**LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS 106, DENVER NUGGETS 99**  
 GAME #14  
 Friday, November 20, 2009  
 STAPLES Center; Los Angeles, CA



The Los Angeles Clippers pushed all their distractions aside and shocked the Denver Nuggets with a 106-99 victory at Staples Center. The victory ended a seven-game losing streak against the Nuggets and helped silence an impatient crowd that had filled the arena with boos during the Clippers' three-game home losing streak. The Nuggets looked as though they'd stroll right past the Clippers, jumping out to a 26-14 lead late in the first quarter behind 17 points from Carmelo Anthony. However, the Clippers suddenly awakened and scored the final seven points of the first quarter. The reserves then took over at the start of the second and extended the run to 19-0. The Nuggets managed to trim the lead to 10 at the half, but the second quarter still proved to be the highest-scoring (35 points) and best shooting (70 percent) quarter of the season for the Clippers. A big reason was the play of the Los Angeles bench, which scored 38 of the Clippers' 56 first-half points. After shooting 66.7 percent in the third quarter to extend their lead to as much as 19, the Clippers settled for a 15-point advantage heading into the fourth. The final period had been rough on the Clippers in their previous two home games, getting outscored by a combined score of 47-25 and blowing leads each time. They appeared headed for another meltdown as the Nuggets scored 17 of the quarter's first 21 points to cut the deficit to two points with 6:09 remaining. The Clippers strung together one of the biggest three-possession streaks of the season. Rasual Butler, who finished with a season-high 27 points off the bench, sank a 3-pointer, Marcus Camby blocked Anthony's shot on the other end and Baron Davis hit another 3-pointer to push the margin back to nine points. The Nuggets never came closer than five the rest of the way. Al Thornton scored 18 points and Anthony finished with 37 points. Chris Kaman had a season-low 13 points and Baron Davis contributed 12 points and nine assists. Butler, shot 8-for-15 against the Nuggets. Nene had 18 points and 12 rebounds.

**CLIPPERS - TIMBERWOLVES NOTES**

- **2009-10 SERIES HIGHLIGHTS: Nov. 2, 009:** Rasual Butler, making his first start of the season for Los Angeles, converted four free throws in the final 19.4 seconds to hold off the Timberwolves...The Clippers led by as many as 13 points early in the third quarter, but then missed nine consecutive field-goal attempts, allowing the Timberwolves to pull within a point heading into the fourth...The lead changed hands eight times in the fourth quarter before the Clippers went ahead for good on a driving layup by Eric Gordon with 1:32 remaining...Clippers center Chris Kaman scored a team-high 25 points and grabbed 11 rebounds...Baron Davis had 13 points and eight assists and Butler finished with 12 points... Al Jefferson scored 24 points...Corey Brewer had 14 points and rookie point guard Jonny Flynn and forward Oleksiy Pecherov scored 13 each.
- The Clippers last swept a season series vs. Minnesota in 1992-93 when they swept four games from the Timberwolves...Minnesota last swept the Clippers in a season series in 2003-04.
- The Clippers 107-84 win over Minnesota on Dec. 6, 2008 snapped a three-game losing streak to the T-Wolves...It was the first win for L.A. at The Target Center since Jan. 10, 2007...The 23-point victory was also the Clippers biggest margin of victory ever in Minnesota, and the largest since they won by 17-points (124-107) on March 14, 1993...
- **CONNECTIONS:** Clippers guard/forward Ricky Davis played for Minnesota in 2005-06 and the entire 2006-07 season...Davis averaged 17.0 points for the T-Wolves in 06-07...Minnesota forward Kevin Love was born in Santa Monica, Calif. and played his freshman year of college at UCLA...Minnesota guard Jason Hart appeared in 51 games for the Clippers during the 2006-07 and 2008-09 seasons, averaging 6.1 points...Clippers forward Craig Smith and guard Sebastian Telfair joined LA in a trade with the Timberwolves on 7/20/09 in exchange for Quintin Richardson...Smith was drafted by Minnesota and appeared in 233 games from 2006-2009 for the Timberwolves...Telfair played in Minnesota from 2007-09, averaging 9.6 points and 5.2 assists in 135 games.
- **Clippers center Chris Kaman grabbed a career-high 23 rebounds March 13, 2006 vs. Minnesota and also had a career-high four steals...**
- In the 2003-04 NBA Playoffs, Clippers forward Marcus Camby, then with Denver, tied a career-playoff high with 21 points and 15 rebounds in Game 5 against the Timberwolves.

