Detroit fell for the third-straight game at home after winning consecutive road games in its previous two contests (11/7 at ORL, 11/9 at ATL), dropping a 103-113 decision to the Charlotte Hornets at Little Caesars Arena on 11/11...**Andre Drummond** set a career-long streak with his fourth consecutive game with 20-plus points, totaling 23 points and 22 rebounds to go along with three assists, three steals and two blocks...**Drummond** recorded his fifth 20-plus point/20-plus rebound game, and also collected his 12th-straight game with at least one block...**Reggie Bullock** finished with a career-high 23 points (7-13 FG, 6-9 3FG), and the six makes from distance also set a career best...**Langston Galloway** led all Pistons' reserves with 10 points, marking his fifth-straight game scoring in double figures (one shy of his career-long streak)...**Galloway** also made two triples for the fourth-straight game, tying his career-best streak...**Reggie Jackson** had 19 points to go along with a season-high seven assists, and **Blake Griffin** totaled 10 points, six rebounds and five assists...Detroit took a 27-24 lead after the first quarter behind 11 points from **Bullock**...**Bullock** went 3-of-3 from distance in the frame, and also hit three triples in the third quarter, matching the most makes from beyond the arc in a quarter by any Piston this season...Charlotte managed to take a 51-49 lead at the break after shooting 12-of-23 (.522) in the second frame...**Bullock's** 12 points in the third quarter helped Detroit stay within reach, 83-75, heading into the fourth quarter...The Hornets extended their lead to as many as 21 in the final frame (79-100) after **Griffin** was called for a flagrant foul and then ejected from the contest...The Pistons cut the deficit to nine with 1:27 to go, but that would be as close as Detroit would get as Charlotte earned the 10-point victory...The Pistons set season highs with 26 second chance points and 22 offensive rebounds.

Detroit rolled to its second consecutive win with a wire-to-wire 124-109 victory over the Atlanta Hawks at State Farm Arena on 11/9...Detroit moved to 6-5 on the year and won back-to-back road games against Southeast Division opponents (ORL, 11/7)..The Pistons led by as many 29 and never relinquished the lead after a 3-pointer from Reggie Jackson to start the game, marking his 11th-straight game with a triple this season...**Jackson** (10) was one of seven Pistons who scored in double figures, along with **Andre Drummond** (23), **Stanley Johnson** (22), **Langston Galloway** (25), **Reggie Bullock** (13), **Glenn Robinson III** (12) and **Ish Smith** (10)...**Drummond** tallied his third-straight game with 20-plus points, tying the longest such streak of his career...Detroit recorded season highs in assists (30), 3-pointers made (20), 3-pointers attempted (47) and blocks (six)...Six Pistons had double-digit 3-pointers, led by **Galloway** (five) and **Johnson** (four)...**Galloway** set a career-long streak with three-straight games with four-plus triples (11/5-11/9)...The Pistons led 40-20 after the first quarter and 74-51 at halftime...Detroit shot 28-of-49 (.571) from the field and 11-of-23 (.478) from 3-point range in the half...The 74 points in the first half marked the most in a first half for Detroit since tallying 74 points vs. Denver on Dec. 6, 1986, and the most points in a half since scoring 74 in the second half at Toronto on March 6, 1996...The Pistons led by 29 four different times in the fourth quarter but a 17-0 run from Atlanta late in the frame cut the deficit to as many as 12 in the final minute...A triple with 8.2 seconds remaining in the game from **Khyri Thomas** marked the rookie's first points of his career as he made his Piston debut, scoring three points in nearly four minutes of action.

