TONIGHT'S QUICK FACTS

- Cleveland will head to Florida for a back-to-back road trip with the top two teams in the Southeast Division, Orlando and Miami. The team will try to extend their streak of four victories in the last five games. The first game against the Magic will feature **two of the NBA's Top 10 teams in three-point shooting with Cleveland (.440) ranking 2nd and Orlando (.388) ranking 7th**. Both teams also take care of the defensive glass, **each giving up only 8.6 offensive rebounds per game to their opponents**, fewest in the NBA.
- With their 100-91 victory over the Knicks in Madison Square Garden on Friday, Cleveland has **won six consecutive games against New York, including the last four on the road**. In this span, the Cavs have outscored the Knicks by an average margin of 110.2-95.7 while shooting .498 from the field compared to .426 from the Knicks.
- In Cleveland's last five games, the team's defense has held opponents to just .418 (164-392) shooting from the field and 86.6 points per game. Cleveland's **defense so far on the season ranks 5th in the NBA in opponent points per game (89.9), 6th in defensive field goal percentage (.427) and is tied for 8th in blocks (5.6) per game**. The team is **allowing 29.7 points in the paint, the 2nd fewest in the NBA and after giving up only two to Chicago last Thursday and four to the Knicks last Friday, and ranks 1st in second chance points allowed at only 9.0 points per game**. The Cavaliers **rank 8th in fewest fast break points allowed at 10.1**.
- Against the Knicks, LeBron James scored 19 points in the first quarter on 8-9 (.889) shooting, **the third-highest opening period total in his career**, on his way to a game-high 33 points on 12-17 (.706) shooting, eight rebounds, a game-high nine assists and three steals in 36 minutes. James' performance led the team to score a season-high 40 points in the first quarter on 16-22 (.727) shooting.
- In 11 career games at the Garden, **LeBron James has averaged 30.4 points on .487 shooting, including .458 from behind the arc, 5.8 rebounds, 6.8 assists and 2.4 steals. James ranks 2nd** in scoring behind K. Bryant at 30.5 for visiting players. (STATS, Inc.) **For the season, James is averaging 26.3 points, 7.7 rebounds and 8.0 assists (ranks 2nd in the East) and 1.7 steals in 37.9 minutes.**
- In his first game off the bench this season on Friday, Anderson Varejao finished with eight points, a game-high 14 rebounds (five offensive), two blocks and two steals in 34 minutes. **Varejao has now led the team in rebounding in five straight games and recorded double figure rebounds in three straight games.**
- Against the Knicks, Daniel Gibson scored 11 points and connected on three three-pointers. **Gibson has scored in double figures in four of the team's seven games this season** and is averaging 8.7 points while shooting 17-34 (.500) from behind the arc.
- Through the first seven games, the team has **made 59 three-point field goals, which is twelve more than the team's previous best mark of 47 in 2007-08**. The team **ranks 2nd (Phoenix) in three-point percentage at 59-134 (.440) and is one of the most improved teams in shooting three-pointers from last season (.393) to this season (.440)**. (STATS, Inc.)
- For players with at least 10 three-point attempts, the Cavaliers have three players in the Top 25 in the NBA. **Anthony Parker, who went a combined 5-6 (833) over the last two games, ranks 8th in three-point shooting at 14-25 (.560) while Daniel Gibson ranks 16th at 17-34 (.500)**. Mo Williams is also shooting **14-30 (.467) on three-pointers this season, which ranks 23rd**.
- Against the Knicks, Zydrunas Ilgauskas had a near double-double with nine points and 11 rebounds. Ilgauskas (714 games played, 667 starts) **is only six games away from tying Bingo Smith (720 games) for second all-time (Danny Ferrv, 723 games) in games played in franchise history.**

CAVALIERS 99, HEAT 89 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA, CLEVELAND, OH (3/7/09)

