CONNECTIONS: Mavericks assistant coach Terry Stotts got his coaching start under Nuggets head coach George Karl when they worked together in Seattle (5 seasons) and Milwaukee (4 seasons)...Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin hails from Dallas...Mavericks player development coach Popeye Jones played for the Nuggets (1999-2000)...Jason Kidd and Nuggets point guard Chauncey Billups played together at the 2007 Tournament of the Americas as part of the USA Basketball program...the point guards go head-to-head for the 3rd time in the postseason (Kidd's Nets won 2003 Eastern Conference Finals 4-0 over Billups' Pistons; DET defeated NJ 4-3 in 2004 Eastern Conference Semifinals)...Kidd and Nuggets forward Kenyon Martin were teammates in New Jersey (2001-04).

PLAYOFF NOTES

SPRINGTIME TRADITION: Dallas is making its ninth straight appearance in the NBA Playoffs and its 15th overall. This extends the longest streak in franchise history and is currently the second best in the NBA, trailing only San Antonio's 12 consecutive postseasons. Dallas is the Western Conference's sixth seed after finishing the season 50-32. The Mavericks defeated San Antonio 4-1 in the first round and will now face Northwest Division Champion Denver in the Western Conference Semifinals.

FIRST ROUND KNOCKOUTS: The Mavericks are 10-9 all-time in 1st round series. Dallas won 3-2 vs. SEA in 1984, 3-1 vs. UTA in 1986, 3-1 vs. HOU in 1988, 3-2 vs. UTA in 2001, 3-0 vs. MIN in 2002, 4-3 vs. POR in 2003, 4-3 vs. HOU in 2005, 4-0 vs. MEM in 2006, 4-1 vs. SA in 2009. The Mavericks lost 3-1 to POR in 1985, 3-1 to SEA in 1987, 3-0 to POR in 1990, 4-1 to SAC in 2004, 4-2 to GS in 2007 and 4-1 to NO in 2008. Dallas is 24-11 at home and 13-23 on the road all-time in the first round.

GOING FOR SECONDS: Dallas is 3-5 all-time in the conference semifinals. Dallas won 4-3 vs. DEN in 1988, 4-3 vs. SAC in 2003, 4-3 vs. SA in 2006. Dallas lost 4-1 vs. LAL in 1984, 4-2 vs. LAL in 1986, 4-1 vs. SA in 2001, 4-1 vs. SAC in 2002, 4-2 vs. PHO in 2005.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF DALLAS: In 14 playoff appearances, the Mavericks have made 3 Western Conference Finals appearances (1988, 2003, 2006) and advanced to the NBA Finals 1 time (2006).

BIG Ds: Dallas and Denver have met only once in the playoffs. Dallas eliminated the Nuggets 4-2 in the 1988 conference semifinals.

CLOSEOUT SPECIAL: With their series-clinching win in Game 5 at SA (4/28), Dallas improved to 13-8 in closeout games.

6 V. 3: Since 1984, when the NBA implemented the current 16-team playoff format, the No. 6 seed is 87-144 (.377) vs. No. 3 (6-5 in 2009) and has won 15 of 52 series (.288). Dallas is the 1st 6-seed to defeat a 3-seed since 2006 when L.A. Clippers earned a 4-1 series edge over Denver. Head coach Rick Carlisle now owns 2 6-over-3 triumphs in his career (also 2005, IND over BOS, 4-3).

EXPERIENCE MATTERS: Dallas boasts a roster of 7 players with Finals experience. Five of those players were members of the Mavericks 2006 Western Conference Championship team that was defeated 4-2 by Miami in the NBA Finals (Nowitzki, Howard, Terry, Stackhouse, Dampier). The remaining 2 players reached the Finals with a different team (Kidd: 2002, 2003 with New Jersey; George: 2000, 2001, 2002 with L.A. Lakers). George (3 championships) is the only Maverick to earn an NBA title.

FIRST TIMERS: Four players are in their 1st postseason: Carroll, Green, Hollins, Williams. The remaining 4 Mavericks, Barea, Bass, Singleton, Wright have at least 1 season of playoff experience.

FRANCHISE PLAYER: Dirk Nowitzki owns franchise playoff marks in points (2,440), FGs (794), FTs (742), rebounds (1,059), steals (119), blocks (100), games (96) and starts (96). Nowitzki hit 2 3-pointers in Game 3 vs. DEN (5/9) to tie Michael Finley for the franchise mark in 3-pointers made with 109.

