WESTERN CONFERENCE FINALS OPPONENT – SAN ANTONIO SPURS 2011-12 Season Series (2-1 Spurs)

Thunder vs. Spurs: After defeating the Los Angeles Lakers 4-1 in the second round, the Oklahoma City Thunder has advanced to the Western Conference Finals for a second consecutive season for the first time since making three straight trips to the Conference Finals during the 1978, 1979 and 1980 seasons. The San Antonio Spurs and the OKC Thunder are set to meet in a postseason series for the fourth time in the history of the two franchises. The two franchises last met in the Western Conference Semi-Finals during the 2005 playoffs. The Spurs have won all three previous postseason match-ups and the OKC franchise sits at 5-11 all-time in games played in the playoffs against the Spurs. The two teams have never before met in the Conference Finals.

2011-12 Rewind: Oklahoma City entered the 2012 postseason having wrapped-up the second best regular season record in the Western Conference (47-19) and the highest year-end winning percentage by the franchise since the 1997-98 season (.744). The Thunder's .712 winning percentage this past season ranks fourth best all-time for the franchise. After finishing the 2008-09 season with a record of 23-59, the Oklahoma City Thunder has now captured playoff berths during each of the three subsequent seasons (the OKC franchise is making three straight trips to the playoffs for the first time since 1996-1998).

March 16, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena San Antonio 114 – Oklahoma City 105

The Thunder trimmed what was once a 27-point San Antonio advantage to as few as two points on three occasions in the fourth quarter, but in the end, Danny Green scored 10 fourth quarter points (4-5 FGs) and the Spurs held off the late Thunder run to claim victory... Through two quarters of play the Spurs shot 57.8% (26-45 FGs), while the Thunder shot just 38.6% (17-44) in the first half... After trailing 72-90 in the final two minutes of the third quarter, the Thunder used an 18-2 spurt to pull within two points of the Spurs with just over nine minutes left in regulation. In all three instances in which the Thunder cut the SA lead to two points in the fourth quarter, the Spurs proceeded to score on their ensuing possession. San Antonio closed the game on a 7-0 run to secure the win...Serge Ibaka registered his ninth double-double of the season with 12 points to go along with a team-high 12 rebounds and six blocks...Led by Tim Duncan (19 rebounds) the Spurs outrebounded the Thunder by a 49-37 margin...The Spurs managed to outscore the Thunder 54-36 in the paint and 24-9 in second chance opportunities.

February 4, 2012 at AT&T Center San Antonio 107- San Antonio 96

Despite six Thunder players scoring in double-figures, Tony Parker set a season-high with 42 points (16-29 FGs) as the Spurs defeated the Thunder to improve to a NBA-leading 13-1 at home this season...The Thunder deficit ballooned to as many as 24 points in the third quarter and in the fourth quarter, the Thunder trimmed the Spurs lead to nine points with 8:27 left in regulation, but San Antonio quickly scored six unanswered points to push their lead to 99-84 with less than six minutes remaining...Kevin Durant matched a career-long streak after recording a fifth consecutive double-double with a team-high 22 points and 11 rebounds...San Antonio was effective shooting the ball from long range. After shooting 9-of-12 from 3-point range in the first half (69.2%), three Spurs players finished the night with three made 3-point field goals (Bonner, Jefferson and Leonard)...With nine assists to go along with his season-high 42 points, Tony Parker passed Avery Johnson to become the Spurs All-Time assists leader.

January 8, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena Oklahoma City 108 - San Antonio 96

Playing for the third time in three days, the Thunder turned a six-point halftime lead into a 22-point advantage heading into the fourth quarter as Oklahoma City became the first team in the NBA this season to "sweep" a back-to-back-to-back...The Thunder led by as many as 25 points early in the 4th quarter and no Thunder starter saw action in the final 12 minutes of regulation...During the 3rd quarter in which the Thunder scored a season-high 37 points, Oklahoma City shot 70.6% from the field (12-17 FGs) while limiting the Spurs to 21 points on 38.9% shooting (7-18 FGs)...Nick Collison recorded his first double-double of the season. In 22 minutes, Collision pulled-down a game-high (tying) 10 rebounds while shooting 6-of-7 from the field...James Harden hit the 20-point scoring mark after shooting 6-of-11 from the field in 22 minutes...The 12 point victory for the Thunder is the largest margin of victory for the OKC franchise over the Spurs since 11/7/04 (19-point victory).



