**MIAMI HEAT 90, WASHINGTON WIZARDS 76 (11/10/09):** The HEAT beat the Wizards for the second time this season, 90-76, behind Dwyane Wade's season-high 41 points. The game started well for the Wizards as they shot 69 percent from the field in the first period and led 27-21 after one. The HEAT managed to tie the score at 36 all in the second, but the Wizards broke off an 11-0 run immediately after and the HEAT went into halftime down 49-41. The HEAT stepped up its defensive intensity in the second half, and they held the Wizards to just 13 third-quarter points as they regained the lead 65-62 after three. The onslaught continued into the fourth period as the Wizards were held to only 14 in the final stanza while Wade had 14 fourth-quarter points himself. Wade led the HEAT with his 41 points, Michael Beasley added 15 points and Mario Chalmers chipped in 13 points. Gilbert Arenas led the Wizards with 21 points.

**MIAMI HEAT 96, DENVER NUGGETS 88 (11/6/09):** The HEAT handed the Nuggets their first loss of the season after defeating them 96-88. The contest started tight as neither team led by more than five points, and the first period ended with the HEAT up 23-21 behind Quentin Richardson's seven first-quarter points. However, with the game tied at 33 with 5:57 remaining in the first half, the HEAT put together a 17-5 run to close the half up 50-38. The HEAT carried its strong play into the second half with a 24-8 run to start the third, and they led 78-56 after three. The Nuggets narrowed the gap considerably in the fourth period, but the HEAT's lead proved too much to overcome. Dwyane Wade scored a team-high 22 points, Jermaine O'Neal added 18 points, and Mario Chalmers scored 16 points. Carmelo Anthony notched 30 points to lead all Nuggets scorers.

**QUICK HITS:**

- The HEAT has held five of its first seven opponents to under 90 points per game.
- Mario Chalmers has recorded at least one steal in all seven games so far this season.
- Quentin Richardson's 28 rebounds from 11/3-11/6 is his highest three-game total since grabbing 29 rebounds over a three-game span from 11/29-12/2/07. In that stretch he grabbed nine @ BOS on 11/29, 11 vs. MIL on 11/30 and nine vs. PHO on 12/2.
- Dwyane Wade has tied Shaquille O'Neal (384) for third place on the HEAT's all-time blocks list. In second place is Rony Seikaly with 610.
- Wade's 40 point performance on 11/10 vs. WAS marked the 26<sup>th</sup> time in his career he has scored 40+ points.
- Dwyane Wade has scored in double-figures in a franchise record 101 consecutive games.
- When Wade went 12-for-13 from the foul line vs. WAS on 11/10, it marked the sixth consecutive game and 108<sup>th</sup> time in his career that he has hit double-figure free throw attempts in a game. The HEAT's record is seven games of double-figure free throw attempts, which he and Alonzo Mourning set previously.
- Udonis Haslem's double-double (11 points and 10 rebounds) on 11/6 vs. DEN marked the 10<sup>th</sup> time in his career that he has recorded a double-double off the bench. The 10 double-doubles off the bench ranks him in second place on the HEAT's all-time list. Miami's all-time leader in double-doubles off the bench is Rony Seikaly with 14.
- Wade led the HEAT in scoring on 11/10 vs. WAS with 41 points, marking the 280<sup>th</sup> time in his career he has done so in 401 career games.

**6-1:** This season marks the second time in franchise history that Miami has gotten off to a 6-1 start. The previous time the HEAT began the season by winning six of their first seven games was during the 1999-00 season. If Miami wins tonight, it would mark the first time in franchise history that the club began the season 7-1.

**BOARDING SCHOOL:** Quentin Richardson grabbed at least nine rebounds in three games from 11/3-11/6, marking the sixth time in his career he has done that in at least three straight games. The last time he had at least nine rebounds in at least three straight games was a three-game streak from 11/29-12/2/07. He also accomplished the feat in three straight games from 1/17-1/20/07; 3/12-3/16/04 and 12/28-12/31/03. His career-high for consecutive games with at least nine rebounds is four and occurred from 1/25-1/30/05.

**FASTEST TO 50:** Erik Spoelstra has currently won 49 total games as HEAT Head Coach. In total, he has coached 89 games. Former Head Coach Stan Van Gundy was the fastest to reach the 50-win plateau, doing so in 93 games.

**ALL-STAR BALLOTING:** HEAT players Michael Beasley, Udonis Haslem, Jermaine O'Neal and Dwyane Wade are represented on the 2010 NBA All-Star ballot. Beginning on November 10, HEAT fans can vote online by visiting nba.com or by filling out ballots available on the concourse at AmericanAirlines Arena. The 2010 NBA All-Star Game, which will air live on TNT and ESPN Radio in the U.S., and in more than 200 countries and territories worldwide, will be held at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, TX on 2/14/10.

