LAST GAME:

Feb. 11 @ Milwaukee – Magic 99, Bucks 94: Jason Richardson poured in a game-high 31 points, including 9-of-11 from three-point range, as Orlando overcame a late double-digit deficit and defeated Milwaukee, 99-94, at Bradley Center. Hedo Turkoglu scored 19 points, while J.J. Redick added 14. Drew Gooden led the Bucks with 21 points, while Ersan Ilyasova tallied 17 points and 16 boards. Richardson scored 28 of his 31 points during the second half. Milwaukee led 88-78 with less than five minutes remaining in the game. However, the Magic went on a 16-0 run, capped off by Richardson's fourth three-pointer during the spurt with 2:06 left, giving Orlando a 94-88 advantage.

RECENT GAMES:

Feb. 10 vs. Atlanta – Hawks 89, Magic 87 (OT): Josh Smith tallied 23 points, 19 rebounds, five assists and three blocked shots, as Atlanta edged Orlando in overtime, 89-87, at a sold-out Amway Center. Joe Johnson added 14 points for the Hawks. Ryan Anderson paced the Magic with 21 points and nine boards, while Dwight Howard recorded 18 points and 18 rebounds. Both teams struggled from the floor – Orlando shot 42.2 percent, while Atlanta shot 43.9 percent. Trailing 78-70 with 1:45 left, the Magic closed regulation on an 8-0 run, capped off by a follow-up jam by Howard with 1.3 seconds remaining to tie the score at 78. Orlando had two chances to win the game at the end of overtime, but three-point attempts by Jason Richardson and Jameer Nelson were off the mark.

Feb. 8 vs. Miami – Magic 102, Heat 89: Dwight Howard tallied 25 points and 24 rebounds, while Ryan Anderson recorded a team-high 27 points and 10 boards, as Orlando defeated Miami, 102-89, at a sold-out Amway Center. The Magic were 17-of-42 from three-point range. The 42 attempts set a new team record for most three-point field goals attempted in a game. Dwyane Wade led the Heat with a game-high 33 points. Orlando outrebounded Miami, 48-38, and pulled down 17 offensive rebounds. Leading 53-50 at halftime, the Magic pulled away during the third quarter, outscoring Miami, 24-11.

Feb. 13 vs. Minnesota: Orlando is 28-16 all-time vs. Minnesota (16-6 at home, 12-10 on the road) during regular season action, including 2-0 last season...The Magic have won six straight meetings with the Timberwolves and eight of the last 10 overall...Orlando has won four of the six outings at home, and six of the last seven games at Minnesota...The Timberwolves and Magic both entered the NBA as expansion teams in 1989-90...For last season's stats and Magic career numbers vs. Minnesota, see p. 278 of the media guide.

UPCOMING OPPONENTS:

Feb. 15 vs. Philadelphia: Orlando is 59-28 all-time vs. Philadelphia (32-10 at home, 27-18 on the road) during the regular season, including 0-1 this season (see recap below)...The Magic went 3-1 last season against Philadelphia...The Magic are 5-5 in postseason play against the Sixers (1999 First Round, 2009 First Round)...Orlando has won 11 of the last 13, 18 of the last 23 and 30 of the last 42 regular season meetings overall...The Magic have won 11 of the last 14 meetings at home and six of the last seven games in Philadelphia...Jameer Nelson played 125 career games at Saint Joseph's from 2000-04 and attended Chester High School...Pat Williams, who spent 12 seasons as Sixers GM, serves as Senior VP for the Magic...TV analyst Matt Guokas was born and raised in Philadelphia - He attended Saint Joseph's, was the Sixers' first round pick in 1966, played four seasons with Philadelphia, served as an assistant coach for three-plus seasons during the early-mid 1980s and was head coach from 1985-88...For last season's stats and Magic career numbers vs. Philadelphia, see p. 288 of the media guide...**Jan. 30 @ Philadelphia – Sixers 74, Magic 69:** Andre Iguodala tallied 14 points, 11 rebounds and six assists, as Philadelphia defeated Orlando, 74-69, at Wells Fargo Center. Evan Turner chipped in with 12 points off the bench. Dwight Howard led the Magic with 17 points and 11 rebounds, while Ryan Anderson added 14 points and a career-high 20 rebounds. Both teams struggled from the floor – Philadelphia shot 37.5 percent, while Orlando shot just 33.3 percent. The Magic also missed 12 free throws and committed 15 turnovers. Philadelphia took control of the game during the third quarter, outscoring Orlando, 21-9.