SECOND ROUND OPPONENT – LOS ANGELES LAKERS

Playoff Series (4-1 Thunder)

2011-12 Season Series (2-1 Thunder)

Thunder vs. Lakers: After defeating the Los Angeles Lakers 3-1, the Oklahoma City Thunder is set to advance to the Western Conference Finals for a second consecutive season. With the series victory versus Los Angeles, the OKC franchise is now 3-6 all-time in postseason series against Los Angeles. By taking four of the five games in the series, the OKC franchise is now 15-26 in playoff meetings versus the Lakers. After overcoming a 13-point fourth quarter deficit to win Game 4 at STAPLES Center, the OKC franchise broke a string of 14 consecutive postseason road losses against the Lakers. Finally, with the Thunder's 106-90 victory over the Lakers in Game 5 the OKC franchise improved to 21-4 all-time in closeout games played at home (26-26 in closeout games overall).

KD is Clutch: With 14 seconds left in regulation during Game 4, Kevin Durant gave the Thunder a 101-98 lead after connecting on a 3-point field goal from the top of the key. Kevin Durant is now 10-23 in game-tying or go-ahead field goals in the last 24 seconds of the 4th quarter/OT this season (including the playoffs). Durant's 10 field goals in such instances leads the NBA (Derrick Rose and Chris Paul rank tied for second with 5 such makes). Meanwhile, Lakers' guard Kobe Bryant is shooting 3-of-18 in the same situation. The league average this season (including playoffs) is 27.8 percent in game-tying or go-ahead field goals in the last 24 seconds of the 4th quarter/OT this season (ESPN Stats & Information).

Elias Sports Bureau Note: During the last 10 years, there have been eight series played between one team coming off a sweep and the other off a seven-game series. Including the Thunder's defeat of the Lakers, seven of those eight series were won by the team coming off the sweep, with the lone exception being the Orlando Magic's elimination of the Cleveland Cavaliers in the 2009 Eastern Conference Finals.

May 21, 2012 at STAPLES Center

Oklahoma City 106 - Los Angeles 90

With the score tied at the four minute mark of the third period, the Thunder closed the game by outscoring the Lakers 36-20 to take the series against the Lakers 4-1...With Kobe Bryant on the bench for the start of the fourth quarter, the Thunder scored eight unanswered points to extended the OKC lead to 14 points before Bryant could return to the Lakers' lineup with 10:11 left in regulation...In the fourth quarter, Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook combined to score 16 points (6-11 FGs) while the Thunder as a team limited the Lakers to 13 points on 33.3% shooting (6-18 FGs) in the final period...On the night, Kobe Bryant led all scorers with 42 points on 54.6% shooting (18-33 FGs). However, the rest of the Lakers' team combined to score 48 points on 38.1% shooting (16-42 FGs)...Although Pau Gasol pulled-down a game-high 16 rebounds, the Thunder outrebound the Lakers by a 51-35 margin...In a game that featured 16 lead changes and eight tied through the first three quarters, the Thunder outscored the Lakers in fast break opportunities by a 30-6 margin...Including James Harden's 17 points (6-10 FGs), the Thunder bench outscored the Lakers reserves by a 35-5 margin.

May 19, 2012 at STAPLES Center

Oklahoma City 103 - Los Angeles 100

After trailing 78-91 at the 8:02 mark of the fourth quarter, the Thunder closed the game on a 25-9 run to take a 3-1 series lead...With the score deadlocked at 98-98 with 14 seconds left in the contest, Kevin Durant knocked-down the game winning 3-point field goal to give the Thunder a 101-98 advantage. In the fourth quarter, Durant led all scorers with 11 points (2-3 FGs and 6-8 FTs). The Thunder as a team shot 66.7% from the field during the final 12 minutes of regulation (10-15 FGs)...Meanwhile, the Lakers missed their final eight field goal attempts as Kobe Bryant converted just two of his 10 field goals in the fourth quarter...With the win, the OKC franchise snapped a 14 game losing streak in the postseason against the Lakers on the road...In 43 minutes of action, Russell Westbrook registered a game-high 37 points (15-26 FGs) while committing just a single turnover (In four games this series, Westbrook has recorded a total of three turnovers)...Oklahoma City outscored the Lakers 57-44 in the second half after limiting Los Angeles to 35.9% shooting (14-39 FGs) during the third and fourth quarters...In the final period, OKC limited Pau Gasol and Andrew Bynum to a combined two points.

