Following a medical leave of absence, **Brian Wheeler** will return for his 21st season at the helm to provide play-by-play for all home and away games, with **Michael Holton** adding commentary for home broadcasts. **Travis Demers** will pick up radio play-by-play duties until Wheeler returns. On television, NBC Sports Northwest will air a total of 76 Trail Blazers regular season games featuring analyst **Lamar Hurd**, **Kevin Calabro** calling play-by-play, and **Brooke Olzendam** reporting from the sideline. Between NBC Sports Northwest, TNT and ESPN, all 82 regular-season games will be televised for the 12th consecutive year and the 12th time in franchise history.

## SERIES NOTES

- Today's game marks the second and final meeting between the Trail Blazers and the Wizards during the 2018-19 season. Washington leads the season series, 1-0.
- **LAST MEETING:** Otto Porter Jr. blocked a **Damian Lillard** layup attempt as time expired to give the Wizards a 125-124 overtime victory in Portland on Oct. 22. Markieff Morris led the way for Washington with 28 points and nine rebounds while Lillard had 29 points, eight rebounds and eight assists for the Trail Blazers.
- **BACKCOURT BATTLE:** Portland's **Damian Lillard** (25.7 ppg) and **CJ McCollum** (20.5 ppg) and Washington's Bradley Beal (22.1 ppg) and John Wall (20.7 ppg) all rank among the top-25 scorers in the NBA this season.
- In his last six games against the Wizards, **Damian Lillard** has averaged 30.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 7.5 assists.
- **Jusuf Nurkic** scored 22 points (9-16 FG, 4-4 FT) and pulled down 18 rebounds against the Wizards on Oct. 22. In his last three games against Washington, Nurkic has averaged 18.0 points, 10.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.00 blocks.
- **Al-Farouq Aminu** had 16 points (6-8 FG, 3-5 3-PT, 1-2 FT), 15 rebounds and one steal against Washington on Oct. 22. In his last four games against the Wizards, Aminu has averaged 14.0 points while shooting 11-of-17 from the three-point line (61.1%).
- **Nik Stauskas** recorded 15 points (5-10 FG, 3-6 3-PT, 2-2 FT), eight rebounds and three assists against the Wizards on Oct. 22.
- Bradley Beal scored 25 points on 10-of-25 shooting (5-9 3-PT) to go with eight rebounds and seven assists against the Trail Blazers on Oct. 22. Beal has scored at least 25 points in each of his last five games against Portland.
- Kelly Oubre Jr. scored 22 points to go with six rebounds in 39 minutes off the bench against Portland on Oct. 22. Oubre has averaged 13.4 points per game while shooting 10-of-14 (71.4%) from the three-point line in his last five games against the Trail Blazers.
- **CONNECTION:** Portland forward **Al-Farouq Aminu** and Washington forward/center Jason Smith were teammates with New Orleans for two seasons from 2012-13 to 2013-14.
- **CONNECTION:** **Evan Turner** and Wizards forward Jeff Green were teammates with the Boston Celtics for part of the 2014-15 season.

## SERIES NOTES

- Tuesday's game marks the first of two meetings between the Trail Blazers and the Knicks during the 2017-18 season. Portland won the season series in 2017-18, 2-0.
- **LAST MEETING:** The Trail Blazers beat the Knicks at Moda Center, 111-87, on March 6. **Damian Lillard** led Portland with 37 points (10-18 FG, 8-11 3-PT, 9-11 FT) to go with two rebounds, one assist and two steals while Tim Hardaway Jr. had 19 points (8-18 FG, 3-6 3-PT) to pace New York.
- In two games against the Knicks last season, **Damian Lillard** averaged 34.5 points (52.6% FG, 52.9% 3-PT, 90.0% FT), 1.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.50 steals.
- **CJ McCollum** averaged 15.5 points (33.3% FG, 58.3% 3-PT, 100% FT), 6.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists in two games against New York during the 2017-18 season.
- In two games against the Trail Blazers last season, Tim Hardaway Jr. averaged 17.5 points (38.9% FG, 45.5% 3-PT, 50.0% FT), 4.0 rebounds and 1.50 steals.

