LAST GAME: 10 points (3-4 FG, 2-3 3FG, 2-2 FT), 2 rebounds and 1 steal vs. HOU (4/7/24). **NOTES:** Jones Jr. recorded 24 points against NOP (1/13/24), tying the second-most points he has recorded in a game in his career which he notched earlier this season vs. OKC (12/2/23)...he has six 20-point games this season, triple his next most (2 w/ MIA, 2019-20).

LAST GAME: 14 points (5-12 FG, 2-7 3FG, 2-2 FT), 13 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 blocks vs. HOU (4/7/24). **NOTES:** Washington Jr. recorded his first double-double with the Mavs after a 14-point, 13-rebound effort at SAC (3/26/24)...recorded a Mavs-high with 32 points and a career-high five steals vs. GSW (4/5/24)...became the second player in Mavs history to record a game with at least 30 points, five steals and two blocks (Mark Aguirre vs. DEN, 12/5/87)...recorded back-to-back games with at least five 3-pointers for the second time in his career (5 vs. GSW, 4/5/24).

LAST GAME: 6 points (3-3 FG, 0-1 FT), 1 rebound and 1 block vs. HOU (4/7/24). **NOTES:** Gafford recorded 16 points and 17 rebounds in his second game with Dallas. His career-high 14 rebounds in the first half is the most rebounds in a half by a Maverick since 2018 (DeAndre Jordan, 14 vs. LAC, 12/2/18)...set the longest streak of made field goals in the play-by-play era with 33 after going 5-of-5 vs. GSW (3/13/24), the second-longest streak in NBA history.

LAST GAME: 48 points (15-25 FG, 3-8 3FG, 15-17 FT), 7 rebounds, 2 assists and 1 steal vs. HOU (4/7/24). **NOTES:** At POR (12/8/23), Irving's 44 points vs. NYK (1/11/24) is his Maverick career-high...became the second player in Mavericks history to record at least 40 points and 10 assists in a game (Luka Dončić)...recorded his second career game-winning buzzer beaters vs. DEN (3/17/24), the first in franchise history against a defending champion...notched his fourth dunk of the season vs. UTA (3/21/24), tying for his most since 2014-15.

LAST GAME: 37 points (12-21 FG, 4-10 3FG, 9-9 FT), 9 rebounds, 12 assists and 2 blocks vs. HOU (4/7/24). **NOTES:** Dončić notched 73 points at ATL (1/26/24) to set a new career-high and franchise record for single game scoring...He became the first player in NBA history to record five straight 35-point triple-doubles (35-11-11 vs. MIA, 3/7/24) and set an NBA record for the longest streak of 30-point triple-doubles in NBA history (6) after recording 39-10-10 (at DET, 3/9/24)...became the sixth player in NBA history to record 20 triple-doubles in a single season after a 30-12-11 performance at GSW (4/2/24)...set the single-season franchise record for most 3-pointers in a game (258, now 262) after his first 3 at GSW (4/2/24).

• **MAVS at HORNETS:** After beating the Rockets in Dallas (4/7/24), the Mavericks hit the road to face the Hornets on Tuesday, Apr. 9, at 6:00 PM CT on WFAA and UniMas. The Mavericks are 43-23 (.652) all-time against the Hornets franchise (23-11 at home, 20-12 on the road). The Mavericks are currently up in the 2023-24 season series 1-0, after recording a 124-118 win in Dallas (11/5/23). The Mavericks have won two of the last five, five of the last 10, 10 of the last 20 and 29 of the last 40 meetings. The Hornets won the 2022-23 season series, 2-0.

Washington Jr.** scored a game-high 32 points (12-18 FG, 5-8 3FG, 3-5 FT) to go along with 5 rebounds, 3 assists, 5 steals and 2 blocks. **Kyrie Irving** scored 26 points (9-19 FG, 2-7 3FG, 6-6 FT) to go along with 8 rebounds, 7 assists, 2 steals and 1 block. **Daniel Gafford** scored 10 points (5-7 FG, 0-2 FT) with 15 rebounds, 5 assists and 3 blocks. **Dante Exum** scored 11 points (5-8 FG, 1-2 3FG, 5-6 FT) to go along with 2 rebounds and 7 assists. Off the bench, **Tim Hardaway Jr.** recorded 13 points (4-13 FG, 1-7 3FG, 4-4 FT) to go along with 3 rebounds and 3 assists. **Luka Dončić**, **Josh Green**, **Maxi Kleber** and **Dereck Lively II** were inactive due to injury/illness. **Stephen Curry** led the Warriors with a team-high 28 points (9-23 FG, 5-14 3FG, 5-6 FT) with 6 rebounds, 5 assists and 1 steal, while **Klay Thompson** recorded 16 points to go along with 3 rebounds, 2 assists and 3 steals.

NOTES: There were 10 lead changes and 10 ties in the game. The Mavericks' largest lead was 16, while the Warriors' was four. In the 1st quarter, the Mavericks reached their largest lead of the game with a 16-point lead, 29-13, with 4:14 to go in the quarter. The Warriors outscored the Mavericks 32-31 in the quarter. In the 2nd quarter, the Warriors outscored the Mavericks 22-21 in the quarter to take a 54-52 lead into the half. In the 3rd quarter, the Warriors reached their largest lead with a four-point lead at the score 56-52 with 11:33 remaining in the half. The Mavericks outscored the Warriors 27-22 in the quarter en route to a three-point lead, 79-76, going into the final quarter. In the 4th quarter, the Warriors outscored the Mavericks 30-29 in the quarter and even brought the score to a tie at 106-106 with 13.0 seconds to go but Mavericks forward **P.J. Washington Jr.** scored the game-winning layup with 4.5 seconds to go en route to a 108-106 win in Dallas.

Team Notes:**vs. HOU; 4/7/24**

- The Dallas Mavericks beat the Houston Rockets in overtime 147-136, despite trailing by 22 points in the second quarter. The 22-point comeback tied for the seventh-largest comeback in franchise history for the Mavericks and the 11th time that the team has overcome a 22-or-more-point deficit. It was the first time since Dec. 22, 2017 that the team trailed by 15-or-more points after the first quarter and won.
- The Mavericks played in their first overtime game this season.
- With Kyrie Irving (48) and Luka Dončić (37), the Maverick duo notched their fourth game where the pair recorded at least 35 points each. The two surpassed the duo of Mark Aguirre and Rolando Blackman (3) for most games with at least 35 points in the same game in franchise history.
- Dallas recorded its 23rd clutch win of the season after winning in overtime against the Rockets. The Mavericks' record in the clutch this year is 23-9, which ties the Los Angeles Lakers for the best clutch record in the league this season.
- The Mavericks recorded their seventh straight win at home, which is the longest single-season streak since winning 11 games straight in 2018.
- With 147 points, the Mavericks tied for the sixth-most points scored in a game in franchise history. The team has recorded at least 147 points three total times this season after scoring 147 vs. UTA (12/6/23) and 148 at ATL (1/26/24).
- Dallas has recorded seven games this season with at least 140 points, which ties for the eighth-most games of such instances in a single season in NBA history. The Mavericks are 7-0 in every game they have recorded at least 140 points this season.

vs. GSW; 4/5/24

- With a win over GSW, the Mavericks are 13-2 over their last 15 games, the best 15-game stretch since the 2010-11 season when the Mavericks won the NBA title.

vs. ATL; 4/4/24

- The Mavs held the Hawks to just 95 points, which ties for the fewest points the Hawks have scored in a game this season (95 vs. CLE, 1/20/24). Dallas is 8-0 this season when holding their opponent to under 100 points.
- With 40 points in the second quarter, Dallas notched its 21st quarter this season with at least 40 points. This ties the Boston Celtics for most 40-point quarters in the NBA this season.
- Allowing just 14 points in the fourth quarter, the Mavericks tied the second-fewest points allowed in a quarter this season (12 vs. ORL, 1/29/24; 14 vs. SAS, 2/14/24).

