The Hawks took last year's series, 3-1, winning each of the final three contests, including an 80-74 road triumph on 12/6/10 ... Atlanta also eliminated Orlando from the 2011 NBA Playoffs with a 4-1 series win in round one ... The Magic lead the all-time series 45-40 (30-13 at home).

**COMMON THREADS:** **Zaza Pachulia** was with the Magic for the 2003-04 season, and was originally drafted by Orlando in the second round (42<sup>nd</sup> overall) of the 2003 NBA Draft ... **Dwight Howard** played his high school ball at SW Atlanta Christian Academy, and was an AAU teammate of **Josh Smith** ... **Joe Johnson** and **Quentin Richardson** were teammates with the Phoenix Suns ... **Kirk Hinrich** and **Chris Duhon** spent time together with the Bulls ... Magic shooting consultant **Mark Price** (a Georgia Tech alum) served in the same capacity for two years with the Hawks (2008-10).

### THIS WEEK IN HAWKS HISTORY:

**February 11, 1970** – The Hawks tie the franchise record for points in a game in a 155-131 road win over San Diego ... The record was originally set by the St. Louis Hawks on Jan. 24, 1960 against the Knicks.

### THE HIGHLIGHT FACTORY:

Since the start of the 2008-09 season, Atlanta has recorded a 97-38 (.719) mark at Philips Arena.

**JOHNSON AN ALL-STAR AGAIN:** On 2/9, Joe Johnson was named as a reserve to the Eastern Conference All-Star team for the sixth consecutive season ... It's the most in a row by a Hawk since Dominique Wilkins went to nine straight from 1986-94 ... The game takes place on Sunday, February 26 at Amway Center in Orlando, with coverage on TNT and ESPN Radio beginning at 7 p.m.

**JJ CLOSING IN ON 10K:** Joe Johnson needs 39 points to become the 7<sup>th</sup> Hawk to reach 10,000 points ... Having recently reached the 2,500 assist mark, JJ would become the 10<sup>th</sup> active player to compile 10,000 points and 2,500 assists with the same team, joining Kobe Bryant, Tim Duncan, Kevin Garnett, LeBron James, Steve Nash, Dirk Nowitzki, Tony Parker, Paul Pierce and Dwyane Wade ... He would be the 60<sup>th</sup> player in NBA history to reach those marks with one team.

**ROAD SWEET ROAD:** The Hawks went 4-1 on their five-game road trip from 1/23 – 1/31 ... The 4-1 record marked the best Atlanta five-game road trip since going 5-0 on a five-game trip in December of 1968, the team's first season in Atlanta.

**LUCKY 13:** Atlanta went 13-5 in the month of January, recording their most wins in a month since a 14-2 mark in January of 1997, a span of 15 years.

**ROLLING IN THE DEEP:** The Hawks rank 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league (.392) in 3FG%, and have three players in the top 40 ... Jeff Teague ranks 14<sup>th</sup> (.447), Marvin Williams places 15<sup>th</sup> (.446) and Willie Green is 34<sup>th</sup> (.412) ... Additionally, Joe Johnson ranks 10<sup>th</sup> in 3FGM (51), while shooting .381 from distance.

**TEAGUE MAKING THE JUMP:** Point guard Jeff Teague has picked up right where he left off in the Playoffs last year, and is making a case as one of the league's most improved players this season. He is averaging 12.3 ppg (up from 5.2 last year), 5.0 apg (2.0 last season) and 2.2 rpg (1.5), while ranking 11<sup>th</sup> in the NBA in spg (1.73).

**SMOOVE MAKES HISTORY AGAIN:** Josh Smith finished with 25 pts, 5 rebs, 5 assts, 6 blks and 4 stls in 34 mins v/Chi (1/7), becoming the first player in over 18 years to hit those levels in a game (since Hakeem Olajuwon on 12/30/93), according to Elias Sports Bureau ... He's also the fourth player to ever record those numbers in a game, joining Hall-of-Famers Olajuwon (5x), Kareem Abdur-Jabbar (4x) and David Robinson (once).

**EXTRA SPECIAL OT:** In Atlanta's 107-101 overtime win at Detroit on 1/27, the Hawks tied a franchise record by scoring 20 points in the extra session (previously on 4/2/08 vs. Toronto) ... The Hawks hit 6-7 FGs, 2-3 3FGs and 6-10 FTs during the frame.

**MORE FREE BASKETBALL:** On 1/6 @Char, the Hawks became the third team in NBA history to follow up a triple OT game (1/5 vs. Miami) with an OT game the next night, joining Dallas (Dec. 1989) and Minneapolis (Dec. 1951) ... Coincidentally, Hawks Executive VP/GM Rick Sund was the VP of Basketball Operations for Dallas in 1989.

**STARTING ON A ROLL:** According to Elias Sports Bureau, the Hawks were the third team in the last 20 years to outscore their first two opponents by a combined 50-points-or-more ('02-'03 Kings and '08-'09 Lakers).

**50,000 POINTS:** The triumvirate of Tracy McGrady (18,260), Jerry Stackhouse (16,146) and Joe Johnson (14,112) are nearing 50,000 career points collectively ... The veteran trio has combined for 48,518 career points in the NBA ... McGrady ranks 9<sup>th</sup> among active NBA players in scoring, while Stackhouse is 14<sup>th</sup> and Johnson 27<sup>th</sup>.

