OCTOBER 16, 2018 - GOLDEN STATE VS. OKLAHOMA CITY

TONIGHT'S NOTES

- Tonight's game is the first game of the 2018-19 NBA regular season for both teams.
- Golden State opens the regular season at home for the fourth time in the last five seasons, including the last three.
- The Warriors have lost the last two season openers (San Antonio in 2016-17 and Houston in 2017-18) and possess a 31-41 all-time record in season openers, including a 17-21 record in season openers at home.
- Last season, the Warriors and Thunder split the regular season series with each team winning two contests.
- The last time these two teams met in the first game of the regular season was on October 28, 1983, when the Warriors visited Seattle and came away with a 110-109 win. The only other time the two franchises opened the regular season was on October 13, 1967, when the San Francisco Warriors defeated the Seattle SuperSonics at home, 144-116.
- The Warriors finished the 2018 preseason with a 1-4 record.
- Warriors Head Coach Steve Kerr was named as an assistant coach on the 2019-20 USA Basketball Men's National Team.

WARRIORS NOTES

- With six NBA Championships, the Warriors are tied with the Chicago Bulls for the third-most titles, trailing only the Boston Celtics (17) and Los Angeles Lakers (16).
- The Warriors have the third-most (10) NBA Finals appearances behind only the Lakers (31) and Celtics (21). Having appeared in the last four NBA Finals, the Warriors became the fifth franchise in NBA history to do so, joining the Boston Celtics, Cleveland Cavaliers, Los Angeles Lakers and Miami Heat. The Celtics are the only team to appear in five consecutive NBA Finals, having made a league-record 10 straight. In the four major professional sports only the Boston Celtics (NBA), New York Yankees (MLB) twice, Montreal Canadiens, twice, and New York Islanders (NHL) and Cleveland Browns (NFL) made at least five straight appearances in their championship game.
- Golden State has a 328-83 (.798) record in the regular season and playoffs over the last four seasons, the best four-year winning percentage in NBA history. Additionally, the Warriors own the best winning percentage (.759) in the postseason in any four-year span in NBA history.
- The Warriors are the fifth franchise in NBA history to win 58 games in four-straight seasons, joining the 76ers, Bucks, Celtics and Lakers, according to the Elias Sports Bureau... The 58 wins were the fifth-highest total in Warriors franchise history.
- Only six teams have won three NBA Championships in four years – Lakers (three times), Bulls (twice), Warriors and Celtics (once each).

2017-18 WARRIORS SEASON NOTES

- **Stephen Curry** led the NBA in free throw percentage (.921 FT%) for the fourth time in his career (2010-11, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2017-18)... Curry has made at least 90 percent of his free throw attempts in five of his nine NBA seasons, including three of the last four.
- The Warriors played 16 of the final 17 games without Curry, who suffered a left MCL sprain in the March 23rd game vs. Atlanta and went 6-10 in the games Curry missed... During the 2017-18 season the Warriors had a 17-14 record without Curry in the lineup.
- Curry (26.4 ppg), **Kevin Durant** (26.4 ppg) and **Klay Thompson** (20.0 ppg) became the fourth trio in NBA history to average at least 20 points per game in two straight seasons, joining the 1986-87 and 1987-88 Seattle SuperSonics, 1981-82 and 1982-83 Denver Nuggets, and 1959-60 - 1961-62 St. Louis Hawks, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Durant averaged a career-high 1.75 blocks per game, finishing fifth among the league leaders... Durant also ranked sixth in scoring (26.4 ppg) and eighth in free throw percentage (.889 FT%).
- The Warriors led the NBA in scoring (113.5 ppg), assists (29.3 apg), blocks (7.46 bpg), field goal percentage (.503 FG%), 3-point field goal percentage (.391 3pt%), and free throw percentage (a franchise-record .815 FT%)... Golden State became the first team to lead the league in these categories in a single season since the introduction of the 3-point line in the NBA in 1979-80 season, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- The Warriors also became the first team to lead the league in assists in four straight seasons.
- The Warriors made their sixth-straight postseason appearance, matching the franchise record set in the first six years of the league's existence (1946-47 to 1951-52).

LAKERS 119, WARRIORS 105

SAP CENTER, SAN JOSE, CA

October 12, 2018 -- Svi Mykhailiuk scored a game-high 22 points off the bench and Kyle Kuzma added 19 points to lead the Lakers to a 119-105 win in the final preseason game for both teams. The Warriors played without Kevin Durant and Andre Iguodala, while the Lakers were without starters LeBron James, Brandon Ingram and Rajon Rondo.

