LAST GAME:

Nov. 8 @ Oklahoma City – Thunder 102, Magic 74: Kevin Durant poured in a game-high 28 points, as Oklahoma City routed Orlando, 102-74, at Ford Center. The Thunder shot 57.1 percent from the floor. Russell Westbrook tallied 17 points and 10 assists, while Thabo Sefolosha recorded 13 points and 10 rebounds. Dwight Howard paced the Magic with 20 points. Orlando struggled on both ends, shooting just 36.8 percent from the field and getting outrebounded, 45-30. The Thunder trailed 25-23 after the first quarter, but seized control shortly thereafter, outscoring Orlando during the second quarter, 30-19. Oklahoma City led by as many as 33 points during the second half.

RECENT GAMES:

Nov. 6 vs. Detroit – Magic 110, Pistons 103: Dwight Howard recorded 22 points and 12 rebounds, as Orlando defeated Detroit, 110-103, at a sold-out Amway Arena. Howard also became the franchise's all-time leader in blocked shots with 825. Six Magic players scored in double figures. Matt Barnes and Jameer Nelson each scored 18 points. Charlie Villanueva led the Pistons and all scorers with 28 points, including 22 during the fourth quarter. Orlando exploded out of the gates, leading 40-23 after the first quarter. The Pistons slowly crept back into it, thanks to Villanueva's performance during the final stanza. Detroit cut the gap to 96-90 with 3:05 remaining, but it would be as close as they would get. The Magic never trailed and went 30-of-35 from the free throw line.

Nov. 4 vs. Phoenix – Magic 122, Suns 100: Dwight Howard led six Magic players in double figures with 25 points, as Orlando routed Phoenix, 122-100, at a sold-out Amway Arena. Ryan Anderson tallied 20 points and 10 rebounds, while Jameer Nelson recorded 16 points and 10 assists. Matt Barnes enjoyed a solid all-around effort, compiling 13 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and two steals. Amar'e Stoudamire led the Suns with 25 points and 14 boards. Orlando shot 52.3 percent from the floor and was 12-of-23 from three-point range. Leading 58-52 at halftime, Orlando opened the third quarter with a 20-5 run and never looked back. Howard scored 17 of his points during the third quarter alone.

Nov. 11 vs. Cleveland: Orlando is 38-35 all-time vs. Cleveland (24-13 at home, 14-22 on the road) during the regular season...The Magic went 2-1 last season against the Cavs...Orlando is 4-2 vs. Cleveland in the playoffs (3-0 at home, 1-2 on the road, 2009 Eastern Conference Finals)...The Magic have won eight of the last 11 regular season matchups with the Cavaliers...Orlando has won 10 of the last 14 games played at home, and three of the last five at Cleveland...Anthony Johnson played 28 games with Cleveland in 2000-01...Assistant Coach Brendan Malone served as head coach of the Cavaliers for the final 18 games of the 2004-05 season, after serving as an assistant coach...His son, Michael, is currently an assistant coach for the Cavs...For last season's stats and Magic career numbers vs. Cleveland, see p. 244 of the media guide.

Nov. 13 vs. New Jersey: Orlando is 44-35 all-time vs. New Jersey (23-15 at home, 19-20 on the road, 2-0 at Tokyo, Japan) during regular season play, including 1-0 this season (see recap below)...Orlando went 2-1 last season against the Nets...The Magic have won eight of the last 11 meetings with the Nets...The Magic have won five of the last six matchups in Orlando, and split the last 10 trips to New Jersey...Ryan Anderson was drafted by the Nets in 2008 and spent his rookie season in New Jersey (2008-09)...Vince Carter spent four-plus seasons with the Nets from 2005-09...Anthony Johnson played two seasons (100 games) with New Jersey from 2001-03 and helped the Nets reach back-to-back NBA Finals in 2002 and 2003...For last season's stats and Magic career numbers vs. New Jersey, see p. 270 of the media guide...**Oct. 30 @ New Jersey – Magic 95, Nets 85:** Dwight Howard recorded 20 points, 22 rebounds and four blocked shots, as Orlando defeated New Jersey, 95-85, at IZOD Center. Five Magic players scored in double figures. Ryan Anderson and Vince Carter each netted 16 points for Orlando. Carter scored all of his during the first half, but was forced to leave the game due to a sprained ankle late in the second quarter. Courtney Lee led the Nets with 18 points, while Devin Harris added 16 points and seven assists. The Magic outrebounded New Jersey, 48-39, and held the Nets to just 38.3 percent shooting from the field.

THIS DATE IN MAGIC HISTORY – NOVEMBER 10...

November 10, 1999 - Pat Garrity shoots a near perfect 10-of-11 from the floor, tying a then career-high 25 points, as Orlando held off Allen Iverson and the Sixers, 110-105. Iverson drops a game-high 46 for Philadelphia, with 36 of his points coming in the second half, the record for most points scored by an opponent in a half against the Magic.

