The New Orleans Hornets rebounded with a 112-84 victory against the Los Angeles Clippers at Staples Center. Devin Brown matched his career-high with 25 points before taking the fourth quarter off. Peja Stojakovic moved into the starting frontcourt against the Clippers and contributed 12 points; including eight in the opening quarter when the Hornets took a lead they never surrendered. The Hornets were able to end Chris Kaman's streak of scoring 20-plus points at six games. Kaman, who was named Western Conference Player of the Week earlier in the day after averaging 24.3 points and 9.7 rebounds last week, finished with 14 points and six rebounds. Brown and Stojakovic looked comfortable from the start, converting 6-for-8 from beyond the 3-point line in the opening quarter and combining for 20 points to help the Hornets to a 35-28 advantage. They made two 3-pointers each during a 12-0 run that gave the Hornets a nine-point lead with 6:09 left in the first quarter. The Clippers never drew within four points the rest of the game. As a team, the Hornets shot 9-for-13 from 18 feet and beyond during the opening quarter. David West finished with 17 points and nine rebounds. Brown and Stojakovic's early success from the perimeter allowed the Hornets to fall back on defense and opened lanes for point guard Chris Paul, who finished with 24 points and 10 assists. The Clippers kept themselves within striking distance by shooting 61.9 percent from the floor in the first quarter, but they cooled off in the second. The Hornets extended their lead to 31 points heading into the fourth. The Clippers change was the result of a groin injury to Eric Gordon. Al Thornton returned to the lineup at small forward and Rasual Butler filled Gordon's spot at shooting guard. Ricky Davis, who did not play in five of the Clippers' previous six games, added 14 points off the bench. Clippers forward Craig Smith left the game in the fourth quarter with a laceration to his right eye.

- The Oklahoma City Thunder were formerly known as the Seattle SuperSonics from 1967 to 2008 and moved to Oklahoma City following the 2007-08 season.
- **2008-09 SERIES HIGHLIGHTS:** *Jan. 23, 2009:* The Clippers Eric Gordon and Oklahoma City's Kevin Durant put on a show as the Clips held on for a 107-104 win at STAPLES Center....Gordon scored a career-high 41 points and Al Thornton had a season-high 34 points...Durant had a career night, too, with 46 points and 15 rebounds..LA improved to 3-0 against the Thunder...*Dec. 16, 2008:* Zach Randolph had 22 points and 13 rebounds and Eric Gordon fueled a 10-point run in the fourth quarter...Gordon finished with 22 points...Baron Davis scored 19, Marcus Camby added 13 points and 15 rebounds, and Al Thornton had 12 points as all of the Clippers starters' reached double figures...Kevin Durant led Oklahoma City with 23 points, and Jeff Green and Chris Wilcox scored 13 apiece...*Nov. 19, 2008:* The Clippers opened the season series with a 108-88 win over Oklahoma City at the Ford Center....Former Clipper Cuttino Mobley scored 12 of his season-high 23 points during a 23-4 third-quarter run that carried the Clippers to a win...Mobley added a career-high seven steals for the Clippers, who outscored the Thunder 30-16 in the third period...Chris Kaman scored a season-high 25 points and added 14 rebounds...Al Thornton scored 20 points...Kevin Durant had 18 points for the Thunder, and Damien Wilkins finished with 17.
- **CONNECTIONS:** Thunder guard Russell Westbrook is a UCLA product and played two seasons at UCLA...Westbrook was born in Long Beach and was a star at Leuzinger High School in Lawndale, Calif...Oklahoma City assistant coach Rex Kalamian attended Cal Poly Pomona...Thunder guard Shaun Livingston was drafted by the Clippers with the 4th pick in the 2004 NBA Draft and averaged 7.4 ppg and 4.8 apg in 145 games from 2004-2008...Clippers forward Blake Griffin was born in Oklahoma City and starred at the University of Oklahoma...
- Clippers guard Sebastian Telfair had a career-high four blocks vs. Seattle on Dec. 14, 2007...Clippers forward Craig Smith had a career-high 11 free throws on Nov. 28, 2008 vs. the Thunder...Clippers center made 11 field goals Nov. 19, 2008 vs. Oklahoma City...
- Baron Davis recorded a career-high seven steals on Feb. 26, 2008 against Seattle....Baron Davis had 21 points and 13 assists, including a game-winning three-pointer with 0.4 seconds remaining in overtime on Dec. 13, 2005...On Nov. 6, 2002 Baron Davis grabbed a then career-high 10 rebounds vs. Seattle...