KEYS TO THE GAME: LeBron James scored 14 points and added team highs in rebounds with 10 and assists with 12, while recording his 4th triple-double of the season (4-0) and 21st of his career...James recorded the 3,000th assist of his career becoming the second youngest player (24 years, 67 days) in NBA history to reach 3,000 assists (Isiah Thomas – 23 years, 322 days)...Mo Williams scored a game-high 29 points on 10-15 (.667) shooting and added five rebounds and three assists...Williams shot 6-7 (.857) from three-point range and in the 4th quarter, he scored 12 points, including nine in a row at one point...Dwyane Wade scored 25 points and added eight rebounds, 12 assists and four steals...Jermaine O'Neal scored 19 points on 7-10 shooting...Michael Beasley scored 17 points and added five rebounds in 24 minutes off the bench.

TURNING POINT: Dwyane Wade picked up his second technical foul and was ejected for the first time in his career in the final minute of the game and the Cavs hit both free throws to build their lead to eight points.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Delonte West scored 19 points and added three rebounds and six assists including scoring 11 points on 4-4 shooting, including 2-2 from three-point range in the third quarter...Anderson Varejao had 12 points and seven rebounds...in his second game as a Cavalier, Joe Smith scored nine points and five rebounds to lead the bench...the Cavs held the Heat to 3-15 (.200) shooting from behind the arc...24 of the Cavaliers 35 baskets were assisted on.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: After becoming the franchise leader last season in rebounds and blocks, Zydrunas Ilgauskas (714 games, 667 starts) is closing in on another milestone in all-time games played in Cavaliers team history. In six games, he will tie Bingo Smith (720 games) and with three more games, tie Danny Ferry (723 games).

RANK AND FILE: For the 2009-10 NBA season, the Cavaliers rank in the Top 10 in the following defensive and offensive statistical categories:

- Defensively, the Cavaliers are **ranked for 1st** (Orlando) in giving up only 8.6 offensive rebounds per game to their opponents and **rank 1st** in second chance points allowed at only 9.0 points per game.
- The team **rank 5th** in overall opponent points per game, allowing only 89.9 and **rank 6th** in defensive field goal percentage, allowing opponents to only shoot .427.
- The Cavaliers **rank 8th** in blocks per game at 5.6.
- Cleveland **rank 2nd** with only allowing 29.7 points in the paint.
- The Cavaliers **rank 8th** in fewest fast break points allowed at 10.1.
- Cleveland, at .440, **rank 2nd** (Phoenix) in three-point shooting and is **one of the most improved teams from last season (.393) to this season (.440)**. (STATS, Inc.)

EARLY BIRD: LeBron James starts seasons off strong. Entering the month of November in each of his six seasons, **James (26.6 ppg) is the leading career scorer in the first full month of NBA action among active players with a minimum of 50 games** (A. Iverson – 26.4 ppg, K. Bryant – 24.4 ppg, D. Wade – 24.2 ppg). So far this season, James is averaging 26.0 points in two games. (STATS, Inc.)

RAPTOR RULER: At Toronto, LeBron James **recorded his 25th career triple-double (20-5) and his third against the Raptors with 23 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists**. James is **the first Raptors opponent to have three regular season three-doubles (Nov. 24, 2007 - 37 points, 12 rebounds, 12 assists) and (April 20, 2005 - 27 points, 14 rebounds, 14 assists) and two of the three have been in Toronto**. James' 12 assists are also the most the Raptors have ever given up to one player in a season opener. James **has averaged 29.2 points per game at Toronto throughout his career (11 games), the most of any player all-time** (minimum of two games). (STATS, Inc.)

