## STORYLINES

- On Feb. 15, in the 2019 MTN DEW ICE Rising Stars, Trae Young and John Collins helped Team USA claim a 161-144 victory ... Young led all bench players with 25 points (9-19 FGs, 6-11 3FGs, 1-2 FTs) and added 10 assists, seven rebounds, and a blocked shot in 24 minutes ... Collins started for Team USA and finished with 12 points (6-7 FGs) and collected two rebounds in 15 minutes.
- The Hawks knocked down 16 three-pointers in a 117-113 victory over the Los Angeles Lakers on 2/12 ... Atlanta's record improved to 9-5 this season when converting at least 15 triples.
- On 2/14 vs. the New York Knicks, Trae Young secured his 18<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season, the most among Eastern Conference rookies ... Young totaled 16 points, 11 assists, six boards, and two steals in 38 minutes ... Young has eight contests this season with at least 20 points and 10 assists, which is the highest single-season total for an NBA rookie since Stephen Curry had eight in 2009-10.
- John Collins leads the 2017 NBA Draft class in double-doubles (22) and ranks in the top 40 among all qualifying players in FG% (.574 – 10<sup>th</sup>), rebounds per game (9.1 – 16<sup>th</sup>) and points per game (19.1 – 35<sup>th</sup>).
- Over the last nine games, Taurean Prince is shooting .500 from the field (38-76), .489 from three-point land (23-47) and .923 from the charity stripe (12-13) ... The third-year swingman has made at least one three-pointer in 35-of-the-37 games he's played this season.
- With his made three-pointer against the Knicks on 2/14, Trae Young has connected from long range 100 times in his rookie campaign and has 51 steals on the season ... Young is 20 points away from becoming the fifth Atlanta Hawks rookie to score 1,000 points.
- Kevin Huerter is five three-pointers shy of 100 for his career and three steals away from 50 career thefts.

The Hawks welcome the Detroit Pistons to State Farm Arena for the final game in the three-game series between the teams ... The two teams each have one win apiece this season, with each win coming on the road ... The Pistons won 124-109 in Atlanta on 11/9 behind Andre Drummond's double-double (23 points and 11 rebounds), while the Hawks won 98-95 in Detroit on 12/23 behind Alex Len's double-double (15 points and 17 rebounds) ... Atlanta leads the all-time series 179-170, but trails 78-83 in contests played at home.

DeAndre' Bembry and Langston Galloway were teammates at St. Joseph's in 2013 ... Pistons radio broadcaster Rick Mahorn is a former Hawks Assistant Coach ... Pistons assistant general manager, Malik Rose, spent three seasons with Atlanta as manager of basketball operations ... Rose also served as general manager of the Hawks G-League affiliate, the Erie BayHawks ... Pistons guard Jose Calderon suited up for the Atlanta Hawks for 17 games during the 2016-17 season ... Pistons center Zaza Pachulia played in 556 games for the Hawks from 2005-13.

**HAWKS 98, Pistons 95 – Little Caesars Arena – Detroit, MI (12/23/18)**

The Hawks used a balanced offensive attack to defeat the Pistons on the road ... Six Atlanta players finished in double figures in the contest ... The Hawks found themselves up seven at the end of the first quarter and up 14 at halftime ... However, the Pistons climbed back into the game during the second half to bring the game closer down the final stretch where Atlanta held on to win by three ... The Hawks were led by Vince Carter who finished the game with 18 points (14 of which came in the first half) ... Alex Len, who was back in the starting lineup for the 18<sup>th</sup> time this season, secured his fourth double-double of the season, tallying 15 points and grabbing a game and season-high 17 rebounds ... The Pistons were led by Langston Galloway who finished with 18 points off the bench ... The Hawks outscored the Pistons 52-40 in the paint and 10-2 on the fast break.