Detroit snapped a five-game losing skid with a 103-96 win over the Orlando Magic at the Amway Center on 11/7...**Andre Drummond** led Detroit in scoring and rebounding with 23 points and 19 rebounds to go along with three steals and a block...**Blake Griffin** tallied his ninth 20-point scoring game of the season and **Reggie Jackson** had his seventh game with at least 15 points...**Stanley Johnson** (13) and **Langston Galloway** (12) also scored in double figures...It was Galloway's third-straight game with double-digit scoring, tying the longest streak of his career...The Pistons trailed by as many as 15 in the first quarter (16-31) before a 15-0 run of their own at the end of the frame and into the second quarter...Detroit took a 10-point lead (57-47) with 38.9 seconds to play in the second quarter and finished the half on top, 58-51...**Drummond** had 19 points and 12 rebounds in the first half, including 13 points and eight rebounds in the first quarter...Orlando shot .650 (13-of-20) in the third quarter to retake the lead 80-78 going into the fourth quarter...The Pistons clamped down on defense in the final frame, holding the Magic to just 16 points on .312 (5-of-16) shooting and were sparked offensively from two triples from **Galloway** and **Johnson**...**Griffin** scored 12 of his 20 in the second half and **Jackson** had seven of his 15 points in the fourth quarter to preserve the win...The Pistons set a season high with 13 steals...Detroit outrebounded its opponent for the sixth time on the year and had its fourth game out of the last five with 50-plus rebounds.

TORONTO RAPTORS (12-2)

QUICK FACTS:

- > Detroit went 0-4 against Toronto last season.
- > The Pistons were swept by the Raptors for the third time in franchise history in 2017-18. Detroit's last series sweep over Toronto was in 2008-09.
- > Andre Drummond averaged 18.7 rebounds over three games against the Raptors a year ago.

SERIES TRENDS:

- > Detroit has a 2-9 record against Toronto over the last three seasons.
- > Detroit holds a 51-35 all-time record against the Raptors with a 24-18 road record.
- > The Pistons are 2-7 at Toronto dating back to 2013-14.

CONNECTIONS:

- > Detroit head coach **Dwane Casey** coached the Toronto Raptors from 2011-12. Casey led the Raptors to a franchise record five-straight postseasons and won Coach of the Year in 2017-18. Casey went 320-238 in seven seasons with Toronto.
- > Pistons guard **Reggie Jackson** played with Raptors forward **Serge Ibaka** in Oklahoma City from 2011-15.

FIRST TO EVER DO IT: Blake Griffin and Andre Drummond have been dominant throughout the season, as Drummond has recorded seven games with 20-plus points and 10-plus rebounds while Griffin has six such games. Drummond is the first Piston to ever reach seven games with 20/10 through 12 games, while Griffin is tied for the second-highest total in team history.

THE 'SECRET WEAPON': Langston Galloway has caught fire lately, tallying double-digit scoring in five-straight games (11/3-11/11) which is one game shy of his career-long streak of six (3/23/15-4/3/15). Galloway also tied a career-best streak with his fourth consecutive game making multiple 3-pointers (11/5-11/11). Galloway is shooting 16-of-35 (.457) from distance since 11/3 and is averaging 14.4 points per game.

CAN'T STOP THE RAIN: Detroit has now made 10-plus 3-pointers in four-straight games, tying the third-longest streak in team history. The franchise record is six consecutive games with double-digit triples (11/4/17-11/17/17).

SETTING RECORDS FROM DEEP: Detroit has made 132 3-pointers through 12 games this season, marking the highest total of any team in franchise history through as many contests. The Pistons currently have the most 3-point attempts (420) for any season through 12 games in team history as well.

HIGHEST-SCORING HALF IN YEARS: The Pistons scored 74 points in the first half against the Hawks on 11/9, marking the most points scored in a first half since Dec. 6, 1986 vs. Denver (74). The last time Detroit scored as many points in any half was in the second half at Toronto on March 5, 1996 (74). Five Pistons reached double-digit scoring by half at Atlanta, led by Drummond and Robinson with 12 apiece.

BEST OF THE YEAR: The Pistons set season highs in a number of categories in their last four games. Detroit had a season-high 26 second chance points and season-best 22 offensive rebounds versus Charlotte on 11/11. On 11/9 against Atlanta, Detroit set season highs with 30 assists, 20 3-pointers, 47 3-point attempts and six blocks. Against the Magic on 11/7, Detroit shot a season-best .900 from the charity stripe and totaled 13 steals. The previous game against Miami (11/5), Detroit set season highs by grabbing 60 total rebounds.

