CAVS QUICK FACTS

- Cleveland concluded the regular season with a 48-34 record, finishing as the 4th seed in the Eastern Conference. It is the second straight season that Cleveland has made the playoffs (51-31, 4th seed in 2023 NBA playoffs). The Cavs finished the season with 22 road wins, marking their most wins on the road in a season since the 2015-16 season (24-17 on the road). The Cavaliers also held their opponents under 100 points 14 times (14-0) and held their opponents to 110.2 PPG, ranking 7th in the NBA for opponent points per game. Cleveland made 1,108 three-pointers during the 2023-24 campaign, its most triples made in a single season in franchise history (team record 13.5 3PM per game). Cleveland also averaged 112.6 PPG, marking their 2nd-highest scoring average in a season in team history (114.1 PPG in 1979-80).
- From January 3rd to February 10th, the Cavs posted an NBA-best 17-1 record. That was tied for their most wins over any 18-game span in franchise history. Cleveland also posted a 9-game winning streak from Jan. 26-Feb. 10 and an 8-game winning streak from Jan. 3-22 over that 18-game span. The Cavs also had 6 players average 12.0+ PPG this season (min. 41 games played). It was just the 2nd time in team history with 6 players averaging 12.0+ PPG (1971-72).
- DONOVAN MITCHELL was named an All-Star for the 5th time this season, averaging 26.6 PPG, a career-high 6.1 APG, a career-high 5.1 RPG and a career-high 1.84 SPG in 35.3 MPG. He is just the 9th player in Cavaliers history to have multiple NBA All-Star selections. He also posted a career-high 6 double-doubles on the season (Cavs were 6-0 in those games). Mitchell became the 2nd player in Cavs history to have multiple seasons averaging 26.0+ PPG (LeBron James, 8 times) and was 1 of 2 players in the NBA this season averaging 25.0+ PPG, 5.0+ APG, 5.0+ RPG and 1.5+ SPG (Shai Gilgeous-Alexander). In Cleveland's trip to Paris, France this season to play the Brooklyn Nets, Mitchell finished the game with a NBA Paris Game record 45 PTS, 12 REB, 6 AST and 4 STL, becoming the 5th player in NBA history to reach those totals in a game (Michael Jordan, Bob McAdoo, Larry Bird and David Robinson).
- JARRETT ALLEN finished the season averaging a career-high 16.5 PPG on .634 FG% (4th-best in the NBA), 10.5 RPG (11th in the NBA), a career-high 2.7 APG and 1.05 BPG in 31.7 MPG. He appeared in 77 games this season, his most games played since the 2018-19 season (80 games). Allen recorded a career-high 42 double-doubles this season, including a franchise record 16-straight from Dec. 23-Jan. 31. His 42 DBL-DBL are the most in a season by a Cavalier since LeBron James in 2017-18 (52 DBL-DBL). It was Allen's 3rd-straight season with 30+ DBL-DBLs, becoming the 3rd Cavalier in team history to do that (Kevin Love, Brad Daugherty). He was 1 of 2 players in the Eastern Conference this season averaging 16.0+ PPG, 10.0+ RPG, 2.5+ APG and 1.0+ BPG (Giannis Antetokounmpo). Allen's career high scoring game was also accomplished this season, recording 33 PTS and 18 REB in a win on March 8 vs. MIN.
- EVAN MOBLEY averaged a near double-double this season with 15.7 PPG on .580 FG% (11th in the NBA), a career-high 9.4 RPG, 3.2 APG and 1.44 BPG in 30.6 MPG. Mobley recorded 22 double-doubles on the season and shot 22-59 (.379) from the three-point line, marking his best 3FG% of his career. He recorded his first 30-10 game this season, finishing with 33 PTS, 14 REB and 3 BLK on Oct. 28 vs. IND.
- CARIS LEVERT finished the season as the only reserve in the NBA to average at least 13.0 PPG, 4.0 APG, 3.0 RPG and 1.0+ SPG. He recorded 14 games this season off the bench with 10+ PTS, 5+ REB and 5+ AST which lead all NBA reserves. He finished the season among NBA bench leaders in points (13.6 PPG, 3rd), assists (4.8 APG, 3rd) and steals (1.09 SPG, 2nd). He scored in double figures 50 times this season and 20+ PTS 15 times.
- OTHER NOTABLE CAVS FEATS: GEORGES NIANG played in all 82 games this season, the first Cavalier to do so since Collin Sexton in 2018-19. Niang averaged career-highs in PTS (9.4) and RPG (3.4) in 22.3 MPG this season. SAM MERRILL finished the season with the 4th-most three-pointers made off the bench in Cavs history (141 3FGM). MAX STRUS averaged career-highs this season in PTS (12.2), RPG (4.8) APG, (4.0), SPG (0.91), BPG (0.41) and MPG (32.0).

