CONNECTIONS: Kings Head Coach Paul Westphal was a member of the Mavericks organization from 2007-2009, first as an assistant coach and then as Executive Vice President of Basketball Operations...Mavericks forward Drew Gooden was with the Kings for a brief stint in Sacramento in 2009...Mavericks guard Jason Terry and Kings center Spencer Hawes both hail from Seattle...Kings forward Andres Nocioni played in Chicago with Mavericks forward Drew Gooden from 2008-2009 and with Mavericks forward Tim Thomas from 2005-2006.

FYI:

- Tim Thomas made his Mavericks debut after missing the preseason and first 11 regular season games due to right knee surgery
- Jason Kidd is averaging 10.5 rebounds over the last 2 games (11 DR vs. SA, 11/18). Last season, Kidd had consecutive games with 10+ rebounds once (10 each at POR 3/11, at GS 3/13).
- Jason Kidd recorded his 24th career game with 17+ assists at MIL (11/16)...his 17 assists Monday night marked the 5th time this season that he has dished at least 10 assists. Kidd's teams are 18-6 all-time when he has 17 assists
- Jason Terry leads all players off the bench with 204 total points in 12 games and ranks 2nd with 17.0 points per game (NY's Al Harrington, 20.3 ppg)
- For the season, Dallas ranks T-4th in bpg (6.3) and T-3rd in total blocks (76) among NBA leaders
- Dirk Nowitzki has at least 1 block in each of the last 7 games
- The Mavs will next be in action at the AAC on Tuesday vs. Golden State (11/24) at 7:30 p.m. on FSSW. Tickets are still available. Select season ticket packages are also still available. For more information: mavs.com or 214-747-MAVS

30TH ANNIVERSARY: The Dallas Mavericks celebrate their 30th season this year. In 29 seasons, the Mavericks have enjoyed 11 50-win seasons, 15 playoff appearances (nine consecutive), three Western Conference Finals berths and one trip to the NBA Finals.

OVERCOMING ADVERSITY: The Mavericks have already used 5 different starting lineups through 12 games this season while battling injuries to starters Josh Howard, Shawn Marion and Erick Dampier. The only group to lose its 1st start was the opening night lineup of Marion, Nowitzki, Dampier, Ross, Kidd.

HOT STREAK: Dallas has won a season-long 4 consecutive games between at MIN (11/13) and vs. SA (11/18). The Mavericks own the 2nd longest win streak in the NBA (ATL, 6 games) and the longest in the Western Conference.

WORKING OVERTIME: The Mavericks have needed overtime to get their last 2 wins. After getting their 6th ever win in MIL (115-113) on Monday night, Dallas turned around and picked up their 4th straight win at home by knocking off SA, 99-94, in 53 minutes. Dirk Nowitzki was the hero in both contests – first, he hit his 7th career game-winning shot (last 5 seconds of game) at MIL and then scored 11 of the Mavs' 15 OT points vs. SA. The last time Dallas played back-to-back overtime games was in 2003-04 (W 127-122 @ NY on 1/12/04; W 125-122 (2OT) vs. PHI on 1/14/04).

TOP 40: Dirk Nowitzki recorded his 2nd 40-point game of the season (14th of career, Mavs 10-4 record) vs. SA (11/18). He finished the OT thriller with a season-high 41 points (15-29 FGs, 1-1 3FGs, 10-12 FTs), 12 rebounds and 1 block in 45 minutes. Nowitzki is 1 of 4 players in the NBA to have multiple 40-point games. There have been 16 40-point outings this season.

GOODEN PLENTY: Drew Gooden has recorded 3 consecutive double-doubles in his last 3 starts and averages 16.7 points, 12.0 rebounds and 1.3 blocks while shooting 61.8% (21-34 FGs) from the floor. In 2008-09, Gooden had 3 straight double-doubles twice. Vs. SAC, he will look to have 4 consecutive double-doubles for the 1st time since early 2007 (1/3-9). His career long double-doubles streak is 7 games (2004-05 season).

RODDY, PROUD AND LOUD: Rookie Rodrigue Beaubois has come alive for the Mavericks in his last 4 starts – which have all been Dallas wins. The native of Guadeloupe averages 10.8 points, 1.8 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 18.7 minutes. In that span, he has shot 60.0% (18-30 FGs) from the floor and 44.4% (4-9 3FGs) from 3-point range. Arguably, Beaubois is the first rookie since Josh Howard and Marquis Daniels (2003-04) to have played meaningful minutes for the Mavericks, especially this early in the season. ROADIES: Heading into their longest homestand of the season so far (3 games), the Mavericks own the 2nd best road winning percentage (5-2, .714) in the NBA behind Phoenix (6-2, .750).

