HEAD COACH LUKE WALTON

- In third season with Los Angeles
- Named Lakers head coach on April 29, 2016, becoming the 26th head coach in franchise history and the 22nd since the team relocated to L.A. in 1960
- Is the eighth individual to both play and coach the Lakers, joining George Mikan, Jim Pollard, Jerry West, Pat Riley, Earvin "Magic" Johnson, Kurt Rambis and Byron Scott
- Has been named Western Conference Coach of the Month once (November 2015) ... Served as Interim Head Coach of the Golden State Warriors for the first 43 games of the 2015-16 season, overseeing a 39-4 start to the year that included an NBA-record 24 consecutive wins to start the season ... Finished ninth in 2016 NBA Coach of the Year voting, despite his ineligibility for the award
- Posted career averages of 4.7 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game in 564 regular-season games in 10 seasons with the Los Angeles Lakers (2003-12) and Cleveland Cavaliers (2011-13)
- As a player, made the playoffs seven times, winning back-to-back NBA Championships with L.A. in 2009 and 2010
- Born March 28, 1980, Walton is the youngest head coach in the NBA at 38 years old
- Along with his wife, Bre, Walton has one son, Lawson, and one daughter, Landen

NEW ADDITIONS

A busy off-season for the Lakers included a host of key signings, highlighted by the below acquisitions:

- Four-time MVP and three-time NBA Champion LeBron James
- NBA Champion and three-time NBA assist leader Rajon Rondo
- Two-Time NBA Champion JaVale McGee
- Playoff veteran Lance Stephenson, who averaged 9.2 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists last season
- Michael Beasley, who shot 50.7% from the field last season, notching 13.2 points, 5.6 rebounds and 1.7 assists

OF ASSISTANCE

Three players on the Lakers roster averaged more than 7.0 assists last season: LeBron James (9.1), Rajon Rondo (8.2) and Lonzo Ball (7.2)

- James finished second in the NBA in assists per game and his 9.1 avg were a career high
- Rondo has averaged more than 7.0 assists in nine of his 12 NBA seasons, leading the NBA on three occasions
- Ball was the first Lakers rookie since Magic Johnson (7.3 avg) to notch more than 7.0 assists per game

2017-18 NOTES

KUZ WORLD IS THIS?

Kyle Kuzma hit more three-pointers this season than any Lakers rookie in franchise history (159).

- The 159 three-pointers are tied for 4th all-time among rookies. **The top 5:** Donovan Mitchell (187), Damian Lillard (185), Stephen Curry (166), Rudy Fernandez (159) and Kuzma (159)
- He ranked fifth in scoring among *Lakers rookies* (1,242) and 10th in rebounds (483)
- Kuzma became the first rookie in NBA history to tally at least 1,200 points, 450 rebounds and 150 threes
- Kobe Bryant is the only Laker to match those tallies in a season, doing so in 2007-08
- Three players in the NBA eclipsed those numbers this season: Kuzma, C. Anthony and K. Durant

KICKSTART MY HART

Josh Hart averaged 13.3 points (.496 FG%), 6.0 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 23 games as a starter.

- Hart scored a career-high 30 points in the season finale, shooting 7-of-9 from three-point range
- The rookie finished with eight double-doubles on the season, including six as a starter
- He scored 20+ points in each of the last four games of the season

INGRAM IGNITES

Brandon Ingram finished with 21 points (10-16 FG), 10 rebounds, six assists and three blocks on 2/26 at Atlanta.

- Ingram, Pau Gasol, Kobe Bryant and Shaquille O'Neal are the only Lakers to match those numbers in a game since the 1999-2000 season
- He joined Kevin Durant, LeBron James and Lamar Odom as the only players to do so at the age of 20 or younger

KCP FOR 3

Kentavious Caldwell-Pope hit a career-high-tying eight three's on 2/24 at Sacramento, and again on 3/22 at New Orleans

- KCP joins Jordan Clarkson, Nick Young, D'Angelo Russell, Jordan Farmer, Kobe Bryant, Glen Rice and Nick Van Exel as Lakers to net eight three pointers
- He becomes just the fourth Laker to match the feat on the road (Young, Bryant, Van Exel)
- Bryant holds the overall franchise record with 12 3PM, also hitting nine three-pointers on three occasions (once on the road)

PROSPERING IN THE PAINT

Scoring in the interior has been a strong suit for the Lakers this season.

- The team finished third in points in the paint this season, with 51.9 per game
- The Lakers scored 60+ points in the paint 18 times this season, including a franchise-record 82 on 12/31 at HOU

FAST AND FURIOUS 17.5

L.A. ranked second in the NBA in fast break points per game this season with 17.5 (Golden State - 19.3 FBP).

- The Lakers scored 42 FBP on 1/7 vs. Atlanta, tying the franchise record that was originally set on 11/16/97 vs. Vancouver (recorded since 1996-97)
- Netting 35 FBP on 1/9 vs. Sacramento, it was the first time a Lakers team has scored 35+ in two straight games

LOTS OF LONZO

Lonzo Ball notched his second career triple-double on 11/19 vs. DEN with 11 points, 16 rebounds, 11 assists and two blocks.

