QUICKLY

The Suns dropped to 46-32 on the season and 7-3 over their last 10 games following a 113-105 loss to the Pelicans Sunday afternoon at Footprint Center ... Scoring 52 points on April 1 at New Orleans, Devin Booker joined Wilt Chamberlin as the only players in NBA history to score 50+ points in three-straight games vs. a single opponent ... With his 9th point of the night on March 20 vs. Philadelphia, Kevin Durant surpassed Shaquille O'Neal for 8th on the NBA's all-time scoring list and now needs 2,584 more points to move past Wilt Chamberlin for 7th on the NBA's all-time scoring list ... Devin Booker has tallied 40+ points and 5+ assists in back-to-back games on April 1 & 3, tying his own franchise record for the most consecutive games with 40+ points and 5+ assists ... The NBA announced on March 7 that Phoenix would host the 2027 NBA All-Star Game at Footprint Center, the city's fourth NBA All-Star Game (1975, 1995, 2009) ... Jusuf Nurkić grabbed 20+ rebounds on March 14 and 15, 1-of-3 players in the NBA this season with back-to-back games of 20+ boards (Sabonis & Gobert) and joined Tyson Chandler as the only players in franchise history to do so ... Since the start of the 2016-17 season, Devin Booker has totaled 27 instances with 20+ points in a quarter, the most such games in the NBA over that span ... Devin Booker scored 62 points on Jan. 26 in Indiana, his second-highest scoring game of his career, while his 29 points in the first quarter set a new franchise record for points in a quarter ... Kevin Durant has tallied 1,944 points in his first 71 games of this season, the most points by a Suns player in franchise in the first 71 games of a player's season ... The Suns had a 40+ point scorer in six-straight games (Jan. 19-28), the longest such streak in franchise history and the first time any team in the NBA had done so since the 2002-03 Lakers (all Kobe Bryant) ... Grayson Allen ranks 2nd in the NBA in 3-pt shooting percentage at 46.6%, ranks second in the league for the most games with 8+ triples (7) this season, and is 1-of-3 qualified players in the NBA shooting 50+ FG%, 40+ 3FG% and 87+ FT% (Kawhi Leonard & Karl-Anthony Towns) ... Devin Booker is 1-of-3 players this season to rank in the top-10 in both scoring (6th) and assists (10th), joining Luka Dončić and Nikola Jokic ... Since the start of the 2020-21 season, the Suns hold a combined record of 206-108, the best record in the NBA since the start of the 2020-21 season.

PHOENIX – The Suns (46-32) dropped to 7-3 over their last night games following a 113-105 loss to the Pelicans (46-32) on April 7 at Footprint Center. After the Suns jumped out to a 20-8 lead to begin the game and 3:38 remaining in the first quarter, New Orleans used a 38-18 run to take a three-point, 41-38, lead with 4:18 to go in the second quarter. While the Suns did manage to regain the lead, the Pelicans went on to build up their lead to as many as 12. In a game where both teams shot a similar field goal percentage, the Pelicans shot 41.0% from three-point range, knocking down 16 of their 39 attempts from beyond the arc, two more than the Suns, who finished 14-of-39. New Orleans also made four more free throws than Phoenix, finishing 17-for-19 to the Suns 13-for-14 mark. **Bradley Beal** tallied a game-high 33 points on 13-of-19 shooting (7-of-8 3FG), 5 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 blocks, while **Devin Booker** netted 25 points on 9-of-16 shooting to go along with 7 assists and 3 rebounds. **Kevin Durant** posted 23 points to go along with 6 assists and 4 rebounds and **Grayson Allen** added 11 points, 5 rebounds, 2 steals and 2 blocks.

