### STORYLINES

- The Hawks clinched a playoff berth for the 10th consecutive season, the longest active streak in the Eastern Conference, the second-longest in the NBA (San Antonio – 20) and the lengthiest in Atlanta Hawks history ... Atlanta is the fifth seed after finishing 43-39 ... Since moving to Atlanta in 1968, the franchise had made 33 postseason appearances.
- The Hawks have won four consecutive home playoff games against Washington ... The last time the Wizards defeated Atlanta at Philips Arena was on 5/3/15.
- Dennis Schröder recorded his first career postseason double-double with 29 points (10-18 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 4-5 FTs) and 11 assists, while adding two steals in Game 5 at Washington (4/26); setting or tying playoff career-highs in points, assists, FGM and 3FGM ... Schröder is the first Hawk to post 25 points and 10 assists in a playoff game since Pete Maravich (34 pts/10 asts) on 4/4/17; and he is the first Hawk to record at least 29 points and 11 in assists in a postseason contest since Lenny Wilkens (29 pts/12 asts) on 4/10/66.
- Taurean Prince recorded 10 points in Game 5 at Washington (4/26) and is the first Hawks rookie to score in double-figures in his first five playoff games since Pete Maravich (five games) from 3/25-4/1/71 ... The last rookie in the NBA to start his first five postseason games and score in double-figures in each outing was Tony Parker (six games) with San Antonio from 4/20-5/5/02.
- Paul Millsap recorded his third 20-point/10-rebound game of the postseason with 21 points and 11 boards, while adding two assists at Washington (4/26) ... Millsap has eight career 20-point/10-rebound playoff contests and is tied with LeBron James for the second most this postseason (Russell Westbrook is first with five).
- Paul Millsap can move up on the Hawks all-time playoff list in a few categories: he needs four steals to tie Al Horford (57) for sixth in steals, five blocks to tie Dikembe Mutombo (58) for fourth in blocks, four 3FGM tie tie DeMarre Carroll (38) for eighth in 3FGM, and six FTM to tie Bill Bridges (189) for ninth in FTM.

**REGULAR SEASON SERIES NOTES**

Washington won the season series 3-1 for the second time in the last three years (teams split 2-2 in 2015-16) ... Atlanta took the first meeting, a 114-99, home decision on 10/27 in the season opener for both clubs ... The Wizards took the next three, including two home wins (95-92 on 11/4 and 104-100 on 3/22) and a 112-86 triumph at Philips Arena on 1/27 ... Washington has won three straight regular season games overall against Atlanta and has taken four-in-a-row at home ... Tim Hardaway Jr. averaged 18.0 ppg in four games (one start) against the Wizards this year, while Dwight Howard put up 14.3 ppg and 15.0 rpg ... Bradley Beal scored at a 21.0 ppg clip in four contests against Atlanta this season ... The Hawks lead the all-time series 151-143 (96-45 at home, 48-93 on the road and 7-5 on neutral courts).

**COMMON THREADS**

Hawks Assistant Coach Darvin Ham played 71 games for the Wizards in 1997-98 ... Kris Humphries played for Washington from 2014 through part of 2016 ... Wizards Head Coach Scott Brooks was Head Coach for the Oklahoma City Thunder when Thabo Sefolosha played on the team from part of 2008 through 2014 ... Dwight Howard and Marcin Gortat were teammates in Orlando (2007-part of 2011) ... Ian Mahinmi (2007-10) played for San Antonio while Hawks Head Coach Mike Budenholzer was an Assistant on the Spurs' bench ... Tim Hardaway Jr., Jose Calderon and Jason Smith all teamed-up in New York in 2014-15 ... Ersan Ilyasova, Mike Dunleavy (2011-13) and Brandon Jennings all played together in Milwaukee from 2009-13 ... Ilyasova and Jennings teamed-up again in Detroit for part of 2015-16, while Ilyasova and Smith were teammates in Orlando for part of 2015-16 ... Kelly Oubre was originally selected by Atlanta in the first round (15<sup>th</sup> overall) of the 2015 NBA Draft before his rights were traded later that night.

