- The Hornets have played more regular season games (81) against the Bucks than any other NBA opponent in franchise history. The Hornets have played 80 games against three other franchises (Bulls, Hawks, Pistons).
- In both match-ups last season, Marco Belinelli averaged 16 points and 5.5 rebounds per contest.
- The Bucks handed the Hornets their worst loss in franchise history, beating them by 50 points (87-137) at the Bradley Center on 1/10/00.
- The Hornets came down with a franchise-high 71 rebounds (as well as a franchise-high 31 offensive rebounds) in their double-overtime victory over the Bucks on 2/8/07.
- Chris Paul handed out 20 assists (tied for second-most in franchise history) against the Bucks on 2/27/09.
- The Bucks eliminated the Hornets from the 2001 NBA Playoffs in Game Seven of the Eastern Conference Semifinals. It was the first playoff meeting between the two teams and the farthest the Hornets had ever advanced in the postseason at the time.
- Monty Williams is 2-0 (1.000) all-time against the Bucks. Scott Skiles is 9-20 (.321) all-time against the Hornets.

HORNETS-BUCKS CONNECTIONS

- Hornets Assistant Coach Bryan Gates was in the same position in Sacramento last season when Bucks F Jon Brockman was with the Kings.
- Hornets G Marco Belinelli was teammates with Bucks G Stephen Jackson during the '08-'09 season with the Golden State Warriors...Also, Jackson played for Hornets assistant coach Dave Hanners during the second half of the '09-'10 season when Hanners held the same position with the Bobcats...
- Hornets F Al-Farouq Aminu competed against Bucks G Brandon Jennings in the 2008 McDonald's All-American game.
- Hornets F/C Chris Kaman played alongside Bucks G Shaun Livingston from '04-'07 when both played for the Clippers.
- Bucks G Beno Udrih played with the San Antonio Spurs during the '04-'05 season when Hornets head coach Monty Williams was an assistant coach with the Spurs. He was also with the Spurs in '06-'07 when Hornets GM Dell Demps was director of player personnel for the Spurs...Also, Udrih played under Hornets assistant Bryan Gates in Sacramento during '09-'10 season, and alongside Hornets F Carl Landry during '10-'11 season with the Kings.

- The Hornets lead by as many as 20 points in the game...in the four games they have led by that margin this season, New Orleans has come away victorious in all.
- New Orleans forced 20 Utah turnovers and scored 23 points off of those Jazz miscues...conversely, the Hornets had just 13 turnovers, allowing nine points off.
- The Hornets forced nine turnovers in the third quarter, a season high for opponent turnovers in any quarter this season.

- The Hornets outrebounded Portland 37-33 and outdueled the Trail Blazers in the paint, holding a +24 (54 to 30) edge...New Orleans grabbed 14 offensive rebounds in the game and scored 20 second chance points compared to just eight from Portland.
- The Bees' bench was solid (just four healthy players), scoring 30 points on 11-18 shooting...Lance Thomas (4) and Al-Farouq Aminu (5) also chipped in on the glass.

- The Hornets avoided setting their franchise low for points in a regulation game (65, twice) with a Marco Belinelli triple with :0.5 seconds remaining...the three pointer was the first of the game for New Orleans, who were 0-2 prior to that point, the fewest attempts of the season.
- Chicago owned the painted area, holding a +10 advantage on the boards (49-39) and outscoring New Orleans by 18 (58 to 40) in the paint.

2011-12 SEASON NOTES

BEE-FENSE So far in 2011-12, the Hornets are again showcasing the stellar defense displayed a year ago, the first under head coach Monty Williams.

- The Hornets have **held 21 of their first 28 opponents under 100 points this season and rank 11th in the NBA in opponent points allowed per game (92.9)**...the Bees also rank **23rd in opponent field goal percentage at (45.2%) and 6th in opponent three-point field goal percentage (31.9%)**.
- The Hornets are **5-4 this season when holding an opponent under 90 points, 3-0 when holding to 80 points or fewer and 1-0 when holding under 70 points**...the Hornets held opponents under 90 points **28 times last year, yielding a record of 25-3**...the Bees held **nine opponents under 80 points in 2010-11 and were 9-0 in those games**.
- New Orleans has only allowed an opponent to score 30+ points in a quarter 16 times so far this season, most recently in the 4th quarter 2/6 vs. SAC (31).

