LAST GAME: Had five points (2-5 FG, 1-2 3-PT), three rebounds, one steal and one block in 20 minutes ... **2016-17 SEASON:** Averaged a career-best 10.0 points (50.2% FG, 35.1% 3-PT, 62.1% FT) and 4.4 rebounds to go with 1.2 assists, 1.09 steals and 28.9 minutes in 77 games (69 starts).

LAST GAME: Recorded 16 points (7-13 FG, 2-4 3-PT), 16 rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block in 35 minutes ... **2016-17 SEASON:** Posted averages of 8.7 points (39.2% FG, 32.9% 3-PT, 70.6% FT), 7.4 rebounds, 1.6 assists, 1.00 steals and 29.1 minutes in 61 games (25 starts).

LAST GAME: Tallied 18 points (7-17 FG, 4-4 FT), seven rebounds, seven assists, one steal and one block in 33 minutes ... **2016-17 SEASON:** Averaged a career-high 27.0 points (44.4% FG, 37.0% 3-PT, 89.5% FT) and 4.9 rebounds to go with 6.9 assists, 0.91 steals and 35.9 minutes in 75 games (all starts).

All 88 Portland Trail Blazers regular season and preseason games will be broadcast on the Trail Blazers Broadcasting flagship station, Rip City Radio 620 AM. **Brian Wheeler**, currently taking a personal leave of absence, will return for his 20th season at the helm to provide play-by-play for all home and away games, with **Michael Holton** adding commentary for home broadcasts. Long-time Portland radio and television broadcaster **Scott Lynn** will handle radio play-by-play duties in Wheeler's absence. On television, NBC Sports Northwest will air a total of 76 Trail Blazers regular season games featuring analyst **Lamar Hurd** and **Kevin Calabro** calling the play-by-play. Between NBC Sports Northwest, TNT and ESPN, all 82 regular-season games will be televised for the 11th consecutive year and the 11th time in franchise history.

SERIES NOTES

- Today's game marks the first of two regular season matchups between the Trail Blazers and Bucks in the 2017-18 season.
- **LAST SEASON:** Milwaukee swept the season series with Portland in 2016-17.
- The Trail Blazers are 4-4 against the Bucks over the last four seasons. Portland's last victory in Milwaukee was a 91-82 win on Nov. 20, 2013.
- **BACK-TO-BACK:** Both teams are playing in the second night of a back-to-back. Portland was 8-7 in the second game of back-to-backs last season, and 5-6 in such contests on the road.
- **Damian Lillard** averaged a team-high 30.5 points to go along with 6.0 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 2.0 steals in two games against Milwaukee in 2016-17. Lillard has scored 20 or more points in six of his ten career matchups with the Bucks.
- In two games against the Bucks in 2016-17, **CJ McCollum** averaged 22.0 points (56.3% FG, 45.5% 3-PT), 2.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists.
- **CJ McCollum** has scored 20 or more points in three consecutive games against the Bucks. McCollum is shooting 56.0% from the field and 47.1% from the 3-PT line in those contests.
- **Maurice Harkless** recorded 11 points, four rebounds, four assists and four steals at Milwaukee on Dec. 7, 2016. It is the only game in Harkless' career with four rebounds, four assists and four steals.
- The last time Portland visited Milwaukee, Giannis Antetokounmpo recorded a triple-double of 15 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists to go along with four blocks and two steals. Antetokounmpo has scored in double figures in six of his seven career games against Portland.
- **CONNECTION:** Trail Blazers coach **Terry Stotts** spent two seasons as head coach of the Milwaukee Bucks from 2005-07, compiling a record of 63-83 (.432).
- **CONNECTION:** Milwaukee head coach Jason Kidd played for the 2011 NBA Champion Dallas Mavericks while Portland head coach **Terry Stotts** served as an assistant coach.