**HAWKS 114, WIZARDS 99 – PHILIPS ARENA – ATLANTA, GA (10/27/16)**

A 24-4 run early in the fourth quarter broke open a close game as Atlanta cruised to a 114-99 win in the season opener ... The game was a back-and-forth affair for three- plus periods, featuring 14 ties and 19 lead changes, the last of which came on Paul Millsap's three-pointer 10:40 to play ... For the game, the Hawks shot .500 FG%, .462 3FG% (12-26) and .778 FT% (14-18), while Washington hit .426 from the field, .300 from distance (6-20) and .722 from the stripe (13-18) ... Millsap finished the night with 28 points, seven rebounds, six assists and one block, while frontcourt tag team partner Dwight Howard tallied 11 points, 19 boards, three blocks, two assists and one steal in his Hawks debut ... Tim Hardaway Jr. came off the bench to score 21 points, Dennis Schröder had 14 and Thabo Sefolosha 13 ... Markieff Morris paced the visitors with 22 points and John Wall had a double-double (12 points/10 assists) ... Atlanta won the battle of the boards 52-40 (38-28 on the defensive end) and outscored the Wizards in second chance points 20-6.

**WIZARDS 95, HAWKS 92 – VERIZON CENTER – WASHINGTON, DC (11/4/16)**

A furious Hawks comeback came up just short as Kyle Korver's three-point attempt to tie the game with under four seconds left was off the mark ... Atlanta trailed by 16 points in the third quarter and faced an 11-point deficit with under nine minutes to play before a 9-0 run got them back in it ... The Wizards went back up 93-85 with under two minutes on the clock but Atlanta wouldn't go away and put themselves in position to send the game to overtime on Korver's triple attempt ... The first quarter ended with things knotted at 19 but the Wizards picked it up in the second to take a 48-35 lead at the break ... Both clubs struggled offensively as Atlanta hit .386 FG%, .200 3FG% (5-25) and .639 FT% (23-36) for the night, while Washington made .388 FG% and .250 3FG% (5-20), but knocked down 28-35 FTs (.800) ... Dwight Howard (12 rebounds) and Dennis Schröder scored 20 points apiece for the Hawks ... Bradley Beal paced the home team with 28 points, with John Wall (21 points/10 rebounds) and Marcin Gortat (12 points/15 boards) recording double-doubles.

**WIZARDS 112, HAWKS 86 – PHILIPS ARENA – ATLANTA, GA (1/27/17)**

Washington started the game on a 13-3 run and pushed the lead to 37-25 after one ... The second quarter was more of the same as the Wizards took a 67-45 halftime advantage ... The Hawks couldn't get back in it as the deficit ballooned to as-many-as-30 in the second half ... Atlanta struggled offensively, hitting .361 FG% and .290 3FG% (9-31), while the Wizards knocked down .483 FG% (.532 in the first half) and .419 3FG% (13-31) ... Washington also won the battle of the boards, 52-41 and had a 40-30 edge in points in the paint ... Kent Bazemore put in 15 points and Dwight Howard had a double-double (12 points/13 rebounds) ... Tim Hardaway Jr. added 12 points and Mike Scott 11 ... All five Wizards starters scored in double-figures, paced by Otto Porter's 21 points (also 11 rebounds) ... Marcin Gortat also posted a double-double with 15 points and 12 boards.

**WIZARDS 104, HAWKS 100 – VERIZON CENTER – WASHINGTON, DC (3/22/17)**

A 12-0 first quarter run sparked the Hawks to an early 20-8 lead, but Washington answered with an 8-0 spurt to make it 20-16 after one ... The Hawks outscored the Wizards 26-24 in the second to take a 46-40 halftime advantage ... In the third quarter John Wall scored his first 12 points of the game and Washington outscored Atlanta 27-21 in the period, knotting things at 67 heading to the final frame ... With 7:28 left in the game and the score even at 78, Washington went on a 13-2 burst over the next three minutes ... Atlanta didn't seriously threaten the rest of the way ... Dwight Howard recorded a double-double (14 points/16 rebounds) and Tim Hardaway Jr. scored 29 points ... Wall posted a double-double (22 points/10 assists) and Bradley Beal scored 28 points for Washington ... The Wizards won the rebounding battle 55-44 and grabbed 18 offensive boards ... Washington shot .400 (38-95) from the floor, .324 (11-34) from deep and .739 (17-23) from the charity stripe, while Atlanta hit .395 FG% (34-86), .320 3FG% (8-25) and .828 FT% (24-29).

