All 68 Portland Trail Blazers regular season and preseason games will be broadcast on the Trail Blazers Broadcasting flagship station, 750 AM The Game. **Brian Wheeler**, in his 14th season calling the play-by-play, and analyst **Antonio Harvey**, in his seventh season, will call the games, home and away. On television, KGW-TV and Comcast SportsNet will air a total of 64 Trail Blazers games with veteran analyst **Mike Rice**, in his seventh full season on television after spending the previous 15 years on the radio, and **Mike Barrett**, in his ninth, calling the action. Between KGW, Comcast SportsNet, TNT and ESPN, all 66 regular-season games will be televised for the fifth year in a row, and the fifth time in franchise history. In addition, all games will be available in High-Definition for the third straight season.

SERIES NOTES

- After last season's 1-1 split with the Wizards, Portland has won eight of the past 11 contests in the series.
- The Trail Blazers have won the last six matchups with Washington at the Rose Garden, last falling at home in 2005.
- Washington has been held to fewer than 100 points in the last seven meetings with Portland, as well as 11 of the last 12 meetings.
- Portland averaged 15.5 more points per game (95.0-79.5) in last season's two-game series than the Wizards.
- The Trail Blazers outrebounded Washington, 96-75, last season, including a 38-22 advantage on the offensive end. Portland used its rebounding edge to outscore the Wizards, 43-25, in points off second chances.
- In two games last season, Portland committed 36 turnovers that led to 27 points for Washington, while converting 44 Wizards miscues into 44 points.
- **LaMarcus Aldridge** averaged a double-double of 19.0 points and 10.5 rebounds in two games against the Wizards in 2010-11.
- In two games against the Wizards last season (one as a member of the Bobcats), Gerald Wallace averaged 26.5 points and 11.0 rebounds to go with 3.00 steals and 1.50 blocks. Wallace dropped 28 points on 10-of-14 shooting from the field in his only game against Washington as a Trail Blazer last season.
- Among players that played in both games against Portland for the Wizards last season, only JaVale McGee average double figures in scoring (10.5). John Wall, who averaged 16.4 points and 8.3 assists during the regular season, was held to averages of 9.5 points (6-25 FG) and 4.5 assists in his two contests against the Trail Blazers.
- The Wizards were limited to 39.4 percent shooting from the field in two games with Portland last season, the second-lowest field goal percentage by a Trail Blazers opponent (Milwaukee, 37.7%).
- Portland garnered a 45-30 advantage in assists in two games vs. Washington last season.
- **Armon Johnson** and Wizards center JaVale McGee played together at the University of Nevada, Reno, for one season in 2007-08. **Luke Babbitt** joined the Wolfpack as a freshman the following season.
- Rashard Lewis played under **Nate McMillan** for all five seasons he served as head coach of the Seattle SuperSonics (2000-2005).

SERIES NOTES

- After winning last season's series 3-1, the Warriors have taken 17 of the past 24 games with Portland.
- Portland came away with a 96-95 win over the Warriors at the Rose Garden last season on Dec. 18, marking the only time in the last 18 meetings that either team has won without scoring at least 100 points.
- Golden State has won 11 of the last 12 meetings at ORACLE Arena with Portland. The Warriors had won nine straight meetings between the teams in Oakland before the Trail Blazers gained a 27-9 advantage in the fourth quarter in a come-from-behind win, 110-105, on March 11, 2010.
- The last time Portland took a season series from Golden State was in 2002-03, when the Trail Blazers earned a 4-0 sweep of the Warriors.
- Golden State outscored Portland, 105.5-92.8, in four meetings last year. That 105.5 scoring average against Portland was the highest among Western Conference opponents last season and ranked second among all NBA foes (Chicago, 106.5).
- In last season's series, the Warriors shot 48.5 percent from the field and 42.3 percent from beyond the arc, while the Trail Blazers managed percentages of 41.3 from the field and 31.3 from distance.

