OKLAHOMA CITY 126, LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS 85
Wednesday, April 15, 2009
STAPLES Center, Los Angeles, Calif.



Kevin Durant had 26 points, Jeff Green added 19 and the Thunder gave their newly promoted coach Scott Brooks a win, dismantling the Clippers 126-85. Oklahoma led by as many as 33 in the third quarter against the Clippers, who were booed throughout by the home fans. Eric Gordon had 22 to lead the Clippers, who stumbled to the finish line while losing nine of their last 10. Los Angeles finished the season 19-63, its eighth worst-record in franchise history. Oklahoma dominated Los Angeles on the boards 49-32 and penetrated the lanes. The Thunder went on a 16-4 run late in the third period to build an insurmountable lead and rookie Russell Westbrook had two highlight-reel dunks - one off an alley-oop pass and the other on a drive - to make it 90-57 with less than two minutes remaining. Mike Taylor's buzzer beating 52-footer to end the third quarter was just about the only play to elicit cheers from the crowd for the Clippers. Los Angeles played poorly on defense and had 22 turnovers. Gordon, Taylor and Chris Kaman were the only players to score in double digits for the Clippers, the second-worst team in the NBA. They were outscored 62-42 in the paint and the Thunder, who finished 2-7 in April, had 17 fast-break points. Six players scored in double digits for Oklahoma. The Thunder started both the first and second quarters on 6-0 runs and built a 21-point lead going into halftime. The Clippers had no answer for either Durant or Green. Both scored at will early on. Durant and Green combined for 28 points before the second half started and were catalysts in two separate runs for Oklahoma. Clippers guard Baron Davis struggled with his shooting and was 1-for-5 in the first half. He finished with eight points. **Notes:** Clippers F Zach Randolph missed the finale because of a mild concussion. ... Durant graded himself as OK for the season even though he raised his average in both points (by five) and rebounds (plus-2.2).

CLIPPERS LAST GAME:**UTAH JAZZ 106, LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS 85**

Monday, April 13, 2009

EnergySolutions Arena; Salt Lake City, UT



The Jazz ended a three-game skid with a 106-85 victory over the Clippers, keeping alive their slim hopes of climbing out of the No. 8 seed in the Western Conference. Carlos Boozer had 20 points and 13 rebounds, and Paul Millsap added 19 points and 11 boards for the Jazz, who outrebounded the Clippers 50-36 and forced 15 turnovers that led to 24 easy points. Marcus Camby had 17 points and 10 rebounds for the Clippers, who have lost eight of nine. Eric Gordon scored 16 and Chris Kaman had 12 points and seven rebounds for Los Angeles. The Clippers opened the fourth quarter on a 9-1 run, which would have been 10-1 but a 23-foot jumper by Mike Taylor initially called a 3-pointer was overturned on review. That was as close as Utah let this one get. Boozer hit a jumper, then tipped in a miss by Williams, and Kyle Korver followed with a 3-pointer to put the Jazz up 91-73 with 8:29 left in the game. The Jazz led by 13 at halftime and slowly pulled away in the third quarter, which was a little sloppy and a lot physical. Los Angeles' Baron Davis knocked Matt Harpring to the court after the two had been bumping under the basket. Both players were called for fouls and Davis received a technical as well. Davis had some words for Harpring before he could get on his feet but was quickly pulled away from the crowd of players who gathered after the commotion. Williams put Utah up 67-50 on the free throw for the technical, which Jazz fans felt was insufficient punishment. Utah fans wanted Davis to be ejected and booed him whenever he touched the ball the rest of the game. Later in the period, Camby's drive through the lane was abruptly halted in a collision with Jarron Collins. Collins was called for the foul and Camby needed a few moments to get up after the whistle. Both teams had eight fouls in the period, which featured 20 free throws.

CLIPPERS LAST GAME:**PORTLAND TRAILBLAZERS 87, LOS ANGELES CLIPPERS 72**

Saturday, April 11, 2009

STAPLES Center; Los Angeles, Ca.



