The Magic outscored the Celtics 36-11 in the third quarter and were able to hold off a late Celtic charge in the fourth as the Magic ended the C's three game winning streak with a 96-89 victory...Rajon Rondo fell just shy of a triple-double, finishing with a team-high 17 points and nine assists to go along with eight boards...Marquis Daniels made his return from left thumb surgery and responded with eight points and three boards in 12:31...The Celtics had 24 assists on 35 field goals...The Magic converted 12-of-17 field goals during the third quarter (70.6%) while they held the C's to just 4-of-14 from the floor (28.6%)...Vince Carter led the Magic with 20 points while Dwight Howard posted a double-double of 16 points and 13 boards.

Eddie House hit a career-high eight three pointers as the Celtics got their ninth straight victory with a 119-100 win over the Kings...House finished the night with a game-high 28 points...House out-scored the Kings bench 28-24...The C's bench netted 61 points on the night...Tony Allen returned after missing 11 games due to a right ankle strain and arguably had his best game of the season with 10 points, eight boards and three steals...Rajon Rondo netted 24 points to go along with a game-high nine assists...The Celtics netted 40 points during the second quarter, a season-high...The Kings were led by John Salmons and his 22 points while Jason Thompson netted 22 points and grabbed 11 boards.

BOSTON 108, SACRAMENTO 63 – ARCO Arena, Sacramento, CA (12/26/08)

The Celtics were able to get back to their winning ways with a 108-63 defeat of the Kings at the ARCO Arena...The 45 point win was the largest scoring margin in a victory that the Celtics had ever had over the Kings franchise...The previous record was 36 points...Kevin Garnett led the Celtics with 21 points and 11 boards in just 23 minutes...Eddie House led the resurgent C's bench with 15 points...The bench accounted for 44 points...The Celtics held the Kings to just 27.9% from the field (19-68) and also held the Kings to just 10 assists...John Salmons was the only King to reach double-figures in scoring with 11 points...The 63 points was the sixth fewest allowed by the Celtics during the shot clock era...It also marked the second fewest field goals allowed by a Celtic team in franchise history.

TEAM NOTES...

KEVIN GARNETT NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE ALL-STAR STARTER...

Kevin Garnett was named a starter for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game in Dallas that will take place on February 14...Garnett was named a starter on January 21 and this marks his 13th time being named an All-Star...The 2003 All-Star MVP received 1,978,116 votes from the fans and has been named to the second most all-star teams among active players behind Shaquille O'Neal (15).

RONDO AND PIERCE NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE ALL-STAR RESERVES...

Rajon Rondo and Paul Pierce were named to the Eastern Conference All-Star team for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game in Dallas that will take place on February 14...Pierce and Rondo join Kevin Garnett who was named to the East team on January 21st as a starter...Pierce will take part in his eighth All-Star game while Rondo makes his first trip as an All-Star.

PIERCE NAMED TO FOOT LOCKER THREE-POINT SHOOTOUT...

Paul Pierce has been named as one of the participants of the Foot Locker Three-Point Shootout on All-Star Saturday Night that will compete on February 13...He will compete against Daequan Cook (Miami), Chauncey Billups (Denver), Danilo Gallinari (New York), Channing Frye (Phoenix) and Stephen Curry (Golden State)...This is Pierce's second time in the competition (also competed in 2002).

RONDO MAKING MAJOR STRIDES IN HIS FOURTH SEASON...

Rajon Rondo has dramatically improved his overall game from his third to his fourth seasons as an NBA player...Rondo entered the season with 23 total double-doubles to his name in his first three seasons...So far during the 2009-10 season he has posted 23 double-doubles and is currently 10th in that category league-wide...He also has improved his numbers in points, assists, steals, field goal percentage and assist-to-turnover ratio...listed below are some of those figures in his career and how he has improved upon them during the 2009-10 campaign.

Rajon Rondo is entering rare territory for point guards as he entered the second half of the season against the LA Clippers on 1/25 with averages of 14.1 points, 9.6 assists and 2.5 steals per game while shooting 53.1 percent from the floor...Only one other point guard, Hall of Famer John Stockton, has finished a season with those numbers and he did it twice (1987-88 and 1988-89)...listed below are Rondo's current numbers for the season and Stockton's two seasons.

When the lineup of Kendrick Perkins, Kevin Garnett, Paul Pierce, Ray Allen and Rajon Rondo has been out at the opening tip-off for the Celtics they have posted a record of 109-33 since the beginning of the 2007-08 season...The Celtics have posted a record of 57-15 at home and a record of 52-18 on the road during those 142 games.

GARNETT IN TOP 25 ALL-TIME IN SCORING...

On December 8 against Milwaukee, Kevin Garnett joined a rare fraternity of NBA players when he passed Hal Greer for 25th All-Time in NBA history in scoring...Garnett needed just 10 points coming into the night and would finish the game with 25...Listed below are the next players in KG's sights...On February 1, KG would pass one of the greatest Celtics ever in Larry Bird when he netted 19 points and took the 24th spot on the list...He passed former Celtic Gary Payton two games later when he netted 10 points against New Jersey (2/5).

Prior to the start of the 2007-08 season, Ray Allen said that opponents would have a lot to fear coming into the Garden with the team that was assembled...Allen has almost been prophetic in that regard as the Celtics are 85-21 at home since the start of the 2007-08 season...The Celtics have lost three or more games in a row only once and have had five winning streaks of 11 games or longer during that span.

RONDO POSTS 30-15...