The Clippers won their third game in a row, defeating the Allen Iverson-less Memphis Grizzlies 113-110 at Staples Center. The Clippers haven't won three in a row since December of last season. The Clippers put the finishing touches on Memphis behind 11 fourth-quarter points from Rasual Butler, nine from Chris Kaman and seven off the bench from Craig Smith. Kaman finished with 26, the sixth consecutive game he has topped the 20-point mark, Smith finished with 18 points in just over 22 minutes and Butler contributed 17. The Clippers never led by more than one point until Butler sank a 3-pointer to give them a 105-101 lead with 3:14 remaining. The Clippers then shot 4-for-8 from the free-throw line in the final 1:10 to keep the Grizzlies within striking distance. Memphis had one final shot to tie the game, but Rudy Gay's shot finished with 33 points, just two shy of his career high. He had 31 through the first three quarters, but shot just 1-for-6 in the fourth. Gay scored 14 in the opening quarter to help the Grizzlies to a 29-23 lead. The Clippers fell behind by 11 twice in first half, but answered with 9-0 runs each time to close the gap. Los Angeles took its first lead of the game on a 3-pointer by Smith early in the second -- his first 3-pointer of the season. Zach Randolph finished with 19 points and 12 rebounds for the Grizzlies. Conley added 16 points and six assists and Marc Gasol and DeMarre Carroll scored 10 each. O.J. Mayo, who played his college ball at nearby USC, scored six of his eight points in the fourth.

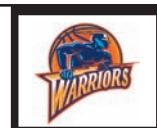

Baron Davis led the Clippers to a 118-90 blowout of the Warriors: Davis had 25 points -- 16 of them in a third quarter where the Clippers outscored the Warriors 34-16 -- seven assists and four steals. The Clippers opened each half with Davis finding Chris Kaman for a pair of layups to set the tone. In all, five of Davis' assists helped Kaman score his 22 points. Kaman thrived inside against overmatched Golden State third-and fourth-string centers Mikki Moore and Anthony Randolph. Kaman continued his tremendous run to begin the season with a fourth consecutive performance of 20 points or more. Eric Gordon gunned his way to 25 points by shredding an array of defenders. Monta Ellis, Stephen Curry and Anthony Morrow each had a spell, with similarly ineffective results as Gordon finished with a season-high 25 points on 8-for-12 shooting, 3-for-5 behind the arc. The Clippers added 22 points in transition and had 19 off Warriors turnovers. With Andris Biedrins (lower back strain) and Ronny Turiaf (sprained left knee) both hurt, the Warriors had no choice but to play small, which is the preference of coach Don Nelson in any case. But Golden State shot 31.8 percent through the first three quarters en route to a 34.5 percentage for the evening as a whole, smothering the vaunted small-ball offense before it even began. Even the emergency usage of Randolph, the second-year big man whose playing time has been sporadically doled out by Nelson, couldn't keep the 18,788 in attendance from fleeing the building early.

CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- **KAMAN HONORED:** Clippers' center Chris Kaman was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, November 2nd through Sunday, November 8th...Kaman led the Clippers to a 3-0 week, averaging 24.3 points on .574 shooting from the field, 9.7 rebounds and 2.0 blocks. Kaman tallied a high for the week with 25 points, 11 rebounds and two blocks in a 93-90 win over Minnesota on November 2nd. Kaman followed up his performance against the Timberwolves with a 22 point, nine rebound and three block night in the Clippers' 118-90 win at Golden State on November 6th. He closed the week out with by tallying 22 points, nine rebounds and four assists in a 113-100 win over Memphis on November 7th. Atlanta's Joe Johnson received the award for the Eastern Conference.
- **BIG LOSS:** The Clippers dropped a 112-84 loss to New Orleans on Nov. 9, 2009. The 28-point loss was the Clippers worst defeat of the season and first 20+ point loss since they fell 106-85 in Utah on March 14, 2009...The 112 points scored by the Hornets was the most points scored by a Clips opponent in 2009-10
- Hornets point guard Chris Paul had a points/assist double-double on Nov. 9, 2009, recording 24 points and 10 assists...Paul was also the last player to register a points/assist double-double in a Clipper game, tallying 30 points and 14 assists on April 1, 2009.
- Clippers center Chris Kaman led the team with 14 points (6-12 FG, 2-6 FT), ending his career-high six-game streak of scoring 20+ points...The Clippers leader in points, field goal percentage and minutes had scored over 20 points in back-to-back games just four previous times in his career, last doing it on Dec. 21, 2008 in Dallas (24 points) and then on Dec. 22, 2008 in San Antonio (20 points)...Kaman also had 20+ points in consecutive games Nov. 16 and Nov. 17, 2008; Nov. 9 and Nov. 11, 2008 and March 11 and March 13, 2006...
- The Clippers bench scored a combined total of 34 points on Nov. 9 vs. New Orleans...It was the third straight game that the Clippers bench had scored 34 combined points...L.A. was led by Ricky Davis off the bench, as the veteran forward scored a season-high 14 points (6-13 FG, 1-4 FT) in a season-high 24:40.
- **INJURY UPDATE:** Clippers guard Eric Gordon missed the Nov. 9 loss to New Orleans due to a sore left groin...Gordon missed a total of four games in his rookie season of 2008-09, as a bruised left shoulder kept him out of action from Feb. 27 - March 4, 2009...**The Clippers are now 0-5 when Gordon misses a game due to injury...**Clippers forward Craig Smith was forced to leave the Nov. 9 game to the Hornets with 8:38 remaining in the fourth quarter due to a laceration under his left eye.

CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- **WIN STREAK ENDS:** The Clippers saw their three-game winning streak come to an end on Nov. 9 vs. the Hornets...It was the Clippers first winning streak since Dec. 12 - Dec. 16, 2008, as they had only one three-game winning streak in 2008-09...The Clippers have not won four games in a row since the opening of the 2007-08 season, when they opened 4-0 from Nov. 2 - Nov. 7....
- **DUNLEAVY MOVING UP NBA RECORD BOOKS:** Clippers head coach Mike Dunleavy won the 595th game of his 16-year coaching career Nov. 7, 2009 ...Dunleavy is now just **five** wins away from 600 NBA wins, and would become the 21st coach in NBA history to win 600 games. Dunleavy's **595** victories places him eighth among active coaches in the league today for wins, trailing only Don Nelson, Jerry Sloan, Larry Brown, Phil Jackson, George Karl, Rick Adelman and Gregg Popovich. Dunleavy's **595** wins is the 21st most in NBA history. Dunleavy needs **34** wins to pass Doug Moe for 20th most wins of all-time and **44** victories to surpass Chuck Daly for 19th...Dunleavy has coached **1,288** career games, the 17th most in NBA history... Holzman coached 1,300 games in an 18-year career.
- **HOT SHOOTING CLIPS:** The Clippers shot 50 percent from the field (42-84) on Nov. 7 in their victory over Memphis...The Clippers have shot 50 percent or better in three of their eight seven games, going 2-1 in those games....Last season, the Clippers did not shoot 50 percent until the 40th game of the year, when they hit 59 percent of their shots Feb. 16, 2009 against Memphis...The Clippers shot over 50 percent from the field just 12 times in 2008-09, going 9-3...In 2007-08, Los Angeles didn't shoot 50 percent from the field until the 33rd game of the season...In the last decade, only the 2004-05 New Orleans Hornets and the 2003-04 Washington Wizards did not shoot 50 percent in more games to start a season, both going 41 games without shooting 50 percent.