vs. HOU; 3/31/24

- The Mavs beat the Rockets, 125-107, snapping Houston's 11-game win streak. It tied for the fourth-longest opposing win streak Dallas has snapped in franchise history.

vs. SAC; 3/26/24

- The Dallas Mavericks beat the Kings by a score differential of 36 points, marking the third-largest win margin the team has had against Sacramento in franchise history (40-point win margin, 11/12/88; 39, 1/14/12).
- The Mavs went 22-of-39 (.564) from beyond the arc against the Kings. The team's .564 3FG% is the most efficient the team has been from behind the arc this season.

vs. UTA; 3/21/24

- The Dallas Mavericks recorded 18 dunks in the 113-97 win against the Utah Jazz. The team's 18 dunks tied for the second-most in a game in NBA history (20, LAC, 12/21/19; 18, WAS, 12/1/21) as far back as the play-by-play era (1996-97).
- The Mavericks held the Jazz to under 100 points for the second time this season. The team is 6-0 when they hold their opponents to under 100 points, and alongside the Minnesota Timberwolves, Dallas is only one of two teams to hold Utah to under 100 points twice this season.
- Dallas recorded 62 paint points vs. UTA, the team's 10th time this season scoring 60-or-more points in the paint. The team is 9-1 this season when recording 60-plus points in the paint.

vs. DEN; 3/17/24

- The team notched their 39th win of the season against the defending champs, surpassing the 2022-23 win total the team had last season (38).
- The Mavericks had 21 offensive rebounds against the Nuggets, the most by the team in the last 10 years. The team's 59 total rebounds is a season-high (prev. 56 vs. WAS, 2/12/24).

vs. GSW; 3/14/24

- The Mavericks have held their opponent to under 100 points in consecutive games for the first time this season after holding GSW to under 100 (3/13/24) and CHI (3/11/24).
- The Mavericks made only six 3-pointers against GSW. This marked the first time in over six years where the team has won a game that they converted six-or-fewer 3-pointers (6 3-pointers, vs. TOR, 12/26/17).
- Holding the Warriors to just 15 points in the second quarter, the Mavericks' defense allowed the third-fewest points in any quarter this season in the second quarter tonight (12 points allowed, Q2, vs. ORL, 1/29/24; 14 PA, Q3, vs. SAS, 2/14/24).
- The Mavericks outscored the Warriors in the paint, 68-48. The team's 68 paint points mark the team's most paint points scored in a game this season. In the last five years, it ties for the third-most paint points recorded by Dallas (72 vs. MEM, 1/14/22; 70 vs. CLE, 11/22/19).
- The Mavericks had a season-high 13 blocks tonight, tied for the most blocks in a game the team has had within the last five years (13 vs. NOP, 3/4/20).

at CHI; 3/11/24

- The Mavericks had two players record 20+ points and went a combined 20-of-21 from the floor (Dereck Lively II, 22 points on 11-of-12 shooting; Daniel Gafford, 20 pts on 9-of-9 shooting). It marked the first time in Mavs history that Dallas had two players score 20+ points while combining for .950 or better from the field in the same game. The last pair of teammates to do so was New York's Nate Robinson (8-8 FG) and Wilson Chandler (11-12 FG) at MEM (11/12/08).

Individual Notes:

Luka Dončić:

- Luka Dončić recorded 37 points (12-21 FG, 4-10 3FG, 9-9 FT), nine rebounds, 12 assists and two blocks against the Rockets (4/7/24). With 37-9-12, Dončić tied Russell Westbrook for the fourth-most games of at least 30 points, five rebounds and 10 assists in NBA history.
- He set the franchise record for most 3-pointers in a single-season after his first 3-pointer at GSW (4/2/24) to reach 258 (now 262).
- With 30-12-11 at GSW (4/2/24), he notched his 76th career triple-double, tying James Harden for eighth-most triple-doubles in NBA history.
- With his 20th triple-double this season after 30-12-11 at GSW (4/2/24), he joins Oscar Robertson, Russell Westbrook, Nikola Jokić, Wilt Chamberlain and James Harden as the only players in NBA history to have 20-or-more triple-doubles in a single season.
- He tied his career-high for 3-pointers in a single game with nine vs. HOU (3/31/24), tying a single-season franchise record for most threes (257).
- Recorded 22-8-5 in the first quarter vs. HOU, becoming the first player to have that stat line in any quarter in the play-by-play era (1996-97).
- He recorded 18 points, 10 rebounds and 16 assists vs. SAS (3/19/24), his 18th triple-double of the season. This marks the most triple-doubles in a single season in franchise history, breaking his previous record of 17.
- His seven triple-doubles against the Spurs all-time (3/19/24) tied Jason Kidd for the second-most triple-doubles against the Spurs in NBA history, only behind Magic Johnson's eight.
- With 37 points vs. DEN (3/17/2), he notched his 45th 30-point game (now 46), which breaks his previous single-season record for most 30-point games in a single season in franchise history (44, 2022-23).
- With 27-12-14 at CHI (3/11/24), he posted his seventh consecutive 20-point triple-double, tying Michael Jordan and Oscar Robertson for the longest of such streaks in NBA history.
- Dončić also passed Shawn Bradley (3,340) for 4th on the Mavs all-time rebounds list (3,341) after getting his 12th rebound at CHI (3/11/24).
- Going 6-of-15 from behind the arc at CHI (3/11/24), he passed Jason Terry (1,140) for the second-most 3-pointers recorded in Mavericks history with 1,143 3-pointers.
- Against MIA (3/7/24), Dončić recorded 35 points, 11 rebounds and 11 assists for his fifth consecutive 30-point triple-double, making him and Russell Westbrook the only two players in NBA history to have done so. His 35-11-11 also marked his fourth straight 35-point triple-double, which marks the first time in NBA history a player has recorded four straight 35-point triple-doubles. It marked his 71st career triple-double.
- Against IND (3/5/24), Dončić surpassed Dirk Nowitzki (112) for most 30-point double-doubles in franchise history (113).
- After putting up 30 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists at TOR (2/28/24), Dončić became the first player in NBA history to record a 30-point triple-double on his birthday and the ninth player to record a triple-double on his respective birthday.
- Recording 45 points at CLE (2/27/24), has five games of 45-or-more points this season, the most of any player, surpassing Joel Embiid and Giannis Antetokounmpo (4) for sole possession of first place.
- With four 3-pointers at CLE (2/25/24), Dončić has recorded his 49th consecutive game with a made 3-pointer (now 57), the longest single-season streak in his career (48-game streak, 1/22/21-5/7/21).
- With 26 points, 11 rebounds and 15 assists vs. WAS (2/12/24), Dončić notched his 10th triple-double of the season (now 17). He has now recorded double-digit triple-doubles in four consecutive seasons, dating back to 2019-20. The only other players who have had double-digit triple-doubles in the last four seasons is Nikola Jokić.
- Recording 35 points and 18 rebounds at BKN (2/6/24), Dončić ties Russell Westbrook for the only guards in the last 40 years in NBA history to record at least 14 instances of 35-plus points and 15-plus assists. He became the first player in NBA history to record a 35-18-9 stat line with one or fewer turnovers.
- With 45 points vs. ORL (1/29/24) and 40 vs. MIL (2/3/24), Luka Dončić recorded back-to-back 40 point games for the third time in his career and recorded back-to-back 40-point, 10-assist games for the first time in his career.
- Luka Dončić recorded a career-high and franchise-most 73 points at ATL (1/26/24), tied for the fourth-most points recorded in a game in NBA history and the most since Kobe Bryant's 81 points in 2006. His 73 points on 25-for-33 shooting (.758) is the most efficient 70-point game in NBA history. His performance is just the 11th 70-point double-double.
- With 73 points, 10 rebounds and seven assists at ATL (1/26/24) and 28 points, 10 rebounds and 17 assists vs. SAC (1/27/24), Dončić totaled 101 points, 20 rebounds and 24 assists, becoming the first player in NBA history to average a 50-point triple-double over a two-game span.
- With 50 points at PHO (12/25/23), Dončić reached 10,000 points (10,039 points) with the fewest games needed (358) since Michael Jordan (303 games). He is the sixth-youngest player to reach the milestone (LeBron James, 23 years - 059 days; Kevin Durant, 24-033; Kobe Bryant, 24-194; Carmelo Anthony, 24-251; Tracy McGrady, 24-272; Luka Dončić, 24-300).
- On Christmas Day at PHO (12/25/23), Luka Dončić recorded 50 points (15-25 FG, 8-16 3FG, 12-12 FT), six rebounds, 15 assists, four steals and three blocks to tie for third-most points scored on a Christmas Day game (60, Bernard King; 59 Wilt Chamberlain; 50, Rick Barry). There has been only one other instance of a game with at least 50 points and 15 assists in NBA history (53-17, James Harden, 12/31/2016).
- With 50 points at PHO (12/25/23), Luka Dončić recorded his sixth career 50-point game, more than every other Mavericks player combined (4) (2, Dirk Nowitzki; 1, Jamal Mashburn; 1, Jim Jackson).
- With 38 points (13-24 FG, 6-12 3FG, 6-10 FT) at DEN (12/18/23), Dončić recorded his 10th consecutive 30-point game, only the 22nd player in NBA history to do so. His 10-straight 30-point games mark his career-most and extends a franchise record he set the previous season.
- With 40 points at POR (12/16/23), Dončić passes Dirk Nowitzki for most 35-or-more-point games in Mavericks history with 79.
- With 29 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at halftime vs. UTA (12/6/23), Dončić recorded his first triple-double in a half in his career. His 25-point triple-double in the first half marked the first 25-point triple double in a half and the sixth triple-double in a first half in NBA history since at least 1996-97 (Russell Westbrook, 4/11/16, 12/31/16;