CREAM OF THE CROP: Dirk Nowitzki is 1 of only 5 players in NBA history to average 25.0 points and 11.0 rebounds.

RIISING TO THE TOP: Jason Kidd is 12 assists away from cracking into the top 5 all-time among the NBA's playoff assists leaders. Kidd has dished 1011 assists in 114 career playoff games (8.9 apg) which ranks 6th all-time.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT: The Mavericks find themselves in a hole no other NBA team has ever climbed out of – recovering from an 0-3 series deficit in the NBA playoffs. Dallas must win 4 straight games in order to avoid elimination from the playoffs. On Monday night, the Mavericks avoided their 1st sweep (7-game series) in franchise history. The only sweeping blemish on Dallas' postseason record remains vs. POR (1990, 5-game series).

OVER THE HILL: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 5th career playoff game of 40 points in Game 4 vs. DEN (5/11) with 44 points in 44 minutes. Nowitzki's game marked the 3rd-best individual performance by a Maverick in playoff history. Nowitzki had previously scored 50 points (vs. PHO, 6/1/06) and 46 points (vs. POR, 4/19/03). Dallas is 4-1 when Nowitzki records 40+ points.

ANYTHING YOU CAN DO, I CAN DO BETTER: According to Elias Sports Bureau, Dirk Nowitzki (44 points, 13 rebounds) and Carmelo Anthony (41 points, 11 rebounds) became the 3rd pair of players in NBA history to each score 40 points and grab 10 rebounds in the same game (Game 4, 5/11). The others: Jerry West (41/10) and Elgin Baylor (45/17) as LAL teammates (vs. DET, 1962); Michael Jordan (42/12) and Charles Barkley (42/13), CHI vs. PHO (1993).

H-FACTOR: Josh Howard rounded up his best overall game of the postseason vs. DEN (5/11). With 21 points and a postseason-high 11 rebounds in 34 minutes, Howard helped the Mavericks snap a 3-game losing streak. Into Game 4, Howard had averaged 9.7 points, 3.3 rebounds and 22.7 minutes as Dallas fell into the 0-3 hole. The Mavericks are 5-0 in the 2009 playoffs when Howard scores at least 17 points and grabs 4 rebounds.

TRIPLE DOUBLE-DOUBLE: Dirk Nowitzki, Josh Howard (21 points, 11 rebounds) and Jason Kidd (13, 10) all recorded double-doubles in Game 4 vs. DEN (5/11). Howard's double-double was his 1st since 2007 (22, 12 at GS, 4/29) while Kidd recorded his 1st of the 2009 postseason. The contest was the 1st this postseason in which multiple Mavericks recorded a double-double. Dallas was 10-7 in the regular season when 2+ Mavs recorded double-doubles.

CENTURY MARK: For the 1st time in the postseason, Dallas gave up 100 points AND WON! in Game 4 vs. DEN (5/11). Dallas outlasted Denver 119-117 to improve to 1-4 when giving up 100+ points. The Mavericks are 4-0 when holding the opposition to 99 points or less.

THIRTY15: Dirk Nowitzki recorded the 9th 30-point, 15-rebound game of his playoff career in Game 3 vs. DEN (5/9). Nowitzki tallied game highs of 33 points, postseason-high 16 rebounds and 13-15 FTs. The Mavericks are 7-2 when Nowitzki has 30 and 15.

FAN-BASS-TIC: Brandon Bass set new postseason career-highs in FTs (12) and FTAs (14) in Game 3 vs. DEN (5/9). His previous postseason career-highs for FTs and FTAs was 9 at NO (4/22/08). He finished the game with a postseason-high 16 points (3rd 10-point effort of playoffs) in 25 minutes. He had never attempted more than 12 free throws in any game of his career. Over the last 2 games, Bass is averaging 13.5 points in 26.5 minutes (including a playoff career-high 28 minutes in Game 4 vs. DEN, 5/11).

ON THE LINE: The Mavericks, led by Dirk Nowitzki, are earning their keep at the free throw line in the last 2 games. After being out-attempted from the free throw line by an average of 16.5 attempts in the 1st 2 games of the series, Dallas is averaging 46.0 free throw attempts and shooting 82.6% (76-92 FTs) over the last 2. The Mavericks have made 70 FGs to 76 FTs in that span. As a team, Dallas is shooting 82.0% from the line in the postseason – the highest of any team remaining in the playoffs.

