SPURS 2018-19 SEASON SNAPSHOT

70 YEARS YOUNG: On 1/28/19, Gregg Popovich celebrated his 70th birthday and became the just the fourth head coach in NBA history to coach at the age of 70, joining Bill Bertka, Hubie Brown and Larry Brown.

PAUERFUL PERFORMANCE: In the Spurs loss to the Jazz on 2/12/18, Pau Gasol grabbed his 11,000th career rebound, becoming just **one of four players in NBA history and the sole active player to reach 20,000 points, 11,000 rebounds, 3,500 assists and 1,900 blocks.** He is the 30th player in NBA history to record 11,000 career boards and 21st player to reach 1,900 blocks. He is the **only European player** besides Dirk Nowitzki and just the sixth born outside the United States (Hakeem Olajuwon, Dominique Wilkins, Tim Duncan, Patrick Ewing) to tally 20,000+ points in his career and just the 8th active and 43rd player in NBA history to reach the mark.

SEEING DOUBLE: Pau Gasol and Rudy Gay each recorded double-doubles off the bench in the win over the Lakers on 10/27, marking the first time in 2018-19 that any team had a double-double by two different bench players. The Spurs had not had accomplished this feat since April 18, 1997 (Will Perdue and Jamie Feick).

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER: The Spurs captured a 154-147 double-overtime victory on 1/10/19, setting multiple records in the game:

- With his 1,222nd career win, Gregg Popovich surpassed Jerry Sloan for third place on the NBA's all-time coaching wins list.
- San Antonio shot an NBA-record 84.2 percent (16-of-19) from behind the arc, which ranks as the best all-time for a single game among teams who converted on at least 10 three-pointers.
- The Spurs connected on each of their first 14 three-point attempts to begin the game, which were the most by a team over the past 20 seasons.
- The 154 points scored by the Silver & Black were their most since scoring 161 on 11/7/90.
- The 301 combined points were the most in an NBA game since 12/7/06 when the Suns and Nets played to double OT.
- LaMarcus Aldridge recorded a career-high 56 points – the third-most points ever scored by a Spurs player and the most ever scored by a Spur in San Antonio. Aldridge (33) became the second-oldest player in NBA history to put up a 50-point performance.
- Derrick White set a then career high with 23 points.
- Marco Belinelli hit three, three-pointers within a single minute of game action for the second time this season.



SPURS 2018-19 TEAM NOTES

CONSISTENT WINNING: With the win on 2/13/17 at Indiana, **Spurs passed the Utah Jazz to claim the most consecutive winning seasons ever in NBA history.** They also hold **second place for the longest active streak of winning seasons across the four major sports** just behind the New York Yankees (26 since 1993), and have the **fifth longest such streak in history** behind the New York Yankees (39 from 1926-64), Montreal Canadiens (32 from 1951-83), Boston Bruins (29 from 1967-96) and Detroit Red Wings (24 from 1991-16). DOMINANT IN THE POST(SEASON): San Antonio clinched a playoff berth for the **21st consecutive season last year**, the longest active streak in the NBA, the second-longest being Golden State and Houston with 6. **The Spurs were the first team to reach the Playoffs with no more than one player averaging at least 12 PPG since the 1953-54 Minneapolis Lakers** (George Mikan averaged 18.1 ppg). The Silver and Black are now **tied for second all-time in NBA history** for consecutive playoff appearances. **The Spurs have now gone to the Playoffs 38 times in the 42 seasons they have been in the NBA since 1976, the most a team has gone to the Playoffs in that time span.** The Spurs own the **longest active streak of playoff appearances across all four major U.S. sports.** Gregg Popovich now has the longest streak of postseason appearances by a head coach in NBA history.
