KINGS NOTES

- Tonight's game at Chicago is the first of six straight road games for the Kings. In the month of February, the Kings have five home games and eight road contests.
- The Bulls have won the last three meetings against the Kings. Sacramento's last win over the Bulls in Chicago was on 12/21/09 (102-98).
- Sacramento has a 5-1 record when leading after three quarters (4-0 at home).
- The Kings are 6-2 with the current starting lineup of John Salmons, Jason Thompson, DeMarcus Cousins, Marcus Thornton, and Tyreke Evans.
- DeMarcus Cousins has recorded 17 double-doubles this season (third-most in the NBA). Cousins was named to the 2012 BBVA Rising Stars Challenge (Feb. 24) during NBA All-Star Weekend.
- In the last six games (after missing the previous four with a left thigh injury), Marcus Thornton is averaging 19.7 ppg. Thornton has scored 20 or more points in four of the last five games.

PHOENIX 98, SACRAMENTO 84

February 11, 2012 - Jared Dudley recorded a team-high 20 points and a game-high 10 rebounds to help the Suns end the Kings' three-game home win streak with a 98-84 win at Power Balance Pavilion.

The Suns led from start to finish, and led by as many as 17 points in the fourth quarter. Phoenix closed out the third quarter with six unanswered points and maintained a double-digit lead the rest of the way.

DeMarcus Cousins led all scorers with 26 points. He also grabbed a team-high nine rebounds. Marcus Thornton scored 21 points, scoring nine points in the second and third quarters. Tyreke Evans, entering the game with a 17.4 scoring average, was held to four points on 1-of-9 shooting from the field. For the Suns, Markieff Morris tallied 18 points off the bench. Channing Frye added 17 points and Marcin Gortat scored 15 points and recorded four of the Suns' season-high 11 blocks. Steve Nash finished with four points, but handed out 15 assists, the most the Kings have allowed to an opposing player this season.

The Kings outrebounded the Suns, 42-38, but were outshot, 35.1 percent to 50.

KINGS NOTES

STREAKS/OBSERVATIONS: The Kings have won four of their last six games ... Current Kings starting lineup (John Salmons, Jason Thompson, DeMarcus Cousins, Marcus Thornton, and Tyreke Evans) is 6-2 ... Sacramento is 5-3 in games decided by five points or less ... The Kings are 3-0 in games Tyreke Evans and Marcus Thornton each score 20 or more points ... **DeMarcus Cousins** has recorded a double-double in three of the last five games ... **Tyreke Evans** scored four points (1-9 FG, 0-1 3pt, 2-2 FT) vs. Phoenix (2/11) after averaging 21.4 ppg in the previous seven games ... **John Salmons** has scored a total of 11 points in the last three games after scoring in double-figures in each of the previous three games ... Salmons is shooting .500 (9-18 3pt) from three-point range in the last six games ... In the last six games (after missing the previous four with a left thigh injury), **Marcus Thornton** is averaging 19.7 ppg ... Thornton has scored 20 or more points in four of the last five games ... Thornton has made three or more three-pointers in four of the last five games and has made at least one three-pointer in 19 of the 20 games he has played in.

COUSINS NAMED TO 2012 BBVA RISING STARS CHALLENGE: On February 8, DeMarcus Cousins was selected to the 18-player roster pool of the 2012 BBVA Rising Stars Challenge to be held on February 24 in Orlando during NBA All-Star 2012. The players, selected by NBA assistant coaches, will be drafted to two teams on Feb. 16, one coached by Charles Barkley; the other, Shaquille O'Neal. Cousins joins MarShon Brooks, Blake Griffin, Landry Fields, Paul George, Gordon Hayward, Kyrie Irving, Brandon Knight, Kawhi Leonard, Greg Monroe, Markieff Morris, Ricky Rubio, Tiago Splitter, Tristan Thompson, Evan Turner, Kemba Walker, John Wall (who was the MVP of last year's Rookie Challenge), and Derrick Williams as participants. Last year, Cousins finished with a game-high 33 points and 14 rebounds to help lead the Rookies to a 148-140 win over the Sophomores.

COUSINS' DOUBLE-DOUBLES: DeMarcus Cousins has recorded 17 double-doubles this season, third-most in the NBA this season. Minnesota's Kevin Love leads the league with 23 double-doubles, followed by Orlando's Dwight Howard with 21. As a rookie last season, Cousins recorded 26 double-doubles.