May 18, 2012 at STAPLES Center

Los Angeles 99 - Oklahoma City 96

Although the Thunder led 92-87 with less than three minutes left in regulation, the Lakers closed the game on a 12-4 run to claim their first victory of the series...The Thunder lost despite holding Los Angeles to 32.4% shooting (11-34 FGs) in the second half...On the night, the Lakers went 41-of-42 from the free throw line. In the fourth quarter alone, LAL went 17-of-18 from the charity stripe. Meanwhile, the Thunder converted 26 of their 28 free throw attempts in the game...Three Thunder players scored in double figures (Durant, Harden and Westbrook) while six Lakers players scored 10-plus points (Blake, Bryant, Bynum, Gasol, Sessions and World Peace)...Despite shooting just 9-of-25 from the field, Kobe Bryant recorded a game-high 36 points after going a perfect 18-of-18 from the free throw line...The Thunder lost despite outscoring the Lakers in fast break opportunities (23-7) and in the paint (40-30)...Oklahoma City trailed 6-18 early in the first quarter, before responding to take a one point lead midway through the second quarter...With the loss, the OKC franchise has now dropped 14 consecutive road playoff games against the Lakers.

May 16, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena

Oklahoma City 77 - Los Angeles 75

After trailing 68-75 at the 2:08 mark of the fourth quarter, the Thunder closed the game on a 9-0 run to capture a 2-0 series lead vs. Los Angeles...In the final two minutes, the Lakers went 0-3 from the field while committing three turnovers...Kevin Durant connected on what proved to be the game-winning field goal with 18.6 seconds left in the contest. On the ensuing Lakers possession, Steve Blake missed a three-point field goal with just under four seconds remaining...In the fourth quarter, Kevin Durant and James Harden combined to score 15 points on 6-of-12 shooting. Meanwhile, the Lakers scored just 12 fourth quarter points (5-20 FGs) while committing six turnovers in the final period...On the night, the Lakers outscored the Thunder in the paint by a 46-34 margin. The Los Angeles duo of Pau Gasol and Andrew Bynum combined to score 34 points and 20 rebounds...The game featured 18 lead changes and 12 ties...The 77 points scored by Oklahoma City is the fewest points scored by the franchise all-time during a playoff win.

May 14, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena

Oklahoma City 119 - Los Angeles 90

After leading 59-44 at halftime, the Thunder outscored the Lakers 39-24 in the third quarter as Oklahoma City amassed a 35-point second half advantage...The 29 point margin of victory was the fourth largest in playoff history for the OKC franchise. Meanwhile, it was the largest postseason margin of defeat for Los Angeles since the 2008 playoffs...Through the first three-plus minutes of the third period, OKC outscored LAL 18-4 to take a 29 advantage with 8:07 left in the quarter. In the third period, the Thunder shot 70.6% (12-17 FGs)...No Thunder starter saw action in the final 12 minutes of regulation...The OKC franchise set a all-time postseason record by committing just four turnover. After three quarters of play, the Thunder committed just two turnovers en route to a 98-68 advantage...On the night, the Thunder outscored the Lakers in fast break opportunities by a 13-0 margin.

2011-12 Season Series (3-1 Thunder)

Thunder/Mavericks Playoff Note:

In a rematch of last year's Western Conference Finals (in which Dallas defeated Oklahoma City 4-1) the No. 2 seed Oklahoma City Thunder and the No. 7 seed Dallas Mavericks met in postseason play for a second consecutive season. After recording a 4-0 sweep over the Mavericks, the OKC franchise is now 2-2 all-time in playoff series against Dallas (the OKC franchise last defeated DAL in postseason play during the 1987 playoffs). By going a perfect 4-0 against the Mavericks in the first round of the playoffs, the OKC franchise recorded just its second all-time sweep of a seven game playoff series. Interestingly enough, the club's only other postseason sweep occurred during the 1996 Western Conference Semi-Finals vs. Houston, in which the team defeated the defending NBA Champion, Rockets. After the 4-0 sweep, the Mavericks became just the second defending NBA Champ to get swept in the first round the season after winning the NBA title.

Game-Winner for Durant: Kevin Durant hit the game-winning jump shot with 1.5 seconds left in regulation during the Thunder's Game 1 victory over the Mavs last Saturday night. It is his fourth game-winning field goal in the final five seconds in the last two seasons (playoffs included). That is most by any player in the NBA.