SERIES NOTES

- Tuesday's game marks the first of four regular season matchups between the Trail Blazers and Pelicans in the 2017-18 season.
- **LAST SEASON:** New Orleans won the season series with Portland, 3-1, in 2016-17.
- The Trail Blazers are 10-5 against the Pelicans over the last four seasons. Portland is 7-1 at home against New Orleans in that span.
- New Orleans last served as Portland's opponent for the home-opener on October 28, 2015. The Trail Blazers won that contest, 112-94.
- **Damian Lillard** averaged 27.7 points (41.0% FG, 44.0% 3-PT), 3.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists in three games against the Pelicans in 2016-17.
- **CJ McCollum** averaged 18.7 points, 2.7 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 1.0 steals in three games against New Orleans last season.
- Anthony Davis led the Pelicans with 28.0 points, 12.0 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 4.00 blocks in three matchups with Portland in 2016-17. Davis has scored 25 or more points in five of his last seven games against the Trail Blazers.

NEWS AND NOTES

LEADING THE WAY: Now in his sixth season with the Trail Blazers, Terry Stotts was hired as the franchise's 14th head coach on August 7, 2012. Stotts led the Trail Blazers to a 41-41 record in 2016-17 and has compiled a 225-187 record in five-plus seasons with Portland. Stotts is the fourth-winningest coach in franchise history, and the first Trail Blazers head coach since Mike Dunleavy (1998-2001) to reach the playoffs in four consecutive seasons (fourth overall in franchise history). Stotts was named the Western Conference Coach of the Month in March 2017 after guiding Portland to an NBA-best 13-3 record for the month. With Stotts at the helm, the Trail Blazers have ranked in the top-10 in scoring for each of the past four seasons ('13-14 to '16-17).

EARLY RETURNS: Through two games, the Trail Blazers rank at or near the top of the NBA in a number of statistical categories. Portland is third in the league in scoring (119.0 ppg), first in 3-PT% (53.5%), second in rebounding (54.0 rpg) and is allowing the second-fewest points against (86.0 ppg).

ROAD TRIPPING: The Trail Blazers have won their first two road games for the seventh time in franchise history and the first time since the 2010-11 season. A win over Milwaukee would mark the third time that Portland has won its first three road games (first since 1997-98). It is just the third time in franchise history that the Trail Blazers have opened the season with three away games (1982-83, 2007-08). Portland went 0-3 on both previous occasions.

MAKING HISTORY: With a 124-76 victory over the Phoenix Suns on Oct. 18, the Trail Blazers set the NBA record for the largest margin of victory in a season-opening game, besting Denver's 46-point margin over the LA Clippers on Nov. 6, 1987. The 48-point win is tied for the second-largest margin of victory in franchise history (50, vs. Cleveland 11/21/82).

MOVING ON UP: With a putback lay-in with 5:49 remaining in the first quarter against Phoenix on Oct. 18, **Damian Lillard** passed Sidney Wicks to move into 10th place on Portland's all-time scoring list. Lillard needs 195 points to move past Rasheed Wallace into ninth place.

DAME SCORING 30: **Damian Lillard** has scored 30 or more points 75 times in his career, tied with Geoff Petrie for the second-most in franchise history (130, Drexler). Lillard had 27 games of 30 or more points during the 2016-17 season, the sixth most in the league.

PATTY JUMP SHOT: **Pat Connaughton** scored 12 points on perfect 5-of-5 shooting in the first quarter against Phoenix on Oct. 18 before finishing with a career high 24 points (9-14 FG, 4-7 3-PT). Connaughton's previous career high was 19 (4/12/17 vs. New Orleans).

ROOKIE WATCH: **Caleb Swanigan** was second among all rookies in rebounding during the preseason with 6.8 rebounds per game. **Zach Collins** tied for 12th in scoring among rookies with 9.5 points per game.

FAMILIAR FACES: The Trail Blazers are returning 12 players out of their current 14-man roster. Portland's 12 returning players logged 16,081 minutes during the 2016-17 season, accounting for 81% of the 19,930 available minutes. That is the eighth-highest percentage of returning minutes in the NBA.

PRESEASON PRECISION: Portland ranked first in the NBA for 3-PT field goal percentage during the preseason (72-163, 44.2%). In addition, the Trail Blazers finished the preseason ranked third in free throw percentage (139-176, 79.0%).

MORE RANKINGS: The Trail Blazers had the highest scoring average in the NBA during the preseason (115.2), and scored more than 110 points in four of their six contests. Portland also averaged the fourth-most rebounds per game (47.8).

MIDSEASON FORM: **Damian Lillard's** 35-point performance against the Clippers on Oct. 8 was the second-highest scoring preseason game of his career (39, 10/22/15 at LA Clippers). Lillard finished the preseason with a scoring average of 19.2 points per game, the seventh-highest in the league.

