## 2016-17 RECENT GAME RECAPS

**MIAMI HEAT 110, WASHINGTON WIZARDS 102 (4/12/17):** The HEAT completed the 2016-17 season with a, 110-102, win against the Washington Wizards in Miami. Marcin Gortat scored 10 points in the first as Washington took a four-point, 27-23, lead after one. Miami shot 55.6 percent in the second as they took a six-point, 56-50, lead into the half. The HEAT pushed their advantage to as many as 16 in the third before closing the quarter up 14, 91-77. Miami never let their lead drop below eight throughout the fourth as they closed out with the, 110-102, victory, thus giving them a .500 (41-41) record to end the season, becoming the first team in NBA history to be at least 19 games under .500 and reach the .500 mark that same season. Goran Dragić scored a game-high 28 points as Hassan Whiteside finished with a 24-point, 18-rebound double-double. Trey Burke led Washington with 27 points.

**MIAMI HEAT 124, CLEVELAND CAVALIERS 121 [OT] (4/10/17):** The HEAT won their 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive game against the Cavaliers in Miami after recording a, 124-121, overtime win vs. Cleveland. The Cavs shot 71.4 percent in the first, giving them a 13-point, 37-24, lead after one. Cleveland held an 11-point lead with 4:20 left in the second, but the HEAT went on a 15-4 run to tie it at 54 apiece at the 1:16 mark before the Cavaliers closed the half up four, 60-56. Deron Williams scored 29 points through three quarters, helping Cleveland to an 11-point, 91-80, lead entering the final quarter. Miami started the fourth on a 26-8 run to take a seven-point, 106-99, advantage before the Cavs went on a 9-2 run to close the fourth, sending the game into overtime. The HEAT was ahead for most of the extra quarter before Cleveland took a one-point lead with 34 seconds remaining. After two made Miami free throws, a missed Cavs jumper and two more made free throws, Miami had a three-point, 124-121, lead. On Cleveland's final possession with 13.6 seconds left, their missed game-tying three-attempt sealed the victory for the HEAT, 124-121. Tyler Johnson led Miami with 24 points, all off the HEAT bench, as Hassan Whiteside posted a 23-point, 18-rebound double-double. Williams led the Cavs with 35.

**MIAMI HEAT 106, WASHINGTON WIZARDS 103 (4/8/17):** On the second night of a back-to-back set on the road, the Miami HEAT went into Washington and recorded a, 106-103, win against the Wizards. Both teams shot 50 percent from the field in the first as Washington held a one-point, 29-28, lead after one. After four lead changes in the second, the game was tied at 52 heading into the break. Goran Dragić scored 10 points in the third, helping Miami to a four-point, 78-74, lead heading into the final quarter. With the game tied at 102 with 47.4 seconds remaining, a missed HEAT shot and foul on the defensive end, put John Wall on the line as he made 1-of-2. James Johnson then scored on a finger roll with 11.9 seconds on the clock, giving Miami a one-point, 104-103, advantage. After a Washington timeout, the HEAT stole the inbounds pass and made both free throws after being fouled. The Wizards, down three with 9.7 seconds on the clock, had their game-tying three-point attempt blocked as Miami took the, 106-103, win. Hassan Whiteside posted a 30-point, 12-rebound double-double as Markieff Morris led Washington with 21.

**TORONTO RAPTORS 96, MIAMI HEAT 94 (4/7/17):** The Raptors secured a two-point, 96-94, win against the visiting Miami HEAT in Toronto. DeMar DeRozan scored 16 points in the first, helping the Raptors take a seven-point, 26-19, lead after one. Toronto pushed their lead to as many as 18 in the second before closing the half up 10, 53-43. Hassan Whiteside posted seven points and four boards in the third as Miami cut the Raptors lead to five, 70-65, heading into the final quarter. The HEAT got within one point twice in the fourth and even tied the game at 82 apiece, but could never take the lead as Toronto closed out the two-point, 96-94, win. James Johnson led Miami with 22 points as DeRozan finished with 38.

**MIAMI HEAT 112, CHARLOTTE HORNETS 99 (4/5/17):** In the first of a three-game road trip, the Miami HEAT opened with a, 112-99, win against the Hornets in Charlotte. Miami connected on six three-point field goals in the first as they took a four-point, 27-23, lead after one. Charlotte shot 52.6 percent from the field in the second, helping cut the HEAT lead down to just one, 52-51, at the break. Miami held a two-point advantage at the 9:14 mark in the third before going on a 14-0 run to put the HEAT up 16 with 5:29 remaining in the quarter as they closed out the stanza with a 13-point, 86-73, lead. The Hornets cut it to eight two minutes into the fourth, but Miami quickly pushed it back to double-digits, and kept it there the rest of the way, as they recorded the, 112-99, victory. Goran Dragić scored a game-high 33 points as Hassan Whiteside posted a 13-point, 20-rebound double-double that also included a game-high three blocks. Nicolas Batum led the Hornets with 24 points.

