SF RUDY GAY

- Averaging a team-high **18.5 points** (17th in the NBA) and a career-high **6.6 rebounds** with **three double-doubles** after returning from last season's season-ending shoulder injury.
- Tied a career high with **13 rebounds** to go with **20 points** and **five assists** on Jan. 31 vs. Denver
- One of the NBA's top two-way forwards, averaged 19.8 points, 6.2 rebounds, 1.68 steals and 1.07 blocks in 39.9 minutes in 54 games last season before suffering a season-ending left shoulder subluxation.
- Last season, averaged career highs in seven major statistical categories, including assists (2.8), steals, blocks, field goal percentage (.471), three-point field goal percentage (.396), free throw percentage (.805) and minutes.
- Helped the United States win the gold medal at the 2010 FIBA World Championships.

- Acquired by Memphis from the Philadelphia 76ers on Jan. 4 in a three-way trade also involving the New Orleans Hornets... The Grizzlies sent **Xavier Henry** to New Orleans and a 2012 second round pick to Philadelphia in the deal.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #27 – MEMPHIS 98, INDIANA 92, Feb. 10 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – In a matchup featuring two newly-named All-Star reserves, **Marc Gasol** outplayed Pacers center **Roy Hibbert**, as the Memphis Grizzlies outlasted Indiana for a second consecutive victory... Gasol, who finished with 15 points, seven rebounds, four assists and three blocks, made a series of key plays down the stretch against Hibbert, blocking the 7-2 center twice and winning a jump ball in the final three minutes... On the other end, Gasol made a pair of free throws to put the Grizzlies up six points (93-87) with 1:09 remaining in the game... Hibbert was limited to a season-low five points on 1-of-7 shooting... The game featured 18 lead changes and 17 ties, as both teams were tied through the end of the first, second and third quarters... Memphis held Indiana to .238 shooting (5-of-21 FG) in the fourth quarter to win despite being outrebounded 48-37 for the game... **Rudy Gay** led Memphis with 21 points, while **Marreese Speights** scored a season-high 19 points and secured nine rebounds... **Mike Conley** (15 points) and **O.J. Mayo** (13) scored in double figures... **David West** led Indiana with a game-high 22 points and a season-best 13 rebounds.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #26 – MEMPHIS 85, MINNESOTA 80, Feb. 8 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies controlled the offensive glass and took advantage of second chances in defeating the Minnesota Timberwolves and ending a three-game losing streak... Memphis outrebounded Minnesota 59-47 overall and 21-10 on the offensive side, setting season highs for both total rebounds and offensive rebounds... Seven of Memphis' offensive boards came in the second quarter, as the Grizzlies held the Timberwolves to just 13 points on 3-of-21 shooting (.143) in the quarter... As a result, the Grizzlies outscored the Timberwolves 22-13 in second chance points for the game... Memphis scored 10 consecutive points bridging the second and third quarters to take a 16-point advantage with 10:26 remaining in the third quarter... From there, Minnesota would get no closer than the five-point margin at the end of the game... **Rudy Gay** led all scorers with 19 points, while **Quincy Pondexter** scored a career-best 17 points in his second start of the season... **Dante Cunningham** added a season-high 12 points off the bench, and **Marreese Speights** corralled a career-high tying 15 rebounds, including a career-best eight offensive boards... **J.J. Barea** led Minnesota off the bench with 17 points and six assists... The Grizzlies defeated the Timberwolves for the second time this season and extended their winning streak over Minnesota to six-straight games.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #7 – UTAH 94, MEMPHIS 85, Jan. 6 at EnergySolutions Arena

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies' two-game winning streak came to an end in Utah, as the team lost its eighth consecutive road matchup with the Jazz... Though Memphis led by as many as 10 points in the first half, the Grizzlies committed seven of their 20 turnovers in the third quarter, as Utah earned its own 10-point advantage thanks to a 9-0 run that gave the Jazz a 78-68 advantage with 6:16 remaining in the game... Memphis shot just 33 percent after halftime, including 6-of-23 shooting in the fourth quarter, while the Grizzlies reserves were outscored 41-11 and were shut out in the second half... **Marc Gasol** and **Tony Allen** each scored a season-high 21 points... Gasol added 11 rebounds and a career-high six blocks to his season-high point total... **Al Jefferson's** 20 points paced Utah, which had five players score in double figures.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #3 – MEMPHIS 113, HOUSTON 93, Dec. 28 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – Active defense, high-percentage shots and the Grizzlies' patented "grit and grind" style stamped Memphis' first win of the 2011-12 season, as the Grizzlies earned a 20-point victory over a Houston Rockets squad that had taken eight of the last nine in the overall series... **Zach Randolph** helped the Grizzlies close the year 2011 on a high note, leading all scorers with 23 points to go with three steals... **Marc Gasol** posted 20 points, eight rebounds, three steals and a career-high tying five blocks in 29 minutes, playing only the first three quarters... Four other Grizzlies scored in double figures, including **Jeremy Pargo** (14 points) making his first NBA start and **Quincy Pondexter** (13)... Memphis scored 56 points in the paint, enjoyed .563 shooting from the field and forced 20 Rockets turnovers... Leading 57-51 at halftime, Memphis used an 18-7 run after the break to take a 75-58 advantage with 5:39 remaining in the third and built the lead up to as many as 25 points early in the fourth... **Kevin Martin** scored 21 to lead the Rockets, while **Kyle Lowry** added 15.