CAVS NOTES: Cleveland shot 16-33 (.485) from the three-point line. The Cavs made a franchise record 1,108 triples this season...**GEORGES NIANG** recorded a team high 16 points on 6-9 (.667) shooting from the field, including 4-7 (.571) from the three-point line in 23 minutes off the bench. With the appearance against Charlotte, Niang appeared in his 82nd game for the Cavaliers this season. He is the first Cavalier to appear in all 82 games since Collin Sexton during the 2018-19 season...**JARRETT ALLEN** finished with 14 points on 7-7 (1.000) shooting from the field, seven rebounds, two assists and two steals in 23 minutes. Allen shot 20-21 FG (.952) over the final 2 games, the best field goal percentage in a two-game span in Cavaliers history (min. 20 attempts). The last NBA player to go 20-21 (.952) or better from the field in two games was Nikola Jokic, who also went 20-21 FG from Dec. 28-29, 2023...**MAX STRUS** tallied his first career triple-double with 14 points, including 4-6 (.667) shooting from the three-point line, 11 assists and 10 rebounds in 31 minutes. He is the first Cavs player to post a triple-double since Darius Garland (11 PTS, 10 REB, 14 AST) on Jan. 12, 2022 at Utah. It was his 6th game this season with 10+ rebounds and his first game with 10+ assists...**EVAN MOBLEY** recorded 14 points, six rebounds and five assists in 25 minutes...**ISAIAH MOBLEY** contributed a season high 11 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting from the field, three rebounds and one steal in 16 minutes off the bench. It was his second career game with 10+ points (18 PTS on April 6th at ORL)...**PETE NANCE** recorded his first career NBA basket in the game (3-pointer in the 4th quarter)...**TRISTAN THOMPSON** recorded his 6,000th career point as a member of the Cavaliers with his 6th point of the game, becoming the 13th Cavaliers player in team history to record 6,000 points.

CAVS NOTES: With the 129-120 win, the Cavaliers clinched a spot in the 2024 NBA playoffs. It marked the second consecutive season making it to the postseason and 24th time in franchise history...Cleveland scored 70 points on 30-50 (.600) shooting from the field in the first half. It was the 2nd time this season shooting .600+ FG% in the opening half and the 8th time this season with 70+ PTS in the 1st half...**DONOVAN MITCHELL** recorded 33 points, including 4-10 (.400) from the three-point line, five assists, four rebounds and a season-high tying four steals in 38 minutes. Mitchell scored 30+ PTS for the 21st time this season. It was his first 30-point game since scoring 31 points on Feb. 27th vs. DAL. With his second rebound of the game, Mitchell secured his 2,000th career rebound in the NBA...**JARRETT ALLEN** finished with his 42nd double-double of the season with 29 points on 13-14 (.929) shooting from the field, a game-high 13 rebounds and three assists in 38 minutes. Allen's 13-14 (.929) shooting from the field tied the single-game record for highest FG% on 13 attempts or more (Georges Niang, 13-14 on 1/17/24 vs. MIL, Brad Daugherty, 13-14 on 2/21/92 vs. SAC and Elmore Smith, 13-14 on 3/13/77 at ATL)...**DARIUS GARLAND** tallied 16 points on 6-11 (.545) shooting from the field, including 4-5 (.800) shooting from the three-point line, four assists and two rebounds in 29 minutes...**CARIS LEVERT** contributed 16 points on 6-12 (.500) shooting from the field, six rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block in 27 minutes off the bench. It was LeVert's 14th game with at least 10 PTS, 5 REB and 5 AST off the bench this season which is the most among all NBA reserves...**EVAN MOBLEY** recorded 12 points on 6-7 (.857) shooting from the field, five rebounds, two assists and one block in 29 minutes.