Memphis won its second straight game for the first time this season, knocking off the Los Angeles Clippers, 106-91. The Grizzlies shared the ball on offense, collecting 23 assists. They helped out on defense, rather than allow someone to go off for 30 or 40 points, as they did far too often during their seven-game losing streak. And they got a season-high 31 points from a bench that had been almost non-existent offensively this season. The bench entered the game averaging just 19.6 points. The Grizzlies led from start to finish for the first time this season. Late in the third quarter, they built a 22-point cushion, their biggest lead of the season, as was the 15-point margin of victory. Gasol hit his first seven shots against the Clippers, setting a new franchise record with 15 consecutive field goals. His only miss of the game came on his final attempt in the fourth quarter when he forced to rush a shot with the shot-clock about to expire. Gasol finished the game with 16 points, eight rebounds and six assists. Randolph and Rudy Gay led the Grizzlies with 21 points apiece. O.J. Mayo added 16. DeMarre Carroll led the bench players with 10 points, while point guard Marcus Williams, playing extended minutes with Mike Conley in foul trouble most of the night, had nine points and six assists. Veteran Jamaal Tinsley made his Grizzlies debut, going scoreless in six minutes. It was his first game since the 2007-08 season. Baron Davis and Chris Kaman had it going in the first quarter, combining to score all of Clippers 23 points. But things went south from there as the Grizzlies built a 55-45 halftime lead, and then pushed that margin to 82-64 heading into the final quarter. Marcus Camby was forced to leave the game late in the first quarter with a lower back contusion. He did not return.

The Hornets toppled the Clippers 110-102 at the New Orleans Arena. It's the first head-coaching win at any level for Jeff Bower and the Hornets' first win since playing the Clippers on Nov. 9. The Hornets saw some stellar point guard production with the mixture of first-round pick Darren Collison, Devin Brown and Bobby Brown as the three combined for 40 points and 14 assists. Rookie Marcus Thornton was the first off the bench for the Hornets, providing 12 points in 21 minutes. Add David West's 24 points and 10 rebounds and Emeka Okafor's 14 boards and the Hornets may have found their recipe for winning with or without Paul. Bower said rebounding has been a constant problem all season for the Hornets and he saw an encouraging improvement in that category Tuesday as the Hornets outrebounded the bigger Clippers 51-36. There was no lack of effort from Al Thornton as the Clippers forward put up a game-high 30 points. Baron Davis added 23 and nine assists while Chris Kaman chipped in with 17. Los Angeles did receive another blow to the injury front, though. Clippers guard Kareem Rush had to be helped off the court with a right knee injury in the latter stages of the first quarter. The injury will just add to an injured squad with No. 1 overall pick Blake Griffin and Eric Gordon still sidelined.

**CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES**

- **BARON DAVIS ENTERS ELITE COMPANY:** Clippers point guard Baron Davis became the 49th player in NBA history to reach 5,000 career assists on Nov. 20 vs. Denver when he dished off to DeAndre Jordan for a dunk with 1:10 remaining in the first quarter...Only three active NBA players have more career assists than Davis (Jason Kidd, Steve Nash and Andre Miller)...Davis is one of only 40 players in NBA history to score over 11,550 points and register over 5,000 assists, joining only Kidd, Nash and Miller as the active NBA players to have reached that milestone...Davis is currently seventh in the NBA in assists...
- **DUNLEAVY MOVING UP NBA RECORD BOOKS:** Clippers head coach Mike Dunleavy won the 597th game of his 16-year coaching career Nov. 20, 2009 ...Dunleavy is now just **three** wins away from 600 NBA wins, and would become the 21st coach in NBA history to win 600 games. Dunleavy's **597** victories places him eighth among active coaches in the league today for wins, trailing only Don Nelson, Jerry Sloan, Larry Brown, Phil Jackson, George Karl, Rick Adelman and Gregg Popovich. Dunleavy's **597** wins is the 21st most in NBA history. Dunleavy needs **32** wins to pass Doug Moe for 20th most wins of all-time and **42** victories to surpass Chuck Daly for 19th...Dunleavy has coached **1,293** career games, the 17th most in NBA history... Holzman coached 1,300 games in an 18-year career.
- **The Clippers** found themselves down by 12 points on Nov. 20 to Denver at STAPLES Center, trailing 26-14 with 1:46 remaining in the first quarter before turning it around and pulling out the 106-99 win...The win was the biggest comeback of the season for the Clippers and the largest comeback win since L.A. rallied from a 19-point deficit on March 25, 2009 in New York...
- Los Angeles scored a season-high 35 points in the second quarter on Nov. 20 vs. Denver as they outscored the Nuggets 35-20 in the second stanza to secure a lead they never gave up...The Clippers racked up a season-high 21 of their 28 assists in the first half...
- **BENCH STEPS UP:** The Clippers bench scored a season-high 54 points on Nov. 20 vs. the Nuggets, led by Rasual Butler's season-high 27 points...
- **BUTLER HEATS UP:** Clippers guard Rasual Butler scored a season-high 27 points (8-15 FG, 4-9 3PT, 7-7 FT) and had three rebounds and two assists in 34:13 off the bench...It was the sixth highest scoring game of Butler's career and the highest point total for Butler since he had 31 points on Feb. 20, 2009...Butler hit a season-high four three-pointers vs. the Nuggets...Butler exploded against the Nuggets after struggling with his shot in the Clips previous five games...Butler entered the Nov. 20 game vs. Denver shooting 28 percent (7-of-25) from the three-point line and 33.3 percent (15-45) from the field in his previous five games.
- **Clippers center Chris Kaman scored a season-low 13 points on Nov. 20, 2009...**Kaman shot 4-of-10 from the field and 5-of-8 from the free throw line while leading the Clippers in rebounding for the fifth time this season...Kaman's 10 shots was a season-low...Kaman's 13-point effort ended his five-game streak of scoring 17+ dating from Nov. 11, 2009.

## CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- Clippers forward Marcus Camby has struggled in the last two contests...In the last two games, Camby has scored a combined total of four points (1-of-6 FG) and is averaging 2.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists...
- **Clippers** forward Craig Smith dished off for a career-high five assists vs. Denver on Nov. 20, 2009 in the Clippers victory.
- Clippers guard Baron Davis has the most blocks of any point guard in the NBA with 10 total blocks in 2009-10.
- **DAVIS A DIFFERENCE IN WINS AND LOSSES:** The play of Baron Davis has had a major impact on the final outcome of games for Los Angeles so far in 2009-10...The Clips point guard is averaging approximatley 13 shots per game this season in both L.A. wins and losses. In the Clippers five victories, however, he is shooting 43 percent from the field and averaging 17.8 points...In the Clippers nine losses, Davis is shooting 37.7 percent from the floor and 14.7 points...
- **The Clippers** were limited to under 40 rebounds on Nov. 20 vs. Denver for the eighth time this season, the second-highest total in the NBA in 2009-10...The Clippers are averaging 35.5 rebounds in the last two games.

● **KAMAN CONTINUES TO STAR:** Clippers center Chris Kaman reached 20+ points for the 9th time in 12 games in 2009-10 on Nov. 15....Kaman is now one of three players (Chris Bosh and Dirk Nowitzki) to currently average 20+ points and 8+ rebounds...Kaman is currently the highest scoring center in the NBA, averaging 20.9 points per game...Kaman has already led the Clippers in scoring seven times in 2009-10...Last season he led L.A. in scoring four times, and in 2007-08 he led L.A. in scoring in 13 games...

Kaman stands apart from most of the centers in the Western Conference this season.