**Pistons 124, HAWKS 109 – State Farm Arena – Atlanta, GA (11/9/18)**

Atlanta could not overcome a slow start and fell to the Pistons at home ... In the first quarter, the Hawks shot .391 from the field and only connected once from long range, while Detroit shot .500 from the field and made six 3FGs ... Atlanta won the battle of the boards, outrebounding the Pistons 53-44 ... The Hawks were led by Jeremy Lin who scored 19 points (5-9 FGs, 2-4 3FGs, 7-7 FTs) in 21 minutes off the bench ... Rookie Trae Young added 16 points, extending his franchise-record of consecutive double-digit scoring games to open a career to 12 contests ... The Pistons were led by Andre Drummond, who tallied a double-double with game-highs in points and rebounds (23/11) ... Atlanta set a season-high with 30 makes from the free throw line (30), and made more free throws than Detroit attempted, who finished the night 12-19 from the charity stripe.

The Hawks could not overcome a season-low for points scored in the first quarter (13) and fell to the Knicks 106-91 at home... The Knicks started the game with a 15-2 run, held the Hawks to a season-low 13 first quarter points, and held a 15-point lead after the first quarter... The Hawks used a 16-6 run during the second quarter to cut the halftime deficit to three... The Hawks were led by Dewayne Dedmon who scored 21 points (6-10 FGs, 4-7 3FGs, 5-5 FTs) and added two rebounds, a steal, and one block in 26 minutes... The Knicks were led by Dennis Smith Jr. who finished with 19 points... Omari Spellman came off the bench and collected a team-high nine rebounds in 17 minutes... The Hawks outscored the Knicks 46-32 in the paint and 12-7 on fast breaks.

**HAWKS 117, Lakers 113 – State Farm Arena – Atlanta, GA (2/12/19)**

The Hawks used a fast start from behind-the-arc to defeat the Lakers 117-113 at home ... Atlanta tied a franchise record for made three-pointers in a quarter with 10 in the first and held a 38-32 lead after 12 minutes of action ... In a game that had 23 lead changes, the Hawks took the lead for the final time with 1:43 left in the third quarter ... Atlanta was led by Trae Young and John Collins who both finished with 22 points ... Young also dished out a team-high 14 assists to secure his Eastern Conference rookie-leading 17<sup>th</sup> double-double of the season ... The Lakers were led by LeBron James who finished with his fifth triple-double of the season, scoring 28 points, grabbing 11 rebounds, and passing for 16 assists ... The Hawks outrebounded the Lakers 47-44 and Atlanta's reserves outscored their counterparts 39-26.

### ATLANTA'S RISING STARS

On 1/29, Atlanta's second-year forward/center John Collins and rookie point guard Trae Young were announced as participants in the MTN DEW ICE Rising Stars during NBA All-Star Weekend in Charlotte ... Collins and Young were selected by NBA assistant coaches to play for the U.S. team in the contest, scheduled to tip off at 9 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 15 at Spectrum Center ... This is the second consecutive year the contest will feature two Hawks (Collins and Taurean Prince in 2017-18).

### ALL-STAR SATURDAY NIGHT SELECTIONS

On 2/5, John Collins and Trae Young were announced as participants in separate events during State Farm All-Star Saturday Night on Feb. 16 at Spectrum Center in Charlotte ... Collins will suit up for the 34<sup>th</sup> AT&T Slam Dunk and Young will compete in the 17<sup>th</sup> Taco Bell Skills Challenge ... Coverage is set to begin at 8 p.m. ET on TNT and ESPN Radio.

### RARE ROOKIE

Trae Young is averaging 16.9 points and 7.6 assists per game, making him one of only seven players who've played in 70% of their team's games - and the only rookie - posting at least 16 points and seven assists per contest this season. Since 1997-98, the only rookies to average at least 16 points and seven assists for a full season are Chris Paul in 2005-06 and John Wall in 2010-11.

### JOHN JOINS STEPH AND BIRD

On 1/23 at Chicago, John Collins led all scorers with a career-high 35 points (career-best 14-16 FGs, career-high-tying 4-4 3FGs, 3-3 FTs) ... Collins added eight rebounds, two assists, and two steals in 29 minutes ... Collins became the third player since the NBA adopted the three-point line in 1979-80 to post a stat line that included at least 35 points, 14 made field goals, eight rebounds, and four three-pointers in fewer than 30 minutes (Larry Bird on 3/18/86 and Stephen Curry 1/28/17).