Some of the standout single-game defensive performances from this season:

- New Orleans held Utah to 80 points 2/13 at the Hive, including limiting the Jazz to 4-14 (28.6%) shooting from beyond the arc...New Orleans also forced 20 turnovers (+7) including a season-high - for any quarter - nine in the third, and scored 23 points as a result (+14).
- Against the Magic 1/27, the Hornets held the Magic to 67 points and under 40% shooting (39.3%)...Orlando was held under 20 points in each of the four quarters...New Orleans forced a season high 23 turnovers and had 14 steals...**no Magic player other than Dwight Howard attempted a free throw until 2:28 remaining in the 4th quarter**.
- After allowing 65 points through the first three quarters, the Hornets held the Rockets to an **all-time franchise low seven points in the fourth quarter** (previous low for the quarter was eight vs. SAS 3/12/08)...it tied the fewest opponent points for **ANY quarter in franchise history** (12/23/95 2nd vs. MIA and 12/29/02 3rd at HOU)...it also tied the fewest points in a quarter by any team in the NBA in 2012-11 at the time.
- The Hornets held Minnesota to 34.2% shooting (24-70) 1/13 at home...the 24 field goals was an opponent low on the season...the Timberwolves also shot just 6-25 (24.0%) from distance.
- At Denver 1/9, the Hornets held the Nuggets to 81 points (season-low at the time), holding Denver under 20 points in each of the last three quarters...the loss was Denver's first at home this season.
- Facing one of the most prolific scorers in league history, the Hornets held Mavericks F Dirk Nowitzki to 2-11 shooting from the field in 30 minutes 1/7 at DAL.
- Against Boston 12/28, the Hornets held the Celtics to 37.2% shooting (29-78) from the field, and just 78 points for the game... Hornets players blocked 12 Celtic shots, **more than in any game from a season ago** (most in 2010-11 was 11 at CHI 3/7/11), and only three off the franchise record of 15 set 12/12/92 vs. DEN.
- In Phoenix 12/26, the Suns were held under 40% shooting (32-81, 39.5%) as well as 5-25 (20%) from distance and 84 total points.

CLEANING THE GLASS New Orleans **rank 4th in total rebounding percentage, 8th in defensive rebounding percentage and 12th in offensive rebounding percentage in the NBA**...New Orleans also ranks 24th in the NBA in rebounds per game (41.1), 14th in offensive rebounds per game (11.5) and is 27th in defensive rebounds per game (29.6).

- The Hornets have only lost the rebounding battle just 10 times this season (36-37 1/6 vs. DEN, 34-37 1/18 vs. MEM, 48-53 1/19 at HOU, 41-48 vs. DAL 1/21, 42-36 1/29 vs. ATL, 25-39 1/30 at MIA, 33-35 2/1 vs. PHX, 38-40 2/2 at SAS, 38-42 2/4 at DET and 2/13 vs. UTA 3/7-45).
- **Nine different Hornets have led the team in rebounding this season.**
- Marco Belinelli has chipped in this season as well, setting his career high for boards 12/30 vs. PHX with 11 while also tying his career high for offensive rebounds with three in the game...Marco also led the team in rebounding 1/30 at MIA (5).
- Al-Farouq Aminu has also had career individual game rebounding numbers this season, gathering 12 1/7 at DAL (all defensive) and then leading the team with eight rebounds 1/9 at DEN.

GOOD GREIVIS Second-year man Greivis Vasquez played his best stretch as a pro in the last eight games beginning 1/29 vs. ATL, including starting the three games between 2/2 at SAS and 2/6 vs. SAC and since 2/10 vs. POR

- In the five games he has started this season, has averaged 13.6 points, 8.0 assists, 2.4 steals and 3.6 rebounds.
- In all, Vasquez has led the team in assists 12 times this season (three ties), in scoring three times and in rebounding once (tie).
- 2/10 vs. POR, Vasquez **set a career high with five steals** and followed it up with three steals 2/13 vs. UTA
- Vasquez **tied his career high with 20 points** (6-9 FG) 2/6 vs. SAC and led the team with nine assists
- Greivis has scored 12.8 points per game over the last eight and has **led the squad with 58 assists** while shooting 37-77 (.481) from the field in 247 minutes....he also has 10 steals and has hit on six of 18 triples in that time.
- In the second start of his career (first as a Hornet) 2/2 at SAS, Vasquez **tied his career high with seven made field goals** on just 14 attempts (50.0%) and tied for the team lead with five assists and two steals...he played a career-high 34 minutes in the game as well.
- In 28 minutes 2/1 vs. PHX Vasquez has his best game as a pro, scoring a **career high 20 points, dishing a career high 12 assists and grabbing a career-high tying six rebounds**...he also tied a career high with seven made field goals
- His outing against the Suns marked the **first time in franchise history that a reserve scored at least 20 points and had at least 10 assists in a game**...it was Greivis' first double-double of his career...his 12 assists 2/1 were a **New Orleans individual high for the season**.
- Vasquez played 26 minutes 1/29 vs. ATL and tallied a career-high tying (at the time) and game-high eight assists...Vasquez also scored 10 points on 3-5 shooting (4-4 from the line) with a block...he was one of four Hornets not to have a 'minus' impact while on the floor (even).

