PLAYOFF SERIES NOTES

- This is the first time the Trail Blazers and Pelicans have met in the postseason.
- Through three games, **CJ McCollum** is averaging 21.0 points (45.5% FG, 39.1% 3-PT, 66.7% FT), 2.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 1.7 steals.
- **Damian Lillard** has averaged 18.3 points (32.7% FG, 32.0% 3-PT), 4.3 rebounds and 4.3 assists through three games.
- Anthony Davis has averaged 28.3 points, 12.3 rebounds, 2.30 steals and 2.70 blocks in three games this series.
- Through three games, Jrue Holiday is averaging 23.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 6.0 assists and 1.70 steals.
- Portland has now played all 14 Western Conference franchises in the playoffs, but faced the Thunder before they moved from Seattle, and the Kings in Kansas City.
- New Orleans has a 18-25 all-time record in the playoffs in seven trips to the postseason.
- The Pelicans/Hornets have won one playoff series, a 4-1 first-round win over the Dallas Mavericks in 2007-08.

SEASON SERIES NOTES

- Portland and New Orleans split the season series 2-2, with each team winning once on the road.
- The aggregate final score of the four-game series was 439-438, Trail Blazers, with all four games being decided by 10 points or fewer.
- Lillard led the Trail Blazers in scoring vs. New Orleans in the regular season season, posting averages of 26.5 points (42.7% FG, 25.6% 3-PT, 77.8% FT), 7.3 assists, 5.3 rebounds and 2.25 steals in four games.
- Lillard has scored at least 25 points in seven of his last nine regular season games against New Orleans.
- Six Trail Blazers averaged double digits in scoring vs. New Orleans in the regular season (Lillard, 26.5; **CJ McCollum**, 17.5; **Jusuf Nurkic**, 15.0; **Al-Farouq Aminu**, 11.0; **Evan Turner**, 10.3; **Shabazz Napier**, 10.0).
- DeMarcus Cousins led the Pelicans in scoring vs. Portland, averaging 33.7 points, 13.3 rebounds and 2.00 blocks in three games.
- Anthony Davis also played three games vs. the Trail Blazers, posting averages of 24.7 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 3.00 blocks.
- The Trail Blazers held their opponents to 44.5% shooting from the field after the All-Star break (fifth in NBA) while the Pelicans held their opponents to 44.3% shooting from the field in that period (third in NBA).

CONNECTIONS

- Trail Blazers forward **Al-Farouq Aminu** played three seasons for the Pelicans, averaging 6.9 points (45.7% FG, 26.3% 3-PT, 71.6% FT), 6.3 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.05 steals in 222 games (157 starts) from 2011-14.
- Pelicans head coach Alvin Gentry was the head coach of the Phoenix Suns team that defeated the Trail Blazers 4-2 in the first round of the 2010 NBA Playoffs.
- This marks the third consecutive season New Orleans guard Ian Clark has faced the Trail Blazers in the playoffs. He averaged 6.5 ppg vs. Portland over eight games the past two postseasons with the Golden State Warriors.
- All-Stars Anthony Davis (selected first overall) and **Damian Lillard** (sixth overall) were members of the same 2012 NBA Draft class.
- Trail Blazers guard/forward **Evan Turner** and Pelicans guard Jrue Holiday were teammates on the Philadelphia 76ers from 2010-13.
- Turner and Pelicans forward Solomon Hill were teammates on the Indiana Pacers in 2013-14.
- Trail Blazers forward **Ed Davis** and Pelicans forward/center Alexis Ajinca were teammates in Toronto in 2010-11.
- Pelicans assistant coach Jamelle McMillan is the son of former Trail Blazers head coach Nate McMillan.

PLAYOFF NEWS AND NOTES

FIVE IN A ROW: The Trail Blazers clinched their fifth consecutive playoff berth on April 1. The last time Portland went to the playoffs in five straight years was 1999-2003 (21-year streak starting in 1983).

AS THE THREE SEED: The Trail Blazers enter the 2018 Playoffs as the three seed in the Western Conference. Portland has been the three seed five times previously, most recently in the in the 2000 Playoffs. The Trail Blazers have advanced to the Western Conference Finals three times as the three seed (1977, 1990 and 2000) and made the NBA Finals twice (1977, 1990) with Portland's one NBA Championship coming as the three seed in 1977. Portland's all-time playoffs record as the three seed is 39-29 (.574).