- He was the first rookie guard with at least 16 rebounds since Steve Francis in 2000. That was also the last time a rookie guard went for a triple-double with 16+ boards.
- Eight guards have recorded a triple-double with at least 16 rebounds since the '99-00 season: Lonzo Ball, Russell Westbrook, James Harden, Rajon Rondo, Jason Kidd, Vince Carter, Andre Iguodala and Steve Francis
- Ball tied LeBron James for youngest NBA player to record multiple triple-doubles, as each player was 20 years and 23 days old when recording their second

BALL OUT

On 11/11 at MIL, Lonzo Ball became the youngest player since LeBron James to record a triple-double, at 20 years and 15 days old.

- He is the youngest Laker ever Magic Johnson previously held the Lakers record for youngest at 20 years and 75 days
- Ball went for 19 points, 13 assists, 12 rebounds, 3 blocks and 3 steals, a line matched by only Magic Johnson and Larry Bird

ZO TIME

Lonzo Ball finished with 29 points, 11 rebounds and 9 assists on 10/20 at PHX, becoming the youngest player in NBA history to notch 29-11-9 in a single game.

- Since the 1983-84 season, three players have gone for at least 29-11-9 at the age of 21 or younger: Lonzo Ball, LeBron James (5x) and Michael Jordan
- Ball is the first rookie to put up those numbers since Blake Griffin in 2011, and joins Griffin, Jason Kidd, Larry Johnson, Chuck Person and Michael Jordan as the only first-year players to do so since '83-84
- The 29 points were the most by a Lakers rookie in the first or second game of their career since at least 1963, surpassing the 26 points that Magic Johnson tallied in his debut
- Ball became the first player since Oscar Robertson (1960) to post at least 25 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in his first NBA road game

KUZMA KLAUS

Kyle Kuzma scored 31 points (8-18 FG, 6-11 3FG) on 12/25 vs. Minnesota, the most points ever by a Lakers rookie on Christmas Day.

- Kuzma was the first rookie to score 30+ points on Christmas since LeBron James (34) in 2003
- His six three-pointers made are tied with Ryan Anderson (2011) and Kevin Love (2017) for most 3PM on Christmas
- He's one of seven Lakers to score 30+ on Christmas (since 1963): Kyle Kuzma, Kobe Bryant (5x), Shaq (2x), James Worthy, Michael Cooper, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Jerry West (3x)

KYLE'S KOOKIN'

Kuzma went for 27 points (9-15 FG) and 14 rebounds on 12/22 at GSW, his third-straight game scoring at least 25 points.

- Kuzma was the first Lakers rookie to score 25+ in three straight games since Jerry West in 1960-61, joining West and Elgin Baylor as the only Lakers rookies to do so
- He notched a career-high 38 points on 12/20 at HOU and became the first rookie in NBA history to score at least 38 points, with seven-plus three-pointers, while shooting at least 70 percent from the field
- The rook recorded nine 20-and-10 games, most by a Lakers rookie since Magic Johnson in '79-80 (10)

KUZ DEBUTS

Forward Kyle Kuzma was named NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in October and November on 12/1.

- The Utah product was the first rookie in NBA history to notch at least 330 points, 120 rebounds and 30 made three-pointers in the first 20 games of his career
- He joins Jordan Clarkson (March 2015) as the only Lakers to earn the monthly award (first presented in 1981-82)
- Through 20 contests, Kuzma averaged a team-leading 16.7 points (.504 FG%, team-high .379 3P%), 6.1 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game

SEASON SUPERLATIVES

- Nov. 19, 2017: The Lakers dished out a season-best 36 assists versus Denver to defeat the Nuggets, 127-109
- Nov. 21, 2017: L.A. came back from a 19-point deficit against the Bulls, the team's largest comeback in a win this season. In the second half, L.A. outscored Chicago 61-38 while committing just a single team turnover
- Dec. 20, 2017: The Lakers knocked off the Western Conference-leading Rockets, 122-116, on the road. The L.A. win snapped a 14-game win streak for Houston
- Dec. 31, 2017: In a double-overtime thriller in Houston, the Lakers combined for a team record 82 points in the paint, the highest output by an NBA team this year.
- Jan. 7, 2018: The Lakers tied a franchise record with 42 fast break points - matching a mark that was first established in the 1997-98 season - to defeat Atlanta, 132-113
- Jan. 21, 2018: Los Angeles scored at least 30 points in all four quarters, the first occurrence for a Lakers team since February 2009.
- Feb. 23, 2018: In a matchup with Dallas, L.A. outrebounded the Mavericks by a 62-29 margin, marking the first time a Laker team has grabbed 60+ rebounds while giving up fewer than 30 boards since March 1994
- March 1, 2018: Against the HEAT, the team scored a season-best 73 points in the first half
- March 3, 2018: The Lakers connected on 15+ three-pointers for the fourth consecutive game, the longest streak in franchise history
- March 11, 2018: L.A. defeated Cleveland for their 30th win of the season, the most wins since the 2012-13 season (45)
- April 4, 2018: The Lakers swept the season series vs. San Antonio (3-0) for the first time since the 1997-98 season
