IF THE NETS WIN

- It would improve Brooklyn's record in April to 3-2.
 - The last time the Nets didn't finish .500 or better in April was April 2016 (no April games were played in 2020-21).
- > It would improve the Nets record to 7-4 at home since the All-Star break. Only the Celtics (nine) have played fewer home games since the All-Star break.
- It would mark the Nets' fourth straight home win against the Raptors (current three-game streak has spanned from 10/21/22 11/28/23).
 - This would be the Nets second-longest home winning streak against the Raptors all-time (longest: six straight from 3/30/00 4/12/03).
- It would be Brooklyn's seventh victory over Toronto in their last eight meetings (since the beginning of last season).
 - The Nets swept the Raptors, 4-0, last season and hold a 2-1 advantage in this year's season slate.

INDIVIDUAL LEAGUE LEADERS

- CLUTCH: Mikal Bridges is sixth in the NBA in 'clutch' points (114), trailing only Stephen Curry (186), DeMar DeRozan (177), Damian Lillard (139), Nikola Jokic (129) and De'Aaron Fox (118).
- MINUTES: Bridges ranks third in the league in total minutes played (2,783), trailing only **DeMar DeRozan** (2,866) and **Domantas Sabonis** (2,790). He led this category in each of the last two seasons.
- SCORING: Bridges is third in the league in corner 3FGM (81-of-200 .405), trailing only Malik Beasley (101-of-213 .474) and Donte DiVincenzo (82-of-176 .466). Bridges finished second in the league in corner 3-pointers made last season (88).

 PLAYER FG % SEASON
 - Cam Thomas is 10th in the league and fifth in the East in ppg on drives (10.0) min. 40 games played.
 - Nic Claxton is fourth in the league in FG % (.629). See the chart for the best qualifying FG % in a single season for a Net all time.
 - Day'Ron Sharpe is third in the league in second chance points off the bench (152).
- USG %: Thomas is 13th in the league and sixth in the East in usage rate (.306) min. 40 games played.
- FG: Bridges ranks 11th in the league and sixth in the East in 3-pointers made this season (214).
 - Thomas is 10th in the East in catch-and-shoot 3FG % (.436) among 112 players in the conference with at least 100 such attempts. Cam Johnson ranks 16th (.424).
- **BOARDS**: Sharpe is third in the league in rebound % (.198), trailing just **Andre Drummond** (.257) and **Jusuf Nurkic** (.203). He's also second in offensive rebound % (.162), trailing only Drummond (.187).
 - Claxton ranks 13th in rpg (9.9). Claxton also ranks 14th in the league in orpg (2.7) and Sharpe ranks 20th (2.6).
 - Sharpe is second in offensive rebounds off the bench (155), trailing only Drummond (199), and is third in total rebounds off the bench (377), behind Bobby Portis (563) and Drummond (527).
- **BLOCKS**: Claxton is eighth in the league in bpg (2.0) and is eighth in total blocks (139).
- > <u>STEALS</u>: Dennis Smith Jr. is tied for second in the league in steals off the bench (63) with Bogdan Bogdanovic and T.J. McConnell and behind Matisse Thybulle (83).
- ASSISTS: Dennis Schröder ranks 13th in the league and seventh in the East in total assists (479).
- DUNKS: Claxton is tied for sixth in the league in dunks (164) with Daniel Gafford after finishing fourth in the category last season (191).
 - This season, he trails only Giannis Antetokounmpo (247), Rudy Gobert (233), Anthony Davis (190), Aaron Gordon (166).

TEAM RANKINGS

- CORNER 3s: The Nets are fourth in corner 3FG % (.414) and are tied for first in corner 3FGM (4.2/game).
 - Brooklyn ranked 13th (.394) and 12th (3.4/game) in those categories, respectively, last season.

- Cam Thomas poured in a game-high 32 points (10-of-25 FG, 10-of-11 FT) with six boards, five assists and a steal in 39 minutes (+11) against Detroit on Saturday night.
 - This was Thomas' second-career 30/5/5 game (other: 44 points, five rebounds, five assists vs. Washington on 2/4/23).