May 5, 2012 at American Airlines Center Oklahoma City 103 – Dallas 97

After trailing by 13 points after three quarters of play, the Thunder outscored the Mavericks 35-16 in the fourth quarter to capture the franchises' second ever postseason sweep of a seven game series. In the fourth quarter, James Harden scored 15 points as the Thunder as a team shot 65.0% (13-20 FGs) from the floor while limiting the Mavs to just 22.2% shooting (4-18 FGs)...In the final 12 minutes of regulation, Dirk Nowitzki was limited to 1-of-8 shooting...The Thunder took their first lead of the second half at the 5:17 mark of the fourth quarter after opening the period on a 24-10 run...On the night, Oklahoma City outscored Dallas in the paint by a 52-28 margin...James Harden recorded a playoff career-high after leading the Thunder with 29 points on 11-of-16 shooting (including 6-of-9 shooting in the fourth quarter). On his own, Harden outscored the entire Mavericks bench (the Dallas reserves scored 23 points on 8-of-19 FGs)...In 30 minutes of action off the bench, Derek Fisher scored 12 points after missing only one of his six field goal attempts (including 2-of-2 3-point shooting)...After recording a total of 13 turnovers through three quarters of play, the Thunder failed to register a single turnover during the fourth quarter.

May 3, 2012 at American Airlines Center Oklahoma City 95 – Dallas 79

During the Thunder's wire-to-wire victory over the Mavericks, Oklahoma City led by as many as 26 points in the second half before taking a 3-0 series lead...On the night, the Thunder limited Dallas to 34.2% shooting (26-76 FGs) which represents the lowest opponent postseason field goal percentage of the Oklahoma City era (dating back to the 2009-10 playoffs)...The Thunder led by 50-41 at halftime, but the Mavericks quickly cut the OKC lead to five points after converting their first two baskets of the second half. From there, the Thunder outscored the Mavs 25-12 throughout the remainder of the third period (DAL shot 2-of-16 to close the third quarter)...Kevin Durant registered the best shooting night of his postseason career after shooting 73.3% (11-15 FGs) from the floor en route to a game-high 31 points. Meanwhile, Oklahoma City limited Mavs' forward Dirk Nowitzki to 17 points on 6-of-15 shooting (including just seven second half points on 2-of-7 shooting)...The Thunder committed just eight turnovers on the night. During the 2011-12 season, the Thunder never committed fewer than 10 turnovers in any game.

April 30, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena Oklahoma City 102 – Dallas 99

After trailing by as many as 16 points in the first half, the Mavericks had an opportunity to send the game to overtime on their final possession, but the Thunder claimed a 2-0 series lead after a pair of missed 3-point field goal in the final seconds by Jason Terry...The fourth quarter featured six lead changes and four ties (16 lead changes and 16 ties overall in the contest)...Kendrick Perkins recorded his second highest scoring effort of the season after scoring 13 points on 4-of-5 shooting...Meanwhile, Thunder guard Derek Fisher came off the bench to provide a lift with 11 points on 5-of-6 shooting...The Thunder defeated the Mavs despite getting outscored in the paint by an 18-40 margin...The Thunder shot 94.9% from the free throw line (37-39 FTs). During the 2011-12 regular season, the Thunder posted a perfect 4-0 record when converting 30+ free throws...Dirk Nowitzki scored a game-high 31 points on 10-of-19 shooting to go along with a perfect 11-of-11 free throw shooting to lead Dallas.

April 28, 2012 at Chesapeake Energy Arena Oklahoma City 99 – Dallas 98

Game 1 featured 16 lead changes and 10 ties (3 lead changes and five ties in the final six-plus minutes of regulation) as Kevin Durant connected on a game-winning 15-foot jump shot from just above the free throw line with 1.5 seconds left in the fourth quarter to secure a Thunder victory...The Thunder trailed 87-94 with just over two minutes left in the contest before closing the game on 12-4 run in the final 2:17 of the game...After scoring 20 points on 8-of-9 shooting through the first three quarters of play, Jason Terry was held scoreless in the fourth quarter (only attempted one field goal in the final period)...The trio of Kevin Durant (25 points; 10-27 FGs), Serge Ibaka (22 points; 9-12 FGs) and Russell Westbrook (28 points; 13-23 FGs) each proceeded to score 20-plus points. During the 2011-12 regular season, Oklahoma City posted a perfect 8-0 record when three players scored 20+ points...The 22 points recorded by Serge Ibaka is a playoff career high (also matches a regular season career-high).

OKLAHOMA CITY THUNDER REGULAR SEASON NOTES

Division Champs: Although the Thunder fell to the Denver Nuggets during the team's regular season finale, Oklahoma City enters the 2012 postseason with the second best record in the Western Conference (47-19). The club's .712 year-end winning percentage is the highest for the franchise since the 1997-98 season (.744) and the fourth highest for the franchise all-time. When the dust finally settled on the 2011-12 season, the Thunder claimed a second consecutive Northwest Division title after finishing 9.0 games above the second place, Denver Nuggets. After finishing the 2008-09 season with a record of 23-59, the Oklahoma City Thunder has now captured playoff berths during each of the three subsequent seasons (the OKC franchise is making three straight trips to the playoffs for the first time since 1996-1998).