#24 - Portland 117, Denver 97 — February 4, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

Nicolas Batum set a franchise record with nine 3-pointers on his way to a career-high 33 points as the Trail Blazers continued their best home start since the 1998-99 season in a 117-97 victory over the Denver Nuggets ... The nine 3-pointers made by Batum set a season-high for made 3-point field goals in a single game in the NBA this season ... On the night the Trail Blazers set season highs in 3-pointers made (15), 3-point attempts (34), field goals (46), and points (117) ... Marcus Camby eclipsed the 20-rebound mark for the third time this season, the first time a Trail Blazers has done so since Arvydas Sabonis did it in the 1997-98 season ... LaMarcus Aldridge posted 29 points (13-of-18 FG) and nine rebounds in 41 minutes, Aldridge has eclipsed the 20-point mark in each of the last five games ... Portland's 11-1 record at home is the team's best home start since the 1998-99 season when the Trail Blazers went 17-1 at home.

#25 - Oklahoma City 111, Portland 107 (OT) — February 6, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

LaMarcus Aldridge recorded a Trail Blazers season-high 39 points on 14-of-28 field-goal shooting in Portland's 111-107 overtime loss against Oklahoma City, Feb. 6 ... Portland won the turnover battle for a fourth consecutive game, committing 12 miscues against Oklahoma City's 19 ... Wesley Matthews' 2nd quarter turnover snapped his four-game streak without a turnover, Matthews is currently third in the NBA in Steals per Turnover ratio at 1.38 (33 Stl, 24 T.O.) ... Jamal Crawford made his first start as a Trail Blazer for the injured Raymond Felton, Crawford finished with 17 points (6-of-18 FG) and five assists on the night ... Oklahoma City recorded an opponent's season-high 59 rebounds and 43 field-goals en route to their first overtime victory this season ... It was the first time in the last nine games for the Trail Blazers that the away team came away with the victory.

#26 - Houston 103, Portland 96 — February 8, Rose Garden, Portland, Ore.

The Trail Blazers won the turnover battle for a fifth consecutive game and shot 86.4% from the free-throw line in a 103-96 loss to the Houston Rockets, at the Rose Garden, Feb. 8 ... Portland erased a 19-point deficit and tied the game in the fourth quarter at 82-82, but ultimately fell to Houston and lost two straight home games for the first time this season ... Jamal Crawford led the Trail Blazers in scoring with 21 points (8-of-15 FG) and tied for the team lead with six assists ... Portland shot 86.4% from the charity stripe connecting on 19-of-22 free-throw attempts, their third highest free-throw percentage of the season ... Gerald Wallace scored 20 points (8-of-11 FG) to maintain his lead in the Western Conference for field-goal percentage at home with 58.7% ... Houston had six different players reach double-figure scoring, including four players off the bench.

Jamal Crawford netted a season-high 31 points and dished out eight assists to lead the Trail Blazers to a 94-86 victory over the New Orleans Hornets, at New Orleans Arena, Feb. 10 ... The Trail Blazers won the turnover battle for the sixth consecutive game, committing 16 turnovers against New Orleans' 17 miscues ... Portland attempted a season-low 68 field-goal attempts, but converted on 35 of them to shoot 51.5% from the field on the night ... Raymond Felton recorded 18 points (6-of-10 FG) and six assists in 35 minutes of action ... LaMarcus Aldridge and Gerald Wallace each added 14 points, while Wallace recorded a season-high three blocked shots ... Portland held a 9-1 advantage in the blocked shots category.

LaMarcus Aldridge recorded his fourth 30-point outing of the season and seventh double-double with 33 points (14-of-26 FG) and 12 rebounds in 52 minutes of Portland's double overtime loss to Dallas, Feb. 11 ... Gerald Wallace also notched a double-double, his third of the year by scoring 10 points (3-of-4 FG) and grabbing 10 boards ... Portland shot 90.5% from the free-throw line, sinking 19-of-21 attempts; Dallas shot 68.4% and drained 13 of their 19 shots at the charity stripe ... The Trail Blazers won the turnover battle for the seventh consecutive game ... Jamal Crawford scored 19 points off the bench (6-of-23 FG) and shot a perfect 9-for-9 from the free-throw line, Crawford is second in the NBA in free-throw percentage with 94.4% (85-of-90 FTA).