**ALL-TIME POSTSEASON SERIES NOTES**

Atlanta and Washington square off in a first round playoff series after the Wizards took the regular season series 3-1 (winning each of the last three games) ... This will be fourth all-time postseason meeting between the clubs, with Atlanta winning in the 2015 Eastern Conference Semifinals 4-2 (after trailing 2-1) ... ### LUCKY 7

Seven Hawks players scored in double-figures in the Game 4 victory vs. Washington (4/24), making Atlanta the only team in the NBA this postseason to have at least seven players score 10-or-more points in the same game ... The last time the Hawks had seven players scored 10-plus points in the same playoff contest was vs. Detroit on 4/17/86.

### FEASTING ON FREE-THROWS

Atlanta opened the playoffs with three consecutive games of 30-plus free throw attempts, which is the longest streak of 30-or-more free throw attempts in the postseason for the Hawks since 4/27/89-4/28/91 (seven games) ... The last time Atlanta had at least three straight games of 30-plus FTAs in a single playoff season was from 4/29-5/8/88 (five games).

### MONSTER MILLSAP:

Paul Millsap recorded 29 points, 14 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and one steal vs. Washington (4/22); becoming the first player in franchise history to record at least that stat line in a postseason game (steals and blocks became official NBA stats prior to the 1973-74 season) ... Millsap posted recorded 27 points (career-high 14-15 FTs), 10 rebounds, four assists, two steals and one block at Washington (4/19); becoming the first Hawk in franchise history to put up at least that stat line and make 14-or-more free throws in a postseason game ... Additionally, Millsap became the first Hawk to record two straight 20-point/10-rebound games in the playoffs since Moses Malone (5/5-5/7/89).

### ROOKIE STARTER:

Taurean Prince became the first Hawks rookie to score in double-figures in his first five playoff games since Pete Maravich (five games) from 3/25-4/1/71 ... The last rookie in the NBA to start his first five postseason games and score in double-figures in each outing was Tony Parker (six games) with San Antonio from 4/20-5/5/02 ... Prince was also the first Atlanta rookie since Horford to score in double-figures in his first postseason outing, finishing with 14 points.

Dwight Howard is the active NBA leader with 666 career double-doubles (including one triple-double) ... He was sixth in the NBA in double-doubles this season with 53, including 25 in 30 minutes-or-less of playing time (best in the league) ... Howard averaged 13.5 ppg and 12.7 rpg on the year, becoming one-of-six players in NBA history to average a point/rebound double-double in each of his first 13 seasons – Wilt Chamberlain (14 years), Tim Duncan, Moses Malone (14), Shaquille O'Neal and Bill Russell.

**SCHRÖDER THE STARTER:**

In his first season as a starter, Dennis Schröder averaged 17.9 ppg, 6.3 apg (t15<sup>th</sup>) and 3.1 rpg in 31.5 mpg, while shooting .451 FG%, .340 3FG% and .855 FT% (t29<sup>th</sup>) ... He scored in double-figures 70 times (career-long streak of 17 consecutive games from 2/4-3/16), including 31 20-point efforts (four 30-point games) and recorded a single season career-best 10 double-doubles ... **PAUL-STAR:**

Paul Millsap, competing in his fourth All-Star Game (each of the last four years), played in the 2017 Midseason Classic on 2/19, and finished the evening with five points, five rebounds, three assists and one steal in 13 minutes (2-4 FGs, 1-3 3FGs) ... Millsap joined Dominique Wilkins, Bob Pettit, Lou Hudson, Joe Johnson, Dikembe Mutombo and Cliff Hagan as the only players in franchise history to earn All-Star honors in four straight seasons.