Rajon Rondo posted 30 points and 15 assists against the Warriors on 12/28...He became just the third Celtic to ever post those numbers in a game joining Larry Bird and Bob Cousy...Both Cousy and Bird have completed that feat twice...Bird last accomplished that feat on 4/1/87 against Washington when he had 30 points, 15 assists and 17 rebounds.

GARNETT NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK...

Kevin Garnett was named the Eastern Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending 12/6/09...He averaged a team-high 19.7 points to go along with 7.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists in the three games...This is Garnett's fourth time winning the award as a Celtic and his 19th time overall.

RONDO PRODUCES ONE OF A KIND NIGHT...

Kevin Garnett shot 11-for-12 from the floor against the Heat on November 29 and finished with 24 points on the night...That matched the highest field goal percentage by a Celtic in the past 15 years (minimum of 10 field goal attempts)...He matched the mark by Ricky Davis when he also shot 11-for-12 against the Sacramento Kings on February 17, 2004.

GARNETT YOUNGEST TO REACH 40,000 CAREER MINUTES...

Kevin Garnett became the 22nd player in NBA history to reach 40,000 career minutes when he played against the Orlando Magic on November 20, 2009...He also became the youngest player in NBA history to reach that milestone at the age of 33 years, 185 days...KG beat the record that was previously established by Oscar Robertson (34 years, 39 days).

RAY ALLEN NETS HIS 20,000TH CAREER POINT...

Ray Allen scored his 20,000th career point fittingly on a three-pointer against the Washington Wizards (12/10)...He is the sixth player to reach that milestone as a Celtic, joining Kevin Garnett, Gary Payton, Robert Parish, Larry Bird and John Havlicek...No other team has had six players score their 20,000th career point while wearing its colors.

Glenn "Doc" Rivers is entering his sixth season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics. He was named to the position on April 29, 2004, becoming the 16th Head Coach in franchise history.

In his first season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics Rivers led the club to a 45-37 (.549) record as well as the teams first Atlantic Division title since the 1991-92 season.

Rivers guided the 2007-08 Celtics to their 17th NBA championship behind an NBA-best 66-16 regular season record which also was his best coaching record in a single season. During the course of the 2007-08 season he was named NBA Coach of the Month three times. He is the only Celtics coach since the award's inception during the 1982-83 season to win the award three times. He joins K.C. Jones, Jimmy Rodgers and Chris Ford as the only Celtics Head Coach's to have won the award.

Rivers is only the fourth coach in franchise history to have earned the NBA Coach of the Year Award, joining Tom Heinssohn (1972-73), Bill Fitch (who won it with Cleveland (1975-76) and Boston (1979-80)) and Red Auerbach (1964-65) for whom the trophy is named.

In Rivers' second season with Boston he led the Celtics to a record of 33-49. The Celtics finished 3rd in the Atlantic division, 16 games behind division winner New Jersey.

The 42-year old Rivers spent four plus seasons as the Head Coach of the Orlando Magic. In his first year at the helm in Orlando he led a team predicted by most to finish near or at the bottom of the league that included four starters who were not drafted. Rivers guided the team to a 41-41 record, and for his efforts, Rivers was named the 1999-2000 NBA Coach-of-the-Year.

Rivers served as an analyst, paired with Al Michaels, for ABC Sports coverage of the NBA during the 2003-04 season, following his release from the Magic on November 17, 2003. Overall he compiled a 171-168 record (.506) in his four-plus seasons as Orlando's Head Coach, advancing the team to the playoffs three times.

Rivers played 13 seasons in the NBA for the Atlanta Hawks (1983-84 to 1990-91), Los Angeles Clippers (1991-92), New York Knicks (1992-93 to 1993-94) and San Antonio Spurs (1994 to 1995-96). He played for three of the game's top coaches in Pat Riley, Larry Brown and Mike Fratello, and holds career averages of 10.9 points, 5.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game. His teams advanced to the NBA Playoffs 10 times, where he averaged 11.4 points, 5.9 assists and 3.3 rebounds. Rivers saw action in 864 regular season games and 81 playoff games over the course of his career.

Rivers averaged a double-double in 1986-87 (12.8 ppg., 10.0 apg.) and was selected to play in the 1988 NBA All-Star Game. He averaged a career-best 15.2 points per game in 1990-91. He scored a career-high 37 points against Seattle on February 4, 1988. He also shares an NBA single-game playoff record for most assists in one half (15 vs. Boston, May 16, 1988).

Drafted after his junior season out of Marquette by the Atlanta Hawks in the second round (31st overall) of the 1983 NBA Draft, he played the first eight years of his career with Atlanta, setting the Hawks' single-season assists record with 823 in 1986-87, and ending his stint with the team as the franchises all-time assist leader with 3,866.

- Won his first playoff game as Celtics Head Coach with a 102-82 win over Indiana (04/23/05) in Game 1 of the First Round of the 2005 NBA Playoffs.
- Recorded his 250th career coaching win in a 110-108 OT win vs. Charlotte (11/8/06).
- Recorded his 100th Celtics coaching win in a 105-96 2OT win vs. Orlando (3/28/07).
- Won Coach of the Month for the Month of November 2007 after leading the Celtics to a 13-2 month.
- Recorded 300th career coaching win in a 97-93 win vs. Houston (1/2/08).
- Won Coach of the Month for the third straight month in November 2008 making him one of three coaches to achieve that feat joining Larry Brown (Philadelphia 2002-03) and Flip Saunders (Detroit 2005-06).
- Recorded 200th Celtics coaching win in a 118-86 win vs. New Jersey (1/14/09).
- Recorded 250th Celtics coaching win in a 110-105 win at Memphis (12/14/09).