COUSINS SEEING 20/20: DeMarcus Cousins recorded 21 points (8-18 FG, 5-5 FT) and a game-high and career-high 20 rebounds in the Kings' 114-106 overtime win over the Warriors on February 4 at Power Balance Pavilion. It was Cousins' 15th double-double of the season. It was the first 20-point, 20-rebound double-double by a King since Brad Miller recorded 30 points and 22 rebounds at Golden State on January 14, 2009. According to Elias Sports Bureau, Cousins became only the fifth Kings player in the Sacramento era to have a 20-point, 20-rebound effort, joining LaSalle Thompson (1988), Olden Polynice (1994), Chris Webber (5 times) and Brad Miller (3 times).

A WORK IN PROGRESS: Kings Head Coach Keith Smart has been trying to push the tempo and have the Kings run more to create easier scoring opportunities. In the first seven games, the Kings averaged 14.7 fastbreak points per game while opponents averaged 19.1 fastbreak points per game (Kings, 103 fastbreak points; opponents, 134). In the last 20 contests, the Kings are averaging 16.8 fastbreak points per game while opponents are averaging 15.7 fastbreak ppg (Kings, 335 fastbreak points; opponents, 313). Another area of emphasis has been ball movement. The Kings have dished out 20 or more assists in six of the last 11 games - They did not have a 20-assist game in the first 13 games of the season. Tyreke Evans averaged 3.0 apg in the first seven games - He is averaging 5.8 apg in the last 20 games. DeMarcus Cousins is averaging 16.5 ppg and 11.9 rpg in the last 20 games after averaging 13.7 ppg and 9.3 rpg in the first seven contests of the season in which he played in. Jason Thompson, who was averaging 5.6 ppg and 3.6 rpg in the first seven games, is now averaging 8.8 ppg and 6.5 rpg in the last 20 games.

WHITESIDE AND HONEYCUTT'S TIME IN RENO: On February 3, the Kings recalled center Hassan Whiteside from the Reno Bighorns of the NBA Development League. Whiteside was assigned to the Bighorns on January 1 and averaged 7.8 ppg (.521 FG%, .343 FT%), 6.5 rpg, 3.0 bpg and 18.9 mpg in 11 contests (started 5). He recorded double-figure scoring in four games with his most notable performance coming versus the Sioux Falls Skyforce (1/13), where he tallied 15 points (7-10 FG, 1-2 FT), 10 rebounds, and two blocks in 29 minutes. Whiteside also registered 13 points (5-9 FG, 3-9 FT), nine rebounds, and six blocks in his first appearance with Reno versus Fort Wayne (1/3). On January 24, the Kings recalled rookie forward Tyler Honeycutt from the Reno. On January 1, Honeycutt and center Hassan Whiteside were assigned to the Bighorns. Honeycutt averaged 5.9 ppg (.418 FG%, .375 3pt%, .438 FT%), 2.9 rpg, 0.9 apg, and 12.7 mpg in 10 games of which one he started. He scored in double-figures in two games and recorded 23 points (9-14 FG, 2-3 3pt, 3-4 FT), seven rebounds, one assist, three steals, and one block in 29 minutes versus the Austin Toros (1/15). He became the third Kings player to be assigned to the D-League (Donté Greene in 2008-09, Hassan Whiteside last season).

MARCUS THORNTON RETURNS TO LINEUP: A diagnostic ultrasound test performed on guard Marcus Thornton on January 25 at the UC Davis Medical Center revealed a significant hematoma in his left thigh. He was expected to miss approximately one to two weeks of action. Thornton first suffered a left thigh contusion when he took a knee to the thigh from Dwight Howard on January 8 vs. Orlando. He was re-injured with 10:56 left in the second quarter on January 21 at Memphis. Thornton has missed a total of seven games due to the injury. In his first game back, Thornton scored a team-high 20 points to help lead the Kings to a 95-93 win over Portland on February 2.