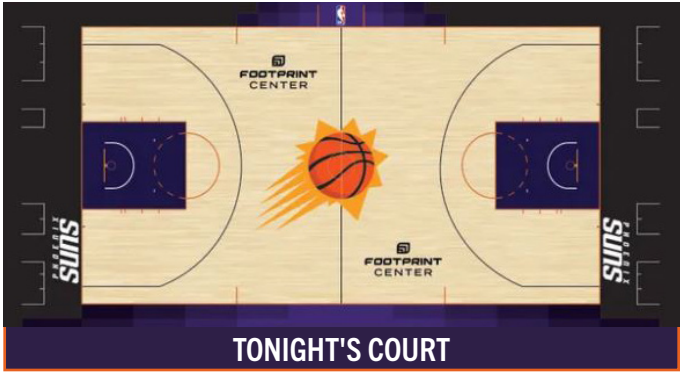

### LAST TIME OUT

- + **BRADLEY BEAL** tallied a game-high 33 points on 13-of-19 shooting (7-of-8 3FG), 5 assists, 3 rebounds and 2 blocks Sunday afternoon. The game marked his fifth 30+ point game of the season, while his seven triples are the second-most he's made in a game this season trailing only the 8 he made on Jan. 11 at Los Angeles Lakers.
- + **DEVIN BOOKER** netted 25 points on 9-of-16 shooting on Sunday to go along with 7 assists and 3 rebounds. Booker entered the game having scored 50+ points in three consecutive games against the Pelicans, joining Wilt Chamberlin as the only players in NBA history with 50+ points in at least three-straight games against a single opponent in the last meeting with New Orleans on April 1. He finished the regular season series with New Orleans having averaged 43.0 points on 62.2% shooting (42.4 3FG%) and 7.0 assists in the three meetings.
- + **KEVIN DURANT** posted 23 points to go along with 6 assists and 4 rebounds. Durant has now scored 1,944 points in his first 71 games of this season, the most points in a player's first 71 games in franchise history.
- + **GRAYSON ALLEN** added 11 points, 5 rebounds, 2 steals and 2 blocks for the Suns on Sunday. Allen ranks second in the NBA in three-point shooting percentage at 46.6%.
- + **JUSUF NURKIC** tallied 6 points, 10 rebounds, 6 assists and 3 steals on Sunday. Nurkic's 3 steals matched his season high, which he's done six times now, while the game marked his fourth-straight game grabbing 10+ rebounds.

### SELLOUT MILESTONE

- + With a sellout crowd at Footprint Center on Jan. 3, 2023 against the LA Clippers, it marked the team's 100th consecutive home sellout in the regular season and playoffs combined since the streak began on Dec. 19, 2021. It's the third Suns sellout streak to reach triple digits in franchise history (390 straight from 1990-1999 and 153 straight from 2006-2009). Below is a look at some of the most memorable moments at Footprint Center from the active streak:
- + **Dec. 19, 2021:** Sellout streak begins at Footprint Center as Suns defeat the Hornets 137-106.
- + **April 5, 2022:** The Suns beat the Lakers for their 63rd win of the 2021-22 season, setting a franchise record for wins. The team would finish the regular season with 64 wins.
- + **Oct. 19, 2022:** Damion Lee makes the game-winning shot in the final seconds of his Suns debut as the team erases a 21-point deficit to beat the Mavericks.
- + **Nov. 30, 2022:** In a win over the Bulls, Devin Booker scores 51 points in just 31 minutes of action.
- + **Dec. 17, 2022:** Devin Booker sets the Footprint Center scoring record with 58 points to lead the Suns back from a 24-point deficit in a win over the Pelicans.
- + **Feb. 24, 2023:** In a win over the Thunder, Devin Booker passes Steve Nash to become the franchise's all-time leader in three-point field goals.
- + **March 29, 2023:** Kevin Durant plays in front of a home crowd for a first time as a member of the Suns in a win over the Timberwolves.
- + **April 9, 2023:** Al McCoy is honored during halftime as he calls the final regular season game of his 51-year run as 'The Voice of the Suns.'
- + **April 25, 2023:** In a series-clinching win against the Clippers, Devin Booker scores 47 points on 19-of-27 shooting plus 10 assists and 8 rebounds.
- + **Oct. 28, 2023:** The Suns debut a reimagined Ring of Honor at Footprint Center, inviting Ring of Honor members and other alumni to be present as permanent banners are unveiled above the seating bowl.

### HISTORIC COMEBACK

- + The Suns completed one of the most historic comebacks in NBA history in the team's 119-117 win over Sacramento on Jan. 16, 2023. Trailing by 22 with 8:22 remaining in the game, Phoenix used a 32-8 run to close out the game for the two-point win. Per the Elias Sports Bureau, 22 points is the largest fourth-quarter deficit the Suns have overcome to win since the league added play-by-play during the 1997-98 season. Since 1997-98, there have been over 8,200 team to face a deficit of 20+ points with less than 8 minutes remaining in the 4th quarter of a regular season game. The Suns comeback marked just the second time a team has comeback to win, per Elias.

