STORYLINES

- Atlanta ranked tied for fourth in the league in forcing turnovers as opponents committed 15.1 miscues per game (leading to 17.7 points, fifth in the NBA) ... The Hawks averaged 7.8 spg.
- The Hawks ranked eighth in the NBA at 23.7 apg on the season, while recording assists on 62.2% of made FGs this year, fifth in the league ... The Hawks were one-of-two teams (Golden State) to post five-or-more games with an 80.0% A/FGM ratio this year, including an NBA season-high tying 87.5% vs. Detroit (12/14).
- The Hawks made 917 3FGs on the year, setting a new single-season franchise record (previously 818 in 2014-15) ... Atlanta ranked ninth in the NBA in 3FGM, while hitting .360 from long-range.
- Eight Atlanta rookies saw game action this season, tying the franchise record set by the 1954-55 Milwaukee Hawks ... The Hawks had 12 players on the final roster (including two-way contracts) with one year or less of NBA experience, while 15 players had fewer than five years experience ... Atlanta's average years of service was 1.5, making them the least experienced team in the league (per the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Taurean Prince scored 20-plus points in four straight games to end the season, averaging 25.8 ppg during the run ... He averaged 19.2 ppg in March and April (20 games), scoring 20-plus points 12 times, including three 30-point efforts.
- Rookie John Collins averaged 10.5 ppg, 7.3 rpg, 1.3 apg and 1.1 bpg (.576 FG%, .340 3FG%, .715 FT%) in 74 games (26 starts) ... He is the sixth player in franchise history to average at least 10.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg as a rookie (Bob Pettit, Zelmo Beaty, John Drew, Al Horford and Mike Sojourner) and the one only to put up 10.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg and 1.0 bpg (officially kept as a statistic by the NBA in 1972-73).
- Dennis Schröder (19.4 ppg and 6.2 apg) is the fourth player in franchise history to average 19.0 ppg and 6.0 apg for a season, joining Lenny Wilkens (1967-68), Pete Maravich (1971-72 and 1972-73) and Joe Johnson (2005-06).
- John Collins ranked seventh in the NBA in FG% at .576 FG% which is the fifth-highest single season performance in NBA history (min. 300 FGM) for a rookie behind Steve Johnson .613 (1981-82), Otis Thorpe .600 (1984-85), Buck Williams .582 (1981-82) and James Worthy .579 (1982-83) ... It is also the fourth-highest single season performance for any player in Hawks history and the best shooting percentage ever for a Hawks rookie.
- Taurean Prince was the only Hawk to play in and start all 82 games during the season ... He averaged 14.1 ppg, 4.7 rpg, 2.6 apg and 1.0 spg in 30.0 mpg (.426 FG%, .385 3FG%, .844 FT% - 30th in NBA), while leading the club with 176 3FGM ... His 176 3FGM rank seventh on the Hawks' all-time single season list and he is the fourth Atlanta player to make at least 170 triples in a season.

THIEVES IN THE NIGHT:

Atlanta ranked tied for fourth in the league in forcing turnovers as opponents committed 15.1 miscues per game (leading to 17.7 points, fifth the NBA) ... The Hawks averaged 7.8 spg ... Atlanta swiped 10-plus steals 22 times on the year and forced 20-plus turnovers on 11 occasions.

SHARE AND SHARE ALIKE:

The Hawks ranked eighth in the NBA at 23.7 apg on the season, dishing out at least 20 assists on 69 occasions, including 33 games with at least 25 helpers (seven 30-assist nights, including 40 vs. Sacramento on 11/15) ... Atlanta recorded assists on 62.2% of made FGs this year, fifth in the league.