CJ SCORING: **CJ McCollum** led the Trail Blazers with 22 points (9-16 FG, 2-5 3-PT, 2-3 FT) in Game 3. It was the eighth time that he scored at least 20 points in his last 11 playoff games. McCollum also dished out three assists and had one rebound. McCollum is tied for 17th in scoring for the 2018 NBA Playoffs (21.0).

CHIEF IN CHARGE: **Al-Farouq Aminu** had 21 points, eight rebounds and two steals while shooting 8-of-15 from the field (3-8 3-PT, 2-2 FT) in Game 3. Aminu is one of three players in NBA history with career postseason averages of at least 13.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.0 three-point field goals.

BENCH BOOST: Through three games, the Trail Blazers' bench has outscored the Pelicans' bench in the series, 92-55. Portland's bench outscored the New Orleans reserves, 36-15, in Game 2. **Zach Collins** led the charge with 12 points while **Maurice Harkless** scored 11 points on 5-of-5 shooting (1-1 3-PT) and **Pat Connaughton** added a postseason career-high nine points.

CLOSE CALL: Portland trailed by 14 points with 6:09 remaining in the fourth quarter of Game 1 before cutting the Pelicans' lead to one with 0:59 left in the game. The Pelican's went 4-of-4 from the free throw line in the final minute to preserve the victory. **CJ McCollum** scored 14 of his 19 points in the fourth quarter, shooting 5-of-9 (3-5 3-PT) in the period.

OUT AND RUNNING: The Trail Blazers outscored the Pelicans in fast break points in Game 1, 29-17. The most fast break points that the Trail Blazers scored during the regular season was 21 (March 5 at LAL).

RECENT HISTORY: The three seed in the Western Conference has won its First Round series in each of the last four years. The most recent three seed to advance to the Western Conference Finals was the Oklahoma City Thunder in 2016.

STOTTS LEADING THE WAY: **Terry Stotts** has led the Trail Blazers to the postseason for the fifth consecutive season, making him the third coach in franchise history to lead the Trail Blazers to five playoff appearances and the first since Rick Adelman did so from 1989 to 1994. He has coached Portland to the Western Conference Semifinals twice in the last four playoff appearances. Stotts won an NBA Championship as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks in 2011.

PAST PRECEDENT: The Trail Blazers were down 0-2 in the First Round of the 2016 NBA Playoffs before reeling off four straight wins to beat the Clippers in six games. The last time the Pelicans had a 2-0 lead in a playoff series was the 2008 Western Conference Semifinals, which they went on to lose to the Spurs in seven games.

LILLARD'S PLAYOFF SCORING: With 20 points (5-14 FG, 3-9 3-PT, 7-8 FT) in Game 3, **Damian Lillard** passed Cliff Robinson for fifth all-time on the Trail Blazers playoff scoring list. Lillard has scored 20-plus points in 23 of his 34 career postseason games.

BEEN THERE BEFORE: Despite having the second-youngest roster in the NBA by average age (25.1 as of April 12), 12 of Portland's 15 players had previous playoff experience entering the 2018 Playoffs. Portland's roster has played a combined 227 postseason games. **Evan Turner** (47 games) and **Damian Lillard** (35 games) have the most playoff experience. Eleven players return from Portland's 2017 Playoffs roster.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE: Portland entered the 2018 Playoffs with home-court advantage in the First Round for the first time since 2009. It is the 13th time in franchise history that the Trail Blazers have home-court advantage in a First Round series. Portland went 6-6 in the previous 12 series. The Trail Blazers are 80-42 (.656) all-time at home in the playoffs and 40-27 (.597) at home in the First Round.

NEW OPPONENT: The Trail Blazers are meeting the Pelicans in the postseason for the first time. Prior to this series, the Pelicans were the only Western Conference franchise that Portland had not faced in a playoff series.

NORTHWEST BY NORTHWEST: The Trail Blazers are winners of the 2017-18 Northwest Division title, marking the seventh time in franchise history that Portland has won its division. It is the team's first division title since the 2014-15 season.

DIVISIONAL DEPTH: The Trail Blazers are one of four teams from the Northwest Division that made the 2018 playoffs, which is the most of any of the league's six divisions. Portland went 9-7 against divisional opponents this season, tied for the second-best mark in the Northwest Division.