ARIZA IN ACTION In the 14 games since returning from a strained groin, Trevor Ariza has made his presence felt

- 2/10 vs. POR, Ariza led the team in scoring (23 points) and rebounding (nine rebounds) and also chipped in five assists and two steals (both good for second-best on the squad)...those numbers made him **just the second Hornet in the last two seasons** to have at least 23/9/5/2 (David West 2/9/11 at NJ).
- Ariza has been solid across the board, averaging 12.1 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.6 assists, 1.6 steals and 0.6 blocks...his numbers put him second on the team in scoring, third in rebounding, third in assists and fourth in blocks.
- 2/4 at DET, Ariza's season-high 26 points, seven rebounds, four assists and three steals made him just the **9th player in Hornets history to record those tallies in a single game and just the 4th forward** (joining Larry Johnson, Jamal Mashburn and David West).

HEAVY MINUTES With only nine healthy bodies for the game 2/10 vs. POR (including two players on 10-day contracts), those who were available were called on to log extended minutes in a hard-fought game against the Trail Blazers where neither team held a double-digit edge at any point

- Emeka Okafor played a season-high 39 minutes, as did rookie Donald Sloan (11)...Trevor Ariza (46 minutes) tied his season mark, while both Greivis Vasquez (37) and Marco Belinelli (33) played upwards of 30 as well.
- Eric Gordon, Chris Kaman, Jarrett Jack, Carl Landry and Jason Smith all missed the game due to injury...those five players had **started a combined 48 games for the Hornets this season**, and left New Orleans without its starting point guard, shooting guard and power forward.

SCRAPPY SECOND UNIT Forced into extended action as the only four healthy bodies on the bench 2/10 vs. POR, Xavier Henry, Lance Thomas, Al-Farouq Aminu and Donald Sloan answered the call with solid individual and group performances

- The group scored **30 points on 11-18 shooting (61.1%)**.
- Lance Thomas was especially effective, **scoring a career-best seven points on 2-2 shooting** and grabbing four rebounds (two offensive) in just 8:09 of play.
- Al-Farouq Aminu led the bench with 12 points, hitting on his only triple late in the game to draw the Bees to within two points, and also **grabbed a game-best four offensive rebounds** (five total).
- Donald Sloan saw the first extended action of his NBA career, and responded **with a career-high seven points** (3-5 shooting) and two assists.

STARTING LINEUPS Thus far this season, the Hornets have used 11 different starting lineups and have not yet been able to roll out the preferred preseason starting five (Jack-Gordon-Ariza-Landry-Okafor) for a single game this season

- New Orleans has started three different players at point guard, shooting guard and small forward this season while starting four different individuals at power forward...Emeka Okafor is the **only Hornet to start every game this season**.
- **12 different Hornets have started** at least one game for the team this season.

CLOSE CALLS Although the record doesn't reflect it, the Hornets have played competitively all season

- New Orleans has played **20 opponents with a winning percentage above .500, the second-most on the league...** conversely, the Bees have played **just seven games against opponents under .500.**
- Earlier this season, the Bees had three consecutive losses by just two points (the first game of the stretch 1/19 at HOU came in overtime)... **it was the first time in franchise history the Hornets had been involved in three straight games decided by two points or less.**
- New Orleans also lost to Detroit on 2/4 by two, the fifth game decided by less than three points this season (1-4).
- The Hornets are 1-16 in games decided by 10 points or less, with the only win coming on the first game of season.

SUPREME SUPLENTE (SUBSTITUTE) Gustavo Ayón has been a bright spot off the bench and filling in for the injured Jason Smith and Carl Landry the past eight games

- Over the past eight games, has averaged 5.5 points, 5.4 rebounds and has a team-leading 10 blocks with eight steals while shooting 47.6% (20-42) from the field
- Earned his first NBA start 2/6 vs. DET and responded by grabbing a **career-high nine rebounds...** with the start, Ayón became the first Hornets rookie since Quincy Pondexter 3/7/11 against the Chicago Bulls to start for the team.
- Ayón grabbed a **team-leading and career-best (at the time) eight rebounds** (all defensive) 2/2 at SAS, the first time he has led the team in that category and the ninth different Hornets to do so this season.
- Gustavo continued his steady production with a career night 1/29 against the Hawks, playing a **career-high 25 minutes while grabbing a career-high tying (at the time) seven rebounds including a career best three offensive caroms...** Ayón also **set a career mark with three blocked shots** and had two assists with six points (3-6 FG)...the Mexico native secured the best +/- (+7) on the team for the game...for players who have played more than three games for the team this season.