The Warriors had their largest lead of the game, 38-21, with 1:44 left in the first quarter, as Stephen Curry tallied 16 points in the first frame, Golden State held a 67-54 halftime advantage, but the Lakers outscored them in the third quarter, 32-16, to enter the fourth quarter with a 86-83 lead. A 14-2 Lakers run which started at the 8:24 mark of the fourth quarter gave Los Angeles a 108-95 edge with 5:06 remaining.

Klay Thompson led the Warriors with 21 points. Quinn Cook contributed 20 points off the bench. Curry and Damian Jones each tallied 16 points. Alfonzo McKinnie, starting in place of Durant at small forward, corralled a team-high seven rebounds. Six Lakers scored in double-figures, including JaVale McGee (14), Jonathan Williams (14), Travis Wear (13), and Isaac Bonga (12). Williams also grabbed a game-high 12 rebounds.

CONNECTIONS

- **Kevin Durant**, selected by the Seattle SuperSonics (2nd overall) in the 2007 NBA Draft, averaged 27.4 points, 7.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists, 1.2 steals, 1.0 blocks and 37.8 minutes per game in starting all 641 career games he played in nine seasons (2007-08 - 2015-16) with the Thunder franchise.
- **Shaun Livingston** appeared in 18 games with Oklahoma City over two seasons (2008-09 and 2009-10), averaging 4.0 points, 2.6 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 17.8 minutes.
- Warriors Assistant Coach **Ron Adams** spent two years as an assistant coach with the Thunder from 2008-10.
- The Warriors briefly held the draft rights to Thunder forward **Andre Roberson**, acquiring him on the night of the 2013 NBA Draft (June 27, 2013) from Minnesota in exchange for **Malcolm Lee** and a second round draft pick before sending him to Oklahoma City in exchange for the draft rights to **Archie Goodwin**.
- Warriors President and COO **Rick Welts** began his NBA career in 1969, at the age of 16, as a ball boy with the Seattle SuperSonics. Welts spent 10 years with his hometown team serving a number of roles, including as the team's director of public relations during NBA Finals appearances in 1978 and 1979 and the SuperSonics' lone NBA Championship in 1979.
- Thunder Assistant Coach **Maurice Cheeks** coached Warriors forward **Andre Iguodala** for four seasons (2005-09) in Philadelphia.

2018-19 SEASON NOTES

STARTING EARLY

The last time the Warriors started an NBA season on or before October 16 was during the 1980-81 season when they opened the season on October 10 at Phoenix (L, 101-121). On the following night the Warriors hosted San Diego (W, 104-91). In the West Coast era (since 1962-63), the Warriors have played on or before October 17 10 times (1980-81, 1979-80, 1978-79, 1973-74, 1972-73, 1971-72, 1970-71, 1967-68, 1966-67, 1965-55).

According to the Elias Sports Bureau the last time a regular season began with a game played on or before October 16 was during the 1980-81 season when the first game was played on October 10 (1980). This does not consider the abbreviated 1998-99 season which began on Feb. 5, 1999.

SIXTH TITLE

By capturing their sixth title in 2017-18, the Warriors joined the Celtics (17), Lakers (16) and Bulls (6) as the only franchises with at least six NBA championships. The Warriors have won four titles since moving to the Bay Area (1975, 2015, 2017, 2018) after winning a pair as the Philadelphia Warriors in 1947 and 1956.

BACK-2-BACK

The Warriors won have won back-to-back NBA titles for the first time in franchise history. This feat marks the seventh time in league history a team has repeated as champions, joining Boston, Chicago, Detroit, Houston, L.A. Lakers and Miami. Golden State is also just the fourth franchise to win three-or-more titles in the span of four seasons, along with Boston (1959-69), Chicago (1991-93; 1996-98) and Los Angeles Lakers (1949-54; 1985-88; 2000-02).

TITLE DEFENSE

The Warriors enter the season as champions for the sixth time in franchise history, having made the playoffs in each of their previous five title-defending seasons... With the 2018 NBA Championship, the Warriors became the 23rd team in NBA history to repeat as NBA champs--and only the seventh different franchise, joining L.A. Lakers, Boston, Detroit, Chicago, Miami, Houston.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE & SELLOUTS

Including the June 8th game vs. Cleveland, the Warriors' current home sellout streak at Oracle Arena is currently 291 consecutive games (including playoffs). The fourth-longest active streak dates back to December 18, 2012, vs. New Orleans. Golden State has sold out all 41 regular season home contests for five consecutive seasons. Oracle Arena is the oldest arena in the NBA and seats 19,596 fans a game. The Golden State Warriors/Oracle Arena was voted the "Best Home-court Advantage" by the NBA Players Association through their Players' Voice Awards in 2015, 2016 and 2017.