CAVS NOTES: Cleveland held Memphis to 98 points on 33-84 (.393) shooting from the field. The Cavs now have a perfect 14-0 when holding teams to under 100 points this season. Cleveland outscored Memphis 30-16 in the 3rd quarter to help secure a lead and eventually the win...With their 4th triple tonight, the Cavs set a franchise record for 3FGM in a single season (1,068). Their previous single season mark was 1,067 3FGM in 2016-17...Cleveland recorded 11 steals and 10 blocks in the win, marking the first time with 10+ BLK and 10+ STL in a game since Dec. 29, 2020 vs. NYK (13 STL, 10 BLK)...**DONOVAN MITCHELL** recorded 29 points on 9-17 (.529) shooting from the field, including 5-10 (.500) from the three-point line, eight assists, four rebounds, a game-high tying three steals and one block in 34 minutes. Tonight was Mitchell's 43rd game with 20+ points this season...**CARIS LEVERT** contributed 18 points, two rebounds, two assists and two steals in 28 minutes off the bench. LeVert is shooting 12-25 (.480) from the three-point line over his last six games...**JARRETT ALLEN** finished with his 41st double-double of the season with 16 points on 7-13 (.538) shooting from the field, 10 rebounds and five assists in 34 minutes...**DARIUS GARLAND** tallied 14 points, a game-high nine assists, a season-high tying six rebounds and one block in 31 minutes...**EVAN MOBLEY** recorded his 22nd double-double of the season with 12 points, a game-high 12 rebounds, a game-high four blocks and a game-high tying three steals in 31 minutes. Mobley's three steals were his second-highest amount of steals this season. It was just his second career game with 10+ PTS, 10+ REB, 4+ BLK and 3+ STL.

CAVS NOTES: The Cavs scored 80 points in the first half, marking the most points scored in a half this season...**DARIUS GARLAND** finished with a team-high 28 PTS, including 4-8 (.500) shooting from the three-point line, eight assists, five rebounds and a career-high tying five steals in 40 minutes of play. It was his 2nd-straight game with five steals...**EVAN MOBLEY** tallied 20 points, six rebounds and four assists in 31 minutes. He scored 11 of his points in the first quarter, marking his highest scoring 1st quarter of the season...**MAX STRUS** finished with 20 points, including 4-9 (.444) shooting from the three-point line, a season-high nine assists, four rebounds and one steal in 39 minutes. His nine assists were the second most assists in a game for his career (10 AST on Jan. 18, 2023 at NOP)...**JARRETT ALLEN** recorded his 40th double-double of the season with 17 points, a team-high 10 rebounds, one steal and one block in 35 minutes...**ISAAC OKORO** contributed 11 points on a perfect 4-4 shooting from the field and three rebounds in 25 minutes.

It was the 3rd time in his career recording 5 STL in a game. It was also his 11th time this season scoring 25+ PTS. He is the 6th Cavalier in team history to have multiple games with 25+ PTS and 5+ STL before their 25th birthday (Garland recorded 41 PTS, 5 STL on Nov. 18, 2022 vs. Charlotte in 2 OT)...**CARIS LEVERT** recorded 21 PTS on 8-14 (.571) shooting from the field, 7 REB and 2 AST in 28 MIN off the bench...**JARRETT ALLEN** contributed his 39th double-double of the season with 12 PTS, a team-high 12 REB, 3 AST and 1 STL in 34 MIN...**DONOVAN MITCHELL** contributed 10 PTS, 7 AST, 5 REB, 3 STL and 2 BLK in 38 MIN...**GEORGES NIANG** chipped in 12 PTS on 5-6 (.833 FG%) shooting from the field in 24 MIN off the bench.

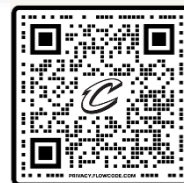

Cleveland also posted win streaks of 9 games (Jan. 26-Feb. 10) and 8 games (Jan. 3-22), and won 23 of their final 31 home games (includes Paris game).