### DO-IT-ALL-DRE'

DeAndre' Bembry is one of just six players this season who have compiled at least 450 points, 235 rebounds, 125 assists, 70 steals, 30 3FGM and 30 blocks ... Through 57 games, the third-year St. Joe's product has totaled 464 points, 237 rebounds, 145 assists, 72 steals, 37 3FGM and 30 blocks ... Bembry joins Bradley Beal, Anthony Davis, James Harden, Jrue Holiday, and Nikola Jokic as players who have met those minimums this season.

### GETTING DEFENSIVE

The Hawks rank 8<sup>th</sup> in turnovers forced (15.5), 11<sup>th</sup> in steals per game (8.34) and 16<sup>th</sup> in blocks per game (5.10) ... Kent Bazemore ranks 15<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in spg (1.57), and leads a trio of Hawks - joining DeAndre' Bembry (1.24) and Taurean Prince (1.00) - who average at least one theft per contest with Dewayne Dedmon (0.98) just behind them ... Dewayne Dedmon (0.98), Alex Len (0.94) and Kent Bazemore (0.82) average just below one block per contest ... Rookies Trae Young (6<sup>th</sup> in steals/game), Kevin Huerter (7<sup>th</sup> in steals/game), and Omari Spellman (9<sup>th</sup> in blocks/game) are in the top 10 of qualified first-year players in select defensive categories.

### BENCH MOB

Atlanta's reserves lead the NBA in steals per game (3.60), rank 4<sup>th</sup> in blocks per game (2.40), 5<sup>th</sup> in rebounds per game (19.2), 8<sup>th</sup> in assists per game (9.1), 8<sup>th</sup> in points per game (42.4), and 9<sup>th</sup> in 3FGM per game (4.6).

### HUSTLIN' HAWKS

The Atlanta Hawks are among the league-leaders in multiple hustle categories ... Per NBA.com's advanced stats, Atlanta ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in loose balls recovered per game (9.9), 8<sup>th</sup> in deflections per game (14.6) and 15<sup>th</sup> in charges drawn per game (0.57) ... Kent Bazemore is t13<sup>th</sup> in loose balls recovered per game (1.6), t28<sup>th</sup> in deflections per game (2.5) and t35<sup>th</sup> in total charges drawn (six) ... DeAndre' Bembry ranks t9<sup>th</sup> in total deflections (153).

### DRAFT NIGHT 2018 - THREE FIRST ROUNDERS

On Draft night 2018, the Hawks acquired No. 5 overall pick Trae Young and a protected 2019 first-round pick from Dallas in exchange for No.3 overall pick Luka Doncic ... Later in the first round, Atlanta chose Maryland's Kevin Huerter with the 19th overall selection and Villanova's Omari Spellman with the 30th pick.

### ROOKIE OF THE MONTH – TWICE AS NICE

Trae Young has been selected as the Kia NBA Rookie of the Month twice this season (Oct./Nov. and Jan.), becoming the first Hawks player to receive the award multiple times since Al Horford in 2007-08 (Nov., Feb., March) ... In October/November, the University of Oklahoma product led Eastern Conference rookies in points, assists and free-throws, and compiled an NBA-rookie-high seven contests with at least 10 points and 10 assists ... In January, Young averaged an Eastern Conference rookie-leading 18.7 points and 7.2 assists per game, and became the first rookie to average at least 18.0 points and 7.0 assists in 10-or-more games in any month since John Wall in March of 2011.

### OMARI GOES BACK-TO-BACK

On 11/7 vs. NYK, rookie Omari Spellman recorded the first double-double of his career, tallying career-highs of 18 points (6-11 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 3-3 FTs), 10 rebounds and three blocks in 28 minutes ... Spellman secured a double-double in consecutive games when he scored 14 points (5-10 FGs, 2-5 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) and grabbed 10 rebounds against the Pistons on 11/9.