COMING BACK AGAIN: The Kings overcame a 18-point second quarter deficit and a nine-point fourth quarter deficit to defeat the Hornets, 100-92, on February 6 at New Orleans Arena. On January 18, the Kings overcame a poor shooting night from the field (30.1 percent), from the free throw line (68.3 percent), and a 16-point third-quarter deficit, to defeat the Pacers, 92-88, at Power Balance Pavilion. In the fourth quarter, both teams struggled from the field, but the Kings outscored the Pacers, 26-8, and forced nine turnovers while not turning the ball over even once. It was the first time a Kings team shot under 31 percent and still won since Dec. 1, 1957, when the Cincinnati Royals shot 30 percent (30-100 FG) from the field and defeated Minneapolis, 90-89. The last time a team had shot as badly as the Kings and still won was on Oct. 29, 2003, when Denver shot 29.2 percent (28-96 FG) but defeated San Antonio, 96-72. On January 5, in Keith Smart's Kings coaching debut, the Kings rallied from a 21-point third-quarter deficit for a 103-100 win over the visiting Bucks. The Kings outscored Milwaukee, 35-18, in the fourth quarter, shooting 61.9 percent from the field and 81.8 from the line.

ALEX ENGLISH ADDED TO KINGS COACHING STAFF: On January 13, Alex English was hired as an assistant coach, joining Jim Eyen, Bobby Jackson and Jim Todd on Keith Smart's coaching staff. A member of the Basketball Hall-of-Fame and the NBA's 13th all-time leading scorer (25,613 points), English arrives in Sacramento after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach and director of player development with the Toronto Raptors (2004-11). Prior to his stint north of the border, English served in a similar capacity with the Philadelphia 76ers (2003-04) and Atlanta Hawks (2002-03). He began his professional basketball management career in 2001-02 as the head coach of the NBA Development League's North Charleston (S.C.) Lowgaters, where he guided his team to a 36-20 record and a berth in the finals of the first NBDL Championship.

YOUTH BE SERVED: Entering the 2011-12 regular season, the Kings are the youngest team in the NBA, averaging 24.347 years, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. The Kings' roster of 14 features seven returning players from last season. The average age of the Kings is 24.3 years - 10 players are under the age of 26. The Kings have an average of 3.1 years of NBA experience (7 players have 2 or less years of NBA experience).

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK: The Kings play one set of back-to-back-to-back games this season. Sacramento visited Memphis (Jan. 3) and Denver (Jan. 4) before hosting Milwaukee (Jan. 5). It is the first time the Kings have played three games in three nights since the 1998-99 lockout-shortened season. That season, the Kings played the Lakers (Mar. 14) the Warriors (Mar. 15) at Golden State, and San Antonio (Mar. 16). The Kings had three sets of back-to-back-to-back games that season (February 15-17, March 1-3, March 14-16, 1999).

TONIGHT'S OPPONENT



KINGS VS. CHICAGO (2/14 at United Center): The Kings face the Bulls for the second and final time during the regular season. Chicago won the first meeting, 108-98, on December 29 at Power Balance Pavilion. Last season, the Bulls swept the season series against the Kings, 2-0. The Bulls have won the last three meetings against the Kings. The last time the Kings defeated the Bulls was on Dec. 21, 2009 in Chicago (102-98). The Bulls lead all-time series, 73-72, including 26-25, in the Sacramento era.

CONNECTIONS: Kings guard-forward **John Salmons** played for the Bulls during the 2008-09 and 2009-10 seasons. Salmons was traded with Brad Miller to the Bulls from Sacramento in exchange for Drew Gooden, Andres Nocioni, and Cedric Simmons (2/18/09). He was traded a year later to Milwaukee (2/18/00). **Tyreke Evans** and Derrick Rose both played at the University of Memphis. Bulls radio broadcaster Bill Wennington (1990-91 and 1999-00) and Randy Brown (1991-92 - 1994-95), Special Assistant to the General Manager, both played for the Kings. Brown also served as an assistant coach during the 2008-09 season.

LAST MEETING: CHICAGO 108, SACRAMENTO 98

December 29, 2011 - Reigning MVP Derrick Rose tallied 19 points and Carlos Boozer recorded a double-double with 16 points and 15 rebounds as the Bulls held off the Kings, 108-98, at a soldout Power Balance Pavilion. It was the Bulls' fourth straight win over the Kings in Sacramento.

The Bulls used a 15-0 run to turn a 5-4 deficit into a 19-5 lead in the first quarter and never trailed again. Sacramento cut the lead down to one point twice in the third quarter, as DeMarcus Cousins hit a jumper with 4:21 remaining for a 74-73 Bulls lead. However, the Bulls responded with a 7-0 spurt to push the lead to eight, 81-73, with 2:35 left in the third quarter. Sacramento could not get any closer than six points the rest of the way.

