- **Gerald Wallace** tallied his sixth double-double of the season with 22 points on 7-12 shooting and 10 rebounds. Wallace added four assists, two steals and two blocked shots in 46 minutes.
- **Stephen Jackson** scored 22 points on 8-13 shooting, grabbed four rebounds and handed out two assists in 41 minutes.
- **Ronald "Flip" Murray** scored 17 points on 5-8 shooting and 7-10 free-throw shooting, to go with a season-high six assists, five rebounds and one steal in 28 minutes.
- **Boris Diaw** scored 11 points on 5-10 shooting, grabbed five rebounds, handed out three assists and blocked three shots in 44 minutes.
- **Nazr Mohammed** scored eight points on 3-3 shooting and grabbed three rebounds in 16 minutes.
- The Bobcats shot a season-high .508 from the field (30-59), .143 from beyond the three-point line (2-14) and .605 (26-43) from the free-throw line, compared to .415 (34-82), .357 (10-28) and .810 (17-21) for the Bucks.
- Charlotte's two offensive rebounds marked a franchise-record low, while their 59 field goal attempts tied the franchise-record low.
- Brandon Jennings led all scorers with 29 points on 12-23 shooting. Hakim Warrick added 16 points and nine rebounds for the Bucks.

BOBCATS NOTES

WELCOME TO CHARLOTTE

The Bobcats on Monday acquired **Stephen Jackson** and **Acie Law** from Golden State in exchange for Raja Bell and Vladimir Radmanovic. Jackson, who is in his tenth NBA season, averaged career highs of 20.7 points, 6.5 assists and 5.1 rebounds last season. Jackson brings career averages of 15.5 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.3 steals in 608 games played for New Jersey, San Antonio, Atlanta, Indiana and Golden State. Law, who was the 11th overall pick in the 2007 NBA Draft by Atlanta, is in his third NBA season, with career averages of 3.7 points, 1.8 assists and 1.0 rebound in 116 games played for Atlanta and Golden State.

MOVING ON UP

Tonight's game marks the 1,905th NBA game coached by **Larry Brown**, moving him past Pat Riley into fifth place on the NBA's list of games coached. Brown enters tonight's game with a career record of 1,048-855, ranking him sixth on the all-time wins list, two wins behind the Lakers' Phil Jackson. When combining NBA and ABA games, Brown's 2,239 total games coached and 1,277 victories each rank third all-time behind Lenny Wilkens and Warriors coach Don Nelson.

JACK-ED UP

After scoring 13 points and grabbing nine rebounds in his Bobcats debut last Monday, **Stephen Jackson** has topped the 20-point plateau in each of his last two games, averaging 24.0 points on .500 shooting from the field (17-34).

ON THE FLIP SIDE

Ronald "Flip" Murray is averaging 19.0 points on .550 shooting from the field (22-40) over his last three games, including a career-high-tying 31 points on a career-high 13 field goals Monday at Orlando. Murray is also averaging 3.7 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.3 steals during the three-game span. Murray's 31 points marked the highest single-game total by a Bobcats player this season and was the second-best scoring game off the bench in franchise history behind Sean May's 32-point performance on Dec. 14, 2006.

DOUBLE-FIGURE DIAW

Boris Diaw is averaging 15.3 points on .563 shooting (27-48) over his last four games, including back-to-back games with a season-high 21 points on Nov. 14 vs. Portland and Nov. 16 at Orlando. He has scored in double figures in seven of his last nine games and is averaging 14.0 points on .515 shooting (53-103) during that stretch.

20-20 VISION

Gerald Wallace is averaging 13.9 points and 11.4 rebounds, which ranks third in the NBA, through the season's first 12 games. Wallace has six double-doubles on the young season and has tallied at least nine rebounds in 10 of 12 games this season. Wallace recorded the first 20-20 game of his career and the fourth in Bobcats history (Emeka Okafor had the other three) with 24 points and a career-high 20 rebounds in the Nov. 2 win over New Jersey. Wallace also leads the NBA in minutes played (42.5) and ranks 15th in steals (1.75).

TOUGH D

Through the season's first 12 games, the Bobcats are giving up an average of 89.6 points per game, which is the third-lowest average in the NBA. The team broke or tied several defensive records in the Nov. 2 win over New Jersey. The Nets 68 points in the game and 27 points in the second half set new Bobcats franchise records for fewest points allowed in a game and a half. Also, New Jersey's 25 field goals in the game, seven points in the third quarter and two field goals in the third quarter tied Bobcats franchise record lows for an opponent.

LARRY'S LEGACY

Tonight's game marks the fifth of 24 games the Bobcats will play this season against teams previously coached by **Larry Brown**. The Bobcats, who were 11-14 in such games in 2008-09, are 2-2 against those teams so far this season.

BOARD MEETING

The Bobcats are grabbing 51.7% of the available rebounds in their games and are allowing their opponents just 39.50 rebounds per game, both of which rank fifth in the league. The Bobcats have topped the 50-rebound plateau three times so far this season tied a franchise record with 44 defensive rebounds on Nov. 6 against Atlanta. The following shows the Bobcats numbers and league rankings in several rebounding categories.

STARRY, STARRY NIGHT

Guards **Raymond Felton** and **Stephen Jackson**, forwards **Boris Diaw** and **Gerald Wallace** and center **Tyson Chandler** all appear on the 2010 NBA All-Star Ballot at their respective positions. While Jackson remains listed on the Western Conference on printed ballots, any votes he receives will go toward his candidacy in the Eastern Conference.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY

Boris Diaw finished the 2008-09 season shooting .507 from the field (448-884) and .414 from beyond the three-point line (75-181), making him one of only two players in the NBA (among qualifiers for league leaders) shooting at least .500 from the field and at least .400 from beyond the three-point line. Steve Nash was the other. Meanwhile, **Stephen Jackson** was one of only four players in the league to average at least 20 points, six assists and five rebounds per game, joining LeBron James, Chris Paul and Dwyane Wade.

RECORD-BREAKING WINS IN 2008-09

The Bobcats finished the 2008-09 season with a 35-47 record, setting a franchise record for wins in a season. The previous high of 33 wins was set in the 2006-07 season. The Bobcats' 23-18 home record was also a franchise best, topping the previous record of 21 home wins set in 2007-08. The Bobcats won a franchise-record six straight games from Feb. 25-March 7, 2009, topping the previous franchise-best streak of five wins set March 2-8, 2008. During the six-game stretch, the Bobcats also won four straight road games, tying the longest road winning streak in franchise history set March 26-April 4, 2008.