Nikola Jokić, 2/15/18, 2/7/23; Domantas Sabonis, 5/1/21)

- With 40 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists at POR (12/16/23), Dončić recorded his eighth career 40-point triple-double, surpassing Wilt Chamberlain for sole possession of fourth-most 40-point triple-doubles in NBA history. With his 40-12-10 at POR, he also ties James Harden for fourth-most 30-point triple-doubles in NBA history.
- Vs. LAL (12/12/23), Luka Dončić recorded a team-high 33 points (12-28 FG, 3-10 3FG, 6-6 FT), adding six rebounds, 17 assists and one steal. His 33 points and 17 assists mark his 11th game with 30-plus points and 15-plus assists, surpassing Russell Westbrook and Isaiah Thomas (10) for sole possession of fifth place for most 30-point, 15-assist games.

Kyrie Irving

- Kyrie Irving recorded 48 points (15-25 FG, 3-8 3FG, 15-17 FT), seven rebounds, two assists and a steal against the Rockets (4/7/24). His 48 points is his most with the Mavericks and tied for the eighth-most in his career.
- Irving became the sixth player in franchise history to record at least 48 points in a game (vs. HOU, 3/7/24), joining Dirk Nowitzki, Jamal Mashburn, Jim Jackson, Luka Dončić and Mark Aguirre.
- Of his 48 points tonight, Irving scored 19 points in the fourth quarter. His 19 points mark the most a Maverick has scored in the fourth quarter this season. Irving led the league in total fourth quarter scoring last season (551 points).
- With 30 points (11-16 FG, 3-5 3FG, 5-6 FT) at SAC (3/29/24), Irving eclipsed 17,000 career points, the 103rd player in NBA history to do so.
- Irving played in his 18th consecutive game vs. DEN (3/17/24), the longest streak of games played for him since 2016.
- With two seconds remaining in the match vs. DEN (3/17/24), Irving hit a buzzer beater to win the game, his second career game-winning buzzer beater (at TOR, 12/16/22). His buzzer beater is the first time a Maverick has recorded a game-winning buzzer beater against a defending champion in the last 25 years.
- Irving recorded his seventh career 35-point double-double with points and assists after posting 36-12 at OKC (3/14/24), his second with the Mavericks. He joins Luka Dončić, Derek Harper and Jason Kidd as the only players in Mavericks history to have multiple 35-point double-doubles with points and assists.
- Kyrie Irving recorded 36 points at BKN (2/6/24), the most points he's recorded in a game against the Nets in his career.
- Irving became the second player in Mavericks history to record at least 40 points and 10 assists in franchise history (Luka Dončić), after he recorded 44 points and 10 assists vs. NYK (1/11/24). It marked his second career 40-point double-double with points and assists. His 44 points is his career-most as a Maverick.
- With eight rebounds vs. MEM (1/9/24), Irving has recorded eight-or-more rebounds in five consecutive game, the longest streak of games with eight-or-more rebounds in his career.
- Irving scored 33 points in the second half at MIL (11/18/23), the third-highest scoring half of his career.
- With 4 free throws made vs. BKN on 10/27/23, Kyrie Irving eclipsed 2,600 made free throws in his career (2,602).

Tim Hardaway Jr.

- With three 3-pointers at HOU (3/31/24), Hardaway Jr. reached 200 3-pointers this season for his fourth season in the last five years with 200 3-pointers. He has more seasons with 200 3-pointers with Dallas than every other Maverick player combined.
- With 18 points vs. MIL (2/3/24), Hardaway Jr. eclipsed 10,000 career points (10,011), the 46th player in NBA history to reach at least 10,000 points and 1,500 3-pointers.
- Converting 48 3-pointers through 15 games in January 2024, Hardaway Jr. set the record for most 3s made in the month of January in franchise history (48).
- With three made 3-pointers at Memphis (10/30/23), Hardaway Jr. passed Jason Kidd for fifth on the Mavericks all-time list for 3-pointers made (778).
- With 41 points vs. NOP (1/15/24), Hardaway Jr. recorded one point shy of his career high (42) and the second-highest points in a game in his career.
- Hardaway Jr. recorded 32 points (10-21 FG, 5-10 3FG, 7-8 FT) vs. LAL (12/12/23), marking the second-most points off the bench in his career in a game and the most as a Maverick.
- Tim Hardaway Jr. recorded 17 points (5-14 FG, 4-12 3FG, 3-4 FT), four rebounds and two assists vs. UTA (12/6/23). His four 3-pointers marked his 13th-consecutive game with multiple made 3-pointers, tied for his third-longest streak of games with multiple 3-point makes.
- After recording three 3-pointers against the Pelicans (11/12/23), Hardaway has converted 1,500 3-pointers in his career.
- With four threes against the Hornets (11/5/23) and the Magic (11/6/23), Hardaway converted at least four threes in three consecutive games after recording five against the Raptors (11/8/23). This marked the second time he accomplished this feat coming off the bench.