REBOUNDING AS A UNIT: Detroit is the only team in the NBA with at least 44 rebounds in every game they have played in this season and Detroit has grabbed at least 50 rebounds in five of the last seven games. The Pistons rank currently first in the NBA in offensive rebounds per game (13.4) and fourth in the NBA in rebounds per game (49.2). Detroit also ranks sixth in the league in offensive rebound percentage (.307), first in defensive rebound percentage (.768) and fifth in overall rebound percentage (.521).

MONSTER HALVES: Andre Drummond has recorded 12 halves with at least 10 rebounds this season, the most in the NBA. Drummond has 187 halves with 10-plus rebounds in his career, the most for any player since entering the league in 2012-13. He also has 36 first-half double-doubles over the last seven seasons, the most in the NBA in that time span. Below is a list of the top five totals for 10-plus rebounds in a half since 2012-13:

FANTASTIC FOUR: The Pistons had four players score 20-plus points in a game versus Miami (11/5) for the first time since a win over Cleveland on January 30, 2018. Andre Drummond (25), Reggie Jackson (25), Blake Griffin (24) and Langston Galloway (21) all eclipsed the 20-point plateau for the Pistons.

DOWN TO THE WIRE: Detroit is tied for the highest total in the NBA with three wins in games decided by three points or less this season. The Pistons moved to 3-2 in such contests after a one-point loss to Brooklyn on 10/31, and the five total games decided by that margin are tied for second in the NBA this season. The Pistons, along with Philadelphia, have also played in the most overtime games this season with three.

DOING IT ALL: Blake Griffin led the Pistons in scoring, passing and rebounding with 38 points, 13 rebounds and six assists at Philadelphia on 11/3. Griffin has scored 20-plus points in nine of 12 games this season, and has never recorded less than five rebounds or three assists in a game on the year. He is one of two players in the NBA averaging 20-plus points, 10-plus rebound and five-plus assists (G. Antetokounmpo). Since 2010-11, Griffin has recorded 72 career games with at least 25 points, seven rebounds and five assists, which is the fifth-most games among all players in the NBA in that time period. He has four such games this season, which is tied for the third-highest total among NBA players (Kevin Durant – six, Anthony Davis – five, LeBron James/Giannis Antetokounmpo/Damian Lillard – four).

EXTENDING THE RANGE: Blake Griffin now has four games with four-plus 3-pointers on the season, already setting the most games he has had in a season with as many threes. He has hit multiple treys six times through 12 games this season, after totaling 51 such games through 529 career games prior to 2018-19. Griffin set a career best for a three-game span with 14 triples from 10/20-10/25, including tying his career high of five 3-pointers in back-to-back games against Chicago and Philadelphia.

LIGHTING IT UP FROM LONG DISTANCE: Blake Griffin and Reggie Jackson are both finding success from beyond the arc early this season. Griffin is 25-of-69 (.362) from deep and Jackson is 25-of-81 (.309) from the 3-point line, marking the two highest totals for 3-pointers made by Pistons this season. Jackson tied his career-long streak of four games with multiple 3-pointers (10/17-10/25) and has at least one triple in every game this season, while Griffin has made at least one triple in nine of 12 games this season.

SOLID ISH: Ish Smith recorded a steal in five-straight games (10/30-11/7), including a season-high three against Orlando (11/7). Offensively, Smith has led the Pistons' reserves in scoring in six of 12 games this season, scoring in double-digits six times, and he is averaging 9.9 points per game, the third-highest average of his career. A year ago, Smith had 50 games with double-digit scoring and averaged 10.9 points per contest.

20/20 VISION: Andre Drummond leads the NBA with five 20-point/20-rebound games this season, and he also led the NBA with the most 20-plus point/20-plus rebound games last season, recording seven such games. His five 20/20 games are the most by any player through 12 games since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar in 1975-76. NIGHT TO REMEMBER: Blake Griffin had a career night with 50 points, 14 rebounds and six assists against Philadelphia on 10/23. Here are some of the records and notes from Griffin's performance:

- Set career highs for points (50), field goals (25) and field goal attempts (35) and tied his career best for 3-pointers made (five) and attempted (10).
- Became the first Piston to record three-straight games of 25-plus points, eight-plus rebounds and five-plus assists to open a season.
- Scored the most points for any Piston with at least 10 rebounds and five assists in a game.