**QUICK HITS:**

- Miami held opponents to under 50 percent from the field in 67-of-82 games this season.
- The HEAT finished 14-2 this season when shooting at least 50 percent from the field and 32-3 when leading entering the fourth quarter.
- The HEAT held opponents to just 8.02 fast break points per game at home, the best in the NBA.
- Miami players missed 328 games due to injury/illness this season, the most in the NBA.

**THE SECOND HALF:** After starting the season 11-30 (.268), the HEAT went 30-11 (.732) in the second half of the season. Miami finished 41-41 (.500), becoming the first team in NBA history to have been at least 19 games under .500 and reach the .500 mark at any point during the same season. Additionally, the HEAT's 41 victories were the most in league history by a team that was previously at least 19 games under .500 that same season. Below are the most wins by teams that were at least 19 games under .500.

**BOARDS AND REJECTIONS:** Hassan Whiteside led Miami in rebounds in 75 games this season, the most by a HEAT player for a single-season in team history, surpassing the previous high of 59 games set by Rony Seikaly during the 1991-92 campaign. He also capped the season leading the team in boards in 35-straight games, the longest such streak in franchise history. Whiteside averaged an NBA-leading 14.1 rebounds and 2.09 blocks this season. According to STATS, he became just the fourth player since 2000-01 to average at least 14.0 rebounds and 2.00 blocks, joining DeAndre Jordan (2014-15), Dwight Howard (2011-12, 2010-11, 2007-08) and Ben Wallace (2002-03).

**MOST IMPROVED:** James Johnson surpassed his career highs in many categories this season, including points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks, field goals made, three-point field goals made and free throws made. His improvement this season was the largest in the NBA when factoring in points, rebounds and assists per game averages from last season to this season, nobody in the league improved more than him. According to STATS, below are the largest points+rebounds+assists per game improvement from last season to this season in the NBA.

**GETTING DEFENSIVE:** James Johnson was in isolation defensive situations 53 times this season. Among those 53, he gave up just 22 percent (9-of-41) shooting to the player he was guarding, the second-lowest percentage in the entire league by players with at least 53 isolation situations. Additionally, Johnson gave up just 0.49 points per isolation possession (26 total points), the second-lowest among all players in the NBA with at least 53 isolation situations.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLES:** Hassan Whiteside totaled 58 double-doubles this season, the most for a single-season in team history. His 58 double-doubles came in 77 games played, which equals to 75.3 percent of games in which he posted a double-double, the highest single-season percentage in franchise history. Additionally, Whiteside has recorded 121 double-doubles as a member of the HEAT, already tying the fourth-most in franchise history with Dwyane Wade. **CLEANING THE GLASS:** Hassan Whiteside grabbed double-figure rebounds in 19 consecutive games from 2/11 – 3/26, the longest double-figure rebound streak in team history. He recorded double-figure rebounds 66 times this season, also the single-season franchise record. **FOLLOW THE LEADER:** Hassan Whiteside grabbed 1,088 total rebounds this season, marking the most for a single-season in team history, surpassing the previous record of 934 which was set by Rony Seikaly back during the 1991-92 season. Additionally, Whiteside grabbed 30.4 percent of all of Miami's rebounds this season, that's the highest percentage by any player as a member of the HEAT. Below are the most single-season rebounds in franchise history and the highest percentage of boards grabbed by a player during a single-season as a member of the HEAT.

**SELLING OUT:** Miami sold out every game this season and has currently sold out 335-straight overall games, which includes both the regular season and playoffs, the 10<sup>th</sup>-longest sellout streak in NBA history. Next on the NBA all-time list is the Sacramento Kings with their 354-game sellout streak from 11/26/99 – 4/18/07. Both Miami's 335 overall streak and their 279-game regular season sellout streak are the longest in franchise history. Additionally, 236 of those 335 overall sellouts have been at over capacity, where fans have purchased Standing Room Only tickets in the Upper 400 Level, including 73 times over the last three seasons. **HOT FROM DOWNTOWN:** The HEAT connected on double-figure three-point field goals 38 times this season, the most for a single-season in team history. Miami also hit 808 total three's this season, again the most for a single-season in franchise history. Additionally, eight different HEAT players connected on at least 70 three-pointers this season, tying the most in the NBA. According to STATS, below are the most double-figure and made threes for a single-season in team history.

**BEYOND THE ARC:** The HEAT connected on a franchise-high 808 three-point field goals this season, accounting for 28.7 percent of their total points. That marks as the highest percentage of points coming from three-point range in franchise history. Additionally, they hit 21 three-point field goals on 4/5 at CHA, the most during a single-game in team history. Below are the highest percentage of points from downtown in team history.

