Oct. 12, 2018 vs. Minnesota
W, 143-121 – Milwaukee erupted for 143 points in its preseason finale on Friday as it knocked off the Timberwolves at Fiserv Forum, 143-121. Leading by as many as 41 points at one point in the contest, the Bucks made 25 3-pointers on the night, going 25-48 (.521) from beyond the arc. Khris Middleton led the way, knocking down a team-high five of his eight threes and was one of nine Bucks to make multiple 3-pointers. Overall, Milwaukee shot 52.7 percent (49-93) as a team and held the Timberwolves to just 39.6 percent shooting (38-96). Despite playing under 26 minutes, Giannis Antetokounmpo tallied a triple-double, scoring a game-high 32 points with 12 rebounds and 10 assists. Middleton finished the night with 22 points while Christian Wood scored 19 points on 7-for-9 shooting with seven rebounds off the bench. Taj Gibson led the Timberwolves, scoring 21 points with seven rebounds.

Oct. 9, 2018 at Oklahoma City
L, 115-119 – The Bucks and Thunder needed five extra minutes to decide this one, but the Bucks dropped their first preseason contest, 119-115, to the Thunder on 10/9 in Oklahoma City. The game got to overtime thanks to a Tim Frazier game-tying 3-pointer with just 1.9 seconds remaining in the game after Milwaukee trailed by double-digits earlier in the fourth quarter. In the overtime period, the Bucks had an early three-point lead before the Thunder tied it at 112. From there, the teams exchanged threes before the Thunder's Deonte Burton made another three to put Oklahoma City up 118-115 with 21.5 seconds remaining. The Bucks couldn't score on their next possession and the Thunder held on to pick up a four-point overtime win. Christian Wood led the Bucks with 19 points and a game-high 15 rebounds and was one of seven players in double-figures for Milwaukee. Paul George paced the Thunder, scoring a game-high 26 points.

BUCK SHOTS

- Milwaukee is opening up its season on the road for the second consecutive season and enters tonight's lid lifter with a 26-24 overall record in openers and a 21-18 mark on the road. The Bucks season-opening win on the road last year at Boston snapped a three-game road-opener losing streak. A win over the Hornets tonight would give the Bucks their first season-opener winning streak since they won the first games of the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons.
- The Bucks finished the 2018 preseason with a 3-1 record, marking the first time since 2002 that the Bucks have finished the preseason with a record over .500. This was Milwaukee's best preseason since going 6-2 in 2000.
- The Bucks capped off their preseason with a 143-121 win over the Timberwolves at Fiserv Forum on 10/12. Milwaukee made 25 of its 48 3-point attempts (52.1%) and shot 52.7 percent as a team overall (49-93) while holding the Timberwolves to just 39.6 percent shooting as a team on the night.
- Despite playing just under 26 minutes, Giannis Antetokounmpo logged a triple-double in the preseason finale against Minnesota, scoring 32 points (13-17 FG, 2-5 3FG) with 12 rebounds and 10 assists. Antetokounmpo averaged a double-double in the preseason with 24.0 points and 11.7 rebounds per game while shooting 66.7 percent from the field.
- Milwaukee averaged 16.5 3-pointers made during the preseason which ranked second in the NBA. In regular season Bucks history, the Bucks have made 16 or more threes in a game only eight times.

- Milwaukee and Charlotte split their 2017-18 season series, with each team winning twice on its home floor. Dating back to the 2016-17 season, the Bucks have won four of their last six matchups against the Hornets.
- Against the Hornets on 11/1 last season, Khris Middleton scored a career-high 43 points, knocking down 15 of his 28 attempts from the field. The Bucks also made a franchise record 19 3-pointers on a franchise-high-tying 36 3-point attempts.
- Hornets forward-center Frank Kaminsky played at the University of Wisconsin where he led the Badgers to consecutive Final Four appearances and was the consensus National Player of the Year as a senior in 2015.

Last game vs. Charlotte – Dec. 23, 2017 – Spectrum Center

L, 106-111 – Despite committing only nine turnovers, and getting 31 points from Khris Middleton, the Bucks fell to the Hornets in Charlotte, 111-106, on Dec. 23, 2017. After it was a one-point game at halftime, 54-53, in favor of the Bucks, Milwaukee started the third quarter on a 21-4 run to go up 18 at 75-57. But Charlotte quickly made a comeback to pull within four points, 85-81, heading into the fourth quarter. In the final quarter of play, the Hornets tied the game for the first time since the 31-second mark of the second quarter on a three-point play from Dwight Howard. From there, the Bucks couldn't regain the lead as the Hornets went a perfect 6-for-6 from the free-throw line in final minute of play to seal the win. Eric Bledsoe and John Henson each scored 16 points for the Bucks in addition to Middleton's 31 points. Howard led the Hornets with a team-high 21 points and 16 rebounds.

