- Highest total in the first three games of season since DeAndre Jordan swatted away 15 shot attempts in the Clippers' first 3 games in 2015-16... Since 1983-84, Durant is the first Warriors player with that many blocks in the first 3 contests of the season (Basketball Reference).
- Recorded career-high 7 blocks at New Orleans (10/20).
- Has scored 20 or more points in each of the Warriors' three games this season.

**QUICK NOTES:** Tonight's game at Dallas is the last game of the current 3-game road trip... The Warriors begin a 3-game homestand beginning with Wednesday's game vs. Toronto... All 3 home games are against Eastern Conference teams... The last time the Warriors opened a season with a 1-2 record was in 2009-10... Golden State recorded 30 or more assists in the first 2 games, but managed only 20 in its last game at Memphis... Stephen Curry is 16 points shy of tying Nate Thurmond (13,191) for fifth all-time on the Warriors career scoring list... Klay Thompson is tied with Isaiah Thomas with 57 consecutive games with at least one 3-pointer made, the longest current active streak.

### RECENT GAME RECAPS

#### GRIZZLIES 111, WARRIORS 101

#### FEDEXFORUM, MEMPHIS, TN

October 21, 2017 -- Marc Gasol tallied a team-high 34 points and game-high 14 rebounds to lead the Grizzlies past the Warriors... Memphis led by 13, 49-36, with 4:35 left in the second quarter, but the Warriors closed to within five, 56-51, at the half... An 18-5 run by the Grizzlies gave Memphis a 74-56 advantage with 6:32 left in the third quarter... Golden State could not get closer than eight the rest of the way... Stephen Curry led the Warriors with 37 points, making all 13 of his free throw attempts before getting ejected with 43 seconds left in the game... Kevin Durant, who was also ejected with Curry, finished with 29 points, a team-high 13 rebounds, three assists, one steal and three blocks... Klay Thompson added 14 points... The Grizzlies held the Warriors to a 39.3 field goal percentage and forced them into 17 turnovers, recycling them into 24 points... The Warriors recorded just 20 assists.

#### WARRIORS 128, PELICANS 120

#### SMOOTHIE KING CENTER, NEW ORLEANS, LA

October 20, 2017 -- Klay Thompson tallied a team-high 31 points, Stephen Curry added 28 points and Kevin Durant recorded 22 points and a career-high seven blocks to help the Warriors overcome a 15-point deficit to earn their first win of the season... New Orleans jumped out to a 21-6 lead to open the game and led, 57-42, with 5:27 left in the second quarter before the Warriors outscored the Pelicans, 35-9, to take an 11-point advantage, 77-66, with 8:03 left in the third quarter... For the Pelicans, Anthony Davis (35 points, 17 rebounds) and DeMarcus Cousins (35 points, 14 rebounds) each recorded double-doubles... Curry dished out eight assists, moving him past Tim Hardaway (3,926) for second place on the Warriors all-time assists list... Curry went 10-of-10 from the free throw line, becoming the 10th player in Warriors franchise history to make at least 2,000 career free throws... The Warriors handed out 31 assists, reaching the 30-assist mark for the second straight game.

## WARRIORS 2017-18 GAME NOTES

### REBOUNDING FROM A SETBACK

Under Steve Kerr, the Warriors have lost consecutive games only six times (4 - 2014-15; 0- 2015-16; 2 - 2016-17), with the longest losing streak at three games (3/8-3/11/17). The Warriors played an NBA-record 146 consecutive regular-season games without suffering back-to-back losses, a streak that ended on March 2, 2017, at Chicago. The previous NBA record was 95 regular-season games without back-to-back losses held by the Utah Jazz from Nov. 22, 1997 to March 19, 1999. Since 2014-15 the Warriors have a 33-7 (.825) record after a loss in the regular season.

### KD'S BLOCK PARTY

Kevin Durant has recorded 14 blocks in the first three games of the season, and recorded a career-best seven blocks in Saturday night's win at New Orleans. He even blocked two Tony Allen shot attempts without his left shoe (11:30 left in the second quarter). Last season Durant recorded a career-high 1.60 blocks per game. Durant's 14 blocks in the first three games of the season is the most since DeAndre Jordan had 15 blocks in the Clippers' first three contests (*Basketball Reference*). It is also the most blocks by a Warriors player in the first three games of a season since 1983-84. Durant has more total blocks than 17 teams this season.