**INSTANT OFFENSE:**

Tim Hardaway Jr. averaged 14.5 ppg (.455 FG%, .357 3FG%, .766 FT%) in 27.3 mpg in 79 games (30 starts) this season, scoring in double-figures 59 times (career-long streak of 20 straight games 1/25-3/10), including 23 20-point outings (two 30-point nights) ... Hardaway Jr. set or tied single game career-highs this year in rebounds (nine) vs. Cleveland (4/9), points (36) and FGM (13) vs. Cleveland (3/3), assists (eight) and minutes (58) vs. New York (1/29), and 3FGM (six) vs. San Antonio (1/1) ... He posted single season career-highs in ppg, rpg (2.8), apg (2.3), mpg, FG%, FGM (415), 3FGM (149) and FTM (164).

**COMEBACK KIDS:**

The Hawks recorded a 26-point fourth quarter comeback in the 126-125 overtime victory against Cleveland (4/9) ... It was third time in NBA history a team has rallied from a 26-or-more point deficit entering the fourth quarter ... It was the second time in franchise history and this season (since the NBA started keeping track of play-by-play in 1997) the club has rallied from at least 20 points in the final period of a game (previously at Houston (2/2)) ... Earlier in the year, Atlanta posted a 20-point second half comeback in the 114-110 victory at Milwaukee (12/9) ... According to ESPN, it was the first time in the Hawks' 68-season history in the NBA to win when trailing by 20-or-more at halftime ... Atlanta had 10 victories this season when trailing by double-digits at any point in a game.

It was the third time in franchise history, and the first in over 47 years, the club had six players score more than 15 points in the same game (previously on 3/10/65 against Cincinnati and 12/31/69 against Baltimore) ... With only 10 available players, Atlanta posted a 114-100 win at Cleveland (4/7) ... All 10 Hawks contributed, as each had at least 19:34 of playing time, four points (six in double-figures), one rebound and one assist ... Against Charlotte (4/11), all 13 active players scored and had at least one rebound ... It was the third time in franchise history that at least 13 players produced at least one point and one rebound in the same game (previously at San Antonio on 11/28/15 and at Minnesota on 12/26/16).

**FILLING UP THE BOXSCORE:**

Paul Millsap recorded 37 points, 19 rebounds, seven assists and one steal against New York (1/29) in 60 minutes of action (the highest single-game total in the NBA this year), becoming the first NBA player to record at least those numbers in a game since Karl Malone at Milwaukee on 1/8/97.

### **RECORD SETTER:**

Dwight Howard hit .633 from the field this year (fourth in the NBA), shattering the Hawks' single-season FG% record, set by Mike Glenn (.588) in 1984-85 ... Additionally, Howard ranks sixth on the Hawks' all-time single season list 644 def. rebounds and 10<sup>th</sup> in off. rebounds with 296.

### **COACH BUD:**

Head Coach Mike Budenholzer ranks sixth on the Hawks' all-time wins list with 189 ... He recorded his 100<sup>th</sup> career victory vs. Charlotte on 10/30/15, becoming the second-fastest coach to reach 100 wins with the franchise (167 games) ... Lenny Wilkens reached 100 victories in 166 games (1993-96) ... Budenholzer's .576 winning percentage (189-139) is the highest among Hawks coaches with at least 100 victories ... Additionally, he ranks fourth on Atlanta's all-time postseason wins chart with 15, trailing Richie Guerin (26), Mike Fratello (18) and Wilkens (17).

### **GOING FOR 30:**

Dennis Schröder had four 30-point games this season, the highest single-season total for a Hawk since Josh Smith (four) in 2012-13 ... Paul Millsap has three 30-point nights this year, Tim Hardaway Jr. two and Dwight Howard one ... Atlanta is 7-0 all-time when Millsap goes for 30-or-more.

### **WIRE TO WIRE**

The Hawks recorded four wire-to-wire victories this season – at Memphis (3/11), at Brooklyn (1/10), vs. Orlando (2/4) and vs. Denver (2/8).

### **HOWARD CLIMBING ALL-TIME NBA LISTS:**

Dwight Howard ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> in NBA/ABA history with 1916 career blocked shots, while holding the 23<sup>rd</sup> position in career rebounds at 12,089 ... He is 12<sup>th</sup> all-time in defensive rebounds (8697) and 20<sup>th</sup> in offensive boards (3392).

