- Four-time NBA Most Valuable Player (2009, 2010, 2012, 2013)

LAST GAME: 18 points, 8 rebounds and 2 steals in 32 minutes vs. Atlanta

- NBA All-Rookie First Team selection in 2017-18
- First rookie in NBA history to tally at least 1,200 points, 450 rebounds and 150 threes
- His 159 three-pointers in 2017-18 set a Lakers rookie record and was fourth-most all-time among NBA rookies

LAST GAME: 8 points, 9 rebounds and 3 blocks in 27 minutes vs. Atlanta

- Ranks third in the NBA with 3.0 blocks per game
- On 10/20, became the first Laker since Kareem (1980) to tally 15+ points and 5+ blocks in 20 or fewer minutes
- Has shot at least 50 percent from the field in eight of his 10 professional seasons

LAST GAME: 10 points, 3 rebounds and 1 assist in 29 minutes vs. Atlanta

- Scored a season-high 24 points (9-18 FG) on 10/29 at Minnesota
- Averaged 16.1 points (.470 FG%), 5.3 rebounds and 3.9 assists in 2017-18
- Reached double-figures in 50-of-59 games last season

- Shooting 41.3 percent from three-point range this season

2018-19 Season Notes: This will be the third matchup between the Lakers and Portland this season ... L.A. fell to the Blazers in the first game of the season, 128-119 ... The Lakers defeated Portland in the last matchup on 11/3/18 (114-110), ending a 16-game losing streak to the Trail Blazers

All-Time Series Notes: Since 1989, the Lakers have won just five season series against the Trail Blazers (2012-13, 2011-12, 2010-11, 2004-05 and 1992-93) ... This will be the 226th meeting between the Trail Blazers and the Lakers, with Los Angeles leading the all-time

series 119-106 ... At STAPLES Center, the Lakers are 21-14 against the Trail Blazers all-time in the regular season ... In recent series history, during the 2011-12 season (2/20/12), the Lakers held the Trail Blazers to just seven first-quarter points, Portland's lowest first-quarter point total in their then-3,363-game history in the NBA ... That mark also matched the second-lowest point total allowed by the Lakers in the first quarter since the team moved to Los Angeles prior to the 1960-61 season

Los Angeles stole this one from Atlanta, 107-106. Down one with 20 seconds remaining, LeBron James was fouled and headed to the free throw line with a chance to give the Lakers the lead. After missing both, forward Kyle Kuzma got the rebound and came up short on the putback, but James cleaned up the miss with the go-ahead dunk with 15 seconds to play. Trae Young got an open look as time expired, but Tyson Chandler blocked the attempt to seal the win for the Lakers. Down by as many as 15 points in the third quarter, Atlanta fought back behind big performances from Young (20 points, 12 assists) and Kent Bazemore (20 points). LeBron James scored 26 points with seven rebounds, while Kuzma added 18 points and 8 rebounds. Stephenson and Rondo added 11 points off the bench, while Lonzo Ball handed out a season-high 11 assists with eight points and six rebounds.

HEAD COACH LUKE WALTON

- In third season with Los Angeles
- Named Lakers head coach on April 29, 2016, becoming the 26th head coach in franchise history and the 22nd since the team relocated to L.A. in 1960
- Is the eighth individual to both play and coach the Lakers, joining George Mikan, Jim Pollard, Jerry West, Pat Riley, Earvin "Magic" Johnson, Kurt Rambis and Byron Scott
- Has been named Western Conference Coach of the Month once (November 2015) ... Served as Interim Head Coach of the Golden State Warriors for the first 43 games of the 2015-16 season, overseeing a 39-4 start to the year that included an NBA-record 24 consecutive wins to start the season ... Finished ninth in 2016 NBA Coach of the Year voting, despite his ineligibility for the award
- Posted career averages of 4.7 points, 2.8 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game in 564 regular-season games in 10 seasons with the Los Angeles Lakers (2003-12) and Cleveland Cavaliers (2011-13)
- As a player, made the playoffs seven times, winning back-to-back NBA Championships with L.A. in 2009 and 2010
- Born March 28, 1980, Walton is the youngest head coach in the NBA at 38 years old
- Along with his wife, Bre, Walton has one son, Lawson, and one daughter, Landen

HART STOPPER

Josh Hart has recorded at least one steal in 16 consecutive games dating back to last season, the longest active streak in the NBA.

- Hart joins James Harden (13 games), Joe Ingles (13) and Chris Paul (12) as the only players with active streaks of 10 games or more
- Ranking 12th in the NBA in steals per game (1.7), Hart is one of 17 players with 20 or more steals this season. Of those 17, he is the only player to do so as a reserve
- Hart is first on the team in total plus/minus, sitting at a plus-50 on the year

FIRST 10

- LeBron James became the first player in Lakers history to total at least 265 points (268), 75 rebounds (76) and 75 assists (77) in his first 10 games with the team
- He joins James Harden, Russell Westbrook (2016-17), John Havlicek (1970-71) and Oscar Robertson (1961-63, '66-67) as the only players with those totals through their first 10 games of a season
- James - who also accomplished the feat in 2007-08 and 2011-12 - joins Robertson as the only player to do so in multiple seasons
- JaVale McGee blocked 34 shots through 10 games, the most by a player in their first 10 games since Miami's Hassan Whiteside (46) in 2015-16
- McGee's 34 blocks were the most by a Laker in the first 10 games of a season since Vlade Divac (36) in 1994-95
- Divac, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (52 blk, 1975-76; 35, '80-81) and Elmore Smith (81, '73-74) are the only Lakers to block 34 or more shots in their first 10 games of the season

Newly-acquired center Tyson Chandler currently ranks third on the NBA's career field goal percentage list (.596).

