PLAYOFF NOTES

- The Hawks tied their playoff low for free throws made (7), and set a mark for fewest rebounds (23) on 5/9 vs. Cleveland (game three).
- In game one of the second round vs. Cleveland (5/6), the Hawks tied playoff lows in points in a fourth quarter (11) and second half (28).
- Atlanta downed Miami in the first round, 4-3, winning the franchise's first best-of-seven series since 1970 vs. Chicago (4-1) ... In series that have gone seven games, it was the Hawks' first victory since St. Louis beat Los Angeles, 4-3, in 1961 ... They had previously played in three Game 7's in Atlanta history, all on the road (1979 @Wash; 1988 @Bos; 2008 @Bos), coming out on the losing end each time.
- The Hawks have advanced to the second round of the playoffs for the first time since 1999 (lost 4-0 to NY).
- Zaza Pachulia's 18 rebounds in Game 4 (4/27/09) were the most by a Hawk in postseason play since Dikembe Mutombo pulled down 18 on 5/16/99 vs. Detroit.
- The Hawks won the first game of a seven-game series v/Mia (4/19) for the first time since the 1969-70 playoffs.
- On 4/19 (in Game 1), Hawks held Miami to an opponent playoff record-tying 64 pts (for a game) and 25 pts (in 2nd half), also holding Miami to an opponent playoff record-low 7 pts (in the 4th quarter).
- Miami also equaled a Hawks opponent playoff record for fewest free throws made in a game (8) and made the second-fewest field goals (26) by an Atl playoff opponent (in Game 1).
- Miami set an Atlanta playoff opponent record low with 23 field goals made (in Game 4, 4/27).

REGULAR SEASON NOTES

SHATTERING ATTENDANCE MARKS

Atlanta finished the regular season with the highest attendance in Philips Arena history, and the 2nd-biggest total/avg. in team history ... The Hawks averaged 16,748 fans (plus an Arena record 12 sellouts) ... The crowd of 20,148 on 3/29 vs. LAL was the biggest in Arena history for a regular season game ... Atlanta's attendance has risen each of the last seven seasons.

COMEBACK KIDS

Atlanta won at Toronto on 4/7 after trailing at halftime, 57-53, and won at Milwaukee on 4/8, despite a halftime deficit of nine points ... It's the first time since November 1988 that the Hawks won games on consecutive days, both on the road, by overcoming a halftime deficit in each.

JOE JOHNSON: ANOTHER 4TH-QUARTER TERROR

Joe Johnson scored nine points in the final six minutes to lead the Hawks to their 118-110 victory in Toronto on 4/7 ... Johnson was 10th in the NBA in total pts scored this season, but was sixth in pts in the 4th quarter, behind only Dwyane Wade, LeBron James, Kobe Bryant, Chris Paul and Brandon Roy.

STREAK BUSTERS

The Hawks were one of two teams this season (Detroit) to snap three separate seven-or-more game win streaks:

12/13 vs. Cleveland – 97-92 (11-game streak)

3/9 vs. New Orleans – 89-79 (7-game streak)

3/11 vs. Utah – 100-93 (12-game streak)

The Hawks also recorded three six-or-more game winning streaks this season for the second time in Atlanta history.

SHOWING IMPROVEMENT EVERY YEAR

The Hawks have become the first team since the Dallas Mavericks (from 1999-2003) to surpass its previous season's record for four straight years ... Dallas won 19, 40, 53, 57, 60 games between the 1999-2000 through 2002-2003 seasons, while Atlanta has won 13, 26, 30, 37 and 47 since the 2004-05 season ... The 47 are Atlanta's most since 50 in 1997-98.

DEFENSE A GOOD BAROMETER

Atlanta held 15-of-the-last-21 regular season opponents under 100 pts (including the league's third-highest scoring team, the Lakers, to a season-low 76 points on 3/29) ... In the last 21, the opposition scored 94.7 ppg (1988) ... Atlanta finished 10th in the NBA in ppg allowed (96.5 ppg) and 11th in opp. FG% (.454).

Joe Johnson is now 3rd in Hawks history in 3FGM (565), having passed Dominique Wilkins (1/20 @Chi) and Steve Smith (3/31 @Phil) this season ... He trails Mookie Blaylock (1050) and Jason Terry (648) on the list ... Josh Smith is 3rd in club history in blocked shots (897) ... He trails Tree Rollins (2283) and Dikembe Mutombo (1094).