LaMarcus Aldridge scored 21 points, Joel Przybilla added 10 points and 14 rebounds, and the Blazers beat the Clippers 87-72 to tie for third place in the Western Conference. The Trail Blazers needed a late rally to beat the lowly Clippers, who were up by two with 7:44 remaining. The win came a day after Portland beat the Lakers at home. Eric Gordon had 18 for the Clippers, who have lost seven of their last eight. Los Angeles, down most of the game, took its first lead since the first quarter when Gordon scored on a layup to make it 68-66. Brian Skinner came off the bench to rally the Clippers with an impressive effort on both sides of the court. He lofted a hook shot to start a 10-0 run for Los Angeles and blocked both Oden and Travis Outlaw's attempts at dunks in the paint. But Portland went on an 18-0 run, keyed by two 3-pointers from Rudy Fernandez, and the Clippers failed to score for more than five minutes until Baron Davis had a layup to make it 84-70. The Clippers came out of the gate in the second half on a 13-3 run, sparked by Davis, Zach Randolph and Marcus Camby, to slice into a 46-31 halftime lead. Randolph, back after serving a two-game suspension because of a suspected DUI conviction, finished with 13 while Davis added 12. Los Angeles got within six with 3:05 remaining in the third quarter when Fred Jones hit a deep 3, but Blake kept hitting shots for Portland. Blake, who had all of his 10 points in the third, sank a 25-footer of his own to make it 61-52. Portland got off to a 1-for-9 start while the Clippers stitched together a 9-2 run to take an early 12-7 lead. But Brandon Roy and Aldridge helped launch Portland on a 21-6 run late in the second quarter. Roy had a free throw with 6:43 to start it and added a slam dunk and a layup while Aldridge added five points, four in the paint, during that stint. The Clippers broke down on the defensive end during the final 1:37 of the period as the Trail Blazers railed off four straight buckets while penetrating the lane.

CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES**TEAM NOTES**

- The Clippers suffered their worst loss of the season on April 15 vs. Oklahoma City when they fell 126-85. It was the Clips worst home loss of the season, as they lost by 38 points in the first game of the year to the Lakers on Oct. 29, 2008...The Clips fell by 40 points, 140-100 in Phoenix on Feb. 17, 2009...The Clippers 41-point defeat on April 15 in the season is the worst loss since Feb. 2, 2000 in a 114-68 loss in Phoenix...The Clippers biggest defeat in franchise history was a 50-point loss to Seattle (154-104) on Dec. 2, 1988.
- The Clippers scored under 90 points for the 32ND time this season on April 15, managing 85 points vs. Oklahoma City.... Los Angeles finished the season 0-32 in 2008-09 when scoring under 90 points...
- Los Angeles finished the season losing 21 of their last 25 road games....The Clippers road struggles started earlier in the season, when the club endured an 11-game road losing streak from Dec. 20, 2008 - Feb. 4, 2009....In the Clippers final 21 road losses, they lost by double-digits 19 times and were defeated by an average of 18.7 points per game...
- The Clippers top three post players - Zach Randolph, Marcus Camby and Chris Kaman saw action in the same game just 10 times this season, going 1-9 in those contests and last playing together in a loss to Portland on April 11.
- The Clippers fell to 0-23 in 2008-09 when shooting under 40 percent after shooting 38.0 percent from the field April 11 vs. Portland, the third time in their last four final games that the Clippers shot under 40 percent.
- **OFF THE BENCH:** This season, the **Clippers bench was outscored 2,710 -- 1,903 this season.**
- The Clippers had two players reach 20+ points in the same game **19** times IN 2008-09, the last time occurring on April 10, 2009, the first time it had happened since April 4, 2009.... **The Clippers had** three players reach 20+ points in the same game for the 11th time this season on March 25, 2009 at New York, **when Mike Taylor (35), Zach Randolph (33) and Al Thornton (21) did it.**...For the first time in 2008-09, the Clippers had four players reach 20 or more points in the same game on Feb. 11 vs. the Knicks...Al Thornton (20 pts), Zach Randolph (22 pts), Eric Gordon (30 pts) and Steve Novak (23 pts) all reached 20 points vs. New York...It was the first time four Clippers reached 20 or more points in a game since April 12, 2008 when Al Thornton (25), Cuttino Mobley (30), Corey Maggette (22) and Elton Brand (21) all did it in a 122-116 loss to Golden State...