- The Clippers fell to 2-8 in Eric Gordon's career when he has missed action due to injury.
- **RUSH INJURY REPORT:** Clippers guard Kareem Rush suffered a torn the ACL in his right knee on Nov. 17, 2009 against New Orleans...Rush entered the game in the first quarter and played just 1:54 before suffering the injury with 2:31 remaining in the first quarter as he cut into the lane, received a pass and went up for a shot. Rush underwent X-rays and an MRI exam in New Orleans which confirmed the injury. Rush travelled with the team to Memphis and will be reevaluated when the Clippers return to Los Angeles on Nov. 19.
- **ASSISTING THE WIN:** The Clippers defeated Oklahoma City on Nov. 15 despite dishing off for a season-low 17 total assists...The Thunder managed only 13 total assists...Since 1986-87, the Clippers have only won 70 games when registering 17 or fewer assists...The last time L.A. won a game with 17 or less assists was on March 10, 2008 when they defeated Miami, who had 23 assists.
- **Kevin Durant lit up the Clippers Nov. 15 for 40 points in a 101-93 loss...It was the first time a Clippers opponent has scored 40+ points against them since Vince Carter had 41 on March 15, 2009...Durant is averaging 35.0 points in two games against the Clippers this season.**

● Two Clippers players scored 20+ points on Nov. 17 vs. New Orleans for the second time this season, with Al Thornton going for 30 points and Baron Davis netting 23 points. The Clippers had three players (Chris Kaman, Baron Davis and Al Thornton) reach 20+ points Nov. 15, 2009...It was the third time this season three Clippers scored over 20 points in the same game...Last season, the Clippers had three players reach 20+ points in the same game 11 times....It was the first time the Clippers have had two players reach 20+ points in a game since April 10, 2009...Last season Los Angeles had two players reach 20+ points in the same game 19 times...The Clippers had four players reach 20+ points in the same game one time last season...

● **HISTORIC LEAD SLIPS AWAY:** The Clippers built up a 22-point lead on Nov. 13 vs. the Raptors, extending their lead to 47-25 on two Chris Kaman free throws with 6:50 remaining in the second quarter before eventually falling 104-89. The 22-point lead lost was the second biggest advantage squandered in team history. The Clippers lost a 23-point lead on March 18, 2000 against Sacramento before eventually pulling out a 104-83 win....The Clippers loss to Toronto on Nov. 13, 2009 was the biggest lead lost in an eventual defeat in team history. The Clippers suffered an overall 37-point swing...Toronto went on a 22-9 run in the final 7:17 of the second quarter to cut the Clips half-time advantage to nine points, and then held Los Angeles scoreless for the final 6:58 of the fourth quarter, finishing the game on a 16-0 run that saw them reverse an 89-88 deficit into the final 104-89 decision.

● **KAMAN HONORED:** Clippers' center Chris Kaman was named the Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Monday, November 2nd through Sunday, November 8th...Kaman led the Clippers to a 3-0 week, averaging 24.3 points on .574 shooting from the field, 9.7 rebounds and 2.0 blocks. Kaman tallied a high for the week with 25 points, 11 rebounds and two blocks in a 93-90 win over Minnesota on November 2nd. Kaman followed up his performance against the Timberwolves with a 22 point, nine rebound and three block night in the Clippers' 118-90 win at Golden State on November 6th. He closed the week out with by tallying 22 points, nine rebounds and four assists in a 113-100 win over Memphis on November 7th. Atlanta's Joe Johnson received the award for the Eastern Conference.

● Clippers center Chris Kaman went 9-of-26 from the field on Nov. 11, 2009 vs. the Thunder, attempting a career-high 26 field goals...Kaman has only attempted 20+ field goals a total of four times in his career, last going 9-of-22 from the field on Dec. 28, 2007 vs. Phoenix...

## CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

● **BIG LOSS:** The Clippers dropped a 112-84 loss to New Orleans on Nov. 9, 2009. The 28-point loss was the Clippers worst defeat of the season and first 20+ point loss since they fell 106-85 in Utah on March 14, 2009...The 112 points scored by the Hornets was the most points scored by a Clips opponent in 2009-10

● **HITTING 50:** The Clippers shot 50 percent from the field (42-84) on Nov. 7 in their victory over Memphis...The Clippers have now shot 50 percent or better in three of their first 10 games, going 2-1 in those games....Last season, the Clippers did not shoot 50 percent until the 40th game of the year, when they hit 59 percent of their shots Feb. 16, 2009 against Memphis...The Clippers shot over 50 percent from the field just 12 times in 2008-09, going 9-3...In 2007-08, Los Angeles didn't shoot 50 percent from the field until the 33rd game of the season...In the last decade, only the 2004-05 New Orleans Hornets and the 2003-04 Washington Wizards did not shoot 50 percent in more games to start a season, both going 41 games without shooting 50 percent.

● **FEELS LIKE THE FIRST TIME:** Clippers forward Craig Smith made the first three-pointer of his NBA career on Nov. 7 vs. Memphis, draining a trey from the corner with 7:56 remaining in the first half...Smith entered the Nov. 7 game having gone 0-17 from beyond the arc in 239 career NBA games....

● **WINNING A CLOSE ONE:** The Clippers won their second close contest, beating Memphis 113-110 on Nov. 7...This season, LA. is 2-1 in games decided by three points or less.... Last season, the Clippers were 6-15 (.285) in games decided by three-points or less...Since 2003-04, the Clippers are 30-48 (.386) in games decided by three points or fewer.

● **DAVIS SHINES, ESPECIALLY AGAINST GOLDEN STATE:** Clippers guard Baron Davis led all scorers on Nov. 6 with a 25 point outburst (8-13 FG, 7-8 FT) against the Warriors....It was the eighth time he has scored 25+ points in 71 games with the Clippers...Of those eight 25+ outings, four have come against his former team, the Warriors...The last time Davis scored over 25 points was on March 17, 2009 in Oakland...Since joining the Clippers, Davis is 2-2 against Golden State while averaging 26.0 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 8.8 apg and shooting 49 percent from the field...On Nov. 6 vs. Golden State, Davis scored 16 of his 25 points in the third quarter...

● **BIG-TIME WIN:** The Clippers 28-point road win on Nov. 6 vs. Golden State was the largest victory away from STAPLES Center since Los Angeles decimated the Pacers by 34 points (102-68) on Nov. 10, 2004...The Clippers 34 point victory margin is a team record, that has been equaled three times...The Clippers 118-90 win over Golden State on Nov. 6 was the Clippers biggest win since they beat Sacramento by 31 points on April 10, 2009...The Clippers built up a 34-point lead vs. the Warriors on Nov. 6, the largest lead they have had in a game since they led the Kings by 31 on April 10, 2009...Against the Warriors on Nov. 6, the Warriors took their 12-point halftime lead and expanded it with a 14-1 third quarter run over a 4:07 second span.

● The Clippers scored a season-high 118 points on Nov. 6 vs. the Warriors...The Clippers scored 118 points or more nine times last season, last scoring over 118 points on March 25, 2009 when they exploded for 140 points vs. the Knicks.

● **CAMBY MAKES HISTORY:** Clippers forward **Marcus Camby** recorded the 2,000th block of his NBA career when he stuffed Carlos Boozer with 7:15 remaining in the third quarter. With the block, Camby joins an exclusive club of just 11 NBA players who have recorded both 2,000 or more blocks and over 7,000 career rebounds. Camby is one of 11 total players, and just one of three active players (Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan) to accomplish the feat. The other players in NBA history with over 2,000 blocks and 7,000 career rebounds are: Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Robert Parish, Hakeem Olajuwon, Shaquille O'Neal, Dikembe Mutombo, Patrick Ewing, Tim Duncan, David Robinson, Larry Nance and Alonzo Mourning.

● **Marcus Camby exploded for 23 points (10-15 FG, 3-6 FT)** on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix...It was the most points Camby has scored as a member of the Clippers, and the most points he has scored since March 26, 2007 when he was with Denver. Camby scored 24 points in a loss to Detroit...Camby's 23 points vs. the Suns was the 36th time he has scored over 23+ points in his career...Camby averaged a career-high 14.5 points during his rookie season of 1996-97...