Bouncing Back: Dating back to the start of the 2010-11 season, Oklahoma City has demonstrated a high level of resiliency in those games played immediately after a loss. After the Thunder's bounce-back win over the Sacramento Kings on April 24th, Oklahoma City finished this past season with a 15-3 mark in games played after a loss. Only the Chicago Bulls recorded a better record in those games played after a loss (15-1). This comes on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which Oklahoma City posted a record of 20-6 in games played immediately after a loss. The Thunder's .769 winning percentage in those games played after a defeat was trumped once again by only the Chicago Bulls (16-4 following a loss).

Block Party: When the dust settled on the 2011-12 regular season, the Thunder not only led the NBA in blocked shots (8.17 bpg), but Oklahoma City recorded the highest block per game total in the NBA in nearly 20 years. The 1993-94 Denver Nuggets team (8.37 bpg) was the last group to average more blocks than this year's Thunder squad. Serge Ibaka led the NBA while setting an all-time franchise record with a 3.65 block per game average (most blocks per game since Theo Ratliff recorded 3.74 bpg during the 2000-01 season). To put a bit more perspective on Ibaka's accomplishment; with a total of 241 blocks this past season, Ibaka recorded only 19 fewer blocks than the entire New Jersey Nets team. During the Thunder's game versus the Nuggets on 2/19, Ibaka set a franchise record by blocking 11 shots en route to his first career triple-double. On the season Ibaka became the first player to register three 10-plus blocks games since Shawn Bradley during the 1996-97 season (five games with 10+ blocks).

Point Made: With a 103.1 point per game scoring average this season, the Oklahoma City Thunder finished behind only the Denver Nuggets (104.1 ppg) and the San Antonio Spurs (103.6 ppg) in the quest to become the NBA's highest scoring team. During the 2011-12 season, the Thunder led the NBA in free throw shooting accuracy (80.6%) while ranking third in field goal shooting accuracy (47.1%). OKC finished the year a perfect 18-0 when shooting 50.0% or better from the field.

Getting Defensive: As is oftentimes the case, team defense is critical to success and this past season the Thunder showed material improvement in a number of defensive categories. After allowing 101.7 points per game on 46.2% shooting through the first 66 games of the 2010-11 season (in which the team started 43-23), the Thunder responded by holding the opposition to 96.9 points on 42.7% opponent field goal percentage this past season. The Thunder concluded the 2011-12 season by going a perfect 16-0 when limiting the opponent to less than 90 points. Including the Thunder's win over the Sacramento Kings on April 13th, Oklahoma City held 19 opponents to less than 40.0% shooting this past year, while posting a 15-4 record in those games. After season's end, Serge Ibaka finished second in the NBA's defensive Player of the Year balloting. Ibaka received 41 first place votes and finished just 17 points behind Tyson Chandler.

Road Warriors: With the 2011-12 regular season now complete, Oklahoma City once again found success playing away from the Chesapeake Energy Arena. In 33 games road games this season, the Thunder registered a 21-12 mark {3rd best road record in the NBA behind Chicago (24-9) and San Antonio (22-11)}. The Thunder was one of only THREE Western Conference teams (Denver & San Antonio) to boast a winning road record. During the 2010-11 season, the Thunder recorded a mark of 25-16 on the road. Only four other teams tallied more road victories than the Thunder (CHI, MIA, DAL and LAL).

Making them Look Free: For a second season in a row, the Thunder finished the year as the top free throw shooting team in the NBA (OKC shot 80.6% from the free throw line). OKC finished the season leading the NBA in free throw makes per game (21.3) while ranking second in free throw attempts per game (26.4). In four instances this season the Thunder converted 30-plus free throws and on each occasion the Thunder won the contest. During the 2010-11 season, OKC shot a league-best 82.3% from the free throw line (5th highest percentage in NBA history). On the year, OKC converted 30+ FTs on eighteen occasions (16-2 record) after doing so six times during all of the 2009-10 season (4-2 record). During the 2009-10 season Durant recorded 756 free throw makes, an all-time OKC Thunder franchise record and the 6th most in NBA history for a single season. Durant's 756 free throws made were the most for a single-season since Michael Jordan recorded 833 free throw makes during the 1986-87 season. KD is the ONLY player in NBA history to convert 700+ free throws while shooting 90.0% or better.

