SIXERS FALL IN THE 6: The Philadelphia 76ers lost, 128-94, to the Toronto Raptors at Air Canada Centre on Saturday night. The Sixers fell to 0-3.

- With 18 points (7-16 FG), 10 rebounds and eight assists, Sixers guard-forward **BEN SIMMONS** became the first rookie since **OSCAR ROBERTSON** (1960) to start their NBA career with three straight games with at least 10 points, 10 rebounds and five assists (Elias).
 - Simmons is one of three players in the league to carry averages of at least 10.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 5.0 assists. The others are Oklahoma City's reigning MVP **RUSSELL WESTBROOK** and Los Angeles Lakers' rookie **LONZO BALL** (stats.nba.com).
- Sixers guard **JERRYD BAYLESS** scored in double figures for the third straight game, contributing 16 points on 5-of-7 shooting to go with three rebounds and a steal. Bayless is off to his best offensive start to a season, totaling 47 points through three games. His previous best was a season ago (2016-17) where he scored 33 points in the first (and only) three appearances (Basketball-Reference).
- Philadelphia continues to stifle opponents' offense in transition. The Sixers are one of four teams (Orlando, Milwaukee, Detroit) to hold opponents under 6.0 fast break points per game. Allowing just 5.3 per game, the 76ers rank third in the NBA. A season ago the squad allowed 15.3 per game, 28th best in the association (stats.nba.com).

SIXERS DROP HOME OPENER TO C'S: The Philadelphia 76ers fell in its home opener, 102-92, at The Center to the Boston Celtics Friday night. The Sixers fell to 0-2 while Boston improved to 1-2.

- Sixers guard-forward Ben Simmons became the first player in franchise history to record back-to-back double-doubles in the first two (now three) games to start a career (Elias). He scored 11 points (4-11 FG) to go with 11 rebounds, five assists and a steal. In his NBA debut at Washington (10/18), Simmons was responsible for 18 points (7-15 FG), 10 rebounds, five assists, two steals and a block.
- Philadelphia center **JOEL EMBIID** pulled down double-figure rebounds (game-high 14) for the second straight game. He pulled down 10-plus rebounds in consecutive appearances once in 2016-17, doing so at Houston (10 rebs, 11/14/16) and at Minnesota (10 rebs, 11/17/16), per Basketball-Reference. He also finished tonight with 11 points, three assists, two blocks and a steal in 28 minutes.
- Sixers guard **JJ REDICK** (team-high 19 points) hit four three-pointers (4-7 3FGT) for the second game in a row. In the season opener Redick was 4-of-6 from deep, finishing the game with 12 points. Last season with the Los Angeles Clippers he made at least four threes 18 times.
- Philadelphia forward **DARIO ŠARIĆ** pulled down 10 rebounds off the bench, to go with nine points (4-10 FG) and two assists. Šaric had 12 games as a rookie as he pulled down at least 10 rebounds with only five of those coming as a reserve. His 12 double-digit rebound games were second among rookies a season ago (Basketball-Reference).
- Philadelphia's starting five (Simmons, Bayless, Redick, **ROBERT COVINGTON**, Embiid) have all been double-digit scorers in both games this season. In 2016-17 the Sixers starting five all scored at least 10-plus points six times.

WIZARDS STOP SIXERS: The Wizards defeated the 76ers, 120-115, in the 2017-18 regular season opener at Capital One Arena. Philadelphia fell to 0-1, while Washington improved to 1-0.

- **STRONG SHOOTING:** The Sixers shot 43-for-94 (45.7%) from the field, compared to Washington's 42-for-97 (43.3%). Further, the Sixers made 15 of their 35 three-point attempts compared to Washington's 6-for-22.
 - Last season, the Sixers made a franchise-record 831 three-pointers (10th in the league) and made at least 15 on four occasions.