OPENING FEAT: In the season opener against Boston, LeBron James (24 years, 301 days old) **became the youngest player to reach 13,000 career points**, passing Kobe Bryant (26 years, 132 days old). He notched his 13,000th point after hitting a three-pointer at the 4:47 mark of the first quarter. James finished with a game-high 38 points on 12-22 (.545) shooting, including 4-9 (.444) on three-pointers and 10-13 (.769) from the free throw line, and team-highs of eight assists and four blocks in 45 minutes. **James' 38 points on Tuesday set a Cavaliers record for points in a season-opener, previously held by Ron Harper's 36 points at Chicago in 1989**. James's **output was the highest against Boston in the Celtics' first game of a season since George Gervin scored 39 points for the Spurs win in 1977**. (Elias)

DIESEL POWER: Last season, Shaquille O'Neal averaged 17.8 points, his highest scoring average since 2005-06, to go along with 8.4 rebounds and 30.1 minutes in 75 games (all starts). It was his most games played in a single season since the 1999-00 season and he was named an All-NBA Third Team Selection. O'Neal made his 15th career NBA All-Star appearance, the second-most in league history (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar) and was named 2009 All-Star Game co-MVP (Kobe Bryant), the third such MVP honor of his career. He shot an NBA-best and career-high .609 percent from the field, breaking his personal mark of .601 percent set in the 2004-05 season, and led the league in field goal percentage for the 10th time in his career, establishing a new NBA record and breaking the mark he previously shared with Wilt Chamberlain. He ranks 10th on the all-time scoring list and tallied 25 scoring efforts of 20 or more points (18-7), posted 15 games (12-3) of at least 20 points and 10 rebounds and had 30 double-doubles last season.

ELITE COMPANY: The Cavaliers have been one of the elite teams in the NBA over the past four regular seasons. The 2008-09 Cavaliers were only the 12th team in NBA history to win at least 66 games. The Cavaliers also tied the 1971-72 Los Angeles Lakers for 2nd in NBA history for the largest improvement in wins (21) of all teams that won at least 45 games in the previous season. With the Lakers going 65-17, it marked the first time in NBA history that two teams posted at least 65 victories in the same season. The Cavaliers won 45 or more games in each of their last four seasons, which represented the first time in team history that Cleveland reached that mark in four straight seasons. The only other teams with 45 or more wins in each of the last four seasons are Dallas, Phoenix and San Antonio. Dating back to the 2005-06 regular season, Cleveland owns a record of 211-117 (.643), which is the fifth-best record in the NBA during that span. Only San Antonio, Dallas, Phoenix and Detroit posted better records than Cleveland. In addition, the Cavaliers are one of just six teams in the NBA that have qualified for the playoffs in each of the last four seasons. The only other team in the Eastern Conference was Detroit while in the West only Dallas, Denver, the Los Angeles Lakers and San Antonio appeared in the playoffs each year.

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU: In just four seasons at the helm of the Cavaliers, Head Coach Mike Brown has quickly recorded the best winning percentage of any coach in the team's 39-year history. With a combined regular season record of 211-117 (.643), Brown **is the third winningest coach, based on winning percentage, for NBA coaches who've been with their current team in a single tenure for at least four seasons (chart below)**. At 211-117 (.643), Brown is only behind Gregg Popovich (686-330, .675) and Phil Jackson (496-242, .672). Brown has posted at least 45 wins in each of his four seasons, including a franchise-best 66 wins during 2008-09 and back-to-back 50-win seasons in 2005-06 and 2006-07. He is the fourth youngest coach in NBA history to win 60 games. On March 19th, Brown won his 200th game (200-114), ranking fourth among current head coaches in fewest games (314) to reach 200 wins (Jackson, Adelman, S. Van Gundy). Brown has led the Cavaliers to the postseason each year and has a record of 36-24 (.600), which gives him the most playoff wins in Cavs history.