2011-12 QUICK FACTS

TEAM QUICK FACTS

- Memphis is mere percentage points behind Utah for the ninth spot in the West and a half-game back from Portland for the eighth seed in the Western Conference Playoffs.
- After playing nine of the previous 12 games on the road, Memphis is in the midst of a stretch of playing seven of the next eight at home, including its current five-game home stand... The last time the Grizzlies played five consecutive home games was a five-game stretch from Dec. 12-22, 2008, before **Lionel Hollins** was hired as the team's head coach.
- The Grizzlies are undefeated when scoring 100 points in a game (**5-0**) and are the best in the NBA at holding opponents under 100 points (**24** games).
- Memphis is **7-1** against teams with sub-.500 records this season (**7-11** against teams with .500 or better records)... (This excludes the season opener on Dec. 26 at San Antonio, when each team had a 0-0 record).
- Memphis had its season-high seven-game winning streak snapped on Jan. 24 at Portland... It was the team's longest streak since a seven-game run from March 14-26, 2006 and just one victory shy of tying the franchise record streak from Jan. 11-25, 2004.
- Prior to the loss on Jan. 24 at Portland, Memphis sat atop the Southwest Division... Before this season, the latest the Grizzlies have ever had a share of first place in their division was four games into the 2005-06 season (3-1, tied with San Antonio through games played on Nov. 8, 2005)... The franchise, including its days in Vancouver, has never had first place all to itself until then.

PLAYER QUICK FACTS

- **Marc Gasol** earned his first All-Star nod when he was named to the 2012 Western Conference All-Star Team as a reserve on Feb. 9... Gasol, one of two first-time All-Stars in the West this season (**LaMarcus Aldridge**), is averaging career highs this season in points, rebounds, assists, blocks and minutes.
- **Marc Gasol** is the third All-Star in Grizzlies history, joining teammate **Zach Randolph** (2010) and brother **Pau Gasol** (2006).
- **Marc Gasol** won his first career NBA Player of the Week Award for the week of Jan. 16, averaging 19.5 points, 9.8 rebounds, 4.5 assists and 2.50 blocks on .673 shooting in 36.3 minutes in leading the Grizzlies to a perfect 4-0 record.
- Memphis is **13-10** since **Zach Randolph** has been sidelined with a torn right MCL... Randolph, who sustained the injury on Jan. 1 at Chicago, will miss 6-8 weeks.
- **Rudy Gay** has been a big reason Memphis has stayed alive in the standings in Z-Bo's absence, scoring 20-plus points in **12** of the last **18** games after doing so just once in the team's first nine contests... Memphis stands **10-3** this season when Gay reaches 20 points.
- With the first of his three steals on Feb. 2 at Atlanta, **Rudy Gay** surpassed **Shane Battier** as the franchise's all-time steals leader... Battier needed 419 games to reach his record total (523), while Gay did it in only 394 games.
- **O.J. Mayo** has scored double figures off the bench **19** times this season... All other Grizzlies have reached double figures in a reserve role a combined **11** times.
- **Mike Conley** is on pace to set a franchise record for steals per game (career-high **2.44**)... That mark ranks **second** in the NBA this season.

PRESSING PAWS

After leading the NBA in steals last season (9.4), the Memphis Grizzlies are nearly a full steal ahead of that pace this year, averaging **10.33** per game... That is the highest average the league has seen since the Philadelphia 76ers recorded 10.84 thefts per game in, ironically, the last lockout-shortened season (1998-99).

Remember **Marc Gasol's** performance during the 2011 NBA Playoffs? His numbers are just as good this season... Acquired by Memphis from the Los Angeles Lakers in exchange for brother **Pau Gasol** while still playing overseas in Spain, Marc has grown into one of the top centers and best all-around big men in the NBA, averaging career highs in points (**15.0**), rebounds (**10.0**, **T-10th** in the NBA), assists (**2.8**) and blocks (**2.26**, **4th**) while shooting **.493** from the field... He also ranks **T-5th** in the league in minutes (team-high **37.7**).

Respectively, those are the first and **fifth**-highest marks by any qualifying player over the last **five** NBA seasons! In **second** place is current Grizzlies TV analyst **Brevin Knight**... THE JUICE IS LOOSE

O.J. Mayo is relishing his role as instant offense off the bench... As a reserve, Mayo has scored in double figures in **19** of his **27** games this season, far exceeding of his proficiency off the bench last season (10-plus points 30 times in 54 games in reserve in 2010-11)... By comparison, all other Grizzlies reserves have reached double digits **11** times combined, with **Dante Cunningham** coming in second place with **three**.

WITHOUT Z-BO

Just as Memphis did last season, when the team made its memorable run in the 2011 Playoffs despite losing star forward **Rudy Gay** before the All-Star Break, head coach **Lionel Hollins** has the Grizzlies marching on after losing last season's leading scorer and rebounder **Zach Randolph**, who sustained a torn right MCL on Jan. 1 in the first quarter against the Chicago Bulls... Randolph will miss 6-8 weeks with the injury... Memphis has gone **13-10** minus Z-Bo, who was posting 19.0 points and 9.0 rebounds .500 shooting in three games before the injury, and the team's calling card of dominating the paint has not changed... Without Randolph, one of the NBA's most reliable inside players, Memphis continues to outscore opponents in the paint (**45.5 to 38.3**), pouring in 72 points inside on Jan. 3 vs. Sacramento.

CONLEY THE PLAYMAKER

Mike Conley steals from opponents and spreads the wealth to his teammates... Conley has been one of the league's best at assists and steals dating back to last season...