- **TRANSITION DEFENSE:** A season ago, Washington averaged 15.9 fast break points per game, which ranked fifth in the NBA (first in the Eastern Conference). On Wednesday night, the Sixers held the Wizards to just four points on the break as Philadelphia posted 19 of their own.
- **SIMMONS SHINES:** Sixers guard-forward Ben Simmons recorded a double-double in his NBA debut, pouring in 18 points and bringing down 10 rebounds. He joined Hall of Famer **BILL WALTON** as the only other player to record 18+ points, 10+ rebounds, and at least two steals in their first NBA game (since steals were first recorded), per NBC Sports Philadelphia.
 - The last five players with at least 18 points, 10 rebounds and five assists in their first career NBA game are Simmons, **GRANT HILL** and Hall of Famers Walton, **KAREEM ABDUL-JABBAR** and Oscar Robertson (NBC Sports Philadelphia).
 - Simmons had just one turnover in his 35 minutes as he became just the third player since 1983-84 to post at least 18 points, 10 rebounds and one or fewer turnovers in their NBA debut. The two previous players to do so were **LUOL DENG** and **EMEKA OKAFOR**, both in 2004, according to Basketball-Reference.
- **CRUISIN' COV:** Philadelphia forward Robert Covington notched 29 points (9-15 FG, 7-11 3FG, 4-4 FT) and brought down seven rebounds as he tied a career-best seven three-pointers, accounting for 21 of his game-high 29 points. It was the third time in his career Covington made seven three-pointers in a single game (2-10-16 vs. SAC and 4-8-16 vs. NYK).
 - Covington's 29 points were the most scored by a Sixers player in a season-opening game since Sixers legend **ALLEN IVERSON** posted 32 points on November 1, 2006 against Atlanta (Basketball-Reference).
 - 'RoCo' became just the third player since 1983-84 to hit seven three-pointers in a season opener, joining **DANILO GALLINARI** (1/28/09 at Miami) and **DENNIS SCOTT** (11/3/95 vs. Cleveland). No player has ever made more than seven three-pointers in a season-opening game (Basketball-Reference).
 - 'Cov' blocked a team-high two shots on the night. With 29 points, seven rebounds and two blocks, he became just the fourth Sixers player since 1983-84 to record such numbers in a season opener, joining **CHRIS WEBBER** (11/1/05 vs. Milwaukee) and Hall of Famers **CHARLES BARKLEY** (11/6/87 vs. Indiana) and **MOSES MALONE** (10/26/85), per Basketball-Reference.
 - Since joining the Sixers in 2014-15, Covington has made at least five three-pointers in 26 games. Only seven NBA players have done so more frequently than he has during that span; he is tied with teammate JJ Redick for the eighth-most five-three-pointer games in the NBA since 2014-15 (Basketball-Reference).
- **EMBIID-EMBIID:** Sixers center Joel Embiid recorded his 10th career double-double by scoring 18 points and recording a team-high 13 rebounds. He brought down a career-high 12 defensive boards and added three assists and a block on the night. Last season, Embiid posted nine double-doubles, finishing third among rookies behind New York's **WILLY HERNANGOMEZ** (11) and teammate Dario Šarić (10), despite playing in 40 fewer games than either player.
 - Embiid and Simmons were the first pair of Sixers each to notch double-doubles in a season opener since **SPENCER HAWES** and **JRUE HOLIDAY** each did so on October 31, 2012 (Basketball-Reference).
- **REDICK SHOWS RANGE:** First-year Sixers guard JJ Redick made his team debut against the Wizards, Redick scored 12 points (all via the three-pointer) in 32 minutes of action. The 12-year veteran ranks 40th in NBA history with 1,275 career threes and is 16th among active players. His 41.5 percent clip from long range is 14th all-time and sixth among active NBA players (Basketball-Reference).
- **FULTZ DEBUTS AT 'HOME':** Rookie 76ers guard **MARKELLE FULTZ** posted 10 points (5-9 FG) and three rebounds during 18 minutes in his NBA debut. The 19-year-old Upper Marlboro, Maryland native made his return to the Washington, D.C. area where he attended high school at DeMatha Catholic.
- **NO. 1 PICKS:** With the debut of Fultz (2017) and Simmons (2016), the 76ers became the first team in the common draft era (since 1966) to have two former No. 1 overall draft picks play in their first career NBA game with the same team in the same game (Elias).

2017-18 PRESEASON: The Sixers finished the preseason with a 2-3 record. In five games the Sixers averaged 107.8 points (ninth in NBA), 47.0 rebounds (fourth in NBA) and were fourth in the league in blocks, averaging 6.4 per game. Additionally, the Sixers bench posted an average of 56.6 points per game, which placed them seventh in the NBA in the preseason.

- **SIMMONS:** Through five games, Simmons averaged 11.4 points per game, 6.2 rebounds and 1.4 steals. Simmons' 5.4 assists per game was 10th in the league, while his 27 total assists placed him fifth in the NBA. Simmons produced 80.7 percent of his total points from the paint, which led all qualified preseason participants.

- **EMBIID:** After missing the team's first three games (left knee surgery), Embiid made his preseason debut in against the Nets on October 11. In that contest, he scored 20 points (12-16 FT) and collected seven rebounds in the first half alone.
- **REDICK:** Finished the preseason shooting 12-for-14 from three-point range, which was good enough for an 85.7 percent mark. His 85.7 three-point percentage led all players with at least 10 makes in the preseason.