CALLING ALL-STARS...NBA ALL-STAR 2012 COMING TO ORLANDO...

NBA All-Star 2012 in Orlando will bring together some of the most talented and passionate players in the league's history for a global celebration of the game...The 61st NBA All-Star Game, which will be held on Sunday, Feb. 26 at the Amway Center, will reach fans in more than 200 countries and territories in more than 40 languages...TNT will televise the All-Star Game for a 10th consecutive year, marking Turner Sports' 28th year of All-Star coverage...NBA All-Star Saturday Night presented by State Farm will feature the Foot Locker Three-Point Contest, Haier Shooting Stars, Sprite Slam Dunk, and Taco Bell Skills Challenge...Other events at NBA All-Star 2012 will include the NBA Rising Stars Challenge, Sprint NBA All-Star Celebrity Game, and NBA All-Star Jam Session...This will be the second NBA All-Star in Orlando...The city also hosted the event in 1992.



****MAGIC TRICKS – TOP VOTE-GETTER****

On Feb. 2, the NBA announced that Orlando's Dwight Howard was this year's leading vote-getter in the 2012 NBA All-Star Balloting program presented by Sprint with a league-best 1,600,390 votes...Howard will start in the 2012 NBA All-Star Game, marking his fifth consecutive NBA All-Star Game start and sixth NBA All-Star Game appearance overall.

CLIMBING THE MOUNTAIN...

The Orlando Magic have been among the best teams in the NBA during the last four seasons (2007-11), and their record speaks for itself...Entering the 2011-12 campaign, only the Los Angeles Lakers and the Boston Celtics have more wins during the last four seasons than the Orlando Magic, both during the regular season and in the playoffs:

NIFTY FIFTY...

Orlando recorded its 50th victory of the 2010-11 campaign on Apr. 6 @ Charlotte...It marked the seventh time in Magic history that they have reached the 50-win plateau, and the fourth consecutive season, marking the longest such streak in franchise history...Orlando also had 50-plus wins for three straight seasons from 1993-96, including a team-record 60 victories in 1995-96...The current streak is tied for the third-longest in the NBA...Below are the longest current streaks with 50-or-more regular season victories.

HOME COOKING...

Orlando is 9-6 this season at Amway Center...The Magic were 29-12 at home during the 2010-11 campaign, its first in the new building...The Magic went closed Amway Arena after 2009-10 with an all-time record of 535-309 (.634) in that building...Orlando is 129-50 (.721) during its four-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (179 games).

****MAGIC TRICKS – SELLOUT****

Orlando recorded its 113th consecutive regular season sellout on Feb. 10 vs. Atlanta and set a new single-game attendance record of 19,207 on Mar. 4, 2011 vs. Chicago (normal capacity is 18,846 – previous record, 19,193 on Feb. 13 vs. L.A. Lakers)...The Magic sold-out all 41 of its home games in 2009-10 and 2010-11...If you include the last three postseasons (22 home games), Orlando has sold-out 135 straight contests.

TRIPPIN'...

