TONIGHT'S QUICK FACTS

- On Saturday, the Cavaliers finished 3-1 through a stretch of four games in five nights, the second such stretch in the season so far. The team, **winners of 10 of their last 12 games**, will now go on the road for the next two games (at Detroit Wednesday and at Charlotte Friday) and **at 5-2, .714 on the road this season, is tied for 2nd best in the NBA.**
- For the second consecutive game, the Cavaliers fourth quarter defense has suffocated its opponent. Against Philadelphia, the team **outscored the Sixers 22-10 in the final frame, while holding them to just 4-23 (.174) shooting from the field. The 10 points scored by the Sixers was a Cavs' opponent low for points in a quarter this season and it's the first time in franchise history that they allowed 10 or less points in the last quarter, after permitting at least 80 points through the first three quarters.** The night before, Cleveland held Indiana to 4-18 (.222) shooting and just 13 points in the fourth quarter. Over the last two fourth quarters, the Cavs have outscored their opponent 25.0-11.5 while outshooting teams 17-34 (.500) to 8-41 (.195) from the field. (*Elias*)
- On Saturday, Zydrunas Ilgauskas **played in his 721st career game (672 starts) as a Cavalier, surpassing Bingo Smith (720 games) for second all-time in games played in franchise history.** He is just two games away from tying Cavaliers General Manager Danny Ferry (723 games) for the team's all-time leader in games played. Ilgauskas finished the game with 13 points in 6-10 (.600) shooting, eight rebounds, four assists and two blocks in 34 minutes. In his last five games, he is averaging 10.2 points and 7.6 rebounds and has **led or tied for the team lead in rebounds in four of the last five games.**
- LeBron James had another strong performance with a game-high 32 points on 13-20 (.650) shooting, including 2-4 (.500) from behind the three-point line, nine assists and seven rebounds in 39 minutes. Over the last eight games, **James is averaging 32.6 points on .553 shooting, 8.3 assists, 6.1 rebounds and 1.5 steals and has scored at least 31 points in seven of the eight contests.** On the season, he is averaging 29.4 points (**3rd best in the NBA**), 6.8 rebounds and 8.1 assists (**6th best**).
- J.J. Hickson posted 14 points on 6-10 shooting (.600), five rebounds and a season-high two blocks in 32 minutes. **Over the last six games, Hickson is averaging 15.7 points on .704 shooting and 5.2 rebounds.**
- Mo Williams finished with 18 points, a season-high tying eight rebounds, five assists and three steals in 41 minutes. On the season, Williams **is averaging 17.3 points on .446 shooting, 3.1 rebounds and 4.6 assists. He ranks 9th at 30-62 (.484) in three-point shooting and ranks 5th in free throw shooting at 40-43 (.930).**
- The Cavs outscored the Sixers 36-23 in the first quarter and have **scored at least 32 points in the first quarter in each of their last nine games and at 30.6 ppg in the opening period are the league's highest scoring teams in the first quarter while shooting .580 from the field, which also ranks 1st.** The team has **won 11 out of 14 and eight out of the last nine first quarters** this season with an average **margin of +4.9, which is a league best.**
- In hitting 42 more three-point field goals than their opponents (2nd largest differential - Orlando), Cleveland ranks 2nd (Phoenix) in three-point percentage at .443 and is one of the most improved teams from last season (.393 to .443, +.050). Meanwhile, their opponents have only connected on .300 of their three-point attempts this season, which is 3rd lowest.**
- On the year, the Cavaliers have three players in the Top 15 in marksmanship from behind the arc: Anthony Parker is **shooting a team-leading 28-53 (.528) on three-point attempts, which is 3rd in the NBA** while **Mo Williams at 30-62 (.484) ranks 9th and Daniel Gibson at 25-54 (.455) is tied for 14th.** Gibson's **25 three-point field goals is the most off the bench this season.**

CAVALIERS 97, 76ERS 91 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA, CLEVELAND, OH (11/21/09)

