## SEASON & SERIES NOTES: CONNECTIONS

The Lakers swept last season's series with Atlanta 2-0 after splitting the previous three season series with the Hawks 1-1. Los Angeles has not lost a season series to the Hawks since 1978-79 (1-3). This will be the 316th meeting between the two franchises dating back to their days in Minneapolis and Tri-Cities/Milwaukee/St. Louis respectively. Since the Hawks moved to Atlanta, the two teams have met 114 times with the Lakers leading the all-time series 71-43. The Lakers are 7-3 against the Hawks in their last 10 overall meetings. At STAPLES Center, the Lakers are 9-3 against the Hawks all-time, are winners of their last five straight and have gone 18-3 in their last 21 home games overall. On the road, the Lakers have gone 5-5 in their last 10 trips to Atlanta and in their most recent meeting (3/8/11) snapped a three-game losing streak at Philips Arena. In 23 games (19 starts) against the Hawks, Kobe Bryant is averaging 22.7 points. Bryant scored 41 points 11/1/10 vs. Atlanta, finishing just short of Jerry West's team record 42 points against the Hawks (2/12/70). Lakers guard Steve Blake and Hawks forward Josh Smith both are alumni of Oak Hill Academy in Virginia. Hawks forward Vladimir Radmanovic played in 166 games for the Lakers from 2006-09, averaging 7.1 points. Hawks guard Jannero Pargo played in 47 games for the Lakers from 2002-04, averaging 2.1 points. Additionally, Hawks head coach Larry Drew played two seasons with the Lakers (1989-91), averaging 4.4 points and 2.6 assists in 128 games.

An eight point halftime lead ballooned to as many as 22 in the third quarter as the Lakers held Atlanta to just eight points for the first nine-plus minutes of the second half and despite allowing the Hawks back to within eight midway through the fourth, responded with an 8-0 run to seal a 101-87 victory at Philips Arena. Kobe Bryant passed Moses Malone for 6th on the NBA's all-time scoring list in the second quarter with his 13th point of the night and finished with a game-high 26 points on 8-of-18 shooting. Andrew Bynum (16 points, game-high 16 rebounds, 3 blocks) and Pau Gasol (14 points, 11 rebounds, team-high 5 assists) both recorded double-doubles while Lamar Odom (12 points, 5-8 FG) and Derek Fisher (11 points, 4-8 FG) rounded out the Lakers in double-figures. Al Horford led Atlanta with 17 points and nine rebounds. Josh Smith (16 points, game-high 6 assists), Kirk Hinrich (12 points), Joe Johnson (11 points, 4-14 FG) and Damien Wilkins (10 points) all scored in double-figures with Zaza Pachulia grabbing a team-high 10 rebounds in the loss. With the win, the Lakers sweep their season series with the Hawks 2-0 and improve 27 games over .500.

## SEASON & SERIES NOTES; CONNECTIONS

The Lakers currently lead their season series with the Suns 1-0, after winning last season's series with Phoenix 3-1 for the fourth consecutive season. This will be the 219th meeting between the two teams with the Lakers leading the all-time series 129-89. The Lakers are 18-7 against the Suns all-time at STAPLES Center during the regular season and 7-3 in their last 10 regular season home games against Phoenix. On the road, the Lakers have gone 6-4 in their last 10 regular season visits to Phoenix but are 6-2 in their last eight regular season games at US Airways Center. Most recently, the Lakers defeated the Suns 99-83 behind an NBA season-high 48 points from Kobe Bryant (his highest scoring output in any game in which he did not make a three-point field goal). Last season, the Lakers defeated the Suns in triple overtime at STAPLES Center back on March 22, 2011. The three-overtime contest was just the second ever in Los Angeles (1-1), fourth since the team moved West prior to the 1960-61 season (2-2) and tied for the second longest game in franchise history behind a quadruple overtime loss in January of 1980 at Cleveland. In 54 career games against the Suns including 47 starts, Kobe Bryant is averaging 26.4 points. In February of 2009, Bryant shared MVP honors with then Sun Shaquille O'Neal at the 2009 NBA All-Star Game in Phoenix. Bryant and Suns guard Steve Nash were both selected in the 1996 NBA Draft, Bryant going 13th overall to Charlotte and Nash two picks later to Phoenix. Derek Fisher was also in that draft, taken by the Lakers with the 24th overall pick. Also, Lakers forward Luke Walton and Suns center Channing Frye were teammates at the University of Arizona for two seasons (2001-02, 2002-03). Suns guard Shannon Brown joined the Lakers midway through the 2008-09 season and was a member of the 2009 and 2010 Lakers championship teams. Over 182 games, Brown averaged 7.9 points (.346 3FG) and 2.0 rebounds in 18.7 minutes while competing in the 2010 Sprite Slam Dunk Contest during All-Star Weekend.