November 10, 1995 - The Magic sign free agent Joe Wolf, who becomes an O-rena favorite. Each time Wolf scores or grabs a rebound, the crowd lets out a wolf howl.

LET'S GET IT STARTED...

The Orlando Magic opened the 2009-10 regular season by winning their first three games, before losing @ Detroit on Nov. 3, 85-80...It marks just the third time in franchise history that Orlando has opened the season 3-0 (1991-92 and 1993-94)...The Magic have never opened a season by winning their first four games.

ON THE EAST SIDE...

Orlando has picked up right where it left off against its Eastern Conference counterparts during the 2009-10 season...The Magic are 4-1 vs. Eastern Conference opponents...Orlando is 3-0 against teams from the Atlantic Division and 1-1 against the Central Division...During the last three seasons combined (2007-08 to present), the Magic are 79-30 (.725) vs. the Eastern Conference.

HOME COOKING...

Orlando hosts Cleveland on Nov. 11 and is 3-0 this season at Amway Arena...The Magic finished 32-9 (.780) at Amway Arena in 2008-09, which was the most wins at home since going 37-4 in 1995-96...Orlando has an all-time regular season record of 503-302 (.625) at home (805 games)...This will be the final season played in Amway Arena.



TRIPPIN'...

Orlando hits the road again tonight (Nov. 10) @ Charlotte and is 2-2 on the road this season...The Magic were 27-14 on the road during 2008-09, tied for the second-best road record in the NBA...Orlando tied the franchise record for most road victories in a season, which they set the prior season (2007-08), also going 27-14 (previous best was 23-18 in 1995-96)...The Magic won six consecutive road games from Nov. 12-27, one win shy of tying the franchise record for longest road winning streak, which they also set in 2007-08 from Nov. 3-19 (their first seven road games of the season).

MAGIC TRICKS – ROAD RULES

Under Head Coach Stan Van Gundy, the Orlando Magic are 56-30 (.651) on the road...Orlando has finished above .500 on the road only three times during its history – two of them are Van Gundy's two seasons at the helm (2007-08, 2008-09)...Below is a look at the Magic's best road records in its 20-year history (excluding the lockout-shortened season of 1998-99, when the Magic went 12-13 (.480) away from home):

MAGIC TRICKS – ROAD RULES

Orlando is currently on a two-game road losing skid (Nov. 3-present)...All of last season, the Magic only had similar losing streaks twice: Feb. 6 @ Indiana (107-102) and Feb. 18 @ New Orleans (117-85), then again Apr. 11 @ New Jersey (103-93) and Apr. 13 @ Milwaukee (98-80).

FILLING IT UP...

Orlando scored a season-high 125 points on Nov. 1 @ Toronto and is averaging 103.7 ppg. (726 points), which ranks eighth in the NBA (as of Nov. 9)...The Magic have scored 100-plus points four times (4-0 record), and recorded 120-or-more points three times...Last season, the Magic averaged 101.0 ppg. and scored 100+ points 46 times...From the field, Orlando is shooting .463 (254-549).

MAGIC TRICKS – CENTURY CLUB

During the club's two-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (2007-08 to present), the Orlando Magic is averaging 102.8 ppg. (17,579 points in 171 games)...They have scored 100+ points 108 times (92-16 record).

MAGIC TRICKS – BALANCING ACT

Orlando has had five-or-more players score in double figures five times (5-0 record) and six-or-more players score 10+ points three times (3-0 record)...On Nov. 1 @ Toronto, the Magic had four players score 20+ points...Jameer Nelson (30), J.J. Redick (27), Dwight Howard (24) and Ryan Anderson (20) each netted 20+ for Orlando during a 125-116 win...It marked the first time since Nov. 1, 2008 vs. Sacramento (Howard-29, Rashard Lewis-26, Hedo Turkoglu-21 and Mickael Pietrus-20) each scored 20-or-more...The previous time prior to that outing was November 9, 2007, a 112-102 victory at New York...The Magic currently have six players averaging 10-or-more points per game.

FROM WAY DOWNTOWN...

Orlando is shooting .391 (72-184) from three-point range this season, which ranks eighth in the NBA (as of Nov. 9), and made a season-high 17 three-pointers on Nov. 1 @ Toronto...The Magic have made 10+ three-point field goals four times this season (3-1 record)...In 2008-09, Orlando set franchise records for both three-pointers made and attempted in a season (817-of-2,147).

MAGIC TRICKS – THREEEEEEEEE!

During the club's two-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (2007-08 to present), the Orlando Magic is shooting .384 (1,690-of-4,405)...They have made 10+ three-point field goals 93 times (69-24 record), including an NBA-record 23 trifectas on Jan. 13, 2009 @ Sacramento...During the previous 10 seasons combined (1997-98 to 2006-07), the Magic made 10+ three-pointers in 63 games (37-26 record).

BUY ONE, GET ONE FREE...

Orlando is shooting .760 (146-192) from the free throw line...When the Magic attempt more (or the same) free throws than their opponents, they are 3-1...Last season, Orlando shot .715 (1,611-2,253) from the foul line.