Marcus Thornton led all scorers with 20 points. Cousins recorded his third straight double-double with 15 points and a team-high 12 rebounds. Jimmer Fredette contributed 14 points off the bench. John Salmons tallied 12 points. Chuck Hayes grabbed 10 rebounds to accompany seven points. Richard Hamilton scored 16 points for the Bulls and Ronnie Brewer and Luol Deng each had 12 points.

The Bulls had a 33-14 advantage in fastbreak points and outscored the Kings in the paint, 54-48. Sacramento again struggled from the free throw line, making 20 of 34 attempts (58.8 percent).

KINGS VS. NEW YORK (2/15 at Madison Square Garden): The Kings face the Knicks for the second and final time during the regular season. The Knicks won the first meeting, 114-92, on December 31 at Power Balance Pavilion. Last season, the two teams split the season series with each team winning a game on the road. The Kings have won the last four meetings against the Knicks in New York. The Kings lead the all-time series, 147-138, but trail, 23-29, in the Sacramento era.

CONNECTIONS: Kings forward **Donté Greene** played one season (2007-08) for Syracuse University. Carmelo Anthony also played for the Orangemen. Both were coached by Jim Boeheim. Kings guard **Jimmer Fredette** was born in Glens Falls, NY and attended Glen Falls High School. Knicks guard Mike Bibby played seven seasons for the Kings (2001-02 - 2007-08), averaging 17.6 ppg and 5.4 apg. While with the Kings, Bibby was teammates with **Francisco Garcia** (2001-02 - 2004-05) and **John Salmons** (2007-08). Kings forward **Tyler Honeycutt** and New York guard Baron Davis played collegiately at UCLA. **DeMarcus Cousins**, **Chuck Hayes**, and Josh Harrellson played collegiately at Kentucky. Cousins and Harrellson were teammates during the 2009-10 season. Kings center-forward **Chuck Hayes** was a teammate of Jared Jeffries (2009-10 and 2010-11) and Steve Novak (2006-07 and 2007-08) while with the Rockets. Kings Assistant Coach **Bobby Jackson** and Knicks center Tyson Chandler were teammates for two seasons (2006-07 and 2007-08) at New Orleans. Kings Head Coach **Keith Smart** coached Knicks guard Jeremy Lin last season at Golden State. Kings center Hassan Whiteside played one season at Marshall - Knicks Head Coach Mike D'Antoni was selected by the Kansas City/Omaha Kings out of Marshall in second round (20th pick overall) of the 1973 NBA Draft. D'Antoni played three seasons with the Kings (1973-74 - 1975-76).

LAST MEETING: NEW YORK 114, SACRAMENTO 92

December 31, 2011 - New York closed out 2011 with a win at the Kings' expense, a 114-92 win at Power Balance Pavilion. The Knicks, playing without Amar'e Stoudemire due to a sprained left ankle, received three 20-plus point performances and a 14-point, 12 rebound effort from rookie Josh Harrellson, who replaced Stoudemire in the starting lineup.

The Knicks used a 15-0 run to turn a five-point deficit into a 20-10 advantage in the first quarter and never looked back. New York shot 56.5 percent in the opening quarter and nailed six three-pointers, three coming from Toney Douglas and two from Harrellson. Carmelo Anthony, who finished with a game-high 23 points, tallied the last 12 points for the Knicks at the end of the first half for a 56-42 halftime lead. The Knicks extended the lead to as many as 29 points late in the fourth quarter.

Marcus Thornton led the Kings with 14 points. Tyreke Evans and Jason Thompson each tallied 13 points. Donté Greene added 10 points off the bench. Chuck Hayes grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds and DeMarcus Cousins corralled 11 boards. Tyson Chandler recorded 22 points, going a perfect 10-of-10 from the free throw line, and Landry Fields added 21 points. Douglas finished with 17 points.

The Kings outrebounded the Knicks, 51-43, but struggled from the field (34.9 percent) and from the free throw line (26-of-41). New York made 10 three-pointers and was 24-of-27 from the free throw line.

"They jumped on us early," Kings Head Coach Paul Westphal said. "And we were never really able to crawl back into the game. They knocked us out pretty good."
