30 OR BUST

The Bobcats ended 2007-08 with a record of 32-50. The Bobcats have posted 30 wins or more in two consecutive seasons. Charlotte finished 33-49 in 2006-07, the winningest season in franchise history. The Bobcats' 21-20 home record in 2007-08 is a franchise best. The Bobcats' 13-17 record against the Western Conference is a franchise best, and their 8-2 record against the Northwest Division is the best ever against a single division.

MARCH ON

The Bobcats finished the month of March with a 9-7 record, setting a franchise record for wins in a single month. The previous record of eight was set in January 2007, when the team was 8-7. March was only the fourth winning month in team history, along with April 2006 (6-3), January 2007 (8-7) and April 2007 (5-4). The Bobcats won a franchise-record five consecutive games from March 2 to March 8, besting the two four-game streaks from February 14-23, 2007 and April 14-19, 2006.

ROAD WARRIORS

The Bobcats won a franchise-record four consecutive road games from March 26 to April 4, besting the previous franchise record of three consecutive road wins done three times previously. With their 108-95 win over the Lakers in Los Angeles on March 26 and their 95-83 win over the Celtics in Boston on January 9, the Bobcats were the only team in the NBA this season to notch road wins against the Lakers and Celtics.

STRONG START

The Bobcats' 6-4 start marked the best in franchise history after 10 games and was the latest in a season the team has ever been at .500 or better. Prior to this season, the team had never been over .500 through more than three games. At 6-4, the Bobcats were two games over .500 for the second time in franchise history. The Bobcats' six wins also marked the most the franchise has ever had in the month of November.

NO LOVE FOR THE NORTHWEST

Charlotte was 8-2 this season versus the Northwest Division, marking their first winning record for a season against a division other than their own. The Bobcats defeated every team in the division, notching road wins over Portland (93-85, March 29), Seattle (96-93, March 28) and Minnesota (109-89, March 4) and recording home wins over Minnesota (121-119, April 8), Denver (119-116, January 19), Utah (98-92, December 19), Portland (101-92, November 19) and Seattle (108-84, November 17). The Bobcats lost at Denver, 117-101 on February 2, and at Utah, 128-106 on March 25.

SEASON SWEEPS

The Bobcats swept season series against Portland (2-0), Minnesota (2-0), Seattle (2-0) and the L.A. Clippers (2-0). The Bobcats also won season series with Indiana (3-1) and Miami (3-1). In addition, the Bobcats split with playoff contenders Toronto (2-2), Atlanta (2-2), Denver (1-1), Utah (1-1), and the L.A. Lakers (1-1).

TWO DOWN, TWO TO GO

The Bobcats notched their first-ever victories over the Memphis Grizzlies (105-87 on January 19) and the Los Angeles Clippers (108-103 on December 12) in 2007-08, leaving Phoenix and Dallas as the two NBA teams the Bobcats have yet to defeat in their four-year history.

FOUR-POINT PLAYS

Jason Richardson and **Matt Carroll** both converted four-point plays in the 108-95 win over the Lakers on March 26, doubling the two four-point plays the Bobcats had converted this season. It was the first time that two teammates converted on four-point plays in the same game since Sasha Vujacic and Kobe Bryant on March 25, 2007. BOBCATS PLAYER NOTES

RICHARDSON'S RAMPAGE

With his season average of 21.8 points, **Jason Richardson** finished 2007-08 as the first player in Bobcats history to average 20 or more points in a season. Richardson posted 16 games scoring 30 or more points, setting franchise records for 30-point games in a season and career. Richardson's 50 20-point scoring games also set a single-season franchise record. In addition, he became the Bobcats single-season franchise record holder in points (1788), field goals (648), field goal attempts (1468), three-point field goals (243) and three-point field goal attempts (599). Richardson's season average of 21.8 points was tied for 12th in the NBA and ranked fifth in the Eastern Conference. Richardson scored a franchise-high-tying 42 points on March 5 vs. Golden State, two shy of his career high of 44 points. Richardson became the second Bobcats player ever to score 40 or more points in a game, joining **Gerald Wallace**, who has done so four times (40 points on January 14, 2008 vs. Denver; 42 on January 31, 2007 vs. New York; 41 on March 28, 2006 vs. Atlanta; and 40 on December 27, 2006 vs. Washington).