Kobe Bryant's 17 first quarter points (8-11 FG) helped spark a 25-4 Lakers run that turned a 19-10 late first quarter deficit into a 35-23 early second quarter lead, and with the Lakers leading 73-70 to start the fourth quarter, Bryant would close the game with 16 fourth quarter points on 6-of-7 shooting to help the Lakers to a 16-1 run to close the game in a 99-83 victory over the Phoenix Suns at STAPLES Center. Bryant finished with an NBA season-high 48 points (18-31 FG, 12-13 FT), his highest scoring output in any game in which he did not make a three-point field goal. Pau Gasol (16 points, 12 rebounds) and Andrew Bynum (12 points and 8 rebounds) rounded out the three Lakers players in double-figures. Los Angeles held the Suns to just four fast-break points and out-rebounded Phoenix 49-35 on the night. Channing Frye led the Suns with 17 points (7-9 FG, 3-5 3FG), Marcin Gortat posted 16 points and 12 rebounds, Steve Nash recorded 13 points and eight assists and Shannon Brown scored 11 points in his first game against his former team.

With the Lakers trailing by four points with 1:41 to play after leading each of the first three quarters and for most of the fourth, Kobe Bryant connected on a three with 56.6 seconds remaining, stole the ball on the ensuing possession, set up Metta World Peace for the go-ahead fast break layup and after a Jose Calderon 17-footer put Toronto back ahead, knocked down a fade-away jumper from the corner with 4.8 seconds on the clock to ultimately secure a 94-92 victory for the Lakers at Air Canada Centre. The win gave the Lakers a 3-3 split on their season-high 6-game Grammy road trip. Bryant finished with a team-high 27 points including 11 in the final period. Pau Gasol (16 points, game-high 17 rebounds, team-high 6 assists) and Andrew Bynum (14 points, 9 rebounds, 2 blocks) were the only other Lakers in double-figures. Calderon led all scorers with a career-high 30 points on 13-of-18 shooting (4-4 3FG). Linas Kleiza (15 points) and Leandro Barbosa (12 points) came off the bench to each post double-figure scoring games while Demar DeRozan finished with a game-high seven assists but only eight points on 2-of-13 shooting in the loss.

### GAME WINNERS

Since entering the NBA in 1996-97, Kobe Bryant has now connected on 16 regular season game-winning field goals in the final five seconds of either the fourth quarter or overtime, the most of any player during that time period. Most recently, Bryant connected on a 17-foot fade away jumper in front of the Raptors' bench with 4.8 seconds remaining, helping give the Lakers a 94-92 victory in Toronto. Carmelo Anthony has the next most game-winning field goals in the final five seconds with 14, followed by Ray Allen (12) and Vince Carter (11).

### WORKING OVERTIME

The Lakers 88-87 overtime victory 2/9 at Boston was the team's 2nd overtime contest of the season. The Lakers are now 2-0 in overtime games this year, after going a perfect 4-0 in overtime games last season. The Lakers have now won their last six straight overtime contests. During the 2009-10 season, the Lakers finished 4-1 in overtime games, after going 2-1 in three overtime games in the 2008-09 season and 4-0 in four overtime games during the 2007-08 campaign. The Lakers' 10 overtime contests in the 2006-07 season established a new Los Angeles era record for overtime games in a single season. With their overtime win at Boston, the Lakers all-time overtime record is now 137-90 (.604).

### BRYANT PASSES SHAQUILLE O'NEAL FOR 5th ON NBA'S ALL-TIME SCORING LIST

With a 23-foot jumper at the 5:08 mark in the second quarter 2/6 at Philadelphia, Kobe Bryant moved past Shaquille O'Neal (28,596) for fifth on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Last season, Kobe Bryant moved past Hall-of-Famers Moses Malone (27,409) 3/8/11 at Atlanta, Elvin Hayes (27,313) 2/27/11 at Oklahoma City, Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946) 1/28/11 vs. Sacramento, Oscar Robertson (26,710) 1/7/11 vs. New Orleans, Dominique Wilkins (26,668) 1/4/11 vs. Detroit and John Havlicek (26,395) 12/10/10 at Chicago on the NBA's all-time scoring list. Next on the all-time list ahead of Bryant (**28,689**) are Wilt Chamberlain (4th/31,419), Michael Jordan (3rd/32,292), Karl Malone (2nd/36,928) and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1st/38,387). Among the top six scorers in NBA history, five have worn the Lakers uniform.

