KGW-TV will broadcast all home and road first round playoff games in High-Definition. ## POSTSEASON SERIES NOTES

- This marks the third time Portland and Houston have met in the playoffs. The Rockets took both of the previous matchups three games to one in 1994 and 1987, both in the first round. After a 4-2 win this season, the Rockets hold a 10-4 edge overall, winning all seven games in Houston.
- **Brandon Roy's** 26.7 points per game lead all scorers in six series games ... **LaMarcus Aldridge** added 19.5 points and a team-high 7.5 rebounds ... Luis Scola (16.2, 41-72 FG), Yao Ming (15.8, 36-64 FG), Ron Artest (15.7, 37-90 FG) and Aaron Brooks (15.3, 13-29 3-PT) led Houston in scoring.
- Houston held a 240-218 edge on the glass in the series, including a 190-159 advantage on the defensive boards.
- The Trail Blazers averaged 7.67 blocks in the series to Houston's 3.30 blocks per game.
- Houston shot 47.3% from the field in six games compared to Portland's 44.7% shooting from the floor.

## MISCELLANEOUS SERIES NOTES

- Including the playoffs, the Rockets have won seven straight meetings and 13 of the last 14 games between the teams in Houston.
- Portland's only five losses since Mar. 26 came against the Rockets. The Trail Blazers won 10 of their last 11 regular season contests, only falling in Houston on Apr. 5. The Rockets won the 2008-09 season series 2-1, with the home team winning each game. Houston was one of three Western Conference teams to win the regular season series with the Trail Blazers this year.
- **LaMarcus Aldridge** led Portland with averages of 23.3 points, 8.7 rebounds and 2.33 blocked shots in three games vs. Houston during the regular season. **Brandon Roy** averaged 21.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 5.3 assists while **Travis Outlaw** chipped in 14.7 points, 7.0 rebounds and .667 percent long-distance shooting.
- Houston Head Coach Rick Adelman (76-74) has coached in 128 more postseason games than **Nate McMillan** (10-12).
- Rick Adelman was the Trail Blazers' first team captain in 1970-71, and later became the franchise's winningest coach at 291-154 (.654). Adelman is 23-23 all-time against the Trail Blazers in the regular season. Houston assistant coach Elston Turner was an assistant coach in Portland from 1996-2000, under P.J. Carlesimo.
- **LaMarcus Aldridge** played two seasons at the University of Texas, majoring in Corporate Communications.
- The Trail Blazers acquired **Nicolas Batum** from the Houston Rockets during last year's draft, June 26, 2008.
- **Joel Przybilla** was originally selected by the Houston Rockets with the ninth overall pick in the 2000 NBA Draft.
- Houston reserve Von Wafer appeared in eight games for Portland last season after arriving in a mid-season trade.
- Rockets point guard Aaron Brooks played four years for the University of Oregon in Eugene, Ore.

## REGULAR SEASON RECAPS

Portland 101, Houston 99 (OT)  
*November 6 at Portland*

Brandon Roy's 31-foot three-pointer as the clock expired propelled Portland to a 101-99 overtime win over Houston Nov. 6 at the Rose Garden ... Roy hit a fade-away jumper with less than two seconds to play in the extra period before Yao Ming's three-point play gave the Rockets a 99-98 lead with 0.8 seconds remaining to set up the All-Star's dramatic game winner ... Roy shot just 4-for-16 from the field before his two game-changing shots in the last 1.9 seconds ... LaMarcus Aldridge led Portland with a season-high 27 points, while Travis Outlaw added 14 points and a season-high 13 rebounds, leading Portland to a 48-36 advantage on the boards (16-5 offensive) ... Portland led the entire second half before Tracy McGrady's two free throws tied the game for the first time with 1:02 left in regulation ... McGrady led all scorers with 30 points and added seven rebounds and eight assists for Houston.