Dynamic Duo: With a combined total of 51.6 points per game, Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook became the highest scoring duo in franchise history (surpassing their previous record of 48.2 ppg last season followed by Dale Ellis and Tom Chambers 48.2 point per game average during the 1986-87 season). Durant and Westbrook surpassed the tandem of LeBron James and Dwyane Wade (combined 49.2 ppg) to become the highest scoring pair of teammates in the NBA this season. During the Thunder's outing against the Denver Nuggets on 2/19, the Thunder prevailed after receiving a combined 91 points from Kevin Durant (51 points) and Russell Westbrook (40 points). The 91 combined points for the two players is an all-time franchise record. After Durant and Westbrook each scored 40+ points in the Thunder's recent outing vs. Minnesota (3/23) the duo becomes the first pair of teammates in NBA history to each score 40+ points on two separate occasions during a single season. On 14 occasions dating back to the start of last season Durant and Westbrook have each scored 30-plus points in the same game (11-3 record).

Back-to-Back Scoring Champ: After averaging an even 28.0 points per game this past season, Kevin Durant becomes the seventh player in NBA history to capture three consecutive scoring crowns {Michael Jordan was the last player to win three straight scoring titles (1995-1998)}. By claiming back-to-back-to-back scoring titles, Durant has joined a hall-of-fame list of NBA players to record the feat (Michael Jordan, George Gervin, Bob McAdoo, Wilt Chamberlain, Neil Johnston and George Mikan). During the 2009-10 season, Durant became the youngest scoring champion in NBA history (21 years and 197 days).

Home Cooking: Earlier this season, the Thunder registered a 14-game home winning streak which represented the longest home win streak for the OKC franchise since the 1994-95 season (17 game home win streak from 11/11/94 – 1/24/95). Prior to the Thunder's home loss versus Cleveland on 3/9, more than two months had elapsed between Thunder home losses (1/3/12 vs. POR). The Thunder finished behind only Miami (28-5) and San Antonio (28-5) in the race for the NBA's best home record.

Harden Heats Up: James Harden once again continued to impact games for the Thunder in a reserve capacity throughout the 2011-12 season. Harden came off the bench in 60 of his 62 appearances this past season for Oklahoma City and in all but four instances he proceeded to score in double figures. Harden was oftentimes the difference-maker for Oklahoma City. This was further validated by the fact that the Thunder posted a 14-1 record this season when Harden scored 20-plus points. Harden's 16.8 point per game average was tops in the NBA among reserves (min. 40 games).

Tracking the Perk Effect: Since Kendrick Perkins made his Oklahoma City debut last in the middle of the 2010-11 season on 3/14/11 at Washington, the Thunder has posted a 60-23 record. With Perkins in the lineup for the final 17 games of the 2010-11 regular season, the Thunder held its opponents to an average of 97.9 points on 43.8% shooting. Prior to Perkins joining the team mid-season, the Thunder had been allowing 101.8 points on 46.3% shooting.

Russell Rules: Russell Westbrook just concluded his fourth season in the NBA with Oklahoma City and he currently maintains the longest active games played streak in the NBA (appeared in 312 straight games). During Westbrook's first three full seasons in the NBA, he became one of only five players in NBA history to record 4,000 points, 1,500 assists and 1,000 rebounds through three NBA seasons (Chris Paul, LeBron James, Anfernee Hardaway and Oscar Robertson). By averaging better than 21+ points and 8+ assists last season, Westbrook became just the FIFTH player in the last 15 years to average 21+ points and 8+ assists {Gary Payton (4x), Stephon Marbury (4x), Chris Paul (2x) and LeBron James}.

5,000 for Russell: Late in the second quarter of the Thunder's game vs. Utah on February 14th, Russell Westbrook scored his 5,000th point to become one of just four players in franchise history to record 5,000 points through 274 or fewer games {Spencer Hayward (190 games), Kevin Durant (205 games), Bob Rule (228 games) and Xavier McDaniel (244 games)}. After reaching the 5,000 point plateau, Westbrook joined Magic Johnson and Oscar Robertson as the only players in NBA history to record 5,000 points, 1,900 assists and 1,300 rebounds through 274 career games (Elias Sports Bureau).