Bryant has been steadily moving up the list over the past few years. In 2009-10, he passed Alex English (25,613), Reggie Miller (25,279), Jerry West (25,192), Patrick Ewing (24,815) and Allen Iverson (24,368). In passing West with a slam dunk at the 4:14 mark of the third quarter February 1, 2010 at Memphis, finishing the game with 44 points (West's retired number), Bryant became the leading scorer in Lakers franchise history. In 2008-09, Bryant passed Gary Payton (21,813) and Hall-of-Famers Charles Barkley (23,757), Robert Parish (23,334), Adrian Dantley (23,177), Elgin Baylor (23,149), Clyde Drexler (22,195) and Larry Bird (21,791).

### IRON MAN

The Lakers victory over Denver on December 31st marked Derek Fisher's 500th consecutive regular season game; Fisher recorded his 400th consecutive regular season start on February 10th against the Knicks at Madison Square Garden. Entering the Lakers February 14th game against Atlanta, Fisher has now played in **523** consecutive regular season games dating back to April 15, 2005, the longest consecutive games streak among all active NBA players. Fisher moved into the top position after Portland's Andre Miller (632) missed the Blazers game against Phoenix (12/7/10) due to NBA suspension. Additionally, Fisher has started **401** consecutive regular season games dating back to January 15, 2007, tops among all active players. Former Laker A.C. Green holds the NBA record for most consecutive games played with 1,192 dating from 11/19/86 – 4/18/01 while a member of the Lakers, Suns, Mavericks and Heat.

### **BYNUM RECORDS SECOND CAREER 20-20 GAME**

On February 6th at Philadelphia, Andrew Bynum totaled 20 points (8-13 FG) and 20 rebounds, marking his second career 20-point, 20-rebound game (3rd career 20+ rebound game). Bynum's other 20-20 game came earlier this season on January 3rd, when Bynum totaled 21 points (8-15 FG) and 22 rebounds as the Lakers defeated the Houston Rockets 108-99 at STAPLES Center, becoming the youngest Laker to do so (24 years, 68 days) since Rudy LaRuso tallied 30 points and 21 rebounds on February 26, 1961 at the age of 23 years, 107 days. Bynum's only other 20+ rebound game came on 4/5/11 vs. Utah, when he grabbed a career-high 23 rebounds. The last Laker to record a 20-20 game prior to Bynum was Pau Gasol, who posted 30 points and 20 rebounds on February 16, 2011 at Cleveland.

### **DOMINATING THE GLASS, BUT LOSING THE GAME**

In the Lakers 95-90 loss at Philadelphia on February 6, the Lakers out-rebounded the 76ers 55-30, marking the first time the Lakers lost despite out-rebounding their opponent by 25-plus rebounds since they out-rebounded New Jersey 55-28 in a 109-103 loss to the Nets at STAPLES Center on 1/28/05. The last time any team lost when out-rebounding their opponent by 25-plus rebounds occurred on 3/11/09 at Detroit, when the Pistons out-rebounded New York 64-39, but fell to the Knicks 116-111.

### **LAW-ABIDING CITIZENS**

Leading for all but 26 seconds of their January 29th victory at Minnesota, the Lakers managed their second road win of the season despite not recording a single steal for only the second time in franchise history. The only other game in which the Lakers did not record a steal came in a January 7, 2005 victory over Houston (111-104). Since the steals statistic began being compiled prior to the 1973-74 season, this was the 47th time a team has not recorded a single steal in a game. With the lack of steals, the Lakers saw the Timberwolves match an opponent franchise record for fewest turnovers in a game (4), originally established in a 108-114 loss 12/21/01 at Memphis.

### **BRYANT NAMED KIA NBA WESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE MONTH**

On February 3<sup>rd</sup> Kobe Bryant was named Western Conference Player of the Month for games played in December and January. The award is Bryant's 14th Western Conf. Player of the Month honor and 15th Player of the Month award overall. Bryant was also named NBA Player of the Month for December of 2000, a year before the award was divided into Eastern and Western Conferences for the 2001-02 season. Bryant has won multiple Player of the Month awards in a single season four times (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2008-09). Bryant's previous Western Conference Player of the Month awards came in March 2011, December 2009, January 2009, December 2008, April 2008, February 2008, March of 2007, December 2006, April 2006, January 2006, March 2004, January 2003 and November 2001.