Houston 98, Portland 94  
*February 24 at Houston*

The Trail Blazers cut an 18-point Rockets lead to as little as two in the final minute with a 14-1 run but could not overtake Houston, losing, 98-94, at the Toyota Center ... Brandon Roy led all scorers with 24 points, LaMarcus Aldridge put in 21 and a team-high tying eight rebounds, Travis Outlaw added 15 points, and Nicolas Batum netted 14 on 5-for-6 shooting (3-3 3-PT), all in the third quarter ... The Rockets took a 17-point lead into halftime and were led by 21 points from Ron Artest and 20 by Aaron Brooks ... Houston got 15 points each from Yao Ming and Luis Scola, who added a game-best 11 rebounds (four offensive) ... The Rockets outrebounded the Trail Blazers, 43-37, and shot 19-for-22 from the foul line, including 9-for-10 in the fourth quarter to close out Portland ... The Trail Blazers led by as many as seven in the opening minutes, but never regained an advantage after Houston took a 31-21 first quarter lead.

Houston 102, Portland 88  
*April 5 at Houston*

The Rockets shot 51.4% (37-72) from the floor as they downed the Trail Blazers, 102-88, Apr. 5 in Houston ... The Rockets made 12 of 18 field goal attempts in the fourth quarter to hold off the Trail Blazers, who came within four in the final period ... Portland's 5-4 advantage early in the first quarter was its last lead ... Yao Ming's 21 points and 12 rebounds (six offensive) led the Rockets, who gained a 42-34 rebounding edge and outscored the Trail Blazers in the paint, 42-28 ... LaMarcus Aldridge and Brandon Roy led Portland with 22 points each, and Aldridge added a team-best nine rebounds and three blocks, while Roy's six assists led the Trail Blazers ... The Rockets scored 18 points off 12 Trail Blazers turnovers while committing only eight miscues themselves ... Houston's bench scored 27 points on 11-for-18 shooting ... Six players besides Yao scored nine-plus points for the Rockets, who got 16 from Luis Scola, 15 from Ron Artest and 14 from Aaron Brooks.

# PLAYOFF GAME SUMMARIES

## #1 - Houston 108, Portland 81 — April 18, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

The Trail Blazers suffered their largest home loss in playoff history, 108-81, at the hands of the Houston Rockets to open the 2009 postseason on Apr. 18 ... The 27-point margin of defeat also marked a high for any game in 2008-09 ... Yao Ming did not miss a shot in the game (9-9 FG, 6-6 FT) in scoring 24 points, all in the first half ... Aaron Brooks led all players with 27 points (10-17 FG, 5-8 3-PT) and seven assists ... Portland set an all-time playoff low with 15 defensive rebounds, as the Rockets held a 44-30 advantage on the glass overall ... Houston shot 58.5% from the floor, including 65.7% in the first half ... Houston's starters went 34-for-52 from the field and outscored Portland's starters, 94-43, in the game, while Portland's bench earned a 38-14 advantage over their counterparts ... The Trail Blazers held a 50-32 edge in points in the paint ... Brandon Roy led the Trail Blazers with 21 points, while Greg Oden added 15 points (6-7 FG) and five rebounds off the bench ... Portland never led in the game.

## #2 - Portland 107, Houston 103 — April 21, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

Brandon Roy dropped 42 points (15-27 FG) and LaMarcus Aldridge added 27 points (11-19 FG), 12 rebounds and three blocked shots as Portland even the series against Houston with a 107-103 victory at the Rose Garden ... Roy's 42-point scoring effort ranks tied for second all-time in Trail Blazers playoff history and is the highest point total in NBA history by a player in his first or second career game ... Portland improved to 20-1 at home in Game 2 of a playoff series ... Neither team led by more than eight points in a game that featured 16 ties and 12 lead changes ... The Trail Blazers outscored the Rockets in the paint, 40-28 ... Portland matched regular season lows with six turnovers and 11 assists ... The Trail Blazers held a 7-1 advantage in blocks and 5-1 edge in steals ... The game had only 10 offensive rebounds, including six by Portland ... Aaron Brooks led the Rockets with 23 points (9-12 FG, 4-5 3-PT) and five assists, while Von Wafer put in 21 points (7-13 FG) off the bench.