NEWS AND NOTES

AT THE HELM: **Nate McMillan**, now in his seventh season as Trail Blazers head coach, became the third coach in team history to reach 200 wins with a 98-88 victory on Oct. 27, 2010, in Los Angeles against the Clippers ... With Portland's season-opening win vs. Philadelphia on Dec. 26, Nate McMillan's record as Trail Blazers head coach improved to 247-246, marking the second time he has held a winning record in Portland (other time: April 12, 2011) ... He was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for April 2011 after leading the team to a Western Conference-best 5-2 record in the month, including wins over Oklahoma City, Dallas, and the L.A. Lakers ... McMillan became the ninth youngest coach in NBA history to reach 450 career wins with a March 19 victory vs. Philadelphia last season ... He is just the second coach in NBA history to improve a team by nine wins or more in three straight seasons, as Portland increased its win total by 33 games between 2005-06 and 2008-09.

ELITE COMPANY: **LaMarcus Aldridge** became the first Trail Blazer to record 33 points and 23 rebounds in the same game Jan. 20 at Toronto ... Aldridge became the sixth different Trail Blazer to record a 30-20 game, and the first since Zach Randolph did it in 2003 ... Aldridge is the only active NBA player to post 33 points, 23 rebounds, five assists and two steals in a single game.

ALL-STAR START: On Feb. 9, **LaMarcus Aldridge** became the 15th Trail Blazer to be named to the NBA All-Star game ... After 27 games, **LaMarcus Aldridge** leads the Trail Blazers with an average of 23.3 points per game (ranking fifth in the NBA) ... He became the first Trail Blazer since Rasheed Wallace in 2002 to start the season with consecutive games of 24 points or more and has reached double-figure scoring in every game this season.

CAREER SEASON: **LaMarcus Aldridge** is one of three NBA players averaging 23.3 points per game and shooting 50% from the field (L. James and K. Durant) ... Aldridge is averaging career highs in points (23.3 per game), assists (2.8 per game), and steals (1.07 per game) ... Aldridge was also selected as one of 20 finalists for USA Basketball's Olympic roster.

DOING IT ALL: **LaMarcus Aldridge** ranks fifth in the NBA in scoring and third among Western Conference forwards with 23.3 points per game, and is one of only two players averaging at least 23.3 points and 8.6 rebounds per game (Kevin Love) ... Aldridge scored 22-plus points and shot at least 50% FG in six straight games Jan. 27- Feb. 6, averaging 27.7 points (58.1% FG) in that span. ... His 34.6 points+rebounds+assists place him seventh in the NBA ... Aldridge is second in the NBA and leads all Western Conference forwards with 266 field goals so far this season.

CROWDED GARDEN: Portland has sold out the Rose Garden in 173 straight games (regular season and playoffs), dating back to Dec. 21, 2007 ... Last season, the Trail Blazers led the Western Conference in home attendance (20,510) and ranked second league-wide.

UN, DEUX, TROIS: Nicolas Batum broke the Trail Blazers franchise record for 3-point field goals in a game, draining nine shots from downtown on Feb. 4 against the Nuggets ... Batum shot 9-of-15 from 3-point range on his way to a career-high 33-point night ... The previous team record for 3-pointers in a game was eight, shared by Damon Stoudamire, 1/14/05 at New Orleans and Nick Van Exel 1/10/05 at Philadelphia.

REBOUNDING HISTORY: With his eight defensive rebounds against the Los Angeles Clippers, **Marcus Camby** passed hall of famer Artis Gilmore for 25th place on the NBA's all-time defensive rebounding list ... With 6,629 defensive boards in his career Camby has passed current Dallas Mavericks' guard Jason Kidd for 24th place on the all-time list.

WHO NEEDS POINTS?: **Marcus Camby** became the first player in Trail Blazers history to record 20 rebounds in a game without scoring a single point, Jan. 27 against Phoenix ... Camby is also the first NBA player to record 20 or more rebounds in 24 minutes or less since Clyde Lee did it for the Atlanta Hawks in 1974-75.

