- **ALL-TIME WINS:** Doc Rivers sits one victory behind Jack Ramsay (864) for No. 13 on the NBA's all-time coaching wins leaderboard.
- **FRANCHISE STARTS:** The Clippers' 17-10 record marks just the seventh time in franchise history that the team has won at least 17 of their first 27 games (2018-19, 2016-17, 2014-15, 2013-14, 2012-13, 2011-12, 1974-75).
- **BOUNCING AROUND:** Through December 17th, the Clippers will have played no two consecutive games in the same arena, a span of 17 games, dating back to the end of a three-game homestand on November 15th. L.A. has played 15 road games this season, tied for the second-most in the NBA. They're one of only seven teams with a road record above .500 this season.
- **HOT HAND:** Forward Tobias Harris logged his second 30+ point game of the season and the 13th of his career with his 33-point outing at Phoenix on Monday. Harris' teams are 12-1 throughout his career when he's reached the 30-point mark.
- **PLAYER OF THE MONTH:** L.A. Clippers forward Tobias Harris was named Western Conference Player of the Month for October and November, his first career Player of the Month honor. He was previously named Western Conference Player of the Week for Week 6. Harris helped lead the Clippers over the first two months of the season, behind averages of 21.7 points and 8.7 rebounds in addition to shooting splits of 52.8 percent from the field, 44.0 percent from three-point range and 82.6 percent from the free-throw line. He was the NBA's most efficient volume scorer in October and November, ranking first in effective field goal percentage (59.4 percent) among 38 players with at least 300 field goal attempts. Now in his eighth NBA season, Harris is averaging career-highs in points (21.4), rebounds (8.4), field goal percentage (50.7%) & minutes (35.2).
- **COACH OF THE MONTH:** Head coach Doc Rivers was named Western Conference Coach of the Month for October and November, his 11th career Coach of the Month honor. He last won the award in April 2017. Rivers led the Clippers to a Western Conference-best 15-6 record over the first two months of the season, tied for the NBA's second-best record in that span. L.A. went 6-0 in games decided by five points or less in October and November, and their bench led the NBA, averaging 53.8 points per game. Their 15-6 start was tied for the team's fourth-best through 21 games in franchise history.
- **HOME COOKING:** Prior to their 12/8 loss to Miami, the Clippers had won nine straight at STAPLES Center, the NBA's longest active home winning streak when it was snapped. The streak is tied for the fourth-longest in franchise history and is the second-longest since the team moved to Los Angeles in 1984-85 (13 straight from Nov. 28, 2012 - Jan. 9, 2013).
- **ROAD SWING:** On the team's recent four-game road trip, guard Avery Bradley averaged 12.0 points on 48.8% FG (20-of-41) & 47.1% 3PT (8-of-17). Bradley tallied a Clippers career-high 16 points and logged season-highs in assists (6) & 3PT-FG (4) in last Thursday's road win over the Kings.
- **SEASON-HIGH:** Center Boban Marjanovic logged a season-high (and Clippers career-high) 19 points in only 13:27 minutes on Wednesday in Memphis. Marjanovic (+8) was one of two Clippers with a positive plus/minus on the night (Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, +10).
- **SIXTH MEN:** Lou Williams and Montrezl Harrell rank second & seventh in the NBA in bench scoring, respectively, and are the only set of teammates averaging 15+ points off the bench this season.
- **FORCE DOWN LOW:** Forward Montrezl Harrell scored 14+ points in a career-best 13 straight games off the bench from 11/8 at Portland through 12/3 at New Orleans. He currently ranks third in the NBA, shooting 63.8% from the field this season. Harrell scored a career-high 30 points in the Clippers' Oct. 26 win over the Rockets.
- **FIRST HALF:** The Clippers scored 77 points in the first half of their 12/3 win over New Orleans, tied for the team's third-most in the second half since half and quarter stats were first consistently kept in 2002-03. The effort marked the second-largest scoring total of any team in the first half against the Pelicans in their franchise's history.
- **RARE AIR:** Forward Montrezl Harrell's scoring average (15.3 ppg) is the highest of any player averaging fewer than 10 field goal attempts per game since 1985-86.
- **EFFICIENCY MATTERS:** The Clippers are the only team that has ranked in the top-10 in offensive efficiency each of the past seven seasons, according to NBA.com. The Clippers rank seventh in the NBA, scoring 111.1 points/100 possessions this season.
- **CHARITY STRIPE:** The Clippers lead the NBA in free-three throws made (23.6) and attempted (29.3) per game this season. The Clippers set a team record (San Diego & L.A.) for the most free-throws made without a miss in a single game, shooting 26-of-26 from the charity stripe in the team's win over the Rockets on 10/21. Lou Williams (94.1%) and Danilo Gallinari (91.3%) rank second and seventh in the NBA in free-throw percentage this season, respectively.
- **IL GALLO:** Forward Danilo Gallinari matched his Clippers career-high scoring effort with 28 points in their 11/28 win over Phoenix. He logged a season-high 10 rebounds, marking his first double-double as a Clipper and the 19th of his career.