## #3 - Houston 86, Portland 83 — April 24, Toyota Center, Houston, Texas

The Trail Blazers trimmed a 17-point deficit to just one on a Rudy Fernandez three-pointer with 17 seconds remaining in the game, before the Rockets made five of six free throws to put away Portland, 86-83, in Houston ... Fernandez hit five three-pointers in all (of seven) and scored 17 points, behind only Brandon Roy's 19 points for Portland ... Steve Blake added playoff career bests of 16 points (4-7 3-PT), including 11 in the fourth quarter, and 10 assists ... The Rockets outrebounded the Trail Blazers, 41-32, and earned a 40-30 advantage in the paint ... The Trail Blazers hit 10 of 23 three-point tries (43.5%), while Houston made three of nine long ball attempts (33.3%) ... LaMarcus Aldridge had a season-high four of Portland's nine blocks, while Houston rejected seven of Portland's shots ... Luis Scola led the Rockets with 19 points (8-15 FG) to go with nine rebounds, Shane Battier counted 16 points (6-10 FG), and Yao Ming added seven points (2-7 FG), all in the first quarter, and a game-best 13 rebounds.

## #4 - Houston 89, Portland 88 — April 26, Toyota Center, Houston, Texas

After trailing by six entering the third quarter, the Rockets used 13 second-chance points on 10 offensive rebounds in the fourth quarter to overtake the Trail Blazers, 89-88, at the Toyota Center ... Houston held a 28-11 margin in second-chance scoring overall ... Portland used a 26-14 advantage in the third period in taking its first lead since the 4:20 mark of the first quarter ... Brandon Roy led all scorers with 31 points (13-13 FT), LaMarcus Aldridge scored a double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds, Travis Outlaw put in 14 points, and Steve Blake notched 11 points and eight assists ... The Trail Blazers did not miss a free throw (17-17) on the night, while the Rockets finished 14-for-22 (63.6%) from the foul line ... Portland shot 45.7% from the field compared to 39.8% for Houston, but the Rockets took 13 more shots from the floor ... The Trail Blazers had nine blocks to Houston's one ... Yao Ming led the Rockets with 21 points and 12 rebounds, Luis Scola tallied 17 points and eight boards (seven offensive), Shane Battier totaled 14 points (4-6 3-PT), eight boards and six assists, and Ron Artest posted 12 points (5-20 FG) and nine assists.

## #5 - Portland 88, Houston 77 — April 28, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

After Houston took its largest lead of the game, 68-64, with 9:34 to play in the game, Portland went on a 15-0 run to take a lead it would never relinquish in defeating the Rockets, 88-77, at the Rose Garden ... LaMarcus Aldridge (11-20 FG) and Brandon Roy (9-20 FG) led all scorers with 25 points, while Steve Blake added 15 points (5-7 FG) and a team-high tying seven rebounds ... The Trail Blazers held Houston to a playoff franchise opponent low three offensive rebounds ... Portland's 12 personal fouls marked an all-time low for a Trail Blazers team in the playoffs, while Houston tallied 24 fouls ... Portland hit six of its 14 three-point tries (42.9%) while holding Houston to only 3-for-15 (20.0%) from beyond the arc ... The Trail Blazers notched eight blocks to Houston's one ... Portland scored 24 points on 17 Rockets turnovers ... Luis Scola led the Rockets with 21 points (10-13 FG), including 15 in the first quarter ... Yao Ming posted 15 points (7-12 FG) and a game-best 12 rebounds.