Orlando is 8-5 this year on the road...Last season, the Magic finished 23-18 away from home and were above .500 on the road for the fourth consecutive time...In the five seasons prior to Stan Van Gundy taking over as head coach (2002-03 to 2006-07), Orlando had won 63 road games (205 total games, .307 win percentage)...During their four-plus seasons under Van Gundy, the Orlando Magic are 110-67 (.621, 177 games) on the road...Orlando has finished above .500 on the road only five times during its history – four of them are during Van Gundy's tenure at the helm (2007-08 to present)...Below is a look at the Magic's best road records in its history (excluding the lockout-shortened season of 1998-99, when the Magic went 12-13 (.480) away from home):

OFFENSIVE ACTS...

Orlando scored a season-high 117 points on Jan. 12 @ Golden State, has scored 100-plus points 13 times (12-1 record) and is averaging 92.9 ppg. (2,602 points)...In 2010-11, the Magic averaged 99.2 ppg. and scored 100-plus points 39 times (31-8 record).

From the field, the Magic are shooting .433 (933-2,153)...Orlando shot a season-high .586 (41-70) from the floor on Jan. 11 @ Portland and have shot 50 percent or better four times this season (4-0)...In 2010-11, the Magic shot .461 (2,956-6,411)...Since the 2008-09 season, Orlando is 60-1 when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (lone loss – Nov. 12, 2010 vs. Toronto).

20-POINT TRIFECTA...

The Magic have had three players score 20-or-more points in a game twice this season...On Feb. 1 vs. Washington, Ryan Anderson (23), Dwight Howard (23) and J.J. Redick (21) all passed the 20-point plateau...On Dec. 26 vs. Houston, Hedo Turkoglu (23), Howard (21) and Redick (20) all scored 20-or-more points...That game marked the first time since Mar. 11 @ Golden State where Orlando had three players score 20-plus points during the same outing (Jason Richardson-30, Jameer Nelson-24, Hedo Turkoglu-24).

MAGIC TRICKS – BALANCING ACT

Orlando has had five-or-more players score in double figures 11 times this season...They are 9-2 in those outings.

FROM WAY DOWNTOWN...

Orlando is shooting .387 (278-719) from three-point range this season, which ranks sixth in the NBA (as of Feb. 12)...The Magic have made 10-plus three-pointers 13 times (11-2 record), including a season-high 17 three-pointers on both Jan. 16 @ New York and Feb. 8 vs. Miami...In 2010-11, Orlando shot .366 (770-2,103) from beyond the arc, which ranked 10th in the NBA...The Magic led the league in both three-pointers made and attempted for the second consecutive season...Orlando made 10-or-more trifectas in a game 40 times (27-13 record).

**MAGIC TRICKS – THREEEEEEEEE! **

During the club's four-plus seasons under Stan Van Gundy (2007-08 to present), the Orlando Magic is shooting .378 (3,500-of-9,261) from the three-point line...They have made 10+ three-point field goals 190 times (141-49 record), including an NBA-record 23 trifectas on Jan. 13, 2009 @ Sacramento...During the previous 10 seasons combined (1997-98 to 2006-07), the Magic made 10+ three-pointers in 63 games (37-26 record)...On Mar. 11, 2011 @ Golden State, the Magic (15) and Warriors (21) combined for an NBA-record 36 three-pointers made.

As of Feb. 12, 32.1 percent of the Magic's total points have come via the three-point shot (834/2,602)...No team in NBA history has had the three-point basket account for 30 percent-or-more of its total offensive production:

On Feb. 8 vs. Miami, the Magic went 17-of-42 from beyond the three-point arc...The 42 attempts set a new franchise record for most three-point field goals attempted in a game, breaking the old mark of 39, set back on Jan. 23, 2010 @ Charlotte.



J-RICH FROM BEYOND THE ARC...

On Feb. 11 @ Milwaukee, Jason Richardson went 9-of-11 from three-point land, including 8-of-9 during the second half...Richardson tied the record for most three-point field goals made in a half, tying the mark set by Tracy McGrady on Jan. 26, 2004 @ Cleveland...The team record for most three-pointers made in a game is 11, set by Dennis Scott on Apr. 18, 1996 vs. Atlanta.