FULTZ ENTERS THE FRAY: After acquiring the No. 1 overall pick in the 2017 NBA Draft from the Boston Celtics, the Sixers selected former Washington guard Markelle Fultz. The 6-foot-4 product from the Washington, D.C. area averaged team-highs of 23 points (sixth in NCAA) and six assists to go along with six rebounds and two steals in 36 minutes per game. He was just the second NCAA freshman to average 23 points, five rebounds and five assists per game since 1992-93.

- Fultz was a finalist for the John R. Wooden Award, which has been presented annually to the outstanding collegiate basketball Player of the Year since 1976. He was selected First Team All-Pac-12 and was named an Associated Press Third Team All-American.
 - He was a member of the 2016 Team USA Under-18 team that won the FIBA Americas World Championships last July. He was named MVP of the FIBA Americas Championships after averaging 14 points, five assists and three steals per game on 55 percent shooting from the floor.
 - Fultz is from Upper Marlboro, Maryland. He graduated from DeMatha Catholic High School where he was a 2016 McDonald's All-American. In his senior season, he led DeMatha to the Maryland Private School League Championship, while setting the school's single-season record for assists with 278.

FREE-AGENT SIGNINGS: On July 8, the Sixers announced the signings of guard JJ Redick and forward-center Amir Johnson. The duo boasts a combined 23 years of NBA experience.

- A 6-foot-4 guard, Redick finished 2016-17 with the Los Angeles Clippers averaging 15 points and two assists in 28 minutes per game while shooting 43 percent from three-point range and 89 percent from the free-throw line over 78 appearances (all starts).
 - The 33-year-old holds the league's 14th-highest all-time three-point percentage at 42 percent. He has finished in the top five in three-point percentage the last three seasons, including first in 2015-16, shooting a career-best 48 percent clip from beyond the arc. The Duke product was drafted with the 11th overall pick in the 2006 NBA Draft by the Orlando Magic after he was named 2006 Associated Press Collegiate Player of the Year.
 - All told, he's played in 690 career games (319 starts) with the Clippers, Milwaukee and Orlando and holds averages of 12 points, two rebounds and two assists in 25 minutes per game. He's shot 45 percent from the field, 42 percent from three-point range and 89 percent from the free-throw line (10th all-time).
- A 6-foot-9 forward-center, Johnson has appeared in 745 career games (461 starts) with Boston, Toronto and Detroit. He holds career averages of eight points, six rebounds and one assist in 22 minutes per game while shooting 57 percent from the field and 67 percent from the free-throw line.
 - Last season with Boston, Johnson posted seven points, five rebounds and a career-high two assists per contest. His 57.4 percent field-goal percentage ranks seventh-best in NBA history and fourth among active players.
 - A 12-year NBA veteran, Johnson averaged 10 points per game in back-to-back seasons from 2012-14 with Toronto. He was originally selected in the second round (56th overall) of the 2005 NBA Draft by Detroit out of Westchester High School in Los Angeles, California. He was a 2005 McDonald's All-American.

TURKISH THUNDER: With the 26th overall pick in the 2016 NBA Draft, the Sixers selected guard-forward Furkan Korkmaz. The Turkish native spent the 2016-17 season playing overseas with Banvit B.K. on loan from Anadolu Efes and subsequently signed with Philadelphia on July 4.

- Korkmaz helped lead Banvit B.K. to its first Turkish Cup in February. In 21 games, the 19-year-old averaged 11 points and four rebounds while shooting 49 percent from the field and 40 percent from three-point range.
 - Korkmaz also helped Banvit reached its first Basketball Champions League Final. He was later named the Basketball Champions League "Best Young Player" after averaging 11 points and five rebounds while shooting 50 percent from three-point range in eight BCL games.
 - In 2015-16, Korkmaz played with current Sixers forward Dario Šarić with Anadolu Efes. In 37 games, Korkmaz averaged five points while shooting 48 percent from the field.

- A native of Istanbul, Korkmaz has been named a Turkish Basketball Super League All-Star three times and is a two-time Turkish Cup champion. He's represented his home country of Turkey in international play in multiple competitions, earning a gold medal at the 2014 FIBA Europe Under-18 Championship and silver at the same event in 2015.

BALLIN' BEN: Also selected in the 2016 NBA Draft (first overall), Sixers guard-forward Ben Simmons, who missed last season with a right foot injury, will be available to make his professional debut against the Grizzlies.