 - Thomas' 14 30-point games are the second-most for a Net age 22 and under in a season in franchise history, trailing only **Bernard King** in 1977-78 (22).
 - The only players to be drafted lower than Thomas (27th in 2021) and have more 30-point games this season are

Over his last 15 games (since 3/9) Thomas has scored 20+ points 14 times, including five 30-point performances. In this stretch, he's averaged 26.5 ppg (.454 FG %, .350 3FG %, .879 FT %), 4.5 rpg and 3.7 apg in 36.3 mpg.

- Since the beginning of March, Thomas is seventh in the league in ppg (26.5 ppg) and is fifth in the East, trailing only Giannis Antetokounmpo (31.0 ppg), Jalen Brunson (29.8 ppg), Jayson Tatum (27.2 ppg) and Jalen Brown (26.7 ppg).
 - Each of the six players ahead of Thomas in scoring since 3/1 (Luka Doncic and Nikola Jokic, in addition to the Eastern Conference players) were All-Stars this season four of the six are multi-time All-NBA honorees.
- Among players with a 30%+ Usage Rate this season (30.6% for Thomas), Thomas' turnover % (8.4%) is the lowest in the NBA, slightly better than Shai Gilgeous-Alexander (33.0% Usage Rate and 8.5% turnover %).
 - Thomas is on pace to be the only guard since at least 1967-68 to average less than 2.0 turnovers per game with a usage rate of greater than 30%. See the chart for the only players to do so in a qualifying season (played in 70% of team's games). ----->

- Thomas is averaging 22.2 ppg and 1.9 turnovers/game this season. No player in franchise history has averaged 20.0+ ppg and fewer than 2.0 turnovers/game across a full season.
- Noah Clowney has averaged 15.3 ppg (.667 FG, .714 3FG, .692 FT), 8.7 rpg (2.7 orpg) and 1.7 bpg in 25.4 mpg in the last three games, including one double-double and two games with 10+ rebounds.
 - He shot 5-of-7 from deep in the last three games after shooting 4-of-16 from distance in his first 17 games.

Clowney joins Chris Morris (April 1989) as the only rookies in Nets history to notch 45+ points, 25+ rebounds, five or more 3pointers and five or more blocks in a three-game stretch.

- Mikal Bridges has shot 67-of-158 (.424 3FG %) from 3-point range since the beginning of March (20 games).
 - Over this stretch, he's tied for sixth in the league and is third in the East in 3-pointers made.
 - See the chart for the top-five leaders in 3FGM in a season by a Net all-time (also the only five instances of a Net draining 200+ 3FG in a season). -----
- Dennis Schröder contributed four points, seven rebounds and six assists on Sunday against Sacramento.
 - In 28 games with Brooklyn, Schröder has had seven games with at least five rebounds and five assists. He did so six times in 51 games with Toronto this season.
 - See the chart for a look at how Schröder's production through 28 games with Brooklyn compares to his time with Toronto this season and his career averages. -----
- Across his last two games, Jalen Wilson averaged 10.5 ppg (.500 FG %, .429 3FG %), 5.0 rpg, 2.0 apg and 1.0 spg over 25.1 mpg (+8), including back-to-back double-digit performances.
 - On the year, Wilson has shot 22-of-56 (.393 3FG %) on catch-and-shoot 3-pointers. His 3FG % .421 350 342 percentage on catch-and shoot attempts ranks fourth among 27 rookies with at least 50 tries, trailing only Charlotte's Nick Smith Jr. (.448), Oklahoma City's Cason Wallace (.439) and Houston's Cam Whitmore (.423). Each of the top nine in this category besides Wilson were first-round picks (Wilson was selected as the 51st pick overall in the second round).
 - In 139 minutes with Nets rookies Wilson and Clowney on the floor together, the two-man lineup has posted an offensive rating of 106.2, a defensive rating of **99.3** and a net rating of **6.9**.