**BALANCED:** Miami had eight players averaging at least 10 points a game this season, the most in the NBA. Goran Dragic (20.3), Hassan Whiteside (17.0), Dion Waiters (15.8), Tyler Johnson (13.7), James Johnson (12.8), Justise Winslow (10.9), Wayne Ellington (10.5) and Josh Richardson (10.2) all reached the mark. **LOCKING DOWN THE FOURTH:** The HEAT gave up 24.06 points per game in the fourth quarter this season. That was the third-lowest average in the entire NBA. Additionally, Miami's fourth quarter defense held opponents to 42.7 percent shooting in the fourth, also the third-lowest in the league and their 31.6 percent from three-point range was the fifth-lowest. Below were the least amount of points given up in the fourth quarter and the lowest shooting percentages allowed in the final quarter this season.

**SIXTH MEN:** Tyler Johnson averaged 13.7 points per game this season, the second-highest average in the NBA by a player with no starts. He totaled 1,002 points, 293 rebounds and 233 assists while James Johnson totaled 884 points, 341 rebounds and 248 assists off the bench, making them as the only two players in the entire NBA to score at least 600 points, grab 250 rebounds and dish out 200 assists off the bench this season. Additionally, Tyler finished among on HEAT's all-time single-season scoring list by a player without a single start. **TRIPPIN:** The HEAT recorded victories at DEN on 11/30 and then at UTA on 12/1, marking the first time in team history they have beaten both DEN and UTA in consecutive days on the road and just the third time in their history they have recorded wins at DEN and at UTA in the same season. Miami previously accomplished the feat during the 2000-01 and 1997-98 seasons. Additionally, according to STATS, the last team to defeat both DEN and UTA on the road in consecutive days (either order) was BOS during the 2003-04 season, since then teams were a combined 0-32 trying to accomplish the feat prior to Miami successfully completing it.

**COACH OF THE MONTH:** HEAT Head Coach Erik Spoelstra earned NBA Eastern Conference Coach of the Month honors for February after leading the team to an 8-3 (.727) monthly record, which was their highest winning percentage for any month since February 2014 (.900). Miami averaged 110.3 points per game in February, the second-highest scoring month in team history. The HEAT scored at least 100 points in 10-of-11 games, including the first 10 consecutive games to begin the month to give them a team-record 16-straight 100-point scoring games dating back to January 21.

**400:** HEAT Head Coach Erik Spoelstra recorded the 400<sup>th</sup> victory of his career on 10/26 at ORL. He joins Pat Riley as the only Miami coaches to achieve the 400-win mark. Spoelstra also became just the second active head coach in the entire NBA to record his 400<sup>th</sup> win with their current team, Gregg Popovich was the first with the Spurs. Additionally, Spoelstra earned his 400<sup>th</sup> victory in his 641<sup>st</sup> career game, becoming the seventh-fastest coach in NBA history to accomplish the feat. The themed, interactive, carnival-like celebration took place on Saturday, March 18 in which HEAT players, coaches, celebrities and families came together for a day of fun, family and feasting. This year's MIAMI MADE themed event recognized the people, places, sights and sounds that define Miami and how South Florida is inextricably linked to the HEAT which included live music, family activities, food representing over 40 of South Florida's finest restaurants and a silent auction with the entire Miami HEAT team and coaching staff. This year's event raised \$554,245.

**PLAYER TICKET PROGRAM:** One of the most generous and trend-setting programs in the NBA, the Miami HEAT's Community Player Ticket Outreach Program spent the entire 2016-17 regular season reaching out to children and youth less fortunate who typically would only dream of watching a HEAT game live. **ERIK SPOELSTRA** (Portland), Head Coach

**Regular Season Coaching Record:** 440-282, currently in 9<sup>th</sup> Season

Erik Spoelstra, completed his ninth season as head coach of the HEAT and his 22<sup>nd</sup> as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering seven postseason appearances, five division titles, four conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013.

In his previous eight seasons at the helm, Spoelstra already made his mark on the HEAT record book. He currently holds the postseason franchise records in victories (70), winning percentage (.619), series won (15) and postseason games coached (113) on Miami's all-time list. In regular season play, he finished this past season ranked first in winning percentage (.623) on Miami's all-time list and second in victories (399) and games coached (640).

Since replacing Riley on the HEAT bench, Spoelstra has seen the expectations for the HEAT change dramatically from the time he was appointed head coach in 2008 until now. Throughout his tenure he has remained a steadying influence for his team and its paid huge dividends in return.

When he first took over the head coaching duties in 2008 he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. Two years later, after the summer of 2010 in which Miami re-signed Dwyane Wade and acquired All-Stars LeBron James and Chris Bosh, he found himself coaching a highly-talented, veteran group that was the most scrutinized team in the NBA. Spoelstra and his team have proven they are up for the challenge as he guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley.

Spoelstra joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season. That streak keyed an 11-2 record in February for Miami which saw Spoelstra earn Coach of the Month honors for the third time in his career.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines in four of the last five offseasons to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. He and his wife, Nikki, reside in Coconut Grove.
