SPURS-TRAIL BLAZERS 2017-18 SERIES RECAP:

The Spurs were 2-1 against the Portland Trail Blazers last season ... the two teams met for the first time on Dec. 20 with the Spurs stealing a 93-91 road win at the Moda Center ... Pau Gasol posted a season-best 17 rebounds on the night to complement a 20-point performance (8-14 FG, 1-3 3FG, 3-3 FT) ... LaMarcus Aldridge led the Spurs with 22 points (10-17 FG, 2-3 FT), adding eight rebounds and three blocks ... Lillard guided Portland with 17 points (6-17 FG, 2-6 3FG, 3-3 FT) ... The Trail Blazers took the second meeting with the two teams as they hosted the Spurs on Jan. 7, squeezing out a 111-110 win ... CJ McCollum hit the game-winning shot with five seconds remaining to seal the win ... McCollum had a team-high 25 points (11-24 FG, 1-3 3FG, 2-3 FT) and seven assists in the game ... LaMarcus Aldridge was the scoring leader for the Spurs, contributing 30 points (12-21 FG, 1-2 3FG, 5-7 FT) ... Manu Ginobili added 26 points (9-16 FG, 6-9 3FG, 2-3 FT) off the bench ... The Spurs took care of business in the lone meeting at the AT&T Center on April 7, capturing a 116-105 victory ... Aldridge paced the Spurs against his old team with 28 points (13-22 FG, 2-2 FT) and eight rebounds ... The two teams will meet four times during the 2018-19 season.

SPURS-TRAIL BLAZERS CONNECTIONS:

In his first game against his former team, Steve Smith set a franchise record by shooting a perfect 8-of-8 from three-point range at Portland on 11/3/01 ... San Antonio set a franchise record shooting a perfect 25-of-25 from the foul line in Game 3 of the 2014 Western Conference semifinals on 5/10/14 ... the Blazers set a franchise record when they scored 49 points in the first quarter vs. the Spurs on 11/25/90 in Portland ... the 49 points is also the highest single quarter total ever recorded by a Spurs opponent ... the Blazers went on to win the game 117-103 ... Spurs assistant coach Ime Udoka played for the Blazers in the 2006-07 season, averaging 8.4 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.5 assists in 75 games ... Spurs guard Patty Mills was originally selected by the Blazers in the second round (55th overall) of the 2009 NBA Draft ... Mills spent two seasons with the Blazers from 2009-11, averaging 5.1 points and 1.5 assists in 74 games ... San Antonio forward LaMarcus Aldridge spent the first nine seasons of his career in Portland (2006-2015), averaging 19.4 points, 8.4 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 648 games.

SPURS-LAKERS 2017-18 SERIES RECAP:

The Spurs were 0-3 against the Los Angeles Lakers last season ... It marked the first time since the 1997-98 season that Los Angeles swept the season series between the two teams ... The Lakers took the first meeting by a score of 93-81 on 1/11/18, led by 26 points from Brandon Ingram (11-21 FG, 2-5 3FG, 2-5 FT) ... Bryn Forbes posted his third-best scoring output of the season with 18 points (7-12 FG, 4-7 3FG) for San Antonio ... The Lakers made their lone trip to San Antonio on 3/3/18, leaving with a 116-112 victory ... Pau Gasol led the Silver and Black with 19 points (8-17 FG, 3-6 FT), 10 boards and eight assists ... Former Laker Julius Randle led L.A. with 25 points (8-15 FG, 9-11 FT) ... The final meeting came on 4/4/18, in which the Lakers came out on top 122-112 (OT) ... LaMarcus Aldridge paced the Spurs with 28 points, adding nine rebounds and four assists ... Kyle Kuzma recorded one of his four 30-plus-point performances on the year, tallying 30 and five.