Dereck Lively II

- With two instances of 20+ points on .910 field goal percentage in the same season, Lively becomes just the fifth rookie in NBA history to have multiple instances of 20+ points on .910 shooting or better from the field (Buck Williams, 1981-82; Steve Johnson, 1981-82; Arvydas Sabonis, 1995-96; DeAndre Jordan, 2008-09).
- With 22 points (11-12 FG), Lively recorded a career-high in points, just the second time in franchise history a rookie has posted at least 20 points on .910 or better shooting. The first instance was also from Lively (vs. OKC, 12/2/23) (20 pts on 9-of-9 shooting).
- With 16 points in the first half against the Bulls (3/11/24), his most points scored in a single half in his career.
- Lively recorded 16 points and 16 rebounds at MEM (12/11/23), becoming just the third Mavericks rookie to record multiple 15-15 games in team history (2, Luka Dončić, Sam Perkins).
- Dereck Lively II recorded a block against the Clippers (11/10/23), marking his eighth consecutive game with a block since his debut. He is the only Mavericks rookie to accomplish that feat in his first eight games, and his eight consecutive games with a block ties for the fifth-longest streak with a block by a Mavericks rookie.
- Dereck Lively II recorded a then-career-high 20 points (9-9 FG, 2-5 FT), a career-high 16 rebounds, seven blocks and a steal vs. OKC (12/2/23), becoming the first rookie in NBA history in the shot clock area to record a 20-15 game, with a 100-percent FG Percentage. He became the fourth player in Mavericks history to record a 20-point, 15-rebound game (21-16, Luka Dončić, 4/9/2019; 29-16, Sam Perkins, 3/16/1985; 38-16, Jay Vincent, 2/12/1982).
- At PHO (12/25/23) Dereck Lively II tied a career-high 20 points while adding 10 rebounds for his fifth career double-double and his second career 20-point double-double.



QUICK HITS

His 20 points and 10 rebounds mark franchise-highs for most points or rebounds by a Mavericks rookie on Christmas Day.

- Lively's seven blocks vs. OKC (12/2/23) is just the second time in Mavericks history that a rookie has recorded seven-or-more blocks in a game (7 blocks, Bernard James, 2/22/2013).

Daniel Gafford

- He notched 10 points (5-7 FG), 15 rebounds, five assists and three blocks vs. GSW (4/5/24). His five assists tie a career-high, which he has done a total of three times with Dallas after tonight, and he became the fifth center in franchise history to have at least 10 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in a game in multiple games (at UTA, 3/25/24).
- After recording 13 points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two steals and five blocks at UTA (3/35/24), Gafford notched the second ever instance of a game with at least 10 points, 10 blocks, five assists, two steals and five blocks in franchise history (Dirk Nowitzki, 11/3/09).
- He notched his fourth career 15-15 game after recording 19 points and 15 rebounds at OKC (3/14/24), his second-highest point total when recording 15 rebounds.
- After going 5-of-5 from the field vs. GSW (3/13/24), Gafford recorded his 33rd straight field goal, the second-most consecutive field goal makes in NBA history.
- Blocking seven shots tonight, Gafford recorded a season-high blocks (7) against the Warriors, the second-most in a game in his career. He is the eighth player this season to record seven blocks in a game.
- Gafford becomes the second ever player in Mavericks history to record at least seven blocks and two steals in a game (Shawn Bradley).
- With 28 straight field goal makes, Daniel Gafford has the most field goal makes in a row in the play-by-play era (1996-97) (vs. CHI, 3/11/24).
- Against the Pistons (3/9/24), Gafford went 7-of-7 from the field, extending his streak to 19 consecutive field goals made, a franchise record for most consecutive field goals made.
- Former Wizard Daniel Gafford recorded 16 points (7-13 FG, 2-3 FT), 17 rebounds, two assists, two steals and five blocks tonight vs WAS (2/12/24). Only Anthony Davis has recorded such a stat line in the last three years in the NBA. Gafford's 16-point, 17-rebound effort marked his third career 15-point, 15-rebound game.
- Gafford's 14 rebounds in the first half vs. WAS (2/12/24) marked a career-high rebounds in a half (prev. 12) and the most rebounds in a half by a Maverick since 2018 (14 vs. LAC, 12/2/18). He became the sixth player in Maverick history to record at least 14 rebounds in a half and had the ninth instance in franchise history.
- With five blocks vs. WAS (2/12/24), Gafford joins Dereck Lively II (7 vs. OKC, 12/2/23) as the only Mavericks players this season to record at least five blocks in a game. Additionally, with two steals, he becomes the first Maverick in the last five years to record at least two steals and five blocks in a game. There have only been four other games of such instances in the last 15 years in franchise history.

P.J. Washington Jr.

- He recorded 32 points (12-18 FG, 5-8 3FG, 3-5 FT), five rebounds, three assists, five steals and two blocks vs. GSW (4/5/24). His 32 points is a new Mavericks-high and tied for the fourth-most points he has recorded in a game in his career. Only one other Maverick in franchise history has recorded his stat line (35-11-5-5-2, Mark Aguirre vs. DEN, 12/5/87).
- Washington Jr. recorded a career-high five steals against the Warriors, which is the most a Maverick has had in a game this season. Over the last three seasons, only one other player has had a game with at least five steals for Dallas (5 steals, Jalen Brunson, 1/14/22).
- He recorded his first double-double with the team against the Kings (3/26/24) after a 14-point, 13-rebound effort.

Derrick Jones Jr.

- Derrick Jones Jr. recorded 14 points (6-12 FG, 1-7 3FG, 1-2 FT), eight rebounds, one assist, two steal and two blocks at POR (12/8/23). With his 12-point effort at POR, Jones Jr. has recorded five consecutive games with double-digit scoring for the first time in his career (15 vs. HOU, 11/28/23; 16 vs. MEM, 12/1/23; 24 vs. OKC, 12/2/23; 12 vs. UTA 12/6/23).
- With 22 points at MEM (10/30/23), 20 points at WAS (11/15/23) and 24 vs. OKC (12/2/23), Derrick Jones Jr. has recorded three 20-point games in a season, his career-high for most 20-point games in a single season, surpassing his 2019-20 (2 games).
- Derrick Jones Jr. recorded 24 points (8-15 FG, 6-12 3FG, 2-2 FT) vs. OKC (12/2/23), marking his second-highest points in a game in his career. His efforts against OKC was his third-consecutive game with 15-or-more points (15 vs. HOU, 11/28/23; 16 vs. MEM, 12/1/23), the first time in his career he has recorded three consecutive games with 15-or-more points.
- Derrick Jones Jr. recorded 11 (4-10 FG, 1-4 3FG, 2-2 FT), 10 rebounds, three assists and three steals against the Clippers (11/10/23). His 11 points and 10 rebounds mark his first career double-double, and his three steals in the first quarter marks a new career-high steals in the first quarter — tied for the second-most steals in a single quarter in his career.

Maxi Kleber

- Against OKC (2/10/24), Kleber recorded a season-high 12 rebounds for his ninth career double-double (12-12).

Dante Exum

- Before this season, Exum had no game-tying or go-ahead baskets in the final moments of a fourth quarter or overtime period. After vs. HOU (4/7/24), he has two of such moments (vs. SAC, 3/29/24).
- Dante Exum recorded 26 points (8-10 FG, 7-9 3FG, 3-4 FT) vs. LAL (12/12/23), converting a career-high seven 3-pointers in the game. His 26 points marks his third consecutive game with 15-plus points, the longest streak in his career.
- Dante Exum recorded 23 points (9-15 FG, 2-2 3FG, 3-4 FT), six rebounds and seven assists at POR (12/8/23). His efforts marked his then-second-highest point total in a game in his career (28 points, 1/5/20; 26, 12/12/23). His 23-6-7 also marked his first career 20-5-5 game.

- The Dallas Mavericks beat the Houston Rockets (4/7/24) in overtime 147-136, despite trailing by 22 points in the second quarter. The 22-point comeback tied for the seventh-largest comeback in franchise history for the Mavericks and the 11th time that the team has overcome a 22-or-more-point deficit.
- With Kyrie Irving (48) and Luka Dončić (37) vs. HOU (4/7/24), the Maverick duo notched their fourth game where the pair recorded at least 35 points each, surpassing the duo of Mark Aguirre and Rolando Blackman (3) for most games with at least 35 points in the same game in franchise history.