LEBRON'S LEAD: LeBron James' all-around game and leadership led the Cavaliers to the NBA's best record while becoming the league MVP, which was the first time a Cavalier has ever received the award. James was the team leader in total points (2,304), rebounds (613), assists (587), steals (137) and blocks (93). Since steals and blocks became an official stat in the 1973-74 season, James (66 wins) became the fourth player to lead his team in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals per game, while also leading his team to 50+ wins. The only other players are Larry Bird in 1985-86 (67 wins), Grant Hill in 1996-97 (54 wins) and Kevin Garnett in 2002-03 (51 wins). James led the team in all three categories (points, rebounds and assists) in a game 16 times this season. No other player in the league has done that more than six times during the season and it's the most such games for any NBA player since James himself had 16 such games in the 2005-06 season. James led the NBA in points per game on the road this season at 31.5 on .479 shooting and has scored at least 20 points in 39 straight road games dating back to the beginning of November 2008. Those 39 games are tied for most games since 1991-92 (A. Iverson, Dec. 3, 2004 - Dec. 10, 2005). In sitting out 13 fourth quarters this season, LeBron James had the highest fourth quarter scoring average in the NBA for fourth quarters actually played. James averaged 7.6 points per game in the fourth quarter (515 pts, 68 games).

MO BETTER: Cavaliers point guard Mo Williams averaged a career-best 17.8 points on .467 shooting, 3.4 rebounds and 4.1 assists for the season and got stronger after the All-Star break (chart below). He had 10 games this season with 20 points and five assists (10-0) and led the team in scoring 11 times. The Cavaliers were 26-5 (.839) when Williams scored more than 20 points in a game, 5-0 when he scored 30 points in a game and 33-4 (.892) when he shot at least .500. The point guard finished the season ranked 2nd (D. Harris) among Eastern Conference point guards in scoring and is one of only two players (S. Nash) in the NBA shooting at least .460 from the field, .430 from three-point range and .900 from the free throw line. Williams made 183 three-pointers and shot .436 from the three-point line. Among Cavalier players who have taken at least 275 three-pointers in a season, only one person has ever made more three-pointers and shot a higher percentage in franchise history from behind the arc than Williams this season. That was Wesley Person (192 makes on .444 shooting) in the 2001-02 season. Williams shot a career best .912 from the free throw line, which is the fourth-best mark in franchise history. In addition to increasing his three-point percentage each full month this season, Williams has increased his overall percentage 5.1 percent from last season (.385 to .436), which represents the 4th highest increase in the NBA (K. Durant, A. Bargnani, D. Cook). (min. 200 att. in both seasons).

NBADL UPDATE: On Thursday, the Erie BayHawks conducted their NBADL Draft and selected Donell Taylor in the first round. Erie had the 2nd overall pick in the first round and selected Donell Taylor (6' 6" / 215 lbs.) of the University of Alabama- Birmingham. Undrafted out of college Taylor is a veteran of two seasons with the Washington Wizards and has spent the past couple of seasons playing in Greece and Belgium. In the second round the BayHawks snagged John Bryant, a 6' 11" - 300 pound center from Santa Clara University. While with the Broncos, Bryant averaged 18 points, 12 rebounds and 2.5 block shots per game.

2009-10 CAVALIERS OFF THE COURT NOTES

CAVALIERS "XL" SEASON: The 2009-10 Cavaliers season will commemorate the franchise's 40th anniversary and in celebrating 40 years of basketball, the Cavs are hitting the court in an XL way with a season-long lineup of special theme nights, premium fan giveaways and the return of Hardwood Classics Nights (HWC). This year will also boast an All-Star cast of player bobbleheads featuring LeBron James, Shaquille O'Neal and Mo Williams.

TOP TIER OVERALL DRAW: The Cavaliers continue to be one of the NBA's most watched teams and so far this season is leading the league in average attendance. The team is playing to a 33-game (all four games this season) regular season home sellout streak. The Cavaliers are averaging 20,562 fans this season, which is 180 fans above the 20,382 fans mark from last season through four games, and has played to sellout crowds in all three road games (seven counting back to last season) and an average attendance of 19,757 on the road, which marks a 4.5% increase from 18,889 fans last season. Combined, the team is averaging 20,217 in attendance, which is a league-best and an increase of 2.4% through seven games this season. Cleveland ranked fourth in the league last season in average home attendance at 20,512 fans (and recorded sellouts in 38 of 41 home games, the most in franchise history during the regular season. On the road, the Cavs attracted 18,889 fans per game, which ranked third in the NBA. Cleveland's combined home and road attendance of 19,706 was the best all-time in franchise history and ranked second in the NBA.

