AN OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION TO START

The Hawks downed the Pacers on 10/28 in the season opener, 120-109, scoring at least 120 in an opener for the first time since putting in 131 in a victory against New Jersey on 11/1/87 ... Atlanta currently sits at 7th in the league in scoring (103.8 ppg) and is 4th in free throw percentage (.804), after ranking 28th last season.

SMOOVE SWATS NUMBER 900

Josh Smith became the youngest player in NBA history to reach 900 career blocked shots on 10/30 vs. Washington, at 23 years, 329 days old ... Shaquille O'Neal (24 years, 286 days) held the previous mark ... Smith is now the youngest in league history to the 200, 300, 400, 500, 600, 700, 800 and 900 plateaus.

SPEAKING OF SWATTING

Al Horford and Smith are making the lane a tough place to operate so far this season ... Horford is up to t4th in the league in blocks (2.50 bpg), while Smith sits at 2.33 per game (t6th) ... As a team, Atlanta is 4th in the league (7.33 bpg).

CRAWESOME

As expected, Jamal Crawford has provided instant offense off the Hawks bench thus far, but he has really been explosive over the last three games ... In those contests, he's averaged 22.0 ppg (66) on .511 FGs (23-41) ... At 17.0 ppg, Crawford ranks 2nd in the NBA in scoring (to Dallas' Jason Terry - 17.8) among players who haven't started a game this season.

SHOWING IMPROVEMENT EVERY YEAR

The Hawks have become the first team since the Dallas Mavericks (from 1999-2003) to surpass its previous season's record for four straight years ... Dallas won 19, 40, 53, 57, 60 games between the 1999-2000 through 2002-2003 seasons, while Atlanta has won 13, 26, 30, 37 and 47 since the 2004-05 season ... The 47 are Atlanta's most since 50 in 1997-98.

THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY

November 4, 1999 – Hawks play their first-ever game at Philips Arena, a 119-109 loss to Milwaukee ... The Hawks grab their first win at the new arena two nights later, a 113-77 blowout win over the Chicago Bulls.

LAST GAME – GAME #6 (Nov. 6)

CHAR 103, ATL 83 (Time Warner Arena, Charlotte, NC)

The Hawks saw their two-game win streak snapped at Charlotte Friday, with the Bobcats turning in a 103-83 victory at the Time Warner Cable Arena ... Atlanta is now 4-2 on the season and Charlotte moves to 3-2 ... It was the Hawks worst loss of the season, and ends a four-game road trip which started last Saturday ... Three players tossed in 13 to lead Atlanta -- Josh Smith, Joe Johnson and Jamal Crawford -- with Al Horford and Maurice Evans each finishing with 10 ... After hitting 10-of-19 field goals (53%) to start this one, the Hawks struggled, hitting only 23-of-64 (36%) the rest of the way ... Atlanta was also pounded on the boards, by 21 (56-35), and in the assist column, 24-10 ... Charlotte also benefited from a terrific night from long distance, hitting 11-of-18 three-pointers (61%).

ATL 113, SAC 105 (ARCO Arena, Sacramento, CA)

Behind 52 combined points from Jamal Crawford and Joe Johnson, the Hawks made it two straight with a 113-105 win over the Sacramento Kings Wednesday at Arco Arena ... Each finished with 26, shooting a combine 21-of-37 from the field, and Atlanta made 54% overall in winning their fourth in five games ... The Hawks dominated in the paint, outscoring the Kings by 22 (66-44), and winning the fourth quarter in crunch time, 30-18 ... It was the first time Atlanta's won two consecutive road games since April 7 and 8 (@Toronto and @Milwaukee) last year ... They shoot for three straight at Charlotte Friday and if successful, will mark the first time the team's accomplished that since February 4, 6 and 11 (@Minnesota, @Charlotte and @Detroit) a year ago ... Joining Johnson and Crawford in double digits were Josh Smith who had 14, Marvin Williams and Mike Bibby, who each has 13, and Al Horford with 11.

HEAD COACH MIKE WOODSON

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 157-259 (sixth year)
2009-10 Record: 4-2

Entering his sixth year, Hawks head coach Mike Woodson has improved the team's record in each of the last four seasons, the only coach in the NBA to do so. Yet, after taking his team from a rocky 13-win campaign in his first year to 47 victories last season, Woodson wants more, and he is determined to keep his team amongst the NBA's elite.

