TONIGHT'S QUICK FACTS

- The Cavs and Pacers meet for the second of four times this season tonight. In their first meeting, the Pacers beat the Cavs 98-91 in overtime.
- **Tonight is the Cavs fourth game in a nine game home stand, which is the longest home stand in team history and is tied for the third longest in NBA history.** The last team to have a home stand of nine or more games was the Vancouver Grizzlies in the 1999-00 season.
- **The Cavs chased down 14 offensive boards against the 76ers on Feb. 11. Currently, the Cavs average 12.7 offensive rebounds per game, which ranks third in the NBA.**
- **Cleveland outscored Philadelphia 44-40 in the paint on Feb 11. The Cavs have now outscored their opponents in points in the paint in nine of their last 11 games.**
- For the season, **the Cavs are giving up only 9.5 fast break points per game which is the second fewest in the NBA.**
- Against the 76ers on Feb. 11, Ramon Sessions dished out eight assists and scored 19 points on 8-15 (.533) shooting from the floor in 32 minutes. **In his last seven games, Sessions is averaging 12.9 points, 9.6 assists and 3.9 rebounds in 32.9 minutes per game. He is also shooting .846 (22-26) from the free throw line during that stretch.**
- Antawn Jamison poured in a game-high tying 20 points on 8-16 (.500) shooting, in addition to grabbing eight rebounds in 31 minutes against Philadelphia on Feb. 11. **Over his last six games, Jamison is averaging 23.5 points on .482 shooting and 9.5 rebounds in 35.7 minutes per game.**
- Against the 76ers on Feb. 11, Alonzo Gee tallied 17 points on 4-8 (.500) shooting, in 24 minutes off the bench. Gee also collected six rebounds and by going 9-10 (.900) from the foul line, set a career-high in free throws made and tied a career-high in free throws attempted.. **In his last eight games, Gee is averaging 14.5 points on .480 (36-75) shooting, 3.8 rebounds and is shooting .450 (10-22) from long distance and .810 (34-42) from the stripe in 30.3 minutes per game.**

KEYS TO THE GAME: Antawn Jamison poured in a game-high tying 20 points on 8-16 (.500) shooting, in addition to grabbing eight rebounds in 31 minutes...Alonzo Gee tallied 17 points on 4-8 (.500) shooting, in 24 minutes off the bench. Gee also collected six rebounds and by going 9-10 (.900) from the foul line, set a career-high in free throws made and tied a career-high in free throws attempted...Ramon Sessions dished out eight assists and scored 19 points on 8-15 (.533) shooting from the floor in 32 minutes... KEYS TO THE GAME: Antawn Jamison notched a season high in scoring for the third consecutive game with 34 points on 14-21 (.667) shooting from the floor in 44 minutes. Jamison added 11 rebounds and three assists...Ramon Sessions handed out a game-high 16 assists in a Cavalier season-high 45 minutes of work, to go along with 12 points and five rebounds...In his third start of the season, Daniel Gibson finished with 17 points on 7-12 (.583) shooting from the field to go along with a season-high eight assists in 42 minutes...Brandon Jennings led the Bucks in scoring with 24 points, in addition to a team-high eight assists and five rebounds in 43 minutes...In 30 minutes off the bench, Ersan Ilyasova scored 12 points on 4-8 (.500) shooting from the field to go along with six rebounds...Drew Gooden ended the night with 19 points and six rebounds in 31 minutes of action.

KEYS TO THE GAME: Ramon Sessions had season highs in points and assists with 24 and 13 respectively. He shot 9-16 (.563) from the floor in 39 minutes, in what was his 1st start of the season... Antawn Jamison set a new season high in points for the second consecutive game as he finished with 27 points on 10-18 (.556) shooting to go along with eight boards and three assists in 38 minutes...In 32 minutes, Anderson Varejao collected 11 rebounds (three offensive) and scored 15 points on 6-8 (.750) shooting... In 37 minutes, Blake Griffin recorded his 15th double-double of the season with 25 points on 8-16 (.500) shooting from the field and 15 rebounds...Chris Paul tallied a team-high 12 assists to go along with 16 points on 5-16 (.312) shooting in 37 minutes of work for his sixth double-double of the season...Caron Butler finished the game with 21 points on 8-15 (.533) shooting in 36 minutes.

CAVALIERS 91, MAVERICKS 88 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (2/4/12)

KEYS TO THE GAME: Anderson Varejao collected 17 rebounds (seven offensive) in addition to 17 points on 8-13 (.615) shooting in 33 minutes...Kyrie Irving tallied 20 points while shooting 9-17 (.529) from the field in 36 minutes. This marks the 11th game Irving has scored at least 20 points...Ramon Sessions played 29 minutes off the bench and had a game-high eight assists to go along with six points...Dirk Nowitzki led the Mavericks with a game-high 24 points on 9-15 (.600) shooting. Nowitzki also added eight rebounds and three assists in 35 minutes...Delonte West dished out a team-high seven assists, to go along with 11 points in 28 minutes of action...In 29 minutes off the bench, Brandon Wright scored 11 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting to go along with a team-high tying eight rebounds and four blocked shots.

TURNING POINT: The Cavs erased a 15-point third quarter deficit which led to a back and forth final quarter. Trailing by three in the final minutes, the Cavs scored six straight points to take a three point lead with under a minute left. Kyrie Irving then made a reverse layup with 15.8 seconds left to seal the win.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: In 33 minutes of work, Antawn Jamison scored 19 points, pulled down nine rebounds and handed out four assists...In 30 minutes off the bench, Alonzo Gee scored 12 points along with four rebounds, two assists and two steals.