**BROKEN:** The HEAT has already broken several streaks this season. Before their win on 11/6 vs. DEN, the HEAT had lost their previous eight contests to the Nuggets, with their last win coming in a 107-100 victory on 12/17/04 in Miami. Additionally, prior to their win @ IND on 10/30, Miami had lost 14 consecutive games in Indiana, with their last win coming in an 89-87 victory on 12/31/01. Including the playoffs, the HEAT had lost 17 straight games in Indiana.

**20+:** Dating back to last season, Dwyane Wade has currently scored 20+ points in 20 consecutive games, two shy of his and the HEAT's record.

**PLAYING TOGETHER:** The 2009-10 season marks the seventh season in which Dwyane Wade and Udonis Haslem have played together with the HEAT. They are the first pair of HEAT teammates to play any part of a seventh season together. The previous 21 seasons saw four pairs of HEAT teammates play six seasons together. They were Rony Seikaly and Grant Long (1988-89 thru 1993-94), Glen Rice and Grant Long (1989-90 thru 1994-95), Bimbo Coles and Keith Askins (1990-91 thru 1995-96) and Alonzo Mourning and Tim Hardaway (1995-96 thru 2000-01).

## 2009-10 COMMUNITY NOTES

**PLAYER TICKET PROGRAM:** One of the most generous and trend-setting programs in the NBA, the Miami HEAT's Community Player Ticket Outreach Program will spend the entire 2009-10 regular season reaching out to children and youth less fortunate who typically would only dream of watching a HEAT game live. HEAT players Joel Anthony, Michael Beasley, Mario Chalmers, Daequan Cook, Yakhouba Diawara, Udonis Haslem, James Jones, Jamaal Magloire, Quentin Richardson, Dwyane Wade, and Dorell Wright along with Head Coach Erik Spoelstra and Alonzo Mourning, Vice President of Player Programs, joined forces to donate nearly 200 tickets for every single home game to local charitable organizations that would otherwise not have the means to attend HEAT games. Each player, based upon availability, graciously provides several private "Meet & Greet" opportunities for the groups prior to each HEAT home game, where the players give inspiring talks to the children, sign autographs and take pictures with the group. The participating organizations also attend a private viewing of the team warm-ups. Over the course of the season, nearly 10,000 children, many for the first time, will have the opportunity to enjoy a HEAT game, courtesy of their favorite HEAT players and role models.

**ERIK SPOELSTRA** (Portland), Head Coach

**Coaching Record:** 49-40, Currently in 2<sup>nd</sup> Season

Erik Spoelstra begins his second season as Head Coach of the Miami HEAT and his 15<sup>th</sup> within the HEAT organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008 when HEAT President Pat Riley stepped down as Head Coach.

Prior to taking over the reigns as the sixth head coach in Miami history, Spoelstra was known around the league for his game preparation and superb attention to detail as the HEAT's Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting. In his last seven seasons in that position he had the primary role of developing game plans for the HEAT's upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

Spoelstra has earned the respect of players throughout the league with a strong reputation as a teacher over the years by heading the HEAT's Individual Player Development Program. As an assistant coach before, where he also served for three seasons (2005-07) as the head coach of the HEAT's summer league team, and as the HEAT's head man now, he has worked tirelessly with many of the HEAT's young players in areas of fundamentals, skill development and shooting. This consistent emphasis of fundamentals contributed to the HEAT setting a franchise-record in 2008-09 for fewest turnovers in a season, shattering the old record by committing 96 fewer turnovers, despite also recording their highest team scoring average since the 2005-06 NBA championship season.

Additionally, Spoelstra helped design and integrate a proprietary statistical database and scouting software for the HEAT. Under Spoelstra, the HEAT continues to embrace the use of technology and continues to use the state-of-the-art statistical software to evaluate team productivity, individual player productivity and trends for both the HEAT and the team's opponents. That use of technology as a teaching tool also included putting the team's video playbook on iPods for his players.

Before becoming Head Coach, Spoelstra spent 13 years in a variety of roles within the organization, including serving as the team's Video Coordinator, Assistant Coach/Video Coordinator, Assistant Coach/Advance Scout, and Assistant Coach/Director of Scouting.

