QUICK NOTES

- Tonight's game at Houston is the second game of the current three-game road trip. The road trip wraps up in Memphis on Monday.
- Kings rookie Tyreke Evans recorded his sixth straight 20-point game, tallying 29 points at Dallas. He became the first Kings rookie to post six consecutive 20-point games since Lionel Simmons recorded seven straight 20-point games during the 1990-91 season (Feb. 12 - 27, 1991).
- The Kings are ranked sixth in the NBA in rebounding (44.5 rpg) and third in offensive rebounding (13.6 orgp). Last season, the Kings were ranked 29th in rebounding and 25th in offensive rebounding.

**KINGS VS. HOUSTON (11/21 - Toyota Center):** Tonight's game at Houston is the second of four regular season meetings between the two teams. Sacramento won the first meeting of the season, 109-100, on Nov. 13, 2009, at ARCO Arena. Houston swept last season's series, 3-0. The Rockets have won the last five meetings against the Kings in Houston. The last time the Kings defeated the Rockets in Houston was on Jan. 11, 2006 (88-80). The Rockets lead the all-time series, 105-82, including 64-36, in the Sacramento era.

**CONNECTIONS:** Rockets Head Coach Rick Adelman coached the Kings for eight seasons (1998-99 – 2005-06). Adelman is the Kings' franchise leader in coaching victories (395). Assistant Coaches Elston Turner (2000-01 – 2005-06) and T.R. Dunn (2004-05 - 2006-07) served in the same capacity with the Kings. Kings forward Donté Greene, Bobby Jackson and a 2009 first-round selection (which the Kings used to select Omri Casspi) were traded to the Kings by the Rockets in exchange for forward Ron Artest, Sean Singletary and Patrick Ewing Jr. (8/14/08). Kings forward Kenny Thomas played four-and-a-half seasons (1999-00 – 2002-03) for the Rockets after being selected in the first round (22nd overall) of the 1999 NBA Draft. Kings Assistant Coach Mario Elie played for the Rockets for five seasons (1993-94 – 1997-98).

**KINGS VS. MEMPHIS (11/23 - FedExForum):** Monday night's game at Memphis is the second of three regular season meetings between the two teams. The Kings won the first meeting of the season, 127-116, in overtime on November 2, the Kings' home opener. The two teams split last season's series with each team winning two games. The Grizzlies' 113-95 win at ARCO Arena on March 27, 2009, snapped the Kings' 20-game winning streak against the Grizzlies in Sacramento. The Grizzlies have won six of the last eight game against the Kings in Memphis. Sacramento leads the all-time series against the Grizzlies, 40-15.

**CONNECTIONS:** Kings rookie guard Tyreke Evans played one season at the University of Memphis. Donté Greene was drafted by Memphis with the 28th overall pick in the first round of the 2008 NBA Draft. He was then traded along with a 2009 second-round draft choice to Houston in a three-team trade that sent Nicolas Batum (25th pick) to Portland while Memphis received the draft rights to Joey Dorsey (33rd pick) and Darrell Arthur (27th pick). Sergio Rodriguez is one of five Spanish players in the NBA – Marc Gasol (Memphis), Pau Gasol (Lakers), Rudy Fernandez (Portland), Jose Calderon (Toronto)

## KINGS' LAST GAME

### DALLAS 104, SACRAMENTO 102

November 20, 2009 – At American Airlines Center, the Kings held Dirk Nowitzki under his scoring average, but Dallas' bench lifted the Mavericks to a 104-102 win over Sacramento. Dallas' bench tallied 52 points, a team-high-tying 20 coming from Jason Terry. The Kings rallied from 10 points down, 98-88, with 1:15 left in the fourth quarter, as Tyreke Evans drilled a three-pointer to trim the lead to three, 102-99, with 2.8 seconds remaining. Terry was fouled and sealed the win with two free throws. Omri Casspi's trey at the buzzer completed the scoring. Evans just missed a triple-double, recording a game-high 29 points, seven rebounds, and a career-high 10 assists. He also had a steal and a block in 44 minutes. Beno Udrih contributed 20 points, four rebounds, five assists, and a block in 42 minutes. Andres Nocioni, who missed the previous game with a right hip pointer, scored 15 points and harassed Nowitzki into a 6-of-15 shooting performance. Nowitzki finished with a team-high-tying 20 points, but entered the game averaging 27.5 points per game and had scored a combined 73 points in the previous two Dallas games. All five of Jason Kidd's made field goals were three-pointers as he finished with a double-double of 15 points and 11 assists. Drew Gooden grabbed a game-high 16 rebounds.

**NOTES:** The Mavericks have won the last 12 meetings against the Kings in Dallas. Sacramento turned the ball over 21 times, resulting in 24 Dallas points. Sacramento had eight turnovers in the second quarter and were outscored by the Mavericks, 25-18, in that quarter. The Kings shot 61.9 percent from the field in the fourth quarter; the Mavericks, 65. Both teams each grabbed 44 rebounds.

## KINGS NOTES

**KEVIN MARTIN OUT AT LEAST 8 WEEKS:** Sacramento Kings' guard Kevin Martin underwent surgery Monday, November 9th at the UC Davis Medical Center to repair a non displaced hairline fracture of the navicular bone in his left wrist. Dr. Robert Szabo performed the procedure. Martin is expected to miss a minimum of eight weeks. An MRI taken on November 5 on Kevin Martin's left wrist revealed a non displaced hairline fracture of the navicular bone. Since emerging as the team's leading scorer in 2006-07, Martin has played in 78.5 percent (197 of 251 games) of the team's games. The injury occurred during the November 2 game against Memphis when Martin collided with Allen Iverson.