KAI IS THAT GUY

Kyrie Irving recorded a new Mavericks-high points with 48 vs. HOU (4/7/24), making him the sixth player in franchise history to have at least 48 points in a game, and one of three Maverick players to do so on 25-or-fewer shots.

In Mavericks history, Irving joins Dirk Nowitzki, Jamal Mashburn, Jim Jackson, Luka Dončić and Mark Aguirre as the only players to record at least 48 points in a game. His 48 points is the 15th instance of such a game in Mavericks history, with Dončić recording the bulk of games with at least 48 points (9).

His 48 points ties for this eighth-most points in his career. Of his games with at least 48 points, he recorded the least amount of 3-pointers to get to 48 points (next fewest is 7) and the second-fewest shots to get to that number (19 shots at CHA, 3/8/22).

With **Kyrie Irving** (48) and **Luka Dončić** (37) vs. HOU (4/7/24), the Maverick duo notched their fourth game where the pair recorded at least 35 points each, surpassing the duo of Mark Aguirre and Rolando Blackman (3) for most games with at least 35 points in the same game in franchise history. This season, there have been only 14 instances where two teammates have recorded at least 35 points in the same game. Irving and Dončić make up three of those occurrences, more than any other pairing this year.

A RUN TO REMEMBER

The **Dallas Mavericks** are 13-2 in their last 15 games (4/7/24), marking the best 15-game stretch the team has had since 2010-11 when the team won the NBA Championship.

The last time the team recorded at least 13 wins in any 15 game stretch was Feb. 4, 2011 to March 7, 2011 when Dallas went 13-2 .

During this stretch of games, the Mavericks recorded at least 15 3-pointers in five straight games spanning from at SAC (3/26/24) to vs. ATL (4/4/24), tying for the longest streak of games with at least 15 3-pointers for Dallas this season.

Over the span of the last 15 games, Dallas is averaging 116.0 points (49.0 FG%, 37.2 3FG%) while holding their opponents to just 104.9 points per game.

With his first made 3-pointer at GSW (4/2/24), **Luka Dončić** surpassed 258 3s to claim sole possession of the most 3-pointers made in a single season in franchise history.

In Houston (3/31/24), Dončić tied the single-season franchise record for most 3s after going 9-of-16 to reach 257 threes in 2023-24. His 257 3-pointers tied George McCloud for the franchise record. With Dončić (262) and McCloud (257), the Mavericks join the Warriors as the only franchise with two different players reaching 200 3s in a single-season.

With 262 threes made this season, Dončić became one of two players in NBA history to reach 250 3-pointers in a season while 25 years old and under. Only Steph Curry (272, 2012-13) has a season in which he made more than 250 threes while being 25 years old or under.



10K GOLD

Luka Dončić reached the 10,000 points benchmark after recording 50 points at PHO (12/25/23) on Christmas Day. He becomes the sixth-youngest player in NBA history to reach 10,000 points, doing so at just 24 years and 300 days old. Accomplishing the achievement in 358 games, Dončić ties Bob McAdoo for seventh-fastest (in terms of games) to the milestone. He joins Kevin Love (2016) and Mike Miller (2012) as the only players in NBA history to hit 10,000 points on Christmas Day. He also is the sixth Maverick to surpass 10,000 career points (Dirk Nowitzki, Rolando Blackman, Mark Aguirre, Derek Harper, Michael Finley).

Recording 50 points (15-25 FG, 8-16 3FG, 12-12 FT), six rebounds, 15 assists, four steals and three blocks against PHO (12/25/23), Dončić recorded his sixth career 50-point game, more than every other Maverick combined. His four steals and three blocks mark his first ever game with at least four steals and three blocks. His 50 points and 15 assists mark the second time in NBA history a player has had at least 50 points and 15 assists in a game (53-17, James Harden, 12/31/2016). He is the first player in history to record his stat line of at least 50 points, six rebounds, 15 assists, four steals and three blocks. His eight 3-pointers makes, including his 3-pointer to reach 10,000 points, ties for the second-most threes made in a game in his career.

THERE'S MAGIC IN THE AIR

Luka Dončić garnered a career-high and franchise-most 73 points in a 148-143 win over the Atlanta Hawks at State Farm Arena on January 26, 2024. In a record-setting night, Dončić tied for the fourth-most points scored in a game in NBA history, with only three other players recording 73-or-more points (Wilt Chamberlain, Kobe Bryant and David Thompson). His 73 points is the most points recorded in a game this season and the most recorded in a game since Kobe Bryant's 81 in 2006.

Dončić's 73 points is one of 15 games with a player scoring 70-or-more points in NBA history and one of 11 games with the player doing so with a 70-point double-double. Only Dončić and Wilt Chamberlain have had at least one 73-plus point double-double in NBA history. With 73 points (25-33 FG, 8-13 3FG, 15-16 FT), 10 rebounds, seven assists and a steal, Dončić became the second player in NBA history to have multiple games with 60-plus points, 10-plus rebounds and five-plus assists and the first in over 50 years (Elgin Baylor, 63-31-7 vs. PHW on 12/8/61; 64-17-8 vs. BOS, 11/8/59). His seven assists marked the most assists in a 70-point effort in a non-overtime game (Donovan Mitchell, 71 points & 11 assists vs. CHI in overtime).

Missing just eight shots the entire night and going 25-for-33, Dončić recorded the most efficient 70-point game in NBA history with a .758 field goal percentage. Only Wilt Chamberlain's 66 points on 29-for-35 shooting (.829) and Karl Malone's 61 points on 21-for-26 shooting (.808) are the 60-plus-point efforts on higher efficiency than Dončić's 73 points on 25-for-33 shooting (.758). There are only two efforts with at least 50 points in NBA history with better efficiency where the player recorded at least 50 points and eight 3-pointers (50 points with 9 3-pointers, Kyrie Irving at CHA on 3/8/22; 50 points with 8 3-pointers, Jamal Murray at CLE on 2/19/21). With 33 field goal attempts, Dončić is the only player in NBA history to record at least 70 points with 33-or-fewer field goal attempts. Dončić's 25 field goals made marked a new franchise-record, breaking Mark Aguirre's record 21 field goals made (at DEN, 3/24/84) that Dončić once tied in his 60-21-10 effort vs. NYK (21 FGM, 12/27/22).

During NBA's third annual Rivals Week where the Mavericks faced the Hawks in Atlanta, Dončić recorded an NBA-record amount of points against the Hawks franchise (previous: 67 points, Wilt Chamberlain, 2/17/1962). His 73-point showing also set a new record for most points scored in the State Farm Arena's 24-year history (previous: 55 points, Kevin Durant, 4/2/22).

At halftime, Dončić had 41 points (16-21 FG) against the Hawks, setting a new franchise record for points in a single half (previous: 34, Dirk Nowitzki, 2nd half, vs UTA 11/3/09). His 41-point half is the 15th 40-point half in the past 20-plus years in NBA history. His 16 field goals made is the third-most in a half in NBA history (18, Kobe Bryant vs. TOR, 1/22/0; 17, Brandon Jennings vs. GS, 11/14/09), doing so with the third-highest efficiency (min. 15 FGM) behind Kenneth Lofton Jr.'s 15-for-18 (.833) shooting at OKC (4/9/23) and Brandon Jennings' 17-for-21 (.810) shooting vs. GS (11/14/09).

Dončić (73) and **Josh Green** (21) combined for 94 points between the two, tying Kobe Bryant (81) and Smush Parker (13) for the most combined points by any two teammates in the last 40 years (94 points). They are tied for the third-most combined points by any two teammates in the last 60 years (98 points, 51, Kiki Vandeweghe & 47, Alex English vs. DET, 12/13/83; 95, 45, Mike Mitchell & 50, George Gervin vs. MIL, 3/6/82).