THREE-POINT THREATS: **Damian Lillard** (91 postseason threes), **CJ McCollum** (51 postseason threes) and **Al-Farouq Aminu** (43 postseason threes) rank second, fifth and seventh, respectively, for three-pointers made in the playoffs in Trail Blazers history. McCollum was 11-of-22 (50.0%) from deep in the 2017 Playoffs while Aminu has shot 43-of-106 (40.1%) in three postseason runs with the Trail Blazers. Lillard has made at least four threes in 11 of his 34 career playoff games.

BIG GAME DAME: **Damian Lillard** averaged 27.8 points in Portland's 2017 First Round series against the Warriors, marking the sixth highest playoff series scoring average in team history. Lillard scored at least 30 points three times in that series, adding to his 10 career playoff games with 30-plus points, the second-most in team history (Drexler, 14).

NEWS AND NOTES

LEADING THE WAY: Terry Stotts was hired as the 14th head coach of the Portland Trail Blazers on August 7, 2012. Stotts led the Trail Blazers to a 49-33 record in 2017-18 and has compiled a 272-220 record in six seasons with Portland. Stotts is the third-winningest coach in franchise history, and the first Trail Blazers head coach since Rick Adelman (1989-1994) to reach the playoffs in five consecutive seasons (third overall in franchise history). With Stotts at the helm, the Trail Blazers ranked in the top-10 in scoring for each of the past four seasons (2013-14 to 2016-17) and had the NBA's eighth-best defensive rating (104.2) during the 2017-18 season.

WINNING WAYS: The Trail Blazers ended the season with a 49-33 record, marking the team's best finish since the 2014-15 season (51-31). It was Portland's fifth consecutive season with a record of .500 or better, the first time the team has accomplished that feat since 1999-00 to 2003-04 (15 straight, starting 1989-90).

MODA-MENTUM: Portland won 21 of its final 24 games at Moda Center (28-13 overall). The Trail Blazers had two nine-game winning streaks at home this season (12/28/17 - 2/8/18, 2/14/18 - 3/17/18), which marked the first time the team won nine straight home games since the 2012-13 season. Portland was one of four teams in the NBA this season with two winning streaks at home of at least nine games (Houston, Philadelphia, San Antonio).

POINT MAN: Damian Lillard finished the season tied for fourth in the league in scoring (26.9). He is the first Portland player to finish in the top-five in scoring since Clyde Drexler was fourth during the 1991-92 season (25.0). Lillard finished sixth in the NBA in scoring each of the last two seasons.

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Trail Blazers allowed the fifth-fewest points in the league this season (103.0) while holding their opponents to 44.7% shooting from the field. Portland held its opponents below 100 points in 33 games this season, tied for the fifth-most in the league. They were 26-7 in those contests.

DYNAMIC DUO: Damian Lillard (26.9 ppg) and CJ McCollum (21.4 ppg) combined to average 48.3 points per game this season, making them the second-highest backcourt in the league (49.0, Harden/Paul). Lillard and McCollum have each averaged over 20 points a game for three straight seasons. No other backcourt tandem in team history has done that once.

BOSNIAN BEAST: Jusuf Nurkic scored in double figures in the final 14 games of the regular season and recorded a double-double in nine of those contests. Over the last 19 games of the season, Nurkic averaged 15.2 points, 11.2 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 1.80 blocks while shooting 57.5% from the field.

BLOCK PARTY: Jusuf Nurkic blocked at least three shots in seven of the last 13 games of the regular season. Nurkic's 30 blocks in that span were fourth in the league and he tied for ninth in the NBA with 1.41 blocks per game for the season.

DAME DROPPING 30: Damian Lillard scored 36 points (13-25 FG, 4-10 3-PT, 6-6 FT) against the Jazz on April 11, marking his 100th career 30-point game. It was Lillard's 25th game of 30-plus points this season, the fifth-most in the NBA (Davis/James - 30). Lillard led the league in second-half scoring (14.4).

CJ SCORING TWENTY: CJ McCollum scored 20 points against the Grizzlies on April 1. It was the 47th game of 20-plus points for McCollum this season, the 15th most in the NBA (69, Harden). McCollum scored 20-plus points in five straight games from Jan. 5-12, his second-longest streak of the season (six, Dec. 9-18).

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARDS: Ed Davis notched 10-plus rebounds 20 times this season, which tied the most such games Davis has had in a season in his career (2014-15). No other reserve in the NBA recorded more than 13 games of double-digit rebounds this season. Davis finished fifth in the NBA in offensive rebound percentage (13.9%).