# NEWS AND NOTES

**LEADING THE WAY:** Now in his seventh season with the Trail Blazers, **Terry Stotts** was hired as the franchise's 14th head coach on August 7, 2012. Stotts led the Trail Blazers to a 49-33 record and a Northwest Division Championship in 2017-18 and has compiled a 282-225 record in six-plus seasons with Portland. Stotts is the third-winningest coach in franchise history, and the first Trail Blazers head coach since Rick Adelman (1989-1994) to reach the playoffs in five consecutive seasons (third overall in franchise history). He is one of two coaches in the NBA to receive Coach of the Month honors in each of the last five seasons.

**PASSING THEM UP:** With his fourth assist against the Timberwolves on Nov. 16, **Damian Lillard** (3,020 career assists) passed Damon Stoudamire (3,018) for the third-most assists in Trail Blazers history. Lillard trails only Terry Porter (5,319) and Clyde Drexler (4,933).

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** **CJ McCollum** was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Nov. 5 to Nov. 11. His week was highlighted by 40 points, four rebounds, six assists and four steals against the Bucks on Nov. 6 and 23 points and seven rebounds against the Clippers on Nov. 8. Portland went 3-0 on the week, with all three wins coming against teams with winning records. It is the first time McCollum has received the award.

**BOSNIAN BEAST:** **Jusuf Nurkic** recorded 21 points, 14 rebounds, three steals and four blocks against the Lakers on Nov. 14. He is the first player to have at least 21 points, 14 rebounds three steals and four blocks in the NBA this season and is the first Portland player to record that line since Clifford Robinson did so on Jan. 20, 1993. Nurkic has recorded three straight double-doubles and eight for the season.

**THIRTY AND TEN:** **Damian Lillard** scored 31 points (8-23 FG, 3-9 3-PT, 12-13 FT) and handed out 11 assists against the Lakers on Nov. 14. It marked his 15th career game with at least 30 points and 10 assists, which is tied for the sixth-most in the NBA since Lillard entered the league in the 2012-13 season.

**BOARD MEETING:** The Trail Blazers lead the league in rebounds per game (51.5) and are second in rebounding percentage (53.4%). Portland has hauled in 50-plus rebounds in nine games this season, the second-most in the NBA

**LONG-RANGE ATTACK:** Seven Portland players connected on a three-pointer against the Bucks on Nov. 6, and six players made at least two shots from deep. The Trail Blazers shot 17-of-43 from the three-point line (39.5%).

**MOVING UP:** **Terry Stotts** is the third-winningest coach in franchise history and is 10 wins away from passing Rick Adelman for second place. He is the third coach in franchise history to coach 500-plus games. In his seventh season with Portland, Stotts is the fourth-longest tenured head coach in the NBA.

**GETTING DEFENSIVE:** The Trail Blazers held Minnesota to 81 points on Nov. 4, which is the lowest scoring total in the NBA this season. Portland is holding opponents to 107.9 points per game, the eighth-lowest average in the league. The Trail Blazers are one of eight teams that have held their opponent under 100 points at least four times this season.

**11,000 AND COUNTING:** Playing in his seventh season with the Trail Blazers, **Damian Lillard** ranks as the fourth-leading scorer in Trail Blazers history and trails Terry Porter by 103 points for third place. Lillard became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 11,000 points on Oct. 27. He achieved the feat in 474 games, making him the fastest player in team history to reach the milestone.

**WINNING BIG:** Portland's 116-105 win over the Clippers on Nov. 8 was the team's eighth win by at least 10 points this season. The Trail Blazers are one of four NBA teams (Golden State, Milwaukee, Toronto) with at least eight wins by double digits during the 2018-19 season. Portland's average point differential of 6.7 is the fifth-highest in the NBA.

**HAMMER TIME:** **Meyers Leonard** led the Trail Blazers bench with 15 points (3-7 FG, 1-4 3-PT, 8-8 FT) and 12 rebounds to go with two assists and one steal against Minnesota on Nov. 4. It was his first double-double of the season and his scoring and rebounding totals were both season highs.

