**LAST GAME:**

**Nov. 25 vs. Miami – Heat 99, Magic 98:** Michael Beasley dunked home a Dwyane Wade airball with 1.6 seconds left, as Miami escaped with a 99-98 win over Orlando at a sold-out Amway Arena. The loss snapped the Magic's five-game winning streak. Beasley finished with 15 points and 12 rebounds for the Heat, while James Jones added 16 points, including 4-of-7 from three-point range. Jason Williams led the Magic with 25 points and eight assists, while Vince Carter netted 22 points. Orlando led 86-75 with under eight minutes to go, but could not put the Heat away. Miami went on a 16-0 run and took a five-point lead late in the stanza. However, the Magic would respond, as Carter drained a long three-pointer as the shot clock expired with 14 seconds left, giving them a 98-95 advantage. After a Udonis Haslem putback, Williams missed a pair of free throws, giving the ball back to Miami. Wade's attempt from the top of the key was short, but Beasley was in the right place at the right time and soared for the game-winning jam.

**RECENT GAMES:**

**Nov. 22 @ Toronto – Magic 104, Raptors 96:** Vince Carter led all scorers with 24 points, as Orlando defeated Toronto, 104-96, at Air Canada Centre. It was the fifth consecutive win for the Magic. Five Orlando players scored in double figures. J.J. Redick netted 19 points, while Dwight Howard tallied 17 points and 12 rebounds. Chris Bosh paced the Raptors with 22 points. Toronto led 28-22 after the first quarter and by as many as 11 points during the first half. The Magic fought back and led 50-49 at halftime. With the score tied at 80 during the fourth quarter, Orlando went on a 10-0 run and pulled away. Jason Williams scored eight of his 16 points during the final stanza.

**Nov. 20 @ Boston – Magic 83, Celtics 78:** Vince Carter poured in a game-high 26 points, as Orlando defeated Boston, 83-78, at TD Garden. It was the fourth straight victory for the Magic. Rashard Lewis tallied 16 points and 10 rebounds for Orlando, while Mickael Pietrus added 14 points. Paul Pierce led the Celtics with 21 points. Orlando shot just 41.4 percent and committed 21 turnovers. However, they held Boston to just 34.5 percent shooting from the floor, including 2-of-19 from three-point range. Orlando led 29-13 after the first quarter, but the Celtics fought back and trailed 43-40 at halftime. Rasheed Wallace's short jumper with 2:54 remaining tied the score at 78. However, Carter responded with a short fadeaway on the next possession to give the Magic the lead for good.

#### **THIS DATE IN MAGIC HISTORY – NOVEMBER 26...**

November 26, 2008 – Rashard Lewis hits the game winning three-pointer with 4.7 seconds left, as the Magic beat Philadelphia, 96-94. Anthony Johnson records his 500<sup>th</sup> career NBA steal during the game and Hedo Turkoglu passes Brian Shaw (1,061 assists) for seventh on the Magic's all-time list for assists.

November 26, 1994 - Anfernee Hardaway records the first triple-double of the Magic conference championship season (35 pts., 12 asts., 10 rebs.), as Orlando rolls over Milwaukee, 113-105.

#### **ON THE EAST SIDE...**

Orlando has picked up right where it left off against its Eastern Conference counterparts during the 2009-10 season...The Magic are 9-3 vs. Eastern Conference opponents...Orlando is 6-0 against teams from the Atlantic Division, 1-2 against the Central Division and 2-1 against its own division, the Southeast...During Stan Van Gundy's tenure (2007-08 to present), the Magic are 84-32 (.724) vs. the Eastern Conference.

#### **HOME COOKING...**

Orlando hosts New York on Dec. 2 and is 6-2 this season at Amway Arena...The Magic finished 32-9 (.780) at Amway Arena in 2008-09, which was the most wins at home since going 37-4 in 1995-96 ...Orlando has an all-time regular season record of 506-304 (.625) at home (810 games)...This will be the final season played in Amway Arena.



### TRIPPIN'...

Orlando hits the road again tonight (Nov. 26) @ Atlanta and is 5-2 on the road this season...The Magic were 27-14 on the road during 2008-09, tied for the second-best road record in the NBA...Orlando tied the franchise record for most road victories in a season, which they set the prior season (2007-08), also going 27-14 (previous best was 23-18 in 1995-96)...The Magic won six consecutive road games from Nov. 12-27, one win shy of tying the franchise record for longest road winning streak, which they also set in 2007-08 from Nov. 3-19 (their first seven road games of the season).