### SCORCHIN' SUNS 10-GAME STRETCH

- + Over the course of 10 games spanning Jan. 22-Feb. 8, 2024, the Suns shot 56.0% from the field, the best field goal percentage in franchise history over a 10-game stretch and the best field goal percentage by any NBA team since the Boston Celtics shot 56.3% over 10 games in April, 1988.

- + With the new look roster, the Suns now feature a new 'Big 3' in **DEVIN BOOKER, KEVIN DURANT** and **BRADLEY BEAL**. - + **KEVIN DURANT** finished the 2022-23 regular season shooting 56.0 FG%, 40.4 3FG% and 91.9 FT% on the season. He became the first QUALIFIED player in NBA history to shoot 55+ FG%, 40+ 3FG% and 90+ FT% in a single season.

### NURK ON THE BOARDS

- + Over a span of five games from Feb. 25-March 5, 2024, **JUSUF NURKIC** totaled 88 rebounds, tying Charles Barkley for the most rebounds over a five-game span by a Suns player since at least 1975-76 (Stathead) and later went on to grab the most rebounds by a Suns player over a 10-game stretch since 1975-76 as well. He had two games with 20+ rebounds over the five-game span, including a career and franchise-record 31 on March 3 vs. Oklahoma City, and notched 20+ rebounds in four games over the 10-game stretch.

- + In the Suns win over the Raptors on March 7, 2024, Allen set the franchise record for threes in a quarter, making 7 in the first quarter. He also matched the franchise record for three-pointers in a half, making 8 in the opening half. Between the Suns game on March 5 at Denver and March 7, 2024 vs. Toronto, Allen set a new franchise record for three-pointers over a two-game span with 16.

### DEEP THREAT

- + Through the first 10 games of this season, **GRAYSON ALLEN** made 27 three-pointers, including a career-high 8 on Nov. 8 at Chicago. Allen's 27 triples tied as the sixth-most by a Suns player in franchise history through the first 10 games of a season. ### A NEW ERA OF THE SUNS

- + On Feb. 7, 2023, **MAT ISHBIA** completed the acquisition of the controlling ownership interest in the Phoenix Suns (NBA) and Phoenix Mercury (WNBA) franchises, the operating entity for Footprint Center and affiliated entities following the NBA Board of Governors approval. With the transaction, Mat became the Governor of the Suns and Mercury while **JUSTIN ISHBIA**, CEO and Founder of Shore Capital Partners, becomes the second largest shareholder and Alternate Governor.
- + **ABOUT MAT:** Mat is the chairman, president and CEO of United Wholesale Mortgage (UWM), the number one overall mortgage lender in the nation. Under Mat's leadership, UWM has become one of the most innovative leaders in the industry and has grown from a 12-person company to a nearly 7,000-person team working together on one campus in Pontiac, Michigan. At the end of 2021, UWM broke the record of wholesale volume in one year with over \$226.5 billion in mortgage originations, while holding the title of the fastest-growing mortgage company in America. Prior to joining UWM, Mat played on Michigan State University's basketball team for four years – going to three Final Fours and winning the National Championship in 2000. He also spent a year coaching alongside Tom Izzo. Mat graduated from MSU's Eli Broad College of Business in 2003.
- + **ABOUT JUSTIN:** Justin is the Founder and Managing Partner of Shore Capital Partners, one of the nation's best performing private equity firms with offices in Chicago and Nashville. Since the firm's inception in 2009, Justin has grown Shore from 4 to 120 team members managing over \$6 billion in Regulatory Assets Under Management across more than 50 platforms representing 800+ acquired companies. By the end of 2022, Shore has been recognized each of the last 3 years as one of Inc. Magazine's Top Founder-Friendly Private Equity Firms. Justin is also a member of the Vanderbilt University Board of Trust and Chicago's Museum of Science and Industry Board.
- + The Ishbia Brothers' business acumen and passion for the game will invigorate the Suns and Mercury in the continued effort to compete at a championship level. Mat and Justin join two storied franchises which have a combined 5 Finals appearances and 3 Championships since 2007. Their collective desire to use sports as a conduit for establishing community will enhance the already devoted and dynamic Phoenix fan base. As the NBA's youngest controlling owner and a former college basketball player, Mat will be in a unique position to create strategic opportunities within the greater Phoenix community that reflect the Suns' and Mercury's shared commitment to excellence on and off the court.