**BIG GAME HUNTING:** **CJ McCollum** scored 40 points (17-26 FG, 5-10 3-PT, 1-2 FT), including 19 in the third quarter, against the Bucks on Nov. 6. It was the highest-scoring game by a Portland player against the Bucks in franchise history and marked the fourth game of 40-plus points of McCollum's career. He became the third player in franchise history to have a game with at least 40 points, five rebounds, six assists and four steals (Drexler - five times, Lillard).

**QUICK WORK:** **Jusuf Nurkic** led Portland with 19 points (8-11 FG, 3-4 FT) and 12 rebounds in just under 23 minutes against Minnesota on Nov. 4. Nurkic is the first player in the NBA this season and the third in franchise history to score at least 19 points and pull down at least 12 rebounds in 23 minutes or less.

**BENCH PRESS:** Portland's bench combined for 50 points against the Pelicans on Nov. 1, marking the third time Portland's reserves scored 50-plus points this season. Portland's bench is 11th in the league in points per game (38.6), seventh in three-point percentage (37.6%), fifth in assists per game (9.3) and fifth in rebounds (20.9).

**SUPER SUB:** **Evan Turner** had his first double-double of the season with 16 points and 11 rebounds to go with four assists against the Bucks on Nov. 6. He is the second bench player in the NBA this season to record those numbers. Turner is one of three reserve players in the league averaging at least eight points, four rebounds and four assists this season.

# NEWS AND NOTES

---

**MAKING A MARK:** **Damian Lillard** scored 169 points through the first five games of the season, besting his own franchise record for most points in the first five games of a season (163, 2016-17). Lillard is averaging 25.7 points per game, which is the eighth-most in the NBA (Curry, 29.5).

**EFFICIENT THREE:** **Damian Lillard** (22 points), **CJ McCollum** (19 points) and **Jusuf Nurkic** (22 points) combined to score 63 points while shooting 66.7% from the field, 50.0% from the three-point line and 88.2% from the free-throw line against Houston on Oct. 30. The trio combined to play 80 total minutes in the 104-85 win.

**LILLARD AT THE LINE:** **Damian Lillard** has made at least eight free throws in seven games this season, which is the third-most in the NBA. He is shooting 93.2% from the free throw line this season (96-of-103), which is the seventh-best mark in the league. Lillard ranks fifth in the league in free throws made (Embiid, 158) and is eighth in attempts (Embiid, 194).

**PILING UP:** The Trail Blazers scored a season-high 132 points in a 132-119 win against the Pelicans on Nov. 1. It was the most points Portland has scored since a 137-105 win over Golden State on Feb. 19, 2016. Portland ranks eighth in the NBA in scoring (114.6).

**SOPHOMORES SHOW OUT:** Second-year big men **Zach Collins** and **Caleb Swanigan** had a strong showing in Portland's 103-93 win over the Pacers on Oct. 29. Collins tied his career high in scoring with 17 points for the second time in three games (Oct. 25 at Orl.) to go with three rebounds and three assists, while Swanigan recorded his first career double-double with a career-high 11 points and 10 rebounds.

**PERFECT GAME:** **Zach Collins** scored a career-high 17 points (7-7 FG, 2-2 3-PT, 1-1 FT) against Orlando on Oct. 25 while matching his career highs in field goals made and three-pointers made. Collins is one of two players in team history to score at least 17 points off the bench while not missing a shot from the field or the free throw line (Sabonis, 11/29/95 at GSW).

**REBOUNDER-IN-CHIEF:** **Al-Farouq Aminu** hauled in 15 rebounds against Washington on Oct. 22 and at Orlando on Oct. 25, marking the first time in his career that he had at least 15 rebounds in consecutive games. Aminu ranks 25th in the NBA in rebounds per game (8.4).

**FORTY-FORTY:** After scoring 41 points against the Magic on Oct. 25, **Damian Lillard** put up 42 points at Miami on Oct. 27. It is the first time in his career that Lillard has scored 40-plus points in consecutive games and only the second time it has happened in franchise history (Drexler). Lillard now has 18 career games with 40-plus points, which is the most in team history (Drexler, 17).