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – ROAD RULES\***

Under Head Coach Stan Van Gundy, the Orlando Magic are 59-30 (.663) on the road...Orlando has finished above .500 on the road only three times during its history – two of them are Van Gundy's two seasons at the helm (2007-08, 2008-09)...Below is a look at the Magic's best road records in its 20-year history (excluding the lockout-shortened season of 1998-99, when the Magic went 12-13 (.480) away from home):

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – ROAD WORK\***

Orlando had a two-game road losing skid from Nov. 3-8...All of last season, the Magic only had similar losing streaks twice: Feb. 6 @ Indiana (107-102) and Feb. 18 @ New Orleans (117-85), then again Apr. 11 @ New Jersey (103-93) and Apr. 13 @ Milwaukee (98-80).

### FILLING IT UP...

Orlando scored a season-high 125 points on Nov. 1 @ Toronto and is averaging 99.3 ppg. (1,490 points)...The Magic have scored 100-plus points six times (6-0 record), and recorded 120-or-more points three times...Last season, the Magic averaged 101.0 ppg. and scored 100+ points 46 times...From the field, Orlando is shooting .451 (529-1,174).

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – CENTURY CLUB\***

During the club's two-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (2007-08 to present), the Orlando Magic is averaging 102.5 ppg. (18,343 points in 179 games)...They have scored 100+ points 110 times (94-16 record).

Orlando has not lost a game in which it has scored 100 or more points since February of last season (Feb. 24, 2009, 120-102 @ Chicago)...The Magic have an active streak of 19 consecutive wins when scoring 100+ points.

### BALANCING ACT...

Orlando has had five-or-more players score in double figures 10 times (9-1 record) and six-or-more players score 10+ points five times (5-0 record)...On Nov. 1 @ Toronto, the Magic had four players score 20+ points...Jameer Nelson (30), J.J. Redick (27), Dwight Howard (24) and Ryan Anderson (20) each netted 20+ for Orlando during a 125-116 win...It marked the first time since Nov. 1, 2008 vs. Sacramento (Howard-29, Rashard Lewis-26, Hedo Turkoglu-21 and Mickael Pietrus-20) each scored 20-or-more...The previous time prior to that outing was November 9, 2007, a 112-102 victory at New York...The Magic currently have five players averaging 10-or-more points per game.

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – SETTLING IN\***

During the first 15 games of 2009-10, the Magic have had eight different starting lineups.

### FROM WAY DOWNTOWN...

Orlando is shooting .373 (150-402) from three-point range this season, which ranks seventh in the NBA (as of Nov. 25), and made a season-high 17 three-pointers on Nov. 1 @ Toronto...The Magic have made 10+ three-point field goals eight times this season (6-2 record)...Orlando ranks second in the league in both three-pointers made and attempted...In 2008-09, Orlando set franchise records for both three-pointers made and attempted in a season (817-of-2,147).



### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – THREEEEEEEEE!\***

During the club's two-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (2007-08 to present), the Orlando Magic is shooting .382 (1,768-of-4,623)...They have made 10+ three-point field goals 97 times (72-25 record), including an NBA-record 23 trifectas on Jan. 13, 2009 @ Sacramento...During the previous 10 seasons combined (1997-98 to 2006-07), the Magic made 10+ three-pointers in 63 games (37-26 record).

### **DISHING IT OUT...**

Orlando is averaging 19.8 apg. (297 assists)...The Magic have recorded 20+ assists in a game six times (6-0 record), including a season-high 28 assists on Oct. 28 vs. Philadelphia...Last season, Orlando averaged 19.4 apg....When the Magic have more (or same) assists than their opponents, they are 10-2.

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – FOLLOW THE LEADER\*\***

The Magic are a perfect 10-0 when Jameer Nelson hands out at least eight assists in a game since 2008-09.

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – AND PROTECTING IT TOO\*\***

Orlando has also done a good job protecting the ball, averaging 13.7 topg. (205 turnovers), which ranks sixth in the NBA (as of Nov. 25)...As a team, the Magic have an assists-to-turnover ratio of 1.45 (297/205).

### **CLEANING THE GLASS...**

The Magic are averaging 41.2 rpg. (618 rebounds)...Orlando leads the NBA in defensive rebound percentage (.794) and seventh in total rebound percentage (.515) (as of Nov. 25)...The Magic are allowing an NBA-best 8.53 orgp. (128 opp. off. rebs.)...When the Magic have more rebounds (or the same) than their opponents, they are 8-0.