- **FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME:** Clippers forward Craig Smith made the first three-pointer of his NBA career on Nov. 7 vs. Memphis, draining a trey from the corner with 7:56 remaining in the first half...Smith entered the Nov. 7 game having gone 0-17 from beyond the arc in 239 career NBA games....
- Clippers center Chris Kaman added 10 foul shots to his 26 points. Kaman went 10-of-12 from the line...He is the first Clippers player to make 10 or more free throws since Eric Gordon had 11 on Feb. 18, 2007.
- **WINNING A CLOSE ONE:** The Clippers won their second close contest, beating Memphis 113-110 on Nov. 7...This season, LA. is 2-1 in games decided by three points or less.... Last season, the Clippers were 6-15 (.285) in games decided by three-points or less...Since 2003-04, the Clippers are 30-48 (.386) in games decided by three points or fewer.
- **DAVIS SHINES, ESPECIALLY AGAINST GOLDEN STATE:** Clippers guard Baron Davis led all scorers on Nov. 6 with a 25 point outburst (8-13 FG, 7-8 FT) against the Warriors....It was the eighth time he has scored 25+ points in 71 games with the Clippers...Of those eight 25+ outings, four have come against his former team, the Warriors...The last time Davis scored over 25 points was on March 17, 2009 in Oakland...Since joining the Clippers, Davis is 2-2 against Golden State while averaging 26.0 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 8.8 apg and shooting 49 percent from the field...On Nov. 6 vs. Golden State, Davis scored 16 of his 25 points in the third quarter...
- **BIG-TIME WIN:** The Clippers 28-point road win on Nov. 6 vs. Golden State was the largest victory away from STAPLES Center since Los Angeles decimated the Pacers by 34 points (102-68) on Nov. 10, 2004...The Clippers 34 point victory margin is a team record, that has been equaled three times...The Clippers 118-90 win over Golden State on Nov. 6 was the Clippers biggest win since they beat Sacramento by 31 points on April 10, 2009...The Clippers built up a 34-point lead vs. the Warriors on Nov. 6, the largest lead they have had in a game since they led the Kings by 31 on April 10, 2009...Against the Warriors on Nov. 6, the Warriors took their 12-point halftime lead and expanded it with a 14-1 third quarter run over a 4:07 second span.
- The Clippers scored a season-high 118 points on Nov. 6 vs. the Warriors...The Clippers scored 118 points or more nine times last season, last scoring over 118 points on March 25, 2009 when they exploded for 140 points vs. the Knicks.
- The Clippers had three players (Chris Kaman, Eric Gordon and Baron Davis) reach 20+ points on Nov. 6, 2009, the second time this season three Clippers scored over 20 points in the same game...Last season, the Clippers had three players reach 20+ points in the same game 11 times...Two Clippers players scored 20+ points on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix for the first time this season, with Marcus Camby going for 23 points and Chris Kaman had 22 points...It was the first time the Clippers have had two players reach 20+ points in a game since April 10, 2009...Last season Los Angeles had two players reach 20+ points in the same game 19 times ...The Clippers had four players reach 20+ points in the same game one time last season...
- **FOURTH QUARTER LEADS:** The Clippers have led after three quarters four times in eight games this season...The Clippers improved to 2-2 this season when leading after three quarters...In the last two seasons, the Clippers have lost a total of 13 times when leading heading into the fourth quarter, going a combined 33-13.
- **FIT TO BE TIED:** Three of the Clippers first six games of 2009-10 have been tied at the half. Last season, the Clippers went into the halftime break with just two games deadlocked. The Clippers went 0-2 in 2008-09 when tied at the half.
- **CAMBY MAKES HISTORY:** Clippers forward **Marcus Camby** recorded the 2,000th block of his NBA career when he stuffed Carlos Boozer with 7:15 remaining in the third quarter. With the block, Camby joins an exclusive club of just 11 NBA players who have recorded both 2,000 or more blocks and over 7,000 career rebounds. Camby is one of 11 total players, and just one of three active players (Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan) to accomplish the feat. The other players in NBA history with over

- **Clippers forward Craig Smith equaled his career-high with three blocks Oct. 30 vs. the Jazz...Smith previously blocked three shots on March 7, 2008 in Sacramento.**

- Clippers guard Kareem Rush made his Clippers debut on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix...Rush entered as a substitute and played 3:14 and grabbed one rebound.

- **Marcus Camby exploded for 23 points (10-15 FG, 3-6 FT)** on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix...It was the most points Camby has scored as a member of the Clippers, and the most points he has scored since March 26, 2007 when he was with Denver. Camby scored 24 points in a loss to Detroit...Camby's 23 points vs. the Suns was the 36th time he has scored over 23+ points in his career...Camby averaged a career-high 14.5 points during his rookie season of 1996-97...

- **HISTORICALLY BAD FROM THE LINE:** Clippers guard Eric Gordon entered the season as a career 85.4 percent free throw shooter. Gordon went 299-of-350 from the line in his rookie year last season....Against the Suns Oct. 28, Gordon missed four foul shots, going 4-of-7 from the charity stripe. It was the most foul shots Gordon has missed in his NBA career.

