The Suns now trail 0-3 in the series following a 126-109 loss to the Timberwolves in Game 3 at Footprint Center on Friday night ... Wit his 16th point of the night on Friday, Devin Booker surpassed Amar'e Stoudemire for fifth on the Suns all-time postseason scoring list and now needs 8 more points to move past Charles Barkley for fourth ... Scoring a team-high 31 points in Game 1 last Saturday, Kevin Durant moved into sole possession of 3rd for the most 25+ point games in NBA postseason history (127) after entering the night tied with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (trails only LeBron James & Michael Jordan) ... Devin Booker and Kevin Durant became the third pair of teammates to each average 27+ points for a season, joining Elgin Baylor and Jerry West, as well as Shaquille O'Neal and Kobe Bryant (min. 60 games played) ... Devin Booker finished as 1-of-3 players this season to rank in the top-11 in both scoring (6th) and assists (11th), joining Luka Dončić and Nikola Jokic ... Grayson Allen led the NBA in 3-pt shooting percentage this season at 46.1%, and ranked second in the league for the most games with 8+ triples (7) this season ... With his 9th point of the night on March 20 vs. Philadelphia, Kevin Durant surpassed Shaquille O'Neal for 8th on the NBA's all-time scoring list and now needs 2,496 more points to move past Wilt Chamberlin for 7th on the NBA's all-time scoring list ... The NBA announced on March 7 that Phoenix would host the 2027 NBA All-Star Game at Footprint Center, the city's fourth NBA All-Star Game (1975, 1995, 2009) ... Jusuf Nurkic was 1 of only 3 players (Sabonis & Gobert) to grab 20+ rebounds in back-to-back games this season and joined Tyson Chandler as the only players in Suns history to do so ... Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Devin Booker has totaled 27 instances with 20+ points in a quarter, the most such games in the NBA over that span ... Since the start of the 2020-21 season, the Suns hold a combined regular season record of 209-109, the best record in the NBA since the start of the 2020-21 season.

PHOENIX – The Suns (0-3) dropped a third playoff game, falling to the Timberwolves (3-0), 126-109, on April 26 in Footprint Center. The Timberwolves won the battle of the boards in Game 3, outrebounding the Suns 50-28 on the night. 15 of Minnesota's 50 rebounds were on the offensive glass, leading to 19 second chance points. Phoenix finished with 5 offensive rebounds, leading to eight second-chance points. Already up by five (62-58) with 8:46 remaining in the third quarter, the Timberwolves used a 23-8 run in just over five minutes to build their lead up to 20 (86-66) with 3:39 to go in the third. Minnesota's lead extended up to as many as 22, as the Suns were unable to cut the lead to single digits the rest of the way. Bradley Beal netted a team-high 28 points, while notching 4 rebounds and 4 assists, while Devin Booker tallied 23 points on 8-of-15 shooting for the Suns. He added a game-high 8 assists and 2 steals and with his 16th point of the night, Booker surpassed Amar'e Stoudemire for fifth on the Suns all-time postseason scoring list. Kevin Durant notched 25 points, to go along with 4 rebounds and 5 assists. His 20+ point game marked the 155th of his career, moving him into sole possession of fifth for the most 20+ point games in NBA postseason history. Eric Gordon added 11 points in 34 minutes off the bench tonight to lead all Suns reserves.



MINNEAPOLIS - The Suns (49-33) moved to 10-4 over their last 14 games following a 125-106 win over the Timberwolves (56-26) on April 14 to close out their regular season slate. The Suns finished 3-0 against Minnesota on the season and the win helped secure the sixth-seed in the Playoffs, avoiding a play-in scenario. Phoenix used a hot start to the game to jump out to a 44-22 lead at the end of the first quarter, shooting 66.7% from the field, including an 8-of-11 mark from three-point range, in the first 12 minutes alone. Phoenix's defense forced 24 turnovers in the win, leading to 36 points on the other end, while 19 of those turnovers came in the first half, tying the NBA record for the most turnovers in a half. The Timberwolves managed to cut the deficit to as little as 10 in the third quarter, but never managed to cut it to single digits the rest of the way. Bradley Beal scored a game-high 36 points on 14-of-21 shooting (6-of-6 3FG) to go along with 6 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals. Devin Booker notched 23 points, 7 assists and 4 rebounds, while Grayson Allen added 20 points on 8-of-11 shooting (3-of-3 3FG) and 6 rebounds. Kevin Durant finished with 15 points and 4 rebounds, while Thaddeus Young and Josh Okogie led all Suns reserves with 5 points each.






KEVIN DURANT scored a team-high 31 points on 11-of-17 shooting (2-of-2 3FG), to go along with 7 rebounds and a block in Game 1 on Saturday. Scoring 31 points, Durant moved into sole possession of 3rd for the most 25+ points games in NBA postseason history with 127 after entering the night tied with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (trails only LeBron James and Michael Jordan).

DEVIN BOOKER notched 18 points, 5 assists and 2 rebounds in Game 1 Saturday afternoon at Minnesota. Booker now needs 36 points to surpass Amar'e Stoudemire for 5th on the Suns all-time postseason scoring list and 11 more three-pointers to pass Dan Majerle for the most triples in franchise history.