MAN OF THE YEAR: Dwane Casey was named Coach of the Year in 2017-18 after finishing 59-23 (.720), a franchise record in wins for the Toronto Raptors, followed by a trip to the Eastern Conference Semifinals. Casey has won at least 48 games in each of the last five seasons, giving him the third-most wins of any coach in the NBA during that stretch.

THE TRUSTY VETERAN: Jose Calderon entered the 2018-19 campaign ranked ninth among active players in career assists (5,033). Calderon began the year 48th all-time in total assists and his 1,304 total turnovers are the least for any player with more than 5,000 assists.

ROOKIE HISTORY: Bruce Brown became just the sixth Piston to start a season opener in their rookie campaign. Brown grabbed two rebounds, dished out one assist and recorded a block in 19 minutes of action. The other Pistons' rookies to start on opening night were Isiah Thomas, Grant Hill, Kelly Tripucka, Arron Afflalo and John Salley.

EARLY SEASON OPENER RECORDS: Andre Drummond became the first Piston to record at least 20 points and 20 rebounds in a season opener after totaling 24 points and 20 rebounds against Brooklyn on 10/17. Drummond's 20 rebounds set a franchise high for a season opener, and he also has the second-highest rebounding total on an opening night for Detroit with 19 boards on 10/27/15. Blake Griffin became the first Piston since 2007-08 to score 30-plus points in a road opener with 33 points at Chicago on 10/20.

DWANE CASEY

HEAD COACH

Dwane Casey was named head coach of the Detroit Pistons on June 11, 2018 after seven years at the helm with the Toronto Raptors. Casey comes to Detroit after being named 2018 Coach of the Year by the National Basketball Coaches Association (NBCA) and being honored as the 2018 NBA Coach of the Year as voted upon by national media covering the NBA.

While with the Raptors, Casey led the Raptors to four Atlantic Division Championships and a franchise record five consecutive postseason appearances from 2014-18. Under his leadership, Toronto recorded the franchise's first 50-win season in 2015-16 and proceeded to amass three consecutive 50-win seasons, including a franchise record 59 wins in 2017-18. He was also selected as the Eastern Conference head coach at the 2018 NBA All-Star Game in Los Angeles, CA and led Team LeBron to a win over Team Stephen. Casey left the Raptors as both the franchise's all-time winningest coach with a 320-238 regular season record and their longest tenured coach.

The Raptors posted their second 50-win season in 2016-17, despite missing All-Star point guard Kyle Lowry for 21 games. Casey earned his fourth Eastern Conference Coach of the Month honor in December when the Raptors averaged a conference-best 112.1 points with a +11.1-point differential. Toronto also finished the month ranked second defensively, holding opponents to 101.1 points per game. He became the only coach in franchise history to earn the Coach of the Month award multiple times (December 2017, December 2016, January 2016, November 2014 and December 2013).

In 2015-16, Casey directed the Raptors to their fourth Atlantic Division championship and set a then team record with 56 victories. It marked the first time in franchise history the Raptors had topped 50 wins in a season and Toronto finished second in the Eastern Conference, the highest position in franchise history. Casey showed an ability to adapt and still be successful as he was missing two-fifths of his starting lineup for more than 60 games and started a rookie for 20 games following the NBA All-Star break. He guided the Raptors to a 12-2 mark, setting a team record for wins in January and the best winning percentage (.857) in a month with 10 or more games. The Raptors won a franchise-best 11 consecutive games (January 6-30) and swept a seven-game home stand for the first time in team history.

The Casey-led Raptors picked up a second consecutive Atlantic Division championship and 49 victories in 2014-15. His club had sole possession of first place in the Eastern Conference for the first time in team history and remained there from November 4 – January 1. The defensive-minded Casey showcased an up-tempo offense that set a franchise best with 726 made 3-pointers and was the second-highest scoring unit in team history. They also finished in the top 10 in the league for fewest turnovers for a third straight season.