Bryant averaged a league-high 30.0 points, 6.1 rebounds and 5.4 assists. On January 1<sup>st</sup> at Denver, Bryant became the youngest player in NBA history to score 28,000 points. In a victory over Phoenix on January 10<sup>th</sup>, Bryant scored an NBA season-high 48 points, kicking off four straight 40+ point games over a five night span. Bryant also achieved a couple of Lakers milestones, surpassing Jerry West as the Lakers franchise leader in free throws made on January 28<sup>th</sup> at Milwaukee, then one night later, passing Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the franchise leader in field goals made in a win at Minnesota.

### **BACK-TO-BACK**

This year, the Lakers will play 18 sets of back-to-back games and one set of back-to-back-to-back games. Last year, the Lakers played an NBA-low 15 sets of back-to-back games, equaling the franchise record set in the team's first ever NBA season (1948-49). While 20 of the team's 66 games (30%) will come without the benefit of a day's rest, the Lakers are only scheduled for one back-to-back-to-back set of games; other NBA teams have as many as three back-to-back-to-back sets on the year.

### **KOBE BRYANT AND ANDREW BYNUM VOTED ALL-STAR STARTERS IN 2012 NBA ALL-STAR BALLOTING PRESENTED BY SPRINT**

On February 2nd, the NBA announced that Kobe Bryant is this year's leading vote-getter for the Western Conference in the 2012 All-Star Balloting program presented by Sprint. Bryant received 1,555,479 votes, ranking second league-wide behind Orlando center Dwight Howard (1,600,390). This marks Bryant's 14th consecutive All-Star selection, matching Jerry West, Karl Malone and Shaquille O'Neal as the only players in NBA history to be selected that many times consecutively (14 times each). In league history, only Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (19), O'Neal (15), Michael Jordan (14), Malone (14) and West (14) have had as many or more NBA All-Star selections. Andrew Bynum, a first-time All-Star and now the 29th Laker in franchise history to be named to an All-Star team, led all Western Conference centers with 1,051,945 votes. Pau Gasol (470,353), who made his fourth All-Star team last season as a reserve (2006, 2009, 2010, 2011), finished 3rd among forwards in the West behind Kevin Durant (1,345,566) and Blake Griffin (876,451). Chris Paul (1,138,743) will start at guard alongside Bryant in the West. Starting alongside Howard in the East are LeBron James (1,360,680) and Carmelo Anthony (1,041,290) at forward and Derrick Rose (1,514,723) and Dwyane Wade (1,334,223) in the backcourt.

This marks the fifth straight season that Bryant has led the Western Conference in all-star balloting. Last season, Bryant, who was the youngest All-Star in NBA history in 1998, received 2,380,016 votes to lead all players in balloting, the second time in his career he has done so (2003). In 2009-10, Bryant received 2,456,224 votes, finishing 2nd overall to Cleveland's LeBron James (2,549,693). In 2008-09, he accumulated 2,805,397 votes, finishing 3rd in overall balloting behind Dwight Howard (3,150,181) and James (2,940,823). In 2007-08, Bryant garnered 2,004,940 votes to finish 4th in overall voting behind Kevin Garnett (2,399,148), James (2,108,831) and Howard (2,066,991). In 2006-07, Bryant finished 3rd overall in balloting behind James and Yao Ming. A four-time All-Star MVP (2002 Philadelphia, 2007 Las Vegas, 2009 Phoenix, 2011 Los Angeles), Bryant is now a 14-time All-Star. He had started 11 consecutive All-Star games before missing the 2009-10 contest due to a sprained left ankle.

### **BRYANT BECOMES FRANCHISE LEADER IN FREE THROWS MADE & FIELD GOALS MADE ON BACK-TO-BACK NIGHTS**

With a free throw at the 6:34 mark in the third quarter 1/28/12 at Milwaukee, Kobe Bryant surpassed Jerry West (7,160 FTM) as the Lakers franchise leader in free throws made. The following night, on a driving reverse layup with 4:52 remaining in the first half 1/29/12 at Minnesota, Bryant passed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (9,935 FGM) as the franchise leader in field goals made. Six games later, Bryant made his 10,000th career field goal 2/10/12 at Madison Square Garden. Bryant now holds Lakers franchise records for points, field goals made and attempted, free throws made, three-point field goals made and attempted, games played and minutes played while ranking second in steals and free throws attempted and third in assists.