BRADLEY BEAL posted 15 points, 6 assists and 3 steals in Sunday's Game 1 at Minnesota. Playing in his 46th career playoff game on Saturday, it marked his 45th-career postseason game scoring in double figures and his 12th playoff game recording 3+ steals.

ROCYE O'NEALE added 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting (4-of-8 3FG) and 4 rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench on Saturday. O'Neale's 4 triples matched his postseason career high, which he's now done six times. His performance marked the 21st instance in franchise history of a player making at least 4 three-pointers off the bench in a playoff games.

With the loss on Saturday, the Suns moved to 68-55 all-time in Round 1 games of the playoffs and 27-33 in Round 1 road games.

The Suns dropped to 33-21 all-time in Game 1's, including an 8-22 mark in Game 1's on the road.

KEVIN DURANT and DEVIN BOOKER ranked 5th and 6th, respectively, in league scoring this season, both finishing the regular season averaging 27.1 points per game. 
SELLOUT MILESTONE



HISTORIC COMEBACK

+ The Suns completed one of the most historic comebacks in NBA history in the team's 119-117 win over Sacrameto on Jan. 16, 2023. Trailing by 22 wiht 8:22 remaining in the game, Phoenix used a 32-8 run to close out the game for the two-point win. Per the Elias Sports Bureau, 22 points is the largest fourth-quarter deficit the Suns have overcome to win since the league added play-by-play during the 1997-98 season. Since 1997-98, there have been over 8,200 team to face a deficit of 20+ points with less than 8 minutes remaining in the 4th quarter of a regular season game. The Suns comeback marked just the second time a team has comeback to win, per Elias.

SCORCHIN' SUNS 10-GAME STRETCH

+ Over the course of 10 games spanning Jan. 22-Feb. 8, 2024, the Suns shot 56.0% from the field, the best field goal percentage in franchise history over a 10-game stretch and the best field goal percentage by any NBA team since the Boston Celtics shot 56.3% over 10 games in April, 1988.



Respected throughout the league for his culture building and championship pedigree, Frank Vogel is in his first season as head coach for the Phoenix Suns in 2023-23 after being named the 21st coach in franchise history on June 6, 2023.

As the Suns conducted their coaching search, Vogel stood above due to his track record of success throughout his time as an NBA head coach, bringing to the Suns the experience of what it takes to capture a title and build a winning culture around talented players. His creativity and ability to build relationships were also significant factors as Vogel has established the skill to connect with and develop players, and to construct a dynamic coaching staff.

Vogel, 49, is in his 12th year as an NBA head coach, having seen stints with the Indiana Pacers (2011-2016), Orlando Magic (2016-2-18), Los Angeles Lakers (2019-2022) and Phoenix Suns (2023-current), winning an NBA Championship with the Lakers in 2020 and amassing an overall record of 480-422 as a head coach. In three of his seasons as a head coach, Vogel's team has led the league in defensive rating and he has guided his team to a top-three finish in defensive rating five times; since he entered the NBA head coaching ranks in 2010-11, no head coach has led the league or ranked in the top three in defense more often than Vogel.

Over his 12-year head coaching career, Vogel has guided his teams to three division titles, earning a No. 1 seed for the playoffs in two of those seasons. He has five times been named an NBA Coach of the Month, three times finished in the top five in NBA Coach of the Year voting and twice served as head coach for the NBA All-Star Game.

Vogel has led his teams to the playoffs in eight of his 12 seasons as a head coach, three times progressing to the conference finals including the league title in 2020. Vogel holds a .557 winning percentage in 88 postseason games as a head coach, which ranks 15th in NBA history among those who have coached at least 70 career playoff games.

Vogel spent eight seasons as an NBA assistant coach before becoming a head coach, making stops with the Boston Celtics (2001-2004), Philadelphia 76ers (2004-05) and Pacers (2007-2011) before being named the interim head coach for Indiana midway through the 2010-11 season, guiding the Pacers to their first playoff appearance since 2006. He was officially named the team's head coach that offseason and went on to total an overall record of 250-181 at the helm of the Pacers, remaining the Pacers' franchise leader in NBA wins. Indiana reached the postseason in four of his five seasons there, including back-to-back trips to the Eastern Conference Finals in 2013 and 2014.

After two seasons as Orlando's head coach from 2016-2018 where he oversaw a young and developing roster, Vogel headed west to become the 27th head coach in Lakers franchise history. In his first season in Los Angeles in 2019-20, Vogel helped guide the team with All-Stars LeBron James and Anthony Davis to the West's best regular season record and a 16-5 playoff run on the way to the NBA championship.

A graduate of the University of Kentucky, Vogel was a student manager for head coach Rick Pitino and contributed to the Wildcats' national title in 1996. He transferred to Kentucky following three years as a starter for Division III Juniata College and got his start in the NBA as the head video coordinator for Pitino with the Boston Celtics before earning his first assistant coaching role with Boston in the 2001-02 season.

A native of Wildwood Crest, N.J., Vogel and his wife Jenifer have two daughters, Alexa and Arianna.