DON'T FOUL ME: **Jamal Crawford** ranks second in the NBA in free-throw percentage, hitting 85-of-90 free-throw attempts for a mark of 94.4% from the charity stripe ... Crawford trails J.J. Redick for first place, hitting a total of 95.5% of his shots from the line.

OUR HOUSE: Portland's 11 wins in the team's first 12 games at the Rose Garden was the team's best start at home since the 1998-99 season when the team started 17-1 at home ... The L.A. Lakers (11-2) and San Antonio Spurs (13-1) are the only two Western Conference team's with better home records than Portland... The Trail Blazers started 6-0 at home for the first time since the 2008-09 season when the team went 7-0 ... Portland finished with a record of 54-28 that season and made their first trip to the playoffs since 2002-03 ... This season's 6-0 start ended as the seventh best home start in team history.

CRASHING THE PARTY: **Gerald Wallace** leads the Western Conference in field-goal shooting at home, shooting 58.7% in games played at the Rose Garden (98-for-167) and has eclipsed the 50% mark in 12 of 14 home games ... Wallace is averaging 17.8 points-per-game at home so far this season.

BOXING OUT: **Marcus Camby** has eclipsed the 20-rebound mark three times this season, the first time a Trail Blazer has done so since Arvydas Sabonis in the 1997-98 season, and the first time a Trail Blazer has grabbed 20 boards in three home games since Bill Walton in 1974-75 ... Camby grabbed a season-high 22 rebounds Jan. 24 vs. Memphis, the most boards he's ever recorded in a Trail Blazers' uniform and five shy of his career-high ... Camby leads the team with 10.0 rebounds per game this season.

BALANCED ATTACK: The Trail Blazers are one of two teams in the Western Conference and four teams in the NBA to have six players average double-figure scoring. **LaMarcus Aldridge, Wesley Matthews, Gerald Wallace, Jamal Crawford, Raymond Felton** and **Nicolas Batum** have all posted averages above 10.0 points per game this season ... Jan. 10 against the Clippers, every single member of the Trail Blazers starting lineup reached double-figure scoring in the same game for the first time this season.

HOT OFF THE BENCH: The Trail Blazers are the only team in the NBA to have two different players, who have come off the bench in five or more games that rank in the top 15 in the league in scoring off the bench ... **Jamal Crawford** has put up an average of 14.8 points a night to land in ninth place for scoring in a reserve role... **Nicolas Batum** has averaged 12.2 points per game this season, good enough to land him in 14th place in the NBA for bench scoring.

NEWS AND NOTES

BLOCK PARTY: LaMarcus Aldridge's three blocked shots in the regular season opener against Philadelphia surpassed Theo Ratliff for 10th on the Trail Blazers' all-time list ... Aldridge averaged 1.16 blocks per game last season ... He already ranks sixth on the team's all-time offensive rebounding list (1,068).

NO REST NO PROBLEM: The Trail Blazers finished with a 2-1 record in their first back-to-back-to-back set of games since the 1998-99 season, in which Portland played three separate sets of three games in three days ... Portland posted a record of 6-3 in those games and never allowed an opponent to eclipse 100 points despite playing seven of the nine games on the road.

DON'T DIG THE LONG BALL: Entering Jan. 11th's game against Orlando the Trail Blazers were first in the NBA in opponent's 3-point field goal percentage, allowing teams to shoot just 23.7% from downtown ... Orlando shot 16-of-27 from 3-point range, good enough for 59.3% ... Portland now ranks fourth in the NBA allowing 30.3%.

WELCOME TO THE TEAM: Portland's newly acquired point guard **Raymond Felton** has helped lead Portland to a 15-13 record while leading the team in assists in 21 games this season ... Felton is averaging 6.5 assists per contest while scoring 10.5 points per game of his own ... Felton dished out a season-high 12 assists Jan. 16 at New Orleans.

HOT OUT OF THE GATES: The Trail Blazers' 7-3 record was the team's best 10-game start since 1999-2000, the last time Portland reached the Western Conference Finals when the team went 9-1 in its first 10 games .. Portland scored better than 100 points in five of its first six games for the first time since 1992-93, when the Trail Blazers also won their first three games.