• **BALL SECURITY:** The Clippers set a franchise record, committing only four turnovers in their win over Portland on 11/25, their fewest ever in a regular season contest.

• **BENCH STREAK:** Lou Williams scored at least 10 points in 62 games straight games in which he's come off the bench dating, from December 3, 2017 through November 23, 2018, the longest streak of any reserve since 1983-84.

• **STRONG PERFORMANCE:** Rookie guard Shai Gilgeous-Alexander became the first Clippers rookie to log at least 16 points, 6 rebounds, 4 assists, and 3 blocks in a single game since Lamar Odom on April 19, 2000 in Saturday's win over Milwaukee. On Monday vs. Golden State, he became the first rookie in team history to log 18+ points, 5+ rebounds, 3+ assists, 2+ steals & 1+ block, while shooting over 70% from the field in a single game.

• **DEEP SQUAD:** The Clippers lead the NBA in bench scoring, averaging 52.4 points per game this season. L.A.'s reserves set a franchise record, scoring 85 points in the team's 133-113 win over Houston on 10/26 (prev. 80 - 11/19/97 at Miami), the most points by any team's reserves in a single game since 12/26/12 (Detroit).

• **EVERYBODY EATS:** The Clippers saw a franchise record nine players reach double-digit scoring in Sunday's win over Washington, tied for the most of any team in a game this season (Indiana on 10/20 vs. Brooklyn). All 13 players to enter the game for L.A. scored at least one point, helping the Clippers become one of just four teams this season to have 13 players score in a single game this season.

• **NBA DEBUT:** Guard Jerome Robinson made his NBA debut on October 26 at Houston, playing the game's final 4:47. He scored his first NBA points with a three-pointer at 3:24 in the 4th.

• **ON THE BOARD:** Clippers rookie guard Shai Gilgeous-Alexander made his NBA debut on Oct. 17 vs. Denver, scoring his first NBA points with a driving 2' layup at the 3:06 mark of the first quarter. He became the 20th player in franchise history to reach double-digit scoring in his NBA debut.

• **FORCE IN THE PAINT:** Clippers center Boban Marjanovic matched his then Clippers-career-high with 18 points in the team's loss to Denver on opening night. He previously set the mark on Feb. 27, 2018, when he scored 18 points and grabbed 6 rebounds in only 15 minutes of action, becoming the only player in the NBA last season with 18+ points and 6+ rebounds in 15 minutes or less.

• **CONTINUING TO BUILD:** The Clippers 372-213 (.636) have the fourth-best record in the NBA since the start of the 2011-12 season.

• **FRANCHISE STREAK:** L.A. finished the 2017-18 season 42-40, extending a franchise record with their seventh straight winning season.

• **CLUTCH KING:** Lou Williams led the NBA in fourth quarter points (597) and finished fifth in second-half points (1,016) last season.

• **COACHING WINS:** Doc Rivers passed Mike Dunleavy (215) for the most regular season coaching victories in Clippers' franchise history with the team's win over the Rockets on April 10, 2017. Rivers is the also winningest coach in team history, by winning percentage (276-161, .632). He ranks 14th all-time and second among active coaches in regular season wins. He sits one win behind Jack Ramsay (864) for 13th most all-time.

• **WINNING RIVERS:** Head coach Doc Rivers recorded his 800th career victory with the Clippers' 115-105 win over the L.A. Lakers on April 1, 2017. Rivers is just the 15th coach all-time to win at least 800 games and joins Gregg Popovich as the only active head coaches to do so. He is also the second-winningest active coach and 9th winningest coach all-time among 28 coaches that have coached at least 1,000 games.