MAGIC TRICKS – CHARITY STRIPE*

After beginning the season 7-for-17 (.412), Dwight Howard is shooting .741 (43-58) during the last five games (Nov. 1-6).

DISHING IT OUT...

Orlando is averaging 21.4 apg. (150 assists), which is tied for 10th in the NBA (as of Nov. 9)....The Magic have recorded 20+ assists in a game four times (4-0 record), including a season-high 28 assists on Oct. 28 vs. Philadelphia...Last season, Orlando averaged 19.4 apg....When the Magic have more (or same) assists than their opponents, they are 5-1.

MAGIC TRICKS – AND PROTECTING IT TOO*

Orlando has also done a good job protecting the ball, averaging 13.7 topg. (96 turnovers), which ranks eighth in the NBA (as of Nov. 9)...As a team, the Magic have an assists-to-turnover ratio of 1.56 (150/96), which ranks sixth in the league.

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

While Orlando's offensive attack gets a lot of attention, it is actually the Magic's defense which has been a critical key to success...The Magic allowed just 94.4 ppg. last season (6th in the NBA) and held opponents to just .433 percent shooting from the floor (3rd in the league)...Here's a quick look at Orlando defensively under Stan Van Gundy (two-plus seasons, 2007-08 to present):

- Orlando is 82-19 when holding opponents to less than 100 points (1-1 this season).
- Orlando is 104-32 when holding opponents to less than 50 percent shooting (2-1 this season).

"THE DAILY DOUBLE"...

Dwight Howard consistently lives up to his nickname of "The Daily Double," racking up a double-double nearly every time he hits the floor...Howard has recorded four double-doubles this season...He had 63 double-doubles in 2008-09 (second in the NBA) and now has 288 double-doubles during his NBA career...Howard had an NBA-best 69 double-doubles in 2007-08 and set the team record for most double-doubles in a season, beating the previous mark of 68, which Shaquille O'Neal accomplished during the 1992-93 season.

****MAGIC TRICKS – "THE QUICK DAILY DOUBLE"*****

On Oct. 30 @ New Jersey, Dwight Howard recorded a double-double after the first quarter alone, tallying 12 points and 11 rebounds during the game's opening stanza...It marks the fifth time during his NBA career that he has accomplished the feat (four times in 2008-09)....Howard went on to finish with 20 points and a season-high 22 rebounds.

SEEING 20/20...

On Oct. 30 @ New Jersey, Dwight Howard had 20 points and 22 rebounds...It marks the 24th time in his career that he has recorded a 20-point/20-rebound game (nine in 2008-09)....Howard has 32 career games with 20-or-more rebounds...Below is a look at Howard's double-doubles broken down when he scores 20-or-more points during his career:

****MAGIC TRICKS – NBA PLAYER OF THE WEEK****

Dwight Howard was named the NBA's Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the period ending Nov. 1...He led the Magic to a perfect 3-0 record and averaged 21.7 ppg., 16.0 rpg., 1.3 apg., 2.33 blkpg. and 1.33 stlpg. in 34.3 minpg. (three games)...It marks the eighth time during his career that he has been named NBA's Player of the Week.

****MAGIC TRICKS – BLOCK PARTY****

On Nov. 6 vs. Detroit, Dwight Howard became the franchise's all-time leader in blocked shots, surpassing Shaquille O'Neal (824) at the top of the list...Howard now has 826 career blocked shots.



2008-09 EASTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS...

The Magic claimed the Eastern Conference championship with a 103-90 victory vs. Cleveland in Game #6 of the Eastern Conference Finals on May 30...It marked the second conference title in franchise history (1995)...Orlando also captured its second consecutive Southeast Division championship on Mar. 25 with an 84-82 win vs. Boston...It was Orlando's fourth division crown in franchise history (1994-95 Atlantic, 1995-96 Atlantic, 2007-08 Southeast)...The Magic were the #3 seed in the Eastern Conference when the NBA Playoffs began.

THE 700 CLUB...

Orlando (59-23, .720) was one of only four teams in the NBA with a winning percentage above .700 in 2008-09...The only other teams that had a .700-or-better winning percentage were Cleveland (66-16, .805), the L.A. Lakers (65-17, .793) and Boston (62-20, .756).

ABOUT THE ORLANDO MAGIC AND NEW AMWAY CENTER...

Orlando's NBA franchise since 1989, the Magic's mission is to be world champions on and off the court, delivering legendary moments every step of the way. On the court, Orlando has won four division championships (1995, 1996, 2008, 2009), had five 50-plus win seasons, and won the Eastern Conference title in 1995 and 2009. Off the court, on an annual basis the Orlando Magic gives more than \$2 million to the local community by way of sponsorships of events, donated tickets, autographed merchandise, scholarships and grants. The Orlando Magic is also the developer of the Amway Center which will compete to host major national events, concerts and family shows. Opening in the fall of 2010, the facility will be operated by the City of Orlando and owned by the Central Florida Community.