### **GETTING DEFENSIVE...**

While Orlando's offensive attack gets a lot of attention, it is actually the Magic's defense which has been a critical key to success...The Magic are allowing 94.0 ppg. (1,410 points), which ranks fourth in the NBA (as of Nov. 25) and are holding the opposition to .442 shooting from the field (521-1,179), 12<sup>th</sup> in the league...Last season, they allowed just 94.4 ppg., which was sixth in the league and held opponents to just .433 percent shooting from the floor (third in the league)...Here's a quick look at Orlando defensively under Stan Van Gundy (two-plus seasons, 2007-08 to present):

- Orlando is 88-20 when holding opponents to less than 100 points (7-2 this season).
- Orlando is 109-34 when holding opponents to less than 50 percent shooting (7-3 this season).

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – DEFENSE\*\***

During their last six games (Nov. 13-present), the Magic are allowing just 88.3 ppg. (530 opp. points) and holding opponents to .400 (195-488) shooting from the field...Orlando is 5-1 during that span.

### **WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?...**

A solid gauge of how an NBA team performs is to look at the point differential, or the team's offensive output compared with what they are allowing on the defensive end...Orlando's point differential is +5.3 (99.3 ppg.-94.0 opp. ppg.), which ranks fifth in the NBA (as of Nov. 25)...Last season, the Magic's point differential was +6.6 (fourth in the league).

### **\*MAGIC TRICKS – WHO'S THE BIG WINNER??\***

The Magic have an average margin of victory of 11.18 ppg. (123 points/11 wins)...They have recorded six wins by 10+ points, including a season-best 22-point victory on Nov. 4 vs. Phoenix.

### **"THE DAILY DOUBLE"...**

Dwight Howard consistently lives up to his nickname of "The Daily Double," racking up a double-double nearly every time he hits the floor...Howard has recorded 10 double-doubles this season...He had 63 double-doubles in 2008-09 (second in the NBA) and now has 294 double-doubles during his NBA career...Howard had an NBA-best 69 double-doubles in 2007-08 and set the team record for most double-doubles in a season, beating the previous mark of 68, which Shaquille O'Neal accomplished during the 1992-93 season.

### **\*\*MAGIC TRICKS – "THE QUICK DAILY DOUBLE"\*\*\***

On Oct. 30 @ New Jersey, Dwight Howard recorded a double-double after the first quarter alone, tallying 12 points and 11 rebounds during the game's opening stanza...It marks the fifth time during his NBA career that he has accomplished the feat (four times in 2008-09)...Howard went on to finish with 20 points and a season-high 22 rebounds.



### SEEING 20/20...

On Oct. 30 @ New Jersey, Dwight Howard had 20 points and 22 rebounds...It marks the 24<sup>th</sup> time in his career that he has recorded a 20-point/20-rebound game (nine in 2008-09)...Howard has 32 career games with 20-or-more rebounds...Below is a look at Howard's double-doubles broken down when he scores 20-or-more points during his career:

### \*\*MAGIC TRICKS – NBA PLAYER OF THE WEEK\*\*

Dwight Howard was named the NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 1...He led the Magic to a perfect 3-0 record and averaged 21.7 ppg., 16.0 rpg., 1.3 apg., 2.33 blkpg. and 1.33 stlpg. in 34.3 minpg. (three games)...It marks the eighth time during his career that he has been named NBA's Player of the Week.

### BLOCK PARTY...

On Nov. 6 vs. Detroit, Dwight Howard became the franchise's all-time leader in blocked shots, surpassing Shaquille O'Neal (824) at the top of the list...Howard now has 838 career blocked shots...When the Magic have more (or the same blocks than their opponents, they are 9-2.

### 2008-09 EASTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS...

The Magic claimed the Eastern Conference championship with a 103-90 victory vs. Cleveland in Game #6 of the Eastern Conference Finals on May 30...It marked the second conference title in franchise history (1995)...Orlando also captured its second consecutive Southeast Division championship on Mar. 25 with an 84-82 win vs. Boston...It was Orlando's fourth division crown in franchise history (1994-95 Atlantic, 1995-96 Atlantic, 2007-08 Southeast)...The Magic were the #3 seed in the Eastern Conference when the NBA Playoffs began.

### THE 700 CLUB...

Orlando (59-23, .720) was one of only four teams in the NBA with a winning percentage above .700 in 2008-09...The only other teams that had a .700-or-better winning percentage were Cleveland (66-16, .805), the L.A. Lakers (65-17, .793) and Boston (62-20, .756).