Over the Hill: After recording 40 points on April 18th versus Phoenix, James Harden became the third Thunder player to score 40-plus points this past season; joining Kevin Durant (four 40-point games) and Russell Westbrook (two 40-point games) in accomplishing the feat. The OKC franchise last had three players score 40-plus points in the same year during the 1997-98 season (Tom Chambers, Dale Ellis & Xavier McDaniel). After scoring 40 points as a reserve, James Harden became the first bench player in the last two seasons to record a 40-point game, tallying the league's most points by a reserve since March 27, 2010, when Maverick guard Rodrigue Beaubois scored 40 points against Golden State. Durant, Harden and Westbrook are the first trio to each record 40 points in a season since Stephen Curry, Monta Ellis and CJ Watson accomplished the feat as members of the Golden State Warriors during the 2009-10 season.

February was Friendly: With a "leap-day" victory over the Philadelphia 76ers at the Wells Fargo Center on February 29th, the Thunder capped-off the month of February with a record of 12-3. The 12 wins recorded in the Month of February was tops in the NBA. The OKC franchise had only won 12 games in the month of February on one prior occasion (12-3 record in February of 1972).

Just Another Back-2-Back: With 18 sets of back-to-backs now in the books (in addition to the Thunder's back-to-back-to-back) for the 2011-12 season, Oklahoma City has been successful to this point when playing on consecutive nights. This past season, the Thunder registered sweeps in nine sets of back-to-back match-ups to go along with a sweep of the team's lone back-to-back-to-back. Oklahoma City posted a 15-4 mark on the first night and a 14-6 record on the second or third night of a back-to-back. During the 2010-11 season the Thunder played 17 sets of back-to-backs and the club posted a 13-4 record on the first night followed by a 10-7 mark on the second night (while capturing sweeps in seven sets of their back-to-backs).

OKC is Fan Friendly: The Thunder opened the 2011-12 season right where they left off a year ago...with another sellout. The Thunder then proceeded to sellout all 33 home games this season. This occurs on the heels of the 2010-11 season in which the Thunder sold out 14 consecutive games to close the regular season and 35 games overall. Those fans in attendance this year will once again enjoy the improvements made to the Chesapeake Energy Arena as part of a taxpayer funded initiative passed in March 2008. Thanks to the publically funded initiative, the team's arena boasts a state-of-the art scoreboard, new terrace suites, an updated main concourse with new concession stands and a courtside club.

Boards are the Barometer: As one might expect, Oklahoma City has traditionally found their greatest success when outrebounding the opposition. On the season, Oklahoma City went 31-5 when outrebounding the opponent (12-1 when outrebounding the opponent by 10 or more). Conversely, OKC has failed to outrebound their opponent in 14 of the team's 19 losses this season. During the 2010-11 season, OKC registered a 37-11 mark when outrebounding their opponent.

Double-Double Man: Including his career-long (tying) streak of five straight games with a double-double (1/27 at GS – 2/4 at SA), Kevin Durant has recorded a double-double in 18 games this season. Last year, Durant recorded 14 double-doubles including a stretch of five consecutive double-doubles from 1/30/11 vs. Miami – 2/8/11 vs. Memphis. During the 2010-11 season, Durant increased his rebounding average by a full 1.2 rebounds per game (averaged a team-high 8.0 rebounds).

Facing the East: After starting the season 8-1 versus the “East”, the Thunder played their final game versus Eastern Conference opponents on April 9th when traveling to Milwaukee to take-on the Bucks. After defeating the Bucks on the road by a 20-point margin of victory, the Thunder concluded the 2011-12 regular season with a 13-5 mark versus the East. During the 2010-11 season the Thunder was successful when matching-up against opponents from the East. Oklahoma City concluded the season with a record of 22-8 when facing Eastern Conference foes. The Thunder’s .733 winning percentage vs. the Eastern Conference ranked tied with Dallas for second best (San Antonio; 23-7) among all Western Conference teams.

3-For-30: During the Thunder’s come-from-behind 115-104 victory over the Phoenix Suns on March 7th, Kevin Durant (30 points), James Harden (30 points) and Russell Westbrook (31 points) each recorded 30+ points in a game for the first time in franchise history since 2/26/1988 (Tom Chambers, Dale Ellis and Xavier McDaniel). Additionally, Thunder center Serge Ibaka set a career-high after pulling-down 20 rebounds. Only one other time in NBA history had three players recorded 30+ points while another player recorded 20+ rebounds. That game occurred on 11/18/1968 when Earl Monroe (30 points), Gus Johnson (30 points) and Mike Davis (40 points) each scored 30+ points for Baltimore in a game in which Wes Unseld registered 23 rebounds.