- **Baron Davis recorded his first double-double of the season on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix, scoring 12 points (4-11 FG, 2-4 FT) to go with 12 assists...It was the 152nd assist/points double-double of Davis' career and his first since April 1, 2009.**

- **Baron Davis had five steals Oct. 28 vs. the Suns, matching his season-high from last season, which he achieved one time...The five steals was two away from his career-high of seven....Davis has now had 5+ steals two times since Feb. 26, 2008.**

- **CAMBY MAKING HISTORY:** Clippers forward/center Marcus Camby is rapidly moving up the list in the NBA record books. Camby currently sits in 66th place on the all-time rebounding list, as he entered the 2009-10 season with **7,437** rebounds...Camby has also recorded the 10th most blocks in NBA history, entering the 2009-10 season by swatting a total of **1,997** shots.

- **CAMBY CAN:** Clippers forward/center Marcus Camby made quite an impression in his first season with the team...Camby finished the season ranked third in the NBA in blocked shots with a team-high 2.13 and grabbed the most rebounds in an NBA game last season when he had 27 on Dec. 17, 2008 vs. Chicago...Camby scored the 8,000th point of his NBA career on March 2 vs. San Antonio...

- **PRESEASON SUCCESS:** The Clippers finished the preseason with a 6-2 record following their victory over New Orleans on Oct. 23. The finish equals the best pre-season mark in Clippers history, as Los Angeles last went 6-2 in the exhibition season in 2005-06, which was the prelude to the Clippers 47-35 season that saw them finish second in the Pacific Division and advance to the Western Conference Semifinals. The last two seasons Los Angeles finished with a 4-4 pre-season record...The Clippers also dropped only two exhibition games in 2001-02, going 5-2 before a 39-43 campaign, and went 5-2 in 1988 before finishing 21-61 and in seventh place in the Pacific Division.

- **GRIFFIN SUFFERS STRESS FRACTURE OF PATELLA:** Clippers rookie forward Blake Griffin suffered a non-displaced stress fracture of his left patella during the Clippers preseason game on Oct. 23...Griffin underwent an MRI on Oct. 26 which confirmed the diagnosis. Griffin was examined by team physician Dr. Steven Shimoyama as well as specialist Dr. Neal ElAttrache. Based on communication between the two physicians, it has been determined that Griffin will be sidelined for approximately six weeks. Griffin will receive bone stimulation and PRP (Platelet Rich Plasma) treatment. Griffin originally suffered a bruised left patella during practice on Thursday, Oct. 24 and was eventually cleared to resume full basketball activity.

- **MILESTONE VICTORIES:** The Clippers have won a total of 385 road games in franchise history and need just 15 victories to reach 400.

- **CLIPPERS TRIPLE-THREAT FROM LONG RANGE:** With the addition of Rasual Butler to the roster the Clippers now have three players (Butler - 140, Eric Gordon - 131, Steve Novak - 119), who hit 100+ three-pointers last season. ***In their history, the Clippers have never had three players each make 100 or more three's in the same season....*** Butler's 140 three's were the 24th best in the league last season, nine more than Clippers leader Eric Gordon. Gordon led the Clips in shooting percent from the three-point land, while Steve Novak hit 41.6 percent from downtown (119-286).

● **AL STEPS IT UP IN YEAR TWO:** Clippers forward Al Thornton improved in nearly every statistical category last season, his second in the NBA. Thornton raised his rebounding, assists, blocks and scoring totals in his second season...Thornton became one of just five second-year players from 2007-09 to improve his scoring from under 15 points per game in his rookie year to scoring over 15 points in the second year.

● **GRIFFIN IS NUMBER ONE:** The number one selection in the 2009 NBA Draft out of the University of Oklahoma, Clippers Blake Griffin is expected to make an immediate impact. Griffin was the consensus NCAA National Player of the Year and averaged 22.7 points and 14.4 rebounds during his final collegiate season...Griffin is the third number one selection in Clippers history, joining Michael Olowokandi (1998) and Danny Manning (1988). The past six number one selections in the NBA draft, dating back to 2003 have enjoyed mixed success. Below is how the last six top picks fared in their rookie season:

● **GRIFFIN IN GOOD COMPANY:** Clippers forward Blake Griffin grabbed 504 total rebounds during his sophomore season at Oklahoma, the most boards in a season by an NCAA Division I player since Indiana State's Larry Bird in 1978-79 (505)...Griffin's rebounding average of 14.4 rebounds per game in 2008-09 was the highest rebounding mark since Wake Forest's Tim Duncan grabbed 14.7 rpg in 1996-97...Upon joining the NBA, both players engineered similar first-year franchise turnarounds. Bird helped improve the Celtics by 32 games in 1979-80, leading Boston to a 61-21 record his first year after a 29-53 campaign the season before. Duncan helped orchestrate the greatest improvement in NBA history, as the Spurs went from 20-62 to 56-26 in his rookie year.