FINE FROM THE LINE Notes on the Hornets solid free throw shooting this season

- Al-Farouq Aminu is shooting 34-38 (89.5%) from the line this season, the best percentage on the club... **Aminu went almost a calendar month (January 7th to February 4th) without missing a free throw.**
- Jarrett Jack (64-75) **currently ranks 20th in the league at 85.3%**...Jack was as high as second in the league at 96.0% before missing a pair of free throws 1/13 vs. MIN...Greivis Vasquez (36-45, 80.0%) has only missed nine times this season.
- Carl Landry hit on 11-11 free throws 1/25 at OKC and leads the team in both attempts (98) and makes (78) on the year and is shooting 79.6%.
- Emeka Okafor's stellar 7-7 performance 2/6 vs. SAC helped him on his way to a season-high 19 points and **marked the most free throws made in a game without a miss in his NBA career** (almost 500 games at the time).

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST Against Sacramento 2/6, multiple Hornets had stellar games at the offensive end

- Greivis Vasquez led the charge with a **career-high tying 20 points** on 6-9 shooting including going 7-8 from the free throw line...the Bees shot 80.8% (21-26) from the line as a group.
- Emeka Okafor **tallied his season high with 19 points** and hit on all seven of his free throws
- While only playing 10 minutes, Xavier Henry also **set his season high mark with eight points** on 4-7 shooting and also tallied his first block and steal of the year.
- Chris Kaman led the bench with 10 points and also grabbed a team-best 12 rebounds, good for his **second double-double of the year.**
- Marco Belinelli (18) fell two points shy of his season best, but paired with Trevor Ariza (11), four of five starter hit the double-digit plateau.

INGREDIENTS 4 SUCCESS In the Hornets four wins this season, there have been some common factors:

- **In all four wins this season, the Hornets have outshot their opponent, held their opponent under 90 points, forced 12+ turnovers and led at halftime.**
- Three of the four New Orleans wins have come in commanding fashion, by 13+ points.
- The Hornets have only won one game when trailing entering the fourth quarter.

INDICATORS OF INSUFFICIENCY On the flip side, there have also been some telling signs when the Hornets fall short:

- New Orleans has not won a game when they have been outshot (0-19), when trailing at halftime (0-14) and when allowing 100+ points (0-7).
- Additionally, the Hornets struggle to overcome 4th quarter deficits, going 1-18 when trailing entering the final period of play.

PIN[E]ING FOR LANDRY Coming off the pine this season (all but the first six games of the year), Carl Landry has led the team in scoring six times (eight times total)...he has been the bench's top scorer nine times thus far.

- 2/2 at SAS, Landry scored 17 points on 8-12 shooting and grabbed four rebounds in 28 minutes.
- 1/25 at OKC Carl Landry scored 15 points on just two made field goals, going 11-11 from the free throw line...Landry became the **first Hornet since Hersey Hawkins on 3/5/94 to score as many as 15 points on a few as two made field goals** (2-12 FG, 10-10 FT).

TALL O(A)K-AFOR Emeka Okafor has anchored the Hornets defense this season, averaging a team-best 7.9 rebounds with 1.0 blocks...he is the **ONLY Hornets player to start every game for the team this season.**

- 1/19 at HOU and 1/21 vs. DAL, Okafor grabbed 29 rebounds and scored 24 points with two blocks, including a season-high 17 rebound performance 1/21 vs. DAL in which he also grabbed a season best 11 defensive rebounds...against the Mavs, Emeka also had 16 points, good for his **team-leading 5th double-double** on the year.
- The third-year Hornet has also been efficient on the offensive end, **shooting 114-214 (.533) from the field, which puts him 8th in the league.**
- Emeka tied a career high with five assists 2/1 vs. PHX and scored a season-best 19 2/6 vs. SAC.

JACK ATTACK Jarrett Jack has been on a tear this season, averaging 15.2 ppg as well as leading the team with 6.7 assists per contest, good for **13th best in the league**, to go along with 3.7 rebounds.

- Jack is flirting with being **one of only two players in the league (LeBron James is the other) who are averaging at least 16 points, seven assists and four rebounds** per game this season....**only 20 players in the last decade have upheld those averages for an entire season.**
- Jack has led the team in scoring seven times, in assists 15 times and has scored 20+ points seven times while having two double-doubles on the year...he also tied a career high with four three-pointers made 1/18 vs. MEM (4-4).
- 1/2 at UTA, Jack's stat line was 27 points, 11 assists, five rebounds and two blocks, making him **only the second Hornets player in franchise history to reach those totals in a game** (the other was Baron Davis 3/1/04 at WAS).
- 1/4 vs. PHI, Jack posted his second double-double in as many games, netting 19 points and dishing 11 assists with five rebounds.