- The Pacers defeated the Bucks, 3-1, in the 2017-18 season series between the two teams. After Milwaukee won the first game of the season series on 1/3/18 in Milwaukee, 122-101, Indiana won the remaining three games of the series.
- Giannis Antetokounmpo led the Bucks against the Pacers last season as he averaged 22.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, 3.3 assists and 2.8 blocks over four games.
- Khris Middleton tallied one of nine 30-point games of the 2017-18 season against Indiana. On 3/2/18, Middleton scored 30 points against the Pacers going 11-for-21 from the field.

Last game vs. Indiana – March 5, 2018 – Bankers Life Fieldhouse

L, 89-92 – Milwaukee fell to Indiana on March 5 at Banker's Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis, 92-89. In the second quarter the Bucks shot 57.9 percent while the Pacers shot 42.9 percent and Milwaukee took a two-point lead heading into halftime, 46-44. The third quarter saw a 15-point lead for the Pacers before the Bucks went on a 17-3 run to cut the lead to four, 69-73, with one quarter left to play. Milwaukee cut the lead to one with 1:05 left to play in the fourth quarter, but Indiana responded with a couple of free throws from Bojan Bogdanovic that put it up by three with 5.1 seconds left. The Bucks had one last chance to tie the game, but Giannis Antetokounmpo's 3-pointer at the buzzer missed and the Pacers prevailed, 92-89. Eric Bledsoe led the way for Milwaukee with 26 points and four assists, while Antetokounmpo added a double-double with 18 points, 12 rebounds and five blocks. Bogdanovic had 29 points to lead Indiana.

NEWS & NOTES

BUD TAKES OVER – Bucks head coach Mike Budenholzer begins his first season with the Bucks after being hired as the team's new head coach on May 17. Budenholzer spent the previous five seasons with the Atlanta Hawks where he led the Hawks to a 213-197 (.520) record and playoff appearances in four of his five seasons. He was also named the 2014-15 NBA Coach of the Year after leading Atlanta to a franchise-high 60 wins and the franchise's only trip to the Eastern Conference Finals.

PRESEASON LEADERS – The new-look Bucks offense under Budenholzer made a big impact in the 2018 preseason as the Bucks led the NBA in scoring during the preseason. Milwaukee scored at least 115 points in each of its four preseason contests, including 143 points in the preseason finale against the Timberwolves on 10/12 at Fiserv Forum. The Bucks also ranked in the top-five of a few other major offensive categories. See the tables below to check out how the Bucks offense stacked up with the rest of the NBA in the preseason:

2,000-POINT CLUB – Last season, Giannis Antetokounmpo became just the second player in franchise history (K. Abdul-Jabbar, M. Redd) to score 2,000 points in a season, after he tallied 2,014 points and averaged 26.9 points per game in 2017-18. Should Antetokounmpo score 2,000 points again this season, he'd join Abdul-Jabbar as the only players in franchise history to have multiple seasons of 2,000 points. IN RARE AIR – Antetokounmpo also averaged a career-high 10.0 rebounds and 4.8 assists in addition to his 26.9 points per game last season, while shooting 52.9 percent from the field. He joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (6 times) and Vin Baker (1 time) as the only players in Bucks history to average more than 20.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per game for a season. Antetokounmpo also became just the fourth player since 1976 to average at least 26.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game while shooting 50.0 percent or better. See the chart below for each of the other three occurrences and how Antetokounmpo compares:

MILWAUKEE'S EKG – The Bucks trio Giannis Antetokounmpo, Eric Bledsoe and Khris Middleton was one of the top scoring trios across the NBA last season. Combined, Antetokounmpo (26.9), Bledsoe (17.7) and Middleton (20.1), averaged 64.7 points per game, which made them the highest-scoring trio in the Eastern Conference and the fourth-highest overall.

KHASH IT IN – Bucks forward Khris Middleton had his best season of his career in 2017-18 as he averaged career highs in points (20.1) and rebounds (5.2) per game while shooting 46.6 percent from the field (2nd-highest of his career). He was also third on the Bucks, averaging 4.0 assists per game. Over the course of the season, Middleton had nine 30-point games and tallied his first two 40-point games of his career. By averaging at least 20.0 points, 5.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists per game, Middleton put himself in a rare category in the Eastern Conference.