● **ROOKIE SUCCESS:** The Clippers are the only team in the NBA to have a player on their current roster make the NBA All-Rookie First or Second Team for three straight years. As a member of the Timberwolves, Craig Smith was selected to the 2006-07 NBA All-Rookie Second Team, and Al Thornton was named to the 2007-08 All-Rookie First Team...Eric Gordon was recognized on the 2008-09 All-Rookie Second Team...The Memphis Grizzlies have also placed three rookies on an All-Rookie squad from 2006-09, however Juan Carlos Navarro, who made the All-Rookie Second Team in 2007-08 is no longer with the club.

● **GORDON GOES OFF:** As the Clippers highest draft pick since Shaun Livingston (4th pick) in 2004, Eric Gordon lived up to the hype in his first season. Named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team, Gordon finished the season with the highest scoring average (16.1) for a Clippers first-year player since Lamar Odom (16.6) in 1999-2000...Gordon finished the season ranked third among all rookies in scoring and sixth amongst rookies in assists per game (2.8)...**After the All-Star Break, Gordon was the 17th highest scoring guard in the NBA, averaging 18.9 points and shooting nearly 48 percent from the field...**Gordon scored a career-high 41 points Jan. 23, 2009 in a showdown with Oklahoma City's Kevin Durant, scoring the most points ever by a Clippers rookie and securing the most points scored by a rookie in an NBA game in 2008-09...Gordon averaged 18.4 points, 2.9 rebounds and 3.1 assists in his 64 starts...Gordon was named the January T-Mobile Rookie of the Month.

● **Baron Davis** equaled his career-high with 20 assists on Feb. 11, 2009 vs. New York and did it again on March 18, 2009 vs. Washington...Davis became the first Clippers player to record 20 assists twice in a season since Gary Grant did it during the 1989-1990 season...The previous member of the Clippers to reach 20 assists in a game was Grant, who had 21 dishes on Jan. 18, 1990 vs. Seattle.

● **DISHING IT OUT:** Clippers point guard Baron Davis led the team with 7.7 assists per game in 2008-09, and finished the season ranked seventh in the NBA in that category, and had the 16th most assists in the league...Davis' 501 assists were the most by a Clippers player in a season since 2002-03, when Andre Miller dished off for 537...The 501 assists represented a down year for Davis, as it was the lowest assist total of his career since 2005-06 when he totaled 480 in 54 games with Golden State...Davis also shot a career-low 37 percent from the field last season, going 355-for-959...His previous worst shooting season was a 38.7 percent mark in 2004-05.

● **Clippers center DeAndre Jordan** grabbed a career-high 20 rebounds Jan. 25, 2009 vs. the Warriors in his fourth-ever start...Jordan became the first rookie to get 20 boards in a game since Chicago's Aaron Gray had 22 boards on April 16, 2000...Jordan is one of only three other active players that had a 20-rebounds game in at least one of their first four career starts. The other three players are: Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan and Aaron Gray.

● Clippers guard Ricky Davis suffered through an injury-plagued 2008-09, appearing in just 36 games due to an injured left knee. It was the fewest games Ricky Davis has played in since 2000-01 when he played in just seven games because of a fractured right foot. From 2001-2008, Ricky Davis only missed a total of 11 games.

● Clippers center Chris Kaman appeared in a career-low 31 games last season, starting 24 and his statistical totals suffered accordingly. Kaman, who has 109 career double-doubles only had nine last season as he struggled with a foot injury...For the second time in his career, Kaman saw his scoring average decline, as he went down from 15.7 ppg in 2007-08 to 12.0 ppg in 2008-09...