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS: After the All-Star break, Portland was third in the league in points allowed (100.8) and ranked 16th in the league in scoring (107.1). Portland's point differential of 6.3 in that span was the fourth-best in the league.

THIRTEEN IN A ROW: The Trail Blazers won 13 straight games from Feb. 14 to March 18, matching the second-longest winning streak in franchise history. The streak included two wins over the defending-champion Warriors as well as victories over division rivals Utah, Minnesota and Oklahoma City. It was Portland's longest winning streak since winning 13 straight from Dec. 3 - 30, 2007.

EASTERN SUCCESS: Portland's game against Boston on March 23 was its final regular season game against an Eastern Conference opponent. The Trail Blazers were 18-12 against teams from the East this season, securing their best out-of-conference record since the 2014-15 season (20-10).

WESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

THREE TIMES OVER: Damian Lillard was named the Western Conference Player of the Week three times this season. Lillard and James Harden (five times) were the only players to receive the award more than twice.

JANUARY 22: Damian Lillard was named the NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Jan. 15 to Jan. 21 after leading the Trail Blazers to a 3-0 record. Lillard averaged 29.3 points (52.7% FG, 52.0% 3-PT, 100% FT), 5.0 rebounds and 8.0 assists for the week.

MARCH 12: Damian Lillard was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from March 5 to March 11. Lillard led the league in scoring for the week, averaging 34.7 points (45.9% FG, 56.3% 3-PT, 83.9% FT) to go with 3.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists. Lillard also led the league in three-pointers made (18) and was second in free throws (26). It was the fifth time in his career that Lillard received the award. He joins Clyde Drexler (10), LaMarcus Aldridge (eight) and Brandon Roy (five) as Portland players who have won the award at least five times.

APRIL 2: Damian Lillard was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from March 26 to April 1. Lillard led the league in scoring average for the week, averaging 28.3 points (46.9% FG, 25.9% 3-PT, 94.7% FT) to go with 6.3 rebounds and 8.7 assists. Lillard is one of three players in team history to have earned the honor at least six times.

NEWS AND NOTES

ROAD WARRIORS: Portland's 107-103 win over New Orleans on March 27 was the team's seventh straight road win. The streak tied the third-longest road winning streak in team history, and is the longest since Portland won seven straight from Nov. 12 - Dec. 9, 2014. The Trail Blazers had a winning road record for the first time since the 2013-14 season (23-18).

STREAK AT THE STRIPE: **Damian Lillard** made 64 consecutive free throws over nine games from March 12-30, marking the most consecutive free throws made in franchise history (Stoudamire, 57 - Jan. 14 - Feb. 16, 2005). It was the most consecutive free throws made in the NBA since Dirk Nowitzki made 74 (March, 2011).

DOUBLE-DOUBLE DAME: **Damian Lillard** had a double-double of 17 points and 11 assists against the Clippers on March 31. It was his 10th double-double of the season. Lillard recorded a double-double while scoring 30-plus points five times this season, the third-most such games by any guard in the league.

CHIEF IN CHARGE: **Al-Farouq Aminu** had 17 points (7-9 FG, 2-4 3-PT, 1-1 FT), 10 rebounds and one steal against the Grizzlies on April 1. It was Aminu's ninth double-double of the season, which tied the second-most he has had in a season in his career (10, 2012-13). In the 11 games from March 15 to April 3, Aminu averaged 12.1 points, 8.8 rebounds, 2.2 assists and 2.10 steals.

DOING IT ALL: **Damian Lillard** is the first player in franchise history to average at least 26 points, four rebounds and six assists over the course of a season. He was one of just four players in the NBA to achieve the feat this season (Curry, Harden, James). Lillard is one of seven players in NBA history to average at least 25 points and six assists twice in his first six seasons (Robertson/James/Archibald/Wade/Harden/Jordan).

THREE-JAY MCCOLLUM: **CJ McCollum** shot 39.7% from the three-point line this season, tied for the 33rd-best mark in the league. McCollum (189 3-PT made) finished 15th in the NBA in 3-pointers made and knocked down at least three 3-PT shots in 34 games, the 16th-most in the NBA (Harden - 54).

MOE BUCKETS: **Maurice Harkless** scored 16 points (7-11 FG, 2-5 3-PT) against Oklahoma City on March 25. It was the fifth time in six games that Harkless scored in double figures. In the six games from March 15 to March 25, Harkless averaged 14.8 points, 3.8 rebounds and 1.8 assists while shooting 66.0% from the field and 61.9% from the three-point line.