● **HISTORICALLY BAD FROM THE LINE:** Clippers guard Eric Gordon entered the season as a career 85.4 percent free throw shooter. Gordon went 299-of-350 from the line in his rookie year last season....Against the Suns Oct. 28, Gordon missed four foul shots, going 4-of-7 from the charity stripe. It was the most foul shots Gordon has missed in his NBA career.

● **Baron Davis recorded his first double-double of the season on Oct. 28 vs. Phoenix, scoring 12 points (4-11 FG, 2-4 FT) to go with 12 assists...It was the 152nd assist/points double-double of Davis' career and his first since April 1, 2009.**

● **Baron Davis had five steals Oct. 28 vs. the Suns, matching his season-high from last season, which he achieved one time...The five steals was two away from his career-high of seven....Davis has now had 5+ steals two times since Feb. 26, 2008.**

● **CAMBY MAKING HISTORY:** Clippers forward/center Marcus Camby is rapidly moving up the list in the NBA record books. Camby currently sits in 66th place on the all-time rebounding list, as he entered the 2009-10 season with **7,437** rebounds...Camby has also recorded the 10th most blocks in NBA history, entering the 2009-10 season by swatting a total of **1,997** shots.

## CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

● **GRIFFIN SUFFERS STRESS FRACTURE OF PATELLA:** Clippers rookie forward Blake Griffin suffered a non-displaced stress fracture of his left patella during the Clippers preseason game on Oct. 23...Griffin underwent an MRI on Oct. 26 which confirmed the diagnosis. Griffin was examined by team physician Dr. Steven Shimoyama as well as specialist Dr. Neal ElAttrache. Based on communication between the two physicians, it has been determined that Griffin will be sidelined for approximately six weeks. Griffin will receive bone stimulation and PRP (Platelet Rich Plasma) treatment. Griffin originally suffered a bruised left patella during practice on Thursday, Oct. 24 and was eventually cleared to resume full basketball activity.

● **CLIPPERS TRIPLE-THREAT FROM LONG RANGE:** With the addition of Rasual Butler to the roster the Clippers now have three players (Butler - 140, Eric Gordon - 131, Steve Novak - 119), who hit 100+ three-pointers last season. *In their history, the Clippers have never had three players each make 100 or more three's in the same season...* Butler's 140 three's were the 24th best in the league last season, nine more than Clippers leader Eric Gordon. Gordon led the Clips in shooting percent from the three-point land, while Steve Novak hit 41.6 percent from downtown (119-286).

● **AL STEPS IT UP IN YEAR TWO:** Clippers forward Al Thornton improved in nearly every statistical category last season, his second in the NBA. Thornton raised his rebounding, assists, blocks and scoring totals in his second season...Thornton became one of just five second-year players from 2007-09 to improve his scoring from under 15 points per game in his rookie year to scoring over 15 points in the second year.

● **GRIFFIN IS NUMBER ONE:** The number one selection in the 2009 NBA Draft out of the University of Oklahoma, Clippers Blake Griffin is expected to make an immediate impact. Griffin was the consensus NCAA National Player of the Year and averaged 22.7 points and 14.4 rebounds during his final collegiate season...Griffin is the third number one selection in Clippers history, joining Michael Olowokandi (1998) and Danny Manning (1988). The past six number one selections in the NBA draft, dating back to 2003 have enjoyed mixed success. Below is how the last six top picks fared in their rookie season:

● **GRIFFIN IN GOOD COMPANY:** Clippers forward Blake Griffin grabbed 504 total rebounds during his sophomore season at Oklahoma, the most boards in a season by an NCAA Division I player since Indiana State's Larry Bird in 1978-79 (505)...Griffin's rebounding average of 14.4 rebounds per game in 2008-09 was the highest rebounding mark since Wake Forest's Tim Duncan grabbed 14.7 rpg in 1996-97...Upon joining the NBA, both players engineered similar first-year franchise turnarounds. Bird helped improve the Celtics by 32 games in 1979-80, leading Boston to a 61-21 record his first year after a 29-53 campaign the season before. Duncan helped orchestrate the greatest improvement in NBA history, as the Spurs went from 20-62 to 56-26 in his rookie year.