KEYS TO THE GAME: LeBron James led the Cavaliers with a game-high 32 points on 13-20 (.650) shooting including 2-4 (.500) from behind the three-point line, nine assists and seven rebounds in 39 minutes...Zydrunas Ilgauskas played in his 721st career game (672 starts) as a Cavalier, surpassing Bingo Smith (720 games) for second all-time in games played in franchise history and finished the game with 13 points on 6-10 (.600) shooting, eight rebounds, four assists and two blocks in 34 minutes...Mo Williams finished with 18 points, a season-high tying eight rebounds, five assists and three steals in 41 minutes... CAVALIERS 105, PACERS 95 – CONSECO FIELDHOUSE, INDIANAPOLIS, IN (11/19/09)

KEYS TO THE GAME: LeBron James tallied a season-high 40 points, nine rebounds and a game-high seven assists in 38 minutes to lead the Cavaliers...it was his 34th career 40-point game and it marked the third consecutive game that James has scored at least 35 points at Conseco Fieldhouse, which is the arena's longest streak by any player...he made his first eight shots and finished the first half with 22 points...Mo Williams paced the Cavaliers with 18 points, including a perfect 11-11 in free throws, three rebounds and four assists...Danny Granger led the Pacers with 19 points, nine rebounds and a team-high five assists...Brandon Rush added 16 points, four rebounds and three assists...Troy Murphy had a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds off Indiana's bench.

TURNING POINT: James scored 10 of his season-high 40 points in the final 7:07 of the fourth quarter and drained a 3-pointer over Dahntay Jones as the shot clock expired that gave the Cavaliers a 101-94 lead with 53 seconds left.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: J.J. CAVALIERS 114, WARRIORS 108 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA, CLEVELAND, OH (11/17/09)

KEYS TO THE GAME: LeBron James notched his second double-double of the season with 31 points on 11-19 (.579) shooting and a season-high tying 12 assists in 39 minutes... it was the 29th time James has notched at least 30 points and 10 assists in a game, and the Cavs are 22-7 (.759) in those games...he also tallied five rebounds, two blocks and one steal while shooting 8-10 (.800) from the free throw line...for the third game in a row, J.J. Hickson set a new career high in scoring with 21 points while shooting a career-high 9-9 (1.000) from the field to go along with a career-high tying nine rebounds in 34 minutes...Mo Williams had a season-high eight rebounds to go along with 16 points on 7-14 (.500) shooting, six assists and two steals in 35 minutes...Monta Ellis finished with 23 points accompanied by eight assists in 46 minutes to lead the Warriors...Corey Maggette had 19 points on 6-16 (.375) shooting, 11 rebounds and two steals in 32 minutes off the bench.

KEYS TO THE GAME: LeBron James finished with a game-high nine assists accompanied by 21 points, six rebounds, two steals and a block in 38 minutes...J.J. Hickson set a new career high with 20 points on 7-13 shooting (.538) and 6-7 (.857) from the free throw line to go along with four rebounds in 38 minutes...Mo Williams tallied 21 points on 9-18 (.500) shooting to go along with six assists, two steals and two blocks in 34 minutes...Carlos Boozer had a double-double with a game-high 25 points on 9-16 (.563) shooting and 12 rebounds in 38 minutes...Eric Maynor scored 24 points on 9-16 (.562) shooting and dished out four assists in 41 minutes.

TURNING POINT: LeBron James put the Cavaliers ahead for good with his and-one basket to make the score 103-101 with 28.8 seconds remaining.

2009-10 CAVALIERS TEAM NOTES

ADDITIONAL QUICK FACTS: Additional things of note with the Cavaliers recent play include the following:

- **Ranking 7th in the NBA in field goal percentage at .471**, the Cavaliers have scored 100 points in six of their last eight games and **are 8-0 when hitting the century mark**.
- Cleveland is **now 3-0 against teams from the Western Conference and are the only Eastern Conference team to not have a loss against a Western team**.

RANK AND FILE: For the 2009-10 NBA season, the Cavaliers rank in the Top 10 in the following defensive and offensive statistical categories:

- Cleveland is **allowing only 34.1 points in the paint on the season, which is the lowest in the NBA**. This continues an upward trend as last season the team allowed 37.1, which was 6th best in the NBA.
- The Cavaliers **rank 3rd (Orlando, Milwaukee) in offensive rebounds per game allowed to opponents at only 9.4 per game**.
- The team **rank 6th in 11.9 second chance points** allowed per game.
- Cleveland **rank 9th in fewest fast break points allowed at 11.2** per game.
- The Cavaliers are **tied for 9th in blocks per game at 5.5**.