### UPCOMING MILESTONES

- Stephen Curry needs 16 points to tie Nate Thurmond (13,191) for fifth place on the Warriors' all-time scoring list.

### KLAY'S 3-POINT STREAK

Following two 3-pointers at Memphis Saturday night, Klay Thompson has made a 3-pointer in 57 consecutive games, tying Cleveland's Isaiah Thomas for the longest active streak. Thompson's current streak, a career-best, began on 12/11/16 at Minnesota.

### MOVING THE BALL

The Warriors have dished out 30 or more assists in two of their three games this season, 34 in the season opener against Houston (10/17) and 31 at New Orleans (10/20). Golden State had just 20 assists in the loss at Memphis (10/21). Last season, the Warriors posted a 49-1 record in games in which they had 30 or more assists. Prior to the loss to the Rockets, the Warriors had won 37 straight games in which they recorded at least 30 assists. Under Steve Kerr (since 2014-15), the Warriors have a 115-7 (.943) record when they record at least 30 assists.

### NICK YOUNG'S WARRIORS DEBUT

Nick Young checked into the game at the 4:02 mark of the first quarter of the Oct. 17th game vs. Houston and promptly introduced himself to the Warriors fans, hitting his first shot attempt, a 3-pointer with 2:55 left in the quarter. Young then buried two more 3-point attempts to give him nine points in the first quarter, en route to a team-high 23 points (8-9 FG, 6-7 3pt, 1-1 FT). The six 3-pointers set a new record for the most 3-pointers made in a Warriors season opener, overtaking five players, each with five treys. Only once in the 2016-17 season did a Warriors reserve lead the team outright in scoring - Ian Clark tallied a career-high 36 points on 3/11/17 at San Antonio.

### ELIAS SAYS:

Nick Young scored 20 first-half points in his first game with the Warriors on Tuesday. Over the last 10 years, only two other players had a 20-point half in their first game with a team: LeBron James with the Heat on October 26, 2010 at Boston, with 21 second-half points, and Joe Johnson with the Jazz on October 25, 2016 at Portland, with 27 second-half points.

Young made six of seven three-point shots in the game and led the Warriors with 23 points. Young is the third player in 2017 to make as many as six three-pointers in his team debut - Lou Williams made seven for the Rockets in February and Troy Williams sank six for Houston in April. Before this year, the only player ever to do that was J.R. Bremer for the Cavaliers in 2003. Bremer's performance was mostly unnoticed compared to his 18-year-old teammate LeBron James, who scored 25 points and contributed nine assists and six rebounds in his NBA debut.

### STARTING EARLY

The last time the Warriors started an NBA season on or before October 17 was during the 1980-81 season when they opened the season on October 10 at Phoenix (L, 101-121). On the following night the Warriors hosted San Diego (W, 104-91). In the West Coast era (since 1962-63), the Warriors have played on or before October 17 11 times (1980-81, 1979-80, 1978-79, 1973-74, 1972-73, 1971-72, 1970-71, 1967-68, 1966-67, 1965-55, 1964-65).

According to the Elias Sports Bureau the last time a regular season began with a game played on or before October 17 was during the 1980-81 season when the first game was played on October 10 (1980). This does not consider the abbreviated 1998-99 season which began on Feb. 5, 1999.

### FIFTH TITLE

By capturing their fifth title in 2016-17, the Warriors joined the Celtics (17), Lakers (16), Bulls (6) and Spurs (5) as the only franchises with at least four NBA championships. The Warriors have won three titles since moving to the Bay Area (1975, 2015, 2017) after winning a pair as the Philadelphia Warriors in 1947 and 1956.