Toronto recorded 48 wins in 2013-14, won an Atlantic Division championship and locked up the third overall seed in the Eastern Conference. Casey's squad also set a franchise record with 22 road wins and matched an all-time high with 16 victories against Western Conference opponents. Casey continued his emphasis on the defensive end of the court as Toronto ranked in the top 10 in points allowed (98.0, 6th) and opponent field goal percentage (.450, 10th).

During the 2012-13 campaign, Casey and his coaching staff oversaw the development of a youthful core of players including DeMar DeRozan, Amir Johnson, Jonas Valanciunas and Terrence Ross. DeRozan established career highs in points, rebounds, assists and minutes, Johnson posted career bests in points, rebounds, assists, steals, blocks and minutes and Valanciunas earned NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month honors.

In his first season with the Raptors (2011-12), Casey took a Raptors team that ranked near the bottom of the NBA in every defensive category and transformed the identity producing desirable results. The Raptors finished the season as the league's leader for greatest improvement in opponent field goal percentage and opponent scoring. Toronto ranked in the top 10 in fewest points allowed (9th), opponent field goal percentage (8th) and 3-point field goal percentage (5th). The team finished in the bottom third of the league in all three categories in the previous season.

Casey, 61, has served as a head coach, associate head coach and assistant coach in the NBA for 23 seasons. He has coached in two NBA Finals (1996 and 2011) and three NBA All-Star Games (1996, 1998 and 2018).

Casey spent three seasons (2008-11) as an assistant coach with the Dallas Mavericks. The Mavericks posted a 162-84 (.659) mark during that span, winning 50 or more games in each of Casey's three seasons with the team. Casey was in charge of a defensive unit that held its opponents to 96.0 points per game (6th in the NBA) and 45.0% shooting from the field (8th in the NBA) in the 2010-11 regular season. In the 2011 postseason, Casey's defense posted series victories over offensive powers the likes of Kobe Bryant, Kevin Durant, Russell Westbrook, LeBron James and Dwyane Wade. Dallas held its playoff opponents to 92.5 points per game and defeated the Miami Heat 4-2 in the Finals to capture the 2011 NBA Championship.

Casey's first NBA head coaching job came with the Minnesota Timberwolves where he served from 2005-07. After going 33-49 in his first season, Casey had the club in playoff contention with a 20-20 record when he was replaced on January 25, 2007.

Casey began his NBA coaching career in 1994 as an assistant with the Seattle SuperSonics. He spent 11 seasons with the Sonics where he served under longtime NBA head coaches George Karl, Paul Westphal and Nate McMillan. He was promoted to associate head coach in November 2000. Nine of his teams in Seattle finished above .500 with five winning 50 or more games. The 1996 Sonics squad won the Western Conference Championship after finishing the regular season with a franchise record 64 victories.

In 14 seasons as an NBA assistant, Casey's teams have registered a 689-427 mark (.617) with eight campaigns of 50 or more wins. His teams have qualified for the playoffs in 11 of those 14 seasons.

Prior to joining the Sonics, Casey spent five years as a head coach in Japan. He also coached Japan's National Team with basketball legend Pete Newell. In the summer of 1998, Casey coached the team to its first World Championship appearance in 31 years.

From 1985-89, Casey was an assistant under legendary collegiate coach Eddie Sutton at the University of Kentucky. The Wildcats posted a 90-40 mark during that span. He also served as an assistant under Clem Haskins at Western Kentucky University from 1980-85.

Casey began his coaching career at Kentucky in 1979 as a graduate assistant under Joe B. Hall. While at Kentucky, he recruited and coached eventual NBA players Winston Bennett, Sam Bowie, Rex Chapman, LeRon Ellis, Shawn Kemp, Chris Mills, Dirk Minnifield, Irving Thomas and Melvin Turpin.

Casey played collegiately at Kentucky and helped the Wildcats register a 30-2 record in his junior season and capture the 1978 NCAA Championship. A four-year letterman, Casey was named team captain his senior year and won Kentucky's all-academic award.

A native of Morganfield, Kentucky, Casey earned a degree in business administration from Kentucky in 1979. He and his wife, Brenda, have a daughter, Justine, and son, Zachary.