**FIRST ISRAELI-BORN PLAYER IN NBA:** On October 28, at Oklahoma City, with 6:16 left in the first quarter, Kings rookie Omri Casspi became the first Israeli-born player to ever play in the NBA. Casspi recorded 15 points (7-9 FG, 0-1 3pt, 1-2 FT), three rebounds, one steal, and one block in 19 minutes off the bench in his NBA debut against the Thunder. Born in Yavne, Israel, Casspi grew up in Hapoel Holon but moved to Maccabi Tel Aviv and played in his native Israel his entire career (2005-06 - 2008-09). Casspi became the first Israel player to be drafted in the first round when the Kings selected him with the 23rd pick in the 2009 NBA Draft. He was also the first European-born player to be drafted by the Kings since Hedo Turkoglu (Turkey) was selected with the 16th overall pick in the 2000 NBA Draft. Turkoglu was the first Turkish-born player in the NBA. The Kings also had the first player born and raised in France to play in the NBA - Tariq Abdul-Wahad.

**YOUTH ISSERVED:** According to NBA.com's 2009-10 Player Survey, Kings rookie Tyreke Evans at 20 years old is the third youngest player in the NBA. The Kings rank as the third-youngest team in the NBA, behind Memphis and Oklahoma City. Sacramento has the second-least experience (3.43 years) of any team in the league with only Memphis having less (3.13 years).

**CAN I SEE SOME ID?:** The Kings have four players that are 21 years old or younger -- Omri Casspi, Donte Greene, and Spencer Hawes are 21, Tyreke Evans is 20 years old. Sacramento has nine players who are 25 years old or younger. The average age of the Kings is 24.9 years old.

**BACK-TO-BACKS:** Tonight's game at Houston concludes the Kings' third set of back-to-back games. The Kings' next (4th) set of back-to-back games is December 5 at Phoenix and December 6 vs. Miami. The Kings are 1-2 in the first game and 1-1 in the second game of back-to-backs this season. Sacramento has swept one set and has been swept once. The Kings will play 20 sets of back-to-back games during the 2009-10 season. Of the 20 sets of back-to-back games, 10 are of the away-away variety, two are home-away, and eight are away-home. Last season, Sacramento was 7-37 in back-to-back games (4-18 in the first game and 3-19 in the second game). The Kings split eight back-to-back sets and were swept 14 times in 2008-09.

**FORMER PLAYERS, KINGS COACHES:** Including current Kings Head Coach Paul Westphal, five of the Kings' last six head coaches have played in the NBA - Kenny Natt, Reggie Theus, Rick Adelman, and Eddie Jordan. Only Westphal and Adelman had NBA coaching experience before becoming the Kings' head coach. Adelman had coached eight seasons (Portland and Golden State) before being named the Kings head coach prior to the 1998-99 season. Westphal has seven years of NBA coaching experience (Phoenix and Seattle).

**GARCIA FRACTURES RIGHT FOREARM:** Sacramento Kings' swingman Francisco Garcia underwent successful surgery on the morning of October 10 at the UC Davis Medical Center to repair a broken right radius in his forearm and ligament damage to his wrist. The injury occurred during a weight lifting session the previous day. Dr. Mark Lee performed the three-hour procedure. Garcia will spend eight weeks immobilized in a cast. He is expected to miss a minimum of four months of action.

**WELCOME TO THE NBA:** The Kings currently have four rookies on the team: Tyreke Evans, Omri Casspi, Jon Brockman, and Lanny Smith. Evans (fourth overall) and Casspi were selected by the Kings in the first round of the 2009 NBA Draft. Brockman's draft rights (38th overall), Sergio Rodriguez, and cash considerations were acquired from the Portland Trail Blazers in exchange for the draft rights to Jeff Pendergraph (31st overall) on Draft Night. Smith, who played under former Idaho Stampede Head Coach and current Kings Assistant Coach Bryan Gates in the D-League last season, was signed as a free agent.

**NEW COACHING STAFF:** Paul Westphal became the franchise's 23rd head coach on June 12, 2009. Prior to joining the Kings, Westphal was the executive vice president of basketball operations for the Dallas Mavericks. Westphal brings with him 22 years of coaching experience, seven in the NBA (four with Phoenix, 1992-93 - 1995-96) and three with Seattle, 1998-99 - 2000-01). He possesses a 267-159 (.627) NBA coaching record. The coaching staff includes Jim Eyn, Mario Elie, Truck Robinson, Bryan Gates, Pete Carril, and Shareef Abdur-Rahim.

**INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR:** The Kings have several players with global ties. Omri Casspi, drafted by the Kings in the first round (23rd overall) of the 2009 NBA Draft, became the first Israeli player to be drafted in the first round and has the opportunity to become the first player from Israel to play in the NBA. Both Francisco Garcia and Donte Greene played high school and college basketball in the United States, but were born in other countries. Greene was born in Munich, Germany; Garcia, in Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic. Garcia and Atlanta's Al Horford are the only current NBA players born in the Dominican Republic. Andres Nocioni hails from Santa Fe, Argentina. Sergio Rodriguez, who was acquired by the Kings on Draft Night, is from Tenerife, Spain. Beno Udrih hails from Sempeter, Slovenia.