### RISE OF THE SUNS

- + The Suns advanced to the NBA Finals three seasons ago, the **3rd** Western Conference title in franchise history as 2021 joined 1993 and 1976 as banner years.
- + The Suns clinched a Pacific Division title in the 2021-22 season for a second-straight year, their **8th** division title in franchise history as the Suns have won the Pacific Division in 1980-81, 1992-93, 1994-95, 2004-05, 2005-06, 2006-07, 2020-21 and now 2021-22.
- + In 2018-19, the Suns tied for the 2nd-worst record in the NBA at 19-63. Shortly after that season, **JAMES JONES** was officially named as general manager. Just two seasons later, the Suns finished with the **2nd-best** record in the NBA at **51-21**. This marked just the third time since the NBA-ABA Merger that a team jumped from bottom two to top two in two seasons or less:

Respected throughout the league for his culture building and championship pedigree, Frank Vogel enters his first season as head coach for the Phoenix Suns in 2023-23 after being named the 21st coach in franchise history on June 6, 2023.

As the Suns conducted their coaching search, Vogel stood above due to his track record of success throughout his time as an NBA head coach, bringing to the Suns the experience of what it takes to capture a title and build a winning culture around talented players. His creativity and ability to build relationships were also significant factors as Vogel has established the skill to connect with and develop players, and to construct a dynamic coaching staff.

Vogel, 49, joins the Suns with 11 years of experience as an NBA head coach with the Indiana Pacers (2011-2016), Orlando Magic (2016-2-18) and Los Angeles Lakers (2019-2022), winning an NBA Championship with the Lakers in 2020 and amassing an overall record of 431-389 as a head coach. In three of his seasons as a head coach, Vogel’s team has led the league in defensive rating and he has guided his team to a top-three finish in defensive rating five times; since he entered the NBA head coaching ranks in 2010-11, no head coach has led the league or ranked in the top three in defense more often than Vogel.

Over his 11-year head coaching career, Vogel has guided his teams to three division titles, earning a No. 1 seed for the playoffs in two of those seasons. He has five times been named an NBA Coach of the Month, three times finished in the top five in NBA Coach of the Year voting and twice served as head coach for the NBA All-Star Game.

Vogel has led his teams to the playoffs in seven of his 11 seasons as a head coach, three times progressing to the conference finals including the league title in 2020. Vogel holds a .557 winning percentage in 88 postseason games as a head coach, which ranks 15th in NBA history among those who have coached at least 70 career playoff games.

Vogel spent eight seasons as an NBA assistant coach before becoming a head coach, making stops with the Boston Celtics (2001-2004), Philadelphia 76ers (2004-05) and Pacers (2007-2011) before being named the interim head coach for Indiana midway through the 2010-11 season, guiding the Pacers to their first playoff appearance since 2006. He was officially named the team’s head coach that offseason and went on to total an overall record of 250-181 at the helm of the Pacers, remaining the Pacers’ franchise leader in NBA wins. Indiana reached the postseason in four of his five seasons there, including back-to-back trips to the Eastern Conference Finals in 2013 and 2014.

After two seasons as Orlando’s head coach from 2016-2018 where he oversaw a young and developing roster, Vogel headed west to become the 27th head coach in Lakers franchise history. In his first season in Los Angeles in 2019-20, Vogel helped guide the team with All-Stars LeBron James and Anthony Davis to the West’s best regular season record and a 16-5 playoff run on the way to the NBA championship.

A graduate of the University of Kentucky, Vogel was a student manager for head coach Rick Pitino and contributed to the Wildcats’ national title in 1996. He transferred to Kentucky following three years as a starter for Division III Juniata College and got his start in the NBA as the head video coordinator for Pitino with the Boston Celtics before earning his first assistant coaching role with Boston in the 2001-02 season.

A native of Wildwood Crest, N.J., Vogel and his wife Jenifer have two daughters, Alexa and Arianna.