AT THE BUZZER

Kyrie Irving hit a left-handed driving hook shot from 21 feet away from the basket to beat the Denver Nuggets, 107-105 (3/17/24). The shot came moments after Luka Dončić tied the game with a 30-foot 3-point make with 25 seconds left in the game.

Irving's shot was just his second career game-winning buzzer beater, the first being against Toronto (12/16/22). The shot came exactly a year from the day Maxi Kleber converted a 3-pointer to beat the Los Angeles Lakers, 111-110 (3/17/23), in a shot that was assisted by Irving. Within the last six years, there have only been three other game-winning buzzer beater in franchise history, including Kleber's 3-pointer over the Lakers. The other two are Dončić's 3-pointer against Boston to beat the Celtics 107-104 (11/6/21), and against the Grizzlies (4/14/21) after Grayson Allen missed two free throws to keep the scoreline within two points, and Dončić converted a 3-point floater to win the game.

Within the last 10 years, there have only been two other game-winning buzzer beaters against a defending champion, Saddiq Bey's shot against the Warriors (1/4/23) and Dwyane Wade's make against the Warriors (2/27/19). Irving's game-winning buzzer beater is the only game-winning buzzer beater over a defending champion in franchise history as far back as data can track (1997-98).

DYNAMIC DUO

Last season, G **Luka Dončić** (42 vs. PHI 3/2/23, 34 vs. PHX 3/5/23) and G **Kyrie Irving** (40 vs. PHI 3/2/23, 30 vs. PHX 3/5/23) each tallied 30+ points in two straight games, becoming the first pair of teammates in franchise history to score 30+ points in the same two consecutive games. Dončić (42) and Irving (40) both scored 40+ points in the team's 133-126 win vs. PHI (3/2/23), marking the first time in franchise history that Dallas had two 40-point scorers. Dončić (7-13 3FG) and Irving (6-8 3FG) combined to shoot 13-of-21 (.619) from beyond the arc against the Sixers, becoming the first pair of teammates in league history to each tally 40+ points and 6+ 3-pointers in the same game.

Dončić (12 assists) and Irving (6 assists) each added 5+ assists against the 76ers, becoming just the third set of teammates in NBA history to each record 40+ points and 5+ assists in a non-OT game (regular season or playoffs):

Dončić and Irving also became only the 5th pair of teammates to record 40+ points in a non-overtime game over the past 30 years.

This season, **Kyrie Irving** (42 vs. NOP, 1/15/24) and **Tim Hardaway Jr.** (41 vs. NOP, 1/15/24) both recorded 40-plus points in the same game, marking the second time in franchise history that two teammates recorded 40-or-more points in the same game and the 20th time in NBA history. Doing so in a 125-120 win in regulation, it marked just the sixth pair of teammates to record 40+ in a non-overtime game over the past 30 years. With this instance and last season's game, the Mavericks are the second team in NBA history to have multiple instances of two teammates with 40-or-more points in the same game (4 times, OKC).

G **Kyrie Irving** recorded a then-season-high 44 points (15-26 FG, 6-10 3FG, 8-9 FT), four rebounds, 10 assists and two steals against the New York Knicks (1/11/24).

His 44-point outing against the Knicks marked his most points recorded in a game as a Mavericks player at that point (48 vs. HOU, 4/7/24). His previous high was 41 points at ATL (4/2/23), a number he has twice surpassed with his 44 vs. NYC (1/11/24) and 42 points vs. NOP (1/15/24). His 44 and 42 points marked the first time he has recorded 40 points twice in a span of three games as a Maverick.

Irving's 44-point, 10-assist efforts against the Knicks (1/11/24) made him the second player in Mavericks history to record at least 40 points and 10 assists in a game (Luka Dončić). Although Dončić has done so many times, Irving is the only other player to do so with points and assists, and the ninth player in franchise history to record a 40-point double-double overall.

After recording 42 points vs. NOP (1/15/24), Irving notched a five-game streak of recording 30-or-more points, tied for the second-longest streak of 30-plus-point games in his career (6-game streak, 1/19/23-1/28/23; 5-game streak, 3/14/19-3/23/19). He is one of seven players this season to record at least a five-game streak of 30-plus points (Joel Embiid, Luka Dončić, Trae Young, Kevin Durant, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Giannis Antetokounmpo). Including Irving, only three players in Mavericks history has had at least five consecutive games with 30-or-more points, including Luka Dončić who extended a franchise-record with 11 consecutive

games of 30-plus points (Mark Aguirre).

In the three-game span from Jan. 11, 2024 to Jan. 15, 2024, Irving totaled 119 points, tying his third-most points across any three-game span in his career (119, 1/25/20-1/31/20; 125, 3/10/22-3/23/22; 132, 3/8/23-3/15/22). At the start of the new year, Irving recorded nine rebounds at UTA (1/1/24), nine vs. POR (1/3/24) and nine vs. POR (1/5/24), marking the first time in his career he has recorded at least three consecutive games with nine-or-more rebounds. In addition to the eight rebounds he recorded vs. MIN (1/7/24) and eight vs. MEM (1/9/24), Irving recorded eight-plus rebounds in at least five consecutive games for the first time in his career.

Nineteen-year-old C **Dereck Lively II** started his first NBA game against the Brooklyn Nets in the Mavericks home opener on Oct. 27, 2023.

Against the Nets, Lively recorded nine points on a perfect 4-of-4 shooting, adding two rebounds and a block. In the season opener (10/25/23), Lively came off the bench and recorded a 16 points (7-8 FG, 2-3 FT), 10 rebounds, one assist, one steal and one block in 31 minutes.

Lively became just the fourth teenager to debut for the Mavericks (Bruno Šundov, Luka Dončić, Dennis Smith Jr.) and became the third-youngest Maverick to play at 19 years and 255 days (Bruno Šundov, 19 years and 70 days; Luka Dončić, 19 years and 231 days).

His double-double against the Spurs in the season opener (16 points, 10 rebounds) marked the first by a Mavericks rookie coming off of the bench in their debut.

Against the Bulls on Nov. 1, Lively recorded six assists, becoming just the second rookie center in Mavericks history to record six-or-more assists in a game after Sean Rooks in 1992-93.

Through his first nine games, Lively has recorded at least one block in each, marking the first time in franchise history a rookie has started the season with nine consecutive games with at least one block. His streak ties for the third-longest by a Mavericks rookie.

WASHINGTON TO DALLAS

P.J. Washington Jr. was acquired by the Dallas Mavericks from the Charlotte Hornets on February 8, 2024 at the NBA trade deadline alongside two second-round picks for Grant Williams, Seth Curry and a 2028 top-2 protected first-round pick.

Against the Golden State Warriors (4/5/24), Washington Jr. recorded 32 points, five rebounds, three assists, five steals and two blocks. His 32 points marked a new Mavericks high and is tied for the fourth-most points he has recorded in a game in his career. His five steals are a career-high, and he became the second Maverick within the last three years (Jalen Brunson, 1/14/22) to record at least five steals in a game.

Only one other player in Mavericks history has recorded at least 30 points, five steals and two blocks in a game, making his occurrence the second instance in Mavericks history. The first time a stat line of such instances happened was with Mark Aguirre (35-11-5-5-2, Mark Aguirre vs. DEN, 12/5/87).

Washington Jr. also recorded back-to-back games with five 3-pointers for the second time in his career.



FRONT AND CENTER

Daniel Gafford was acquired by the Dallas Mavericks from the Washington Wizards on February 8, 2023 at the NBA trade deadline in exchange for Richaun Holmes and a 2024 first-round pick via the Oklahoma City Thunder.