LEBRON'S LEAD: The leadership of LeBron James has helped the Cavaliers get off to one of the best starts in franchise history. In the Cavaliers first quarters, in which the team is leading the league in scoring, James has **either scored or assisted on 106 of the team's 176 first-quarter baskets (60.2%)**. His **9.5 ppg in the first quarter ranks 4th in the NBA**. More so, **no other player in the league has assisted or scored on a higher percentage of his team's overall baskets this season than James (251 field goals and assists combined on 506 team field goals, which equals 50.2%)**. He has **led the Cavaliers in both points and assists in 12 of the team's 14 games (NBA-best) and since the 2007-08 season, has also led the league with 116 games of leading the team in both categories**. (STATS, Inc.)

UPCOMING MILESTONES: After becoming the franchise leader last season in rebounds and blocks, Zydrunas Ilgauskas is closing in on another milestone in all-time games played in team history. In three games, he (721 games, 672 starts) **will surpass Cavaliers General Manager Danny Ferry, the team's all-time leader with 723 games played**.

DYNAMITE: J.J. Hickson had a tremendous streak of setting **successive career highs over a three game stretch (18 points at Miami on Nov. 12, 20 points versus Utah on Nov. 14 and 21 versus Golden State on Nov. 17)** and averaged 19.7 points on 23-31 shooting (.742) and 5.7 rebounds in 34.3 minutes per game over that span. Hickson's perfect shooting game against Golden State on Nov. 17 made him **just one of two players to shoot at least 9-9 from the field this season (Toronto's Chris Bosh was 9-9 at New Orleans on Nov. 6, 2009) and only the sixth Cavs player to shoot at least 9-9 from the field in a game** (Johnny Warren, 12-12 in 1973; Zydrunas Ilgauskas, 10-10 in 2008; Luke Rackley, 9-9 in 1970; Phil Hubbard, 9-9 in 1988; and Tyrone Hill, 9-9 in 1996). Since gaining a starting role in the last seven games, he has averaged 13.6 points on .679 shooting, .704 shooting from the stripe and 4.6 rebounds. (Elias)

STRONG STRETCH: Over a five-game winning streak from Nov. 6 - 17, the Cavs scored at least 100 points in each game and **outscored their opponents 106.8-99.8**. The team **connected on 44-92 (.478) from beyond the arc while holding opponents to just 31-104 (.298) in that span**. In that streak, LeBron James **averaged 31.0 points on 50-94 (.538) shooting and 48-58 (.828) from the stripe, 6.2 rebounds, 8.2 assists and 1.8 steals**. Mo Williams **averaged 20.4 points on 43-76 (.566) shooting, including 12-21 (.571) from beyond the arc, 3.6 rebounds and 4.6 assists**.

GARDEN HUNTING: Against the Knicks on Nov. 6, LeBron James scored 19 points in the first quarter on 8-9 (.889) shooting, **the third-highest opening period total in his career**, on his way to a game-high 33 points on 12-17 (.706) shooting, eight rebounds, a game-high nine assists and three steals in 36 minutes. James' performance led the team to score a season-high 40 points in the first quarter on 16-22 (.727) shooting. In 11 career games at the Garden, **LeBron James has averaged 30.4 points on .487 shooting, including .458 from behind the arc, 5.8 rebounds, 6.8 assists and 2.4 steals. James ranks 2nd in scoring behind K. Bryant at 30.5 for visiting players**. (STATS, Inc.) **For the season, James is averaging 26.3 points, 7.7 rebounds and 8.0 assists (ranks 2nd in the East) and 1.7 steals in 37.9 minutes**.

RAPTOR RULER: At Toronto on Oct. 28, LeBron James **recorded his 25th career triple-double (20-5) and his third against the Raptors with 23 points, 11 rebounds and 12 assists**. James is **the first Raptors opponent to have three regular season three-doubles (Nov. 24, 2007 - 37 points, 12 rebounds, 12 assists) and (April 20, 2005 - 27 points, 14 rebounds, 14 assists) and two of the three have been in Toronto**. James' 12 assists are also the most the Raptors have ever given up to one player in a season opener. James **has averaged 29.2 points per game at Toronto throughout his career (11 games), the most of any player all-time** (minimum of two games). (STATS, Inc.)