MUST SEE TV: The Cavaliers continue to be one of the top teams in the NBA in local television and radio ratings. The team's opening night game against Boston on October 27th at Quicken Loans Arena, which was nationally broadcast on TNT, had a 19.5 television rating and a 29.0 household share, which amounts to approximately 750,000 viewers, not including bars/restaurants and other public group viewing totals. The 19.5 rating is also the second highest regular season rating in franchise history behind the 20.5 television rating on February 8, 2009, against the L.A. Lakers on ABC.

For the first time in Cavaliers team history, all games broadcast this season on FOX Sports Ohio (FSO) will be presented in High Definition (HD). Also, all FSO games will be aired the next day or at midnight following the game for Friday and Saturday games. The team's regional broadcast ratings on FSO have netted a 8.6 rating and a 14.0 household share, which is slightly higher than last year's record-breaking averages of 8.5 and 14.0, respectively.

MICHAEL SYMON COMES TO THE Q: Cleveland's own award-winning chef and Food Network star Michael Symon has brought his culinary talents to Quicken Loans Arena. The Cleveland Cavaliers and ARAMARK—a world-class leader in professional services and the Cavs' exclusive food and beverage provider—have teamed up with Symon to bring his signature cuisine to Quicken Loans Arena. The partnership with Symon is one of many new food and service enhancements to be introduced this season at Quicken Loans Arena. As part of the partnership, two Symon-branded dining destinations, the B Spot and Bar Symon, will be open for all Cavaliers games and for most arena events. Additionally, customized catering packages, featuring Symon's signature menu, has been designed exclusively for arena suite-holders.

NEW WAY TO PURCHASE TICKETS: There is a new way to purchase tickets to all events at Quicken Loans Arena. No longer will the public purchase tickets to Quicken Loans Arena events through Ticketmaster, Ticketmaster.com or Ticketmaster retail or phone outlets. Fans can now visit Discount Drug Mart's 58 northern Ohio locations, which are the new, exclusive full-service retail outlets to purchase tickets to all Quicken Loans Arena events, which includes the NBA Cleveland Cavaliers, AHL Lake Erie Monsters, concerts, family shows and more. Fans can also use the new charge-by-phone number at 1-888-894-9424, visit the Quicken Loans Arena box office or visit theQarena.com.

THE CAVALIERS BRAND: The Cavaliers were one of only five professional sports teams (NBA Celtics, NHL Blackhawks, MLB Rays, MLB Brewers) in the United States to be named a Finalist for the prestigious Sports Business Journal's 2009 Sports Team of the Year Award. The award recognizes excellence in sports franchise business operations. According to the 2008 team Brand Index Report (produced by industry leading Turnkey Sports research), the Cavaliers rank #1 in Team Popularity and Grade of Ownership among all other pro sports teams in Cleveland. The Cavaliers also rank highest among all pro sports teams in Cleveland in Community Involvement (defined as dedicated to giving back to the community).

DOT-COM STILL BOOMING FOR CAVS: Cavs.com, the comprehensive resource for all things Cavaliers, continues to be one of the league's most viewed websites. Cavs.com has had a banner year for the 2008-09 season, already surpassing the total number of visits from the 2007-08 season by over a million visits. The 2,867,381 visits to Cavs.com in March represented a 99 percent increase over March of 2008 (1,439,816 visits). In addition to the visits record, Cavs.com also set a new unique visitors mark with 1,411,839 unique visitors, up 94 percent over March of 2008 (728,372).