Gafford comes to the Mavericks after averaging 10.9 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists, 1.0 steals and 2.2 blocks with the Wizards through 45 games (45 starts) this season. At the time of the trade, Gafford is one of three players in the NBA this season to average at least one steal and two blocks per game (Victor Wembanyama, Anthony Davis). He had the seventh-highest blocks per game average (2.2) in the NBA this season.

In his first game as a Maverick (vs. OKC, 2/10/24), Gafford recorded 19 points and nine rebounds, the second-most points coming off the bench in a Mavericks debut (25, Christian Wood, 10/19/22). In his second game with Dallas (vs. WAS, 2/12/24), Gafford recorded 16 points, 17 rebounds, two assists, two steals and five blocks for his third career 15-15 game. His five blocks and two steals made him the first Maverick in the last five years to have at least five blocks and two steals. His 14 rebounds in the first half is a career-high and is the most by a Maverick in a half since 2018 (14 vs. LAC, 12/2/18, DeAndre Jordan).



CAN'T MISS

Daniel Gafford recorded 10 points (5-5 FG), six rebounds, one assist, two steal and seven blocks vs. GSW (3/13/24) to extend his then-streak of consecutive field goal makes to 33. Missing his first shot of the game at OKC (3/14/24), he ended his streak at 33 straight field goal makes, two away from tying Wilt Chamberlain's record. His 33 straight field goal makes is the second-longest in NBA history.

Going 9-of-9 from the field vs. CHI, his former team, Gafford recorded the most consecutive field goal makes in a game since the play-by-play era (since 1996-97), surpassing Derrick Favors' 22 straight makes in 2019-20 by finishing the game with 28 straight makes (7-7 FG vs. IND, 3/5/24; 5-5 vs. MIA, 3/7/24; 7-7 at DET, 3/9/24; 9-9 at CHI, 3/11/24).

He is one of six players in NBA history to record back-to-back games with at least 15 points on 100-percent shooting (DeAndre Jordan; Boris Diaw; Tyrone Hill; Fouts Walker; Wilt Chamberlain), and the first player to do it since DeAndre Jordan in 2016.



BUCKETS OFF THE BENCH

This season, the **Dallas Mavericks** have recorded 2,760 points from their bench unit with 35.4 points per game averaged, placing them 12th in the league for points per game from non-starters.

Appearing in 75 of the Mavericks' games, 65 off the bench, **Tim Hardaway Jr.** is fifth in the league in points scored off the bench with 878 points (1,110, Malik Monk; 1,037, Bobby Portis; 1,004, Norman Powell; 892, Cole Anthony) for the 2023-24 season. His 878 points off the bench through a team's 77 games is his career-best start, despite missing three games and starting 10. With his 878 points, he has the 13th-most points off the bench of any season in Mavericks history and he has the record for most 3-pointers by an NBA reserve in franchise history with 169 (prev. Vince Carter, 158).

Jaden Hardy is second on the team for bench scoring with 422 points. **Dante Exum** has the third-most points off the bench on the team with 202. **Dwight Powell** is fourth with 161 points off the bench. **Josh Green** has 144 points scored through 22 games off the bench. Although he was with the Charlotte Hornets at the time, P.J. Washington Jr. recorded 43 points off the bench for them (at UTA, 1/27/24), marking the most points recorded off the bench this season and the most points off the bench in a single game in Hornets history.

HARDAWAY FROM DEEP

Tim Hardaway Jr. recorded career-high 169 3-pointers off the bench in the Mavericks' 76 games of the 2023-24 season.

After going 3-of-6 from behind the arc at HOU (3/31/24), Hardaway Jr. recorded his fourth season with at least 200 3-pointers in the last five years. He has more seasons with 200 3-pointers with Dallas (4) than every other Maverick combined (3). He has also recorded the most 3-pointers in franchise history when starting 10-or-fewer games (201, previously 162 3-pointers w/ Vince Carter, 2012-13).

Hardaway Jr. has converted from behind the arc in his first 20 games of a season, marking the first time in his career he has done so. His 20-game streak of at least one three is tied for fourth-longest single-season streak of his career.

Against the New Orleans Pelicans (1/15/24), Hardaway Jr. recorded 41 points, one point shy of tying his career-high. His nine 3-pointers that day tied for the second-most threes he has recorded in a game in his career.

Hardaway Jr. recorded four 3-pointers at CHA (11/5/23) and at ORL (11/6/23), while converting five from behind the arc against the Toronto Raptors (11/8/23). His three consecutive games with four-or-more threes marks the seventh time in his career he has done so in three consecutive games and the second time he accomplished the feat coming off the bench.

Against the Washington Wizards (11/15/23), Hardaway Jr. scored 31 points (11-20 FG, 7-11 3FG, 2-5 FT), which marked his third-highest scoring output in a game coming off the bench. His 22 points in the first half is his career-high points scored in the first half coming off the bench. Hardaway Jr. has two games with seven-or-more 3-pointers made this season, tying 2019-20 for the second-most games with seven-or-more 3-pointers (2) in a season. He had six such games in 2020-21.



LUKA MAGIC

Luka Dončić recorded 40 points (14-25 FG, 6-12 3FG, 6-8 FT), 10 rebounds, 11 assists and a steal vs. UTA (12/6/23) to surpass Larry Bird for sole possession of ninth-place in NBA's all-time triple-doubles list with 60 triple doubles.

Vs. UTA (12/6/23), Dončić recorded 29 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists by halftime, recording his first triple-double in a half in his career. His 25-point triple-double in the first half marked the first 25-point triple double in a half and the sixth triple-double in a first half in NBA history since at least 1996-97 (Russell Westbrook, 4/11/16, 12/31/16; Nikola Jokić, 2/15/18, 2/7/23; Domantas Sabonis, 5/1/21). In the first quarter, he recorded 16 points, five rebounds and five assists for his fifth career 15-point, five-rebound, five-assist quarter. Since 1996-97, Giannis Antetokounmpo (2) is the only other player with multiple such quarters. His 40-point triple double through three quarters vs. UTA (12/6/23) is just the third time in NBA history since at least 1996-97 that a 40-point triple double has occurred after just three quarters (James Harden, 12/31/16, 1/11/19).

Dončić recorded a 33-point triple-double, posting 33 points (13-25 FG, 3-11 3FG, 4-7 FT), 13 rebounds, 10 assists and two steals for his 57th career triple-double in the season opener at SAS (10/25/23) for the first triple-double in a season opener in Mavericks history and his fifth triple-double against the Spurs, which is his highest amount versus any NBA franchise. Dončić joins Oscar Robertson (10/21/1961; 10/15/1966) and Giannis Antetokounmpo (10/24/2019) as just the third player in NBA history to record a 30-point triple-double in a season opener.

Dončić scored 49 points (16-25 FG, 9-14 3FG, 8-10 FT), 10 rebounds and seven assists against the Brooklyn Nets on Oct. 27, 2023 in the home opener. Making nine three-point shots, including a contested hook-shot three against the shot clock, Dončić recorded a new career-high three-point makes, previously eight (vs. POR, 1/17/20; at POR, 3/21/21; vs. CHO, 3/19/21). In the fourth quarter, Dončić recorded 11 consecutive points for the Mavericks and converted four consecutive three-point attempts to take the lead for Dallas.

Through the first three games of the 2023-24 season, Dončić recorded 33-13-10, 49-10-7 and 35-12-12 points-rebounds-assists stat-lines, becoming the first player in NBA history to outright lead his team in points, rebounds and assists through the first three games of the season.

Vs. the Houston Rockets (11/28/23), Dončić recorded 41 points (15-29 FG, 3-10 3FG, 8-9 FT), nine rebounds, nine assists and two steals, marking his second career game with nine-or-more assists in a game with zero turnovers (nine assists, zero turnovers at SAS, 12/31/22). He became the second player in NBA history to have multiple games of at least 40 points and nine assists while having zero turnovers (Stephon Marbury, 2/17/1999 and 1/17/2003).