CLEVELAND CAVALIERS TEAM NOTES

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE: After playing his best statistical year of his career in 2010-11, Anderson Varejao is putting up even better numbers this year. **While playing virtually the same number of minutes as last season, Varejao is on pace to set career highs in points, rebounds (offensive, defensive and total) and steals.** Varejao also has 14 double-doubles this season, already surpassing his previous season high of 11 in 2010-11. The box to the right illustrates Varejao's improvements compared to his career stats going into this season.

FINISH STRONG: The Cavs are turning it on in the fourth quarter and have become one of the best fourth quarter teams in the league. **Cleveland is averaging 24.7 points per fourth quarter which is the second most in the league. They are doing much of their damage in the paint in the final period, averaging 11.1 points in the paint in the fourth, which is the second most in the NBA.**

GLASS CLEANERS: This season, the Cavs own the glass on both ends of the court. **For the year, Cleveland ranks third in offensive rebounds per game averaging 12.7 offensive boards per contest. On the defensive end, the Cavs are giving up only 40.4 total rebounds a game which is the sixth fewest in the NBA.**

BEST OF THE NEW CLASS: **Kyrie Irving was named as the NBA's Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in the months of December and January.** For the month, Kyrie Irving averaged 18.1 points on .511 shooting, 3.3 rebounds and 4.9 assists in 28.8 minutes per game. **He ranked 1st in scoring, field goal percentage, three-point percentage, free throw percentage and assists among Eastern Conference rookies for the month.** Irving scored 20 or more points in 10 of 20 games and shot at least .500 from the field 12 times in games played in December and January.

BETTER ALL AROUND: In his third season in the NBA, Alonzo Gee is having his best year. **He is averaging career-highs in points (9.9), rebounds (3.7), assists (1.6) and steals (1.4). He is also shooting a career-high .489 from the field. He has recorded double-digit points in 14 of his 26 games this year.**

PASSING THE BUCK: Against the Bucks on Feb. 10, Ramon Sessions handed out a Cavalier season-high 16 assists to go along with 12 points and five rebounds in 45 minutes of work. Of Sessions' 16 assists, 10 came in the first half of action. **He is the first Cavalier to record 10 or more assists in a half since Sessions reached 10 assists in the second half against the Detroit Pistons on February 9, 2011. The last Cavalier to tally at least 16 assists in a game was Andre Miller (16) against the Atlanta Hawks on April 13, 2002.**

PERFECT VISION: Anderson Varejao scored 20 points and pulled down 20 rebounds (10 offensive) against the Boston Celtics on Jan. 31 **to become the first Cavalier to record at least 20 points and 20 rebounds in a game since Carlos Boozer on March 30, 2004 when he had 23 points and 20 rebounds versus the Dallas Mavericks. Varejao also became the first Cavalier to record at least 20 points and 20 rebounds with 10 offensive rebounds in a game since Kenny Carr had 27 points and 20 rebounds (11 offensive rebounds) against the New York Knicks on February 12, 1981.**

FINISH STRONG: Against the Nets on Jan. 27th, Kyrie Irving scored 21 points in the fourth quarter, including 17 in the last 2:58. **The last rookie to score at least 21 points in the fourth quarter of a game was Marcus Williams of New Jersey on November 24, 2006.** The last rookie to score at least 21 points in any quarter was Roddy Beaubois (21 in the 2nd) of the Dallas Mavericks against the Golden State Warriors on March 27, 2010. **(Elias) The last player in the NBA to score 17 or more points in the final three minutes of the game was Vince Carter who scored 18 points in the last three minutes for the Nets against Chicago on April 11, 2006. (Elias)**

DOING IT ALL: Against the Timberwolves on January 6, Anderson Varejao scored 13 points to go along with 12 rebounds (5 offensive), five assists, four steals and two blocks in 34 minutes becoming the first Cavalier to record at least those numbers since LeBron James put up 31 points, 19 rebounds, eight assists, four steals and three blocks against Charlotte on Jan. 11, 2008 and was the first person in the league to have at least those numbers since Paul Millsap against New Orleans on April 9, 2010.

REBOUND MACHINE: Anderson Varejao grabbed 10 or more rebounds in eight straight games from Jan. 4-17, which was his longest streak of consecutive games with 10-plus rebounds in his career. **The last Cavalier to pull down double-digit rebounds in at least eight consecutive games was Tyrone Hill (10 straight) from February 1, 1997 to February 23, 1997.**

IN GOOD HANDS: In his NBA debut, Kyrie Irving scored six points while dishing out seven assists and only having one turnover against Toronto on Dec. 26. **He is the first Cav to have at least seven assists and one or fewer turnovers in their NBA debut. The last player to record seven or more assists and one or fewer turnovers in their NBA debut was Mario Chalmers who had eight assists and one turnover for Miami on 10/29/08 against the Knicks.**

YOUNG GUNS: The Cavs opening night roster has an average 3.33 years of NBA experience with is the fourth lowest average in the league and the lowest in the Eastern Conference. The Cavs have seven players with one year or less NBA experience.

PICK OF THE LITTER: In the 2011 NBA Draft, the Cavaliers selected guard Kyrie Irving with the first overall pick and forward Tristan Thompson with the fourth overall pick. Cleveland was the first team in the lottery era (since 1985) to have two picks in the top four and first team to have two of the top four picks since the Rockets in 1983.

CANTON CHARGE UPDATE: The Canton Charge, the NBA Development League team owned and operated by the Cleveland Cavaliers, currently sit at 15-16 in the D-League Eastern Conference. Guard Manny Harris leads the team in scoring averaging 18.8 points to go along with 7.7 rebounds in 15 games. Center Dante Milligan leads the team in rebounds, averaging 8.8 to go along with 8.9 points per game in 28 games.

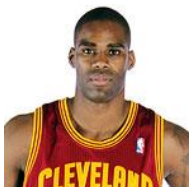