● **DUNLEAVY GAINS TENURE:** Clippers head coach Mike Dunleavy is the third-most tenure of all active coaches in the NBA. Mike Dunleavy begins his second season in the dual-role of General Manager and Head Coach and seventh season as the head coach of the Clippers. Dunleavy is now the third most tenured of all active coaches in the NBA, trailing only Utah's Jerry Sloan and San Antonio's Gregg Popovich. Despite a difficult 2008-09 season that saw the Clippers lose the fourth-most games to injury and illness in the NBA (233 games), Dunleavy helped develop a group of promising young players, including guiding first round selection Eric Gordon to become one of the most exciting rookies in the league in 2008. Long known as one of the hardest working and most dynamic coaches in the league, Dunleavy overhauled the Clippers roster prior to the start of the 2009-10 season with the additions of consensus collegiate player of the year Blake Griffin, swingman Rasual Butler, point guard Sebastian Telfair, and forwards Craig Smith and Mark Madsen. Dunleavy became the Clippers all-time franchise leader in victories when he won his 159th game on Dec. 7, 2007, surpassing Dr. Jack Ramsay. Dunleavy's 492 games on the Clippers sideline is the most games coached in club history, as he passed Ramsay (1972-76) and Bill Fitch (1994-98) on Nov. 2, 2007. A 16-year NBA coaching veteran, Dunleavy now ranks eighth among active coaches on the all-time NBA victory list, and is 21st on the all-time NBA wins list. Dunleavy has coached 1,280 career NBA games, the seventh most among active coaches and the 17th most games of any coach in NBA history. Dunleavy led the Clippers to within one game of the Western Conference Finals in 2006 and won his 500th career game as a coach on March 13, 2006. Dunleavy coached his 1,000th career game during the 2005-06 season. The Clippers improved in each of Dunleavy's first three seasons on the bench, increasing their win total from 28 wins in 2003-04 to 47 wins during the 2005-06 campaign. In 2005-06, Dunleavy guided the Clippers to their best record since the franchise moved to California and to their first playoff appearance in nine seasons. Prior to joining the Clippers, Dunleavy guided the Portland Trail Blazers for four seasons (1997-2001), leading them to a 190-106 (.642) record and four straight playoff appearances. Under Dunleavy, the Blazers made two consecutive trips to the Western Conference Finals in 1999 and 2000 with the 1999-00 club winning 59 games, matching the second-best victory total in Blazers history. Dunleavy earned the 1999 NBA Coach of the Year award after leading the 1998-99 Blazers to a Pacific Division-winning 35-15 record. Dunleavy's first head coaching opportunity came with the Los Angeles Lakers in 1990-91, when he led them to a 58-24 record and a berth in the NBA Finals, where they lost in five games to the Chicago Bulls. During the Lakers' run through the 1991 NBA Playoffs, Los Angeles defeated Houston (3-0), Golden State (4-1) and upset Portland (4-2) in the Western Conference Finals, after the Blazers had posted the league's best regular season record (63-19) and two straight NBA Finals appearances. The following year, the Lakers posted a 43-39 record and dropped a first-round series to Portland. Dunleavy moved on in 1992 to Milwaukee, where he compiled a 107-221 (.326) record over four seasons while holding the dual title of Vice President of Basketball Operations and Head Coach. He stepped away from the bench prior to the 1996-97 season to concentrate on his general manager duties with the Bucks for one season before taking the head job in Portland. Selected in the sixth round (99th pick overall) by Philadelphia in 1976, Dunleavy played 11 seasons in the NBA with career averages of 8.0 points and 3.9 assists in 438 games. He played for Philadelphia (1976-78), Houston (1978-82), San Antonio (1982-83) and Milwaukee (1983-85, 1988-1990). During the 1980-81 campaign, Dunleavy averaged a career-best 10.5 points as a starting guard for a Rockets team that reached the NBA Finals. In his lone season in San Antonio, Dunleavy led the NBA in three-point percentage, connecting at a .345 (67-194) clip from behind the arc. A back injury prompted his unofficial retirement following the 1984-85 season and he worked for a New York investment firm before returning to the NBA as an assistant coach with Milwaukee for the 1986-87 season. He stayed on the Bucks' bench through the 1989-90 campaign, but returned to uniform in parts of two seasons (1988-89, 1989-90) when injuries to the Bucks' backcourt forced Dunleavy into the lineup. A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Dunleavy played collegiately at the University of South Carolina, where he finished his career as the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,586 points. He appeared in 111 consecutive games for the Gamecocks, starting his last 105. Dunleavy was a straight A student, majoring in psychology while at South Carolina. He played his prep basketball at Nazareth High School in Brooklyn, where he earned All-New York City honors as a senior and had his number 44 jersey retired. Mike and his wife Emily have three sons: Michael, Jr. (Indiana Pacers), William Baker and James (USC).