### FIRST-YEAR FIRST-ROUNDERS DOUBLE UP

The Hawks' three first-round draft picks from 2018 – Trae Young, Kevin Huerter and Omari Spellman – have each recorded at least one double-double this season ... Per the Elias Sport Bureau, Young (17 double-doubles), Spellman (four) and Huerter (one) are the club's first rookie trio to accomplish the feat since John Drew, Tom Henderson and Mike Sojourner pulled it off in 1974.

### TRAE & KEV'S EXCELLENT DECEMBER

Rookies Kevin Huerter and Trae Young were among the top players in the 2018 Eastern Conference draft class in December ... Young led his conference classmates in assists per game (7.0), total steals (14) and total free throws (44), and was 2<sup>nd</sup> in points per game (15.8) ... Young's four point/assist double-doubles and four contests with at least two steals also led the class ... Huerter's .400 3FG% led first-year players in the East with at least 10 3FGM, he was 2<sup>nd</sup> in 3FGM per game (2.2), 2<sup>nd</sup> in total steals (12), 4<sup>th</sup> in points per game (11.3), 4<sup>th</sup> in assists per game (2.8) and 5<sup>th</sup> in steals per game (0.92).

### THE YOUNG GUNS

Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Kevin Huerter and Trae Young are the first pair of Hawks rookies to record back-to-back contests with at least four three-pointers made ... Young accomplished the feat first, knocking down four 3FGs on 10/19 at Memphis and following up with six three's on 10/21 at Cleveland ... Huerter made four from beyond-the-arc on 12/12 at Dallas before converting five long-range attempts on 12/14 at Boston ... In total, Huerter has knocked down at least five three-pointers on five different occasions this season, making him the only rookie with five games with at least five three-pointers in 2018-19 ... Young has compiled two contests with at least five 3FGM, making the first-year Hawks the only rookie teammates with multiple games knocking down five-or-more from long distance this season.

### SWISHIN' AND DISHIN'

On 11/19 vs. the LA Clippers, Trae Young finished with 25 points and a then-NBA season-high 17 assists ... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Young became the fourth rookie in NBA history to record at least 25 points and 17 assists in a game and the first since Jason Kidd on 3/13/95 ... He is the third Hawk to have 25 points and 17 assists in a single game at any point during their career (Johnny Davis 2/27/83, Lenny Wilkens 1/20/68).

### A NIGHT LIKE NO OTHER

On 11/3 vs. Miami, Trae Young tallied 24 points, 15 assists, six rebounds and one block in 31 minutes ... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Young became the first rookie in NBA history to record those minimums and knock down at least two three-pointers in the same game ... Young's 15 assists tied an NBA season-high at the time and marked the highest single-game total of his career to that point.

### DOUBLE-DOUBLE DOUBLE-DIP

Hawks 2018 first-round NBA Draft Picks Trae Young and Omari Spellman have each recorded back-to-back double-doubles this season ... Young completed a streak of three consecutive point/assist double-doubles from 11/1-6 and Spellman compiled two straight point/rebound double-doubles on 11/7 and 11/9 ... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the last two Hawks rookies with streaks of at least two double-doubles in the same season were Josh Childress and Josh Smith in 2004-05.

### **TRAE SCORES 20-OR-MORE**

### **OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION**

On 1/15 vs. OKC, the Hawks scored 142 points and converted a season-high 56 field goals in 90 attempts to finish with a season-best field goal percentage of .622 ... For the first time in franchise history, Atlanta finished a game with two 45-point quarters (second and fourth) ... The 142 points were the club's highest point total in a regulation contest since a 146-115 victory over the Raptors on 12/2/09 ... The Hawks' 56 FGM were the most for an Atlanta team since making 56 baskets on 4/19/97 vs. Philadelphia.

### **DEADEYE DEDMON**

On 12/16 at Brooklyn, Dewayne Dedmon was a perfect 5-5 from three-point land, as he scored a career-high 24 points (8-12 FGs, 3-4 FTs) and grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds to secure his third double-double of the season ... Per STATS LLC, Dedmon became the first player in NBA history to produce a stat line that includes a perfect night from behind the arc and at least eight field goals made, five three-point makes, 12 rebounds, three assists and a steal ... Dedmon is one-of-two centers to record multiple contests with at least five 3FGM this season (Brook Lopez).