FRESH FACES

Joining the Warriors 2018-19 roster are DeMarcus Cousins, Marcus Derrickson (Two-Way), Jacob Evans III, Jonas Jerebko, Damion Lee (Two-Way), and Alfonzo McKinnie. Cousins, an eight-year NBA veteran, played for the New Orleans Pelicans last season. The Kentucky product earned his sixth-straight All-Star selection, before suffering a season-ending Achilles injury on January 26 at Houston. Cousins joined the Warriors as a free agent on July 6. Jerebko spent last season with the Utah Jazz and saw action 74 games (19 starts). The native of Sweden signed with Golden State as a free agent on July 12.

HEAD COACH STEVE KERR

NBA 2015-16 COACH OF THE YEAR, 2015 & 2017 ALL-STAR COACH

- Entering fifth season with Golden State.
- Named an assistant coach on the 2019-20 USA Basketball Men's National Team.
- Guided the Warriors to the 2015, 2017 and 2018 NBA titles, four straight Western Conference Championships (2015-18) and the NBA's single-season wins record (73, 2015-16).
- Is just the third coach in NBA history to win three championships in his first four seasons at the helm, joining Phil Jackson (1991, 1992, 1993) and John Kundla (1949, 1950, 1952) as the only coaches to do so.
- Owns eight championships as a player and coach (five player/three coach), joining a list of those with multiple titles as both player and coach that includes Phil Jackson (two player/11 coach), KC Jones (eight player/two coach), Tommy Heinsohn (eight player/two coach) and Bill Russell (11 player/two coach).
- Earned his 250th regular season coaching victory on Feb. 10, 2018 vs. San Antonio, reaching the milestone in the fewest games in NBA history (302). • Became the first coach in Warriors franchise history to win more than two championships (2015, 2017, 2018).
- With the 113-106 win at Houston on March 28, 2017, the Warriors' 60th of the season, became the fastest to earn 200 career coaching victories (in 238 games) in NBA history, surpassing the previous record of 270 games set by Phil Jackson.
- Named with his staff (Ron Adams, Mike Brown, Jarron Collins, Chris DeMarco, Bruce Fraser and Willie Green) to coach the Western Conference in the 2017 NBA All-Star Game on Sunday, Feb. 19, in New Orleans... Became the second coach in franchise history to earn the honor multiple times, joining Alvin Attles (1975, 1976)... Is also the first coach to earn the All-Star nod in two of his first three NBA seasons since Phoenix's Paul Westphal in 1993 and 1995.
- Has been named Western Conference Coach of the Month six times (January, March 2015, March 2016, Oct./Nov. 2016, January 2017, December 2017).
- Named 2015-16 NBA Coach of the Year after the Warriors set numerous league records - single-season wins record (73), single-season road wins (34), consecutive wins to begin a season (24) and consecutive regular-season home wins (54) - and joined the Chicago Bulls (1995-96 & 1996-97) as the only teams to win at least 65 games in back-to-back campaigns.
- Became the third coach in Warriors franchise history to earn NBA Coach of the Year Award, joining Alex Hannum (1963-64) and Don Nelson (1991-92).
- In 2014-15, led the Warriors to a then-franchise-record 67 victories, establishing NBA records for most wins and highest winning percentage (67-15, .817) by a rookie head coach.
- Eight-time NBA Champion (three as a coach and five as a player - 3 with Chicago, 2 with San Antonio).
- Named Warriors head coach on May 19, 2014, becoming the 25th head coach in franchise history and the 20th since the team moved to the West Coast in 1962.
- Is the NBA's all-time three-point percentage leader, having converted on 45.4 percent (726-of-1599) of his attempts from long range.
- Amassed career averages of 6.0 points, 1.8 assists and 1.2 rebounds per game in 910 regular-season games in 15 seasons with six teams: Phoenix (1988-89), Cleveland (1989-90 - 1992-93), Orlando (1992-93), Chicago (1993-94 - 1997-98), San Antonio (1998-99 - 2000-01, 2002-03) and Portland (2001-01).
- Owns 28 years of NBA experience as a player, coach, television analyst (two different four-year stints as a game analyst on TNT) and front office executive, including a three-year stint (2007-10) as president of basketball operations and general manager for the Phoenix Suns... During his time as Suns GM, the club posted a 155-91 (.630) record and earned a pair of playoff berths, including a trip to the 2010 Western Conference Finals.
- As a player, made playoffs 11 times and is one of only 26 players in NBA history to win five championships, earning three rings with Chicago and two with San Antonio.
- Born on September 27, 1965, Steve and his wife, Margot, have two sons, Nicholas and Matthew, and one daughter, Madeleine.