**TRIPLE THREATS:** Joe Johnson, Tracy McGrady, Jerry Stackhouse, Vladimir Radmanovic and Kirk Hinrich are among the top active career three-point shooters in the NBA ... Johnson has made 1207 (16<sup>th</sup> among active players), while McGrady has sunk 1073 from long range, which puts him 21<sup>st</sup> ... Stackhouse is 28<sup>th</sup> with 947 triples, Radmanovic is 29<sup>th</sup> with 943 3FGs and Hinrich is 32<sup>nd</sup> with 894.

**SCHEDULE NOTES:** In the 2011-12 season, the Hawks have:

- 20 back-to-backs and 12 road/road back-to-backs; 10 3-games-in-4 nights
- 29 games with 1 day of rest, most in NBA, and 2 games with 2 days of rest (least in NBA)
- Also, Atlanta was the only NBA team with 9 games in the first 12 days of the season ... Seven teams had 8 games in the first 12 days.

**RECORD SETTING OPENER:** Atlanta won 106-70 at New Jersey on 12/27 in the season opener (the largest margin of victory ever in an opener), winning their fifth consecutive opening night, the longest streak in Atlanta history ... The game marked the third time in NBA history that a team won on the road by more than 35 points in its season-opener (Cavs over Hornets 133-93 in 1988; Bulls over Heat 108-66 in 2006) ... The Hawks also tied a franchise record by holding the Nets to 22 FGM for the game.

**HEAD COACH LARRY DREW**

Overall NBA Coaching Record: 61-47 (2<sup>nd</sup> year)

2011-12 Record: 17-9

Larry Drew was named head coach of the Atlanta Hawks on June 12, 2010, becoming the 11th full-time head coach in the franchise's history.

Through his first season, Drew guided the team to a 44-38 record and led the Hawks to the playoffs for the fourth consecutive campaign, coaching his players to a series victory over division-rival Orlando in the first round of the 2011 NBA Playoffs, and falling short of reaching the Eastern Conference finals in a six-game series against the Chicago Bulls.

The Hawks came out of the gates strong to start the 2010-11 season, winning its first six games – Atlanta's longest winning stretch overall of the year – and enjoyed their best months during December and January when the team won 19 of 30 contests. Despite cooling off a bit prior to the playoffs, the Hawks showed enough determination in that series against Orlando, and shook off any thoughts of another playoff disappointment to eliminate the Magic in six games before their eventual loss to the Bulls.

Drew finished with an even .500 record in the postseason as his six playoff victories were the most-ever by a rookie Atlanta coach in his first playoff appearance.

Drew has experience, having played with championship-caliber players like Magic Johnson, James Worthy and Byron Scott. He has also coached under individuals like Scott, Alvin Gentry and Doug Collins, and following 27 seasons as a player and coach, the work invested in those positions set the stage for Drew to obtain the job he has desired for some time, and after 18 years on the bench as an assistant, he was ready for the challenge when Hawks GM Rick Sund named him to the position.

He knows the personalities of his core players after seven years of work in Atlanta, as well as their strengths and weaknesses on the court, and that knowledge serves him well as he attempts to keep the Hawks amongst the best in Eastern Conference and lead them back to the playoffs for the fifth straight season.

Before arriving in Atlanta as the top assistant to then-head coach Mike Woodson in August 2004, Drew was an assistant with the New Jersey Nets and Scott after spending the previous three seasons with the Washington Wizards in a similar capacity (2000-03) under Collins. Prior to that, he re-joined one of the teams he previously played for, the Detroit Pistons, as an assistant coach in 1999-2000. Drew returned to Detroit as an assistant under Alvin Gentry, for the first time since playing with the team as a NBA rookie with the Pistons in 1980-81. His coaching career began in 1992-93 when he broke into the ranks with another of his former teams, the Los Angeles Lakers, whom he played for from 1989-91.

An 11-year professional, Drew averaged 11.4 points and 5.2 assists in 714 career games for four NBA teams. After one season in Detroit, he played the next five years with the Kings, in Kansas City and Sacramento (1981-86), and his final four in Los Angeles (1986-91), for the Clippers and the Lakers. In addition, Drew spent one season internationally as a member of Scavolini of the Italian League in 1988-89.

He was a first round pick in the 1980 NBA Draft – 17th overall selection by the Pistons – and he reached postseason play four times in his pro career (31 games). Drew recorded his best season during the 1982-83 campaign, when he averaged 20.1 points, 8.1 assists and 1.7 steals for Kansas City.

Born April 2, 1958 in Kansas City, Kansas, Drew played four seasons at the University of Missouri, where he averaged 12.0 points and 2.8 rebounds and prepped at Wyandotte High in Kansas City. During the summer, Drew runs the Larry Drew Advanced Guard Academy in Los Angeles, and holds camps around the country.

Drew and his wife Sharon have three children, Larry, Landon and Lindsey. While Larry II is sitting out this year as he transfers to UCLA, he will have one year of college eligibility remaining in 2012-13, his brothers Landon and Lindsey both play high school basketball in the Los Angeles area for Fairfax High School.