### **A SP'LEN'DID NIGHT**

On 10/30 at Cleveland, Alex Len shot a perfect 9-9 from the field, including 1-1 3FGs, on his way to a season-high 22 points, nine rebounds, two steals and two blocked shots in 27 minutes ... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Len became the first player since the three-point line was established (1979-80) to record at least 22 points, nine boards, nine FGM, two steals, two blocks and one 3FGM on a perfect shooting night.

### **DEWAYNE'S DOUBLE-DOUBLE**

On 10/27 vs. Chicago, Dewayne Dedmon finished with 13 points (5-10 FGs, 1-3 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) and 13 rebounds to secure his first double-double of the season ... He added five blocks in 27 minutes off the bench ... Dedmon became the third player since the 1985-86 season to record at least 13 points, 13 rebounds, five blocks, and one 3FG off the bench, and is the first player to accomplish the feat in less than 30 minutes of action.

### **GRAND OPENING FOR BAZE AND DRE'**

Kent Bazemore and DeAndre' Bembry set or tied multiple career-highs when the Hawks opened State Farm Arena with a 111-104 victory over Dallas on 10/24 ... Bazemore drained a career-best 12 shots from the field on his way to scoring a career-high 32 points ... Bembry notched the first double-double of his career, as he paired a career-high 16 rebounds with 11 points, and added five assists, two steals and a block ... Bembry became the fourth Hawk ever to record those minimums and knock down at least one three-pointer in a single game.

### **IT'S RAINING THREES**

On 10/21 in Cleveland, the Hawks set a franchise record with 22 three-pointers ... For the first time in Hawks history, three rookies drained at least three three-pointers in the same game ... Trae Young knocked in six, followed by Omari Spellman who scored four, and Kevin Huerter who hit three triples ... Kent Bazemore added four three-pointers and DeAndre' Bembry converted a career-high three 3FGs ... The club shot 22-47 (.468) from deep.

### **IN ELITE COMPANY**

At Cleveland on 10/21, rookie Trae Young compiled a stat line which included 35 points, 11 assists and six 3FGM ... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Young became the first player in Hawks history with those single-game totals and joined Steph Curry as the only rookies in NBA history to compile that combination of points, assists and 3FGM in a single game ... He accomplished the feat in his third career game, becoming the first player in NBA history to record a 35-point/10-assist game within his first 10 NBA contests ... Young became the eighth first-year player to score 35 points and hand out 11 helpers in one game, joining Michael Jordan, LeBron James, Steph Curry, Oscar Robertson, Allen Iverson, Sherman Douglas and Kelvin Ransey.

### **YOUNG AND CARTER - THE STARTERS**

Twenty-year vet Vince Carter and rookie Trae Young each received their first starts as Hawks on 10/17 at New York ... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, their age difference of 21 years and 236 days is the second-largest age disparity among starting teammates since starters were recorded in 1970-71 ... The largest disparity was between another set of Hawks starters, Kevin Willis and Josh Smith, who had a difference of 23 years and 90 days when they started against Chicago on 4/16/05.

### **BEST BIRTHDAY EVER FOR NEW HEAD COACH**

After climbing the NBA coaching ladder through stints in Philadelphia, Memphis, Golden State and Cleveland, Lloyd Pierce was named the 13th head coach in Hawks history on his 42nd birthday, May 11, 2018 ... Last season, the defensive-minded Santa Clara University grad helped guide the Sixers' defense to the league's top spot in field goal percentage defense, the number two ranking in three-point percentage allowed, and the third-best defensive rating in the NBA.

### **YOUTH WILL BE SERVED**

Atlanta entered 2018-19 with 10 players who have two years or less of NBA experience ... Atlanta finished last season with the league's fourth-least experienced roster (3.31 years of experience) and currently sports a 17-man roster (including two-way contracts) with 3.65 years of experience – a figure that drops to 2.63 years with the exclusion of 20-year vet Vince Carter.