CHARITY CASE:

Atlanta finished seventh in the NBA in FT% at .785, while hitting .800-or-better from the charity stripe 43 times on the season ... The Hawks made a season-best 1.000 FT% four times this year (12-12 vs. Denver on 10/27, 18-18 at Denver on 1/10, 12-12 vs. Utah on 1/22 and 1-1 vs Orlando on 4/1), also tied for the NBA single-game high, and knocked down a season-high 33-36 from the line (.917) at Brooklyn on 10/22 ... Atlanta's 1-1 showing at the charity stripe vs. Orlando (4/1) tied an NBA record for fewest free throw attempts in a game (Memphis went 1-1 from the line against the Hawks on 2/8/14).

EXPERIENCE:

Eight Atlanta rookies saw game action this season, tying the franchise record set by the 1954-55 Milwaukee Hawks ... The Hawks had 12 players on the final roster (including two-way contracts) with one year or less of NBA experience, while 15 players had fewer than five years experience ... Atlanta's average years of service was 1.5, making them the least experienced team in the league (per the Elias Sports Bureau).

GETTING BETTER & BETTER:

Dennis Schröder has increased his scoring each season since his rookie year in 2013-14 ... After averaging 3.7 ppg in 49 games as a rookie, Schröder averaged 10.0 ppg (77 games) in 2014-15, 11.0 ppg (80 games) in 2015-16, 17.9 ppg (79 games) in 2016-17, and put up a team-leading 19.4 ppg this season in 67 games.

POINT GUARD PRODUCTION:

Dennis Schröder had 32 20-point scoring games in 2017-18 (three 30-point efforts, including one 40-point night), scoring in double-figures 62 times overall ... He averaged 19.4 ppg (25th in the NBA), 6.2 apg (t13th), 3.1 rpg and 1.1 spg, while shooting .436 FG% and .849 FT% (27th) ... Schröder owns 22 career point/assist double-doubles (five 20/10 games), including five this year, and has scored 30-plus points seven times (one 40-point night) in his career ... Atlanta is 15-7 all-time when Schröder posts a double-double and 5-2 when he goes for 30-or-more points (1-0 with 40 points).

BUCKETS & DIMES:

Dennis Schröder (19.4 ppg and 6.2 apg) is the fourth player in franchise history to average 19.0 ppg and 6.0 apg for a season, joining Lenny Wilkens (1967-68), Pete Maravich (1971-72 and 1972-73) and Joe Johnson (2005-06).

BIG JOHN:

Rookie John Collins averaged 10.5 ppg, 7.3 rpg, 1.3 apg and 1.1 bpg (.576 FG%, .340 3FG%, .715 FT%) in 74 games (26 starts) ... He is the sixth player in franchise history to average at least 10.0 ppg and 7.0 rpg as a rookie (Bob Pettit, Zelmo Beatty, John Drew, Al Horford and Mike Sojourner) and the one only to put up 10.0 ppg, 7.0 rpg and 1.0 bpg (officially kept as a statistic by the NBA in 1972-73) ... Overall, Collins ranked seventh in the NBA in FG%, 10th in Eff. FG% (.591), t25th in bpg and 33rd in rpg during the regular season, while ranking second among NBA rookies in FG%, second in bpg, third in rpg, fifth in double-doubles (11) and 11th in ppg ... Several of Collins' noteworthy performances are listed below:

- His .576 FG% is the fifth-highest single season performance in NBA history (min. 300 FGM) for a rookie behind Steve Johnson .613 (1981-82), Otis Thorpe .600 (1984-85), Buck Williams .582 (1981-82) and James Worthy .579 (1982-83) ... It is also the fourth-highest single season performance for any player in Hawks history and the best shooting percentage ever for a Hawks rookie (Antoine Carr .528 in 1984-85).
- Lead all rookies with 176 off. rebounds, averaging 2.4 off. rpg ... John Drew (4.6 in 1974-75) and Al Horford (3.1 in 2007-08) are the only Hawks to pull down more offensive boards per game than Collins as rookies.
- Set a team rookie record by shooting at least .500 from the field in 15 straight games played from 11/13-12/27 (previously 11 by Stacey Augmon from 12/28/91-1/19/92).
- Had 13 points, 16 rebounds and four blocks vs. Toronto (1/24), setting or tying career-highs in rebounds and blocks ... He is the second Hawks rookie to record at least 15 boards and four rejections in a game, joining Tree Rollins (11/19/77 and 12/25/77) ... The last Hawks rookie to have a 15-rebound game was Al Horford (3/19/08).
- Made first career start vs. L.A. Clippers (11/22), finishing with 14 points (7-9 FGs), 10 rebounds, four steals and three assists (the only Atlanta rookie to ever record at least that line in a game) ... The first Hawks rookie since Mike Scott at New York (4/17/13) to post a double-double in the first starting assignment of his career ... His .778 FG% on the night is the best-ever for a Hawks rookie making his first start (minimum five FGM) – previously .750 FG% twice (Butch Lee 9-12 FGs on 10/13/78 at Indiana and Bill Willoughby 6-8 FGs on 12/18/75 vs. L.A. Lakers).
- Posted two consecutive double-doubles off the bench (at Brooklyn 10/22 and at Miami 10/23), becoming the first Hawks rookie since Adam Keefe (3/4-3/6/93) to record back-to-back double-doubles in a reserve role.
- Tallied 14 points and 13 boards at Brooklyn (10/22), making him the first Hawks rookie since John Drew in 1974-75 (third game) to have a 13-plus rebound outing within his first three games played.
- Converted a three-point play on his first career FGA in his NBA debut vs. Dallas (10/18), becoming the first Hawk to have a three-point play on his first career attempt since Pape Sy 4/9/11 at Washington ... Finished with 14 points, five rebounds, two steals and one assist in 22 minutes off the bench.

HE'S A PRINCE:

Taurean Prince improved his numbers from his rookie year in virtually every category (see graph below), while ranking in the Top 10 among second-year players in several statistics: second in FT%, fourth in 3FG%, fourth in spg, fourth in ppg, seventh in FG%, eighth in apg, ninth in rpg and bpg.

GOING FOR 30:

Taurean Prince scored 30-or-more points five times (including a career-high 38 twice) this season, the highest total for an Atlanta player in the last five years ... The last Hawks with five 30-point nights in a season were Josh Smith (eight) and Joe Johnson (six) in 2011-12, while the last Hawk with two 38-plus scoring games was Johnson in 2007-08.

ALL-STAR WEEKEND:

Rookie John Collins and Taurean Prince both participated in the 2018 Mtn Dew Kickstart Rising Stars game (2/16) during All-Star Weekend ... Collins started and tallied 11 points, three rebounds, two steals and one block in 23 minutes (5-8 FGs, 1-2 FTs), while Prince saw 18 minutes off the bench and recorded eight points, two rebounds, two assists and one steal (3-6 FGs, 2-3 3FGs).

DENNIS DOMINATES:

Dennis Schröder scored a career-high 41 points (career-high 16-28 FGs, 3-7 3FGs, 6-10 FTs) to go with seven assists and five rebounds in 35 minutes at Utah (3/20) ... His 41 points are the most by a Hawk since Joe Johnson's 41 on 12/27/08 vs. Chicago while also being the highest point total for a Hawk on the road since Shareef Abdur-Rahim scored 43 points at Cleveland on 12/6/03 ... Schröder is the second Atlanta player (Dominique Wilkins) to record over 40 points while playing under 35 minutes since the 1986-87 season ... He is also the fourth Hawk to finish with at least 40 points, seven assists and five rebounds (Jason Terry, Johnson and Wilkins).

FRANCHISE RECORDS:

Atlanta set franchise records with 48 3FGAs, 25 3FGAs in the second half and 16 3FGAs in the fourth quarter (record for any half or quarter) vs. Chicago on 1/20.