● **ROOKIE SUCCESS:** The Clippers are the only team in the NBA to have a player on their current roster make the NBA All-Rookie First or Second Team for three straight years. As a member of the Timberwolves, Craig Smith was selected to the 2006-07 NBA All-Rookie Second Team, and Al Thornton was named to the 2007-08 All-Rookie First Team...Eric Gordon was recognized on the 2008-09 All-Rookie Second Team...The Memphis Grizzlies have also placed three rookies on an All-Rookie squad from 2006-09, however Juan Carlos Navarro, who made the All-Rookie Second Team in 2007-08 is no longer with the club.

● **GORDON GOES OFF:** As the Clippers highest draft pick since Shaun Livingston (4th pick) in 2004, Eric Gordon lived up to the hype in his first season. Named to the NBA All-Rookie Second Team, Gordon finished the season with the highest scoring average (16.1) for a Clippers first-year player since Lamar Odom (16.6) in 1999-2000...Gordon finished the season ranked third among all rookies in scoring and sixth amongst rookies in assists per game (2.8)...**After the All-Star Break, Gordon was the 17th highest scoring guard in the NBA, averaging 18.9 points and shooting nearly 48 percent from the field...**Gordon scored a career-high 41 points Jan. 23, 2009 in a showdown with Oklahoma City's Kevin Durant, scoring the most points ever by a Clippers rookie and securing the most points scored by a rookie in an NBA game in 2008-09...Gordon averaged 18.4 points, 2.9 rebounds and 3.1 assists in his 64 starts...Gordon was named the January T-Mobile Rookie of the Month.

● **Baron Davis** equaled his career-high with 20 assists on Feb. 11, 2009 vs. New York and did it again on March 18, 2009 vs. Washington...Davis became the first Clippers player to record 20 assists twice in a season since Gary Grant did it during the 1989-1990 season...The previous member of the Clippers to reach 20 assists in a game was Grant, who had 21 dishes on Jan. 18, 1990 vs. Seattle.

● **DISHING IT OUT:** Clippers point guard Baron Davis led the team with 7.7 assists per game in 2008-09, and finished the season ranked seventh in the NBA in that category, and had the 16th most assists in the league...Davis' 501 assists were the most by a Clippers player in a season since 2002-03, when Andre Miller dished off for 537...The 501 assists represented a down year for Davis, as it was the lowest assist total of his career since 2005-06 when he totaled 480 in 54 games with Golden State...Davis also shot a career-low 37 percent from the field last season, going 355-for-959...His previous worst shooting season was a 38.7 percent mark in 2004-05.

## CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- **Clippers center DeAndre Jordan** grabbed a career-high 20 rebounds Jan. 25, 2009 vs. the Warriors in his fourth-ever start...Jordan became the first rookie to get 20 boards in a game since Chicago's Aaron Gray had 22 boards on April 16, 2000...Jordan is one of only three other active players that had a 20-rebounds game in at least one of their first four career starts. The other three players are: Shaquille O'Neal, Tim Duncan and Aaron Gray.

- Clippers guard Ricky Davis suffered through an injury-plagued 2008-09, appearing in just 36 games due to an injured left knee. It was the fewest games Ricky Davis has played in since 2000-01 when he played in just seven games because of a fractured right foot. From 2001-2008, Ricky Davis only missed a total of 11 games.

- **DUNLEAVY GAINS TENURE:** Clippers head coach Mike Dunleavy is the third-most tenure of all active coaches in the NBA. Dunleavy, who was hired on July 11, 2003 and took over General Manager duties for the team this off-season, is the Clippers all-time leader in coaching victories and games coached.