MY OH MY: **Meyers Leonard** made 5-of-6 three-pointers against Phoenix on Oct. 11 and finished the game with 17 points and eight rebounds. Leonard's regular season career-high for three-pointers is five (twice, last 12/31/15 at Utah).

TWO-BY-FOUR: **CJ McCollum** made four 3-pointers in Portland's two games from Oct. 5 to Oct. 8 and shot 11-of-26 (42.3%) from beyond the arc during the preseason. Last season, McCollum made four or more 3-pointers in at least two consecutive games on five occasions.

FIRST ROUND PICKS: Portland adds rookies **Zach Collins** (10th overall pick) and **Caleb Swanigan** (26th overall pick) to a 14-man roster that now includes 12 former first round picks. Collins joins **Evan Turner** (2nd, 2010), **Damian Lillard** (6th, 2012), **Al-Farouq Aminu** (8th, 2010), **Noah Vonleh** (9th, 2014) and **CJ McCollum** (10th, 2013) as current Trail Blazers who were drafted in the Top-10 of their respective drafts.

EXTRA TIME: The Trail Blazers played nine overtime games in 2016-17, finishing with a record of 4-5 in those contests. It was the most overtime games played by Portland since the 2006-07 season (10 games).

CONNECT FOUR: The Trail Blazers were the eighth seed in the Western Conference in the 2017 Playoffs, marking the fourth consecutive season that the team reached the postseason. It is the longest playoff streak for Portland since the franchise made the postseason 21 straight times from 1982-2003.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Portland won 11 of its final 14 games at the Moda Center in 2016-17, finishing the season with a home record of 25-16. The Trail Blazers won eight straight home games from March 23 to April 10, marking their longest home winning streak since the team won eight straight from March 8 - April 6, 2016. Portland has had a winning record at home for 10 consecutive seasons.

DIVISION DOMINANCE: In 2016-17, Portland finished its divisional schedule with a record of 11-5 for the third season in a row. The Trail Blazers' mark was the best in the Northwest Division. Portland was a perfect 8-0 at home against Northwest Division Opponents for the first time since the 2008-09 season.

LIGHTS OUT: **CJ McCollum** averaged 23.0 points during the 2016-17 season with shooting splits of 48.0% FG, 42.1% 3-PT and 91.2% FT. Steph Curry (2014-15) and Dirk Nowitzki (2009-10) are the only other players in NBA history to produce those numbers over the course of a season.

NEWS AND NOTES

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY: On Jan. 29, 2017, **Damian Lillard** became the 10th player in NBA history to record at least 8,000 points and 2,000 assists in his first five NBA seasons (James/Jordan/Thomas/Bird/Theus/Archibald/Maravich/Bing/Robertson). He joined Michael Jordan and LeBron James as the three most recent players to accomplish the feat.

DYNAMIC DUO: **Damian Lillard** (27.0 ppg) and **CJ McCollum** (23.0 ppg) combined to average 50.0 points per game in 2016-17, the most points averaged by a pair of Trail Blazers teammates in franchise history (G. Petrie/S. Wicks - 48.7, 1972-73). Lillard and McCollum are the first Trail Blazers backcourt in the history of the franchise to both average more than 20.0 points per contest in a single season and have now done so twice (2015-16).

THE LETTER O: With 2,024 points and 440 assists in 2016-17, **Damian Lillard** joined LeBron James and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history with 1,500+ points and 400+ assists in each of his first five seasons.

MIDSEASON TURNAROUND: After being as many as 11 games below .500 (24-35 on Feb. 28), the Trail Blazers turned things around in March of the 2016-17 season and finished 17-6 to arrive at a final record of 41-41.

THREE-POINT THREATS: Portland was the sixth-best 3-point shooting team in the league in 2016-17, hitting from deep at a 37.5% rate. Portland made 112 threes in its first 10 games, the most through the first 10 games of a season in franchise history (108, 2014-15). The Trail Blazers made 852 three-pointers on the year, the second most in franchise history, and eighth most in the league.