- Simmons spent one season at LSU before declaring for the 2016 NBA Draft during which averaged 19 points, 12 rebounds, five assists, two steals and one block in 35 minutes per game, each of which led the Tigers. Simmons was the consensus National Freshman of the Year, SEC Freshman of the Year and was the only freshman named to the 2016 Consensus All-America Team.

NUMBER CHANGES: A season ago, Sixers guard-forward **JUSTIN ANDERSON** wore No. 23, guard **T.J. MCCONNELL** wore No. 1 and guard-forward **TIMOTHÉ LUWAWU-CABARROT** donned No. 20. This season, Anderson will be No. 1, McConnell will sport No. 12 and Luwawu-Cabarrot will be No. 7. Fultz will wear No. 20.

2016-17 YEAR IN REVIEW

- **PLUS-18:** The Sixers won 18 more games in 2016-17 than they did in 2015-16. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 18-win improvement from season-to-season was the second-highest in franchise history behind a 21-win jump from 1998-99 to 1999-2000.
 - The 18-win increase was the largest in the NBA last season (Elias).
- **STANDOUT ROOKIES:** Sixers center Joel Embiid and forward Dario Šarić were each named to the NBA's All-Rookie First Team. The duo combined to win the Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month Award in all but one month of the NBA season, with Embiid taking home the honor in October/November, December and January and Šarić doing so in February and March.
 - For the season, Embiid appeared in 31 games and averaged 20.2 points, 7.8 rebounds, 2.1 assists and 2.5 blocks in 25.4 minutes per game, becoming the seventh rookie in NBA history to average at least 20.2 points, 7.8 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per game. He posted at least 20 points in 19 of his 31 games, which led all NBA rookies (Basketball-Reference).
 - Posted the third-best PER for an under-30 rookie since 1962, behind only Hall of Famers Dave Robinson and Michael Jordan.
 - His 28.7 points per 36 minutes were the second-most ever averaged by an NBA player, behind only the Philadelphia Warriors' Wilt Chamberlain, who posted 29.2 points per 36 minutes in 1959-60.
- **SWIPING SIXERS:** The Sixers posted at least 10 steals in 26 different games last season, which was tied with Atlanta and Oklahoma City for the fourth-most such games in the league. The only teams with more 10-steal games than the Sixers were Golden State (40), Minnesota (29) and Washington (28), per Basketball-Reference.
 - The Sixers finished third in the NBA in both total steals and steals per game.
- **DROPPING DIMES:** Sixers guard T.J. McConnell finished the season with 534 assists, which ranked eighth in the NBA. His 534 assists were the most in a season by a Sixers player since 2012-13 when **JRUE HOLIDAY** had 625 (Basketball-Reference).
 - T.J.'s 134 steals placed him sixth in the NBA and led the Sixers. McConnell was the first Sixers player with such assist and steal totals in the same season since **ALLEN IVERSON** had 596 assists and 180 steals in 2004-05, per Basketball-Reference.
- **BENCH GAME:** Philadelphia finished fourth in the NBA with an average of 39.8 bench points per game. Returning reserves include guard-forward Justin Anderson, guard-forward Timothé Luwawu-Cabarrot and guard **NIK STAUSKAS**.
 - Luwawu-Cabarrot, the Frenchman, closed out his rookie season by scoring in double figures in a career-best seven consecutive games.

FRESH FACES: The Sixers roster features 17 players, including McAdoe and Pullen, who signed two-way contracts with the team and will spend time with both the Sixers and Delaware 87ers of the G League. **New to the roster:** Fultz, Johnson, Korkmaz, McAdoe, Pullen and Redick. **Returning from last season:** Anderson, Bayless, Covington, Embiid, Holmes, McConnell, Luwawu-Cabarrot, Okafor, Šarić, Simmons and Stauskas. HEAD COACH BRETT BROWN



Brett Brown was named head coach of the Sixers on 8/14/13 after spending the previous seven seasons as an assistant coach on Gregg Popovich's staff in San Antonio. Brown originally joined the Spurs as a member of their basketball operations department in 1998-99 but left after the season to become the head coach of the Sydney Kings of the Australian National Basketball League (NBL). He re-joined the Spurs in July of 2002 as the team's assistant coach/director of player development and was moved to the bench as an assistant coach prior to the 2006-07 season. Brown was with the Spurs for their first four championships (1999, 2003, 2005 and 2007). In March of 2009, Brown was named head coach of the Australian National Team. He had previously served as an assistant for eight years, including both the 1996 and 2000 Olympic Games as well as the 1998 World Championships.