## NEW FACES

Joining the Warriors 2017-18 training camp roster are Nick Young, Omri Casspi, Jordan Bell, Chris Boucher and Quinn Cook. Young, a 10-year NBA veteran played for the Los Angeles Lakers last season, averaging 13.2 points (.430 FG%, .404 3pt%, .856 FT%), 2.3 rebounds, 1.0 assists in 25.9 minutes per game in starting all 60 games he played in. Casspi just completed his eighth NBA season, averaging 5.2 points (.470 FG%, .349 3pt%, .586 FT%), 3.1 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 17.9 minutes per game in 36 contests with Sacramento, New Orleans and Minnesota. Both Young and Casspi join the Warriors as free agents. Bell was acquired from the Chicago Bulls on Draft Night for cash considerations. A junior out of Oregon, Bell was selected by the Bulls in the second round of this year's draft, 38th overall. Boucher became the first player in Warriors' history to sign a two-way contract and Cook followed. Per NBA rules, teams are permitted to sign two players to two-way contracts in addition to the 15-man regular-season roster. Players signed to a two-way contract may accrue no more than 45 days of service with their respective NBA club during the regular season, spending the remainder of the season with the team's G League affiliate. The Warriors' two-way players will have the ability to spend time with both Golden State and the team's G League affiliate in Santa Cruz.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE & SELLOUTS

Including the October 17th game vs. Houston, the Warriors' current home sellout streak at Oracle Arena is currently 240 consecutive games (including playoffs). The seventh-longest active streak dates back to December 18, 2012. Golden State has sold out all 41 regular season home contests for three consecutive seasons. Oracle Arena is the oldest arena in the NBA and seats 19,596 fans a game. The Golden State Warriors/Oracle Arena was voted the "Best Homecourt Advantage" by the NBA Players Association through their Players' Voice Awards in 2015, 2016 and 2017.

## 2016-17 TEAM NOTES

### SUPERLATIVES FROM LAST SEASON

- 5: The Warriors won the franchise's fifth NBA title following a 129-120 victory over the Cleveland Cavaliers in Game 5 of the 2017 NBA Finals at Oracle Arena on June 12.
- 16-1: Golden State finished the 2017 NBA Playoffs with a 16-1 (.941) mark, surpassing the 2001 Los Angeles Lakers' 15-1 (.938) record for the best single-season winning percentage in NBA postseason history... Golden State won its first 15 postseason games, an NBA playoff record win streak.
- 3: Warriors forward Kevin Durant earned the Bill Russell NBA Finals Most Valuable Player Award with averages of 35.2 points, 8.2 rebounds, 5.4 assists, 1.60 blocks and 1.00 steals, becoming the third Finals MVP in Warriors history—joining Andre Iguodala (2015) and Rick Barry (1975)... Durant is the second player in league history to win the Finals MVP Award while averaging at least 35 points, eight rebounds and five assists in The Finals (Michael Jordan in 1993).
- 4: Warriors Head Coach Steve Kerr became the fourth coach in NBA history to win two championships in his first three seasons at the helm, joining Phil Jackson (1991, 1992), Bill Russell (1968, 1969) and John Kundla (1949, 1950), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- 13.5: The Warriors concluded the 2017 NBA Playoffs with an average margin of victory of +13.5, which ranks second-most in NBA postseason history (min. five games) behind only the Milwaukee Bucks' +14.5 average point differential (1971 NBA Playoffs).
- 9-0: In the 2017 NBA Playoffs, the Warriors posted a 9-0 record at home, tying the 1976 Celtics for the second-most consecutive games won at home in a single postseason (most 10, four times).
- 15: The Warriors have won at least one road game in each of their last 15 playoff series, a franchise record.
- 2: Golden State swept its first three series to become only the second team in NBA history to record three consecutive series sweeps in one year's playoffs, joining the Lakers who did it three times (1950, 1989, 2001).
- 1: Draymond Green became the first player in franchise history to earn NBA Defensive Player of the Year honors, earning the accolade after finishing as the runner-up for the award in each of the past two seasons.
- 2: Warriors President of Basketball Operations / General Manager Bob Myers was named NBA Executive of the Year for the second time in three seasons... Myers, who previously won the award in 2014-15, is the first Warriors executive to earn the honor on multiple occasions, marking the third such honor in Warriors history (Dick Vertlieb, 1974-75).
- 3: Stephen Curry and Kevin Durant were named to the All-NBA Second Team while Draymond Green earned Third Team honors, marking the third time the Warriors have had three players earn All-NBA accolades in the same season (previously: Curry, Green & Klay Thompson in 2015-16 and Paul Arizin, Neil Johnston and Jack George in 1955-56)... Curry is the first Warrior to be named to four-straight All-NBA teams since Chris Mullin from 1988-89 to 1991-92.
- 67: The Warriors have won at least 67 games in each of the last three seasons (67-15 in 2014-15, 73-9 in 2015-16, 67-15 in 2016-17), becoming the first team in NBA history to win 67 games in three-straight campaigns (no team had ever won as many as 63 games in three-straight seasons).