SPURS-LAKERS CONNECTIONS:

The Spurs and Lakers have the two best overall winning percentages in NBA history ... the Spurs have met the Lakers in the playoffs 11 times, more than any other team in the league ... former Lakers guard Kobe Bryant holds the Spurs opponent playoff records for points, field goals made, field goals attempted and three-point field goals attempted ... Bryant also holds the Spurs opponent record for most field goal attempts in a game with 41 on 2/14/03 ... Spurs assistant coach Ime Udoka spent the 2003-04 season with the Lakers, appearing in four games ... Spurs center Pau Gasol spent seven seasons with the Lakers, winning two NBA Championships and receiving three NBA All-Star nominations ... Gasol averaged 17.7 points 9.9 rebounds, 3.5 assists, 1.4 blocks per game in 429 total appearances ... with a 102-91 win vs. Los Angeles on 4/24/13 Tim Duncan and Gregg Popovich won their 119th playoff game, surpassing Kobe Bryant and Phil Jackson for the most win by a player-coach duo in NBA postseason history ... Lakers forward Kyle Kuzma and Spurs center Jakob Poeltl played two seasons together at the University of Utah from 2014-16 ... Lakers guard Rajon Rondo was teammates with Spurs forward Rudy Gay and guard Marco Belinelli during the 2015-16 season in Sacramento.

SAN ANTONIO – The Spurs edged out the Timberwolves for a 112-108 win to begin the 2018-19 campaign. San Antonio jumped out to an early advantage, leading by as many as 11 in the opening quarter. Jeff Teague tied the game with 9:01 left in the third quarter before the teams exchanged leads five times in the third. Nine fourth quarter points from each DeMar DeRozan and LaMarcus Aldridge helped to seal the win for the Silver and Black. DeRozan led the Spurs with 28 points (10-21 FG, 1-3 3FG, 7-11 FT) and added four rebounds and four assists in his first regular season game with San Antonio. LaMarcus Aldridge recorded his first double-double performance of the year with 21 points and 19 rebounds. Jeff Teague paced Minnesota with a team-high 27 points and four assists. Jimmy Butler added 23 points to go along with seven rebounds, four steals and three assists.

SPURS 2018 OFFSEASON OUTLINE

ACQUIRED DeMAR DeROZAN AND JAKOB POELTL FROM TORONTO

San Antonio acquired guard DeMar DeRozan, center Jakob Poeltl and a protected 2019 first round pick from Toronto in exchange for Kawhi Leonard and Danny Green on July 18, 2018. DeRozan is a four-time All-Star and two-time all-league player, who spent the first nine seasons of his NBA career with the Raptors. The Compton, California native has averaged 20-plus points per game in each of the last five seasons and set a new career mark with 5.2 assists per game during the 2017-18 campaign. Poeltl is preparing for his third season in the NBA, spending each of the first two in Toronto. The Austria native set new career marks with 6.9 points, 4.8 boards and 1.22 blocks per game in 18.6 minutes last season.

GUARD MANU GINOBILI RETIRES AFTER 16 SEASONS IN SAN ANTONIO

On August 27, Spurs guard Manu Ginobili officially announced his retirement, following a 23-year professional career that included 16 seasons in the NBA as a member of the Silver & Black. The four-time NBA Champion appeared in 1,057 career games, averaging 13.3 points, 3.8 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 1.32 steals in 25.4 minutes. He is the Spurs all-time leader in three-pointers made (1,495) and steals (1,392), while ranking third in games played (1,057), fourth in assists (4,001), fourth in free throws made (3,380) and fifth in points (14,043). Ginobili was named to the All-NBA Third Team in both 2008 and 2011 and was a two-time All-Star (2005 and 2011). The 2008 NBA Sixth Man of the Year is the first sixth man, as well as the first South American, to earn All-NBA honors. The Argentina native ranks third all-time in wins in franchise history, trailing only Tim Duncan and Tony Parker. Ginobili and Parker, who signed with Charlotte during the offseason, hold the record for the most playoff wins by a pair of teammates in NBA history with 132 postseason victories. Ginobili and Duncan's 126 playoff wins together rank third on that list behind Duncan and Parker.

RE-SIGNED RUDY GAY AND BRYN FORBES

The Spurs re-signed 12-year veteran Rudy Gay and third-year guard Bryn Forbes. The former Connecticut Husky appeared in 57 games during the 2017-18 season, including six starts, averaging 11.5 points, 5.1 rebounds and 1.3 assists in 21.6 minutes. Gay will return for his second season with the Silver & Black and his 13th year in the NBA, spending time in Memphis, Toronto, Sacramento and San Antonio. He has averaged double figures in 10-of-12 NBA seasons, playing in 810 games over the course of his NBA career. Forbes originally signed on with the Spurs as an undrafted free agent in July of 2016 and spent the majority of the 2016-17 season with the Austin Spurs. Last season, Forbes produced career bests with 6.9 points, 1.4 rebounds and 1.0 assists over 19.0 minutes per game. The Lansing, Michigan native appeared in 4-of-5 postseason games for San Antonio last season, scoring a playoff-high 14 points to go along with three rebounds and one assist in Game 1 of the Western Conference quarterfinals.