## #6 - Houston 92, Portland 76 — April 30, Toyota Center, Houston, Texas

The Rockets used a 31-18 second-quarter margin to take a double-digit lead into halftime it would never lose in ousting the Trail Blazers from the playoffs with a 92-76 win at the Toyota Center ... Ron Artest led all scorers with 27 points on 11-for-21 shooting, while Yao Ming posted 17 points and a game-best 10 rebounds ... The Rockets shot 36-for-78 (46.2%) from the floor while holding the Trail Blazers to 30-for-71 shooting (42.3%) ... Portland turned the ball over 15 times on nine Rockets steals ... Houston had only eight turnovers ... The Rockets led by as many as 20 points ... Portland last led in the game, 19-18, in the first quarter ... Every quarter besides the second was decided by three points or fewer ... Portland never scored more than 20 points in a quarter ... LaMarcus Aldridge led the Trail Blazers with 26 points (12-21 FG), while Brandon Roy put in 22 points (8-17 FG, 2-3 3-PT).

# PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

**ROY-AL COMPANY:** Brandon Roy's 26.7 points per game rank fourth in Trail Blazers history for points in a single post-season and stand as the most averaged by a Trail Blazer since 1989 ... His 26.7 points are also the most by a Portland player in his first postseason ... Roy led Portland in scoring in five first round games (including ties).

**FIRST ROUND AND DOWN:** Of Portland's 27 playoff appearances, 19 have resulted in opening-round defeats, including the last four ... Of the eight times the Trail Blazers have advanced to the next round, the team ended up in the conference finals six times and finals three times, winning the NBA Championship once.

**TOUGH ROAD:** After falling in all three contests in Houston, the Trail Blazers have dropped 11 of their last 12 road playoff games, dating back to the Western Conference Finals in 2000.

**LONG ODDS:** Portland is now 0-6 in playoff history when trailing in a series three games to two, including a seven-game loss in their last playoff series before 2008-09, vs. Dallas in 2003 ... The Trail Blazers are 0-8 when trailing three games to one in playoff series in franchise history.

**FOUR SEEDS TO FORGET:** Since modern playoff seeding began in 1984, the Trail Blazers have been the No. 4 seed three times, losing each series by a total count of 10 games to four ... Utah beat Portland in 1988 and San Antonio defeated Portland in 1993 ... The No. 4 seed in the West had won its series five straight times.

**CHANGE OF PACE:** The Trail Blazers scored fewer than 90 points in four straight playoff games for the first time since being swept by San Antonio in the 1999 Western Conference Finals ... Portland never went four straight games without reaching 90 points during the regular season and averaged 99.4 points per contest.

**OUT OF THE GATES:** The team that won the first quarter took all nine games in the season series, including all six playoff games ... The first-quarter leader also took an advantage into halftime in each contest.

**RE-BOUND TO WIN?:** In five of six games in the series, the winning team outrebounded its opponent, with the only exception coming when Portland held a one-rebound advantage in Game 6 ... The Rockets bettered the Trail Blazers on the glass, 40.0-36.3, overall.

**SWEET SIX?:** Before Apr. 30, The Trail Blazers had won Game 6 in their last three series of six or more games ... Portland had last lost a Game 6 on June 14, 1992, falling four games to two against the Chicago Bulls in the NBA Finals.

**ROCKET UNLAUNCHED:** The Rockets' 77 points in Game 5 are the fewest allowed by Portland in the postseason since the Trail Blazers defeated the Lakers, 106-77, on May 22, 2000, in Game 2 of the Western Conference Finals ... Houston had averaged 96.5 points in four previous games in the series.

**HALFWAY HOME:** In Portland's 88-77 win in Game 5 on Apr. 28, the Trail Blazers won when leading at halftime at home for the 34th consecutive game, including both regular season and postseason games, dating back to the 2007-08 campaign.

**SETTING THE PLAYOFF STANDARD:** Houston's three offensive rebounds in Game 5 are the fewest by a Trail Blazers opponent in franchise playoff history, Portland's fewest allowed this season, and come two days after the Rockets pulled in 16 offensive rebounds, including 10 in the fourth quarter of Game 4 ... Portland's 12 personal fouls were also a low mark in a game by a Trail Blazers playoff team and by Portland this season.