SCORCHING THE SUNS II New Orleans' offense was running on all cylinders 2/1 against the Suns at the Hive

- The **103 points** was a season high for the Bees...New Orleans also set **season highs with 32 second quarter points and 59 points in the first half.**
- **Seven Hornets scored in double-figures**, led by Greivis Vasquez's 20 off the bench...it **marked the first time since 3/24/11 at UTA that seven Hornets scored in double figures**...four players (Ariza, Belinelli, Jack, Okafor) were a part of both occasions.
- The Hornets shot 51.9% from the field, the sixth time the team has shot at least 50.0% from the field for a game this season...it was the **second consecutive game and third game in the last four contests** that the Hornets have made better than half their shots from the field.
- New Orleans also made a season-high nine three-pointers and has a season-high 32 team assists

HOT IN SOUTH BEACH Against the Heat in Miami 1/30, the Hornets shot a season-high 53.3% from the field (40-75)

- The Hornets bench was even better, shooting 21-36 (58.3%) with five players contributing over 15 minutes.
- Reserve DaJuan Summers was especially good, scoring seven points on 2-2 shooting, including going 1-1 from beyond the arc and hitting on both his free throws...Summers also grabbed a rebounds and did not commit any fouls or turnovers.

MYSTIFYING THE MAGIC New Orleans put a spell on the Magic defensively 1/27 at home...some notes from the most complete defensive outing of the season:

- Orlando was held to 39.3% shooting from the field, the fifth opponent this season to be held under the 40% mark this year.
- The Magic were held to an opponent season-low 67 points and also scored the fewest points in a first half (34) and through three quarters (52)...Orlando **failed to score 20 points in any quarter, the 7th time a team has not reached 20 in any quarter of a game this season and the first time in franchise history since 1/21/11 in Atlanta.**
- New Orleans forced an opponent season-high 23 turnovers and had a season-high 14 steals.
- Though Dwight Howard single-handedly shot and made more free throws than the Hornets, no other Magic player attempted a free throw until Chris Duhon did so with 2:28 remaining in the game.
- The win against the Magic moved Monty Williams to 3-0 against his former team.

GRANDE GUSTAVO Over the three game stretch between 1/13 – 1/16, rookie forward Gustavo Ayón played so well that he has given the coaching staff no choice but to keep him on the floor, so well in fact that he played the entirety of the 4th quarter 1/13 vs. MIN and 1/14 at MEM....those three contests, Ayón averaged 8.0 points (10-15 FG, 66.7%), and 5.3 rebounds in just over 17 minutes and has also contributed seven assists, five blocks and four steals in those games.

- In his second career night in as many days 1/14, Ayón scored nine points (3-5 FG, 3-3 FT), grabbed seven rebounds, dished five assists, blocked two shots and came away with a steal in just 20 minutes of play...all numbers were career highs.
- Ayón's stat line 1/14 in the fourth quarter was impressive: five points, six rebounds, four assists and a block while missing only once from the field and hitting his only free throw...in fact, Ayón's 5 point-6 rebound-4 assist performance for a quarter **was the first in at least the last 14 seasons in franchise history** (dating back to 1998) and at the time was a **mark that had only been done one other time this season** (Kyle Lowry 2nd quarter 12/29 vs. SAS)...adding in Ayón's block, he **became the first player in the entire NBA since Lamar Odom on 10/31/10 (11-7-4-1) to reach those plateaus.**
- Entering the game with :41 seconds remaining in the 3rd quarter against the Timberwolves 1/13, Ayón played the rest of the game, notching career bests (at the time) of seven points (3-5 shooting), four rebounds (two of which were on the offensive glass) and also recorded the first block and steal of his career and matched up defensively with Kevin Love for the majority of his time in the game.

BENCH BIG ON BEALE The Hornets reserves showed up to play 1/14 at the FedEx Forum off of Beal St. in Memphis.

- In total, the bench scored 52 points, the **most bench points in franchise history in almost four years** (New Orleans last had 52 points from the reserves 1/16/2008 vs. SEA)...in addition to Gustavo Ayón, there were some other standout individual performances from the bench:
- Jason Smith notched the **first double-double of his career with 15 points and 10 rebounds**...the **10 rebounds was a career high, and his four offensive boards tied his career mark**...Smith also poured in three blocks, just one off of his all-time best.
- Greivis Vasquez led the team with six assists, the third time this season he has led the squad in helpers in addition to his 14 points.
- Ayón, Smith and Vasquez each played the entire 4th quarter, with Jarrett Jack (10) and DaJuan Summers (6) the only starters who played in the final frame...the trio combined for 22 of the team's 24 4th quarter points, grabbed 13 rebounds and had seven assists in the final 12:00 minutes.
- The reserves contributed seven of the team's eight blocked shots.