DISHING IT OUT...

Orlando is averaging 19.9 assists per game (557 total)...When the Magic have more (or the same) assists than their opponents, they are 12-2...Orlando has dished out 20-or-more assists in a game 16 times (13-3 record), including a season-high 27 assists three times, the last on Feb. 6 vs. L.A. Clippers.

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

While Orlando's offensive attack gets a lot of attention, it is actually the Magic's defense which has been a critical key to success...Orlando is allowing 91.6 ppg. (2,564 points), which is tied for sixth in the NBA (as of Feb. 12)...Orlando has held its opponents to under 100 points 23 times (14-9 record), under 90 points 13 times (8-5) and less than 80 points three times (2-1), including a season-low 74 points on Jan. 30 @ Philadelphia...In 2010-11, the Magic allowed 93.7 ppg. (7,687 points), which ranked fourth in the NBA, and held its opponents to under 100 points 58 times, 90 points or less 36 times (31-5 record) and 80 points or less 11 times (10-1 record), including a season-low 72 points three times, the last on Apr. 5 vs. Milwaukee.

The Magic have held opponents to .436 (982-2,254) shooting from the floor, which ranks 12th in the NBA (as of Feb. 12), and held its opponents to less than 50 percent shooting 23 times (15-8 record), including a season-low .341 (29-85) on Feb. 4 @ Indiana...In 2010-11, Orlando held the opposition to .436 (2,865-6,569) shooting from the floor, which ranked fourth in the league, held the opposition to less than 50 percent shooting from the floor 69 times and less than 40 percent 21 times (20-1 record), including a season-low .307 on Apr. 13 vs. Indiana (27-88)...Here's a quick look at Orlando defensively under Stan Van Gundy (four-plus seasons, 2007-08 to present):

- Orlando is 186-51 (.785) when holding opponents to less than 100 points (14-9 this season).
- Orlando is 218-73 (.749) when holding opponents to less than 50 percent shooting (15-8 this season).

CLEANING THE GLASS...

Orlando is averaging 43.1 rebounds per game (1,208 total), which ranks ninth in the NBA (as of Feb. 12)...When the Magic have more (or the same) rebounds than their opponents, they are 10-5...Orlando has grabbed 50-or-more boards in a game five times (2-3 record), including a season-high 60 rebounds on Jan. 18 vs. San Antonio.

The Magic are also averaging 10.9 offensive rebounds per game (306 total) and 32.2 defensive boards per contest (902 total), which ranks eighth in the league (as of Feb. 12).

BACK-TO-BACKS...

In 2010-11, Orlando was 24-14 in back-to-back sets (13-6 in first game, 11-8 in the second).

Dwight Howard consistently lives up to his nickname of "The Daily Double," racking up a double-double nearly every time he hits the floor...Howard has 22 double-doubles this season and now has 436 double-doubles during his career (the most in the NBA since he entered the league in 2004-05)...In 2010-11, he led the NBA with 66 double-doubles...Howard also led the NBA in 2009-10 with 64 double-doubles...He set the club record for most double-doubles in a season in 2007-08 with an NBA-best 69.

With his career-high-tying 45-point, 23-rebound performance on Jan. 12 @ Golden State, Dwight Howard tallied the sixth 30-point/20-rebound game of his career, and crossed the 40/20 threshold for the first time...It marked the first 40-point/20-rebound game in the NBA since Mar. 21, 2003, when Shaquille O'Neal (L.A. Lakers) tallied 48 points and 20 boards vs. Boston...He is the only active NBA player with a 40-point/20-rebound game.

In the same game, Howard went 21-of-39 from the free throw line, eclipsing the NBA record for most free throw attempts in a regular season game...Howard passed the previous mark of 34, set by Wilt Chamberlain (Philadelphia) on Feb. 22, 1962 vs. St. Louis...The previous Magic record was 26, set by Tracy McGrady on Mar. 10, 2004 vs. Washington.