- 5: The Warriors qualified for the playoffs in five consecutive seasons, the franchise's longest streak of postseason berths since making six-straight playoff appearances in each of the first six years of the league's existence (1947-1952).
- 3: The Warriors won the Pacific Division title, earning three consecutive division crowns for the first time in franchise history to give them five Pacific Division titles since the NBA began using the current divisional format in 1970-71.
- 31: The Warriors posted a 31-10 (.756) record away from home one year after winning an NBA-record 34 road games, making them the first team in NBA history to win at least 31 road games in consecutive seasons.
- 207: The Warriors won 207 regular-season games over the last three seasons, which is the most regular-season wins over a three-season span in NBA history surpassing the mark of 203 games set by the Chicago Bulls from 1995-96 to 1997-98.
- 200: Warriors Head Coach Steve Kerr won his 200th career regular-season game in just his 238th game, reach 200 wins in fewer games than any coach in professional sports history.
- 4: The Warriors had an NBA-record-tying four All-Stars in New Orleans (Stephen Curry, Kevin Durant, Draymond Green, Klay Thompson), marking the eighth time in NBA history that a team has had four players appear in the All-Star Game... It also marked just the fifth time a team has had its coach (Steve Kerr) represent the conference with four of his team's players in the game.
- 11.63: The Warriors posted a franchise-record point differential of +11.63, which ranks as the fourth-highest average margin of victory in NBA history... The Warriors outscored the opposition 115.9 to 104.3 during the regular season.
- 14: The Warriors won an NBA-season-high 14-straight games from March 14 to April 8, joining the Philadelphia 76ers (from 1980-81 to 1982-83) as the only teams in NBA history to compile a double-digit win streak in three-straight seasons... Golden State previously won 28-straight games from the end of 2014-15 to the beginning of 2015-16 (including the first 24 games of the 2015-16 season) and 16-straight games in 2014-15.

- 36: Golden State posted a 36-5 (.878) record at home, becoming the first team to win at least 36 home games in each of three consecutive campaigns since the Chicago Bulls from 1995-96 to 1997-98.
- 146: The Warriors played an NBA-record 146 consecutive regular-season games without suffering back-to-back losses, a streak that ended on March 2 at Chicago.
- 50: The Warriors dished out at least 30 assists in a franchise-record 50 games, joining the L.A. Lakers in 1984-85 (an NBA-record 52 30-assist games) as the only teams in NBA history to reach the 30-assist mark in at least 50 games in a single season.
- 30.4: Golden State dished out an average of 30.4 assists per game, a franchise record and the fifth-highest single-season assist average in NBA history... The Warriors' 30.4 assists per game are the highest total in the NBA since the Los Angeles Lakers dished out an NBA-record 31.4 helpers per game in 1984-85.
- 324: Stephen Curry led the league in three-point field goals for a fifth consecutive campaign, hitting over 300 three-pointers for a second-straight season (no other player in NBA history has hit 300 threes in a season)... Curry's 324 threes trail only his NBA-record 402 threes in 2015-16 as the most in a single season in NBA history.
- 13: Stephen Curry set the single-game NBA record for three-point field goals with 13 threes on Nov. 7 vs. New Orleans, eclipsing the previous mark of 12 that he shared with Kobe Bryant and Donyell Marshall.
- 25: Both Stephen Curry (25.3) and Kevin Durant (25.1) averaged at least 25 points per game, the first time in Warriors history that a pair of players both averaged at least 25 points over the course of a season... - 2.03: Draymond Green led the league in steals per game with 2.03 thefts per game, giving the Warriors the NBA's leader in steals per game for a second-straight season (Stephen Curry led the league with 2.14 steals per game in 2015-16).
- 10: Draymond Green swiped a franchise-record 10 steals on Feb. 10 at Memphis, recording the first triple-double in NBA history without scoring in double figures (11 rebounds, 10 assists).
- 4.50: Andre Iguodala became the first player in franchise history to lead the league in assist-to-turnover ratio, posting an NBA-best 4.50 ratio.
- 60: Klay Thompson scored a career-high 60 points in just 29 minutes on Dec. 5 vs. Indiana, becoming the fourth player in franchise history to reach the 60-point mark in a single game...