IN SPITE OF THE RIM: The Mavericks are 6-2 when shooting less than 44% FG (recently, W vs. SA, 11/18). Dallas and POR are the only teams in the league to have 5+ wins when shooting under 44%. A season ago, Dallas was 6-24 when shooting less than 44%. Dallas also has an NBA-best 3 wins when shooting 40% or less FG. Dallas won just 1 of 13 games last season when shooting below 40%.

MOVING UP THE RANKS: Jason Terry now has 6,634 points as a Maverick and has moved into 8th place all-time among Mavs. If JET sustains his 17.0 points per game pass, look for him to overtake Sam Perkins (6,766) for 7th place by early December.

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Erick Dampier had a monster night on the boards vs. HOU (11/10), coming down with 20 rebounds and a career-high 17 defensive rebounds. The game marked the 8th of his career (2nd with the Mavs) with 20+ rebounds. He has come down with at least 10 rebounds in 5 of the last 6 games, and has 14+ boards in 2 games. He has 29 14-rebound performances since joining the Mavs in 2004-05. Dallas is 20-9 when he has 14+ rebounds. Dampier had 6 games with 14+ a season ago.

IRON ERICK: Erick Dampier recorded his 3rd double-double of the season with 14 points and 20 rebounds in 32 minutes vs. HOU (11/10). In 2008-09, Dampier didn't come up with his 3rd double-double until 1/2/09 vs. PHI. When Damp scores 10+ points, odds usually favor the Mavs. Since his arrival in Dallas (2004-05 season), Dampier has recorded 46 double-doubles (35-11 record, .761). When the center scores 10+ points, Dallas is 70-19 (.787). Over the past 4 seasons, Dampier has missed 11 regular season games – including the last 3 due to an illness.

18 KARAT: Dirk Nowitzki leads the Mavericks in scoring and ranks 2nd in rebounding to start the 2009-10 season. With his 39 points vs. UTA (1/17/09), Dirk Nowitzki crossed the 18,000-point threshold for his career (19,414 total points). He joins 55 other players to reach the mark and now ranks 39th all-time among NBA scorers, passing Tim Duncan (19,363) with 32 points at MIL (11/16). He needs 47 points to move into 38th position (Terry Cummings, 19,460). Nowitzki ranks 5th among active players in all-time scoring behind Shaquille O'Neal, Kobe Bryant, Kevin Garnett and Ray Allen. Nowitzki is followed by Duncan and Paul Pierce.

DIRK (and KIDD) FOR 3: Last season, Dirk Nowitzki made 61 3s (his lowest output since having 14 his rookie season)...so far this season, Nowitzki has made 12 3s (12-33 3FGs, .364) and averages 1 per game putting him on pace to make 82 3-pointers for the season which would be the most since having 110 in 2005-06. For his career, Nowitzki has 1,092 3-pointers and ranks 43rd all-time among NBA players. In fact, Nowitzki (7,293 rebounds) and teammate Jason Kidd (1,505 3FGs, 7,477 rebs) are 2 of only 3 players in NBA history to have at least 1,000 3s and 7,000 rebounds (also Rasheed Wallace, 1,004 3s and 7,037 rebounds).

TOE THE LINE: The Mavericks, perennially one of the NBA's best free throw shooting clubs, are shooting 79.9% (234-293 FTs) from the line. Since the 2000-01 season (first of 9 consecutive 50-win seasons), the Mavericks have shot an NBA-best 80.3% from the line, have led the league in FT shooting in 4 of those seasons (2001-02, 2002-03, 2003-04, 2007-08) and have finished in at least the top 6 each year. In that span, Dirk Nowitzki has shot 87.8% FT (7th in NBA) and has hit 4,452 FTs (4th).

CLOSING IN ON SECOND: Jason Kidd now ranks 3rd all-time among the NBA's career assist leaders (10,306 assists). With 20 assists vs. PHO (4/5/09), he passed Magic Johnson (10,141) for 3rd position. Kidd now trails John Stockton (15,806) and Mark Jackson (10,334). If Kidd continues to average around 8.9 assists, he will move into 2nd place around the end of the month.

STOLE THE SHOW: With 2,218 steals, Jason Kidd now ranks 6th on the NBA's all-time steals list. With 2 steals at SA (11/11/09), Kidd surpassed Clyde Drexler (2,207). The point guard is 90 steals away from taking 5th position from Scottie Pippen (2,307).

TOP 10 LIST: Jason Kidd hit 3 3-pointers vs. SA (12/9/08) to move into 9th place all-time on the NBA's 3-point field goals made list with 1,391 (surpassing Antoine Walker, 1,386 3FGs). For his career, he has 1,505 3-pointers. With 24 more 3-pointers, he will move into 8th place (Nick Van Exel, 1,528). He can be found on several other NBA Top 10 lists (3rd at 10,306 career assists, 6th at 9.2 apg; 3rd with 103 triple-doubles; 6th with 2,218 steals).