MOVING UP: The Trail Blazers victory over the Clippers on March 18th was the 267th win for **Terry Stotts** as head coach of the Trail Blazers. With the win, he passed Nate McMillan for third place on Portland's all-time coaching wins list.

FIFTY-POINT PERFORMANCES

CJ McCollum and **Damian Lillard** are the only set of teammates to have both scored at least 50 points in a game in the NBA this season. They became the second and third players in NBA history to score 50-plus points in fewer than 30 minutes.

CJ FIVE-0: With 50 points (18-25 FG, 6-9 3-PT, 8-8 FT) against the Bulls on Jan. 31, **CJ McCollum** became the seventh player in franchise history to record a 50-point game and set new career highs in points and field goals made. McCollum accomplished the feat in just 29 minutes, making him the second player in NBA history to score at least 50 points in fewer than 30 minutes. McCollum is the only player in franchise history to score 50 points on 25 shots or fewer.

HISTORIC QUARTER: **CJ McCollum** set franchise records for points in a quarter and field goals in a quarter with 28 points on 11-of-14 shooting (4-5 3-PT, 2-2 FT) in the first period against Chicago on Jan. 31. It was most points scored in a quarter by an NBA player this season.

FIFTY IN THREE: **Damian Lillard** scored 50 points (16-26 FG, 8-13 3-PT, 10-10 FT) in 29 minutes at Sacramento on Feb. 9, becoming the third player in NBA history to score 50-plus points in less than 30 minutes (McCollum/K. Thompson). It was the fourth time in his career that Lillard scored 50-plus points, the most in franchise history and tied for the sixth-most among active NBA players.

SELECT COMPANY: With nine assists against Cleveland on March 15, **Damian Lillard** joined LeBron James and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history to record at least 1,500 points and 400 assists in each of their first six seasons.

MARATHON MEN: **CJ McCollum** ran 2.70 miles per game this season, the most by any player in the NBA. **Damian Lillard** was eighth, running 2.54 miles per game. The Trail Blazers are the only team in the NBA that had two players in the top-10.

VOLUME AND ACCURACY: **Damian Lillard** shot 493-of-538 from the free-throw line this season (91.6%). It was the second most accurate free throw percentage by a player who made at least 490 free throws in league history (Reggie Miller, 551-600, 91.8%).

COACH OF THE MONTH: **Terry Stotts** was named NBA Western Conference Coach of the month for January after leading the Trail Blazers to an 11-5 record, including a perfect 7-0 mark at home. It is the fifth time Stotts has won the award, the most in franchise history. He is the only Western Conference coach to have won the award in each of the past five seasons.

1,500 POINTS: With 39 points against the Lakers on March 5, **Damian Lillard** passed 1,500 points for the sixth straight season. He is one of 13 players all-time and one of four active players to score 1,500 points in each of their first six seasons (Anthony, Durant, James). Lillard is tied with Clyde Drexler for the most seasons with 1,500 points as a Trail Blazer. His 1,962 points this season are tied for the eighth-most in team history.

NEWS AND NOTES

LILLARD FROM THE ARC: **Damian Lillard** made a three-pointer in 52 straight games from Nov. 10 to March 18, setting a new franchise record (44 - Batum, 3/14/13 - 1/2/14). Lillard made 227 three-pointers this season, tied for the sixth-most in the NBA and two shy of his own franchise record (229, 2015-16).

BIG TEN: **Damian Lillard** scored a total of 354 points in the 10 games from Feb. 9 to March 6, representing the highest-scoring ten-game span in team history. Clyde Drexler previously held the record, having scored 329 points from Dec. 16, 1988 to Jan. 7, 1989.

THE SHABAZZ SHOW: **Shabazz Napier** scored 13 points (4-5 FG, 4-4 3-PT, 1-2 FT) against Dallas on April 3. It was the 28th game this season that Napier scored in double figures. Napier scored in double figures in 23 games total during his first three NBA seasons.

YOUNG SUCCESS: With an average age of 25.1 years old as of April 12, the Trail Blazers have the second-youngest roster in the NBA (Phoenix - 24.9). Portland is the youngest team in the 2018 Playoffs.

FEBRUARY TO REMEMBER: **Damian Lillard** averaged 31.4 ppg in the month of February, marking the highest scoring average for any month in team history (minimum 10 games). Geoff Petrie previously held the record, having averaged 30.4 ppg in March, 1971.