### **20/20:**

Dwight Howard notched his third 20-point/20-rebound game of the season and 48<sup>th</sup> of his career at Philadelphia (3/29) with 22 points and 20 boards, becoming the first Hawks since Kevin Willis in 1993-94 to post at least three 20/20 nights in the same season ... He has 75 career 20-rebound games overall (six this season) ... Howard grabbed a season-high 23 rebounds twice this year (at Houston on 2/2 and vs. Charlotte on 12/17) ... The last Hawk to have a 23-rebound game was Mutombo on 1/31/01 vs. Toronto.

### **QUADRUPLE DOUBLE-DOUBLE:**

The Hawks had four players record double-doubles in the victory vs. New York (1/29); Paul Millsap (37 points/19 rebounds), Dwight Howard (19 points/13 rebounds), Dennis Schröder (23 points/15 assists) and Kent Bazemore (24 points/10 rebounds) ... It was the first time Atlanta had a quartet of teammates with double-doubles in the same game since 11/7/07 vs. Phoenix (Marvin Williams, Josh Smith, Joe Johnson and Josh Childress).

### **LET'S GO TO OT:**

The Hawks were 5-0 in overtime games this season, including a 142-139 quadruple OT win vs. New York (1/29) – the 14<sup>th</sup> quadruple OT game in NBA history and the third in Hawks history (previously a 139-133 win vs. Utah on 3/25/12 and a 127-122 victory at Seattle on 2/19/82) ... The last time Atlanta had five OT wins in a single season without one loss was in 1996-97 (5-0 record).

### **NO REST/NO PROBLEM:**

The Hawks had an 11-7 record in the second game of back-to-backs this season, tied for the third-most wins in the NBA and highest total in the Eastern Conference.

### **30 TIMES 2:**

In the win at Oklahoma City on 12/19, Dennis Schröder (31 points, 10-16 FGs) and Paul Millsap (30 points, 12-18 FGs) became the first two Hawks to score at least 30 points and shoot at least .600 from the field in the same game since Joe Johnson (36 points, 14-18 FGs) and Al Harrington (35 points, 13-19 FGs) pulled it off vs. New York on 12/16/05 ... The last two Hawks to score 30-or-more points in the same game were Johnson (34 points) and Josh Smith (33 points) at Denver on 3/13/12.

### **DWIGHT'S DEBUT:**

Dwight Howard had a memorable debut with his hometown team, finishing the night with 11 points, 19 rebounds, three blocks, two assists and one steal in 30 minutes vs. Washington (10/27) ... His 19 rebounds are the most ever by a Hawk in their first game with the club and he is the first Hawk to post a double-double in his debut outing since Zaza Pachulia (12 points/13 boards) at Golden State on 11/2/05 ... Howard's 15 first half rebounds are the most by an Atlanta player in a half since Dikembe Mutombo had 15 in the second half vs. Toronto on 1/31/01.

### **COINCIDENCE?:**

Paul Millsap and Kent Bazemore scored 23 and 20 points respectively and Dwight Howard had 20 in the Hawks' 112-97 home win over the Rockets (11/5) ... It was the third time in the last 14 seasons that all three members of Atlanta's starting frontcourt scored at least 20 points (according to the Elias Sports Bureau) ... The previous two games also came against Houston, on 1/15/11 (Joe Johnson 30, Al Horford 24, Josh Smith 21) and 12/29/15 (Horford 30, Bazemore 26, Millsap 22).

### **PRIME TIME PLAYER:**

Tim Hardaway Jr. recorded 36 points (13-20 FGs, 5-9 3FGs, 5-6 FTs) in 35 minutes off the bench vs. Cleveland (3/3), setting career-highs in points and FGM ... It was the highest scoring total off the bench for Atlanta since since Jamal Crawford had 36 at Toronto (1/12/11) ... Hardaway Jr. scored 33 points (12-18 FGs, 4-9 3FGs, 5-7 FTs) at Houston (2/2), including 23 in the fourth quarter ... The last Hawk to score at least 23 points in any quarter was Salim Stoudamire (24) in the fourth against New Orleans in Oklahoma City on 11/18/05, and the last Hawk to record at least 20 points in the final period was Joe Johnson (21) at New Jersey 11/14/08.