### **THE CENTURY MARK**

Having gone 7-6 over a 13-game span from 1/5 at Portland thru 1/28 at Milwaukee, the common denominator in each contest, win or lose, was that the Lakers scored fewer than 100 points. The 13-game run of sub 100-point scoring games is the longest streak in franchise history since the introduction of the shot clock prior to the 1954-55 season. Prior to the aforementioned streak, the Lakers scored fewer than 100 points in 12 consecutive games during the 2003-04 season when Los Angeles went 12 games from 1/12/04 - 2/2/04 without hitting triple digits; the Lakers went 6-6 during the stretch of games, eventually scoring 111 points in a 111-106 overtime victory 2/4/04 at Cleveland. The Lakers finished that season with a 98.2 point per game scoring average while limiting their opponents to 94.3 points per game, ultimately winning the West before falling to the Pistons in the 2004 NBA Finals. The 98.2 ppg scoring average is the lowest for a Lakers team in the Los Angeles era. In the shot clock era, only the 1954-55 Lakers have averaged fewer points per game in a season (95.6 ppg). Additionally, the only other Lakers 10-game run without scoring at least 100 points in a game came in 2002 (11/3/02 - 11/22/02), with the Lakers going 3-7 during that stretch.

## **RUMP IN THE ROAD**

While opening the season with a 10-2 mark at home, the Lakers were just 1-7 in away games this season before defeating the Timberwolves 106-101 in Minnesota (1/29). In doing so, the Lakers avoided their worst start away from home since opening the 2002-03 season 1-8 on the road while playing their first seven road games without injured center Shaquille O'Neal, who was sidelined after having toe surgery. That season marked their worst one-win road record since the team moved to Los Angeles. The 1958-59 Minneapolis Lakers also started the season with a 1-8 road record, after the 1957-58 Minneapolis Lakers started the season with a franchise worst 1-15 road record. Earlier this season, the Lakers were 0-3 on the road before earning an overtime victory 1/11 at Utah. The Lakers last opened a season with three consecutive road losses in 1995-96, eventually falling to 0-4 away from home before earning their first road win. Since the end of neutral site games prior to the 1973-74 season, the Lakers have now opened their schedule with three or more consecutive road losses five times: 2011-12 (0-3), 1995-96 (0-4), 1993-94 (0-6), 1984-85 (0-4) and 1978-79 (0-4).

## **BRYANT AMONG 20 FINALISTS FOR 2012 U.S. OLYMPIC MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM**

On Monday, January 16, Kobe Bryant was named as one of 20 finalists for the 2012 U.S. Olympic men's basketball team by USA Basketball chairman Jerry Colangelo. The official 12-man U.S. Olympic team roster will be announced later this year. Bryant is one of eight 2008 Olympic gold medalists in the final 20 along with 10 members of the 2010 USA World Championship gold medal winning team. Others named as finalists in addition to Bryant include: LaMarcus Aldridge (Trail Blazers); Carmelo Anthony (Knicks); Chauncey Billups (Clippers); Chris Bosh (Heat); Tyson Chandler (Knicks); Kevin Durant (Thunder); Rudy Gay (Grizzlies); Eric Gordon (Hornets); Blake Griffin (Clippers); Dwight Howard (Magic); Andre Iguodala (76ers); LeBron James (Heat); Kevin Love (Timberwolves); Lamar Odom (Mavericks); Chris Paul (Clippers); Derrick Rose (Bulls); Dwyane Wade (Heat); Russell Westbrook (Thunder); and Deron Williams (Nets). The 2012 USA coaching staff is led by Duke Hall of Fame coach Mike Krzyzewski. Serving as assistants are Syracuse Hall of Fame coach Jim Boeheim, Knicks head coach Mike D'Antoni, and Trail Blazers head coach Nate McMillan.

## **WINNING IN SPITE OF TURNOVERS**

In their 90-82 victory over Memphis on January 8, the Lakers turned the ball over 27 times; their highest total since turning it over 27 times in a 96-89 loss to Philadelphia on March 27, 2005 at STAPLES Center. The last time the Lakers had at least 27 turnovers and won came in a 106-102 overtime victory on April 20, 1999 at Golden State (27 turnovers). For the Lakers last regulation victory with at least 27 turnovers, one has to go all the way back to November 3, 1995 when they defeated the Denver Nuggets 98-96 at the Great Western Forum despite turning the ball over 27 times. On the season, however, the Lakers are now **12-8** when turning it over more than their opponents, [most recently defeating Toronto on February 12th despite turning the ball over 15 times to the Raptors' 14.](#)

## **GASOL 10<sup>TH</sup> FOREIGN BORN PLAYER TO REACH 14,000-POINT MILESTONE**

With a free throw at the 3:54 mark in the second quarter 1/20/12 at Orlando, Pau Gasol became the 10th foreign born player to reach 14,000 points during an NBA career. Only nine other foreign born players have reached the 14,000 career point milestone (active players career totals on 1/20/12): Hakeem Olajuwon (26,946 / Nigeria), Dominique Wilkins (26,668 / France), Patrick Ewing (24,815 / Jamaica), Dirk Nowitzki (23,072 / Germany), Tim Duncan (21,854 / U.S. Virgin Islands), Rolando Blackman (17,623 / Panama), Steve Nash (16,073 / South Africa), Kiki Vandeweghe (15,980 / Germany) and Detlef Schrempf (15,761 / West Germany).