**HISTORIC NIGHT AT THE LINE:** In Game 4 on Apr. 26, Portland became the second team in franchise playoff history to make all of its free throw attempts (17-17 FT) ... The Trail Blazers went 21-for-21 from the foul line in Game 6 of the NBA Finals, at Chicago on June 14, 1992 ... The last time Portland lost consecutive playoff games by three points or less, the Detroit Pistons defeated the Trail Blazers in the 1990 NBA Finals.

**BETTER LUCK NEXT TIME:** The Trail Blazers improved to 20-1 all-time in Game 2 of playoff series played in Portland, with the only loss coming vs. Utah on Apr. 30, 1988 ... With its win on Apr. 21, Portland has still never lost both Games 1 and 2 of a series at home.

**RARE COMPANY:** In Game 2, Portland became just the seventh team to shoot above 50% from the field and commit five or fewer individual turnovers in a playoff game since the NBA started tracking turnovers in 1970 ... All seven teams won the game.

**HOME COURT ADVANTAGE LOST:** Portland has never won a playoff series when losing Game 1 at home (0-7) ... On Apr. 18, the Trail Blazers lost at home in Game 1 of a playoff series for the first time since Apr. 29, 1993, vs. San Antonio.

**GAME ONE AND DONE?:** The Trail Blazers have lost Game 1 in five straight playoff series, dating back to the Western Conference Finals in 2000 ... Portland fell in each of the series ... The Trail Blazers are 3-24 all-time in playoff series when dropping Game 1, including 1-17 in the first round.

**COMING OF AGE:** The Trail Blazers' 35 games and 489 minutes of playoff experience among active players are the fewest for a team to begin postseason play since the 1996-97 L.A. Clippers ... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Portland is the first team in NBA history to win 50 games with four rookies appearing in 50-plus contests ... Portland's rookie quartet of **Nicolas Batum** (79), **Rudy Fernandez** (78), **Greg Oden** (61) and **Jerryd Bayless** (53) combined to average the second-highest totals in points and minutes of any team in the league in 2008-09 (Memphis).

**PLAYOFF EXPERIENCE:** Before Game 1 on Apr. 18, Portland had just five players on the roster who had logged playoff experience – **Steve Blake**, **Raef LaFrentz**, **Joel Przybilla**, **Shavlik Randolph** and **Michael Ruffin** – amounting to 70 total playoff games ... The two players in Portland's regular rotation with playoff experience (Blake and Przybilla) had combined to play just 232 minutes in 14 games.

McMillan has bettered the Trail Blazers by 20 wins since his first year in Portland, averaging a 10-game improvement each season ... Among the 23 head coaches to reach the 300-win plateau during the last 20 seasons (1988-2008), only Jeff Van Gundy (42 years, 320 days on 12/04/04) and Mike Fratello (42 years, 312 days on 1/02/90) hit the milestone at a younger age than Nate McMillan (43 years, 225 days on 3/15/08).

**CROWDED GARDEN:** The Trail Blazers have played in front of 68 consecutive regular season sellouts at the Rose Garden, dating back to Dec. 21, 2007 ... Portland's 20,524 average home attendance in 2008-09 ranked tops in the Western Conference and third league-wide, trailing only Detroit and Chicago.

**NORTHWEST CROWN:** Portland earned at least a share of the divisional title for the fifth time in franchise history, with 2008-09 marking the first tie ... Three of the past four times Portland won its division the team reached the Western Conference Finals.

**SETTING THE PACE:** Portland finished the regular season schedule a season-high 26 games above .500 at 54-28, the best record by a Trail Blazers team since 1999-2000 (59-23) and the sixth-best mark, all-time.

Portland won 11 games, including seven road contests, when trailing at the start of the final period (11-23) ... Portland's 13 wins (13-25) when behind or tied after three quarters tied for the league's best mark ... Portland notched its second and third-largest comeback wins of the season in back-to-backs games, 19 points at San Antonio on Apr. 8 and 18 points at Memphis on Apr. 7 ...