Awfully Good in OT: Despite falling to the L.A. Lakers in double overtime on 4/22, the Thunder finished the season 3-1 in overtime affairs. During the 2010-11 season, the Thunder became just the FIFTH team in NBA history to win eight overtime games in a single season (8-2). OKC set an all-time franchise record by winning five straight overtime games to start the season and the club’s eight OT wins are the most in the NBA since 2002, when the Detroit Pistons went 8-0 in their overtime contests. During the 2010-11 season, OKC captured the franchises’ first-ever triple-overtime victory (12/1/10) against New Jersey (the OKC franchise was previously 0-4 all-time in triple overtime games).

One For the Record Books: The Thunder’s 124-118 overtime win versus the Denver Nuggets on February 19th was not your average Oklahoma City victory. It was the first game in NBA history in which a set of teammates recorded a 50-point effort (Kevin Durant; 51 points), a 40-point effort (Russell Westbrook, 40 points) and a triple-double (Serge Ibaka; 14 points, 15 rebounds and 11 blocks). Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook are the first set of teammates to score 50 and 40 points, respectively since Kiki Vandeweghe (51 points) and Alex English (47 points) accomplished the feat on 12/13/1983 vs. DET (3OT). The 91 combined points by Durant and Westbrook is a franchise record. To put a bit more perspective on such an accomplishment, through February 19th, there had been 323 NBA games this season in which a team as a whole failed to score 91 points. Not to be outdone, Serge Ibaka became the first player in franchise history to record a triple-double which included blocked shots.

Five-In-Seven to Start: After defeating the Phoenix Suns at the end of 2011 (12/31), Oklahoma City claimed their fifth victory of the season in the first seven days of the 2011-12 season. The Thunder became just the second team in NBA history to capture five wins in the first seven days of the season (Houston Rockets accomplished the feat to start the 1996-97 season). The 5-0 start for the Thunder this year was the best start for the OKC franchise since the 1998-99 season.

30 Never Looked so Good: Picking up right where he left off last season, Kevin Durant hit the 30-point scoring mark in each of the Thunder’s first four games this season. Durant is one of only four players in the last 30 years to open the season with four straight 30-point scoring efforts (Most recent: Kobe Bryant in 2005-06). In the last four seasons, Durant has scored 30+ points in 122 games (most in the NBA). Most importantly for Oklahoma City, the Thunder has found a great deal of success on Durant’s biggest nights. Dating back to the start of the 2010-11 season the Thunder has posted a 41-13 (.759) record when Durant hits the 30-point plateau. During the 2009-10 season, Durant set a franchise record by scoring 30+ points on 47 occasions.

Western Conference Finals: Last season, the Oklahoma City Thunder appeared in the Western Conference Finals just two years after finishing the 2008-09 season with a record of 23-59 (started season 3-29). Since the NBA went to a conference format in 1970-71, only one other team has reached the conference finals within two years after winning 23 or fewer games {San Antonio; 1998-99 season (won 20 games in 1996-97)}. The Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season by compiling 50 wins after posting just 23 victories during the team’s inaugural season in Oklahoma City. The 27 win improvement was tied for the EIGHTH largest increase in NBA history.

Thunder All-Stars Shine Bright: During February’s All-Star festivities, Kevin Durant claimed his very first All-Star MVP award after helping lead the West to a 152-149 victory in which he scored a game-high 36 points on 14-of-25 shooting. With an All-Star average of 28.3 points per game, Kevin Durant is the game’s all-time leader in points per game (minimum three appearances). Durant was making his second All-Star start (Received 1,345,566 votes, second most in the Western Conference) and his third career All-Star appearance. In his second All-Star game, Russell Westbrook scored 21 points to go along with five rebounds and two steals. The Western conference team was guided by Thunder Head Coach, Scott Brooks. Brooks was named the coach of the Western Conference All-Stars after the Thunder secured the best record in the Western Conference for all games played through February 15th.

National Spotlight: Oklahoma City is appeared on ESPN, ABC or TNT 17 times throughout the course of the 2011-12 season. When the dust settled on the NBA’s 2011-12 broadcasting schedule, the Thunder was set to make the 6th most national TV dates this year.

Team USA: On January 16th Kevin Durant and Russell Westbrook were among the 20 finalists named for the 2012 U.S. Olympic men’s basketball team. Durant was named World Championship MVP during the 2010 USA World Championships after helping lead team USA to a perfect 9-0 record and a gold medal in Istanbul, Turkey. His involvement in USA basketball began in 2006 when he was named a member of the U.S. team at the Nike Hoop Summit. Westbrook, was also a member of the 2010 USA World Championship team and his involvement with USA Basketball dates back to 2008 when he was named to the USA Basketball Select team. The official 12-man U.S. Olympic team roster will be announced later this year.