J-SMOOVE SETS ANOTHER NBA BLOCKS MARK

On 12/6, Josh Smith became the youngest player in history to reach the 800-block mark ... Smith, who turned 23 the day before, shattered the mark held by Shaquille O'Neal. Smith is the youngest in NBA history to reach the following benchmarks (courtesy of Elias Sports Bureau):

PLAYOFF GAME #11 (May 11)**CLEV 84, ATL 74 (Philips Arena, Atlanta, GA)**

The Cavaliers topped the Hawks 84-74 at Philips Arena to take the best-of-seven playoff series 4-0 ... Atlanta jumped out to a 22-15 lead in the first quarter behind 10 points from Josh Smith, but Cleveland rallied to take a 40-38 lead at halftime ... Smith finished with 16 for the half to lead the Hawks, while LeBron James' 12 paced the Cavaliers ... Atlanta forced 11 Cleveland turnovers (leading to 16 points) in the first half but shot only 31.6% (12-38) from the field ... The Hawks had 4 turnovers in the half (leading to 4 points) ... The Cavs opened the third on an 8-0 run to push the lead to 10 ... The Hawks wouldn't go away and rallied to cut the deficit to 2 points, but could get no closer ... Smith led the Hawks with 26 points and 8 rebounds ... Joe Johnson had 18 points and 7 assists ... Flip Murray added 14 off the bench ... James finished with a game-high 27 points for Cleveland ... He also had 8 boards and 8 assists ... Delonte West scored 21, while Zydrunas Ilgauskas had 14 points and 10 rebounds ... For the game, Atlanta shot 31.5% from the field (23-73), 15.4% from 3-point range (2-13) and 86.7% from the line (26-30) ... Cleveland hit 42.9% from the field (30-70), 55.6% from behind the arc (10-18) and 53.8% from the charity stripe (14-26).

LeBron James carried Cleveland to 97-82 Game Three win over Atlanta at Philips Arena ... James finished the night with 47 points, 12 rebounds and 8 assists ... The Cavaliers led by as many as 9 points in the first quarter before the Hawks started the second stanza on a 10-2 run to claim the lead ... Cleveland came back again and held a 47-46 advantage at the break ... Josh Smith led the Hawks in the first half with 12 points ... Joe Johnson and Flip Murray each had 10 ... LeBron James led all scorers with 22 ... The teams traded runs in the third quarter with the Cavs eventually pushing their lead to 72-65 ... The Hawks hit 7-11 FTs on the night while Cleveland was 21-29 from the charity stripe ... James was 12-16 alone from the foul line ... Cleveland won the battle of boards 46-23 ... James' 12 rebounds were a game-high and Anderson Varejao grabbed 10 caroms ... Joe Johnson led the Hawks with 21 points and 5 rebounds ... Josh Smith added 18 and 5 boards, and Flip Murray scored 17 off the bench ... The Cavs had only six players score, led by James' 47 ... Atlanta hit 33.3% (13-39) in the first half and managed 6 points off of 7 Cavs turnovers ... Mike Bibby's 9 and Mo Evans' 8 points led Atlanta in the first half ... LeBron James tallied 18 (including a 3-pointer at the halftime buzzer) to lead all scorers ... The Cavs won the battle of the boards 43-34 and had a 44-24 advantage in points in the paint ... Josh Smith led the Hawks with 17 points in the first half and Mike Bibby added 14 (4-4 3FGs) ... LeBron James paced the Cavs with 22 ... Cleveland ended the the 3rd quarter on a 16-7 run, pushing their lead to 77-61 heading to the fourth ... The Cavs won the battle of the boards 41-33 and outscored the Hawks in the paint 40-26 ... The Hawks turned the ball over 9 times (leading to 11 Heat points) ... Three-point shooting played a huge role in the win as Atlanta hit 11-23 (.478) from long range, while the Heat managed 4-19 (.211) ... Joe Johnson led the Hawks with 27 points on 10-19 FGs, 6-8 3FGs and 1-2 FTs ... He also had 5 steals, 5 boards and 4 assists ... Josh Smith tallied 21 points and team-high 9 rebounds ... ATL 106, MIA 91 (Philips Arena, Atlanta, GA)

The Hawks knocked off the Heat 106-91 at Philips Arena to take a 3-2 series lead ... After a back-and-forth first quarter that ended with Atlanta leading 24-20, the Hawks outscored Miami 39-20 in second to take a commanding lead (63-40) at the break ... The Heat never got closer than 13 the rest of the night ... Atlanta shot a sizzling 81.3% in the second quarter (13-16 FGs) and hit 12-14 FTs (85.7%) ... Four Hawks were double-figures by halftime, led by Joe Johnson's 17 and Mike Bibby's 15 ... Maurice Evans and Josh Smith each added 10 ... Jermaine O'Neal had 12 to pace Miami ... Atlanta ended the night shooting 48.6 from the field (34-70 FGs) and hit 33-41 FTs (80.5%) ... The Heat shot 47.7% (31-65) and put in 25-32 FTs (78.1%) ... Johnson finished the night with a team-high 25 points ... Flip Murray came off the bench for a career playoff high 23 points ... Josh Smith tallied 20 points and team-high 8 boards ... OFF THE COURT

Al Horford was the recipient of the 2008-09 Jason Collier Memorial Trophy on 4/4. Named after the late Hawks center who passed away October 15, 2005, and is presented annually to the individual who best exemplifies the characteristics Collier displayed off the court as a community ambassador.

Philips Arena announced on 4/6 that the building has attained LEED certification by the United States Green Build Commission. LEED stands for "Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design" and represents independent, third-party verification that the arena has met green building operating standards and performance measures. Philips Arena is the first NBA or NHL arena to achieve this certification for an existing facility.