As head coaching debuts go, Spoelstra orchestrated an impressive one. Guiding one of the NBA's youngest rosters, with four of its top seven players garnering only two years or less of NBA experience, Spoelstra turned in one of the best coaching performances in the NBA during his 2008-09 rookie season. Under his guidance the HEAT recorded its greatest single-season improvement in franchise history. He took a 15-win team from the previous season and directed them to a 28-win improvement, marking the greatest single-season improvement ever by a rookie head coach in NBA history, bettering the previous record of a 20-win improvement by former Chicago Bulls Head Coach Ed Badger during the 1976-77 season. It also marked the seventh-best single-season improvement in NBA history by any coach. As a result of a 43-win regular season which surpassed the franchise record for most wins by a head coach in his first season guiding the HEAT, Spoelstra led Miami to the 2009 NBA Playoffs. The 2009 postseason appearance made Miami just the second team in NBA history to win 15-or-fewer games one year and make the postseason the next; only the San Diego Rockets had previously achieved that feat during the 1968-69 season.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending the University of Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for all four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating from Portland he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

A team member of the NBA FIT initiative, Spoelstra takes pride in encouraging families to engage in physical activity and healthy living practices with their children. Additionally, he created "Spo's Shooters", in conjunction with the Miami HEAT Community Education Ticket Program. This program reaches out to South Florida's less fortunate student-athletes and gives them the opportunity to enjoy HEAT games and meet their favorite HEAT players and role models.

During the 2009 off-season, Spoelstra participated with the NBA and the U.S. State Department Good Will Sports Envoy Trip to his native Philippines, while hosting basketball clinics and promoting the importance of education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth.

Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years.

Raised in Portland, Spoelstra is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues. He will once again enter the upcoming season as the NBA's youngest head coach. Most recently, Spoelstra was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009.

**QUENTIN RICHARDSON:** Full name is Quentin Lamar Richardson...answers to the nicknames "Q" and "Q-Rich"...is the youngest of Lee and Emma Richardson's five children...lists his father Lee, a retired motorman who drove a train for 37 years for the Chicago Transit Authority, as the person who made a difference in his life...his mother, Emma, a former high school basketball player, introduced him to the sport of basketball...stepmother is Marilyn Richardson...has a brother (Cedric Richardson) and a sister (Rochelle Richardson)...two of his brothers (Bernard and Lee, Jr.) are deceased...during an eight-month period when he was a 12-year old in seventh grade he lost a brother, his grandmother and his mother...his grandmother, Ada, died of natural causes...his oldest brother Bernard was shot and killed by robbers...his mother, Emma, died of breast cancer in 1992...he has two tattoos to honor their memory...on his left arm his mother's initials appear beneath a halo on a banner wrapped around a coffin with an inscription that says, "The period of pain gives me the strength to succeed"...a cross on his back shows another banner, this one carrying the initials of his mother, grandmother and brother, Bernard...his older brother, Lee Richardson, Jr., was a music producer who was killed by a robber in December 2005...he has a tattoo on his right arm honoring him...is a cousin of former New York Giants linebacker Carlos Emmons...along with teammate Dwyane Wade he is the godfather to Dorell Wright's son Devin Quentin Dwyane Wright...was enrolled in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences at DePaul and chose to major in broadcast journalism because he wanted to be educated to speak better...when he is done playing he would like to become an NBA broadcaster and served as a guest commentator on MSG Network's coverage of the 2008 NBA Las Vegas Summer League...in his free time he enjoys bowling, watching movies and playing video games...lists his family as his most prized possession...his favorite sport other than basketball is football and lists his hometown Chicago Bears as his favorite team...says something most people don't know about him is that he is an actor...co-starred with former Clippers' teammate Darius Miles in a documentary feature film called *The Youngest Guns* which chronicled their first three years in the league, the first two as teammates...also has played himself in the movie *Van Wilder* in 2002 and in an episode of the HBO show *Arli\$\$*...has always been one of the most community-minded players on the teams he has played on...runs his own charity, BFAM...has run a weekly basketball camp for kids at DePaul each of the past three years...oversaw Q's Catalysts ticket program while he played in New York which provided tickets to Knicks home games for area youth groups throughout the season...lists his favorite television shows as *Entourage* and *Heroes* and *Coming to America* as his favorite movie...enjoys listening to R&B and hip-hop...chose Houston's as his favorite restaurant and salmon as his favorite food...says he cooks barbecue well...selected the Bahamas as his dream vacation spot and Tokyo, Japan as the best place he has visited so far...helped lead Whitney High School to a 30-1 record and Chicago Public League championship and Illinois Class AA state championship in 1997-98...was named the 1998 Illinois Player of the Year by *USA Today*...was a member of the 1998 USA Basketball Men's Junior Team that won the World Championship in 1998...has no set pre-game routine or rituals...wears size 15 basketball shoes.