WHAT DIRK'S DONE LATELY: After starting the playoffs by averaging 16.5 points and shooting 34.4% from the floor, Dirk Nowitzki has been stellar on offense. The power forward averages 29.0 points on 55.6% (69-124 FGs) shooting from the field over the last 7 games, including 1 40-point game, 4 30-point efforts, 4 double-doubles and 2 20-point halves. Nowitzki is averaging a series-best 35.0 points and 12.0 rebounds in 4 games of the Western Conference Semifinals.

20 SOMETHING: Jason Terry scored a postseason-high 21 points (7-18 FGs, 3-8 3FGs, 4-6 FTs) in Game 2 at DEN (5/5). The game was the 1st of the postseason in which JET came off the bench and then scored 20 points. In the regular season, he had an NBA-best 33 20-point games as a reserve.

BREAKING THE MOLD: In the regular season, Dallas was 0-11 when scoring less than 90 points. In Game 3 (4/23), the Mavericks earned the win despite scoring 88 points.

HOLDING STEADY: In the regular season, Dallas was 14-0 when holding their opponent to less than 90 points. The trend held true in Game 3 (4/23) as SA scored just 67 points.

STOLEN!: In 9 playoff games, Jason Kidd is averaging 2.3 steals (3 steals in Game 4 vs. DEN, 5/11) and ranks 2nd among active players. While Kidd finished the season averaging 2.0 steals (3rd in NBA), his production went down at the end of the regular season. He didn't record more than 2 steals in any of the last 11 regular season games (4 games with 0 steals).

THE CLOSER: In Game 5 (4/28) vs. SA, Jason Terry scored 12 4th quarter points (4-7 FGs, 2-3 3FGs, 2-2 FTs) in 12 minutes. During the regular season, Terry recorded 14 double figure 4th quarters (including the last 2 games).

NIFTY FIFTY: Dallas is 3-0 when shooting 50% FG in the postseason. In Game 4 vs. DEN (5/11), the Mavericks shot 50.6% (40-79 FGs, 3-14 3FGs) from the floor. The Mavericks fared well in the regular season when reaching the accomplishment – they were 23-3 when shooting 50% FG.

1ST HALF CATALYST: Josh Howard has been the Mavericks' 1st half catalyst throughout the last few seasons. During his regular season starts (51), averaged 10.7 1st half points and 7.6 1st quarter points. The trend has continued into the playoffs. Howard averages 7.9 1st half points and 5.7 1st quarter points.

D-E-F-E-N-S-E: Dallas held SA to just 67 points in Game 3 (4/23). The Spurs set franchise opponent postseason lows in the following categories: points (67, previous low 76 done 2 times), 1st half points (30, previous low 34 vs. MIA on 5/11/06), FG% (.321, previous low .354 vs. HOU on 5/7/05). For the series, Dallas held SA to 90.4 points a game – 9.4 points less than they allowed in the regular season (99.8 ppg).

SEASON NOTES

SIXTH MAN OF THE YEAR: Jason Terry was named the NBA's Sixth Man of the Year presented by Kia Motors for the 2008-09 season. He is the 3rd Maverick to earn the award following Antawn Jamison (2003-04) and Roy Tarpley (1987-88). He averaged 19.6 points (22nd in NBA), 2.4 rebounds, 3.4 assists, 1.3 steals (17th) and 33.7 minutes in 74 games (11 starts). Terry averaged more points than each of the last 18 Sixth Man of the Year winners and ranks fourth all-time in scoring among honorees.

EXHIBIT TWO: Jason Terry scored 23 points off the bench vs. HOU (4/15) – the game marked the 33rd in which he came off the bench and then scored 20+ points. He also single-handedly matched or outscored the opposing bench 26 times (18-8 record).

THIS KIDD DOES IT ALL: Jason Kidd recorded 3 triple-doubles during the regular season. For his career, Kidd has 103 triple-doubles and ranks 3rd on the NBA's all-time triple-double list after surpassing Wilt Chamberlain last season. He trails only Oscar Robertson (181) and Magic Johnson (138). Kidd was 1 of only 6 NBA players to have multiple triple-doubles this season

ELITE COMPANY: When the Mavericks picked up their 50th win of the 2008-09 season vs. HOU (4/15/09) they joined some elite company. The Mavericks became just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the inception of the NBA to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

TWO OF A KIND: The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

DALLAS IS: The 1st team in NBA history to start a season with a 2-7 record and then finish with 50 wins.

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out 317 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 42 playoff and 20 preseason games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 263-62 (.809). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 331-242 (.578); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-36 (.493)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions, including 2008-09.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