FRIDAY THE 13th Against the Timberwolves on Friday, January 13th, the Hornets had a frightening performance.

- The defense was scary good, allowing an opponent season-low 24 Minnesota field goals (34.3% on 70 attempts) and held the Wolves to just 37 first half points...**the game marked the first time in franchise history that the Hornets allowed as few as 24 field goals and lost the game and only the second time in franchise history that an opponent was held to below 34.3% from the field and won (1/7/2000 at LAL, who shot 33.8% in a 83-87 Hornets loss)**
- The Hornets accrued **13** more fouls than the Timberwolves (32-19) and Minnesota attempted 22 more free throws with 25 more makes...Kevin Love (17) made more free throws than New Orleans attempted (16) as a team.
- New Orleans scored just **13** points in the third quarter, a season low for any quarter, letting a one point halftime edge slip to a 12 point deficit to begin the fourth quarter.
- The Hornets **13** turnovers led to 11 Minnesota points.
- There is one more Friday the **13th** date on the docket, against the Jazz at home in April.
- The late Bobby Phillips, who's **#13** is the only number in franchise history to be retired, was honored during the game (a day after the 12th anniversary of his unfortunate passing) with a moment of silence in addition to head coach Monty Williams wearing a patch displaying his number.

ROOK-IE NO MORE Al-Farouq 'Rook' Aminu has played the best stretch of games of his career in his sophomore season from 1/7 at DAL to 1/11 vs. OKC

- **Aminu set career highs with 12 rebounds (all defensive, also a career high) and four steals and scored a season high 15 points to lead the team in scoring...it was Aminu's first double-double of his career**...Aminu's previous high rebounds was eight (four times) and his previous high in steals was three (three times)...The 21-year old also went 2-4 from distance in addition to 5-6 from the line.
- The following game in Denver, in just 26 minutes, 'Chief' **tied his career high with five assists and led the team with eight rebounds.**
- Aminu tied for the team lead in rebounds (nine) 1/11 vs. OKC and tied his career high in offensive rebounds (four) in just 25 minutes of play...he also hit for his 500th career point with his first field goal of the game.

MILE HIGHS 1/9 in the 'Mile-High' city of Denver, multiple Hornets season or career statistical marks were reached

- Chris Kaman (20) and Marco Belinelli (19) each posted their season high in points while Carl Landry (21) tied his best season output.
- Al-Farouq Aminu tied his career high with five assists in the game.
- The Hornets hit on 52.0% of their shots from the field (39-75), a season best.

SABOR INTERNACIONAL = INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR Two of the newest members of the Hornets roster, Gustavo Ayon and Greivis Vasquez, from Mexico and Venezuela respectively, are each the third player in NBA history from their home country.

- Ayón joins Haracio Llamas (Phoenix Suns, 1996-98) and Eduardo Najera (currently with the Charlotte Bobcats) as the only Mexican born players.
- Vasquez, a rookie last season, joined Carl Herrera (1991-96) and Oscar Torres (2001-03) as the only Venezuelan-born players.
- Marco Belinelli (Italy) is the only other foreign-born player on the Hornets roster, the sixth player born on the Apennine Peninsula to make the NBA and one of three active players (the Raptors' Andrea Bargnani and the Nuggets' Danilo Gallinari are the others).
- Chris Kaman, though American, holds dual U.S.-German citizenship and participated with the German national team this past summer in the European Championships and in the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing.
- Recently acquired Xavier Henry was born in Belgium, and is one of only two players in the NBA (joining Tony Parker) to be born in that country.

COMPACT CAMPAIGN The shortened 2011-12 season will feature 66 games over the course of only 120 days (not including the three day All-Star Break). Here are some notes that the peculiar schedule has produced:

- January will be the toughest month in terms of games played for the Hornets, with 18 contests (including 10 home dates), an average of a game every 1.72 days! This marks the **fourth time in franchise history the Bees have had 18 games in a single month**, joining March and April 1999 (also a post-work stoppage season) and in March of 1990...the last time the Hornets had 10 home games in a month was in January 2007, when they played host to 11 games.
- The Hornets will play a back-to-back-to-back February 20th – 22nd in Oklahoma City, Indiana and Cleveland, respectively, only the second time in franchise history the team has had such a stretch of games.
- The '11-'12 schedule features 15 sets of back-to-back games, with the first coming January 1st and 2nd in Sacramento and Utah...there will be three sets of home back-to-backs, all in the first three weeks of March (2nd/3rd, 14th/15th and 21st/22nd).
- February 11th and 12th was the first time the team had consecutive days off without a game.