MARCO BELINELLI AND DANTE CUNNINGHAM SIGNED

On July 20, the Spurs signed free agent guard Marco Belinelli and free agent forward Dante Cunningham. Belinelli agreed to a two-year contract with the Spurs, signing on for his second stint in San Antonio. Belinelli formerly played for the Spurs from 2013-15, winning a title in 2014. During his two-year stint with San Antonio, Belinelli contributed 10.4 points, 2.7 boards and 1.9 assists over 24.0 minutes, while shooting .405 from deep and .848 from the charity stripe. He has played on nine different teams throughout his NBA career, most recently playing for the Atlanta Hawks and Philadelphia 76ers in the 2017-18 season. Cunningham agreed to a one-year deal with the Spurs over the offseason, signing on to play for his seventh different team. Last season, Cunningham split time between New Orleans and Brooklyn, tallying 5.7 points and 4.1 boards over 21.4 minutes.



DRAFTED LONNIE WALKER IV

The Spurs drafted Lonnie Walker IV in the first round of the 2018 NBA Draft (29th overall). Walker IV, 6-5/205, played one season at the University of Miami, where he averaged a team-high 11.5 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.9 assists in 27.8 minutes on his way to being named to the ACC All-Freshman team and All-ACC Academic Team. He became the first freshman in school history to earn all-league honors when he was named an honorable mention All-ACC honoree. Walker IV became just the fourth freshman in program history to lead the team in scoring.

DRAFTED CHIMEZIE METU

The Spurs drafted Chimezie Metu in the second round of the 2018 NBA Draft (49th overall). Metu, 6-10/225, spent three seasons with the USC Trojans, leading the team with 15.7 points and 7.4 boards in his final collegiate season. He shot .523 (205-392) from the field and .730 (111-152) from the charity stripe. The Lawndale, California native earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors as a junior, scoring in double figures 29 times and posting 11 double-doubles. He also registered nine games with three-or-more blocks during the 2017-18 season.

DREW EUBANKS SIGNED TO A TWO-WAY CONTRACT

The Spurs signed undrafted free agent forward Drew Eubanks to a two-way contract on July 24. The rookie out of Oregon State started all 32 games for the Beavers in his final season, averaging 13.2 points, 6.8 rebounds, 1.70 blocks and 1.1 assists in 31.3 minutes per game.

DOMINANT IN THE POST(SEASON): San Antonio clinched a playoff berth for the **21st consecutive season last year**, the longest active streak in the NBA, the second-longest being Golden State and Houston with 6. **The Spurs were the first team to reach the Playoffs with no more than one player averaging at least 12 PPG since the 1953-54 Minneapolis Lakers** (George Mikan averaged 18.1 ppg). STANDOUT SEASON: LaMarcus Aldridge led the Spurs in scoring 59 times last season. **He is just the fifth Spur in franchise history to lead the team in scoring at least 50 times in a single season** along with Kawhi Leonard, Tim Duncan, David Robinson and George Gervin. He scored in double figures 73 times – in all but two games he has played this season. After the Spurs loss against the Pelicans on 4/11, **Aldridge has now scored in double figures in 783 games in his career.** There are only three players with more double-digit scoring games since Aldridge entered the NBA in 2006: LeBron James, Dirk Nowitzki, Carmelo Anthony. Aldridge notched his 51st 20-point game of the season vs. the Trail Blazers on 4/7. **He had the same amount of 20+ point games last season (in 75 games) that he had from 2015-2017 (in 146 games).**

PAU PAU PAU: In the Spurs victory at Memphis, Pau Gasol recorded his 10th double-double of the season. **He is the first player 37 or older with 10+ double-doubles since Tim Duncan in 2015-16.** In the Spurs victory at Sacramento on 12/23, Pau Gasol recorded the 42nd triple-double in Spurs history and the first triple-double for the Spurs since Tim Duncan's in December of 2014 with 14 points (5-8 FG, 2-3 3FG, 2-3 FT), 11 rebounds and 10 assists. **With his 10th career triple-double, Gasol became one of five players in NBA history to record such a feat at age 37 or older with Karl Malone, Tim Duncan, Jason Kidd (3x) and Elvin Hayes.**