THREE-WAY CALLING

Jason Richardson led the NBA with 243 three-point field goals, a total that ranks fourth all-time in NBA history. Following are the NBA's all-time single-season leaders in three-point field goals

Richardson broke the Bobcats single-season record (previously 115) on January 21 in the season's 41st game. In addition, he already ranks third on the club's all-time list. Richardson set a new Bobcats franchise record with seven three-point field goals on January 26 against Philadelphia, and he hit at least one three-point field goal in 33 consecutive games from November 11 to January 18, setting a new franchise record (Jumaine Jones, 32, January 16-March 22, 2006). EVERYBODY LOVES RAYMOND

With his nine assists on April 2 vs. Cleveland, **Raymond Felton** became the Bobcats' career assist leader, moving ahead of Brevin Knight (1,497). Felton finished the season with 1,566 assists in his career. Felton's season average of 7.4 assists was **second in the Eastern Conference**, trailing only Toronto's Jose Calderon. Felton posted 17 double-doubles in 2007-08 and 19 games handing out 10 assists or more. Felton's season averages of 14.4 points and 7.4 assists both marked career highs.

DOUBLE PLAYER

With season averages of 13.8 points and 10.7 rebounds, **Emeka Okafor** was one of just 18 NBA players to average a double-double in 2007-08. Okafor posted 39 double-doubles on the season, tied for 10th in the league. In addition, Okafor finished 2007-08 ranked sixth in the NBA in rebounding and 12th in blocks with 1.7 per game. Okafor posted two 20-20 games this season, November 9 vs. Indiana (25 points and 23 rebounds) and February 13 vs. Atlanta (20 points and 21 rebounds).

WALLACE'S WAY

Gerald Wallace scored a season-high 40 points on January 14 vs. Denver, posting his fourth career game scoring 40 or more points. He followed that up by scoring 36 points and tying a career high with 14 rebounds in the January 16 win over the Magic. The 76 points in consecutive games marked a Bobcats franchise record for a two-game span. Before sustaining a concussion on February 22, Wallace was averaging 20.9 points in 39.7 minutes and led the Bobcats in scoring 24 times in 49 games. Returning to action on March 14 at Houston, Wallace averaged 14.9 points in 35.5 minutes over 12 games before missing the final six games of the season due to a left groin strain.

IRON MEN

Emeka Okafor and **Jason Richardson** both played in all 82 games in 2007-08, becoming the first Bobcats players to do so and besting the previous franchise record of 81 games played in a season (Jason Kapon, 2004-05). Okafor has played in a team-record 93 consecutive games, spanning the last 11 games of 2006-07 and the entire 82 games of 2007-08.

PLAYER(S) OF THE WEEK

Jason Richardson won the Eastern Conference Player of the Week award twice this season, while teammate **Gerald Wallace** did so once. Richardson averaged 28.9 points, 6.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.8 steals and led the Bobcats to a 4-0 record for the week ending March 9. Richardson again won the award after averaging 26.8 points, 6.8 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 2.3 steals and 1.0 block and leading the Bobcats to a 3-1 record for the week ending. Wallace won the award for the week ending January 20, in which he averaged 29.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 4.8 assists, 3.0 steals and 1.0 block in four games, leading the Bobcats to a 3-1 record. Richardson and Wallace are the only Bobcats players to have won the award.

TWO CAN PLAY THAT GAME

Jason Richardson and **Gerald Wallace** scored 20 or more points in the same game 22 times this season. The duo had a streak of six straight games from December 28 to January 8 that tied Denver's Carmelo Anthony and Allen Iverson for the second-longest streak in the NBA this season of two teammates each scoring 20 or more points.

WELCOME MATT

Matt Carroll shot .500 (47-94) from the three-point line over his last 26 games, after shooting just .377 (23-61) in his previous 25 games. Carroll shot .436 (105-241) from beyond the arc this season, setting a franchise record for three-point field goal percentage and ranking ninth in the league.

STAT SHEET STUFFER

Gerald Wallace finished 2007-08 ranked fifth in the league in steals, trailing only New Orleans' Chris Paul, Sacramento's Ron Artest, Golden State's Baron Davis and Washington's Caron Butler. Wallace posted a season-high seven steals on January 19 vs. Memphis. Wallace and Butler finished the season as the league's only two players to average at least 19.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.0 steals.

DUDLEY DOES RIGHT

Jared Dudley finished in the top 20 among NBA rookies in field-goal percentage (seventh, .468), steals (eighth, 0.8), rebounding (12th, 3.9), assists (T-14th, 1.1) and scoring (T-17th, 5.8). Dudley scored a career-high 19 points in a career-high 42 minutes on April 12 at Indiana. Dudley also grabbed a career-high 18 rebounds on March 5 vs. Golden State, the third-most rebounds in a game ever by a Bobcats rookie. Dudley posted four double-doubles on the season and 17 games scoring in double figures.
