Atlanta has taken two-of-the-last-three matchups in Memphis ... The Hawks hold an 18-10 advantage in the all-time series (6-7 on the road).

Jason Collins spent time two years ago with the Grizzlies, appearing in 31 games ... Mike Bibby was drafted by the Vancouver Grizzlies (2nd overall in 1988), and spent the first three years of his career with the franchise ... Bibby's father Henry is an assistant coach with the Grizzlies ... Memphis assistant coach Johnny Davis spent time with the Hawks as an assistant, as well as in other front office capacities ... Jamaal Tinsley was originally drafted by the Hawks (27th overall in 2001) before being traded on draft night to Indiana for a future first-round pick.

GAME AT WASHINGTON POSTPONED: The Hawks-Wizards game scheduled for February 6 was postponed due to severe weather conditions in the Washington DC area ... The game has been rescheduled for Thursday, March 11 (7 p.m.) at Verizon Center.

ALL-STARS: Joe Johnson has been selected to his fourth consecutive Eastern Conference All-Star team, while Al Horford earned his first trip to the midseason classic ... The 2010 NBA All-Star game will be played on February 14 at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, TX ... Johnson will also participate in the Haier Shooting Stars competition on February 13 as part of NBA All-Star Saturday Night, joining former Hawks star Steve Smith and Atlanta Dream guard Angel McCoughtry representing Team Atlanta ... Horford is the first Hawks draft pick since Kevin Willis (drafted in 1984) to be named an All-Star.

JC FOR ... FOUR!: On 2/3 vs. LAC, Jamal Crawford set the NBA career record for four-point plays (24), according to Harvey Pollack's NBA statistical yearbook ... Crawford recorded his fifth of the season (also 1/20 v/Sac, 1/8 v/Bos, 12/26 @Ind, 1/27 @SA), surpassing Reggie Miller's 23, which he compiled over his 18-year career.

DON'T BRING THAT STUFF IN HERE: On 2/2 at OKC, Josh Smith (at age 24 years/59 days) became the youngest player in NBA history to reach the 1,000 career block plateau, topping Benoit Benjamin (25 years/128 days) ... He is 3rd in the NBA in bpg (2.16) and total blocks (106) ... Earlier this season, he became the youngest player in NBA history to reach 900 rejections on 10/30 vs. Wash., at 23 years, 329 days old ... Shaquille O'Neal (24 years, 286 days) held the mark.

THE DIFFERENCE: A leading candidate for the Sixth Man Award, Jamal Crawford ("The Difference") is 2nd on the team in ppg at 17.6 ppg (36th in the NBA), in 30.6 mpg ... He leads the league in scoring among players who haven't started a game this season ... Crawford is averaging 19.6 ppg (333) over his last 17 contests, including a clutch 26-footer as time expired to beat the Suns on 1/15.

ROBIN HOOD: Josh Smith reached the 500 career steals mark on 1/22 vs. Charlotte, in the process moving past Spud Webb into 10th place on the Hawks career leaders list ... He now has 514, and trails Jon Koncak (515) by 1 for 9th place.

ATTENDANCE MARK: The Hawks drew a Philips Arena regular season record 20,150 fans to the building for the 12/29 game vs. Cleveland ... It was the second-biggest crowd ever at Philips Arena, behind a playoff contest against Boston on 5/2/08 (20,425).

OFFENSIVELY SPEAKING: Atlanta is 8th in the league in scoring (101.9 ppg), 10th in FG% (.465) and 15th in FT% (after finishing 28th last year) at .763, while committing only 11.9 turnovers per game (best in the NBA).

5K AND COUNTING: With his dish to Al Horford with 26 seconds remaining in the second quarter vs. New York on 1/1, Mike Bibby reached 5,000 assists for his career, joining Jason Kidd, Steve Nash, Andre Miller, Allen Iverson and Baron Davis as the only active players with that many ... He is also the 49th player in league history to reach the milestone ... On 1/25 @Hou, Bibby put in his 5,000th career field goal on a layup with 2:40 remaining in the contest.

DELIVERING IN THE PAINT: The Hawks are the league's 4th-best team in the paint, delivering 45.2 points per game ... Atlanta is also 4th in fast break points at 16.5.

SCHEDULE CHANGES: The NBA has announced that the March 21 game vs. San Antonio will now be televised on ESPN (in addition to SportSouth HD) and will begin at 8 p.m. ... There is also a time change for the February 26 game vs. Dallas ... The game, televised by ESPN, will now start at 7 p.m. instead of 8 p.m.

SHOWING IMPROVEMENT: The Hawks last season became the first team since Dallas (from 1999-2003) to surpass its previous season's record for four straight years ... Dallas won 19, 40, 53, 57, 60 games from 99-00 through 02-03, while Atlanta has won 13, 26, 30, 37 and 47 since 04-05 ... The 47 were Atlanta's most since 50 in 1997-98.