GORDON IN THE GAME In the two games Eric Gordon has played for New Orleans this season, he is averaging a team-best 21.0 points as well as 5.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 blocks.

- Gordon has led the team in scoring both times he has played this year.
- In his home debut, 'The Commissioner' hit his first four shots from the field en route to an 11 point first quarter and ended the game with 22 points.
- His Hornets debut was a memorable one, hitting the game-winning jumper with 4.2 seconds to play 12/26 at Phoenix...in the game, Gordon also became the first player to score at least 20 points in his team debut since the team moved to New Orleans in 2002.

CAPTAIN JACK & Co. Monty Williams named Jarrett Jack, Eric Gordon and Emeka Okafor captains for the 2011-12 season...Okafor, whose eight years of experience tie him for most on the roster, is the longest tenured Hornets player, entering his third season with the club...Jack enters his 7th season in the league and his first full season with the Hornets after being acquired mid-season last year...Gordon is in his fourth year in the league and first with the Hornets after headlining the offseason deal with the Los Angeles Clippers and wasted no time introducing himself to fans and teammates alike by hitting the game-winning shot with 4.2 seconds remaining in his debut 12/26 at Phoenix.

YOUTH MOVEMENT The average age of the three players the Hornets received from the Clippers in the December 14th trade (Al-Farouq Aminu, Eric Gordon and Chris Kaman) was 24 years old.

- Aminu (21) was the fourth-youngest player in the entire NBA last season.
- The Hornets have three rookies on the roster and three more players who had less than 82 games of NBA experience entering the season...in fact, the Hornets ranked 3rd in the NBA in least average experience with only 3.2 seasons of service per player coming into the year.
- New Orleans currently has just four players on the squad with more than four full years of NBA experience (Trevor Ariza, Jarrett Jack, Chris Kaman, Emeka Okafor).

NEW FACES There were nine players on the opening day roster who were not members of the team in 2010-11. In the season opener, five players made their debut wearing the creole blue, and in the first home game on 12/28 vs. BOS, two more Hornets were newly-minted...in all, 11 Hornets have been newly-minted this season.

- Al-Farouq Aminu, Eric Gordon, CarlDell Johnson, Chris Kaman and Greivis Vasquez all appeared in their first game as Hornets 12/26 at PHX.
- For 'Squeaky' Johnson, a New Orleans native, the game also marked his NBA debut....Johnson made his debut at the Hive two days later on 12/28 vs. BOS, connecting on a technical free throw to an ovation from his hometown crowd.
- With two minutes played 12/28 vs. BOS, Trey Johnson also officially joined the Hornets all-time roster, playing in his 13th career game in the NBA with his fourth team over three seasons.
- On January 1st, 2012, with 2:03 to play in the game, Gustavo Ayon stepped foot on the court, officially becoming the third Mexican born NBA player in league history.
- DaJuan Summers, formerly of the Detroit Pistons, played his first game for the Hornets 1/9 at DEN, logging 24 minutes in his first game back from a knee injury...Summers made his first field goal attempt, and finished with four points and three rebounds with two assists.
- After resolving an ankle sprain suffered with the Memphis Grizzlies in preseason, second-year guard Xavier Henry played his first game at Oklahoma City 1/25 in front of his hometown crowd.
- Donald Sloan made his Hornets debut 2/10 vs. POR, logging a career-high 13 minutes, scoring seven points with two assists.

10,000 SEASON TICKETS The New Orleans Hornets sold more than 10,000 season tickets for the 2011-12 season, including selling the most new season tickets in the NBA since June...this strong demonstration of community commitment to the long-term presence of the NBA team in New Orleans is all the more remarkable because it was achieved in the midst of significant uncertainty regarding team ownership and a labor work stoppage...the Hornets pursuit of 10,000 season tickets was initiated in February as the team began its infamous "I'm In" campaign, which included appearances and public support from Governor Bobby Jindal and Mayor Mitch Landrieu...the campaign included grassroots marketing, electronic billboards, radio and TV advertising and, most importantly, the unprecedented "100 Events in 100 Days: I'm In, Are You?" initiative.

SAINTS/HORNETS CONNECTION When Eric Gordon heard he was coming to New Orleans, he knew he had a couple of Super Bowl Champion friends that could share some tips on life in the Big Easy...Gordon went to the same high school and college as Courtney Roby of the Saints and attended Indiana University with Tracey Porter.