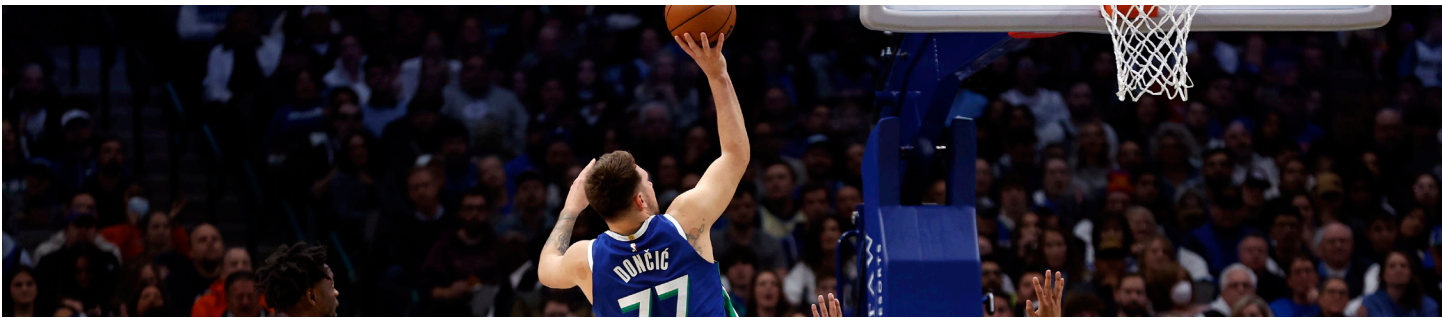
A HISTORIC RUN

Luka Dončić recorded 39 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists at DET (3/9/24). His 39-10-10 marked his 72nd-career triple-double and with 3 steals and two blocks, he became the second player in NBA history to record such a stat line (39-10-10-3-2) (Michael Jordan) in regulation.

Dončić set an NBA record for most consecutive 30-point triple-doubles with six after his 39-10-10 performance against Detroit (3/9/24). Additionally, in his last five games, Dončić notched a 35-point triple-double.

He broke the record for most consecutive 35-point triple-doubles with four (vs. MIA, 3/7/24), but extended that record after recording his fifth consecutive (at DET, 3/9/24). Additionally, he tied the record for most consecutive 20-point triple-doubles with seven (Michael Jordan, Oscar Robertson) after 27-12-14 at CHI (3/11/24). For the first time in his career, Dončić recorded seven consecutive games with a 30-point double-double. With 39 points and either 10 rebounds or 11 assists (vs. IND, 3/5/24), Dončić surpassed Dirk Nowitzki (112) for most 30-point double-doubles in franchise history with 113 (now 114). No other Mavericks besides Nowitzki and Dončić have more than 20 of such instances.

Recording 39 points and 11 assists (vs. IND, 3/5/24), Dončić surpassed Tiny Archibald for sole possession of third-most 35-point, 10-assist double-doubles in NBA history (44, now 45). For the first time in his career and in Mavericks history, Dončić has recorded five straight games with a 30-point double-double with points and assists (now 7). Only five other players have at least a five-game streak of such instances (Trae Young, Russell Westbrook, Michael Jordan, Tiny Archibald, Oscar Robertson).



TRIPLE-DONČIĆ

Luka Dončić has a franchise-best 76 triple-doubles, which are already more than every other current and former Maverick combined (40). Dončić recorded a league-high 17 triple-doubles in 2019-20, becoming the youngest player in NBA history (21 years, 168 days) to lead the league outright in the category. He not only set the Mavericks single-season triple-double record, but he became the franchise’s all-time leader as well. He has missed a triple-double by 1 rebound or 1 assist on 29 occasions in his career (9 time this season).

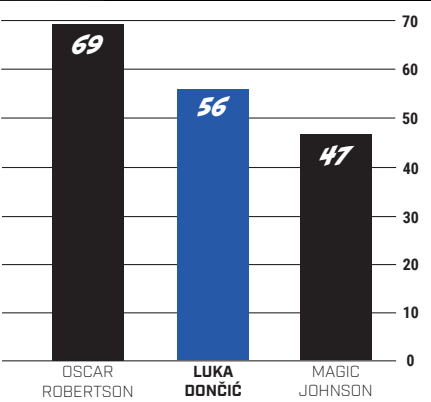

Dončić recorded his 50th career triple-double (33 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists) vs. DEN (11/18/22), becoming the 10th player in NBA history to reach the milestone.

Dončić reached 50 career triple-doubles at the second-youngest age (23 years, 263 days) and in the second-fewest games (278) in NBA history. Only Oscar Robertson (23 years, 42 days; 111 games) got there faster.

Dončić also recorded his 25th career 30-point triple-double vs. DEN (11/18/22) en route to becoming the fifth player in league history with 25-or-more 30-point triple-doubles (Robertson, Russell Westbrook, LeBron James, James Harden). The 33-point, 12-rebound, 11-assist effort against the Nuggets was Dončić’s NBA-leading fourth triple-double of the season.

Jason Kidd was named the 10th head coach in Mavericks history on June 28, 2021.

Kidd, who was inducted to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 2018, is in his third stint in Dallas after spending eight of his 19 seasons as a player with the team and helping the Mavericks to the 2011 NBA title.

Kidd joins the Mavericks after most recently serving two seasons as an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Lakers, where he was part of the franchise's 2020 NBA championship season.

Kidd's coaching career began in 2013 when he helmed the Brooklyn Nets for one season. He is the third person since the NBA-ABA merger (1976) to become a head coach in the season after he retired as a player. As a rookie head coach, Kidd earned a pair of Eastern Conference Coach of the Month awards (January and March), leading the Nets to 44-38 record and an appearance in the Eastern Conference Semifinals.

On July 1, 2014, Kidd became the head coach of the Milwaukee Bucks in a transaction that sent two second round draft picks to Brooklyn (2015, 2019). He became the first coach in NBA history to lead two teams to the postseason in his first two seasons after helping the Bucks to a 41-41 record and improving on their 15-win season from a year earlier. Kidd finished third in NBA Coach of the Year voting following the 2014-15 season.

In three-plus seasons with Milwaukee, Kidd amassed a 139-152 record and appeared in the playoffs twice before parting ways with the franchise midway through the 2017-18 season. Kidd was drafted second overall by the Mavericks in 1994 NBA Draft and spent two-and-a-half seasons in Dallas before being traded to Phoenix during the 1996-97 campaign. He shared Rookie of the Year honors with Grant Hill after averaging 11.7 points, 5.4 rebounds and 7.7 assists in his first season.

Kidd returned to Dallas from New Jersey in an eight-player trade in February 2008. Following the trade, Kidd teamed up with former Mavericks superstar Dirk Nowitzki and together they led the Mavericks to the 2011 NBA title, defeating Miami 4-2 to bring the Larry O'Brien Trophy to DFW.

He averaged 12.6 points, 6.3 rebounds, 8.7 assists and 1.9 steals in 1,391 games (1,350 starts) with Dallas, Phoenix, New Jersey and New York. In 500 games with Dallas (all starts), he averaged 10.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 8.4 assists 1.9 steals and 34.6 minutes.

Kidd's 12,091 career assists and 2,684 career steals are the second-most in NBA history behind John Stockton. His 107 career triple-doubles represent the fourth-most in NBA history. Kidd was a 10-time NBA All-Star, five-time All-NBA First Team selection and four-time All-Defensive First Team pick.

Kidd played two seasons at the University of California. The Oakland, California, native led the Golden Bears to consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament and, as a sophomore, was an All-American and the Pac-10 Player of the Year. He also won two Olympic gold medals as a member of Team USA (2000, 2008).