BACK-TO-BACK IT UP: Dallas finished the 4th of 20 back-to-backs at MIL (11/16). The Mavericks have 4 more back-to-backs than a season ago. Seven begin on the road and conclude at home, seven are on the road and six are home-away. Twelve of Dallas' back-to-backs occur in the first half of the season. Dallas is 4-0 in the first game of a back-to-back and 2-2 in the second game.

HOW THE MAVS WERE BUILT: Of the 15 players currently on the roster, 11 are former first round draft picks (Erick Dampier, Drew Gooden, Josh Howard, Kris Humphries, Jason Kidd, Shawn Marion, Dirk Nowitzki, Jason Terry, Tim Thomas, Shawne Williams, Rodrigue Beaubois). Seven were top 10 picks (Dampier, Gooden, Kidd, Marion, Nowitzki, Terry, Thomas). Kidd holds the honor of being the highest drafted Maverick (second overall by Dallas in 1994). Four Mavericks were undrafted (J.J. Barea, Matt Carroll, Quinton Ross, James Singleton).

EVERYTHING IS BIGGER IN TEXAS: On 10/30/08, Dallas was awarded the 2010 NBA All-Star Game (Feb. 14, 2010). In a joint venture between Mavericks owner Mark Cuban and Dallas Cowboys owner Jerry Jones, and following the mantra that "everything is bigger in Texas," the All-Star Game will be played at the new Dallas Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, which will have a seating capacity of over 80,000 fans. This collaboration between the NBA, and the ownership groups of the Mavericks and Cowboys, will afford Mavericks season ticket holders a chance to partake in the NBA All-Star Game. The T-Mobile Rookie Challenge and NBA All-Star Saturday Night will take place at American Airlines Center. Dallas last hosted All-Star festivities in 1986.

ELITE COMPANY: The Mavericks are just the fourth franchise (five times total) since the NBA went to an 82-game schedule in 1967 to have at least nine consecutive 50-win seasons. Here is a run down of the teams to accomplish this feat:

1. Los Angeles Lakers 12 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1990-91)
2. Boston Celtics 10 consecutive seasons (from 1958-59 to 1967-68)
San Antonio Spurs 10 consecutive seasons (from 1999-00 to 2008-09)
3. Boston Celtics 9 consecutive seasons (from 1979-80 to 1987-88)
Dallas Mavericks 9 consecutive seasons (from 2000-01 to 2008-09)

JUST THE TWO OF US: The Mavericks and Spurs are the only two teams to have won 50+ games in each of the past nine seasons. Here's a look at the records of the Mavericks and Spurs over the past nine seasons:

20,000 MANIAACS: The Mavericks have sold out 322 consecutive home games, which is an NBA-best sellout streak. The listed capacity for AAC is 19,200 but that can be surpassed because of attendance in the suites. The streak started on 12/15/01. Dallas has sold out an additional 44 playoff games during that same stretch. Since moving into American Airlines Center (2001-02 season), the Mavericks have posted a home mark of 267-63 (.809). Dallas has sold out all 41 games in each of the past seven seasons.

HEAD COACH RICK CARLISLE

Regular Season Coaching Record: 340-245 (.581); Playoff Coaching Record: 35-37 (.486)

Rick Carlisle became the ninth coach in franchise history on May 9, 2008. He joined the Mavericks after spending six seasons, with Detroit and Indiana, as a head coach. Most recently, Carlisle served as an ESPN studio analyst during the 2007-08 NBA season.

In seven seasons as a head coach, Carlisle has led his team to the postseason on six occasions.

Carlisle began his head coaching career with Detroit. During his two-season tenure, the Pistons won 61.0% of their games (100-64) to go with two Central Division championships and one trip to the Eastern Conference Finals. Following his first season as head coach, Carlisle earned the NBA's Coach of the Year award in 2002.

Carlisle joined Indiana as head coach on Sept. 2, 2003. In his first year, Carlisle led the Pacers to the NBA's best record (61-21), the most victories in franchise history, the best winning percentage in franchise history and a Central Division championship. He also led the Pacers to the 2004 Eastern Conference Finals where they eventually lost to the Pistons. Carlisle, including his previous two seasons with Detroit, became the first coach since Pat Riley to win 50 games and division championships in each of his first three seasons as head coach. Overall, Carlisle earned a 181-147 (.552) regular season record in Indiana and led the team to three consecutive postseason appearances before stepping down following the 2006-07 campaign.

Carlisle began his coaching career in 1989 as an assistant with the New Jersey Nets. In five seasons with the Nets, he had the opportunity to work under Hall of Fame coaching legends Bill Fitch and Chuck Daly. Carlisle then moved on to Portland, where he spent three seasons as an assistant under P.J. Carlesimo before joining former teammate Larry Bird's staff in Indiana during the summer of 1997.