FOUR-POINT PLAYS:

Atlanta recorded two four-point plays in the same game for the first time in franchise history vs. Chicago on 3/11, with Andrew White III tallying his first career four-pointer and Taurean Prince his second (both this season) ... Prince recorded his first career four-point play vs. Los Angeles Lakers (2/26), marking the 50th in team history ... Malcolm Delaney recorded his first career four-point play vs. Utah (1/22), followed by his second vs. Memphis (2/6).

WHAT A NIGHT!:

Atlanta recorded a 126-80 win vs. Sacramento on 11/15, the largest margin of victory in franchise history (previously 44 twice – St. Louis Hawks vs. Baltimore on 2/12/65 and Atlanta Hawks vs. Detroit on 2/7/94) ... For the game, Atlanta shot .633 FG% (50-79) and .500 3FG% (16-32), won the battle of the boards 53-29, dished out 40 assists and led by as-many-as-48 at one point ... It was first time since 2/24/93 at Philadelphia the Hawks had at least 120 points, 40 assists and 50 rebounds in a game, as eight Hawks scored in double-figures ... The .633 FG% is the sixth-highest for the club since 1983-84 and it was the 10th 40-assist game since 1986-87 ... The Hawks hit their first eight FGAs of the game for the first time since 2/27/15 vs. Orlando.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB:

Kent Bazemore tallied 16 points, a season-high tying seven assists, a season-best five steals, five rebounds and two blocks in 32 minutes (zero turnovers) vs. Miami (12/18), becoming the seventh player in NBA history to record at least that line in a game while not committing a turnover – Hakeem Olajuwon (twice), Clyde Drexler, Vlade Divac, Baron Davis (the last do it on 1/16/08), Andrei Kirilenko and Lionel Simmons.

FILLING UP THE BOX SCORE:

Dewayne Dedmon posted 20 points, 14 rebounds, five assists, two steals and two blocks in 23:53 of playing time vs. Sacramento (11/15), setting or tying career-highs in points, assists and FGM ... He is the only NBA player since 1983-84 to record at least that line in less than 24 minutes ... Additionally, Dedmon shot 9-10 FGs, 1-1 3FGs and 1-3 FTs on the night and did not commit a turnover.

RARE ROOKIE:

Tyler Cavanaugh had 16 points (6-7 FGs, 4-4 3FGs), six rebounds and two assists in 18 minutes (no turnovers) at New Orleans (11/13) ... He is the third NBA rookie since 1983-84 to have at least 16 points and four 3FGM without a miss in fewer than 19 minutes, joining Kyle Korver (12/21/03) and E'Twaun Moore (1/26/12).

IN ELITE COMPANY:

Dennis Schröder scored 28 points at Dallas (10/18), becoming the third Hawks point guard to score 28-or-more points in a season opener, joining Hall of Famers Pete Maravich and Lenny Wilkens ... Schröder followed it up with 25 points at Charlotte (10/20), becoming the first Hawk since Joe Johnson in 2008-09 to start a season with consecutive 25-point games (Jeff Teague had back-to-back 20-point outings to start 2014-15).

VALUE THE BALL:

Dennis Schröder had 13 points and a career-high tying 15 assists vs. New Orleans on 1/17 (zero turnovers), becoming the third Hawk to dish out 15-plus assists without a miscue, joining Mookie Blaylock on 2/6/95 at Philadelphia and Doc Rivers on 2/28/87 vs. Portland (Schröder and Blaylock recorded double-doubles).

PRINCELY PERFORMANCES:

Taurean Prince posted 30 points (12-16 FGs, 5-6 3FGs, 1-2 FTs), 10 rebounds, two blocks and one assist in 35 minutes (zero turnovers) at Toronto on 12/29 ... He is one-of-three Hawks to have a 30-point/10-rebound game without committing a turnover since the 2004-05 season, joining Al Horford (twice) and Josh Smith (twice) ... Prince followed it up with 12 points (4-7 3FGs) and 10 boards vs. Portland (12/30) ... He is the second Hawk to record back-to-back double-doubles, while making at least four 3FGs in each game (Mookie Blaylock three times – all point/assist double-doubles) ... Prince also had 33 points, eight rebounds, five assists, one steal and one block in 39 minutes (12-17 FGs, 7-8 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) at Boston on 4/8 ... He is the second Hawk since 2012-13 to accumulate at least that line in a game, while becoming the fifth Hawk to have two career games with seven 3FGM (third do it in the same season).