- <u>11/28 at BKN</u>: In a game that featured 29 lead changes and ties, Brooklyn outscored Toronto 39-28 in the fourth quarter en route to a 115-103 home win in their fourth and final game of the inaugural In-Season Tournament.
 - The Nets finished group play of the inaugural In-Season Tournament with a 3-1 record, falling just short of advancing to the
 quarterfinals by virtue of point differential.
 - All five starters grabbed eight or more rebounds for Brooklyn: **Mikal Bridges** (10), **Spencer Dinwiddie** (nine), **Cam Johnson** (nine), **Dorian Finney-Smith** (nine) and **Nic Claxton** (eight), becoming the first five players on a team this season to grab eight or more rebounds in a game (later joined by Golden State on 3/22).
 - This was the first time all five starters for a team posted eight or more rebounds since Phoenix's starting five did so on 3/19/15 vs. New Orleans (Eric Bledsoe, Marcus Morris, Markieff Morris, P.J. Tucker and Brandan Wright).
 - This is the first time any five players on the Nets recorded eight or more rebounds since 12/6/04 vs. Toronto (Jason Collins, Richard Jefferson, Nenad Krstić, Alonzo Mourning and Eric Williams) and the only time in franchise history that all five starters registered eight or more rebounds in a game.
- > 3/25 at TOR: Brooklyn entered the fourth down by one (69-68) but would outscore Toronto 28-19 in the final frame and go on to win, 96-88.
 - This marked the second time this season that Brooklyn has held its opponent below 90 points (86 at Memphis, 2/26). The Nets are now 7-2 this season when holding the opposition under 100 points.
 - This was also Brooklyn's first win this season when finishing below the century mark. The Nets are now 2-15 when failing to score 100 points.
 - This was just the third time this season that both the Nets and their opponent failed to score 100+ points: 96-95 OT loss vs. Miami on 1/15 and 96-94 loss vs. Minnesota on 1/25.
- ► GLASS: The Nets have posted a commanding 148-121 (+27) advantage on the glass against the Raptors this season.
 - In Brooklyn's two victories against the Raptors, the Nets have been a +13 and a +20 on the boards. In the lone loss, they were a -6.
 - The Nets were +10 or better on the glass three times all of last season (done nine times this season twice against the Raptors).

BRIDGES THE IRON MAN

SCHRÖDER JOINS THE NETS

- > ACQUIRED: The Nets acquired guard Dennis Schröder from the Toronto Raptors on trade deadline day (2/8).
- > Schröder put together a memorable Brooklyn debut, recording his seventh double-double of the season with 15 points (6-of-13 FG, 3-of-5 3FG), three rebounds, a season-high-tying 12 assists and just two turnovers in 27 minutes off the bench.

 - Schröder and Kelvin Ransey are the only players in Nets history to accomplish that feat off the bench.

- DBL-DBLS: Schröder has notched eight double-doubles this season, including one in his first appearance with the Nets (15 points and 12 assists vs. San Antonio on 2/10/24). He's registered more than eight double-doubles in a season once in his career: 10 double-doubles in 2016-17 with Atlanta.

INTERIM HEAD COACH KEVIN OLLIE



The Brooklyn Nets named Kevin Ollie interim head coach on February 20, 2024.

Kevin Ollie is in his first season as a coach with the Nets organization. Ollie arrives in Brooklyn from Overtime Elite, where he served as head of coaching and basketball development for two seasons (2021-23). Prior to his stint with Overtime Elite, Ollie spent six years (2012-18) as the head coach of the men's basketball program at the University of Connecticut. After leading UConn to a 20-10 record in his first season at the helm in 2012-13 when the program was ineligible to participate in postseason competition, Ollie directed the Huskies to a 32-8 record in his second season in 2013-14. UConn earned a seven seed in the 2014 NCAA Tournament and became the second-lowest seed (and the only seven seed) to win a national championship when he guided the Huskies to their fourth of five titles in program history. Before he became the head coach at UConn, the Los Angeles native was an assistant coach with the Huskies for two years (2010-12), helping lead the team to a

national championship in 2011. Prior to the start of his coaching career, Ollie played in the NBA for 13 seasons (1997-2010) with 11 teams, including a 19-game stint with the Nets during the 1999-2000 season. Ollie played in 662 career games with Orlando, Dallas, Sacramento, Philadelphia, New Jersey, Indiana, Chicago, Seattle/Oklahoma City, Milwaukee, Cleveland and Minnesota, and logged playoff action five times in his career, including a trip to the NBA Finals in 2001 with the 76ers. Ollie went undrafted in 1995 and began his playing career as a member of the Connecticut Pride of the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) for two seasons (1995-97). As a collegian, Ollie played at UConn for four years (1991-95), helping the Huskies advance to the NCAA Tournament three times. As a senior, he earned All-Big East Third Team honors.




