### JAZZ 2015-16 COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS:

🏀 Oct. 22: The Wheelin' Jazz will play in an intrasquad scrimmage during halftime of the game. Nine members of the wheelchair team, plus Jazz Bear, will showcase their skills and Wheelin' Jazz founder and Paralympic Games gold medalist Mike Schlappi will provide commentary on the action. The Wheelin' Jazz, ranked 9<sup>th</sup> nationally in the Championship Division, tip off their season on Nov. 20-21. They are a non-profit organization that provides physical, social, and emotional therapy to individuals with a physical disability.

🏀 Oct. 21: The Utah Jazz hosted a "Junior Jazz Generations" event on Wednesday, Oct. 21 at the Zions Bank Basketball Center. This unique, multi-generational event was held in conjunction with Jr. NBA Week (Oct. 19-23) and featured interactive basketball games on the official Jazz practice court, led by Jazz assistant coaches Johnnie Bryant and Alex Jensen and Jazz broadcaster and 12-year NBA veteran Thurl Bailey. The attendees were also able take photos with Jazz players Trevor Booker and Rodney Hood in the Jazz locker room. With more than 1.5 million total participants, Junior Jazz is in its 33<sup>rd</sup> season of award-winning youth basketball that connects communities, friends and families through the love of the game. It is open to youth in kindergarten through 12th grade, and registration for the program can be done through local parks and recreation departments.

🏀 Oct. 16: Utah Jazz ambassador Mehmet Okur and Jazz Bear attended the 2015 UEA Convention & Education Exhibition and helped hand out more than 1,000 free books at the "Book-A-Basket" free-throw area.

🏀 Oct. 16: Concrete was poured on the new Jazz basketball court at Central Park in South Salt Lake. The Utah Jazz and Larry H. Miller Charities awarded a \$25,000 grant to South Salt Lake to build a new community basketball court. Funding for the project was provided by Larry H. Miller Charities, a nonprofit organization representing the charitable arm of the Larry H. Miller Group of Companies, along with the city where the court will be built. Since 1995, Larry H. Miller Charities has granted more than \$4.4 million to nonprofit organizations in Utah.

🏀 Sept. 19: For the second consecutive year, Utah Jazz forward **Trevor Booker** invited fans to help give back to the community with his cereal donation program called "Booker's Breakfast Assist," which helped collect 250 cereal boxes for the Catholic Community Services of Utah's St. Vincent de Paul Dining Hall. Smith's Food & Drug also contributed 50 gallons of milk.

🏀 Aug. 10: Utah Jazz forward/center **Derrick Favors** hosted a back to school party for 25 youth from the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Salt Lake at the Zions Bank Basketball Center. ## ALOHA OPENER

The Utah Jazz opened the preseason with two victories over the L.A. Lakers in Honolulu, Hawaii. It was Utah's first time playing in Hawaii since 1993. That year the Jazz and the Lakers played a back-to-back (10/15/93). The Lakers won the first game, 98-86, in front of 5,108 fans. The next night, the Jazz were able to force a split, taking the contest 81-77, in front of 5,538 fans.



## JENSEN ENSHRINED

Utah Jazz assistant coach Alex Jensen was enshrined into the University of Utah 2015 class of Crimson Club Athletics Fund Hall of Fame on Friday, Oct. 9. Jensen was inducted individually and as a member of the 1998 men's basketball team that finished as the national runner-up. The 1998 Utes team included current Jazz radio broadcaster Britton Johnsen and current Minnesota Timberwolves guard Andre Miller. The enshrinement class was also recognized at Utah's football game against California on Oct. 10.

## STEADY IMPROVEMENT

The Jazz saw a 13-plus win improvement from the 2013-14 season finishing 38-44 in 2014-15, ranking them sixth in the NBA and second in the Western Conference in win improvement.

# QUIN SNYDER



## Getting Ac-QUIN-ted

Quin Snyder became the eighth head coach in Utah Jazz history, and only the fifth since the franchise moved to Utah in 1979, on June 6, 2014. With over 20 years of coaching experience, and 10 years of head coaching experience, Snyder has sat beside some of the game's most respected names and has coached in all walks of basketball life, including the NCAA, the NBA Developmental League, the EuroLeague and the NBA. Snyder most recently comes to Utah from the Atlanta Hawks, where he was an assistant to Head Coach Mike Budenholzer.

From 2007-10, Snyder was the head coach of the Developmental League's Austin Toros (the D-League affiliate of the San Antonio Spurs). With the Toros, Snyder garnered a 94-56 (.627) record, seeing the playoffs each year and advancing to at least the D-League Semifinals every season.

In Snyder's inaugural season, he inherited a team that had gone 21-29 the year before and flipped the script guiding the Toros to a 30-20 record, a Southwest Division Title and an appearance in the 2008 D-League Championship game. In 2009, Snyder was named the Dennis Johnson Coach of the Year. During his three seasons in Austin, Snyder sent more players to the NBA and won more games than any other D-League coach.

Snyder got his first NBA coaching gig as an assistant with the Los Angeles Clippers in 1992-93, from there Snyder served as an assistant/associate head coach at his alma mater Duke University from 1993-99. He landed his first head coaching job with the NCAA's Missouri Tigers and held that position for seven seasons (1999-06). After his success with the Toros, Snyder went on as a player development coach with Philadelphia (2010-11) and an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Lakers (2011-12), CSKA Moscow (2012-13) and Atlanta Hawks (2013-14) serving under some of the most respected coaches in basketball.

## COLLEGIATE PLAYING CAREER

Snyder competed collegiately at Duke University (1985-89), averaging 6.2 points, 4.2 assists, 1.9 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game in 136 games. Snyder led the Blue Devils to three Final Fours (1986, 1988, and 1989) and won two ACC Championships (1986, 1988). Academically, Snyder was named to the ACC Honor Roll three times. Snyder attended training camp with the Indiana Pacers after finishing his career at Duke, but went on to pursue other coaching endeavors.

A native of Mercer Island, Wash., Snyder earned undergraduate degrees in both philosophy and political science at Duke and later earned a Juris Doctor and M.B.A from there as well.