10,000 POINTS: With a driving lay-up at the 0:47 mark of the first quarter at Toronto on Feb. 2, **Damian Lillard** reached 10,000 points for his career. Lillard reached the milestone in 441 career games, which is faster than any of the previous six players to score 10,000 points in Portland (500, Drexler). Lillard is one of eight NBA players all-time with 10,000 points and 2,500 assists in their first six seasons (James/Jordan/Bird/Archibald/Maravich/Bing/Robertson).

CLIMBING THE LADDER: With 37 points against the Knicks on March 6, **Damian Lillard** passed Cliff Robinson for fourth on the all-time franchise scoring list.

STRONG START: **Jusuf Nurkic** had a double-double (12 points, 12 rebounds) in the first half against the Pacers on Jan. 18. It was the first time in his career that Nurkic has had a double-double by halftime. Nurkic finished the game with 19 points, 17 rebounds, two steals and two blocks. He is one of seven NBA players to record those numbers in a game this season.

HARK BEYOND THE ARC: **Maurice Harkless** made a career-high five three-pointers (of five) on his way to 19 points at Boston on Feb. 4. Harkless is the fourth player in franchise history to come off the bench and make at least five three pointers while shooting 100% from the three-point line.

THREE-TIME ALL-STAR: Playing in the third All-Star Game of his career on Feb. 18, **Damian Lillard** tied for the Team Stephen lead in scoring with 21 points (9-14 FG, 3-8 3-PT) to go with three rebounds and two assists in 21 minutes.

TWO OF A KIND: **Damian Lillard** had 44 points, three rebounds and eight assists against the Warriors on Feb. 14, while **CJ McCollum** added 29 points, five rebounds and two assists. Lillard and McCollum are two of the 11 NBA guards who averaged 21+ points, 3+ rebounds and 3+ assists this season. The Trail Blazers are the only team in the league with two players on that list.

STOTTS WINS 250: Portland's 107-93 victory over Dallas on Jan. 26 was the 250th win for **Terry Stotts** as head coach of the Trail Blazers. Stotts is the fourth coach in franchise history to win 250 games, and one of seven head coaches in the NBA to have won 250-plus games with their current team.

PHYS ED: **Ed Davis** followed up back-to-back double-doubles, including season highs of 15 points, 13 rebounds and three blocks against the Mavericks on Jan. 26, with 14 points and nine rebounds against the Clippers on Jan. 30. In the five games from Jan. 20 to Jan. 30, Davis averaged 11.0 points, 10.4 rebounds, 1.4 assists and 1.60 blocks.

AL-FAROUC ON FIRE: **Al-Farouq Aminu** scored a season-high 24 points while shooting five-of-seven from the three-point line at Chicago on Jan. 1. It was the fifth time this season that Aminu has made five three-pointers in a game, a feat he had accomplished just twice before this season. Aminu shot a career-best 36.9% from the three-point line this season.

THREE KINGS: With two three-pointers against the Timberwolves on Jan. 14, **Damian Lillard** became the second player in NBA history to make 100-plus three-pointers in each of their first six seasons. Lillard (227 3-PT made) and **CJ McCollum** (189 3-PT made) were the third set of teammates to each make 180-plus three pointers this season (Curry/Thompson, Harden/Gordon).

NURK'S NIGHT: **Jusuf Nurkic** had 29 points (12-19 FG, 5-10 FT), 15 rebounds, three assists and four blocks against the Nets on Nov. 24. Nurkic is the first player in Trail Blazers history to record that stat line in a non-overtime game.

'BAZZ BALLING: In the eight games from Nov. 7 to Nov. 22, **Shabazz Napier** averaged 11.9 points (54.8% FG, 64.7% 3-PT, 80.0% FT), 2.3 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 1.30 steals. Playing against the Magic on Nov. 15, Napier became the third player in Trail Blazers history to make at least five 3-pointers off the bench while shooting 100% from deep (Wright, Crabbe).

MAKING HISTORY: With a 124-76 victory over the Phoenix Suns on Oct. 18, the Trail Blazers set the NBA record for the largest margin of victory in a season-opening game, besting Denver's 46-point margin over the LA Clippers on Nov. 6, 1987. The 48-point win is tied for the second-largest margin of victory in franchise history (50, vs. Cleveland 11/21/82).

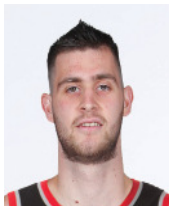