### **OLD MAN GAME**

On 12/29 vs. Cleveland, Vince Carter surpassed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the oldest player in NBA history to lead or tie for the team lead in scoring (41 years, 337 days), pouring in a season-high 21 points in 23 minutes ... Carter tied season-highs with seven FGM and four 3FGM.

## VC25K

On 11/21, with a season-high 14 points, Vince Carter became the 22<sup>nd</sup> player all time to eclipse 25,000 points in their career ... The 25,000<sup>th</sup> point was scored on a slam dunk in the final seconds of the fourth quarter.

## THE ULTIMATE TEAMMATE

Over his 21 seasons in the NBA, Vince Carter has shared his knowledge with more teammates than anyone in NBA History ... With the game in New York on 10/17, Carter has played with 240 teammates, passing Juwan Howard who played with 237 teammates over his career.

## BUCKETS AND DIMES

Trae Young recorded 24 points (11-19 FGs) and 10 assists on 12/12 at Dallas, marking the eighth double-double of his rookie campaign and his fifth contest with at least 20 points and 10 helpers this season ... Young became the second-youngest player in NBA history to record five 20-point/10-assist games (LeBron James) ... Young accomplished the feat in 27 career games, the quickest since Damon Stoudamire in 1995-96 (11 games).

## TRAE-IN-A-ROW

On 11/6 at Charlotte, Trae Young recorded his third straight point/assist double-double (18 points and 10 assists) ... Young is the first Hawks rookie to reach this milestone and the first player to have three straight point/assist double-doubles in his first 10 career games since John Wall in 2010.

## TRAE SCORES 10 OR MORE

First-year point guard Trae Young scored at least 10 points his first 13 contests this season, becoming the first Hawks rookie to score in double digits in each of his first 13 career games, per the Elias Sports Bureau ... Young passed Dominique Wilkins (nine games) and John Drew (eight games) to take the top spot on the list.

## BUCKETS AND BOARDS

Second-year big man John Collins recorded six straight point/rebound double-doubles from 12/18-12/31 and 11/30-12/14, the longest double-double streaks of his career ... Collins became the youngest Hawks player to record six consecutive contests with at least 10 points and 10 rebounds since a 20-year-old John Drew did it in December 1974 ... Over the six-game stretch from 11/30-12/14, the Wake Forest product averaged 21.7 points and 13.2 rebounds on .583 FG% (56-96) and eclipsed 1,000 career points with his 11-point outing against the Celtics on 12/14.

## JOHN'S DECEMBER DOMINATION

John Collins averaged 21.3 points and 12.8 rebounds for the month of December, becoming the second Hawk ever to average at least 21.0 points and 12.5 rebounds in a month (Kevin Willis – Feb. '92 and March '94) ... Collins became the first Hawk with a 20-point/10-rebound month since Paul Millsap in December 2013 ... The last five 20/10 occurrences are listed here:

The Hawks scored 42 points in the first quarter on 1/23 at Chicago and have scored 40-or-more points in a quarter 10 times this season ... The last time the Hawks had at least 10 40-point periods in a season was 1972-73 (10 quarters).

### **TRAE THE CLOSER**

At Phoenix on 2/2, Trae Young scored 17 points (6-10 FGs, 3-5 3FGs, 2-3 FTs) in the fourth quarter ... Young became the first Hawks rookie to score 17 points in the final frame since Marvin Williams on 12/20/05 at Miami.

### **“FOUREVER” YOUNG**

On 10/17 at New York, four Atlanta rookies (Jaylen Adams, Kevin Huerter, Omari Spellman and Trae Young) made their NBA regular-season debuts ... The last time the Hawks had four first-year players appear in a season opener was 10/25/85 against Washington (Lorenzo Charles, Jon Koncak, Sedric Toney and Spud Webb).

### **IRON MAN**

Georgia Radio and Atlanta Sports Hall of Famer Steve Holman is in 34<sup>th</sup> season as the “Voice of the Hawks,” having never missed a broadcast, a span of over 2600 games ... His play-by-play streak, which began in March of 1989, is currently at 2557, including regular season and playoffs.