HEAD COACH MIKE WOODSON

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 185-274 (sixth year)
2009-10 Record: 32-17

Entering his sixth year, Hawks head coach Mike Woodson has improved the team's record in each of the last four seasons, the only coach in the NBA to do so. Yet, after taking his team from a rocky 13-win campaign in his first year to 47 victories last season, Woodson wants more, and he is determined to keep his team amongst the NBA's elite.

With all of his starters back from a squad that reached the second round of the 2009 Playoffs and key off-season acquisitions to bolster the bench, Woodson has his most experienced team ever to challenge for the NBA Championship.

Last season, he guided the Hawks to their first winning season in a decade (47-35), as Atlanta reached the playoffs for the second straight year, reaching the second round of the postseason for the first time since 1996-97. Not since the Dallas Mavericks' teams from 1999-2003 had any NBA team improved its win total four consecutive years, but Atlanta's climb under Woodson duplicated that impressive mark.

Now the challenge for Woodson is to maintain and build on that level of success in a competitive Eastern Conference, where several teams made significant moves to remain strong, and continue to guide his young and maturing squad into a consistent threat each night.

Prior to becoming the Hawks head coach, Woodson reached the pinnacle of success during his days as an assistant with the Detroit Pistons. In 2004-05, the Pistons won the franchise's third NBA championship, defeating the heavily-favored Los Angeles Lakers, four games to one.

His days in Motown were the foundation for many of the coaching principles he attempts to instill within his players. Learning from Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown, Woodson has continued to stress "doing things the right way" – working hard, putting the team first and dedicating themselves to becoming the best players they can be, as they work together to build a winning organization, on-and-off the court.

The 10th head coach in Hawks' history, Woodson has a record of 185-274 (.403). For the fourth year in a row, he coached Atlanta to a better record than the previous season, improving by 10 wins in 2008-09. Atlanta built on that 13-victory inaugural season, to seasons of 26, 30, and 37, before recording 47 a year ago.

The 51-year-old Woodson has over two decades of NBA experience as a player and coach, and served three seasons as an assistant under Brown in both Philadelphia (2001-03) and Detroit. He also worked as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers (1999-01) and the Milwaukee Bucks (1996-99).

One of the chief architects behind the Pistons' suffocating defensive effort during the 2003-04 season, Detroit held the opposition to 84.3 points per game that year, which equaled the league's best total defensively (along with San Antonio). In addition, the Pistons' point differential of +5.84 was the second-best in the NBA and they limited opponents to 41.4 field goal shooting, the league's third-best performance. During their 23 postseason games, Detroit intensified their efforts defensively, holding teams to 80.7 ppg and 39.2 FG shooting, and in the five-game Finals series against Los Angeles, the Pistons kept the Lakers more than 16 points under their regular season average and hounded them into shooting 41 percent from the floor.

The 11-year veteran and 6-5 guard played for seven teams in the NBA after he was selected in the first round of the 1980 Draft by the New York Knicks with the 12th overall pick. In 786 career games, Woodson averaged 14.0 points (10.981 career points), 2.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 25.5 minutes, enjoying his best season in 1982-83 when he played for the then-Kansas City Kings and posted 18.2 points per game.

In addition to the Knicks and Kings (both in Kansas City and Sacramento), Woodson also played with New Jersey, the Los Angeles Clippers, Houston and Cleveland, before retiring from the game in 1991. His teams advanced to the playoffs five times, where he averaged 12.2 ppg, 2.6 apg and 2.3 rpg.

Drafted out of Indiana University, Woodson, in his junior season, helped lead the Hoosiers to the 1979 National Invitational Tournament (NIT) championship with a 53-52 victory over conference rival Purdue and was named to the All-Tourney team.

During the summer of that year, he played for Bob Knight and captained the United States team that participated in the Pan American (Am) Games, joining teammates Isiah Thomas and Ray Tolbert in winning the gold medal.

A two-time All-American (1979 and 1980) and four-year letterman Woodson suffered a herniated disk in his back after five games (and a No. 1 ranking) into his senior campaign and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, Indiana went 7-5 in the Big Ten, but once he returned, IU finished the conference season at 6-0 and captured the Big Ten title. Despite the limited action, Woodson took home the league's 1980 MVP award.

The fifth-leading scorer in IU history with 2,061 points, Woodson averaged 19.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 104 games with the Hoosiers. He graduated with a degree in physical education.

Woodson, born March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis, IN, attended Broad Ripple High in Indianapolis. The high school, whose alumni include CBS' David Letterman and former Vice President Dan Quayle's wife Marilyn, retired his number in 2006. He and his wife Terri have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, both very talented volleyball players. Alexis is a member of the Georgia Tech volleyball program, while Mariah is starting her freshman season at the University of Florida.