### **DOUBLE-FIGURE W'S:**

The Hawks won each of the first three games by double-figures – 114-99 vs. Washington (10/27), 104-72 at Philadelphia (10/29) and 106-95 vs. Sacramento (10/31) – for the first time since moving to Atlanta in 1968 ... For the season, Atlanta has 17 double-digit wins.

### **HOMECOURT ADVANTAGE/ROAD WARRIORS:**

Since the start of the 2008-09 season, Atlanta has recorded a 246-115 (.681) regular season mark at Philips Arena ... Atlanta was 23-18 at home this year ... The Hawks had a 20-21 road record this season.

### **OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION:**

The Hawks scored at least 110 points and shot over .500 FG% in four consecutive games (11/5-11/12), equaling the longest single-season streak in club history (last accomplished 2/19-2/26/88).

## **BIOS**

### **PRESIDENT OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS/HEAD COACH MIKE BUDENHOLZER**

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 189-139 (.576) (4<sup>th</sup> year) ... Overall Postseason Record: 17-21 (.447)

Having played a significant role in one of the most successful sustained runs in league history and with four NBA championship rings under his belt in San Antonio, Mike Budenholzer was named the 12<sup>th</sup> full-time head coach in Hawks franchise history on May 28, 2013. He added duties as President of Basketball Operations on June 30, 2015.

Last season, he led the Hawks to a 48-34 regular season finish, fourth in the Eastern Conference, as the club reached the playoffs for the third time in his three years. Overall, Atlanta has made nine consecutive postseason trips, the longest stretch in franchise history and the longest active streak in the Eastern Conference.

The 2014-15 NBA Coach of the Year, Budenholzer led the Hawks to a number of milestones two seasons ago, including the best record in franchise history (60-22, .732), the club's first-ever trip to the Eastern Conference Finals, Atlanta's first Division title since 1993-94 and the first time with the Eastern Conference's top seed since that same season. In addition, the Hawks put together a franchise-record 19-game win streak, tying the fifth-longest single-season streak in NBA history. Budenholzer and his staff coached the Eastern Conference All-Star team in February 2015 in New York.

He was the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for December 2014 and January 2015, becoming the first Hawks coach to win the honor in back-to-back months. Atlanta became the first team in NBA history to finish a month 17-0 in January.

In his first season in Atlanta, Budenholzer led the Hawks to their seventh consecutive postseason appearance with a 38-44 record. The team reached the playoffs playing their best basketball of the season and pushed the top-seeded Indiana Pacers to seven games in their first round series.

Budenholzer spent the previous 19 seasons with the San Antonio Spurs. He worked the final 17 as an assistant coach and the last six as the no. 1 aide to Gregg Popovich, the longest-tenured head coach in major professional sports and third-winningest coach (by percentage - .692) in NBA history behind only Phil Jackson and Billy Cunningham.

As an assistant coach since the 1996-97 season, he helped lead San Antonio to a league-best 908-438 (.675) regular season record, a league-best 133-83 playoff mark (.616) and NBA championships in 1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007. Hired by Popovich prior to the 1994-95 campaign, Budenholzer spent his first two seasons as a video coordinator before being named an assistant coach. On numerous occasions, he served as the Spurs summer league head coach. He also served as an advance scout for Team USA for the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece.

Budenholzer is a 1993 graduate of Pomona College where he received a bachelor's degree in politics, philosophy and economics and was a four-year letterman in both basketball and golf. Following college, he played professionally in Denmark for the Vejle Basketball Klub, also getting his start in coaching, serving as head coach for two different teams in the Vejle system.

A native of Holbrook, AZ, he has four children: Will, Libby, Hanna and John. His father Vince spent 25 years as a high school and college basketball coach in Arizona before retiring in 1997, and was inducted into the Arizona Coaches Association Hall of Fame. The youngest of seven children, Budenholzer was born on August 6, 1969.