SEASON OPENER: In the season opener against Boston, LeBron James (24 years, 301 days old) **became the youngest player to reach 13,000 career points**, passing Kobe Bryant (26 years, 132 days old). He notched his 13,000th point after hitting a three-pointer at the 4:47 mark of the first quarter. James finished with a game-high 38 points on 12-22 (.545) shooting, including 4-9 (.444) on three-pointers and 10-13 (.769) from the free throw line, and team-highs of eight assists and four blocks in 45 minutes. **James' 38 points on Tuesday set a Cavaliers record for points in a season-opener, previously held by Ron Harper's 36 points at Chicago in 1989**. James's **output was the highest against Boston in the Celtics' first game of a season since George Gervin scored 39 points for the Spurs win in 1977**. (Elias)

NBADL UPDATE: The Erie BayHawks conducted their NBADL Draft and selected Donell Taylor in the first round. Erie had the 2nd overall pick in the first round and selected Donell Taylor (6' 6" / 215 lbs.) of the University of Alabama- Birmingham. Undrafted out of college Taylor is a veteran of two seasons with the Washington Wizards and has spent the past couple of seasons playing in Greece and Belgium. In the second round the BayHawks snagged John Bryant, a 6' 11" - 300 pound center from Santa Clara University. While with the Broncos, Bryant averaged 18 points, 12 rebounds and 2.5 block shots per game.

In their first and only preseason game, the Erie BayHawks, down by as many as 17, bounced back to defeat the Fort Wayne Mad Ants in a 106-100 victory. The BayHawks comeback was sparked off the bench by shooting guard Rod Wilmont, who notched 23 points including shooting 12-12 from the free throw stripe. BayHawks veterans Oliver Lafayette chipped in 14 points and Jarvis Gunter marked a double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds. The same two teams will square off in the season opener next Friday, November 27 in Fort Wayne. Erie's home opener is set for December 12 at the Tullio Arena vs. the expansion Maine Red Claws.

2009-10 CAVALIERS OFF THE COURT NOTES

NBA'S TOP OVERALL DRAW: The Cavaliers continue to be one of the NBA's most watched teams and this season the team is leading the league in overall average attendance. The team is playing to a 42-game (including the 2009 playoffs and all seven games this season) regular season home sellout streak. The Cavaliers are averaging 20,562 fans this season, which is 120 fans above the 20,442 fans mark from last season through seven games, and has played to sellout crowds in all seven road games (ten counting back to the 2008-09 regular season) with an average attendance of 19,239 on the road, which is on pace to be close to a 2.0% increase from the average of 18,889 fans last season. Combined, the team is averaging 19,900 fans in attendance, which is a league-best to date this season. Cleveland ranked fourth in the league last season in average home attendance at 20,512 fans (and recorded sellouts in 38 of 41 home games, the most in franchise history during the regular season. On the road, the Cavs attracted 18,889 fans per game, which ranked third in the NBA. Cleveland's combined home and road attendance of 19,706 was the best all-time in franchise history and ranked second in the NBA.

MUST SEE TV: The Cavaliers continue to be one of the top teams in the NBA in local television and radio ratings. The team's opening night game against Boston on October 27th at Quicken Loans Arena, which was nationally broadcast on TNT, had a 19.5 television rating and a 29.0 household share, which amounts to approximately 750,000 viewers, not including bars/restaurants and other public group viewing totals. The 19.5 rating is also the second highest regular season rating in franchise history behind the 20.5 television rating on February 8, 2009, against the L.A. Lakers on ABC. For the first time in Cavaliers history, all games broadcast this season on FOX Sports Ohio (FSO) will be presented in High Definition (HD). Also, all FSO games will be re-aired the next day or at midnight following the game for Friday and Saturday games. The team's regional broadcast ratings on FSO have netted a 8.2 rating and a 13.0 household share so far this season.