CLIPPERS MISCELLANEOUS TEAM NOTES

- The Clippers had five or more players reach double figures 33 times this season, last on April 10 and went 15-18 in those games.
- **The Clippers finished the season 0-22 when shooting under 40 percent after shooting 35.8 percent from the field April 7 vs. the Timberwolves.**
- **PULLING OUT A CLOSE ONE:** The Clippers dropped a close contest on April 5 vs. the Lakers, falling 88-85 at STAPLES Center...Los Angeles FINISHED 6-15 in games decided by six points or fewer in 2008-09...
- **The Clippers allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or higher from the field for the 26TH time in 2008-09 on April 15 when the Thunder shot 53.9 percent...The Clippers streak of allowing opponents to shoot over 50 percent from the field in five straight games came to an end on April 5 vs. the Lakers....From March 25 - April 4, the Clips opponents shot 54.2 percent....Los Angeles opponents have shot over 50 percent from the field SEVEN times in the last 12 games....**The Clippers are 2-23 this season when their opponent shoots 50 percent or better from the field...The Clippers are 9-4 this season when shooting over 50 percent from the field, most recently doing it on April 10 vs. Sacramento, shooting 56.0 percent from the field.
- **The Clippers had two players score 30+ points in the same game for the second time this season when Mike Taylor (35 points) and Zach Randolph (33) did it March 25 vs. New York...It was the first time since Eric Gordon (41 points) and Al Thornton (34) did it on Jan. 23 vs. Oklahoma City...Previously, the last time the Clippers accomplished that feat was April 12, 2007 when Corey Maggette (34 points) and Elton Brand (32 points) scored 30+ points each in a 118-110 win over the Lakers.**
- The Clippers finished with just three players in double-figures (Chris Kaman - 13, Eric Gordon - 22 and Mike Taylor - 15) on April 15, 2009 vs. Oklahoma City...The Clips finished 0-12 when three players or fewer reach double-digits in points.
- The Clippers scored over 120 points in their 123-08 win over Washington on March 18, marking two straight games in which the Clips scored over 120+ points, the second time this season the Clippers have accomplished that...L.A. scored 126 points in a win over Memphis Feb. 6 and then had 121 points in victory over Atlanta on Feb. 7...The Clippers have now scored 120+ points in back-to-back games twice in 2008-09, after previously last scoring over 120 points in **two-straight regular season games during the 1992-93 season, when they scored 121 points in a win in Denver on Nov. 28, 1992 and then 122 points in a victory in their next game over Orlando on Dec. 3, 1992....**The Clippers did reach 120+ points in back-to-back games in the 2006 NBA Playoffs, losing 130-123 to Phoenix in Game 1 of the Western Conference Semifinals on May 8, 2006 and then defeating the Suns in Game 2 by scoring 122 points on May 10, 2006....Last season, the Clippers reached 120+ points three times.
- **ROOKIE TRIO:** The Clippers started three rookies on March 7 vs. Indiana when Eric Gordon, DeAndre Jordan and Mike Taylor all started the game...It was the first time the Clippers have started three rookies in a game since the end of the 1988-89 season when the rookie trio of Tom Garrick, Gary Grant and Charles Smith started 15 times together...This season, the Clippers became the fourth team to start three rookies, as Memphis, Sacramento and Portland have all also started three first-year players.
- **FOUL SHOOTING:** The Clippers have struggled from the foul line this season, shooting .736 percent from the line ... The Clippers foul line struggles are a big difference from last season, when they shot .781 from the line, the sixth best total in the league. **Since Mike Dunleavy took over as head coach in 2003-04, the Clippers are shooting a combined total of .784 from the foul line entering this season. That includes the club's franchise record .791 free throw percentage from the 2005-06 season.**
- **The Clippers win over the defending champion Boston Celtics on Feb. 25 was the Clips first win over a defending NBA champ since they defeated the Miami Heat 101-97 on Dec. 5, 2006 at STAPLES Center.**
- Three Clippers scored at least 25 points in their win over the Warriors on Feb. 23: Eric Gordon and Zach Randolph scored 27 points, Baron Davis had 25. It's the first time in 18 years that three Clippers scored at least 25 points in a non-overtime game. The last time it happened - April 12, 1991 vs. Denver - the players were Olden Polynice (30), Charles Smith (27) and Ken Norman (26). -- *From ESPN.com*

COMEBACK IN NEW YORK - MARCH 25, 2009

- **EXPLOSIVE GAME FOR CLIPPERS:** The Clippers tallied 140 points in their overtime victory over the Knicks March 25...It was the first time the Clippers had scored 140 or more points in a game since March 13, 1998 when they tallied 152 points in a victory over the Toronto Raptors...This season, the Clippers previous high for points scored was 128 points on Feb. 11, 2009, also in an overtime win against New York....The Clippers 140 points vs. the Knicks came after L.A. had averaged just 76.5 points in their previous two games....

- Clippers guard Mike Taylor made his fifth start of the season March 28 vs. Houston and had 11 points (5-11 FG, 1-2 3PT), three rebounds and a career-high six assists in 32:01...**It was the third straight game that Taylor had registered a new career-high in a statistical category and the third straight game the rookie point guard reached double-figures...From March 25-28, Taylor averaged 23.0 points, 4.0 assists and shot a whopping 66 percent (29-of-44) and 73 percent (8-of-11) from the foul line...Taylor suffered a bone bruise of his right knee in the closing seconds of the first half against Houston on March 28...X-rays were negative, and Taylor returned to play 12:18 in the second half...Taylor exploded for a career-high 35 points (14-20 FG, 7-7 FT) and career-high 8 rebounds on March 25 against the Knicks at Madison Square Garden...On March 27 against the Spurs, he led the team in scoring for the second straight game and second time this season with 23 points (10-13 FG, 2-2 3PT, 1-3 FT) while adding three assists and three rebounds...**