PERFECT FROM THE STRIPE:

The Hawks finished the two-game season series with the Nuggets shooting a perfect 30-30 (1.000) from the foul line (12-12 vs. Denver on 10/27 and 18-18 at Denver on 1/10) ... Atlanta is the first team since Toronto in 2009-09 (vs. Portland) to not miss a FT against an opponent in a season series.

WHAT A DEBUT!:

HEAD COACH MIKE BUDENHOLZER

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 213-197 (.520) (5th year)

Now in his fifth season in Atlanta, Mike Budenholzer is the 12th full-time head coach in Hawks history. He was named head coach on May 28, 2013 and has led the Hawks to a 189-139 (.576) regular season mark entering the 2017-18 season.

Last season, he led Atlanta to a 43-39 regular season finish, placing fifth in the Eastern Conference, as the club reached the postseason for the fourth time in his four years. Overall, Atlanta has made 10 consecutive postseason trips, the longest stretch in Atlanta history and the longest active streak in the Eastern Conference (second in the NBA to the Spurs).

In 2015-16, the Hawks went 48-34, good for fourth in the East, and topped Boston in the first round of the NBA Playoffs (Atlanta's first series win over the Celtics in franchise history), reaching at least the Conference Semis for the second straight year. From 2014-16, the Hawks had the best two-year combined mark (108-56) in the history of the franchise.

Budenholzer led the Hawks to a number of milestones in 2014-15, including the best record in franchise history (60-22, .732), the club's first-ever trip to the Eastern Conference Finals, Atlanta's first Division title since 1993-94 and the first time with the Eastern Conference's top seed since that same season. In addition, the Hawks put together a franchise-record 19-game win streak, tying the fifth-longest single-season streak in NBA history. Budenholzer and his staff coached the Eastern Conference All-Star team in February 2015 in New York.

He was the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for December 2014 and January 2015, becoming the first Hawks coach to win the honor in back-to-back months. Atlanta became the first team in NBA history to finish a month 17-0 in January. He capped off 2014-15 by winning the NBA's Coach of the Year award.

In his first season in Atlanta, Budenholzer led the Hawks to their seventh consecutive postseason appearance with a 38-44 record. The team reached the playoffs playing their best basketball of the season and pushed the top-seeded Indiana Pacers to seven games in their first round series.

Budenholzer spent the previous 19 seasons with the San Antonio Spurs, winning four NBA championships along the way. As an assistant coach since the 1996-97 season, he helped lead San Antonio to a league-best 908-438 (.675) regular season record, a league-best 133-83 playoff mark (.616) and NBA titles in 1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007. Hired by the Spurs prior to the 1994-95 campaign, Budenholzer spent his first two seasons as a video coordinator before being named an assistant coach. He also served as an advance scout for Team USA for the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece.

Budenholzer is a 1993 graduate of Pomona College where he received a bachelor's degree in politics, philosophy and economics and was a four-year letterman in both basketball and golf. Following college, he played professionally in Denmark for the Vejle Basketball Klub, also getting his start in coaching, serving as head coach for two different teams in the Vejle system.

Budenholzer raised over \$100,000 last season for the Atlanta Community Food Bank, giving money raised from his Assists for Hunger program and a fundraiser dinner.

A native of Holbrook, AZ, he has four children: Will, Libby, Hanna and John. His father Vince spent 25 years as a high school and college basketball coach in Arizona before retiring in 1997, and was inducted into the Arizona Coaches Association Hall of Fame. The youngest of seven children, Budenholzer was born on August 6, 1969.