- Chandler is second among active NBA players and trails only Dallas center DeAndre Jordan and Hall of Famer Artis Gilmore on the all-time chart
- The Compton, CA, native led the NBA in shooting percentage in 2011-12 (.679), also finishing second in 2007-08 (.623)

LeBron James (35 pts, 11 reb) moved into sixth place on the NBA's all-time scoring list on 10/27 at San Antonio, passing Dirk Nowitzki to become the league's active leader.

- James also jumped Shaquille O'Neal in career field goals on 10/27, moving into sixth place on the all-time list and becoming the active leader
- His 30-point performance was the 432nd of his career, moving ahead of Kobe Bryant for fourth-most all-time

LEBRON AMONG THE NBA'S ALL-TIME SCORING LEADERS

Lakers forward LeBron James has scored **31,381** points throughout his 16-year career, ranking sixth on the NBA's all-time scoring list. The 14-time NBA All-Star is now the league's active leader in career points, moving ahead of the now-seventh-ranked Dirk Nowitzki with a one-legged fadeaway jump shot over Dante Cunningham at the 7:51 mark of the third quarter against San Antonio on 10/27/18. James now approaches the scoring mark of former Lakers star Wilt Chamberlain, whose 31,419 career points ranks fifth in NBA history. A four-time NBA Most Valuable Player, James eclipsed both the 30,000 and 31,000 scoring marks last season to join Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Karl Malone, Kobe Bryant, Michael Jordan, Chamberlain and Nowitzki as the only players in league history to achieve the milestones.

LeBron James recorded his first triple-double as a Laker and the 74th of his career on 10/25 vs. Denver, notching 28 points, 11 rebounds, 11 assists and 3 steals.

- It was his third triple-double in the STAPLES Center, after recording one each with Cleveland and Miami
- The game marked LeBron's fifth career triple-double against the Nuggets
- He's the first Laker since Kobe in 2014 to have a 20-point triple-double

LANCE-A-LOT

Lance Stephenson tallied 23 points (10-14 FG), 8 rebounds, 8 assists and 2 steals in 25 minutes off the bench on 10/24 vs. Phoenix.

- He became the first player since Cedric Maxwell (3/31/88) to notch at least 23 points, 8 rebounds and 8 assists, while shooting at least 70% from the field as a reserve
- Magic Johnson (2/16/96) was the last Lakers reserve to match Stephenson's 23-8-8

ALL HAIL JAVALE

JaVale McGee notched 16 points, 6 rebounds and 5 blocks in 20 minutes of play on 10/20 vs. Houston.

- He became the first Laker since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (15 pts, 6 blk, 2/24/80 vs. Hou) to score 15 or more points and block 5 or more shots in 20 or fewer minutes of play

It was the second time that L.A. had three selections in the annual rookie/sophomore showcase (first since Kobe Bryant, Derek Fisher and Travis Knight in 1997). Kuzma finished with 20 points, seven rebounds and two assists, while Ingram tallied eight points, three rebounds, one assist and one steal. Ball did not participate due to injury.

KUZMA KLAUS

- Kyle Kuzma scored 31 points (8-18 FG, 6-11 3FG) on 12/25 vs. Minnesota, the most points ever by a Lakers rookie on Christmas Day.
- Kuzma was the first rookie to score 30+ points on Christmas since LeBron James (34) in 2003
 - His six three-pointers made are tied with Ryan Anderson (2011) and Kevin Love (2017) for most 3PM on Christmas

- Lonzo Ball notched his second career triple-double on 11/19 vs. DEN with 11 points, 16 rebounds, 11 assists and two blocks.
- He was the first rookie guard with at least 16 rebounds since Steve Francis in 2000. That was also the last time a rookie guard went for a triple-double with 16+ boards.
 - Eight guards have recorded a triple-double with at least 16 rebounds since the '99-00 season: Lonzo Ball, Russell Westbrook, James Harden, Rajon Rondo, Jason Kidd, Vince Carter, Andre Iguodala and Steve Francis
 - Ball tied LeBron James for youngest NBA player to record multiple triple-doubles, as each player was 20 years and 23 days old when recording their second

FREE THROW WOES

- L.A. allowed the fewest free throws made or attempted by an opponent in franchise history on Halloween Night, with Detroit finishing just 1-of-3 from the charity stripe.
- Prior to 10/31, a Lakers opponent had only made three or fewer free throws on three occasions
 - The three free throws attempted were also an opponent low, surpassing the previous low of four, when New Orleans was 4-of-4 on 2/5/11
 - At the time, it was the ninth occasion in NBA history in which a team converted just one free throw or less, and the first time since Golden State went 1-for-2 at Philadelphia on 1/30/16

KUZ DEBUTS

- Forward Kyle Kuzma was named NBA Western Conference Rookie of the Month for games played in October and November on 12/1.
- The Utah product was the first rookie in NBA history to notch at least 330 points, 120 rebounds and 30 made three-pointers in the first 20 games of his career
 - He joins Jordan Clarkson (March 2015) as the only Lakers to earn the monthly award (first presented in 1981-82)
 - Through 20 contests, Kuzma averaged a team-leading 16.7 points (.504 FG%, team-high .379 3P%), 6.1 rebounds and 1.6 assists per game

SEASON SUPERLATIVES

- Nov. 19, 2017: The Lakers dished out a season-best 36 assists versus Denver to defeat the Nuggets, 127-109