Mike Dunleavy begins his second season in the dual-role of General Manager and Head Coach and seventh season as the head coach of the Clippers. Dunleavy is now the third most tenured of all active coaches in the NBA, trailing only Utah's Jerry Sloan and San Antonio's Gregg Popovich. Despite a difficult 2008-09 season that saw the Clippers lose the fourth-most games to injury and illness in the NBA (233 games), Dunleavy helped develop a group of promising young players, including guiding first round selection Eric Gordon to become one of the most exciting rookies in the league in 2008. Long known as one of the hardest working and most dynamic coaches in the league, Dunleavy overhauled the Clippers roster prior to the start of the 2009-10 season with the additions of consensus collegiate player of the year Blake Griffin, swingman Rasual Butler, point guard Sebastian Telfair, and forwards Craig Smith and Mark Madsen. Dunleavy became the Clippers all-time franchise leader in victories when he won his 159th game on Dec. 7, 2007, surpassing Dr. Jack Ramsay. Dunleavy's 492 games on the Clippers sideline is the most games coached in club history, as he passed Ramsay (1972-76) and Bill Fitch (1994-98) on Nov. 2, 2007. A 16-year NBA coaching veteran, Dunleavy now ranks eighth among active coaches on the all-time NBA victory list, and is 21st on the all-time NBA wins list. Dunleavy has coached 1,280 career NBA games, the seventh most among active coaches and the 17th most games of any coach in NBA history. Dunleavy led the Clippers to within one game of the Western Conference Finals in 2006 and won his 500th career game as a coach on March 13, 2006. Dunleavy coached his 1,000th career game during the 2005-06 season. The Clippers improved in each of Dunleavy's first three seasons on the bench, increasing their win total from 28 wins in 2003-04 to 47 wins during the 2005-06 campaign. In 2005-06, Dunleavy guided the Clippers to their best record since the franchise moved to California and to their first playoff appearance in nine seasons. Prior to joining the Clippers, Dunleavy guided the Portland Trail Blazers for four seasons (1997-2001), leading them to a 190-106 (.642) record and four straight playoff appearances. Under Dunleavy, the Blazers made two consecutive trips to the Western Conference Finals in 1999 and 2000 with the 1999-00 club winning 59 games, matching the second-best victory total in Blazers history. Dunleavy earned the 1999 NBA Coach of the Year award after leading the 1998-99 Blazers to a Pacific Division-winning 35-15 record. Dunleavy's first head coaching opportunity came with the Los Angeles Lakers in 1990-91, when he led them to a 58-24 record and a berth in the NBA Finals, where they lost in five games to the Chicago Bulls. During the Lakers' run through the 1991 NBA Playoffs, Los Angeles defeated Houston (3-0), Golden State (4-1) and upset Portland (4-2) in the Western Conference Finals, after the Blazers had posted the league's best regular season record (63-19) and two straight NBA Finals appearances. The following year, the Lakers posted a 43-39 record and dropped a first-round series to Portland. Dunleavy moved on in 1992 to Milwaukee, where he compiled a 107-221 (.326) record over four seasons while holding the dual title of Vice President of Basketball Operations and Head Coach. He stepped away from the bench prior to the 1996-97 season to concentrate on his general manager duties with the Bucks for one season before taking the head job in Portland. Selected in the sixth round (99th pick overall) by Philadelphia in 1976, Dunleavy played 11 seasons in the NBA with career averages of 8.0 points and 3.9 assists in 438 games. He played for Philadelphia (1976-78), Houston (1978-82), San Antonio (1982-83) and Milwaukee (1983-85, 1988-1990). During the 1980-81 campaign, Dunleavy averaged a career-best 10.5 points as a starting guard for a Rockets team that reached the NBA Finals. In his lone season in San Antonio, Dunleavy led the NBA in three-point percentage, connecting at a .345 (67-194) clip from behind the arc. A back injury prompted his unofficial retirement following the 1984-85 season and he worked for a New York investment firm before returning to the NBA as an assistant coach with Milwaukee for the 1986-87 season. He stayed on the Bucks' bench through the 1989-90 campaign, but returned to uniform in parts of two seasons (1988-89, 1989-90) when injuries to the Bucks' backcourt forced Dunleavy into the lineup. A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Dunleavy played collegiately at the University of South Carolina, where he finished his career as the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,586 points. He appeared in 111 consecutive games for the Gamecocks, starting his last 105. Dunleavy was a straight A student, majoring in psychology while at South Carolina. He played his prep basketball at Nazareth High School in Brooklyn, where he earned All-New York City honors as a senior and had his number 44 jersey retired. Mike and his wife Emily have three sons: Michael, Jr. (Indiana Pacers), William Baker and James (USC).