## **GOOD DEFENSE OR BAD OFFENSE?**

Whichever way you look at it, good defense or bad offense, the Lakers managed to defeat the Dallas Mavericks 73-70 on January 16th despite recording the franchise's second lowest scoring quarter in the NBA's shot clock era. Since 1954-55 (introduction of the shot clock), the Lakers have only posted one lower scoring quarter than their 7-point third against Dallas, scoring six points 11/20/77 in the first quarter versus Chicago. The Lakers defense, however, also made some history. Entering the game, no Dallas team had ever scored fewer than 80 points against the Lakers since the Mavericks entered the league prior to the 1980-81 season. Holding Dallas to 70 points marked the 9th time in franchise history during the shot clock era that the Lakers have held an opponent to 70 points or less. The Lakers are now 9-0 in such games.

## **GAME WINNERS**

Known for his clutch shooting, Derek Fisher delivered once again for the Lakers in their 73-70 victory over Dallas on January 16th, this time in game-winning fashion with a three-pointer from the right side of the arc with 3.1 seconds remaining. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, since the stat began being tracked prior to the 2000-01 season, Fisher now has **SIX** game winning field goals, five in the regular season and one in the playoffs (FGM in last 10 seconds of the 4th quarter or overtime). Only three, however, have actually come with the Lakers: the three-pointer vs. Dallas this season, a running three-foot layup high off the glass as the buzzer sounded to give the Lakers an 87-86 victory 12/8/10 at LA Clippers last season and his famous 0.4 second buzzer beater 5/13/04 at San Antonio (74-73 win). Fisher's other game winners came with Utah (2/10/07 vs. NY (104-102 win) and Golden State (3/25/05 vs. MIL (118-117 win), 12/28/05 vs. BOS (111-109 win)).

In 2009-10, teammate Kobe Bryant famously connected on six game-winners; the most game winning field goals of any player in a single season over the last decade-plus (Carmelo Anthony ranks second on this list with five game-winning field goals in 2005-06). Since the start of the 2000-01 season, Bryant has 20 field goals that have given his team the lead within the last 10 seconds of a fourth quarter or overtime, the most in the league over that span.

## **40-POINT GAMES**

With 42 points January 14 in an away game against the Clippers, Kobe Bryant scored 40+ points for the fourth consecutive game, [fourth](#) time this season and [11th](#) time (regular season) in his NBA career. Bryant's other 40+ point games this season came 1/10 vs. Phoenix (48), 1/11 at Utah (40) and 1/13 vs. Cleveland (42). In the history of the NBA, only two players have more career 40-point games: Wilt Chamberlain (271) and Michael Jordan (173). The Lakers are now **76-35** all-time in games that Bryant scores 40+ points. Bryant holds the Lakers franchise record for 40-point games in a season, recording 27 during the 2005-06 campaign. Bryant also holds the franchise record for most consecutive 40-point games (9), established during the 2002-03 season. Only Wilt Chamberlain (14 twice, 10 once) has had longer consecutive 40-point game streaks in NBA history than Bryant.

### **BRYANT NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR 30th TIME, SECOND CONSECUTIVE WEEK**

Averaging a league-high 43.0 points on 50.4% shooting, 6.3 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.00 steals while helping the Lakers to a 3-1 record, Kobe Bryant earned his **SECOND** WC Player of the week award this season for games played Monday, Jan. 9 through Sunday, Jan. 15. It is the second consecutive week Bryant has won the award, also earning the honor for games played Monday, Jan. 2 through Sunday, Jan. 8 when he averaged a league-high 33.0 points on 49.5% shooting, 5.5 rebounds and 6.3 assists while helping the Lakers to a 3-1 record. The award is the **30th** of Bryant's career (28 Western Conference POW, 2 NBA POW), further surpassing Magic Johnson's 18 NBA POW awards as the franchise's all-time leader. Johnson, however, earned each of his Player of the Week nods before the award was separated by Conference prior to the 2001-02 season. Bryant's other WC POW honors came in weeks ending: 11/4/01, 1/20/02, 11/3/02, 12/8/02, 1/12/03, 2/2/03, 2/23/03, 2/17/04, 3/22/04, 11/13/05, 12/18/05, 12/25/05, 1/22/06, 4/16/06, 3/18/07, 3/25/07, 1/13/08, 3/2/08, 4/6/08, 12/28/08, 1/11/09, 3/15/09, 11/22/09, 12/20/09, 12/27/09, 3/27/11 and 1/8/12. His two NBA Player of the Week honors came in weeks ending 4/16/00 and 12/24/00. The NBA began the Player of the Week award in 1979-80.