6 PLAYERS AT 12.0+ PPG: For just the 2nd time in franchise history (minimum 41 GP), the Cavs had 6 players averaging 12.0+ PPG: Donovan Mitchell (26.6), Darius Garland (18.0), Jarrett Allen (16.5), Evan Mobley (15.7), Caris LeVert (14.0) and Max Strus (12.2). The only other time the Cavs have accomplished this feat was back in 1971-72.

17-1 STRETCH: From Jan. 3 to Feb. 10, the Cavs posted an NBA-best 17-1 record. That was tied for their most wins over any 18-game span in franchise history (done 7 other times, most recently Nov. 13-Dec. 17, 2017).

NEXT MAN UP: The Cavs utilized 21 different starting lineups this season. Darius Garland, Donovan Mitchell, Max Strus, Evan Mobley and Jarrett Allen have only started together 28 times this season. As a team, Cleveland has had 307 games missed due to injury/illness/assignment this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Cleveland finished with a 22-19 record (.550) on the road this season, TIED FOR THE 4TH-BEST ROAD RECORD IN THE EAST, and Cleveland's most wins on the road since 2015-16 (24).

BAY AREA VICTORY: At Golden State on Nov. 11, Cleveland recorded their first road win over the Warriors since Game 7 of the 2016 NBA Finals and first regular season road victory against them since March 14, 2014.

MAKE 'EM MISS: Cleveland, the NO. 7 DEFENSIVE RATING TEAM IN THE NBA (112.1), ranked the Top 10 in opponent PPG (7th, 110.2) and opponent FG% (6th, .463).

UNDER 100 POINTS: The Cavs are a perfect 14-0 when holding teams to under 100 points this season. Cleveland also held opponents to 4 straight games under 100 points from Jan. 15-22, the Cavs' longest since November 2021 (also 4 games).

D UP THE 3: In a win at New York on Nov. 1, Cleveland held the Knicks to .167 (5-30) 3FG%, tied for the franchise's lowest opponent 3FG% on 30+ attempts in a regular season game. A month later against Orlando on Dec. 6, the Cavs held the Magic to .087 (2-23) 3FG%, the franchise's lowest opponent 3FG% on 20+ attempts ever.

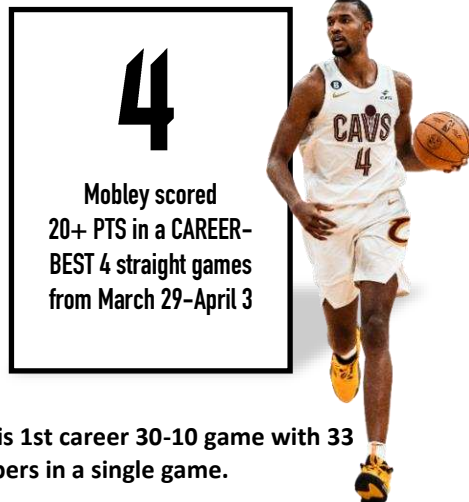

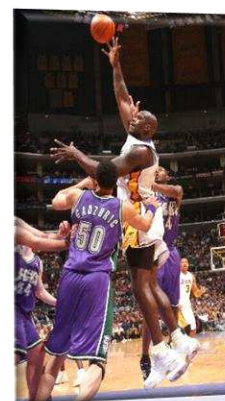

GIANT COMEBACK: In Cleveland's 105-104 win over Boston on March 5, the Cavs trailed 93-71 with under 9 minutes remaining in the game, outscoring the Celtics 34-11 in that span and snapping Boston's 11-game win streak. The Cavs had never overcome a 22-point deficit or higher in the 4th quarter since the NBA began tracking play-by-play. Their previous biggest 4th quarter comeback since 1997-98 had been 19 PTS done five times (most recently 2/24/20 vs. Miami).

WADE'S WORLD: DEAN WADE finished with a career-high 23 PTS (8-11 FG, 6-9 3FG), 8 REB and 2 STL in 21 MIN off the bench in the win over Boston on March 5. He scored 20 points in the 4th quarter, his most points scored in any quarter of his career.

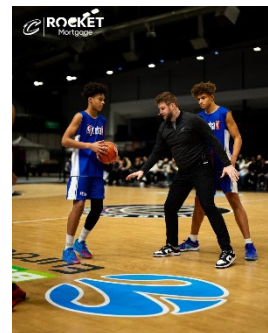