With all of his starters back from a squad that reached the second round of the 2009 Playoffs and key off-season acquisitions to bolster the bench, Woodson has his most experienced team ever to challenge for the NBA Championship.

Last season, he guided the Hawks to their first winning season in a decade (47-35), as Atlanta reached the playoffs for the second straight year, reaching the second round of the postseason for the first time since 1996-97. Not since the Dallas Mavericks' teams from 1999-2003 had any NBA team improved its win total four consecutive years, but Atlanta's climb under Woodson duplicated that impressive mark.

Now the challenge for Woodson is to maintain and build on that level of success in a competitive Eastern Conference, where several teams made significant moves to remain strong, and continue to guide his young and maturing squad into a consistent threat each night.

Prior to becoming the Hawks head coach, Woodson reached the pinnacle of success during his days as an assistant with the Detroit Pistons. In 2004-05, the Pistons won the franchise's third NBA championship, defeating the heavily-favored Los Angeles Lakers, four games to one.

His days in Motown were the foundation for many of the coaching principles he attempts to instill within his players. Learning from Hall of Fame coach Larry Brown, Woodson has continued to stress "doing things the right way" – working hard, putting the team first and dedicating themselves to becoming the best players they can be, as they work together to build a winning organization, on-and-off the court.

The 10th head coach in Hawks' history, Woodson has a record of 157-259 (.377). For the fourth year in a row, he coached Atlanta to a better record than the previous season, improving by 10 wins in 2008-09. Atlanta built on that 13-victory inaugural season, to seasons of 26, 30, and 37, before recording 47 a year ago.

The 51-year-old Woodson has over two decades of NBA experience as a player and coach, and served three seasons as an assistant under Brown in both Philadelphia (2001-03) and Detroit. He also worked as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Cavaliers (1999-01) and the Milwaukee Bucks (1996-99).

One of the chief architects behind the Pistons' suffocating defensive effort during the 2003-04 season, Detroit held the opposition to 84.3 points per game that year, which equaled the league's best total defensively (along with San Antonio). In addition, the Pistons' point differential of +5.84 was the second-best in the NBA and they limited opponents to 41.4 field goal shooting, the league's third-best performance. During their 23 postseason games, Detroit intensified their efforts defensively, holding teams to 80.7 ppg and 39.2 FG shooting, and in the five-game Finals series against Los Angeles, the Pistons kept the Lakers more than 16 points under their regular season average and hounded them into shooting 41 percent from the floor.

The 11-year veteran and 6-5 guard played for seven teams in the NBA after he was selected in the first round of the 1980 Draft by the New York Knicks with the 12th overall pick. In 786 career games, Woodson averaged 14.0 points (10.981 career points), 2.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 25.5 minutes, enjoying his best season in 1982-83 when he played for the then-Kansas City Kings and posted 18.2 points per game.

In addition to the Knicks and Kings (both in Kansas City and Sacramento), Woodson also played with New Jersey, the Los Angeles Clippers, Houston and Cleveland, before retiring from the game in 1991. His teams advanced to the playoffs five times, where he averaged 12.2 ppg, 2.6 apg and 2.3 rpg.

Drafted out of Indiana University, Woodson, in his junior season, helped lead the Hoosiers to the 1979 National Invitational Tournament (NIT) championship with a 53-52 victory over conference rival Purdue and was named to the All-Tourney team.

During the summer of that year, he played for Bob Knight and captained the United States team that participated in the Pan American (Am) Games, joining teammates Isiah Thomas and Ray Tolbert in winning the gold medal.

A two-time All-American (1979 and 1980) and four-year letterman Woodson suffered a herniated disk in his back after five games (and a No. 1 ranking) into his senior campaign and had to undergo surgery. Upon losing Woodson, Indiana went 7-5 in the Big Ten, but once he returned, IU finished the conference season at 6-0 and captured the Big Ten title. Despite the limited action, Woodson took home the league's 1980 MVP award.

The fifth-leading scorer in IU history with 2,061 points, Woodson averaged 19.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 104 games with the Hoosiers. He graduated with a degree in physical education.

Woodson, born March 24, 1958 in Indianapolis, IN, attended Broad Ripple High in Indianapolis. The high school, whose alumni include CBS' David Letterman and former Vice President Dan Quayle's wife Marilyn, retired his number in 2006. He and his wife Terri have two daughters, Alexis and Mariah, both very talented volleyball players. Alexis is a member of the Georgia Tech volleyball program, while Mariah is starting her freshman season at the University of Florida.