EVERY HORNETS GAME IS ON TV! For the first time in franchise history, Hornets fans will have an opportunity to watch every single game this season. CST will broadcast 65 regular season games, while TNT will broadcast the lone non-CST game (4/24 at GSW).

NATIVE SONS Hornets rookie guard **Donald Sloan** hails from Shreveport...in his rookie season, Sloan is now the 13th active NBA player born in the state of Louisiana joining D.J. Augustin (New Orleans, Bobcats), Brandon Bass (Baton Rouge, Celtics), Glen Davis (Baton Rouge, Magic), Chris Duhon (Mamou, Magic), Danny Granger (New Orleans, Pacers), Antawn Jamison (Shreveport, Cavaliers), Rashard Lewis (Pineville, Wizards), Paul Millsap (Baton Rouge, Jazz), Greg Monroe (New Orleans, Pistons), Tyrus Thomas (Baton Rouge, Bobcats), Marcus Thornton (Baton Rouge, Kings), Von Wafer (Homer, Magic) and Thaddeus Young (New Orleans, 76ers)...another Hornets point man, **Jarrett Jack**, also has Louisiana ties, with his mother and father being born in Doyline and Ville Platte respectively...Jack is also the cousin of Duhon.

BUSY BEES

A Look at the Hornets' Off-season



MAKING CHANGES: The Hornets have been one of the most active teams in this condensed season. New Orleans went into the 2011-12 campaign with only six returning players from the 2010-11 roster (currently five) and nine new players, while Emeka Okafor (third season) is the longest-tenured Hornet and only remaining member of the roster inherited by Dell Demps and his staff when they took the helm in the summer of 2010. Below is a timeline of the Hornets' off-season:

June 23, 2011	Trade the rights to center Jonathan Harrelson (45 th overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft) to the New York Knicks for financial considerations.
June 27, 2011	David West declines player option for the 2011-12 season and becomes a free agent.
June 30, 2011	Extend qualifying offer to guard Marco Belinelli for the 2011-12 season.
July 7, 2011	Reigning NBA D-League champion Iowa Energy named new Hornets D-League affiliate.
August 2, 2011	Dave Hanners named assistant coach...Randy Ayers named lead assistant coach.
December 9, 2011	Hornets sign nine free agents (Brian Butch, Justin Dentmon, Jerome Dyson, Moses Ehambe, Carldele Johnson, Trey Johnson, DaJuan Summers, Trey Johnson and Terrico White) to training camp roster.
December 13, 2011	Marco Belinelli signs qualifying offer...waive forward Patrick Ewing Jr.
December 14, 2011	Acquire forward Al-Farouq Aminu, guard Eric Gordon, center Chris Kaman and the more favorable of the 2012 first round picks between the Los Angeles Clippers and Minnesota Timberwolves from the Clippers in exchange for guard Chris Paul and two 2015 2 nd round picks.

Dell Demps ▪ *Senior Vice President and General Manager*

▪ On July 21, 2010, Dell Demps was named the seventh general manager in Hornets history. It is Demps' first stint as general manager of an NBA franchise.

- Demps joined the Spurs at the start of the 2005-06 season as director of pro player personnel and was promoted to Vice President of Basketball Operations in 2010. In addition to his duties with the Spurs, Demps was named general manager of the Toros when they were first purchased by the Spurs in June 2007.
- With the Spurs, Demps won an NBA Championship (2007) and two divisional titles (2006, 2009). In each of the last five seasons that he was with San Antonio, the Spurs won at least 50 games.
- Demps had the opportunity to play in the NBA for Golden State (1993-94), San Antonio (1995-96) and Orlando (1996-97), as well as playing

professionally in the Philippines, France, Greece, Turkey, Croatia and Venezuela during his 10-year career.

▪ During his professional playing career, each summer he returned to Pacific to take MBA courses. When Demps suffered a season-ending shoulder injury in 1998, he returned to Pacific and completed his MBA.

▪ At Pacific, Demps was a four-year starter, earning All-Big West honors three times. After completing his MBA, Demps became a member of Pacific's Eberhardt School of Business Advisory Board. He was also elected to the Pacific Athletics Hall of Fame in 2003.

▪ Demps, a native of the San Francisco Bay Area and his wife, Anita, have three sons, Jourdan (21), Tre (18), and Riley (11). Jourdan attends the University of Texas-San Antonio and Tre is in his freshman year playing basketball at Northwestern University. Riley is great student-athlete that excels in football and basketball. Anita is a 1998 graduate of Pacific's McGeorge School of Law.