### **BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK 40 POINT GAMES**

On Saturday, January 14th, Kobe Bryant scored 42 points against the Los Angeles Clippers, giving him four straight games with 40+ points. Earlier in the week, Bryant scored 42 points in a victory over Cleveland (1/13/12), 40 points in an overtime victory at Utah (1/11/12) and an NBA season-high 48 points in a victory over Phoenix (1/10/12), giving him four 40+ point games over a five day span. Bryant, at the age of 33, is the oldest player in NBA history to record at least three consecutive 40+ point games (the only other players to do so after turning 30 were Wilt Chamberlain in December of 1967 at age 31 and Bob Love in February of 1973 at age 30). Bryant last recorded four or more consecutive 40-point games back in March of 2007 when he posted five straight 40+ point games including four straight 50+ point efforts. That streak was one of the most historic scoring runs in NBA history, with Bryant becoming just the second player in NBA history to score 50+ points in four consecutive games (65 points 3/16/07 vs. POR, 50 points 3/18/07 vs. MIN, 60 points 3/22/07 at MEM, 50 points 3/23/07 at NOK). Bryant's 225 points (56.3 ppg) during that run of four games is only surpassed in league history by Wilt Chamberlain, who topped 225 several times during the 1961-62 and 1962-63 seasons.

### **BRYANT YOUNGEST IN NBA HISTORY TO 28,000 POINTS; 6th EVER TO REACH MILESTONE**

With a free throw at the 10:43 mark of the third quarter January 1st at Denver, Kobe Bryant reached 28,000 points for his career. In doing so, Bryant became the youngest to 28,000 points in NBA history (33 years, 131 days), surpassing Wilt Chamberlain (34 year, 109 days) who reached the milestone back on December 8, 1970. Michael Jordan (34 years, 333 days), the only other guard in NBA history to score 28,000 points, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (34 years, 363 days), Karl Malone (35 years, 212 days), and Shaquille O'Neal (37 years, 319 days) round out the top six. Additionally, in reaching 28,000 points in 1,109 games, Bryant became just the 6th player in NBA history to do so and the 5th fastest in terms of games. Chamberlain was the fastest to reach 28,000, doing so in 825 games, followed by Jordan (886), Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (1,008), Karl Malone (1,070) and Shaquille O'Neal (1,154).

Last season, Bryant reached the 27,000 point milestone with his 28th point January 30 vs. Boston. In doing so, Bryant became the youngest to 27,000 points in NBA history (32 years, 160 days), surpassing Wilt Chamberlain (32 years, 202 days) who reached the milestone back on March 11, 1969. Additionally, Bryant became the 8th player in NBA history to score 27,000 points and the 5th fastest to do so (1,069) in terms of games. Chamberlain was the fastest to reach 27,000, doing so in 780 games, followed by Jordan (852), Kareem Abdul-Jabbar (965) and Karl Malone (1,035). The youngest player in league history to accumulate 18,000 – 20,000 and 23,000 – 28,000 points, Bryant was the 16th fastest to 18,000, 15th fastest to 19,000, 15th fastest to 20,000, 12th fastest to 21,000, 12th fastest to 22,000, 11th fastest to 23,000, 9th fastest to 24,000, 9th fastest to 25,000, 8th fastest to 26,000 points and 5th fastest to 27,000 points in terms of games.

### **FIRST TO 40**

On Tuesday, January 10th, Kobe Bryant scored an NBA season-high 48 points the help the Lakers to a 99-83 victory over the Phoenix Suns at STAPLES Center. Entering that night's schedule, 131 NBA games had been played on the season, and not one player had reached the 40-point mark in a game, marking the farthest into a season in the shot-clock era, in terms of games played, before the first player scored 40 points in a game. Prior to this season, the latest "first player to 40" came in the 2004-05 season, when Dirk Nowitzki scored 41 points on 11/11/04. Prior to that day, there had been 68 NBA games played that season. The NBA season-high 48 points scored by Bryant, who was 33 years, 140 days old on January 10th, is the most by a player that old in a regulation-length game since Michael Jordan posted 51 points at the age of 38 as a member of the Washington Wizards 12/29/01 vs. the Charlotte Hornets. Bryant, who is currently in his 16th NBA season, became the first NBA player to score 48+ points in his 15th season or later; Jordan held the previous record, scoring 48 or more points in his 14th NBA season. Bryant's 48 points (18-31 FG, 12-13 FT), marks his highest scoring output since registering 49 points 3/1/09 at Phoenix, and is the most he has scored in any game in which he did not make a three-point field goal.\*