HEAD COACH MIKE WOODSON

RECORD IN NBA PLAYOFFS: 7-11 / Overall NBA Coaching Record: 153-257 (fifth year) / 2008-09 Record: 47-35

After leading the Hawks to the NBA Playoffs last season for the first time in nine years and pushing the eventual NBA champion Boston Celtics to seven games in the first round, Atlanta Hawks head coach Mike Woodson set new goals for his club. Among the targets - hosting a playoff series in front of the home fans at Philips Arena, where the playoff atmosphere was frenzied last season.

Consider that mission accomplished.

Atlanta held sole possession of the fourth playoff position in the East from January 14 on, and will begin their quest for the Larry O'Brien Trophy by hosting a first round series for the first time in Philips Arena history, and for the team, its first since the 1999 Playoffs.

The club improved its win total under Woody's direction for the fourth straight season - from 13 in 2004-05 to 26, 30, 37 and 47 this season. Atlanta became the first team since the Dallas Mavericks (from 1999-2003) to accomplish that difficult feat.

Woodson, who entered his Hawks coaching career as a rookie head coach, inherited a rebuilding situation that brought a lot of pain, heartache and many long nights on the losing end of games. While the wins were few and far between, he never stopped preaching and teaching his young troops towards their ultimate goal of contending for an NBA championship.

Accustomed to postseason action prior to joining the Hawks, Woodson has reached the pinnacle of success before, coming during his days as an assistant with the Detroit Pistons. In 2004-05, the Pistons won the franchise's third NBA championship, defeating the heavily-favored Los Angeles Lakers, four games to one.

It is where Woodson learned many of the coaching principles that he attempts to instill within his players in Atlanta. Learning from Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown, "Woody" has continued to stress "doing the things the right way" -- working hard, putting the team first and dedicating themselves to becoming the best players they can be, as they work together to build a winning organization, on-and-off the court.

The 10th head coach in Hawks' history, Woodson has a record of 153-257 (.373). He finishes the 2008-09 campaign with the fifth-most coaching wins in Atlanta history.

The 51-year-old Woodson has over two decades of NBA experience as a player and coach, and served three seasons as an assistant under Brown in both Philadelphia (2001-03) and Detroit. He also worked as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers (1999-01) and the Milwaukee Bucks (1996-99).

One of the chief architects behind the Pistons' suffocating defensive effort during the 2003-04 season, Detroit held the opposition to 84.3 points per game that year, which equaled the league's best total defensively (along with San Antonio). In addition, the Pistons' point differential of +5.84 was the second-best in the NBA and they limited opponents to 41.4% FGs, the league's third-best performance. During their 23 postseason games, Detroit intensified their efforts defensively, holding teams to 80.7 ppg and 39.2% FGs, and in the five-game Finals series against Los Angeles, the Pistons kept the Lakers more than 16 points under their regular season average and hounded them into shooting 41 percent from the floor.

The 11-year veteran and 6-5 guard played for seven teams in the NBA after he was selected in the first round of the 1980 Draft by the New York Knicks with the 12th overall pick. In 786 career games, Woodson averaged 14.0 points (10,981 career points), 2.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 25.5 minutes of action, enjoying his best campaign in 1982-83 when he played for the then-Kansas City Kings and posted 18.2 points per game. Woodson helped the Kings to a third-place finish in the Midwest Division (38-44) and a first round playoff berth against Lakers.

In addition to the Knicks and Kings (both in Kansas City and Sacramento), Woodson also played with New Jersey, the Los Angeles Clippers, Houston and Cleveland, before retiring from the game in 1991. His teams advanced to the playoffs five times, where he averaged 12.2 ppg, 2.6 apg and 2.3 rpg.

Drafted out of Indiana University, Woodson, in his junior season, helped lead the Hoosiers to the 1979 National Invitation Tournament (NIT) championship with a 53-52 victory over conference foe Purdue and was named to the All-Tourney team.

During the summer of that year, he played for Bob Knight and captained the United States team that participated in the Pan Am Games, joining teammates Isiah Thomas and Ray Tolbert in winning the gold medal.

A two-time All-American (1979 and 1980) and four-year letterman, Woodson suffered a herniated disk in his back after five games (and a No.1 ranking) into his senior campaign and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, Indiana went 7-5 in the Big Ten, but once he returned, IU finished the conference season at 6-0 and captured the Big Ten title. Despite the limited action, Woodson took home the league's 1980 MVP award.

The fifth-leading scorer in IU history with 2,061 points, Woodson averaged 19.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 104 games with the Hoosiers. He graduated with a degree in physical education.

Woodson, born March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis, Indiana, attended Broad Ripple High in Indianapolis. He and his wife Terri have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, both very talented volleyball players. Alexis is wrapping up her freshman year, carrying on the Woodson name at Indiana University. Mariah, a senior at Woodward Academy in Atlanta, is being recruited by some of the nation's top programs.