### **ON THE AIR**

FOX Sports Southeast is televising all 82 Hawks regular season games in 2018-19 ... Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins is in his 10<sup>th</sup> year as the game analyst with play-by-play man Bob Rathbun in his 23<sup>rd</sup> season ... On Nov. 8, Rathbun was announced as a member of Hampton Roads Sports Media Hall of Fame’s class of 2019 ... On the radio side, Steve Holman is back for his 34<sup>th</sup> year calling every game on 92-9 The Game.

### **STATE FARM ARENA**

On Aug. 29, the Atlanta Hawks Basketball Club and State Farm announced a 20-year collaboration that will benefit the Atlanta metropolitan area aimed at building stronger communities through mentorship, volunteerism and the principle of being a good neighbor. A nationally-renowned company and one of Georgia’s top employers, State Farm will join forces with the Hawks, displaying their iconic red logo and marks atop and throughout the best sports and live entertainment venue in Atlanta - the new State Farm Arena - and building new community engagement programs and philanthropic initiatives. Following a three-game road trip to open the season, the Hawks will return home to open the all-new State Farm Arena in downtown Atlanta on Oct. 24 against Dallas ... The state-of-the-art facility completed a \$192.5 million transformation in October and lays claim to the NBA’s third-largest scoreboard, Topgolf’s first swing suites in a major sports arena and Atlanta statesman Killer Mike’s SWAG Shop (a four-chair barbershop overlooking the court) ... The venue was also the first in the league to announce fan-friendly food pricing, with a menu including 12 food and beverage items priced at \$5 or less.

### **SCHEDULE NOTES:**

All of Atlanta’s Monday-through-Saturday home games will feature 7:30 p.m. tip times, with the exception of the home opener on Oct. 24 (7 p.m.), Monday, Jan. 21 vs. Orlando (3 p.m.), Saturday, Feb. 23 vs. Phoenix (7 p.m.), Saturday, March 9 vs. Brooklyn (7 p.m.) and Wednesday, April 10 vs. Indiana (8 p.m.). Sunday game times will vary. Atlanta faces each Eastern Conference team four times, except for Toronto and Detroit (two home/one road), as well as Brooklyn and Cleveland (one home/two road), and every Western Conference opponent twice. The Hawks play 20-of-41 home games on weekends (five Friday, nine Saturday, six Sunday). The Hawks play 12 sets of back-to-backs, including three home/home, three road/home and six road/road. The busiest month of the home schedule is March (10 games), while the Hawks will play nine contests away from home in January. The longest road trip of the year is a seven-game run from Jan. 23-Feb. 4, covering Chicago, Portland, the LA Clippers, Sacramento, Utah, Phoenix and Washington.

**HEAD COACH LLOYD PIERCE**

Lloyd Pierce was named the 13<sup>th</sup> full-time Head Coach in Hawks history on May 11, 2018.

Pierce, 42, came to the Hawks following five years as an Assistant Coach with the Philadelphia 76ers, who finished last season third in the Eastern Conference with a 52-30 mark and advanced to the Eastern Conference Semifinals.

Under Pierce's guidance last season, the Sixers' defense led the NBA in field goal percentage defense (.434), ranked second in three-point percentage allowed (.342) and was third in defensive rating (102.0). Two Philadelphia players, Robert Covington (First Team) and Joel Embiid (Second Team), earned NBA All-Defensive selections.

Pierce joined the Sixers after two seasons with Memphis, where he was Assistant Coach-Player Development, helping lead the Grizzlies to back-to-back playoff appearances and the Western Conference Finals in 2013.

He spent the 2010-11 season as an Assistant Coach with the Golden State Warriors after three years as Assistant Coach-Player Development with Cleveland (2007-10), where the Cavaliers made three playoff appearances and a trip to the Eastern Conference Finals in 2009.

Prior to his NBA coaching career, Pierce was an Assistant Coach at his alma mater, Santa Clara University, from 2002-07. The San Jose, CA native played four seasons for the Broncos, where he teamed with two-time NBA MVP Steve Nash and current Assistant Coach, Marlon Garnett. Pierce graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Business Management in 1998.

He and his wife, Melissa, have a daughter, Maya Joy, born in August, 2018.