### **SHOOTING BLANKS**

In their January 5 loss at Portland, the Lakers struggled to 0-for-11 shooting from behind the three-point arc despite opening the contest connecting on 11 of their first 12 field goals. The zero in the three-point field goals made column marks the first time the Lakers have not made at least one three-point shot since November 16, 2003 vs. Miami when the team combined to go 0-for-9. With 11 attempts and zero made, the Lakers also equaled the franchise record for most three-point field goal attempts without a make, established, ironically, 2/26/83 at Portland (0-11 3FG) and equaled again on 3/9/01 vs. San Antonio (0-11 3FG).

### **LAKERS REMARKABLE DEFENSIVE EFFORT**

A game after holding the Jazz to just 32.2 percent shooting from the field in a 96-71 victory on December 27th, the Lakers held the Knicks to just 31.3 percent shooting from the field in a 99-82 victory at STAPLES Center. In doing so, it marks the first time that the Lakers have held their opponents to making less than one-third of their field-goal attempts in consecutive games since the team moved from Minneapolis to Los Angeles in 1960. The last time that the Lakers did such a thing came in November of 1959 when they held the Pistons to 28.6 percent shooting and then, in their next game, limited the Cincinnati Royals to 31.3 percent shooting from the field.\*

### **LOSING THE CLOSE ONES AT HOME**

In falling to Chicago 88-87 on Christmas Day at STAPLES Center, the Lakers have now lost each of their last four home games decided by one point. The streak, prior to Sunday, includes losses to Boston (February 2010), San Antonio (February 2011) and Utah (April 2011). The streak is the Lakers' longest losing skid in home games decided by the minimum margin since the Nixon administration, when the team lost five straight one-point games at The Forum from December 1969 to January 1974.\*

### **BRYANT NOW 3RD ON NBA FRANCHISE CAREER POINTS LIST**

During the 2009-10 season, with his 29th point on February 1, 2010 at Memphis, Kobe Bryant surpassed Jerry West as the Lakers all-time leading scorer. In the history of the NBA, only two players have scored more points with a single franchise than Bryant (28,689): Karl Malone (1st/36,374) and Michael Jordan (2nd/29,277). Last season, Bryant moved past Hakeem Olajuwon (26,511) 12/19/10 at Toronto and John Havlicek (26,395) 12/10/10 at Chicago into third on this list.

### **UNCOMMON START**

With their loss at Sacramento on December 26th, the Lakers fell to 0-2 to start a season for the first time since opening the 2002-03 campaign with a pair of losses. The only team in the NBA that has gone longer since its last 0-2 start is Phoenix, who last started a season with two losses in 1996-97. This was the 11th time the Lakers have started a season 0-2 (2011-12, 2002-03, 1990-91, 1984-85, 1981-82, 1978-79, 1969-70, 1960-61, 1957-58, 1956-57 and 1953-54). In three of the previous 10 seasons in which they have started 0-2, the Lakers went on to win the NBA Championship (1954, 1982, 1985).

### **LAKERS STAFFERS HEAL THE BAY**

On a beautiful Wednesday afternoon at Dockweiler State Beach in Playa del Rey, 26 Lakers employees took part in the latest Lakers Team Up initiative, this time tasked with collecting as much trash and debris as possible as one-day members of the Heal the Bay project. In just under two hours on November 9, the staffers removed cigarette butts, wrappers, pumpkin shells and even a tire, totaling over 100 pounds of trash. A nonprofit environmental organization founded more than 20 years ago by a group of Los Angeles residents looking to curb unchecked pollution and toxicity in the coastal waters and beaches, Heal the Bay aims to "employ sound science, passionate advocacy, effective legislation and wide-reaching education to improve the quality and health of our beaches and waterways." As Lakers such as general manager Mitch Kupchak and assistant coach John Kuester soon discovered, taking care of the beach isn't just about taking care of your surroundings once you arrive at the ocean. "The key thing we like to say is that the beach begins in your front yard," said Heal the Bay Communications Director Matthew King. "Most people don't realize that 80 percent of what winds up in the ocean and on the beach comes from inland sources. It's the small steps people can take in their daily lives to keep their immediate surroundings like their front yards and neighborhoods clean, which is going to have a positive effect upon the ocean down the line." What volunteer groups like the Lakers can provide in a few hours isn't necessarily going to change the toxicity levels in the water, but Heal the Bay hopes that a larger lesson is learned through the process. "It's a single day of action, but a lifetime's worth of education," concluded King.