SEE YOU LATER: Portland will face six Western Conference opponents four times (Golden State, L.A. Clippers, New Orleans, Oklahoma City, Sacramento, Utah) and all other Western Conference foes three times each ... Only two of the six teams Portland faces four times made the 2011 NBA Playoffs ... The Trail Blazers play three Eastern Conference teams twice (Atlanta, Milwaukee, Washington) and all other East teams just once.

TAKING CARE OF THE ROCK: Portland has won the turnover battle in seven consecutive games and ranks in the Top 10 in the NBA in both turnovers (seventh, 14.39), and opponent turnovers (fourth, 17.07) ... The Trail Blazers' four turnovers Jan. 5 against the Lakers were one shy of tying an all-time team-low of three in a game (vs. Phoenix 2/22/91) ... Portland's four turnovers Jan. 5 are tied for the fewest committed by any team in a single game so far this season.

NORTHBEST DIVISION: With a combined record of 78-58, the Northwest Division owns the best divisional record in the NBA this season.

TOP SHELF VICTORIES: Portland's back-to-back home wins over Phoenix and Charlotte was the first time the Trail Blazers outscored their opponent by 38 points in consecutive home games in team history ... Portland also held their opponent to fewer than 71 points in consecutive home games for the first time in team history ... With the 112-68 win over Charlotte, Portland won a game by 44 points for the first time since Nov. 17, 1997 at Dallas in a 120-75 win over the Mavericks.

GRAND OPENING: The Trail Blazers started the season 3-0 in consecutive seasons for the first time in franchise history ... Dec. 27, against Sacramento marked the first time the Trail Blazers have hosted games on consecutive nights to open regular season play since 1991-92.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS: The Trail Blazers began the regular season at home for the third straight year after starting on the road six straight seasons from 2003-08 ... The last time Portland opened at home at least three straight years was 1985-92 (eight seasons) ... Portland never plays more than three consecutive games at home this season ... The team's seven, three-game homestands account for 21 of the 33 games at the Rose Garden.

BACKED UP: The Trail Blazers will play 17 back-to-back sets this season, and twice play in back-to-back-to-back games (Jan. 23-25, Feb. 14-16) ... Portland went 9-4 in its last 13 tries on the second half of back-to-back sets in 2010-11, and finished 13-9 for the season on day two of consecutive contests ... The Trail Blazers were one of only nine teams to play at least 22 back-to-back sets last year ... Portland went an NBA best 15-4 on the second day of consecutive games in 2009-10 ... Besides the All-Star break, the Trail Blazers never have more than two days between games in 2011-12.

STIFF COMPETITION: Portland has posted a record of 8-6 this season when playing teams with a winning record ... The win against New Orleans on Jan. 16 was the first time this season the Trail Blazers beat a team that had a losing record.

HOW THE BLAZERS WERE BUILT: Of the 15 Trail Blazers on the roster, four were selected by Portland in the NBA Draft, six were picked up in trades and five signed as free agents ... Fourteen played in college and one (**Nicolas Batum**) came from overseas ... Eleven were on the roster at season's end in 2010-11.

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE: **Marcus Camby** and **Kurt Thomas** helped the Knicks reach the NBA Finals in 1999, where they lost to San Antonio, 4-1. Camby and Thomas are also the only current Trail Blazers born in the 1970's ... The other 13 players on the roster were born in the 1980's.

DRAFT DAY DEALINGS: The Trail Blazers have made 19 draft-related trades over the past six seasons ... The dealing has resulted in the acquisitions of **LaMarcus Aldridge**, **Luke Babbitt**, **Nicolas Batum**, **Raymond Felton**, and **Armon Johnson**.

NO PITY IN RIP CITY: The Trail Blazers have now won 11 of the last 13 meetings with the Lakers at the Rose Garden and 24 of the last 30 ... In the meeting on Jan. 5 the Lakers were held without a 3-point field goal for the first time this season, shooting 0-of-11 from downtown ... Seven of the 10 Lakers who played were held to six points or fewer ... The 107 points scored by the Trail Blazers were the most given up by the Lakers this season.