**ALL THAT SAUCE:** In his Trail Blazers debut against the Lakers on Oct. 18, **Nik Stauskas** matched his career high with 24 points on 7-of-11 shooting (5-8 3-PT, 5-5 FT). It tied the most points scored by a Portland reserve in their first game with the Trail Blazers (John Johnson, 10/13/73 vs. Cap.). Only Kiki Vandeweghe (47, 10/27/84 at KC) and Jim Barnett (31, 10/16/70 vs. Cle.) have scored more points in their first game with Portland.

**TWENTY-TWENTY:** The Trail Blazers are 4-2 when both **Damian Lillard** and **CJ McCollum** score at least 20 points in the same game. Lillard led Portland with 25 points against the Clippers on Nov. 8 while McCollum added 23 points. The Trail Blazers were 23-10 last season in games in which both players scored 20-plus points.

**FIFTY DOUBLE-DOUBLES:** With 18 points (7-14 FG, 4-7 FT) and 10 rebounds against the Magic on Oct. 25, **Jusuf Nurkic** recorded the 50th double-double of his career. With 56 career double-doubles, Nurkic trails only **Damian Lillard** (58) for most career double-doubles among current Portland players.

**THRIVING AT THE LINE:** The Trail Blazers lead the league in free-throw percentage (85.3%), are sixth in free throws per game (19.8) and are 16th in free throws attempted per game (23.2).

**DIVISION CHAMPIONS:** The Trail Blazers won the 2017-18 Northwest Division title, marking the seventh time in franchise history that Portland won its division title. It was the team's first division title since the 2014-15 season.

**SELECT COMPANY:** On March 15, 2018, **Damian Lillard** joined LeBron James and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history to record at least 1,500 points and 400 assists in each of their first six seasons.

**BACK AT IT:** Eleven of the players on Portland's current 15-man roster are returning from the 2017-18 season. The returning players combined to log 14,779 minutes last season, accounting for 74.8% of the possible 19,755 minutes. The Trail Blazers have eight players that are playing in at least their third season in Portland.

**STREAKS CONTINUE:** The Trail Blazers 128-119 opening-night win over the L.A. Lakers extended a pair of notable streaks. Portland has won an NBA-record 18 consecutive home openers (14, Boston, 1979-92). Additionally, Portland beat the Lakers in 16 straight contests, matching the second-longest winning streak over any team in franchise history (17, LA Clippers, 1986-89).

**RUN ON REBOUNDS:** The Trail Blazers hauled in 70 rebounds in an overtime loss to the Wizards on Oct. 22, marking just the third time in franchise history that Portland has had 70-plus rebounds. The other two occurrences featured double overtime (74, Por. at LAL, 2/14/90) and quadruple overtime (75, Por. vs. Cle., 10/18/74).

**HAVE A HALF:** **Damian Lillard** scored 34 of his 41 points against the Magic on Oct. 25 in the second half, breaking his own franchise record for points in a half (33, 4/8/17 vs. Utah). Lillard shot 11-of-15 from the field in the final two quarters (5-8 3-PT, 7-7 FT).

**CAREER HIGHS:** Portland's 128-119 victory over the L.A. Lakers on Oct. 18 featured career highs by three Trail Blazers players in three different categories. In addition to **Nik Stauskas'** career-high-tying 24 points, **Meyers Leonard** matched his career high with four assists and **Zach Collins** blocked a career-best six shots. Leonard has dished four assists on eight other occasions (last 1/13/17 vs. Cho.) while Collins' previous career high for blocks was three (12/9/17 vs. Hou.).

**NEW FACES:** The Trail Blazers added four new faces to their roster for the 2018-19 season, including two draft picks and two free agent signings. Portland selected guard **Anfernee Simons** out of IMG Academy with the 24th overall pick of the 2018 NBA Draft and traded for guard **Gary Trent Jr.**, the 37th overall selection out of Duke. The Trail Blazers signed guard **Seth Curry** on July 6 and guard **Nik Stauskas** on July 5.

**FIVE IN A ROW:** The Trail Blazers have made the playoffs in five consecutive seasons. The last time Portland went to the playoffs in five straight years was 1999-2003 (21-year streak starting in 1983). Portland is one of five NBA teams that has made the playoffs in each of the last five seasons.