- **NOVAK NAILS IT DOWN:** Clippers forward Steve Novak enjoyed one of his best games as a pro March 15 vs. New Jersey...Novak hit a career-high seven three-pointers, going 7-of-11 from the field, with all of his shot attempts coming from behind the three-point arc...Novak's seven threes were the most made by a Clippers player this season...The biggest shot Novak nailed was the game-winner, burying the final shot of the game from the left corner with 0:06 remaining in the game...It was the second buzzer-beating shot of Novak's career, he hit a game-winning three-pointer as a member of the Houston Rockets on Feb. 13, 2008 with 2.5 seconds remaining

Mike Dunleavy, who begins his first season in the dual-role of General Manager and Head Coach completed his fifth season as the head coach of the Clippers by permanently etching his name in the franchise record books despite a difficult season that saw the Clippers suffer through a league-high 321 games lost due to injury and illness. Long known as one of the hardest working and most dynamic coaches in the league, Dunleavy kept the Clippers competitive and focused despite losing all-star forward Elton Brand and guard Shaun Livingston for the majority of the season due to injuries. Dunleavy became the Clippers all-time franchise leader in victories when he won his 159th game on Dec. 7, 2007, surpassing Dr. Jack Ramsay. Dunleavy's 410 games on the Clippers sideline is the most games coached in club history, as he passed Ramsay (1972-76) and Bill Fitch (1994-98) on Nov. 2, 2007. A 15-year NBA coaching veteran, Dunleavy now ranks sixth among active coaches on the all-time NBA victory list, and is 21st on the all-time NBA wins list. Dunleavy has coached 1,197 career NBA games, the eighth most among active coaches and the 18th most games of any coach in NBA history. Dunleavy led the Clippers to within one game of the Western Conference Finals in 2006 and won his 500th career game as a coach on March 13, 2006. Dunleavy coached his 1,000th career game during the 2005-06 season. The Clippers improved in each of Dunleavy's first three seasons on the bench, increasing their win total from 28 wins in 2003-04 to 47 wins during the 2005-06 campaign. In 2005-06, Dunleavy guided the Clippers to their best record since the franchise moved to California and to their first playoff appearance in nine seasons. Prior to joining the Clippers, Dunleavy guided the Portland Trail Blazers for four seasons (1997-2001), leading them to a 190-106 (.642) record and four straight playoff appearances. Under Dunleavy, the Blazers made two consecutive trips to the Western Conference Finals in 1999 and 2000 with the 1999-00 club winning 59 games, matching the second-best victory total in Blazers history. Dunleavy earned the 1999 NBA Coach of the Year award after leading the 1998-99 Blazers to a Pacific Division-winning 35-15 record. Dunleavy's first head coaching opportunity came with the Los Angeles Lakers in 1990-91, when he led them to a 58-24 record and a berth in the NBA Finals, where they lost in five games to the Chicago Bulls. During the Lakers' run through the 1991 NBA Playoffs, Los Angeles defeated Houston (3-0), Golden State (4-1) and upset Portland (4-2) in the Western Conference Finals, after the Blazers had posted the league's best regular season record (63-19) and two straight NBA Finals appearances. The following year, the Lakers posted a 43-39 record and dropped a first-round series to Portland. Dunleavy moved on in 1992 to Milwaukee, where he compiled a 107-221 (.326) record over four seasons while holding the dual title of Vice President of Basketball Operations and Head Coach. He stepped away from the bench prior to the 1996-97 season to concentrate on his general manager duties with the Bucks for one season before taking the head job in Portland. Selected in the sixth round (99th pick overall) by Philadelphia in 1976, Dunleavy played 11 seasons in the NBA with career averages of 8.0 points and 3.9 assists in 438 games. He played for Philadelphia (1976-78), Houston (1978-82), San Antonio (1982-83) and Milwaukee (1983-85, 1988-1990). During the 1980-81 campaign, Dunleavy averaged a career-best 10.5 points as a starting guard for a Rockets team that reached the NBA Finals. In his lone season in San Antonio, Dunleavy led the NBA in three-point percentage, connecting at a .345 (67-194) clip from behind the arc. A back injury prompted his unofficial retirement following the 1984-85 season and he worked for a New York investment firm before returning to the NBA as an assistant coach with Milwaukee for the 1986-87 season. He stayed on the Bucks' bench through the 1989-90 campaign, but returned to uniform in parts of two seasons (1988-89, 1989-90) when injuries to the Bucks' backcourt forced Dunleavy into the lineup. A native of Brooklyn, N.Y., Dunleavy played collegiately at the University of South Carolina, where he finished his career as the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,586 points. He appeared in 111 consecutive games for the Gamecocks, starting his last 105. Dunleavy was a straight A student, majoring in psychology while at South Carolina. He played his prep basketball at Nazareth High School in Brooklyn, where he earned All-New York City honors as a senior and had his number 44 jersey retired. Mike and his wife Emily have three sons: Michael, Jr. (Indiana Pacers), William Baker and James (USC).