SCORING MACHINE: **Damian Lillard** finished the 2016-17 season with an average of 27.0 points per game, good for the sixth-highest mark in the NBA and the second-highest in team history (Clyde Drexler - 27.2, 1988-89). Lillard (2) joins Drexler (3) as the only two Trail Blazers to average more than 25.0 points in multiple seasons.

THE 2,000 CLUB: **Damian Lillard** (2,024 pts) had the fifth most points by a Trail Blazer in franchise history and became the fifth player in Trail Blazers history to score 2,000+ points in a season (first since Clyde Drexler - 2,123, 1988-89). Lillard (8,880 career points) is 11th on the Trail Blazers all-time scoring list and is just three points away from passing Sidney Wicks (8,882) to move into tenth.

DAME FROM DOWNTOWN: With his seventh 3-pointer against the Heat on Mar. 19, **Damian Lillard** became the first player in Trail Blazers history to make 1,000 3-pointers. Lillard (1,042) is the second NBA player to make 1,000 3-pointers in his first five seasons, joining Klay Thompson (1,060).

MR. 200: Portland's 102-86 victory over Cleveland on Jan. 11, 2017 marked the 200th win for **Terry Stotts** as Portland's head coach. Stotts is just the fourth coach to win 200 or more games in franchise history (Ramsay, Adelman, McMillan).

HARK BEYOND THE ARC: **Maurice Harkless** made multiple 3-pointers in 19 games during the 2016-17 season (77 games played), after doing so six times in 82 games in 2015-16. Harkless made multiple threes in a career-high five straight games earlier this season (Nov. 6-13).

NURKIC FEVER: **Jusuf Nurkic** scored a career high 33 points (12-15 FG) to go along with 16 rebounds in a victory against the Nuggets on Mar. 28. Nurkic became the first player in franchise history to register 30+ points and 15+ rebounds on 80% shooting or better. In 20 games with the Trail Blazers (19 starts), Nurkic averaged 15.2 points, 10.4 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.9 blocks.

DAME DROPPING 40: **Damian Lillard** had five games of 40 or more points in 2016-17, the most he has had in his career (4, 2015-16) and tied for fifth most in the NBA. Lillard made four or more 3-pointers while shooting 50.0% or better from deep in all five of those games.

CJ SCORING 30: **CJ McCollum** scored a team-high 39 points (15-of-24 FG, 3-5 3-PT) vs. Denver on March 28, the second highest scoring output of his career (43, 1/1/17 at Min.). McCollum had 15 games in 2016-17 with at least 30 points, tying him for 14th in the NBA. McCollum tallied eight such games in 80 contests in 2015-16 season.

TRAIL BLAZER 2,000: In beating New Orleans, 119-104, on Nov. 25, 2016, the Trail Blazers notched their 2,000th victory in franchise history, becoming the 15th team in NBA history to do so.

2017 NBA Playoffs Recap

LILLARD'S PLAYOFF SCORING: With 34 points in Game 4, **Damian Lillard** passed LaMarcus Aldridge to move into eighth place on the Trail Blazers playoff career scoring list. Lillard averaged 27.8 points for the 2017 postseason, the third best scoring average in a single postseason in Trail Blazers history. Lillard has scored in double figures in all 31 of his career postseason games.

3J MCCOLLUM: **CJ McCollum** shot 11-of-22 (50.0%) from the 3-point line in the playoffs, third best among players who had made at least 11 3-pointers as of April 25. McCollum averaged 22.5 points for the 2017 playoffs, the best postseason average of his career.

MO(DA)-MENTUM: The Trail Blazers are 80-40 (.667) all-time at home in the Playoffs (40-25 at home in the First Round). Portland was 4-1 at home during the 2016 Playoffs, and 1-1 at the Moda Center in 2015. Last season marked the team's most home wins in one playoff run since 2000 (6-2 at home).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **CJ McCollum** (41 points) and **Damian Lillard** (34) combined to score 75 points in Game One at Golden State, two shy of tying the team playoff record for points in a game by teammates (77 - Aldridge/Lillard-4/20/14; Drexler/Porter-5/19/92).

SCINTILLATING CJ: **CJ McCollum** scored 27 points in the first half of Game 1, matching the franchise postseason record for points in a half. McCollum finished with 41 points (16-28 FG, 4-6 3-PT) to set a new playoff career high and become the eighth Trail Blazers player to score 40 or more points in a playoff game.
